## YCWA Board Rejects Public's Right to Vote

On Tuesday October 11, 2016 the Yuba County Water Agency (YCWA) Board of Directors, lame ducks John Nicoletti, Mary Jane Greigo, Tib Belza, who lost re-election in June, Roger Abe now in a run-off election, Andy Vasquez, Brent Hastey and Randy Fletcher, voted unanimously to reject the "Groundwater Fairness Act." an initiative proposed for a vote of the people. The initiative would return a portion of the ground water substitution proceeds to the property owners of Yuba County through a credit or deduction in their property

The process generally requires that in order to put an initiative on the ballot, the proponent presents the initiative to the appropriate governmental agency for Title and Summary, at this point the proponent can ask the agency to put it on the ballot; if denied then the proponents can begin signature gathering to put the initiative on the ballot. Once on the ballot if the voters reject the initiative the issue is dead. If the voters

approve the initiative and the governmental agency believes it is illegal that is the time for a legal challenge. In this case the YCWA Board of Directors short circuited the process and they determined that the initiative is illegal and will not be placed on the ballot.

YCWA Chairman of the board, TIB Belza stated," YCWA's Board of Directors earlier today rejected an illegal proposed groundwater initiative called the "Groundwater Fairness Act." For YCWA's Board, this was an important decision. Our responsibility is to the people of Yuba County. Every day, we're working to protect the county's groundwater resources, improve flood protection, provide water supplies for local farmers and ranchers, generate renewable hydropower, create enjoyable recreational opportunities, and protect and improve salmon habitat in the Yuba River.

The proposed initiative could significantly impact YCWA. It would require the Agency to impose a new tax on some people in Yuba County and to then give the

tax receipts to another group of interests, using an unexplained formula. Issuing an illegal ballot title and summary now, and the potential future administration of the initiative, could expose YCWA to numerous lawsuits from one side or another. The Agency believes the most responsible way to handle this situation is to follow the guidance by the California Supreme Court and address the legal issues now.

YCWA has a comprehensive, responsible groundwater management program that protects our community's groundwater supplies. We don't need new taxes to protect our groundwater, but YCWA does need the continued discretion to protect those supplies. # The Rick Fenton Factor

Marijuana for medical use is legal and Rick Fenton is fed-up with ordinances that drive-up costs and trouble ill people seeking relief. Neither is he happy with recreational smokers abusing the rights of medical users in order to get rich. And, Fenton is no proponent of legalization or dispensaries.

So, Sutter County Supervisor candidate Barbara LeVake sent him over the edge with her tough talk on marijuana. He decided to do something about it. Spending a few hundred dollars, he created and distributed flyers negatively comparing LeVake to Hillary Clinton.

Fenton knows the rules and violated no laws, but the LeVake campaign couldn't pass up the chance to again slander her opponent, Matt Conant as being in cahoots with Fenton. Fenton lives in Olivehurst.

LeVake's last laugher was saying that Conant was anti-law enforcement. Conant is a reputable farmer and political virgin in stark contrast to LeVake. LeVake is a political bully whose farming venture ended in bankruptcy hurting local growers and businesses.

LeVake and associates knew the truth about Fenton. Fenton has never met Conant and actually posted on LeVake's Facebook page that it was all his doing. LeVake removed his post.

Knowing that LeVake's campaign manager is Assemblyman James Gallagher's chief of staff, the mud-slinging may smudge the assemblyman's golden boy image and credibility. Gallagher recommended LeVake to complete his supervisor term in spite of the fact that voters turned her out once before. He also insisted that his staff member run LeVake's campaign.

So, LeVake's lobbying buddy in Sacramento filed an absurd Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) complaint against Fenton. They know it is baseless but it is all about conning the voters. That hypocrisy and insincerity is exactly what riles Fenton. Fenton thinks politicians should be caring about the well-being of their constituents rather than manipulating them, deceiving them, or pandering to them.

It appears that local farmer/ developer and political string-puller Al Montna's fingerprints are on LeVake's FPPC complaint and another filing against Roger Abe. Magalia resident James Wilson submitted FPPC papers against Yuba Co Supervisor Abe regarding Montna's controversial Magnolia Ranch proposal in Abe's district.

Abe is up for re-election. Montna has been shoveling tens of thousands of dollars to LeVake and Abe's opponent who is a Magnolia Ranch advocate.

