MJUSD Refinances Bonds

Marysville, Ca.

The Marysville Joint Unified School District sold approximately \$28.5 million of refunding general obligation bonds for the Measure P general obligation bond measure that was passed by vot-

ers in 2008. This sale of refunding bonds was pursued by the District in an effort to generate savings for taxpayers. The financing will close on November 10, 2016.

Due to historically low interest rates in the municipal bond market. combined with high investor demand for the District's bonds, refinancing resulted in savings greater than expected. Through this refinancing, property owners in the District will save nearly \$4,600,000 over the remaining term of the bonds, which equates to approximately \$172 over the same period for the average homeowner in the District.

In a school district general obligation bond refunding, similar to refinancing a home mortgage to a lower interest rate, proceeds of the new bonds are used to retire the older bonds. Unlike refinancing mortgage, the term of the original debt is not extended. With municipal bond rates near historic lows, the District was able to refinance at an all-in cost of 2.97 percent compared to the prior average interest rate of 5.17 percent on the original bonds issued in 2009. The lower interest rates reduce the debt service payments, which results in savings to tax-

payers. The refunding reflects the commitment of the Board of Trustees to effectively manage its bond program, which is funded by taxpayer dollars. As the prior bonds are paid off in the next 18 years, this refunding is a prudent step to ensure remaining payments are as low as possible. The result of this bond sale highlights the District's sound financial management and its stewardship of the taxpayers' inter-

pounds. Apparently the recent storms have the fish moving up the Sacramento River. In addition, lures and plugs are bringing some nice black bass to boats and nets. This last storm, which

produced lots of rainfall in certain areas of California, has muddied up streams, creeks and eventually the river systems. Expect sturgeon to be on the way in the future and do not forget the catfish, which love to feed in the flooded areas for an abundance of food.

Our weather source has told me to expect a continuation of wet weather, which will bring occasional periods of dryness but overall will produce a wet one for this winter. He also advised to expect reservoirs to fill and Valley Rivers to flood the river bottoms.

Osumi's Tractor

My adventure with old tractors has led me into an interesting journey. Upon arriving home from a third world country visit, the realization of appreciation for being lucky enough of being born in America has been deepened. Liberty is the ingredient that has made us prosper and a focus of desire to live. Our country is not perfect and at times decisions made are less than admirable judged by hindsight.

However, many families of the Yuba Sutter Basin have overcome great diversity and their contributions have become part of the woof and warp of our community. Such is the Osumi Family. When David Osumi was a young man his family was interned in Poston, Arizona during World War II. It is hard for me to imagine my family having dinner, a knock on the door by government agents, and my

whole family removed to an unknown place. What would have been the range of feelings of an American of Japanese ancestry elementary student on December 5th and December 8th 1941. Yet the quality of character came through as David recalled the pleasant times of hiking, fishing, and he was happy to have someone who would play with him!

When the family returned to their farm in Sacramento everything was gone and other people had possession of the property. A friend assisted them in the move to the Yuba City area. The new home was not much, but they worked hard and smart at whatever they could find that made money. The domiciles improved and the farming operation grew. Like many tomato farmers of that time he leased different plots and rotated the crops. He finally secured a small family farm and

the four children grew up on Stewart Road, Mitzi his wife, is still alive and gave birth to Bruce, Mike, Karen and Kirk.

David's first tractor

was this 1948 Farmall Super AV, serial number 261249 which he purchased from Henry Miller Senior in the new dealership of Valley Truck and Tractor. Valley Truck and Tractor began as an International Harvester agency in 1948. The AV was used to cultivate tomatoes on various sites around the area including working in peach orchards. The tractor is somewhat unusual in that David bought a Hydra-Creep auxiliary transmission to slow the cultivating process so the plants would not be damaged. The Super AV had a hydraulic lift instead of the mechanical lift of the A. About 1,400 Super AVs were built and sold for about \$750 and up depending on accessory items. The C123 engine produced 13 horsepower

on the drawbar and a claimed 16 horsepower on the belt. Super AVs were produced from 1948 to 1954. This model weighs from 2,400 pounds to 3,450pounds depending on options.

I met Mike at Tractor Supply and he invited me to see his Dad's tractor. We went to the family barn, opened the door and there it was! Stolen radiator, absent grill, rotten tires, dirt, dust, and highlighted by pigeon droppings. It was a jewel at first sight. This little tractor left in the barn still had important work to do after the family made the tractor available to me. I contacted Jeff Magill, the Farm Mechanic Instructor at Wheatland High School. We discussed the unit and he said he had a young man who could restore it and he was looking for a sponsor. Bruce and Mike approved of the fine young man, Lucas Skinner. Lucas spent



Palm weevil concerns insect specialists

An insect that can kill palm trees will be the subject of a meeting near San Diego Wednesday. The South American palm weevil feeds on the crowns of palm trees, and causes enough damage the trees eventually die. Weevils have been found in San Diego County, and specialists say they don't know how far the insects may have spread. Authorities consider the weevil a threat both to ornamental palm trees and to date palms.

