Forbestown Daze

As the peak days of summer settle over northern California, the historic gold rush town of Forbestown comes alive with its annual community celebration of Forbestown Daze on Saturday, August 5, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Located in the foothills above Oroville, Forbestown is proud of its heritage as the destination for many immigrants from the eastern United States and from foreign lands who came seeking their fortunes among the quartz seams and tall forests of the Sierras in the 1800s.

The day begins with the traditional patriotic raising of our nation's flag at the Yuba Feather Museum and Gold Trader Flat. The hoisting of the Stars and Stripes and playing of the Star Spangled Banner will be conducted by Boy Scout Troop 6400 and local Veterans of Foreign Wars George Steiner Post 10135. Then, throughout this day of "living history," visitors mingle with costumed docents, lawmen and gun fighters in



Gold Trader Flat, an interpretive village lovingly constructed by descendants of the early pioneers as well as by more recent transplants. Inside the Museum, curated exhibits display the way people lived and worked during the gold rush era from the expert basketry of the first peoples to the "green gold" of the lumber industry. On the boardwalks and along the streets of Gold Trader Flat, visitors can tour

the establishments of a typical gold rush town from chapel to saloon and homestead to hotel while listening to the strains of old time music, sipping ice cold sarsaparilla and filling up with hearty chow.

Our blacksmith Jeb Swart will be turning out his marvels at the forge, Donna Hankins will be peddling her toys and souve-

Jefferson Meeting **Exposes False** Accusations by Lou Binninger

On Saturday, July 29th, more than 150 leaders from the State of Jefferson movement throughout Northern California came to Yuba City for a meeting at Church of Glad Tidings.

They were there at the request of State of Jefferson Chaplain Dave Bryan to address rumors and expose fake news and slander directed toward the Jefferson movement and its founder Mark Baird. Bryan also wanted to see a reconciliation of any factions resulting from misunderstanding or offenses over the last 3 ½ years since the movement began.

A Dave Hodges radio broadcast was played claiming that more than \$300,000 collected to fund an ongoing legal action by Jefferson against the State of California for lack of representation was being wasted on the endeavor. Hodges said pursuing the lawsuit was intended to deplete funds and destroy the

Further, Hodges explained 'his un-named inside sources' revealed that George Soros and MoveOn.org had infiltrated the organization to undermine it so the Cal Exit effort could succeed. More details were promised by Hodges to come later.

Hodges also predicted that the Cal Exit advocates would somehow sabotage Oroville Dam causing a breach where the catastrophe would lead to the federal government allowing the state to secede from the union.

Local radio host Paul Preston and friend of Hodges was also noted at the meeting as claiming Mark Baird, the unofficial and unpaid leader of the movement, had misused Jefferson funds and would soon be held criminally accountable for his mis-

Mark Kent, who set-up Jefferson's 501 (c) 4 and oversees the monies given for the lawsuit, was at the meeting and took offense



Family of the Year at the **Nevada County Fair**

Brad and Alana Fowler have been named the 2017 Family of the Year by the Nevada County Fair's Board of Directors. The Board chose the Fowler Family for their ongoing commitment. participation and volunteer efforts in the livestock program at the Nevada County Fair.

Brad and Alana, who were both born and raised in Nevada County, have been attending the Fair since they were children. Alana started showing animals in 4-H at nine years old and continued through high school in FFA; and Brad showed throughout high school in FFA. Since that time, they've continued to help in the show arenas, volunteer on Treat Street, work in educational booths, assist at the Junior Livestock Auction, set up various displays, and clean barns after the Fair. Today, they spend countless hours in the livestock barns, helping their own children, as well as other youth exhibitors, prepare their animals for the Fair.

The Fowlers, who will celebrate their 20th wedding anniversary this year, have five daughters - Macey, 14; Molly, 12; Morgan, 10; Wendy, 7; and Wyatt, 7. All their children have been involved with livestock since birth, and have been showing and exhibiting at the Fair since they were young. The older girls started with pygmy goats and rabbits and moved to beef and dairy. Their oldest three daughters raise steers for the Junior Livestock Auction, and their youngest daughters entered Mutton Bustin' last year. The girls have each started their own herds of various species, so in addition to bringing steers to the Fair this year, the oldest three girls will also bring

some of their own breeding animals, both beef and dairy cattle, to show. The youngest girls help their sisters and have their own animals that will be the foundation for the future livestock they exhibit at the Fair. Additionally, Macey works with several horses during the week, trading for lessons; Molly plays volleyball; and Morgan competes in track.

