County Seeks Proposals to Support Local Organizations

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County is soliciting proposals from lead organizations to help strengthen and build capacity of local non-profit community-based organizations (CBOs) that are focused on providing services to a variety of underserved populations, including: Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) who experience disproportionately negative health and social outcomes, unhoused individuals and families, individuals with behavioral health needs, individuals with involvement in the child welfare or criminal justice system, refugees/immigrants, and other marginalized communities which were disproportionately impacted by the pandemic.

Throughout the County, CBOs improve the quality of life in communities by providing educational, health, and social services to citizens in need of support, beyond the services generally provided by local governments. Through their unique connectivity to the communities they serve, CBOs can impact hard-to-reach and traditionally underserved populations in a culturally responsive and equitable manner. The County recognizes the value of partnering with CBOs to support local citizens and foster an environment in which the community can thrive and recover from the health, economic, and other negative impacts suffered as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The primary focus of this funding is to help CBOs develop core infrastructure to: 1. Effectively expand services and deepen their impact for underserved communities; 2. Build and strengthen the capacity for CBOs to more easily access and better manage government funds and contracts; 3. Support the integration and elevation of BIPOC-centered and serving CBOs; 4. Evaluate services and programs and improve equitable access and outcomes to underserved populations; and 5. Enhance the cultural responsiveness of service provision to traditionally underserved populations.

In 2020, the County declared racism as a public health crisis and since that time has begun to strategically invest in a focus on diversity, equity and inclusion. Building capacity and

Rio Linda High School Named One of Nine Exemplary Dual Enrollment Schools

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond announced on February 9, 2023, that nine schools have been designated as a 2022-23 Exemplary Dual Enrollment School. The newly created Exemplary Dual Enrollment Award publicly recognizes schools that provide students with opportunities to enroll in and earn college credits while in high school. California Exemplary Dual Enrollment schools demonstrate quality, equity-driven dual enrollment programs. This is the first year that schools are being recognized for this award, and the California Department of Education (CDE) plans to make it an annual recognition program.

"Congratulations to these schools for their incredible work providing students with a pathway to succeed in college and careers," said Thurmond. "California's dual enrollment programs lead to increased graduation rates, attendance,

and college readiness—all while helping underrepresented groups succeed, closing opportunity gaps. Congratulations to all the staff, educators, administrators, parents, and

students at these exemplary schools."

The award program encourages all California schools to strengthen and expand their dual enrollment offerings, particularly focusing on the inclusion of students of color,

socioeconomically disadvantaged students, and students who are the first in the family to attend college.

schools build collaborative relationships among high schools, colleges, families, community members, and industry partners. These programs had to mirror the student population, include underserved populations, and make

progress toward more equitable participation and outcomes. The programs also integrated with college and district plans and/or frameworks and converted college credits to high school credits.

All comprehensive high schools with dual enrollment programs were eligible to apply for the 2022-23 Exemplary Dual Enrollment Award. Early College High Schools, Middle College High Schools, and alternative education schools will be eligible to apply for the 2023-24 year. Board Affirms Development Process Improvements

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The County's development process is one step closer to undergoing comprehensive systematic and customer service improvements, as the Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on Tuesday, February 7, to support the direction and goals of the process.

The plan includes improving the timeliness of review, ensuring a predictable and consistent process, and a concerted focus on providing outstanding customer service.

"Simply put, we want Sacramento County to be the best place to build in the region for all of our customers," said Dave Defanti, Deputy County Executive, Community Services. "We're grateful for the Board's feedback about the Development Review Process improvements and for its support in implementing changes that will make the process more efficient and easier to navigate.

"These changes will help us to meet our goals of attracting, planning and fostering housing production and other beneficial uses in existing and new communities, and serving our customers even better than before."

Goals include an increase in affordable housing units, helping achieve state and local goals and regulations to address climate change and air quality, providing for unparalleled environmental protection and encouraging public participation.

Defanti provided the Board with an update on improvements recently implemented/positive outcomes:

Focus on building a collaborative, positive culture and supporting staff; Sacramento County earning the state's Pro-Housing Designation, a recognition of its commitment to policies that increase housing supply;

The formation of an Industry Working Group with representatives from the building industry that will vet new process improvements moving forward; Addition of two Development Process Managers, who will facilitate key projects through the County's processes; Training and review of the Accela Government Software system – the system of record for the development process – to review what's working and what can be improved; Providing customers with easy-to-follow manuals for how to do business with the County, including when and how to seek permits for construction activity.