Animal-health lab set to open

A new laboratory designed to protect animals and people from diseases will be dedicated in Tulare Friday. The lab will add to a state system of animal health and food-safety facilities. It will help with rapid detection and response for routine illnesses and more serious outbreaks that can harm farm animals, such as foot-and-mouth disease or avian influenza. The lab will be operated by the University of California and the state Department of Food and Agriculture.

Asian weather affects vegetable demand

Typhoon damage to crops in Asia has led to increased demand for California-grown vegetables. California exporters say they're selling more produce to Japan and Taiwan in particular, because of typhoons that have hit those islands this autumn. Much of the new demand appears to be affecting broccoli and lettuce. Marketers say increased vegetable demand from Asian markets may extend into early November.

Organization ranks top college farms

A dozen campus farms at California colleges appear on a list of the nation's top college farms, compiled by an organization that promotes online college planning. The Ecological Agriculture Center at Santa Rosa Junior College ranked No. 1 on the list of top 60 campus farms. The ranking organization said it based its standings on farm size, crop variety and the number of degree options related to sustainable agriculture.

City of Yuba City Wastewater Digester Cleaning Project

Significant Efforts Underway to Minimize Impacts on Neighboring Community

As part of routine, regular maintenance, the City of Yuba City Wastewater Treatment Facility at 302 Burns Drive began cleaning one of the plant's digesters on Monday, October 24. The project is expected to take approximately two weeks to complete, and all efforts will be taken to minimize odor impacts to neighbors within the neighboring vi-

"We anticipate most of the related odors will dissipate quickly, but there is potential for some to lin-

ger during certain periods of cleaning," said facility supervisor Mike Finnigan. "We are sensitive to citizens' odor concerns and greatly appreciate everyone's patience during this

The City has taken several steps to reduce potential odors and does not anticipate any significant problems. Measures included allowing additional digestion time to minimize odors at the source, using self-contained concrete tanks to collect solids durof portable odor masking units. Businesses in the area and the Feather River Air Quality Management District have been notified of the potential odor, which, if it occurs, is expected to only last for four days throughout the cleaning process. The Wastewater Treat-

ing cleaning, and the use

ment Facility provides comprehensive wastewater treatment services to about 13,000 households, all businesses and major industries in City limits. There are two digesters in operation at the Facility. Every five years, a complete cleaning is required to remove sand and other non-degradable substances followed by internal inspection to ensure efficient operation of the digesters.

Originally built in 1972, the Wastewater Treatment Facility underwent an expansion in 2003 to meet current and future needs of the growing City. Currently the facility treats an average of 6 million gallons per day with most households contributing, on average, 330 gallons per day to the wastewater system.





Case in point: A former USC football player is demanding that "sports workers" (meaning the players) be classified as employees—paid by the hour, time and a half for overtime, workers comp, etc. How smart is that? A four-year player would be taxed on his wages and the \$240,000 in free tuition and housing (USC is not free). An athlete's education is based on playing a game, not scholarship, so finding a well-paying job after graduation is not certain. Filling taco shells will probably not pay the taxes on \$500,000.
- The High Speed Rail, in the past 13 years, has not been able to raise a penny from private sources, as they were required to do before receiving any public funding. Still, they were given \$3.2 billion of federal tax money. Instead of returning the money, as they had not met the terms of the agreement, they spent it. And Obama gave them an extension to raise the money or pay it back. Agreements don't mean anything in Obama's world.
- Listening to the so-called educators you would think that everyone who makes money should be giving back to the community. Have you ever heard of professors actually doing what they say others should do? Have you ever heard professors saying tuition should be lowered so students wouldn't have debt?

Local Governments Rigging Elections – Again

With all the state and local taxes on the November ballot, one would think that government at all levels in California was starved for revenue. But even a cursory review of the Golden State's "tax machine" reveals that the tax burden is already too heavy for many to bear. California has the highest income rate in America (likely to be extended for another 12 years) and the highest state sales tax rate. And despite Prop 13, our per capita property tax collections ranks no lower than 14th in the nation.

In the June primary, voters already passed 29 out of 40 local tax increases. But those taxes register as barely a blip compared to the earthquake confronting voters in less than three weeks. According to the California Taxpayers Association, there are 228 local tax measures representing a cumulative tax increase of more than \$3 billion per year, along with 193 bonds (more than \$30 billion's worth) that would dramatically increase annual property

taxes. After the June primary, this column observed that the high rate of passage reflected not so much a love for higher taxes as it did the fact that the tax raisers have become experts at gaming the system to pass tax and bond measures. Highly paid political consultants tell local officials not to publicize tax elections to the entire community, but to target only their supporters. This means running

stealth elections, communicating (in the case of school bonds) with only administrators and construction firms who are always more than willing to finance political campaigns and, of course, public employee unions who never met a tax they didn't like. The strategies that

the pro-taxers employ to extract money from an unsuspecting citizenry are endless. For example, many school boards, cities and counties do all they can to time elections so that potential opponents have inadequate time to mobilize. The ultimate goal is to prevent an opposition argument from even appearing in the ballot pamphlet. On countless occasions, advocates taxpayer have been blindsided by proposed tax increases because they were only afforded a few precious days to submit an argument. And when it is too late, there are few legal remedies.