Not surprisingly, when asked about their favorite memories at the Fair, both share fond memories of their time with the livestock community. "My favorite part of the Fair is watching the Junior Livestock Exhibitors show their animals," says Brad. "Fair is also important to me because I get to see people in the community." Alana echoes his comments. "Fair is like a family vacation with friends and family," she says. "I love to see the livestock exhibitors sharing their knowledge of these animals with families that visit."

When not busy at the Fair, Alana reports that "life outside of Fair is much like Fair." They are self-employed, and for the past 10 years they have sold pasture-raised hogs, turkeys and chickens, as well as grass fed beef, lamb and goat directly to consumers in Nevada County. They also use goats and sheep for fire prevention grazing throughout Nevada, Placer and Yuba counties. Outside of work, the Fowlers are involved with the Nevada County Farm Bureau, the Nevada County Food and Farm Conference, Nevada County 4-H, Nevada County Food Policy Council, and Nevada County Livestock Producers.

"The Fowler's involvement in the livestock community, and their countless hours of volunteering at the Nevada County Fair, embody the community spirit that makes up the Nevada County Fair," said Rea Callender, CEO of the Fairgrounds. "We are thrilled to be able to recognize them as the 2017 Fair Family of the Year."

The Fowler Family will be honored at the Fair's opening ceremony. They will receive a Fair package, as well as a family portrait by Shaffers Originals of Grass Valley. The 2017 Nevada County Fair is August 9 – 13.

Yuba-Sutter **Political Notes**

Yuba County Clerk-Recorder Terry Hansen announced she will be campaigning for another term in office. Other than the court system the Clerk-Recorder office may have more face to face contact with the public than any other county department.

The office keeps track of the complex and changing laws on elections, conducts elections, and keeps candidates briefed on compliance issues. It handles voter registration and the integrity of the registration list. People wanting marriage and other licenses, passports, or to record any document come through that office. The Clerk keeps the details of births, marriages, deaths, name changes, real estate and more.

A poorly managed county office can create havoc for the citizens. Fortunately, Hansen's is easy to work with and seems efficient and effective doing the people's business. Her workers are knowledgeable and Hansen actually returns calls promptly.

Marysville can't seem to get ahead. The story of \$17 million debt on 5 acres worth \$1.5 million should be engraved on a monument to remind future generations that government has no business gambling with the people's future. The debt will outlive those council members who created it at no personal cost to them. Even if the property is sold the city still has to pay the balance on the bonds.

After the council got its 1% sales tax increase and up to \$1.5 million in extra cash annually, \$288,000 will go to the state for a fine because Marysville employees were too lazy to complete quarterly reports to the Dept. of Water Resources.

After borrowing \$700,000 from Yuba County to leverage a multi-million dollar grant to upgrade drains, streets, sidewalk and gutters at 12th and J nothing was ever done though the project was pitched to Yuba County as shovel-ready. The loan, interest and administrative fee were repaid and the residents in the area are still waiting for a resolution to annual flooding.

The city was offered an opportunity to join the Linda Water Agency to upgrade its water treatment facilities years ago where Marysville could send its waste water and sewage. Marysville chose to stick with its antiquated system in the flood zone until the Regional Water Quality Board threatened fines saying the sewage ponds had to go. Now, city residents will be paying more than they had to by piping their fluids to Linda because they procrastinated and missed an opportunity to join Linda Water in the first place to obtain a \$10 million grant.

Now, the contractor to build the pipeline to the Linda Treat-

One reservoir that

now has these feisty fighters is located in the foothills of the Coast Range. I am referring to Lake Berrvessa, which is located near Winters. At this writing these rainbows are exciting lots of anglers with limits of fish running up to three pounds. Apparently the trout are holding down to 35 or 40 feet. The fish have been hitting on spoons and lures. There is a problem for anglers on this lake which is lots of boat and wave runner traffic.

The salmon fishing has been slow on both the Feather and Sacramento Rivers. Things should pick up into August and September.

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

Late June ushered in some exceedingly hot weather and July tempered that a bit with a very pleasant but very temporary bit of relief. One doesn't have to live in the area for long to know that our summer weather is usually just hot with little pockets of relief. For most people it is a month for upkeep - not lots of gardening. It is a time that gives one some time to plan what they might like to do in the yard as fall approaches. August leads us right into the beginning of the fall season, but don't let that fool you, August is usually one of our hottest months.