Additional improvements in the coming months will lead to processes that:

Are timely, efficient, and carried out in a manner that recognizes "time is money" for our customers; Reduce complexity and eliminate superfluous requirements; Are consistent with industry best practices and comparable agencies' processes viewed by customers as exemplary; Include customers in problem-solving and decision-making; Ensure the level of detail requested is appropriate for any stage of development; Offer clear timelines and transparency for customers regarding the status of their permit or application; Provide routine opportunities to solicit and receive customer feedback; Empower staff to be innovative and creative to help solve problems and facilitate desirable development.

"Sacramento County is facing an unprecedented housing supply and affordability crisis, and we believe these improvements will positively affect new housing production to address these crises," said Defanti. "This is an exciting time for the County, and we look forward to updating County residents and the Board about our progress to affect real change."

Grant Program for Non-Profit Organizations to Open

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The County Board of Supervisors intends to continue providing \$1 million through the Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) Grant Program to support nonprofit organizations located in Sacramento County in Fiscal Year 2023-24. For the last 7 years, the Board of Supervisors has awarded funds to organizations that carry out community-based programs and/or services in the areas of economic and workforce development, arts and culture, community development, and health and human services. The County began setting aside funding for this purpose in 2017.

Grants will be allocated through a competitive process and applicants must meet eligibility and funding requirements. Applications will be accepted online beginning February 10, 2023, through the County's Office of Budget and Debt Management with a deadline of March 13, 2023.

Funding for the TOT Grant Program will come from County Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) revenues. Transient Occupancy Taxes are levied on guests who occupy rooms in hotels, motels and other temporary lodging accommodations in the unincorporated area of the County.

June 2023

Grant Program Hearing Notification: Applicants will receive a second electronic notification of the schedule for the Board of Supervisors Hearing where recommended award selections will be made.

The Board of Supervisors will make the final determination and approval for all TOT Grant Program recipients.

County Budget & Dept Management Division staff will notify applicants of funding selections within 5 business days of Board Hearing approval. All notifications will be made electronically.

County Budget & Dept Management Division staff will draft and administer agreements between the County and grantees.

Financial Literacy Needs to be Taught in California Schools

With more and more of our children failing to meet basic math skills, it's unfortunate but not surprising that so many adults struggle with achieving financial freedom. Late last year, California released statewide test scores that revealed only 33 percent of students were able to meet the state's math standards – a drop of seven percent from 2019. Some of those results are undoubtedly due to challenges associated with the pandemic. But the statistic on its own is cause for concern and action.

Adding financial literacy to the state's education curriculum could help improve those numbers as well as prepare our youth for the financial realities of adulthood.

Financial literacy is an individual's ability to understand and make informed decisions regarding their finances. This includes knowledge of basic financial concepts such as budgeting, saving, investing, and managing debt. In today's world, financial literacy is more important than ever. Here are a few reasons why California students would benefit from a

financial literacy course:

- **Better Money Management:** Financial literacy empowers individuals to manage their money effectively, enabling them to make informed decisions on spending, saving, and investing. It helps people understand the true cost of credit, set financial goals, and plan for future expenses.
- **Avoid Financial Scams:** Financial scams have become increasingly common. Research suggests that people who are financially literate are less likely to fall victim to them. Understanding basic financial concepts and being aware of common scams help individuals protect their money and avoid costly mistakes.
- **Improved Credit Scores:** Understanding the financial landscape can also have a positive impact on an individual's credit score, a metric used to determine one's ability to obtain credit. Understanding credit scores, how they are calculated, and how to maintain a good credit history can improve a person's chances of getting approved for loans, credit cards, and other financial products.
- **Retirement Planning:** With more and more Americans retiring at a later age, financial literacy can help students understand the importance of saving for retirement, and to choose the right investment options to ensure they have enough money to support themselves in their later years.
- **Financial Independence:** Financial literacy can help individuals become financially independent, reducing their dependence on credit, and enabling them

to take control of their financial future. This can increase self-esteem, reduce stress and lead to greater overall happiness.

