Portion of Dry Creek Parkway Trail Renamed to Honor Robert Bastian

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - With the blessing of the Board of Supervisors at its Feb. 28 meeting, a portion of the Dry Creek Parkway will be renamed in honor of Robert (Bob) Bastian.

Mr. Bastian was a leader

in the community, having been born and raised in North Sacramento. He attended local schools and earned his Associate of Arts degree from American River College, a Bachelor of Arts in Education and a Master of Arts in Special Education from Sacramento State. He taught for more than 30 years, at Del Paso Junior High School, Lincoln High School and the majority of his career with the Rio Linda Union School District.

"Bob's dedication to his local community seemed almost limitless, and he served on and founded many local clubs and organizations," said Liz Bellas, Regional Parks Director. "Bob served on the Dry Creek Parkway Advisory Committee and was a

member of the Sacramento County Recreation and Park Commission, a commission he served on for 31 years, from 1987-2018."

In addition to his time serving on County commissions and committees, Mr. Bastian also served as

Chairperson for the Rio Linda/Elverta Recreation and Park District; founding member, President and Vice President of the Rio Linda/Elverta Historical Society; President, Vice President, and Vision Chairperson for the Rio Linda/Elverta Lions Club; a Shriner; a Mason; and a member of the Rio Linda Chamber of Commerce, the Grant Alumni Association, and the Grange.

He was a Special Olympics and Pop Warner football coach, and he served as a leader for the 4-H club. Bastian was an elected member of the Rio Linda Union School District Board of Trustees.

The Dry Creek Parkway Trail from Dry Creek road heading northeast to "U" street will be known as the Robert F. Bastian Memorial Trail.

Sacramento County Ends COVID-19 **Public Health Emergency**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On February 28th, 2023, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted to end the local COVID-19 State of Emergency and Public Health Emergency. The ending of the emergency declaration does not rescind or impact Health Officer Orders or California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Orders governing mask usage in certain settings.

Sacramento County Public Health identified the first case of COVID-19 in Sacramento County three years ago this month. Since then, there have been over 368,000 reported cases of COVID-19 and over 3,700 residents of Sacramento County have died from COVID-19. COVID-19 will not go away on February 28 and residents are urged to continue to take steps to prevent the spread of respiratory illnesses. This includes staying up-to-date on COVID-19 vaccinations, testing for COVID-19 if you have symptoms, and asking your healthcare provider about treatments if you test positive for COVID-19. Vulnerable people, including those who are at greater risk for severe illness, should consider wearing a mask in indoor public places.

Some of the changes residents may notice when the emergencies end and in the coming months:

Dashboard

The Sacramento County Public Health COVID-19 dashboard will no longer be updated after March 1. After this date, please use the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) "Tracking COVID-19 in California" dashboard to access the latest data.

Public Meetings

Meetings governed by the Brown Act, such as City Councils, Board of Supervisors, School Boards, and their affiliated advisory bodies will need to return to in-person meetings if they have not already done so.

Testing Sites

Some underutilized State-funded testing sites will wind down operations in the coming months. CDPH has indicated testing sites will remain open as long as funding is available and they are being utilized. No closure dates have Continued on page 5

Board Approves American River NRMP

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously yesterday to approve the American River Natural Resources Management Plan (NRMP).

The goal of the NRMP is to provide relevant and defensible information to the Parkway Managers so that they can make informed decisions for managing, maintaining and enhancing Parkway resources. In general, the NRMP provides a clear understanding of existing Parkway resources, the effects of disturbances such as flood, fire, invasive species and human impacts, as well as opportunities for protection and enhancements.

"We are so excited to get to work implementing the American River Natural Resource Management Plan," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "This plan includes 65 site-specific projects, and we expect to get started on 12 of them within the first 10 years, including establishing low-growing native vegetation under power lines in the Discovery, Woodlake, Cal Expo, and Watt areas of the Parkway; developing a conceptual naturalization plan for a stormwater runoff channel at Woodlake; developing a wildfire rehabilitation plan; and establishing a community science program."