As we begin to exit the summer heat and look ahead to coming fall months, there are lots of things that can be done in the yard. Perennials can be planted now to become well established before going dormant. They will then be stronger plants as they emerge next spring. Think about Coreopsis, Gaillardia, Shasta Daisy, Rudbeckia, Penstemon, and many others that could add beauty and interest to your yard next spring. Keep dead heading the annuals that were planted earlier to keep them blooming longer. If you have a vegetable garden, harvest the vegetables frequently to extend their production. Pumpkins and melons in the garden should be kept up out of the wet soil to prevent developing a rotted spot in the rind. Perhaps you are planning to plant a winter garden this fall. If you happen to have some younger kids that live or perhaps are frequent visitors in your house with the frequent lament "I'm

bored", or "I don't have

create some interest and help by engaging them in planting seeds for winter veggies. They can be planted in small peat pots and when they are ready to be planted plant pot and all. Some people plant them in old egg cartons which should work pretty well. It is less expensive than buying vegetable starts for a large garden. Root vegetables such as carrots and beets can be planted now and be ready for harvest next spring.


While It is still very hot, continue to deep water younger trees in the yard one or two times a week to maintain a healthy root system. This should be done until a tree is about three years old, tapering off the frequency gradually. A reminder that citrus trees should be fed monthly with citrus food except for the coldest winter months. Don't promote growth during those months because any new tender growth

anything to do", you might iron, not fertilizer. Iron will green them up without encouraging new growth. It doesn't take much, and it will gradually green up the foliage. Follow the directions on the iron product you purchase and be patient. Remember to always water a plant well before fertilizing and water the fertilizer in well following its application. This is particularly important when the weather is hot since they will take the water up quickly if they are thirsty and the fertilizer can cause leaf burn if they were not adequately watered when it was applied.

We have had a lot of hot weather this summer and I will bet most of us are looking forward to fall - I know I am!


Preston, a spokesperson for the Sutter Buttes Tea Party Patriots is now working with Tea Party members to nurture a 'Jefferson' splinter group

Investing doesn't always necessarily mean money. We can invest in many things. We can invest in our homes by keeping up with the maintenance, our bodies by eating healthy and exercising, our minds by education and in a host of other things that might need our attention and hence our "investment".

Kitty Cannon says they are always looking for foster families as the need is ongoing. Many families host more than one child and since it preferred siblings stay together, there is an obvious need for households who can accommodate multiple children.

Investing in our community can take many forms, and hosting a foster child or two is one way we can help. Not only do we help our future generation of adults start off from a healthier launching pad, the rewards that we receive may be more than we expect. I am told relationships special which may last a lifetime often develop and the feeling one can get from helping another human being can be a once in lifetime experience. I speak from experience. 19 years ago I became a mentor to a troubled teen through the Big Brothers program and we are still

good friends to this day. Next month my "teen" will be 35 years old!

Marysville Asks to be Treated Equally

Community leaders are used to hearing criticisms about something we've said or done. That's fair game if you want to be in the public eye. When the criticisms are warranted, we try to learn from them for the future; when they aren't, we understand that people have a right to express themselves and say what's on their minds. After all, these are generally our friends and neighbors. and they know that we'll pay attention to what they have to say.

Recently, however, several city council members made what we believed to be a simple request of the Yuba County Water Agency. The board of directors of the agency was meeting to consider a request of the County government for a low-interest loan to help the County deal with its large retirement program expenses. The County's proposal for a loan was a reasonable one; if approved by the Water Agency; County taxpayers would save money on a large County obligation coming due this month. The benefits of that are obvious.

Because the City of Marysville is in exactly the same position as the County in dealing with retirement program costs, several of us council members were at the Water Agency's board of directors meeting to ask the board for the same consideration they were giving the county government, and make a similar loan to the City to allow taxpayers of Marysville to share those savings. We feel we were making a reasonable request, entirely in line with what the County was asking- and received- of the Water Agency.

The City's request for a meeting to consider such a loan was denied. That's the Board's prerogative, and we have no complaint about that. But some members of the Board, Andy Vasquez in particular, made what were wholly unfounded. hysterical statements that were not only factually inaccurate, but were uncalled for from a public official acting in his official capacity. The fact that the City was asking the Board to consider the very same sort of a loan to cover pension costs that the County was requesting, is not, as Mr. Vasquez asserted, evidence that the City failed to plan ahead or to act reof its finances. If that were true, the County would be equally guilty of poor financial management in its conduct. After all, we were asking for exactly the same thing as the County was asking.