Despite its importance, financial literacy is often not taught in schools and quite frankly it should be. Two years ago I was hopeful when legislation was introduced to authorize a school district or charter school to incorporate a financial literacy program into an economics course offered by the local school districts. Sadly, the bill never even received a committee hearing.

This lack of basic skills not being taught in our schools is having serious consequences, particularly for younger generations who don't have the knowledge and skills needed to manage their finances effectively.

We must support legislation at the national, state, and local level to teach financial literacy and encourage individuals to take an active interest in their finances.

Financial literacy is crucial for individuals to achieve financial stability and independence. It enables individuals to make informed decisions about their finances, protect themselves from financial scams, and plan for their future. Making financial literacy a priority will help ensure that individuals have the knowledge and skills they need to manage their finances effectively, and to achieve their financial goals, leading to a sense of financial freedom.

COVID-19 Effects on California Will Linger for Years

Gov. Gavin Newsom says California’s COVID-19 state of emergency will end on Feb. 28, just four days shy of three years since he issued the first of countless orders he said were necessary to cope with the pandemic.

“Throughout the pandemic, we’ve been guided by the science and data – moving quickly and strategically to save lives,” Newsom said in October announcing the February end date. “The state of emergency was an effective and necessary tool that we utilized to protect our state, and we wouldn’t have gotten to this point without it.”

The efficacy of Newsom’s pandemic orders will be debated for years, particularly the shutdowns of schools and businesses and the billions of dollars in no-bid contracts his administration issued.

What cannot be debated, however, is that their impacts on millions of Californians will linger for years, decades or perhaps even generations.

Nearly 3 million Californians lost their jobs due to the shutdown orders. While the state has, on paper, recovered all of the jobs it lost, countless small businesses that shut their doors have not reopened.

With work-at-home the growing norm, restaurants and other businesses

dependent on concentrated employment were clobbered. The downtowns of the state’s larger cities – including the state capital, Sacramento – were hollowed out and have not, in the main, recovered.

California’s stark divide between haves and have-nots grew wider. Upper-income Californians could do their jobs from home but lower-income service workers simply lost their jobs. Some qualified for unemployment insurance, but a managerial meltdown at the state Employment Development Department delayed, sometimes for months, benefits for legitimate claimants while EDD handed out billions of dollars to fraudsters.

School shutdowns, and the fitful efforts to continue instruction via the internet, had a devastating effect on students, especially those from poor families which lacked technology and whose parents could not work from home. The “achievement gap” that has long plagued California’s public school system widened even further, recent research has found.

Several new studies add even more evidence that the steps taken by the state to combat COVID-19 will have long-term negative impacts.

An analysis by The Associated Press, Stanford University’s Big Local News project and Stanford education professor Thomas Dee determined that 234,000 students in 21 states vanished from public school enrollment rolls during the pandemic. More than half of them were in California.

Overall, in those states, enrollment dropped by about 700,000 students, but

most of the decline could be explained by enrollments in private schools, movements to other states or shifts to at-home instruction. Of the remaining 234,000 absences for which there was no explanation, researchers said, 152,000 were in California.

The Public Policy Institute of California crunched the numbers and discovered that not only did COVID-19 kill about 100,000 Californians but that the state’s life expectancy, which had been tied for the nation’s highest with Hawaii at 80.9 years, has dropped by two years – the first such decline since World War II.

PPIC found that the higher death rate has disproportionately affected non-white Californians, particularly Latino and Black residents. “Between 2019 and 2021, the death rate (deaths per 1,000 residents) increased 51% among Latinos, 31% among Blacks, 26% among Asian-Americans, and 17% among whites,” the PPIC reported.

Finally, a new study UCLA Center for Health Policy Research found that Newsom’s stay-at-home orders, affecting businesses, child care centers and school, created financial hardships that led to psychological distress and a sharp increase in turmoil and conflict, including domestic violence.

Some COVID-19 victims are experiencing long COVID, with lasting debilitating effects. California suffers from lingering effects as well.

Through the generosity of the The Rio Linda News, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Rio Linda.

Several years ago, I was approached by a group of individuals who were desperately advocating for the Sacramento Board to approve Laura’s Law, which would establish collaborative court proceedings for seriously mentally ill individuals who have not committed a crime, do not know they have a problem and yet they are a danger to themselves or others. At the time, my thoughts immediately drifted back to overcrowded State Mental Institutions, the movie “One Flew Over the Cuckoo’s Nest,” and a person’s civil rights.

