## Michael Rock is New Yuba City Manager Planned Sept. 3 Start Date

If confirmed, Rock will come to the City after serving as city manager for the City of Santa Paula for the last two years. He has previously worked in that same role for the City of Banning and the City of Lomita, town manager for the City of Fairfax, and operations manager for the City of Rocklin.

Mayor Shon Harris said that for this critical role, the City Council wanted someone who was not only the most qualified but who also shares the values, attitudes and leadership style that align with the City and community and that

will enable them to thrive. The City Council is confident it has found that person in Rock.

“We are excited about welcoming Michael to our City and introducing him to our dedicated and professional staff,” Harris said. “There is a lot of work to be done as we move forward, and we look forward to exceptional results under his leadership.”

Rock’s areas of expertise include public policy, economic development, capital projects, budget and finance, public works, and infrastructure maintenance. Harris said his wide breadth of practical experience, his innovative and results-oriented leadership style, and long-term connections to the Yuba-Sutter community will be tremendous assets in his new role as city manager.

Rock looks forward to re-

turning to his Northern California roots and being closer to family he has in Yuba City and across the North State. He said he also eagerly anticipates opportunities to support the City in its continued growth and prosperity.

“It’s a great place to live, and there are so many opportunities ahead for housing and commercial development,” he said. “It’s wonderful to see how much people care about their community and how the City Council is diligent about what they do to serve them at every council meeting and in between.”

Frequently those seeking political office portray themselves as they want people to see them rather than who they really are. It’s called hypocrisy.

Candidates are often successful with this scheme since voters rarely have time to vet them and if candidates are liberal the media is complicit in the scam. Such is the case lately with Kamala Harris and her desire to be President of the United States.

Harris, an attorney, was appointed to two paid state commissions by her boyfriend and Speaker of the State Assembly Willie Brown while Brown was married to Blanche Vitero. Harris then served as San Francisco District Attorney, California Secretary of State and now U.S. Senator.

In 2014, she married white Jewish attorney Douglas Emhoff and they raise two children from his previous marriage. It is assumed they are heterosexual since we must know how popular people are having sex nowadays -- hetero, homo, bi, or fluid. It’s way more important than character.

Recently, at the first debate of democrats hoping to be president, Harris sought to discredit Joe Biden on his “friendship” with segregationists and pick apart his record on busing. In fact, the Harris family paternal ancestors were slave owners in Jamaica. Donald Harris revealed in 2018 that his grandmother was a descendant of Hamilton Brown, the namesake of Brown’s Town in northern Jamaica.

“My roots go back, within my lifetime, to my paternal grandmother Miss Chrishy (née Christiana Brown, descendant of Hamilton Brown who is on record as plantation and slave owner and founder of Brown’s Town),” he wrote in a post for “Jamaica Global.”

Hamilton Brown was not only a slave owner, but also an engineer of mass Irish migration to Jamaica after the British Empire abolished slavery in 1834.

A Jamaican Family Search recorded: “Hamilton Brown owned several plantations over the years 1817 to about 1845. According to the 1818 Almanac which can be found on this site, (Jamaican Family Search), he was the owner of Minard (128 slaves) which he must have acquired from its previous owner (John Bailie) in 1815 or later. The other register (86 slaves) cannot be assigned to any estate, although he is listed

in Almanacs for subsequent years as owning several, (Antrim, Grier Park, Colliston, Little River, Retirement and Unity Valley)."

"Hamilton Brown was instrumental in the importing of several hundred labourers and their families from Ireland to Jamaica between 1835 and 1840," according to University College London's project "Legacies of British Slave-ownership." The project describes Hamilton Brown as a "Major attorney and resident

slave-owner in Jamaica."

However, this is where liberals like Kamala spin and twist rather than be honest and transparent and quit playing the race card tune. Slavery back then was a nasty part of the world and all kinds of ethnic and religious sorts owned slaves. In fact, black and brown Muslims still have slaves today.