The Yuba County Water Agency is a public agency owned by the people of Yuba County. If it can see its way clear to making a large loan to the County government to ease County's pension costs, it is entirely reasonable that an identical request from the City of Marysville should be given the same, courteous consideration, free emotional outbursts and inflammatory rhetoric based upon a profound ignorance of the facts.

Timing of the FERC Delay **Letter Was Wrong**

At first glance, the letter requesting FERC to delay the Oroville license was based upon the community concerns, and finding out who is to blame for the failure. This reason is why I believe many signed onto this and under those reasons it's a reasonable request.

We all experienced

this disaster and narrowly missed losing everything we have behind this "spillway failure." Everyone agrees we do not ever want to experience this again. Yet will this letter approach help to fix the issue or not? My problem with the

letter—it's timing is wrong and may jeopardize everyone's lives for another event next year. Being experienced with FERC may add to our thinking base, we know exactly what it takes to obtain a FERC license. It takes negotiating infrastructure improvements, public safety and public recreation with so many agencies. It takes years—Oroville is over 12. Yet with approval comes the included projects that will bolster the local economy. The Oroville Mayor made these comments during their city council meeting about this letter. She was correct.

In this case we are all currently hoping that the spillway repairs get accomplished by the time we need it to be working. We all agree on that right?

FERC is a federal regulatory commission of nonelected commissioners. As of this date they do not have a "quorum" as many appointments are being held up behind delayed congressional hearings.

The deciding factor for me was considering that FERC must approve the final plan for the spillway repair. Yes that is right, they need to be a part and make this happen NOW. FERC has people on the spillway regularly now. Can we afford a risk of misunderstanding?

While I have been assured that this license delay request is separate from the repair approvalthere have been ZERO assurances made that this is indeed fact. The timing of this letter is off base for the true safety and wellbeing of our residents. After the approval of the repair design- that would be the right time.

I could not risk signing onto a request that may directly or indirectly jeopardize the lives of our community without the assurances that this action would not delay the repair design approval process. Immense pressure was exerted to have us sign on, yet again NO assurances that the message would not be misunderstood by FERC. After all the government never has communication problems, right- ohh wait?? I wanted you to know why I said no. Even if it's not popular keeping the repair the priority needs to be the target

Feather River The is now facing a crisis that can no longer be Last winter's ignored. unusually heavy rain, resulted in partial failure of the Oroville Dam structure, requiring unusual management of the dam. The subsequent rapid rise and fall of the outflow resulted in extreme erosion downstream dumping millions of tons of material into the river channel. This has raised the bottom of the river, restricted flow and put additional pressure on our levees.

The obvious answer to the problem is to dredge and initiate the process immediately. Other rivers have been successfully dredged for

decades while the environment has survived and, in fact, prospered as a result. The vast Mississippi River system is a great example. So, the following question is posed, "Why isn't the Feather River and the Sacramento River being routinely dredged? This would maintain an open channel, enhance flood control, recapture valuable fill that could be used elsewhere, improve recreational use, improve our salmon runs and, once again, allow the rivers to be used for

transportation. If this common sense solution is blocked because of arbitrary buregulations reaucratic and our communities are placed in jeopardy by the blockage of our rivers then the citizens need to make their voices heard and demand an answer. Government agencies are spinning out of control with little no consequences. The poor management of our rivers is just one example of government getting in the way. As President Reagan once said," Government isn't the solution to a problem, government is the problem".



A Disaster Creates Gold Rush

As with all disasters there's a little bit of hope that can be found and so it is with the Oroville Dam disaster when on February 12, 1017 the dam overtopped it's emergency spillway endangering the lives of over one million Californians but brought up new gold from the soils of Oroville.

Oroville Dam is an earthfill embankment dam built by the California Department of Water Resources (DWR), Oroville Dam is one of the key features of the California State Water Project (SWP).

Oroville Dam is the largest earthfilled dams in the United States standing at 770 feet high and impounds Lake Oroville, the second largest man-made lake in the state of California, capable of storing more than 3.5 million acre-feet water.

The emergency was prompted by a broken main spillway that occurred on February 7, 2017 which forced a frantic decision by the California Department of Water Resources to reduce the amount of water flowing over the main spillway thus allowing the reservoir to suddenly rise. As water 'inflows' from the Feather River continued to enter the reservoir the water level of the dam continued to rise out of control as 'outflows' were not matched by the main spillway. By February 11, 2017 water from the reservoir started to overtop the og weir of the emergency spillway.

