RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - The Rio Linda High School Class of 2023 celebrated its graduation ceremony on Thursday, June 1st at Sutter Health Park in West Sacramento. The Knights

took one last time together at graduation to recollect their memories, to reorient their priorities, to instill their thoughts on others and to accept their diplomas.

After marching into the arena to Edward Elgar's classic Pomp and Circumstance, Class of 2023 President Clarissa Sainz led the Pledge of Allegiance, and graduating Senior Liberty Williams sang the National Anthem for the celebratory occasion.

Rio Linda High School Principal Paul Orlando addressed the graduates telling them that they were the first class to have experienced school life, programs and many activities pre-COVID, and also to have gone through the ordeal maintaining the vital spirit of leadership in the school. He said that many of these scholastic experiences were "only last done by the seniors when they were freshmen, so they have three classes" that they had helped orient. "Thank you, Class of 2023 for your guidance," Orlando said. SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors at its June 6 meeting concurred with the County Executive's Appointment of Chad Rinde as Director of Finance, effective June 26, 2023.

"Mr. Rinde is exceptionally qualified, and we are very fortunate to appoint him as our Director of Finance," said David Villanueva, Assistant County Executive and Deputy County Executive for Administrative Services. "We believe that his enthusiasm, education and expertise will benefit the County's Department of Finance and the County overall." Rinde has nearly 15 years of experience working in and around County government, with more than eight of those years working for Yolo County, where he currently serves as the Chief Financial Officer, a position he has held since 2019. During his tenure, Rinde also served as the Interim County Administrator for nine months and Assistant County Administrator for two months to support the transition to the new County Administrator. Rinde has led Yolo County's budgetary process, been a key contributor to annexations with local cities to promote economic development and performed disaster and business relief efforts during COVID-19 while simultaneously fulfilling all the statutory responsibilities of the office. In addition to his professional experience, Rinde graduated from Sacramento State with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration with an emphasis in Accountancy. Rinde is also a Certified Public Accountant for the State of California. Cookbook submission is free and open to all residents of the Greater Sacramento Region. Artists may submit their own art and recipe or partner with one another during the submission process.



2021 County Greenhouse Gas Inventory Released

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -Sacramento County has released its 2021 Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Inventory for public review and is proud to show reduced GHG emissions in government operations and throughout the unincorporated community as a whole.

The GHG Inventory presents both a Sacramento County government operations inventory and an unincorporated community-wide inventory. The Inventory shows that Sacramento County has reduced GHG emissions in its government operations by 32.5 percent compared to 2015 levels, the year of our last inventory. The Inventory also shows that the unincorporated community of Sacramento County has reduced GHG emissions by 3.2 percent since 2015.

"Our 2021 government operations Sacramento County website.

inventory shows a reduction of 39,979 metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalents from 2015 levels, which equates to 8,897 gasoline-powered passenger vehicles driven for one year or planting 661,056 tree seedlings grown for 10 years," said John Lundgren, Sacramento County Sustainability Manager. "While we still have a tremendous amount of work to do to reach carbon neutrality, we can celebrate a victory in seeing our internal government operations efforts pay off in documented GHG reductions."

The Inventory will be presented to the Climate Emergency Mobilization Task Force as an informational item on June 15. The public may submit comments on the GHG Inventory until July 31 by emailing John Lundgren at Lundgrenj@ Saccounty.gov.

Sacramento County's Recommended Budget Approved

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on June 7 to approve the \$8.4 billion recommended budget for

Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24. "The approved budget stands as a testament to the County's commitment to addressing the critical and urgent needs of our community," said County Executive Ann Edwards. "The budget prioritizes funding programs that tackle pressing issues like homelessness, the improvement of road conditions in the unincorporated areas of our County, Health Services and Child, Family, and Adult Services. It is important to continue investments in these key areas to ensure the well-being of all residents."

The \$8.4 billion budget consists of \$3.2 billion in Enterprise and Special Revenue Fund appropriations (utility rates, fees and other dedicated revenue), \$3.9 billion in General Fund appropriations (funded with \$979 million in discretionary resources, \$1.3 billion in reimbursements from restricted funds, and \$1.7 billion in Federal, State and fee revenue dedicated to specific purposes), and \$1.3 billion in Restricted Funds.

