# SMF Named WSJ's Top Airport



Sacramento International Airport was named the top airport in the nation according to the Wall Street Journal's 2022 Airport

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento International Airport (SMF) was named the top airport in the nation according to the Wall Street Journal's 2022 Airport rankings. Compared to the 50 other airports surveyed, SMF received the highest score overall.

The top 50 busiest airports were surveyed and then divided into two sizes - 20 large and 30 midsize. The airports were then measured on 19 categories including experience from on-time performance and security waits to customer-satisfaction scores and ticket prices. The categories ranked were

further grouped into three broad categories – reliability, convenience, and value.

SMF ranked highest among all airports surveyed in the reliability category and also ranked high in arrival and departure times, low flight cancellations, quick taxi and security clearance times, and a max walking distance of only 1,213 feet.

"The SMF team consistently provides our customers with a safe, comfortable and enjoyable travel experience," said Cindy Nichol, Director of the Sacramento County Department of Airports. "Living our values every day clearly makes a difference, as we make our customers

our top priority. We see each day as an opportunity to improve and accomplish more together by collaborating; communicating and taking pride in what we do."

In 2019, SMF similarly won the top midsized airport award - the award was not issued in 2020 or 2021 due to the pandemic.

The Sacramento County Department of Airports is responsible for planning, developing, operating and maintaining the county's four airports: Sacramento International Airport, Executive Airport, Mather Airport and Franklin Field. For more information, visit

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors, at its Nov. 15 meeting, voted to approve a resolution accepting a \$290,000 donation from Eppie's Wellness Foundation to support future Therapeutic Recreation Services (TRS) programming and the Gibson Ranch Sensory Playground Pathway to Play.

Of the \$290,000, \$140,000 will be placed in the Regional Parks' restricted funds to be used for future TRS program support over the next ten years. These funds will be used for the development of new programs or special funding requests such as scholarships or uniforms for the Sacramento Chargers sports teams.

The remaining \$150,000 will be used to complete

construction of the Gibson Ranch Sensory Playground Pathway to Play project, which will create a play area specifically designed to be accessible and inclusive for all children, but especially for those who have been diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

The Pathway to Play area includes various play equipment and is specifically designed for inclusive play, providing access to a range of sensory experiences for children of different abilities. These pieces of equipment are spread out so that they can limit sensory overload.

Sacramento area restaurateur/entrepreneur Eppie G. Johnson was the founder of Eppie's Great Race, a Sacramento tradition that took place annually along the American River Parkway in collaboration with Sacramento County

Parks. During his lifetime, he supported Regional Parks in numerous ways, including promoting the American River Parkway and bringing out park users to train and appreciate the jewel of Sacramento, the American River.

"Eppie had a deep appreciation for the American River Parkway, and he was an avid supporter of Therapeutic Recreation Services (TRS), a recreation program offered through the Department, serving those with a variety of disabilities," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "We will be forever grateful to Eppie and his family, and the tremendous generosity they have shown Regional Parks over the years."

Eppie founded the event in 1974, holding the first triathlon on July 27, 1974. The race featured a 5.82-mile run, a 12.5-mile bike and a

6.10-mile paddle held along the scenic American River Parkway in Rancho Cordova and Sacramento. This event provided an opportunity to race for all ages and abilities. The final race was held in 2018.

The proceeds from the event raised more than \$1.5 Million dollars for causes within Sacramento, including over \$1 Million specifically for TRS. Eppie's Great Race Foundation was incorporated by Eppie Johnson in 2004, and the Foundation was renamed by the Board of Directors to the Eppie's Wellness Foundation (EWF) in 2014.

The EWF Board of Directors decided to dissolve the foundation by the end of 2022, and in keeping with Eppie's historic support of Regional Parks and TRS, it decided to donate a majority of the remaining assets to Regional Parks. ★

# \$647 Million to Cover Overdue Utility Bills

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Gov. Gavin Newsom on November 22 announced the release of \$647 million in funding to help over 1.4 million California households struggling to pay

their overdue energy bills.

The awarded funding will eliminate all past due energy debt accrued by residential customers between March 4, 2020 and December 31, 2021, providing real relief to households that have suffered the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and increased energy debt.

Over the last year, California has distributed over \$1.6 billion in financial assistance for bill credits through the California Arrearage Payment Program (CAPP) to reduce or eliminate overdue electric and gas bills.

"California has made unprecedented commitments to help vulnerable households stay afloat as the cost-of-living increases," said Governor Newsom. "By providing utility relief that will eliminate over 1.4 million Californians' overdue energy bills, we're helping families who continue to struggle with higher costs."