I visited the top of the dam at the og weir at noon on February 11, 2017 and witnessed the water overtopping of the weir. I was stunned at the size of the overtopping but was even more shocked by what was obvious erosion taking place in front of the of the weir on the 'dirt deck'. Yes the dirt deck. I asked a couple of workers on top of the dam why the DWR was allowing the water over the emergency spillway and their response took me by surprise. There was no discussion about the damaged main spillway but rather DWR was concerned there might be damage to fish habitat downstream in the Feather River by high flows over the main spillway!



With 2 systems out of control the DWR was rapidly losing control of the dam. The dam had become an 'out of control' dam threatening millions of people's lives and the destruction of one of the worlds most productive agricultural areas.

Erosion at the emergency spillway was causing 'head cutting' back up toward the weir itself putting it at risk of collapse. If the og weir was to go a 30 foot wall of water would have emptied the top 20% of the reservoir and inundated the valley floor past Sacramento.

On February 12, 2017 around 3:30 pm over 27 hours after my observations on the dam Butte County Sheriff Kory Honea was told by DWR officials there was one hour before the head cutting would reach the og weir and it would collapse. Honea without hesitation ordered the evacuation of all people down stream of the Oroville

Dam. The largest evacuation in U.S. and California history of nearly 200,000 people.

Gold Rush!

The Feather river is major gold producing area and has enormous history from the 1849 California Gold Rush which prompted one of man kinds largest migrations right into the 'Golden State'.

Causing the new gold rush was the overtopping the emergency spillway and forcing the DWR to open the gates of the main spillway which destroyed much of the lower portion of the main spillway thus creating new channels cutting into the ground, taking soil off the bedrock. When the water stopped the damage revealed the gold bearing soils which ultimately found their way into the Feather River. Gold debris left behind by the damaged Oroville spillways has triggered 'gold fever'.

Now months later the gold from the Oroville Dam disaster is making it's way into the stores that are down stream of the dam where miners who have been panning gold in the Feather River are cashing in on the new gold rush. I've stopped by Yuba City Coin and Bullion several times to talk to the owners Ray and Angela Dimmick to gauge the impact of the gold rush and found the start of a 'real' modern day gold rush!

Both reported their business has jumped dramatically with people bringing in gold from the Feather River. Angela stated 'We're buying gold all day long."

Where's the gold and where can I buy gold panning equipment has now become the questions most asked by their customers and people from all around the country. I asked them if they were going to be the new Levi Strauss and outfit new miners to satisfy their fever? Angela said they were buying gold pans to meet their new found customer base.

Feather River Parkway Closed During Emergency Levee Repairs

The Feather River Parkway will be closed from July 31 -**December 31. 2017 for emergency levee repairs**

Emergency placement of 2.9 miles of seepage cutoff wall will cause the Feather River Parkway, located north of the 10th St. Bridge, to be closed from July 31st through December 31st, 2017. Repairs are necessary before next runoff event to ensure the safety of approximately 75,000 Yuba City and Sutter County citizens.

Levee distress was observed in downtown Yuba City during the High Water event in February of 2017. A particular area of distress is a historic portion of the levee that has failed in the past and been repaired multiple times, including repairs done following the 1997 High Water event.

Feather River Parkway

opened in 2013 to highlight the importance of local waterways to the City and surrounding community. With almost 90 acres to explore, it is the largest park in Yuba City and includes walking and biking trails, picnic areas, wheelchair-accessible scenic overlooks, a pavilion and other recreational amenities, as well as public education displays

describe the wildlife and habitat.

Though the temporary closure of the Feather River Parkway may come as an inconvenience to our community the repairs are required to ensure public safety and to protect damageable property. Gold Lake Campground Improvements

In the short term, ever resourceful Gold Lake 4x4 campers are providing their own portable "pack it in-pack it out" restroom accommodations as the last of the infamous pit toilets (or large capacity cesspools as they are known in the trade) have

been removed from the Plumas National Forest. The 4x4 Campground is located in the Lakes Basin Recreation Area in the eastern portion of the Forest.

Restroom logistics for this campground are tricky according to Beckwourth District Ranger Matt Jedra, who is responsible for the area. "This campground is accessible only by four wheel drive vehicle or boat and visitors want to maintain that experience," he said. Because it's impossible to negotiate the rugged trail access in order to pump a vault restroom unit, the Forest's facility

engineer found a different solution in new evaporative units which will be installed in time for next season's campers.

"Until the new units are in place, campers are utilizing the 'pack-it-in, pack-it-out' system which hasn't been a problem so far," according to Jedra. The 16 unit campground has no fees, water or garbage pickup.