The recommended budget recognized new or enhanced areas of growth, including annual commitments of:

Mays Consent **Decree Jail Population** Reduction - The Recommended Budget includes \$34 million in appropriations, with \$7 million in Net County Cost

to fund new or enhanced programs aligned with the County's jail population reduction plans to comply with the Mays consent decree

Consent Mays **Decree Remedial Plan** - \$10 million in Net County Cost included in the Recommended Budget in the Sheriff and Correctional Health budget units to fund continued efforts to meet the County's obligations under the Mays consent decree remedial plan, including additional staffing and services.

Addressing

Homelessness - \$2 million in Net County Cost to fund new programs and services addressing homelessness in the County.

Health Services -Overall, the Health Services budget includes \$84 million of Growth funded almost entirely by State, Federal and Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) revenue.

In addition to the Growth identified in the Mays Consent Decree Jail Population Reduction and Addressing Homelessness sections above, recommended Growth includes \$14 million for Cal-AIM performance-based incentive programs, \$14 million to construct a new Children's Mental Health **Psychiatric Health Facility** and Crisis Stabilization Unit, \$10 million to construct a new Mental Health Rehabilitation Center, \$5 million to increase the Children's Mental Health Flexible Integrated Treatment contract pool, and \$2 million to increase existing Full Service Partnership contracts.

Child, Family and Adult Services - \$3 million in Net County Costs to support Child Family and Adult Services' programs to implement the **Families First Prevention** Services block grant program, and \$2 million in Net County Cost to provide additional funding for Child Protective Services welcome and assessment center contracted services.

During Board deliberations, the Board added additional items totaling \$7.6 million:

\$5 million to address road repairs/improvements in the unincorporated County; \$1.7 million to Regional Parks to fund ongoing contracted trash pickup and removal and for necessary equipment expenses; \$300,000 to Water Resources for staff time or contracted services to manage flood mitigation efforts in the south County; \$463,150 to the District Attorney for two additional attorneys; \$168,000 to Human Assistance for Cal-Fresh benefits at farmer's markets.

For more details on the recommended budget, read the County Executive's Budget Letter or view the budgets documents on the Office of Budget and Debt Management's website.

The numbers on the Recommended Budget will change between now and September, when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. The Final Budget will come back to the Board of Supervisors in September for review and adoptions.



We have the most (Seal of Biliteracy) of the district (TRUSD.) 49 Rio Linda High seniors have accomplished the feat of earning the Seal of Biliteracy on their diploma. "Speaking of Rio Linda High graduates," Orlando said with pleasure, "We are proud to honor our students joining the military. We'll have our share of students joining the US Marine Corps, US Army, US Air Force, Coast Guard and National Guard."

Next, Rio Linda High School Class of 2023 Salutatorian Aaron Lee shared his experience through high school with the graduating class.

Lee spoke of the increased freedom given to students by parents and schools as their level of maturity increased and the bonding which took place with peers. He said the experience was aided by associating with others "who were in the same situation... align[ing] our goals together with the sole

with those we could relate to."

"We've reached a point in our lives where we now face what may be the biggest question in our life: What next? This question has no



'Sanctuary State' Governor Upset **Migrants Were Sent Here for Sanctuary**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -California's sanctuary state Governor Gavin Newsom and Attorney General Rob Bonta were quick to blame Florida Governor Ron DeSantis for Friday's migrant flight into Sacramento, and then accused Florida of "state-sanctioned kidnaping" for transporting migrants from the Texas border to a Sacramento church.

However, when he was still Lieutenant Governor, Newsom proudly declared and reaffirmed California's sanctuary state status after the Trump Justice Department threatened to charge state or local officials who enforced sanctuary policies protecting illegal immigrants.

As California Lieutenant Governor, Newsom issued a warning to the Trump administration a Tweet. "Let me be clear, @realDonaldTrump: California is a sanctuary state. We believe in the power of diversity. We have defied and resisted the xenophobic, hateful policies of your administration at every turn. We will do it again.'

And he posted a video on Facebook saying, "California will remain a sanctuary state, and your attempt to intimidate will not stop us."