In addition to the NRMP, staff have developed a draft NRMP Monitoring Plan that provides Regional Parks with a framework for monitoring and reporting the progress of general and specific management actions set forth in the The Monitoring Plan

will include ongoing coordination with stakeholders and/or project proponents to ensure that project implementation and monitoring activities are integrated into the overall monitoring and reporting goals of the NRMP. These monitoring and reporting goals cover biological resources, physical resources, cultural resources, human use impact reduction, as well as agency and community coordination.

The Monitoring Plan will be brought to the American River Parkway Advisory Committee for endorsement, and to the Recreation and Parks Commission for final approval.

to Groundwater Decisions

California Farm Bureau Press Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California Farm Bureau President Jamie Johansson responded to the California Department of Water Resources announcement on sustainability plans for the state's groundwater

The agency recommended approval of plans for six California groundwater subbasins. It declared six other plans to be "inadequate," which will result in a review by the State Water Resources Control Board.

"This action will trigger a process before the water board that will afford local agencies additional opportunities to address identified problems, regain control of their basins and, hopefully, avoid formal probationary status or the imposition of eventual state interim plans," Johansson said.

"Passage of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act in the 2014 drought year was a seismic shift in California water," he said. "It was never going to be easy to

transition on a timeline of just 20 years to eliminate an estimated 2.5 million acre-feet of overdraft a year in our most impacted areas of the state. Historic droughts in recent years have also shown us that we can't simply continue as we have been, and that California must also invest in a more resilient, 21st-century water system."

Johansson added, "California Farm Bureau will work with state and local agencies, our county Farm Bureaus and our agricultural groundwater users on workable solutions to sustain healthy aquifers. Our groundwater supplies are critical for California farmers, including vegetable, fruit, nut, and dairy producers who account for much of America's food supply. It is important that California carefully consider solutions that protect both our aquifers and our food production."

The California Farm Bureau works to protect family farms and ranches on behalf of nearly 29,000 members statewide and as part of a nationwide network of 5.3 million Farm Bureau members.

DA Thien Ho Announces the 2023 Citizens Academy

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Learn about the criminal justice system, discuss issues related to use of force, specialized prosecutions and sensitive current events and engage in open discussions with top administrators!

District Attorney Thien Ho announced that applications are now being accepted for this year's in-person Citizens Academy. The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office hosts the program in partnership with the Sacramento Police Department, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office and the Sacramento County Probation Department.

The program is designed to engage citizens from all backgrounds and communities in discussion about public safety and criminal justice issues. Participants learn about our local criminal justice system – including the roles of law enforcement, prosecutors and the courts. Topics include the anatomy of a criminal case; specialized areas

of prosecution; CSI and crime lab analysis; local gangs; use of force; innovative programs and partnerships; and community-focused public safety partnerships and initiatives. There is also an opportunity for a field trip to the 911 Communications Center.

Representatives from the District Attorney's Office, Probation Department, Public Defender's Office, law enforcement, the judiciary and community organizations will provide information, answer questions and address community concerns.

There is NO cost to participants. The 10-week course is held on Tuesday evenings starting April 4, 2023 – June 13, 2023, from 6 p.m. – 8 p.m. at the Sacramento Police Department's Safety Center (5770 Freeport Blvd., Sacramento).

Giving Goldens a Second Chance

- There is a great non-profit in our region that is bringing a lot of "gold" to the community. The organization is NORCAL Golden Retriever Rescue and their mission is to rescue and place adoptable Golden Retrievers into loving homes.

As the privileged pet owner of a 13-year-old rescue, this author was personally thrilled to take on this writing assignment to help bring visibility to the non-profit and to a local Golden lovers group doing good in the community.