American white Christians were mostly abolitionists and tens of thousands gave their

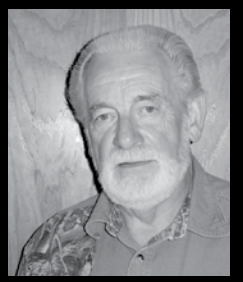

Reports indicate salmon fishing in local rivers will be better than average this year when the season opens on July 16th.

The holidays of summer usually slow down the bite in local reservoirs. This year is no different as reports tell us the slowdown of active fish is taking place all over the Sacramento Valley and foothills with some exceptions. Clear Lake is still going full speed ahead on the catch and landlocked kokanee salmon are filling stringers at Stampede Reservoir, Lake Berryessa,

Whiskeytown Reservoir and Bullard's Bar Reservoir.

We have word that the landlocked king salmon in Lake Oroville have started schooling and are moving out of the arms of the reservoir and close to or into the main body of water. Once the boat traffic slows down the kings should be producing some excitement for those who fish for them.

Up Eagle Lake way the fish are on a heavy feeding cycle due to the hatching of the caddisflies. Fly fishermen are catching limits at this

time.

Lake Almanor is the place to go if you fly fish. Bug hatches have the bass and trout feeding and are available to those who use the fly rod. Bait fishing and trolling is not doing well at this time.

Even though Little Grass Valley Reservoir received a trout plant last week the action here is slow. Some anglers are only interested in the big brown trout this reservoir is famous for.

Frank Dana Hubbard, 87, of Marysville, CA passed away on July 8, 2019. He was resident of the Yuba Sutter area for more than 30 years and deeply devoted to education, the community and the communities history. He was born December 19, 1931, in Bakersfield, CA. He grew up on the shores of Lake Tahoe where his parents were caretakers at Zephyr Point Presbyterian Conference Center and this area always held a special place in his heart. Hubbard was proud to have graduated from the University of California, Berkley. He began his

career teaching, after graduation, and taught for more than 30 years. Hubbard taught for 20 years in the Marysville School District at Cedar Lane School.

Hubbard was a long-time member of the First Presbyterian Church of Marysville, serving the Lord where any need presented itself. He served as past President of the Yuba County Museum of History and tried to help create a Yuba County Museum. He was avid genealogy researcher and historian. We are comforted knowing that he was met with these words, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you were faithful." Matthew 25:21 NIV

Hubbard is survived by his companion of more than 20 years, Carolyn Maclean and her family.

Arrangements are under the directions of Sierra View Memorial Park and an upcoming Celebration of life is being planned.

in 1802 by muckraking, racist, alcoholic journalist, James Callender, who had served prison time for his writing broadsides. Callender tried to blackmail Jefferson into appointing him postmaster at Richmond after Callendar worked for Jefferson. When that failed, seeking revenge he publicly accused Jefferson of fathering the first-born son of Sally Hemings. The writer referred to Hemings as "a slut as common as the pavement."

Westwood Trail, Oregon House

Just before 8:00 a.m. on 7/8/19, the YCSO Marijuana Enforcement Team (METYU) with the assistance of Yuba County Code Enforcement officers executed a search warrant in the 9100 block of Westwood Trail in Oregon House. During the search, Deputies located and eradicated 2,423 marijuana plants and 140 lbs. of processed marijuana from a large outdoor grow as well as a residence and garage converted to indoor grow facilities at the property.

Two male adults ran from the property as officers arrived to serve the search warrant. One of the suspects was found

by deputies a short time later on Rices Crossing Road in Oregon House and taken into custody.

He was identified as 56-year-old Chung Chan of Texas. Chan was booked into the Yuba County Jail on charges

of 11358 H&S/Illegal Cultivation of Marijuana, 11359 H&S/Possession of Marijuana for sale, 11366 H&S/Maintaining a Residence for Drug Sales, and 148(a)PC/Resisting Arrest/Obstruction.

