

Oregon House School Needs A New Lease On Life



Oregon House, California has a rich history. Just outside Marysville, in the Gold Country, families have resided in the small rural town of Oregon House and nearby Dobbins for many generations. The land for the first Oregon House School, built in 1854, was donated by Bill and Roma Johnson, which later became the Agnes Deen.

The old Agnes Deen Community Center sits in the center of Oregon House and acts as a historical landmark. Built in the 1870's during the gold rush the Agnes Deen was once a schoolhouse, named to memorialize one of its local schoolteachers. The small school of less than fifty students remained in operation until the late 1960's.

The original structure, in the rear of the building, is a basic post and beam construction. The updated front half features a solid foundation, extending out several feet to include a generous wrap-around porch. There is ample space around the building for outdoor activities.

The kitchen is spacious, and has the capacity to serve large groups. The Agnes Deen also offers a perfect location, as it is easily accessible from Rice's Crossing Road. Many of the locals pass this structure several times a day, and it is sad to see it go neglected. North Yuba Grown would like that to change. A revitalized Agnes Deen would be a place for people of Oregon

House to celebrate the history and successes of our community.

North Yuba Grown is a local non-profit dedicated to supporting community and agriculture, and wishes to offer this Community Center a new chapter. Oregon House is a growing foothill community currently offering attractions such as Cafe Collage, our own local gourmet restaurant, the Oregon House Farm Store, and the recently relocated Annie Ruth's at Lake Francis.

The Agnes Deen, could provide another attraction. North Yuba Grown would like to offer it as a place to collect artifacts

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Sutter County Gives Shooting Range Notice to Move

Twin Cities Rod and Gun Club operates the shooting range off Second Street in Yuba City, but was given notice by Sutter County General Services Director Megan Greve to look for a new home. Gary Kim, president of the club, informed supervisors April 11th about the developments and asked for help.

The club manages the public range for the county. Kim indicated he was speaking for more than 200 club members as well as local shooting enthusiasts.

Board Chairman Jim Whiteaker said he knew what was going on with the range and that Kim's problem is with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), not the supervisors. No further explanation was offered, just contact the FAA.

The club's facility, a second law enforcement range, as well as the adjacent airport are all on county property, but the FAA provides funding to the airport and sets guidelines for its operation and nearby activities.

Rod and Gun Club and National Rifle Association (NRA) members are wondering why there is a problem all of a sudden. The range is older than the supervisors and gets inspected by the NRA every two years. The county in the past has praised the club as a good tenant.

Is the range no longer compatible with the airport? Kim says other shooting ranges around the valley are neighbors with airports and aren't having FAA issues.

The club's lease expires June 30, 2017 and Kim had requested the normal one-year renewal. First, Greve said General Services would submit the new lease to supervisors for approval but it likely could be their last, blaming the FAA. Then, last week, Greve in an email said that a renewal would not be offered and that the club's tenancy would be month to month, then ended entirely.

Browns Valley is Home to PG&E's First Lithium-Ion Battery Storage Facility

Building on the success of its Vaca-Dixon and Yerba Buena (east San Jose) battery storage systems, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) recently deployed its third energy storage facility in Yuba County.

Co-located with PG&E's Browns Valley substation roughly 50 miles north of Sacramento, the new, 500 kilowatt/2000 kilowatthour battery storage system is PG&E's first lithium-ion energy storage facility and features Tesla Powerpack technology.



This battery storage system in Brown's Valley is PG&E's first lithium-ion energy storage facility and features Tesla Powerpack technology.

The facility features 22 Tesla Powerpacks, each about the size of a refrigerator, and will provide important services for balancing energy supply and demand, as well as for improving power quality and reliability for customers. The batteries' modular design is adapted from the technology used in Tesla's electric cars.

PG&E worked with Cupertino Electric, an electrical engineering and construction company headquartered in San Jose, on the design and installation of the facility.

"Browns Valley is a great example of PG&E's commitment to integrating new technologies and collaborating with leading companies to drive a clean energy future," said Roy Kuga, vice president, Grid Integration and Innovation, PG&E.

PG&E believes that battery storage can help customers save money and energy, address integration challenges associated with increasing penetration of renewables and distributed energy resources, and enhance the overall reliability of an ever-changing energy supply.