The first thing to know about NORCAL Golden Retriever Rescue (NGRR) is they do not have a central facility for sheltering dogs. Instead, they rely on an extensive team of well-networked volunteers to help keep everything running smoothly.

NGRR services Northern California to the Lake Tahoe/Reno region and to Fresno and San Luis Obispo Counties. Skilled volunteers are always wanted to support the organization in a variety of roles – from hands-on operations to professional services.

Fostering is at the heart of this rescue where volunteers open up their homes to surrendered Goldens needing a safe temporary environment. Upon intake, dogs receive a veterinary exam, vaccinations, and are spayed and neutered if needed. NGRR covers all medical expenses while a dog is in foster care.

The non-profit relies on contributions and their online store (www.ngrr.org) to help defray costs.

For the Love of the Breed

Robin Gostovich is NGRR's Outreach and Special Events Coordinator for the Sacramento and surrounding areas. "Some 400 dogs a year are given a second chance when they find NORCAL Golden Retriever Rescue," she reports. "We're always looking

for compassionate dog lovers to help out."

As a long-time owner of Goldens and a Fair Oaks resident, Robin got involved with the organization eight years ago when one of her daughters found a dog online. Their new dog, Simon, became the first of many Goldens the family adopted or fostered through NGRR.

Robin has fostered at least 20 dogs. "It's not hard to give one up when you know it's going to the right home. Yeah, you may cry when that time comes, but you do what's best for the dog. It's always about the dog!"

She is huge advocate for Goldens and for NGRR – two topics she loves to talk about. "I just want people to know about this amazing breed and what a great job NGRR does for their dogs."

Robin and her husband, Mark, now have three Goldens at home:

12-year old Quincy, 10-year old Donne, and 6-year old Hero. Robin likes to say, "Goldens are like potato chips, you can't have just one!"

A Group for Golden Lovers

Community outreach is an important part of what Robin does. "Everyone loves to meet our Goldens. The dogs open up so many doors leading to people and organizations who look to us

for support."

Robin is also the founder of a Northern California group called Norcal Golden Lovers Sac. "It's through this group and partnerships that we're able to give back to the community."

The group hosts fundraisers and accepts donated pet supplies and food for two local non-profits: Growing Past Today and Jake's Journey. They also donate dog

food to the Orangevale-Fair Oaks Food Bank.

Matt Rise owns LogOff Brewing in Rancho Cordova where Robin often hosts fundraisers and social events through Norcal Golden Lovers Sac. He enjoys supporting their activities by bringing visibility to their causes and has even placed a permanent doggy donation bin inside the brewery.

"At LogOff Brewing we love dogs! It's satisfying to know how much community good has come out of our partnership with Robin and all the volunteer work she does on behalf of NGRR and Norcal Golden Lovers Sac."

Matt is hosting Barks and Brews on March 26 from 2-6 p.m. "It's a fun dog-themed event at the brewery benefitting Front Street Animal Shelter. Come meet the vendors and enjoy live music and food," he says. "Norcal Golden Lovers Sac will be on-hand to accept donations of bagged dog food, leashes, and dog toys for the non-profits they support."

Meetups and Playdates

Members of Norcal Golden Lovers Sac also team up for fun events, meetups, and playdates with their Goldens. Robin spearheads a local social Meetup site of 783 members to help spread good will in the community and have some fun, too! The meetups are open to all Golden Retriever owners.

"These dogs make great ambassadors. We are simply Golden lovers doing good in the community while enjoying our pups!"

Arrest Made in Rio Linda Homicide Case


RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - At approximately 2:53 P.M. on Sunday, February 26, 2023, California Highway Patrol Officers were investigating a traffic accident in Rio Linda. They reported they heard gunshots in the area (unrelated to their investigation), possibly near U Street. Sacramento County Sheriff's Deputies responded to assist shortly thereafter, where they discovered a male victim lying on the driveway of a residence.