James Wilson is colorful, in the early 1990's getting himself arrested for damaging a Wester Aggregates (WA) gate in a dispute over public access to the Yuba River through WA's property. Feeling buff he then took on Church of Glad Tidings, trashing the congregation in the Appeal Democrat.

The church was solicited by Yuba County Health to develop and direct for no cost a multi-media teen pregnancy prevention campaign. Yuba County had one of the highest teen birth rates in the state at the time. Glad Tidings was also known for assisting demonized people.

The two activities were irresistible for Wilson and his river-access buddy William Calvert who were looking for another fight. They knew nothing about the teen pregnancy epidemic or demons, but thought the two issues were perfect to create a stir.

Wilson and Calvert did not believe a church should have any interaction with government. They later admitted that it was all a ploy to weaken the church's influence in the community. They were good of boys lacking a moral-compass.

The Nov 8 election may reveal just how many Rick Fentons are sick of the scams of those that will say and do anything to acquire and stay in power. Donald Trump's popularity stems from just such revulsion.

Meanwhile, Fenton wants officials to protect the rights of ill people to use marijuana and not be financially gouged to grow it or taxed to buy it.

## **Key Club Students Clean-Up Graffiti**

The core values of Key Club International are leadership, character building, caring and inclusiveness. Key Club members pledge to uphold the Objects of Key Club International - to build my home, school and community; to serve my nation and God; and combat all forces which tend to undermine these institutions.

Saturday, October 1st, more than 40 Key Club members carried out their mission by covering graffiti sites throughout Yuba and Sutter Counties. The students attend Yuba City, River Valley, Live Oak and East Nicolaus High Schools.

Club members covered

more than 150 sites of graffiti vandalism, most of it done by gang members. A sudden uptick in gang graffiti tagging has led to recent exchanges of gunfire among rival gangs.

Students were joined by their advisor Rhonda Cameron, and two painting contractors, Jon Law and Leo Machado. Law and Machado coordinate on-going graffiti eradication, working closely with all law enforcement agencies.

The importance of eliminating graffiti, besides making the community look better, is based on the "Fixing Broken Windows" theory of community policing made popular by the successes of New York

Mayor Rudy Giuliani and his Chief of Police William Bratton.

Starting in 1994, Giuliani and Bratton led the halt of New York's crime epidemic by addressing formerly ignored "minor offenses" ultimately leading to a reduction in major crimes.

For example, keeping subway cars graffiti-free and arresting subway "turnstile jumpers" led to riders again feeling safe to use subways. Many arrested for misdemeanors were also wanted for other offenses.

Key Club students made a significant contribution to a safer community by showing they care about how it looks.





In 2013 the "Pumpers" revenues were \$33,580,000 and in 2014 they were \$26,912,241.

#### Marijuana Tax Revenue Hopes Could Go Up In Smoke

For the third time in state history, California voters will be faced with the question of legalizing marijuana for recreational use.

The official ballot summary for Proposition 64 says the measure could generate up to \$1 billion in new tax revenue annually for state and local governments. Only time will tell if this is true, but voters - regardless of how they plan to vote - would be wise to take these revenue projections with a grain of salt.

First, the facts: Prop. 64 would legalize marijuana - under state, not federal, law - while creating a \$9.25 per ounce cultivation tax on dried flowers, a \$2.75 per ounce cultivation tax on dried marijuana leaves, and a 15 percent excise tax on the retail sale of medical and non-medical marijuana products. In addition, non-medical products would be subject to California sales tax, which currently ranges from 7.5 to 10 percent.

Under Prop. 64, medical marijuana will not be subject to state sales tax. Furthermore, it will be exempt from cultivation taxes when grown by a qualified patient or primary caregiver. Under the new law, local governments could add even more taxes to marijuana purchases. Some local governments are already contemplating additional taxes to fund youth programs or fight homelessness.

Marijuana users who are desperate to save money could return to the black market or pick up a "Prop. 215 card," skipping the state sales tax on marijuana - and likely

#### Farmers respond to increased olive oil demand

Growing popularity of California olive oil has led to more plantings of olive groves in the state. The California Olive Oil Council says the U.S. now represents the second-largest market for olive oil, behind the European Union. Imported oils still dominate the U.S. market, but the council says California oil now accounts for about 6 percent of the market--up from only 1 percent a few years ago.

## Report shows benefits of dairy exports

Continuing increases in exports of dairy products will create jobs and help farmers, according to a report issued Tuesday by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The report says the proposed 12-nation Trans-Pacific Partnership would provide U.S. dairy products with expanded access to markets such as Japan, Vietnam and Malaysia. The report says each \$1 billion in dairy exports supports about 20,000 jobs.