Fishing Lakes with Arctic Fox Flies – Denis Peirce

The Rooster Tails Fishing Club monthly breakfast will be held at the Auburn Elks Lodge on Pine Street on April 21. This event is open to club members, spouses, and non-member guests. Doors to the Lodge will open at 7:00 a.m. to share fresh brewed coffee. A fantastic \$13 wide-selection buffet breakfast is served at 8:00 am followed by a 9:00 am guest speaker, Denis Peirce, a prolific angler, who will give an instructional seminar on fishing with Arctic Fox trolling flies. Reservations are not necessary to attend the breakfast, but attendees are encouraged to arrive by 7:00 a.m. for a good seat.

Troll with Arctic Fox Flies for any predator fish species that eats other fish! Arctic Fox trolling flies & streamers have caught Coho & Chinook salmon; Eagle Lake Trout; monster mackinaw; striped bass; Pyramid cutthroat and countless rainbow trout & Kokanee.

Denis Peirce has been in the fly fishing industry as a sales rep, manufacturer and fly distributor since 1993. His interest in trolling flies began when he met Jay Fair, manufacturer of the Wiggle Fin Action Disc in the 1990's. Jay and Denis

teamed-up to making a winning combination of fly-designs, color, and fish-mesmerizing action to trolling flies and streamers.

Fly fishing to the average non-fly fishing person is often seen as casting super-small imitations of various insects, with complex (expensive) gear, with special strategies and skills to catch fish. The emphasis of fly fishing is presentation-casts and sighting fish among other techniques to be successful. However, using trolling flies with a fly rod versus using them trolled from a boat is an area of mutual applications. Special trolling flies called 'streamers' are just really big flies and in fly fishing terms, they are usually presented in an 'active retrieve' creating an illusion of swimming forage. Streamer flies are designed to attract largemouth bass, 'meat-eater' fish that dine on other fish, crawdads, leeches, and large aquatic insects. Trolling streamers requires less finesse than other types of flies and creates a great opportunity to catch fish when other methods might not be working. For the angler in the know, streamers provide a great alternative to conventional

lures when trolled from a boat with traditional rods and reels. Trolling flies can be used in conjunction with down riggers or long lined with minimal weight so the fight is without the drag of other fishing hardware.

The trolled Arctic Fox fly is designed to be used with the Wiggle Fin Action Disc which is a type of clear vibrating disc that when pulled through the water, creates a vibrating swimming action that is transferred to the fly. The deadly action draws fish to the fly often resulting in an explosive strike. The use of real Arctic Fox Fur versus feathers makes the Arctic Fox brand trolling fly durable even after several strikes.


Fox fur has the movement of marabou feather flies; however the fur has far greater tensile strength. Fox fur is tough and meant to protect the animal, and a superior fly tying material as well its white color can be dyed to a variety of bright colors. Available in multiple colors, each Arctic Fox Fly come with an Action Disc and rigged with a Gamakatsu octopus hook. Instructions are included with the individually package fly. The buzz around the valley and Delta is about the current striped bass run and of course sturgeon. We tend to forget there are other bass in most waters including black bass, both large and small mouth, crappie and the rest of the perch family, steelhead, all species of trout available now in reservoirs and the end of this month we have the general trout season opener for streams and rivers.

There is one fish which comes to mind whenever we have high water conditions. Actually these fish are available year round but tend to be more cooperative when the water rises and they cruise the otherwise dry areas for food. The fish I am referring to is the catfish. We have several species of this fish in California, but the channel cat seems to be the most abundant and popular. You will find these cats in rivers, streams, lakes, reservoirs, ditches and ponds which say the catfish will just about be swimming anywhere there is water.

Catfish tend to run in schools so if you catch

one chances are you will catch a lot more in that location. They also feed mostly by scent which means the cats will come to you if you are near their areas. This fish is almost 100% nose. What I mean is they can smell with their entire body. This is why some anglers swear by their "special stink bait" or using chicken livers which were left out of the frig overnight.

When a catfish takes your bait you will not see the fish break water but will make several runs with its head down. They put up a good fight and are excellent for a fish dinner.

Catfish are not caught only with bait, but have been caught on spinners, crankbait and live minnows. The fish will eat anything that is dead or alive. Some of the favorite "tidbits" are minnows, crayfish, and water bugs and so on.