Deputies were able to move the victim to an area away from the residence and began life-saving measures. Simultaneously, deputies began calling the residence's occupants outside, detaining two individuals. The

Sacramento Metro Fire Department responded to the scene and continued life-saving measures but ultimately declared the victim, 42-year-old Russell Mawyer, deceased at the scene.

Sheriff's Homicide Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators responded to the scene a short time later, interviewed witnesses, and gathered evidence. The two individuals from the residence were deemed to have not been involved and were released at the scene.

Based on their investigation, Sheriff's Homicide Detectives arrested the victim's 39-year-old brother, Robert Mawyer. Mawyer was booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail for murder and is scheduled to appear in court on March 8, 2023, at 8:30 A.M.

Homicide on Rogue River Drive Leaves 2 Dead and 2 Wounded

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - At approximately 1:15 A.M. on Monday, March 6, 2023, Sacramento County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a residence on Rogue River Drive regarding an incomplete 911 call. An anonymous caller reported that people were being shot near the location. Deputies arrived shortly thereafter and discovered four victims suffering from gunshot wounds inside the residence. Two victims were pronounced deceased at the scene by Sacramento Metro Fire Department personnel, while the other two were transported to a local hospital by ambulance. The two surviving victims remain in critical condition with life-threatening injuries.

Two other individuals were present inside the residence when deputies arrived. They were subsequently held for questioning. Homicide Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators responded to the scene a short time later, interviewed witnesses, and gathered evidence. No further information or suspect information is available at this time. The identity of the victims will be made available by the Sacramento County Coroner's Office after notification has been made to their next of kin.

Defendant Convicted of 27 Child Sexual Assault Charges with Multiple Victims

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Howard Loveless pled to 27 child sexual assault charges, including lewd and lascivious touching of a child under 14, lewd and lascivious touching of child with force and annoy or molest of a child. Loveless admitted to enhancements for crimes against more than one victim, substantial sexual conduct and one-strike sentencing. He also admitted to aggravating factors that the crime involved a high degree of cruelty, viciousness, or callousness; the victim was particularly vulnerable; the manner in which the crime was carried out indicates planning and sophistication; and he took advantage of a position of trust or confidence.

On November 7, 2020, Loveless babysat the then 7-year-old victim. Later that evening, the victim told her

parents about sexual acts Loveless committed against her. DNA evidence linked Loveless to the sexual assault. During the investigation, Loveless admitted to sexually abusing the victim and admitted to sexually abusing another victim. The second victim confirmed to detectives that Loveless starting abusing her when she was approximately 10 years old to 20 years old. A third victim reported that Loveless also sexually abused her when she was between 4 and 13 years old. She stated that Loveless was violent with her and threatened to hurt her or her family if she told anyone about the abuse. A fourth 9-year-old victim reported that Loveless was inappropriate with her.

Loveless faces a maximum sentence of 424 years to life in state prison. Sentencing is set for March 24, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 13 before the Honorable Matthew Gary.

Golden 1 Center and Partners Seek to Improve Access to Sacramento Events

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As Sacramento's Golden 1 Center welcomes increasing numbers of visitors back to the stadium to enjoy Kings games, concerts, and other events, community members who are blind or have low vision will notice improvements to the stadium's online ticket purchase platform. These improvements are thanks to collaboration between the Golden 1 Center, non-profit law firm Disability Rights Advocates (DRA), the ACB Capital Chapter of the California Council of the Blind (CCB), and other community members.

DRA reached out to the Golden 1 Center on behalf of the ACB Capital Chapter, Kings season ticket holder Leslie Thom, and community member Margie Donovan to notify the stadium of difficulties that individuals who are blind had experienced attempting to purchase tickets using the Golden 1 Center's online ticket purchase platform. Due to programming barriers, the ticket purchasing website was incompatible with the software that many customers who are blind use to navigate and interact with websites. called screen readers. Because this online platform is the only way to purchase tickets without going to the box office in person, it is important that the process be accessible for individuals who are blind or have low vision.