So which is it Gov. Newsom - is California a Sanctuary State which welcomes illegal immigrants and releases them from custody? Or are you sending them back in disgust?

Is all of this bravado and bluster grandstanding for future Democrat voters? Newsom is clearly running for President, and Bonta has announced he wants to be the next California Governor.

As for the two flights into Sacramento, there still is uncertainty if Gov. Ron DeSantis is actually behind the flights. Thus far, all reports about the illegal immigrant planes appear to be speculation, and DeSantis is mum.

Governors DeSantis and Greg Abbott (Texas) have sent planes with illegal immigrants to sanctuary cities Chicago, New York, and Martha's Vineyard to share in the housing and care of the migrants they claim to want sanctuary for.

Democrat President Joe Biden has called this movement of mostly Latin American migrants "playing politics with people's lives" and said it is inhumane, especially in areas such as New York City, which have services brought to the brink already because of the migrant

influx, the Globe reported Monday.

However, officials from Texas and Florida, including DeSantis, have fired back that "every community in America should be sharing in the burdens."

The federal government has also sent secret flights full of illegal immigrants into Westchester, New York in the middle of the night, own:

Leaked video shows migrants being transported on secret charter flights under the cover of night from southern border states to Westchester, New York.

"The government is betraying the American people," a federal contractor told a Westchester County police officer in

stirring controversy of their a conversation recorded on the officer's body camera on the tarmac of a Westchester airport on Aug. 13, 2021.

> Westchester Police Sgt. Michael Hamborsky asked the contractor hired to transport migrants around the country why: "You know why. Because if this gets out, the government is betraying the American

people," the contractor said. Gov. Newsom and Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg turned on the rhetoric claiming, 'Human trafficking is not only despicable; it's a felony. I urge authorities to investigate how 16 vulnerable people were lured from El Paso, to Sacramento. "'Is there anything more cruel than using scared human beings to score cheap political points?""

Both Steinberg and Newsom support open borders, and illegal immigration.

And it isn't human trafficking or kidnapping to take illegals from a non-sanctuary state to a sanctuary state that claims to welcome them.

Rich with irony, Gov. Newsom has been releasing dangerous felons from state prisons, most of whom reoffend or end up living on the streets, addicted to meth and/or heroin.

Perhaps the most ironic Tweet summed up their hypocrisy best: "Lol yes you are not worried about them coming across the dessert and risking their lives but put them on a private jet and send them to your cities, now that's a travesty."

California Water Rights At Risk As Three Legislative Proposals Advance

When California imposed its first-ever regulation on the extraction of water from underground aquifers in 2014, it gave environmental groups a landmark victory in their decades-long effort to overhaul water use laws.

It was also a political setback for farmers, who are California's major water users and have depended on wells to irrigate their crops as increasingly frequent droughts reduce surface water in rivers and reservoirs.

However, while groundwater regulation ended one front in California's never-ending political and legal battles over allocation of water, it merely set the stage for an even bigger conflict over surface water rights, particularly those pre-dating 1914, when the state first began controlling diversions.

Just months after the groundwater regulation's enactment, with drought still gripping the state, the water rights battle was joined when the state Water Resources Control Board attempted to curtail diversions by some pre-1914 rights holders.

The board accused a small water system on the southern edge of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, Byron-Bethany Irrigation District, of ignoring its curtailment order and however, underwrite research California newspapers.

the Delta for 13 days.

"We are a test case," Byron-Bethany's manager, Rick Gilmore, said at the time. "I think this has become a larger issue. I think the water board wants to use this as a precedent so they can start to gain more not only in times of extreme control over senior water right users."

An immediate confrontation was averted, but the underlying conflict continued and last year the state court of appeal declared that the board lacked emergency curtailment authority over senior rights holders.

Meanwhile, 2022 saw another clash involving another small water agency that ignored curtailment orders on the Shasta River a few miles south of the Oregon border. The Shasta River Water Association's farmers and ranchers continued to tap the river and later paid small fines.

Shasta River case fired up a long-standing drive by environmental groups to reduce diversions that damage wildlife habitat, contending that pre-1914 rights reflect exploitive and even racist 19th century attitudes incompatible with climate change and 21st century societal mores.

