Placement of Sexually Violent Predators Signed Into Law

Sacramento, Ca.

On July 10, 2017, Governor Brown signed the Protect Our Communities Act (AB 255), authored by Assemblyman James Gallagher (R- Yuba City). The measure would require a court to consider residential, familial, or employment connections when they are determining counties for conditional release of sexually violent predators (SVPs).

"These repeat sexual offenders pose a serious threat, and rural counties shouldn't be a default dumping ground for them," said Gallagher. "Today we took an important step forward in ending this flawed practice that threatens our North State communities," Gallagher continued.

SVPs are frequently placed in areas where they have no community connections. These offenders are being disproportionately placed in rural coun-

ties, even though rural areas face unique public safety issues and do not have the capacity to monitor offenders from other counties. Earlier this year, the Department of State Hospitals placed a sexually violent predator from Monterey County in a home located in rural Marysville, where he has absolutely no family or historical connection.


These offenders should be placed in the counties they are from, but current state law allows the court to look at other placement counties if placement in the county of domicile is not possible. These alternative placements are often made in rural counties. AB 255 will require the court to look at community ties, such as whether they have family or employment connections to the area, when considering placement counties that are not the county of domicile.

Pets and Heat – A Deadly Combination *Part One*

Excessive heat is deadly to both wildlife and domestic animals. The dangers of heat are reported year after year hoping to prevent another death, yet pets still die. Dogs in our area have already died due to the heat.

Heat exhaustion or stroke can occur both in our homes and vehicles. Your dog or cat can collapse from the heat in their backyard or in their home if they are not kept cooled. They should not be confined to small places as they need a good air flow, shade and cool fresh water. If inside, air conditioning; if out then

fans and misters. If you do not have air conditioning, keep your dog cool by wiping him down with wet cloths, have frozen water jugs in an area he can lie next to and fans blowing.

Signs your animal is in distressed are: excessive panting, restless, glazed eyes, excessive thirst, vomiting, dark or bright red (may also turn pale) gums and tongue, lethargic, staggering, high body temperature (normal temperature is 101.5), excessive drooling, increased heart rate, seizures, collapse and unconsciousness. These are just a few of the symptoms. Your animal may exhibit only one or two of them. If they have any of the symptoms they need help immediately - don't delay in taking him to the veterinarian.

Vehicles are deadly to animals. Parking the vehicle in the shade and the windows cracked does not prevent the temperatures from climbing to dangerous levels. You think you will be only gone for a minute or two, but what happens if you can't find what you are looking for or there is a long line or you run into a friend who talks for a few minutes? This is what happens in a vehicle if it is 70 degrees outside, in 10 minutes the inside of that vehicle will

be 89 degrees and in 30 minutes it will be 104 degrees. If it is 95 degrees outside, in 10 minutes it is 114 degrees inside and in 30 minutes it is 129 degrees. If you love your pet do you really want to put him through this torture? You are not doing your dog/cat any favors by taking him with you. Leave him at home in air condition comfort with lots of cool water.

K9 officers are not exempt from dying in the heat, they are often left in cars with the air conditioning running but as evidenced last year with many K9 deaths, air conditioners fail and so do the alarm systems designed to prevent their deaths. Like any other dog they should not be left in a vehicle and certainly not for hours at a time. They need to be checked frequently and not just by peering inside - the inside temperature needs to be physically checked.

If your pet collapses with heat exhaustion, act quickly - place him in the shade, start cooling him by taking a wet cloth, wipe it over his neck, head, belly, between his legs, his pads and down his coat. Offer small sips of cool water, not cold water. You want to cool him rapidly but not too fast nor do you want to use ice as you could drop his temperature too low causing additional problems. If you have a thermometer and his temperature drops to 103 stop cooling him down. Take him to a veterinarian immediately. They may need to do additional treatment to stabilize him and heat exhaustion injuries can show up days later so he needs to be evaluated for internal damage immediately.

The summer has just begun let's do all we can to keep our loved ones alive. No one - not children, the elderly or animals- no one should be left in a vehicle on a hot day.

Our trip several weeks ago over to Bodega Bay and a stroll down the beach reminded me of an experience many years ago. On the way to the state park we drove by Petaluma and I was reminded of another trip to Dillon Beach. That particular weekend was back in the summer of 1973. I received a call from my friend John who told me him and his wife Barbara were going over to the cabin for the weekend and asked me if I would like to join them. Needless to say they picked me up at 6 P.M. that Friday evening.

Their cabin was really a small house with all the rooms one usually has for comfort and so on.

Barbara asked me if I would like to go with her fishing. Of course I agreed and she go out the old ladder in the storage shed out back and once in the garage and as I steadied the ladder she climbed up and brought down a cane pole about ten feet in length. It looked just like my frog gigging pole in the rafters of my garage except she showed me the end which had about six inches of heavy line and a large hook.