Catfish do not have scales but have skin. They also have a sharp barb at the end of each fin including the one on top of the back of the fish. We highly

recommend using caution when handling these fish due to the barbs having a poison like substance that hurts like heck if you get stuck with one.

Lots of people disregard the catfish as a dirty scavenger which is no fit to eat. I can attest to the fact that catfish filets fried in a frying pan are absolutely delicious and have their own flavor.

I have caught catfish all over the state of California from the valley floor, up in the foothills and in reservoirs at 5000 feet in elevation and above.

I wonder how many of you out there in the world of fishing mapped out your favorite reservoir during the low water conditions caused by the recent drought. With all the water we now have and the reservoirs full it would be great to have knowledge of exactly what is on the bottom and what areas will hold fish.

Boots fishing tip of the week: "Dull hooks can lose fish so make sure your hooks are sharp."

Browns Valley is Home to PG&E's First Lithium-Ion Battery Storage Facility



The Yuba County facility is PG&E's first energy storage system to reduce peak demand during the hot summer months.

Browns Valley is PG&E's first energy storage system installed to reduce peak demand during the hot summer months through a technique known as "peak shaving."

It also represents the first time a Tesla energy storage system will be fully integrated into PG&E's Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system. While the storage system will operate autonomously to shave peaks, PG&E's

grid operators will also be able to take control of the system as needed to respond to system emergencies.

The Powerpack system will charge when demand is low and then send reserved power to the grid when demand grows, providing up to 500kW of power to address potential overloading on the substation's transformers. PG&E has integrated the Browns Valley system with existing distribution opera-

tions protocols, roles and responsibilities.

"Projects like Browns Valley offer a tremendous opportunity to better understand how we can fully realize the value of energy storage in different applications, including enhancing the overall reliability of our distribution grid and integrating renewable resources to maintain system reliability at lower overall costs to customers," Kuga added.

Sutter County Gives Shooting Range Notice to Move

Kim asked Greve for the FAA documentation noting this sudden change in attitude toward the range? Greve told Kim he would have it by the end of last week but it didn't happen.

Supervisor Ron Sullenger says the problem started when County Counsel Jean Jordan expressed concerns about being in compliance with FAA regulations. Sullenger talked of locating a new range near the Sutter Buttes as a solution. Since Kim's contacts say siting a new range can take two years or more, Sutter County's last minute eviction while blaming the FAA is not setting well.

Kim says that FAA regulation 51906b – Land Use Compliance page 21-11 expresses concerns about shoot-

ing ranges near airports. It states "a range can be inherently hazardous unless properly controlled and mitigated." However, Kim says the range does meet standards, mitigates any risks and that is confirmed in the routine NRA Range Inspection Reports submitted to the county. There has never been an incident.

A club member called

Chairman Whiteaker last weekend after hearing of the upcoming eviction. According to Kim, Whiteaker told the member he had it all under control. If that is the case, Twin Cities Rod and Gun people NRA members and other shooting enthusiasts are anxiously waiting an explanation from Whiteaker, Greve and Jordan.





of local history through an ongoing museum display. A concessionaire with regular hours could keep the place open between events, allowing for con-tinued community col-laboration. The site could provide a venue for:

- Farmers Market
- Cottage food production
- Food distribution center for a local food co-op
- Farm to fork dinners
- A community outdoor garden
- Workshop and classes
- Museum and library
- Community gathering place


These activities would bring new life to the

building. Ultimately, this effort would invigorate and encourage local sus-tainability, and stimulate community involvement and exchange. In order to make all this possible the help of the community is need-ed. A lease would need to be negotiated with the Marysville Joint Uni-fied School District, the building owners. Vari-ous permits would have to be secured with Yuba County. It is anticipated that \$30,000 to \$50,000 would be needed for re-pairs and improvements to get this restoration ef-fort underway.

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40 Acres, But No Mule

In full disclosure, I worked with Paul Rogers and Company

A group of greedy car-petbaggers with the help of Paul Rogers, a local cannabis business owner, have submitted a proposal to the Yuba County Board of Supervisors to approve 140 acres of marijuana cultivation. Jeff Lake, the San Diego attorney and partner of this group (formerly known as the Twin Rivers Group), plans to purchase the Timbuctoo Ranch to grow 40 acres of marijuana.