Water rights reformers have pressed the board to aggressively invoke the "public trust doctrine" of California water law and the state constitution's declaration that water use must be reasonable.

Despite its clashes over curtailment orders, the water board has been reluctant to journalist for more than 60 engage in a sweeping political and legal war. It did,

Arrest Made in Sexual Abuse of Juvenile



Don't Put All Your Eggs in One Basket

Dear Dave,

My employer offers an employee stock purchase plan at a 15% discount. I'm usually the kind of guy who buys stocks and holds on to them forever. But when it comes to an opportunity like this, should I buy it and wait for a year to sell it, or should I buy it and sell right away?

– John

Dear John,

Generally, I don't recommend buying single stocks at all. Single stocks are way too risky, and a 15% discount is nothing special in this kind of scenario. Virtually every single company out there that has an employee stock option plan offers a 15% discount.

In most situations like this, if you pull up a 52-week chart on the stock's performance, you'll

find a variance of as much as 15% in those 52 weeks. In other words, you could lose any or all of that discount in one move of the stock. Plus, it's not like 15% is a big discount to begin with. Fifteen percent off a single stock, considering how volatile they are, is no big deal. But hey, if you love your company that much, they have a great track record, and the stock has a good history, go ahead. Just don't allow single stocks as a category to make up more than 10% of your net worth.

The core issue here is a lack of diversification. When you put all your eggs in one basket, there's always some clown twirling the basket. The first time I ran into that was a long time ago with a lady who was 70 years old. She had worked for a large company for 40 years. On top of that, she invested all her 401(k), all her wealth-\$800,000 totalin that one company. Well, this company experienced a crisis. It lost nearly

half of its value, and her \$800,000 was suddenly worth about \$400,000. She left herself vulnerable with a high-risk play, John.

I'll say it again. Don't bet the farm on one horse, and don't have more than 10% of your net worth wrapped up in single stocks. Hundreds of research projects have been done that show individuals who buy individual stocks and think they know what they're doing actually lose money much more often than they *make* money.

Social Security Matters How Will Working Affect My First Year's Benefits?

Dear Rusty: I retired from working in January of this year and have since claimed Social Security. I didn't work at all in February or March, but I began a part time job in April. I'm very confused about how Social Security counts earnings for the first year. I don't know if I need to keep each month's earnings under \$1,770 or if they average it. Some of the literature I've found says each month must remain under \$1,770 or NO benefit will be paid that month. Two people at the Social Security office told me that they'll just dock me \$1 for every \$2 I am over that, even in my first year. I also cannot find anything about when they count your income. Is it when it's earned or when it's paid? If I go over in a month because there are three pay periods, can they withhold the benefit for that month? I'm just so confused! Signed: Part Time Worker

Dear Part Time Worker: The Social Security earnings test during your first year collecting benefits before full retirement age is, indeed, somewhat confusing. The reason is because there are two methods which Social Security may use during your first calendar year collecting early benefits, and they will use the one which results in the least financial impact to you. To elaborate:

If you claim benefits mid-year before your full retirement age, for the remainder of that first year (starting in the month benefits begin and ending in December) you'll be subject to a monthly earnings limit (\$1,770 for 2023). If you exceed the monthly limit in any remaining month of that first calendar year, you won't be entitled to benefits for that month, so Social Security would (eventually) take back that month's benefit. That is, unless using the annual limit (\$21,240 for 2023) instead will result in a smaller penalty. If your total earnings for your first year collecting are over the annual limit (e.g., \$21,240 for 2023), the penalty would be \$1 for every \$2 over the annual limit and, if that is less than the penalty from using the monthly limit, they will assess the smaller penalty. In other words, Social Security will use the method which is most beneficial to you when assessing a penalty for exceeding the earnings limit during your first calendar year collecting benefits. And just for clarity, the earnings limits are much higher and the penalty less during the year you attain full retirement age (FRA).

Something else to be aware of: if you know in advance you will exceed the annual limit it would be best to inform Social Security in order to avoid an Overpayment Notice next year. If you don't, Social Security won't know about your 2023 earnings until you file your 2023 income taxes, so you'll get your 2023 monthly payments as usual. But when the IRS informs Social Security of your 2023 earnings later next year, Social Security will ask you to detail your monthly work earnings for 2023. If you have exceeded the limits, they will determine an overpayment amount and will ask you to either pay back what is owed in a lump sum or will withhold your benefits for enough months to recover what you owe for exceeding the 2023 earnings limit. Then, after you reach full retirement age (FRA), you'll get time credit for all months in which benefits were withheld, thus slightly increasing your monthly payment after your FRA.