That morning I was introduced to a different kind of fishing. She called it "Poke Pole Fishing" and we only go out when the tide is out. She advised when the time is right the fish are still there, but are forced into

crevasses and holes in the rocks which are accessible by the poke pole.

Barbara secured a piece of squid on the hook and she began jumping from rock to rock which included wading a bit. After poking for about ten minutes she hollered and came up with a ling cod about six or seven pounds. I was amazed as she brought the fish to shore.

She told me this is the only way to catch fish in the rocks without donating half of your tackle box to constant snags.

Salmon are being caught in the Feather and Sacramento Rivers. The opening was last Saturday which had a bunch of eager anglers on the water even with the low water conditions of the Feather River. With reports from the bay area this year's salmon fishing will only get better as the season progresses.

We have been told trout were planted recently in the Gold Lake Basin in Sierra County.

Long Bar (Part 4)

Ranching along the Yuba River (alfalfa, corn, fruit trees, cattle) and into the valley slowly began to die as more and more land was covered in" slickens or pipe clay" and was hastened by subsequent battering storms in the 1870's and 80's. Dr. C.E. Stone who practiced in Long Bar for 14 years, treating people in their homes, was an important witness in the Woodruff-Bloomfield suit brought by a downstream farmer against a mining company. He described the Hostetter and Quinlay vineyards partially covered in 1861-1862 and as only a small part cultivable by 1875. Dr. Stone testified "I bathed in the river every morning until 1862. Water was clear in the morning at Long Bar and muddy in afternoon". He said the Briggs, Pumyea, McAdams, and Schinkle ranches were covered with mining debris overgrown with willows. This court action known as the Sawyer decision had far reaching effects and effectively ended hydraulic mining.

As the town of Long Bar sank beneath the gravel and tailings and people moved farther and farther into the foothills or moved away entirely the school, located at the corner of Peoria and Sicard Flat Roads continued, its population rising and falling. Henry Smith, noted rancher in Yuba County, graduated from

Long Bar in 1946. He remembers walking barefoot to school from where he lived in the Rock House on the Smith Ranch, playing Steal the Stick, and stoking the pot bellied stove with wood in the winter. There was

no electricity, no bathrooms and if a student wanted a drink of water it had to be pumped with a hand pump at the well. Henry says around 1940 as the Depression was ending, families camped all along Dry Creek and sometimes 30-40 children would come to school for awhile until they moved on. It was around this time that turkeys were introduced into the foothills of Yuba County and if they were near the school students tried to capture one for dinner. The school closed in 1946 after Henry finished and the building sat idle for a couple of years. Hay was stored in the structure until the hay and the building burned down one Spring morning in 1950. An ignominious ending for a venerable building. Another barn on Sicard Flat road filled with hay burned the same early morning Arson was suspected.

The current owner of the Long Bar School property is Harry Barajas who is searching for old photos or memorabilia of the area. He hopes to have some type of historical memorial on the site. All that remains today are the stone steps and the cistern.

Perhaps the best epitaph for Long Bar is the one written in Thompson and West "History of Yuba County" in 1879: " The river flows over and around the site of the old mining camp, forming part of it into an immense sand and willow island".

Celebrating the Opening of the Wheatland Museum

There are no copyrights to any of this material. Many books can be found that address the history and impact of the Yuba Sutter area.

This article contains ample quotations and prosaic borrowing. I am not a historian and I was not there.

Three primary instances occurred in 1920 that changed American society. Those occurrences had unique affects upon Marysville, and the Yuba Sutter Area had profound influence upon America.

Firstly, prohibition. Throughout 1917-18 the German community was marginalized by the nation's war against Germany, and the brewing industry was shut down in state after state by the legislatures and finally nationwide under the Eighteenth Amendment in 1920. The Yuba Sutter area has a unique relationship with beer, from Sutter's Hop Farms of 1840's to the largest hop farms in the country

nearWheatland.Throughout California history, beer helped maintain the fortunate economy of the Yuba Sutter area. Marysville chose to celebrate freedom by ignoring prohibition. While a long way from Washington D C., Marysville was a short ride on a trolley from San Francisco and Sacramento. Marysville became a destination for club hopping, shopping, parks, movies and general enjoyment. Marysville's reputation for recreation lasted until around 1975. Yuba City, in contrast, respected the Eighteenth Amendment.

Also, on August 18th, 1920, the 19th Amend-

ment passed Congress ratifying women's right to vote. The first thing that many women did was to cut their hair, burn their corsets and invest in elaborate hats. This closely mirrored women's rights from1850, when the first California Governor Mariano Vallejo reserved the legal right for women to own property. Under both Mexican and Spanish rule, women had enjoyed the right to own property and that right was maintained in the California Constitution. While banned in most states, in California women owned dairies, farms and city buildings. Their transition to voting was relatively natural. Interestingly, in 1850 the first woman to vote in the United States was a mule-skinner working out of Marysville named Charley Parkhurst. She could vote because everyone believed that she was a man. When she died her vote was quietly struck from the records.