Who decides if someone is seriously mentally ill, and when is the appropriate time to intercede on their behalf?

Then I learned about a condition called Anosognosia. This condition makes people believe they are not sick and do not know they need help. People who suffer from Anosognosia are more vulnerable and can threaten their families and others.

To give you some history, “Laura’s Law” was named after 19-year-old Laura Wilcox, who was killed in 2001 while volunteering at the Nevada County Department of Behavioral Health by a former patient of the county’s outpatient mental health clinic. It was signed into Law in November 2002 and was patterned after New York’s highly successful Kendra’s Law (AB1421).

Laura’s Law is also known as Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT). It allows court-ordered, intensive outpatient treatment for people 18 years old or older who suffer from severe mental

illnesses and refuse treatment because their condition impairs their ability to make rational decisions.

We see and hear about these people daily. They are wandering the streets hungry and afraid, homeless and without hope. Sometimes they lash out, and their families don’t know how to help them. They are in our emergency rooms and often wind up in our jails, only to be released back to a society where they don’t fit in.

In 2021 the State of California required counties to “opt-in” or “opt-out” of the program, and if the county decided to “opt-out,” they had to provide a reason. By May of that year, the Sacramento Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to opt-in. Since that time, our staff has been coordinating with the Collaborative Courts – Judge Brown and his team, Law Enforcement Agencies, Probation, Adult Correctional Health, Substance Use Prevention and Treatment (SUPT), Department of Human Assistance (homeless services, Medi-Cal applications), and Community Organizations to meet individual service needs. The program has been estimated to cost 2.5 million annually.

I’m happy to report that our AOT Court is scheduled to go live in mid-February 2023. While we don’t know all the program details yet, I am told there will be a website for referrals; individuals will be strongly vetted to determine if they qualify for the program. Family members, roommates, treatment providers, and law enforcement may request an investigation. Only the County mental health director or their designee may file a petition with the court. There must be a clinical determination that the person is unlikely to be able to survive safely in the community without supervision. They will work with mental health and various service providers and receive multiple

interviews and offers for services appropriate to their condition. There will be an opportunity to accept assistance with Mental Health through a formal agreement. They receive encouragement, rewards, and even a graduation certificate during their treatment. If they do not take services, they can receive assistance from a public defender and petition the AOT Court, where they will go before the Honorable Superior Court Judge Lawrence Brown.

I met with Judge Brown last week, and he described these as collaborative justice courts, where a team of experts are all working together to achieve the best outcome for that person. While the Judge in the Black Robe is a strong influence, he underscored the importance of the collaborative team, who all work together on behalf of that person.

While we cannot force treatments or lock people up if they have not committed a crime, other counties with AOT programs report that many individuals opt into treatment before ever getting to the Judge in the Black Robe. It is my understanding that an estimated 30% of those treated are transitioning out of homelessness and into a stable living environment.

AOT is just one tool in our End Homelessness Toolbox. While expensive, it can positively impact our most vulnerable individuals, who represent a high cost to taxpayers, and negatively impact businesses and neighborhoods.

Legislation to Prohibit Homeless Encampments near Schools and Parks

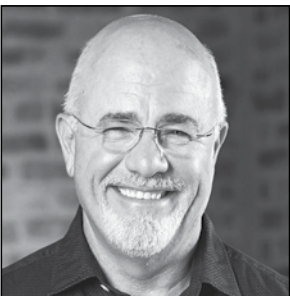

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On January 23, 2023, Assemblyman Josh Hoover (R-Folsom) announced the introduction of Assembly Bill 257, which would prohibit homeless encampments within

500 feet of schools, day-care centers, parks, and libraries. “As our local communities work toward mental health and housing solutions on homelessness, it is critical that the Legislature act to ensure our most sensitive public spaces are kept safe,” said Assemblyman Hoover. “No parent should be afraid to let their kids walk to school or worry about finding needles in the park where their children play, but that is the current experience for far too many families across our state. This legislation would change that.”