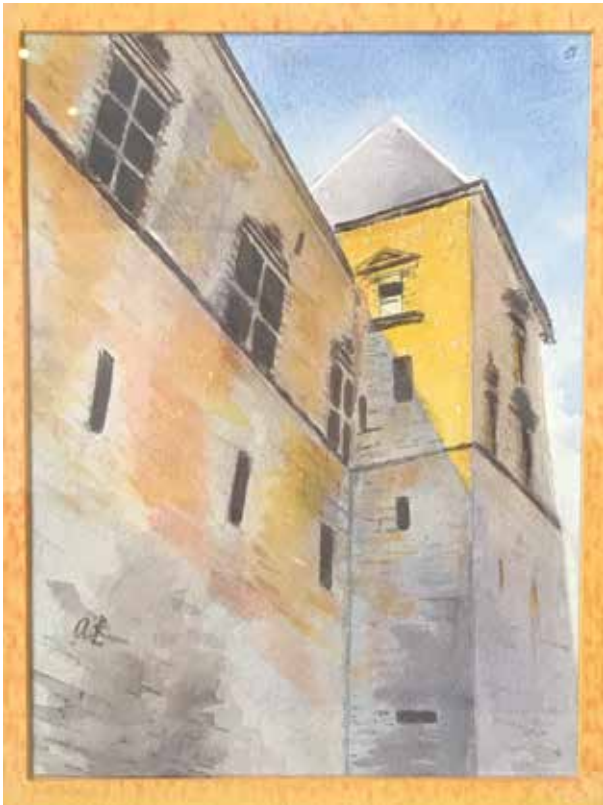
# Agnès Laurent Artist Gallery Show Opening and Reception

## Food and Farm News

### Pence to hold trade discussion in Central Valley

The topic will be trade when Vice President Pence visits the Central Valley Wednesday. Pence is scheduled to speak at a farm in Lemoore, during an event promoting the U.S.-Mexico-Canada trade agreement. Supporters say the agreement will improve agricultural trade among the three countries. The agreement awaits ratification in the U.S. Congress and Canadian Parliament; Mexico has ratified it.

### Black-eyed peas could lend drought tolerance to other crops

Breeding more drought-tolerant crops could be one result of the genetic decoding of black-eyed peas. Scientists at the University of California, Riverside, announced Tuesday they had unraveled the crop's genetic code. Also known as cowpeas, black-eyed peas provide a staple source of protein in much of the world, and tolerate drought and hot temperatures. Researchers say their work could ultimately help other crops acquire those traits.

### Data can help grape growers forecast crop performance

Decisions that grape growers make could have a 25-year impact on their vines, and computer engineers want to give farmers better information to guide their choices. Professors from Purdue University in Indiana have been working with California winegrape growers to help them adopt new technology. The project includes harnessing data growers can use to forecast how their decisions might affect the long-term performance of their vineyards.

### Advisors seek new market for California-grown moringa

Grown for its leaves and fresh pods, the tropical tree moringa has been cultivated on a small scale in the San Joaquin Valley. Now, University of California farm advisors hope to create a new market for the crop: selling dried, powdered moringa leaves as a dietary supplement. Most moringa powder sold in the U.S. is imported. The UC advisors have been working with small-scale Fresno County farmers to process local moringa powder.

## Investment in Sports

Today we're straying off money economics and delving into the topic of investing in a sport. And why not? Investing your time into learning a sport is as valid topic as investing one's money.

You've heard time is money and spending the time to learn a sport, much like investing, must have some sort of pay-back. The obvious pay-back to any sport, besides the lucky few who make oodles of money from it or become famous (think the NFL or NBA), is the enjoyment one gets from playing. The investment part is how much work (practice) is required to be able to get good at it and subsequently enjoy enough to make the time learning it worthwhile.

Some may call it a learning curve and we have all tried one sport or another. Some sports we have stuck with, others we may have given up for whatever reason.