Another occurrence was in Yuba City history, the formation of the Peach Grower's Association in 1920. Because peaches were such an important crop during the formation of California we see another important link between the 1920's and the 1850's. Early peach trees helped feed Gold Rush pioneers. By the 1920's, this crop had inspired technological innovations such as refrigerated railroad cars, freezing, drying and canning techniques.

The crop also inspired an unprecedented influx of migrant workers. Sutter County typically employed 1200 workers, in Yuba County 1000 workers, but during peach harvesting season the need was 10,000 workers or more. While year-round farm laborers were specialists in their fields and well paid, short-term workers were also relatively well paid. Many were from nearby farms and villages. At that time, 85% of all American citizens lived and worked on farms

When you walk the streets of Marysville remember these three things: prohibition, women voting and peaches. Most of the commercial buildings received new facades during the 1920's, when flapper's roared, peaches rode the rails and the beer flowed freely. Beneath the bricks are older buildings, those built by emigrants that braved great dangers and survived to build big, ridiculous houses. Walk-

ing in Marysville, you will see Victorian residences, Victorian buildings with Art Deco facades, Art Deco Buildings, and lots of Art Deco Residences. As in decades past, Marysville was a magnet known internationally for lush living and prosperity. The sweet, full taste of life was found in Marysville like no other place in America in the 1920's.

This attraction proved almost fatal when the agricultural tables turned in 1930.

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

Conditional Use Permit CUP2017-0001 (Avondale Self-Storage): The project consists of a conditional use permit (CUP) that would allow the operation of a new self-storage facility on two parcels that are 9.05 acres in size. The project site is located at 5958 Avondale Avenue (APN's 020-160-037 & 020-160-041) in the unincorporated community of Linda.



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Really, Is The Rapture Going to Happen?

YES, really! It is going to happen! Jesus said that He was going to prepare a place for us in His Father's house and that He would return and take us to Himself. (John 14:2-3)

Paul wrote that the Lord will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. (1 Thess. 4: 15-16) Paul also wrote that after that, we, who are still alive and are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. (1 Thess. 4:17) The Word of God tells us that God will redeem my life from the grave; He will surely take me to Himself. (Psalm 49:15)

Revelation 12:1 describes the great sign in the sky, about the woman expecting a child, and the sign of the red dragon is described in Rev. 12:3. Scott Clarke of ERF-Ministries.com (Eternal Rhythm Flow Ministries), has videos, which use the computer program, Stellarium, to show the movements of the heavenly bodies. The videos show the location of this great sign, which will be fulfilled on September 23, 2017. That is within the 48-hour celebration of The Feast of Trumpets, this year, which begins on September 21st.

Revelation 12:5 describes the male child being snatched up to heaven, to be saved from the red dragon. (Rev. 12:4) There is a quote in Rev. 2:26-27, from Psalm 2:9, which states that those who overcome and do His will until the end will be given the authority to rule over the nations with an iron scepter, just as He has received authority from His Father. The "child" is the body of Christ! Some people have explained this logically. Jesus was already born, and He ascended into heaven. Therefore, the child being born is not Jesus. Jesus is the head of everything for the church which is His body. (Ephesians 1:22-23)

The rapture of the Bride of Christ (Rev. 19:7) will happen, prior to the Tribulation. God's Word has stated that His people will not suffer the wrath of God. (Isaiah 26:20; 1 Thessalonians 1:10; 1 Thessalonians 5:9; Rev. 3:10) The Wrath of God is described in Revelation 8:7 forward. Additional descriptions regarding the Wrath of God can be found in Revelation 14:19, Revelation 15:1, and Revelation 16: 1 forward.

The rapture scriptures and those for the Second

Coming of Christ have often been confused, because Jesus will have two appearances in the clouds. In Matthew 24:3, the disciples of Jesus asked Him about the sign of His coming and the end of the age. Jesus' discourse was about His return to earth and the end of time. When Jesus said that no one would know the day or the hour, He was referencing when heaven and earth would pass away. (Matthew 24:35-36) Jesus' second coming to earth is when He stands on Mt. Zion. (Zechariah 14:4; Rev. 14:1) In Matthew 24:15-16, Jesus referred to the prophet Daniel (Daniel 9:27) and the need to flee to the mountains. Jesus told His disciples, in Matthew 24:22, that if those days hadn't been shortened, no one would survive, but for the sake of the elect, those days will be shortened. The elect are people going through the Tribulation, who converted to Jesus after the rapture. Within His response, in Matthew 24:29, He told them about the time, immediately after the distress of those days. Matthew 24:30-31 is a description of Jesus' Second Coming, as well as the gathering of His elect from the four winds. The four winds are from the North, South, East, and West parts of the earth. There is no doubt that Jewish people will be included as Jesus fulfills His Word. Isaiah 37:32a states, "For out of Jerusalem will come a remnant, and out of Mount Zion a band of survivors." "...I will forgive the remnant I spare." (Jeremiah 50:20) "... Israel, my chosen..." (Isaiah 45a) In Isaiah 54:5, the Word of God states to the Jewish people, "... your Maker is your husband..."