When notified, Golden 1 Center got to work to fix the problems by hiring a web access consultant to assess not only the ticket purchase platform, but the entire Kings and Golden 1 Center websites. They also worked with vendors to implement

the recommended modifications. These improvements follow the Golden 1 Center's recent addition of audio description services for eventgoers who are blind or have low vision so that they can enjoy all aspects of performances at the arena.

"To my knowledge, Golden 1 Center is the first arena with audio description and a fully accessible ticket purchasing system. Being fully accessible to people who are blind or visually impaired is something Golden 1 Center can be proud of," said Capital Chapter member Margie Donovan.

"It is always great when businesses invest in a relationship with local advocates," said Meredith Weaver, a senior staff attorney at DRA. "The Golden 1 Center has done just that with the Capital Chapter, and we are encouraged by the company's recognition that increasing access is good for the community and good for business."

During the Kings' February 23 home game against the Portland Trailblazers, Golden 1 Center and the Kings highlighted their dedication to the blind community in Sacramento by featuring DRA and CCB at the arena's Do Good Corner, which provided the opportunity to spotlight Golden 1 Center's commitment, share the importance of accessible technology, and connect individually with interested fans.



Transparency on Local Ballot Nottoli Place Shelter Measures Faces New Threat Opening for Older Adults

During every California election cycle, dozens of ballot measures to raise taxes or issue bonds appear on local ballots.

Long-standing state law requires that the ballot include a statement, no longer than 75 words, summarizing what each measure would do. For many years, sponsors would use their 75 words to extol the virtues of their measures, often concealing their true financial

impacts. In 2015, a Republican assemblyman from Big Bear, Jay Obernolte, carried a bill aimed at making the ballot summaries less slanted and more factual, and then-Gov. Jerry Brown signed it. Assembly Bill 809 required tax increase measures, including bonds, proposed via initiative to tell voters how much money they would raise (if approved) and how long the new taxes would remain in effect.

Two years later, Obernolte introduced Assembly Bill 195, which extended the useful for engaged votdisclosure requirement to tax and bond measures proposed by cities, counties, school districts and other local entities. It also added another requirement, that the 75-word explanation of measures be a "true and impartial synopsis" of the Newsom vetoed it, declaring *newspapers*.

proposal "in language that accurately, "I am concerned is neither argumentative nor likely to create prejudice for or against the measure."

The latter was clearly aimed at stopping ballot measure sponsors from using the 75-word summaries to campaign for Senate Bill 532, claiming their passage, and Brown it would "improve voter embraced that reform by signing AB 195.

Not surprisingly, local government officials and their allies didn't like it, fearing that having to explain the financial consequences of their proposals and abstain from language advocating their passage would make voters less likely to vote "yes" in the adjacent boxes. They complained that meeting all of the requirements in 75 words was impossible and found an ally in Scott Wiener, a Democratic state senator from San Francisco.

Just before the Legislature adjourned its 2019 session. Wiener used the so-called gut-and-amend maneuver to propose legislation that would repeal much of what Obernolte, who is now a congressman, had wrought. It would have allowed sponsors of tax and bond measures to skip including financial impacts in the 75-word statements and, instead, essentially allow them to tell voters, "See voter guide for tax rate information."

While voter guides are ers, it's fair to say that many, if not most, don't read them. They instead rely on the ballot language itself when making their decisions. Wiener won legislative approval of Senate Bill 268, but Gov. Gavin

that this bill as crafted will reduce transparency for local tax and bond measures."

We're now poised to do it all over again because Wiener is back with an almost identical measure, transparency into the financial implications of ballot measures."

However, it would have the opposite effect, as Newsom concluded.

Obernolte's requirements are "well intentioned," Wiener said in a statement, but "present massive - and at times insurmountable - challenges to transit agencies, school districts, cities, counties, hospitals, libraries, and other public entities that are legally required to rely on ballot measures to raise critical funds, especially for infrastructure projects."