Obviously the harder a sport is to learn, the flatter the learning curve. I've played a number of sports and spent literally decades in martial arts. One of the flattest learning curves I have ever experienced (in other words the hardest sport to learn) was windsurfing. back on the board, I must have burned a million calories. I did after much pain, learn and enjoyed it immensely.

On the flip side about two years ago I was introduced to the game of Pickle ball.

Having played racquetball for decades, and tennis, upon picking up a pickle ball racquet, I found it the easiest game on the planet to learn. Being the fastest growing sport in the country, obviously many others have found it easy to learn and get proficient at it as well.

How easy is pickle ball?

Literally stupid easy.

So easy in fact, it seems everybody claims to be an expert at it. I have to admit, I have met more people I know that play this game, and although I haven't played it more the handful of times, my racquetball experience has bled over to pickle ball and I will bet anyone willing to play me I can either beat them or give them one hell of a game. It's that easy, at least for me.

I think I've figured out why so many tennis and racquetball players, and indeed the average Joe and Jane are gravitating to pickle ball. The investment in time to learn it is minimal.

Literally anyone who plays it can get proficient at it in a surprisingly short amount of time. That's one payback. There are many others that keep people coming back.

Unlike tennis, one gets a lot more hits at the ball without having to chase the ball very far.

Pickle ball is like giant ping pong, played with a whiffle type plastic ball and oversized wood or plastic paddles. This

means the ball doesn't go very far and you can whack the hell out of it.

The court is dinky so the distance from one end to the other is but a few steps. That means both old and young, able and un-abled bodied people can play. I've seen people with oxygen tanks on the court, people with limps and bad knees and older women who can seemingly barely move be able to give a competitive game.

The rules are simple and I think the real hooks are it is, like I said, stupid easy, and one gets ten times the hits per minute than any other racquet sport. You also don't have move much and did I mention its crazy fun?

Since it's so easy, everybody thinks they're an expert, and you'll find more than a few people will be willing to step in and help you out sort of speak.

However for a person like me who has spent his whole life playing a variety of sports, I find the constant kibitzing quite irritating.

Yea, I got it. You hit the stupid ball.

Pickle ball. Give it a try. You'll love it.







## Nicaraguan Military Arrests Four ISIS Terrorists Stops Their Smuggling Into The United States

Costa Rica’s national security chief, Michael Soto, confirmed the men entered the country legally and were approved by his country’s immigration control officials “with no problem.” Soto also revealed that “confidential information from an unknown source” later alerted Costa Rican officials of the men’s “criminal” ties. Various Mexican media outlets also re-

ported that authorities there were warned that three—instead of four—ISIS operatives were making their way to the United States through Mexico via Central America. Mexico’s largest newspaper covered a press conference in which President Andrés Manuel López Obrador confirmed receiving an alert from the United States about the ISIS terrorists’ plan to enter Mexican territory to reach the American border.

Not surprisingly, the mainstream media has essentially ignored this disturbing story which is simply the latest of many involving Islamic terrorists and the southwest border. Judicial Watch has for years uncovered evidence of Islamic terrorists infiltrating the U.S. through Mexico as part of an ongoing investigation into the U.S. national security crisis created by the dangerously porous southern border. Judicial Watch has interviewed local, state and federal law enforcement officials as well as U.S. and Mexican military sources and has traveled to remote border towns to interview American ranchers. When the Central American caravan got started last fall, Judicial Watch deployed an investigative team to the Guatemala-Honduras border after Guatemalan President Jimmy Morales confirmed that nearly 100 ISIS terrorists had been apprehended in the impoverished Central American nation.