Finally, it is when your income is earned that counts, not when it is paid. So, for example, if you worked in January 2023 and were paid for that work in February 2023, that is considered January income which wouldn't count toward the February earnings limit.

Wanted Fugitive Nida Muhammad Niazy Returned to Sacramento County

FBI News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On May 30, 2023, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sacramento Field Office special agents returned wanted fugitive Nida Muhammad Niazy, 32, to Sacramento County to face multiple sexual assault charges. Niazy was booked into the Sacramento County Jail and is currently awaiting his initial appearance before the Superior Court of California, County of Sacramento.

With the assistance of the FBI Berlin Legal Attaché and the International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL) Germany, Niazy was apprehended by Landeskriminalamt Schleswig-Holstein, near Eutin, Schleswig-Holstein, Germany, on February 23, 2023, pending extradition. "The FBI is eager to help our law enforcement partners ensure those accused of crimes can and will answer to charges, despite their efforts to flee," said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "We thank our international partners and the FBI International Operations Division for assisting us with our effort to apprehend Mr. Niazy." Niazy's return to Sacramento County to face prosecution is funded by the United States Government's "Project Welcome Home," which provides funding to assist


in the transportation of federal fugitives to the United States.

Niazy is alleged to have sexually assaulted two people last fall. The Sacramento State Police Department, which serves the California State University, Sacramento campus community, and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department investigated the assaults. The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office is prosecuting the case.

The FBI obtained a federal arrest warrant for unlawful flight to avoid prosecution on December 14, 2022, following the FBI's discovery that Niazy had taken a commercial flight from San Francisco to Switzerland, on November 5, 2022. The Sacramento State Police Department, Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, and FBI Sacramento Field Office worked collaboratively to locate and apprehend Niazy. The FBI continues to collaborate with its law enforcement partners to apprehend criminals charged with state crimes who then flee the jurisdiction. Cases seeking information from the public, including fugitive matters, are posted on the FBI Sacramento Field Office's Most Wanted page and FBI Most Wanted app. Anyone with information that may aid these cases may contact their local FBI office, United States embassy, or submit information online at tips.fbi.gov. *



YOLO REGION, CA (MPG) - Summer is here, and the bats are back! The Mexican free-tailed bat colony under the I-80 Yolo Causeway is growing daily as they return from wherever they spent the winter. Although many of the bats over-winter in the bridge, most seem to leave. As the weather warms, crops grow, and insect populations explode, the bats return to the Causeway.

These amazing, winged wonders are the only mammals capable of true flight. In late June, the females give birth to one pup. She nurses that pup for about 5 to 6 weeks, and then it joins her as she flies throughout the Central Valley to consume crop pests and mosquitos. There also are males that live in the Yolo Causeway bridge, but their groupings are smaller, so they are less noticeable. Throughout the summer,

Yolo Basin Foundation offers many Bat Talk and Walks, as well as a number of special events. Registration for all of these activities are now open on our website, www.yolobasin.org.

Children who are interested in bats are encouraged to join Yolo Basin Foundation for a morning of Bats and Crafts on August 13th and September 17th. Meet live bats from our local area, then have fun creating crafts and playing bat games. This special event is aimed at young children, especially those that are too young to stay up late to watch the bats fly.

Adults can visit the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area Headquarters for Bats and Brews on August 19th to taste a variety of local beers and meet ambassador bats from a rehabilitation program, followed by a visit to the Bypass to see the evening bat flyout.

We are also hosting a Bat House Building Workshop on August 26th! This is a great opportunity for small groups or families. Registration includes supplies and instructions to build a Bat House which can be put up to invite bats to your yard or farm.

Additionally, we are seeking Bat Program Volunteers to help educate the public, guide tours, and host our special events. Our Bat Program Training will take place on June 7th. Visit our website, www. yolobasin.org, for more information about volunteer opportunities!