Last year several cities in California, including Sacramento and Los Angeles, voted for similar measures at the local level. Since 2019 homelessness in Sacramento County has grown by 67%, recently surpassing San Francisco for the first time. As a new member of the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, Assemblyman Hoover also plans to propose an audit of statewide homelessness spending in the near future to provide more accountability and determine which programs are effective at reducing homelessness. ★



Roll With It

The best thing to do is roll the money over into an IRA. Otherwise you’re going to be hit with a 10% penalty – plus your tax rate – and end up paying 30% to 40% of it to the government. That’s kind of like asking, “Would it be a good idea to borrow \$3,200 at 30% interest to pay off debt?” Of course not! That would be a really dumb idea. And in a sense, that’s what you’d be doing by just taking the money out of the TSP.

It’s not a ton of money, but conceptually, I hate the idea of giving the government 30% to 40% of my money just to get my money out. So yeah, do some research, find a good investment professional

near you – one with the heart of a teacher – and roll it into an IRA.

Congratulations to you and your wife for deciding to take control of your money. And thank you for your service to our country, Todd. I hope this helped.

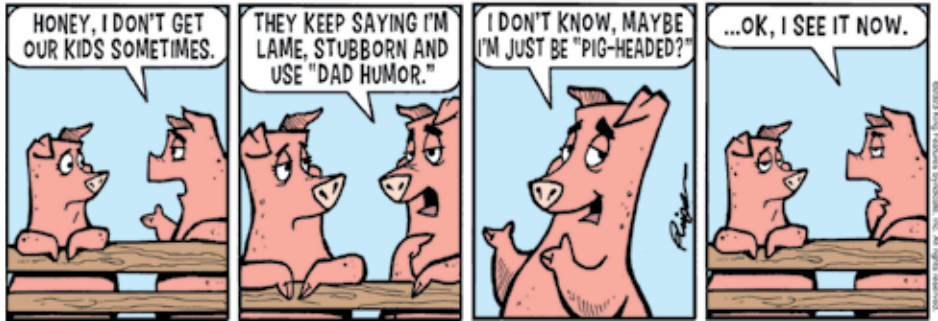

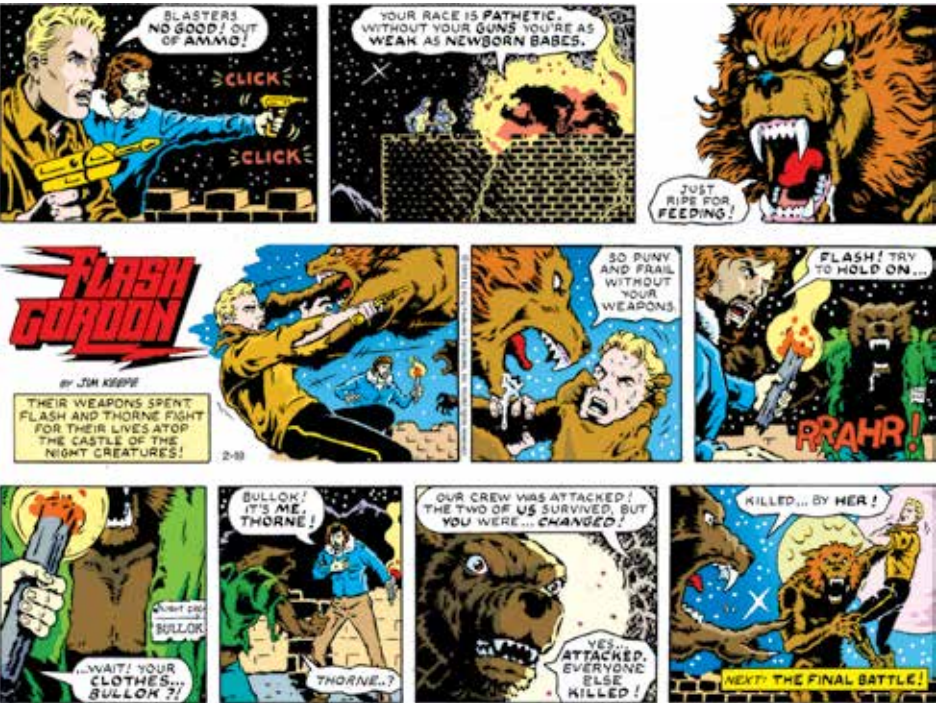