Jesus fulfilled the first four Feasts of the Lord through His death, lying in the grave, resurrection, and sending His Holy Spirit to His disciples. Those were the spring feasts. The other three Feasts of the Lord are the fall feasts.

Jesus said, regarding His return, to earth, that He would come in the clouds with the trumpet blast. (Matthew 24:30) Jesus also told His disciples that they were to keep watch, because they did not know on what day He would return. (Matthew 24:42; Matthew 25:13)

The Jewish people would have understood the trumpet blast and "No One Knows the Day or the Hour" meant the Feast of Trumpets. The fifth Feast of the Lord is a two-day feast, which started when the new moon was seen,

on the 29th day of the month or on the 30th day of the sixth month, which was also the last month of the year, on the agricultural calendar. The Feast of Trumpets is called "The Last Trump." Paul wrote, in 1 Cor. 15:51-53, that the dead in Christ and those still alive would be changed at the last trumpet. Remember that Paul had been "Saul" a Jewish Pharisee. When the 100 blasts of the trumpets are blown, it is the one long blast of the shofar, the ram's horn, that is the last trumpet. Paul didn't use the words, "the last trumpet," without meaning. Paul certainly understood Leviticus 23:24, regarding the feast on the first day of the seventh month, which was a sacred assembly commemorated with trumpet blasts.

Jesus' statements would be as clear to the Jewish people as the following statement would be to people in the United States. "Some year, I am taking a vacation in December, because I want to personally watch the ball drop." You would know, clearly, that the person intends to be in New York City, on December 31st, to celebrate the New Year. You just wouldn't know the day of the week, until you knew which year the person was going to travel.

So, is there any hope for people who are not yet believers in Jesus as Lord and Savior? Yes!

In Acts 16:26, there is a description of a great earthquake happening, while Paul and Silas were in prison. Thinking that the prisoners had escaped, the jailer was about to end his own life. Paul quickly called out that they were still there. The jailer asked in verse 30, what he must do to be saved. In verse 31, Paul and Silas answered, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved - you and your household."

In addition to watching for the Lord coming in the air, is there anything that we are to do? Yes! In Matthew 22:37-39, it states, "Jesus replied, 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind,' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" The bodies, of the believers in Jesus as Lord and Savior, are the temple of God and the Holy Spirit lives within us. (1 Corinthians 3:16) It is the Holy Spirit, within us, who enables the light of Christ to shine in our hearts. Isaiah 61:10 tells us to rejoice in God, for He has clothed us with garments of salvation and a robe of righteousness. Be ambassadors for Christ. (2 Cor. 5:20) So, everyone share the Good News! Pray for conversion of souls and that hearts are set on fire for Jesus. Pray to hear His voice and do His will. Share this writing electronically or on a hard copy.

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Food and Farm News

Fresh peaches see rising demand
 Demand for California-grown fresh peaches has increased this year. Farmers say that's in part because they have a better crop than peach growers in other parts of the country, where weather problems hurt yields. A preseason crop forecast projected California production of fresh, freestone peaches would grow about 13 percent this season. Production of canning-variety peaches is also expected to rise.

UC tests avocado production in San Joaquin Valley
 Nearly all California avocados come from regions near the Southern California coast, but University of California specialists are testing varieties that could thrive in the San Joaquin Valley. Test plantings are underway in three places. Finding avocados that produce well in interior locations would allow avocado marketers to extend the season for California-grown fruit.

Farmers express concern on electric-rate proposals
 Proposed changes in time-of-use electric rates could pose challenges for California farmers. Utilities have asked to revise their peak and off-peak times, when electricity prices rise or fall. Farmers and their representatives say changes could disrupt irrigation schedules and other agricultural operations. Three hearings will be held in July and August on a Pacific Gas & Electric Company rate proposal.

Heat wave could affect butter production
 Butter production could eventually be affected by the June California heat wave: That's the conclusion of an American Farm Bureau market analysis. Cows typically produce less milk--and less milkfat--during hot weather. The analysis says that could ultimately affect the amount of butter produced in California, which accounts for about 30 percent of the nation's production. But it's unknown whether any impact would be noticeable at the grocery store.