The 75-word requirements are particularly difficult for complex, multi-tiered tax and bond proposals, Wiener said, leaving "little to no room to explain how the new taxes or bonds will actually be spent to benefit the local community."

Clearly, Wiener wants to make it easier to pass tax and bond measures by allowing their sponsors to once again use the 75-word summary for advocacy, rather than a "true and impartial synopsis."

They should make their case in campaigns, not use the ballot itself for propaganda.

- A new 15-bed facility for adults aged 60+ will be opening soon in Sacramento County. Nottoli Place, named after retired Sacramento County District 5 Supervisor Don Nottoli, will house older adults who are eligible for Sacramento Countv's Adult Protective Services (APS) and experiencing homelessness or housing instability.

"It's a high compliment and a true honor to have a safe harbor such as this bear my name," said Nottoli at the soft opening for the facility.

The shelter has 15 rooms. Some rooms will allow double occupancy for spouses or caretakers.

Several community members showed up for the soft opening of Nottoli Place on Thursday, February 23. During the ceremony, Sacramento County District 5 Supervisor Pat Hume highlighted how important it is for the county to have facilities like Nottoli Place.

"The reality is there

are people who live good lives who have had bad things happen to them and it is important that society steps up to protect them. Through no fault of their own, whether they are victims of abuse or neglect or being taken advantage of, this is a place for them to come and feel restored, to alter their faith and their hope. And they can have a safe, healthy environment to get back on their feet," said Sacramento County District 5 Supervisor Pat Hume.

Sacramento County, like many other counties in California, has seen an increase in older adults facing housing insecurity and homelessness for the first time due to a destabilizing event or because they are the victims of abuse or neglect. Nottoli Place is meant to provide a safe space for older adults until they are able to find more permanent housing.

"By adding this place that will be a place of comfort and warmth and welcoming we'll be able to address some of that need in our community and for that, I am very thankful," added Nottoli.

To be eligible for Nottoli Place, adults must be involved with Adult Protective Services and be able to live independently or have a care provider to assist them. Applicants must live in Sacramento County.

On-site services will be provided by Volunteers of America, including 24-hour staffing and availability 24 hours per day/seven days a week, daily meals, and laundry services.

Additionally, case management services will be provided with linkages to resources, including longer-term housing. There are rules people must abide by when staying at Nottoli Place. No alcohol or illegal drugs are allowed. Weapons are also forbidden. There is also a pet policy. One animal is allowed per guest. The pet must be vaccinated, and vaccination records are needed upon registration.



Break up with in-person DMV visits and complete most of your DMV todo list online instead! From renewing vehicle registration to changing your address on your driver's license or ID card, or driver's license renewal (and much more), the DMV continues to expand its online services to help meet your needs.

Q: I need to renew my vehicle registration; do I have to go into a DMV office?

A: Most people can renew their registration without a trip to the DMV. Check your notice from the DMV to make sure you're eligible.

The DMV's website has a "service advisor" that can tell you what options are available, such as renewing online, at a certified business partner, at your local AAA, or at a nearby kiosk. Before you begin the renewal process, make sure you have:

Your license plate number.

The last five digits of your vehicle identification number (VIN) or hull identification number (HIN) for a vessel/boat.

A renewal notice confirming your current address. If you have moved, update your address about one week **before** beginning your renewal application.

Your payment information.

Q: My driver's license is about to expire; can I renew it online?

A: For people who are not required to come to an office to take a test or eye exam, yes! With the DMV's convenient online services, most people are eligible to easily replace your driver's license or ID, or REAL ID online as long as you do not need to change your address or personal description, are not applying for a REAL ID for the first time, and are not renewing a commercial driver's license.

If you want to upgrade your driver's license or ID to a REAL ID during your renewal, then you can start the application online but will need to finish the process in a DMV office.