Judicial Watch’s reporting has confirmed that ISIS has a training cell just a few miles from El Paso, Texas in an area known as “Anapra” situated just west of Ciudad Juárez in the Mexican state of Chihuahua. We also verified that Mexican drug cartels are smuggling foreigners from countries with terrorist links to stash areas in a rural Texas town (Acala) near El Paso. Back in 2014 Judicial Watch reported that four ISIS soldiers, who entered the U.S. through the Mexican border, were arrested in McAllen and Pharr Texas. Two years ago, Judicial Watch exposed a plot involving Mexican drug traffickers that help Islamic terrorists stationed in Mexico cross into the U.S. to explore targets for future attacks. Among the jihadists that travel back and forth through the porous southern border is a Kuwaiti named Shaykh Mahmood Omar Khabir, an ISIS operative who lives in the Mexican state of Chihuahua not

far from El Paso. Khabir trained hundreds of Al Qaeda fighters in Pakistan, Afghanistan and Yemen and at the time lived in Mexico for more than a year, according to information provided to Judicial Watch by high-ranking Homeland Security officials. Khabir trains thousands of men—mostly Syrians and Yemenis—to fight in an ISIS base situated in the Mexico-U.S. border region near Ciudad Juárez, the intelligence gathered by Judicial Watch’s sources reveals.

Just a few weeks ago a captured ISIS fighter provided alarming details of a plot in which jihadists enter the country through the southern border to carry out an attack. The terrorists begin their journey in Central America (like the four recently captured in Nicaragua) and exploit vulnerabilities in the Mexican border to reach the U.S., according to Abu Henricki, an ISIS soldier captured by the Syrian Democratic Forces in Rojava, Syria. Henricki and 160 of his fellow terrorists were interviewed at length by a research group called the International Center for the Study of Violent Extremism. The non-partisan organization published its findings recently in an alarming report that includes a video of the interview with the captured terrorist, who is Canadian and has dual Trinidadian citizenship

“They were going to move me to the Mexican side [of the U.S. southern border] via Puerto Rico,” Henricki says about the ISIS plot. “This was mastermind[ed] by a guy in America. Where he is, I do not know. That information, the plan came from someone from the New Jersey state from America. I was going to take a boat [from Puerto Rico] into Mexico. He was going to smuggle me in,” Henricki explains. “I don’t know where I’d end up.” In the report, the researchers reveal that the ISIS fighters were to travel from Syria to penetrate the U.S. southern border by infiltrating migration routes.

“Whatever one thinks of President Donald Trump’s heightened rhetoric about the U.S.-Mexico border and his many claims that it is vulnerable to terrorists, ISIS apparently also thought so, as knowledge of this ISIS plot came from the mouth of a now-repentant ISIS cadre,” the report states.

Personal note: Remember 9/11

USDA meat inspection label on meat at the store means it was inspected by the USDA; not grown here exactly. This is why I want C.O.O.L. (country of origin label) back on or US meat. That tells you where it was born, raised and slaughtered. This is a local movement where people want to know where their food comes from and how it is processed.

GISA is Grain Inspected Packers & Stockyards Act of 1920, which the US Secretary of Agriculture Perdue outlawed.

We had C.O.O.L on meat until W.T.O. got our USA Congress to vote against C.O.O.L. in 2015 and our beef prices went .10 a pound lower and never recovered. WTO told Congress C.O.O.L. was detrimental to Canadian and Mexican imports. What about US producers and consumers?

In the USA mother cow herds have declined by 13 million head since the USA entered NAFTA 25 years ago and in that time we have lost 75% of our former feeders, who have gone out of busi-

ness.

After Congress dropped C.O.O.L. labels on USA meat, consumer prices did not drop. The USA lets International Monetary Fund (IMF) import live cattle from Canada to break our beef market (\$18 M worth) about the time calves are weaned to sell when green grass dries up. It happens every year.

Cattle are imported from Australia to Hawaii and I noticed not a single mother cow, calf or bull. They were all yearlings. They are imported live and SF Port sends them to Arbuckle feed lot. If they are here 60 to 90 days (on US soil) they are not considered imported.

One problem with other countries is that they do not have the same requirements as to chemicals we use on cattle here in the USA. It’s not apple to apple; it is not like kind.

In my opinion, Alzheimer’s is increased because of Canadian imported meat and the doctors are not checking for Mad Cow Disease in Alzheimer’s victims; which has increased 25% in the last 5 years.