## Brussels sprouts thrive on foggy coast

A foggy summer helped the Brussels sprouts crop along the Central Coast. Farmers say the cool weather encouraged high quality Brussels sprouts and strong supplies. In October 2015, Gov. Brown signed California's Cannabis Regulation Act which:

- classifies marijuana/cannabis as an agricultural product

county for cannabis production.

Other Counties like Calaveras, Mendocino, Humboldt, Santa Cruz and Trinity have adopted local cannabis licensing and are accepting license applications for an average filing fee of \$5,000 in addition to other fees and taxes on growers. Calaveras County collected \$3,000,000 in application fees within six weeks.

Yuba County could be collecting millions of dollars in fees. County financial problems could be gone like when Coalinga erased its entire city debt in one day due to a medical marijuana license.

Growers who can't handle regulation or can't pass background checks are being forced out of regulated counties into banned counties like Yuba. Yuba's current ban has unintended consequences making it a haven for illegal growers, black marketeers, outlaws, criminal enterprises, sex traffickers, and drug trafficking organizations:

- Yuba growers are exempt from enrolling in the Water Board's cannabis program which requires filings and environmental and water law compliance
- Yuba growers are exempt from any background check or filing requirements
- Yuba growers are exempt from any state regulations, taxes or fees
- Yuba growers are exempt from any safety testing requirements

Measure E would regulate Yuba

growers extensively by requiring conditional use permit, administrative use permit and/or zoning clearance filings with the Planning Department as well as proof of legal water and permitted wastewater systems, adequate fencing and proper zoning.

#### The Cormon booking

The German banking conglomerate Deutsche has seen better days. Its stock cut in thirds in the last 2 years, investors have hammered the shares under swirling rumors and concerns about its financial health and long term viability.

This bank is no small potatoes. It has more than 100,000 employees in over 70 countries, and has a large presence in Europe, the Americas, Asia-Pacific and the emerging markets. In 2009, Deutsche Bank was the largest foreign exchange dealer in the world with a market share of 21 percent.

The trouble started during the banking blow up and housing crash says Wikipedia.

Deutsche Bank was one of the major drivers of the collateralized debt obligation (CDO) market during the housing credit bubble from 2004 to 2008, creating  $\sim$ \$32,000,000,000 worth. The 2011 US Senate Permanent Select Committee on Investigations report on Wall Street and the Financial Crisis analyzed Deutsche Bank as a 'case study' of investment banking involvement in the mortgage bubble. Then when the majority of large banks were recapital, Deutsche bet the markets would loosen and increased its leverage. The bet apparently failed as markets remained anemic and bank regulations tightened.

Just because it's a German bank however, don't think your tax payer dollars weren't used to shore up Deutsche. In 2008 Deutsche Bank reported its first annual loss in five decade and received somewhere in the neighborhood of US\$11.8 billion from funds provided by US taxpayers when they bailed out AIG, the American insurance company it had dealings with.

Fast forward 7 years later and Deutsche is still in trouble and it appears to be getting worse. Its troubles are not its own however.

With a reported 70 trillion in derivatives on its books (large unregulated bets of which the content and trigger points are known only to Deutsche), it's collapse, if it indeed happens, would have much greater impact on financial markets then the Lehman Brothers fiasco that many argue was the first domino in the banking blowup that almost melted global financial markets in 2008/09. Jim Willie in his Silver Doctors September 17 essay said:

"The important thing to keep in mind about Deutsche Bank is that it won't go down alone if it goes down at all. If it fails, it will take along with it 3,4,5,6 or 10, or 15 other banks with it".

The Street.com add-

ed to the specter of a Deutsche failure when it wrote on August 25:

"The 2008-2009 global financial crisis, is nothing compared to what would happen if Deutsche Bank, a keystone of the global financial system, collapsed".

Is a failure of this magnitude plausible?

It's hard to imagine, given the recent history of central bank intervention when it comes to "too big to fail" bailouts that the global monetary authorities would let Deutsche go under given the possible ramifications of such a failure.

My money is on another bailout should Deutsche be forced to ask for a life preserver. The ironic part here is that this bank, the people who run it and the authorities that regulate it apparently didn't learn much from the 2008/09 crisis that occurred just a few years ago.

Once again the taxpayers of the world will likely pay the price resulting from the actions of others who were looking to line their pockets with obscene amounts of dough.