I've heard them plot to corner the markets in Yuba, Sutter, Butte and Colusa Counties by controlling cultivation, processing, manufacturing, distribution and sales, squeezing out the small family farmers who supplement their incomes growing and processing medical marijuana.

To justify this insanely large cultivation, they are promising the county pie-in-the-sky numbers of good paying jobs and up to \$6.5 million in taxes and permit fees. The only thing they didn't include was a free mule. They fail to recognize that most of these jobs already exist even if they are currently underground.

They also fail to take community standards into consideration. How many times have we voted on marijuana cul-

tivation rights already? If the community vetoed 99 plants, why would they accept gardens that could grow 16,000 plants each (400 plants x 40 acres)?

What kind of risk would they be exposing our community to? What would grows this size do to the water supply of nearby neighbors? How could they control the odor from this many plants?

These investors stand to make a king's ransom and will promise anything to advance their agenda. They believe that the lure of big money will sway enough Supervisors to come on board and we need to watch closely who approves this cockamamie idea. We can raise money for the county without supporting this out-of-control plan.

How? MCRSA AND AUMA (Prop 64) have some good guidelines to follow. They give the County complete latitude to adopt some or all of the license types that will be offered by the state thereby limiting the number and size of grow sites allowed. The sweet spot lies somewhere between a complete ban and full adoption of the recently passed state regulations that allow up to 4 acres of cultivation for the most liberal license type.

For starters, every qualified patient should be able to grow 6 plants for their own use (inside or outdoors as long as they are not a public nuisance). This will cut down on demand at a retail level. Selling excess product without a license would still be illegal.

Exceeding the six plant limit without a permit would still be subject to the fines already in place.

For those wanting to embrace the retail opportunities now allowed by state law, the county could set up a permitting operation or cede that authority to the State. Fees should be variable according to license type to include opportunities for small farmers. I was pleased to see that the State now allows a micro-business license for small farmers to cultivate, manufacture (without volatile substances), distribute, and sell their product legally to licensed dispensaries - and we now have two in our backyard.

It's obvious the times have changed. It's up to us how we adapt. Together, we can find a reasonable solution, but first we have to sideline greedy profiteers who have no concern for this community.

74th Annual Stonyford Rodeo Make Plans to Camp at Stonyford

Come camp with us in Stonyford, at the 74th Annual Stonyford Rodeo, May 6 and 7, 2017. You may likely score a trifecta of camping; in that the weather will, hopefully be sunny; the campgrounds are spacious with some amenities (toilets and garbage cans); and the rodeo action is first rate. Because Stonyford lacks motel facilities, camping at the rodeo has been a tradition for many folks and families over the last 70-odd years.

Over the three days of rodeo weekend, the camp grounds behind the arena are a merry place where good times abound for all campers. If you're not shy, newby campers will find it easy to join in the fun. There's nothing structured, just campers who get together and visit. Camping is \$25 per motor vehicle. That is, a vehicle pulling a trailer is \$25, but a camper towing a car (2 motorized vehicles) is \$50. It's a one-time fee that is good for the duration of your camping (one day or one week, whatever). There is also lake-side camping available along the shoreline of the East Park Reservoir, for a

fee. These campgrounds are two miles away, on the Stonyford end of the lake, or eight miles distant, on the Lodoga end. Go to www.countyofcolusa.org/index for information.

The rodeo weekend events begin on Friday, May 5, at 3 p.m. when we crown our rodeo queen and her court. You'll get to see some interesting horsemanship from some very pretty cowgirls. Later in the evening, around 5 p.m. a passel of ladies will entertain you with their barrel-racing skills. On Saturday, May 6, breakfast will be available a short walk from the campgrounds, for a modest charge, and our annual parade will begin at 10 a.m.. This is a small-town parade featuring one or more sheriff's posses, ladies with flags, children on floats, a funny group of "firemen" showing their stuff, and a group of men and women dubbed the Corkhill Wild Bunch, who've come from all over and meet every year to march in this parade and see this rodeo. Rodeo action begins at 1 p.m..

On Sunday breakfast is available at 7 a.m., a

rodeo church starts at 9 a.m., and rodeo begins at noon. On all three rodeo nights, dining, dancing and live music is available at the Timberline Bar and Grill, a short walk from the campgrounds. Stonyford is so small that once you've settled in to your camp, there's no need to drive again until you leave.