The ultimate insult to taxpayers, of course, is when local governments use public dollars to engage in political advocacy to influence an election. In theory, it is illegal for officials to use public resources (including public funds) to urge a vote for or against a political issue. But, in practice, it happens all the time. Two weeks ago, both the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association and the Central Coast Taxpayers Association filed a complaint with the Fair Political Practices Commission alleging campaign reporting violations of the Political Reform Act by the County of San Luis Obispo, the San Luis Obispo Council of Governments (SLOCOG) and the Yes on Measure J Committee, a group pushing a local transportation tax. These government entities have spent nearly a quarter of a million taxpayer dollars on promotional materials and government employee and contractor compensation supporting Measure J.

As the November election draws near, the complaints about government interference in elections have ramped up dramatically. In Sacramento, the Sacramento City Unified School District used "robocalls" to contact thousands of parents with "important information" about the benefits of a parcel tax as well as statewide Proposition 55. According to the Sacramento Bee, the district sent the scripted messages recorded by five district trustees through its automated telephone distribution message system, explaining how the two tax measures would raise money for school programs and services that otherwise could be slashed. (This despite the fact that education spending in California has exploded since 2010).

Such communications are neither information nor balanced. They are always one-sided puff pieces designed solely to extract yes votes from uninformed voters.

California voters need to be alert to the lies, distortions and illegal expenditures of taxpayer dollars when considering any request for higher taxes. Yes, government services require public dollars. But before voting yes on any tax increase, ask yourself why is it that other states have markedly better public services without the high price

YCWA Response

In response to the October 19th article, 'YCWA Board Rejects Public's Right to Vote', we believe Yuba County's residents will appreciate our position on the recently proposed groundwater initiative, which we have determined to be illegal, unconstitutional and a disservice to the people of this community.

YCWA's mission is to serve the people of Yuba County. This is a serious responsibility, and it absolutely requires our Agency to comply with all state and federal laws and policies. Our reading of the initiative is that it is an illegal tax designed to unconstitutionally redirect revenues to specific interests using an unexplained formula, and for purposes that are unclear.

California's Supreme Court has issued clear guidance that agencies such as YCWA should not "take a pass" on the responsibility of an initiative that contains illegal elements. Instead, the court has instructed agencies like YCWA to act responsibly and deny unconstitutional initiatives in the interest of the general

We understand that the proponents would have

public.

preferred that YCWA approve their new tax and spend plan, but that is unacceptable. According to the Cali-

fornia Constitution and the Agency Act, YCWA is prohibited from establishing a general tax and may only enact a special tax upon a two-thirds vote of the citizens of Yuba County. The proponents failed in their duty to demonstrate that the tax is proportional to the costs, if any, imposed on residents by the targeted groundwater transfers. The U.S. and California

Constitutions also prohibit YCWA from "taking" private property without paying just compensation for the property rights taken. YCWA also is prohibited from donating its funds to any other entity or person without a clear public purpose for such a gift.

The proposed initiative conflicts with YCWA's responsibilities to the people of Yuba County which include, improving flood protection, providing water supplies for local farmers and ranchers, generating renewable hydropower, maintaining recreational opportunities, and restoring salmon and steelhead habitat in the Yuba River.

The proposed initiative would not improve ground-

water supplies because the proposal would not mandate that any of the funds generated by the illegal tax be used for groundwater preservation and improvement. In fact, the proposed initiative would reduce YCWA's funding and therefore adversely impact its mission.

In our view, the proposed initiative is illegal and would not benefit the people of Yuba County. Taxing groundwater transfers will only impair YCWA's ability to fund projects, and it would limit our ability to fulfill our responsibilities to all of our citizens. For those reasons, YCWA's Board of Directors unanimously chose to reject it.



Zoning Clearance Certificates in Permitted Use areas are not free, they require a filing with the County and are enforced by code enforcement so it's not a drain on the Sheriffs, it's not lax regulation - it's as good as the County's Code Enforcement department and it's a lot easier because people will be stepping forward and filing with the County so the County doesn't have to go out and look for the growers to regulate them - so enforcement costs will go down and will be funded by County filings.

All registered growers will have to prove legal water and wastewater so fears of over drilling or overuse of water due to cannabis are unwarranted. Water regulation will be improved when Measure E passes because growers will be regulated by the State Water Board in addition to the County.

Measure E would open the door to regulated, controlled and taxed commercial cannabis and would force out the black-market. Once Measure E passes, the County would be able to pass additional rules, taxes and fees under the State Cannabis Law.

The only thing our "Leaders" have brought to Yuba are \$Millions of dollars of lawsuits, \$Millions of tax dollars spent to enforce an unenforceable Ban, a drop in raw land prices and housing in the foothills is at a low. So, now instead of highly regulated and taxed cannabis farms on agricultural land creating revenue and jobs, our County is in debt and worse an escalating issue brought to the county by poor "Leadership".