Governor Newsom and the California Legislature established the 2022 California Arrearage Payment Program (2022 CAPP) to address 100 percent of past due energy bill balances incurred by residential customers during the program's COVID-19 pandemic bill relief period covering March 4, 2020 to December 31, 2021. Thirty-three energy utilities applied for 2022 CAPP funding on behalf of over 1.4 million eligible residential customers.

Participating state energy utilities are required to apply a 2022 CAPP bill credit to their customer accounts within 60 days of receiving funds.

"Once again, we are leading with our values by working to ensure that our neighbors economically impacted by the pandemic can keep their lights on," said California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly. "Many of us fell behind as the pandemic continued, and our commitment to further address energy debts is another way we are lifting up all Californians."

CAPP is administered by the Department of Community Services and Development (CSD). Under the first round of CAPP funding in 2021, over 1.5 million residential

# Feeding a Country During War

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -**We all see on TV news about the war in the Ukraine. Most of us feel compassion towards what the citizens in that country are going through, but we really have very little idea of what it's really like. One local man, who is a baker by trade (specializing in making bread) decided that he wanted to do something to

help them. For safety purposes, we will use only his first name

- Shawn.

"Sometimes charity takes more than writing a check or waving a flag," said Shawn. He joined a group out of Washington DC called World Central Kitchen. This organization is strictly a humanitarian organization with no political influence or agenda. They simply go where they are needed to help get food to those who need it. In fact, neither the organization nor the government supplied any support, of any kind,

in the mission. Shawn explained that even though the Ukraine usually has a good wheat production, other countries are sending them wheat now, but they didn't really know what to do with Businesses like bakeries are shut down or bombed. Those that aren't cannot follow their regular baking schedule because they are under martial law. No one is allowed outside from 10pm to 6am, except for military. Shawn knew he could help.

Shawn and three others went to the war-ravaged Ukraine this summer to do what they could to feed the Ukrainian people. Told ahead of time to bring a flak jacket and a Kevlar helmet, Shawn wasn't sure what he was getting into. He just knew that they needed help and this was something he could do. He didn't bring a jacket and helmet

because he thought it would raise questions in both our airports and theirs. Once he was there, he wished he would have.

"You can't go into a war zone armed unless you are part of the local militant system," Shawn said, "I just went in looking like a normal American tourist." Shawn and his friends arrived in the Ukraine with only their carry-on luggage. They were questioned why they were there. Any electronic devices were gone through thoroughly, including all text messages, photos, etc. Burner phones were purchased for the minimal communication that would be used. Russian spies and Pro-Russian Ukrainians had devices that lifted cell phone numbers when they crossed into the country. Those numbers were closely monitored while they were there. Photos were not permitted.

They traveled in different

modes while there, but no matter how they were traveling, they were regularly stopped (about every kilometer) and questioned by Ukrainian Security about why they were there and what they were doing. They especially focused on Americans. Men would board trains, buses, etc. armed with machine guns and AK47's to question passengers on their purpose of travel. Every time they focused a lot of attention on Shawn, often being the only American.

Ukrainian soldiers don't have many supplies on the frontline, so it was standard practice for people to take an SUV or some other vehicle and fill it with gasoline, food, socks and other supplies. They would then take these vehicles to the frontline and just leave them there. One of these vehicles was one of the modes of transportation that Shawn's group used to get to the next area.

Shawn and his group would arrive in a city and pull together whatever they could to set up. They would gather supplies from grocery stores that had been bombed, or restaurants that had been destroyed and occasionally they might get some food from suppliers. They would use whatever they could, often an oil drum to cook on. In one city they even used a burnt out tank to turn into a stove. They would gather big pots and set them on their make shift stoves to make soup or stew. Sometimes they made sandwiches. Occasionally they had bags of groceries to hand out.

When the air raid sirens go off, they go off across the country so you never know where the missiles were headed. Many people began to ignore them. Others would run for cover, taking safety in the underground bunkers that are

under most public buildings there (left over from WWII). There were missile strikes all around them, the closest being just a few blocks away. It was so close they could feel the rumble of the ground as the bomb exploded. In one town there was a missile that had hit the ground and was sticking out of the ground but had not detonated.

In the more rural areas, such as villages, people hid in their root cellars (a cellar that is designed for storage of potatoes and other produce). They would come out sheepishly at first, until they got to know them, then more people would come out. Sometimes the same people would make multiple trips to the same bunker. This was especially true in areas that were under heavy bombardment.

As people got to know the group, more people would come out to help. There was even a 15-year-old girl in a flak jacket and Kevlar helmet delivering bread. The group would come across schools being taught in bunkers because their school had been bombed. Shawn and his friends did what they could to get these kids school supplies.

"The hardest thing was the language barrier," Shawn said, "But we brought a bunch of little hot wheels cars and John Deer tractors and handed those out. It was a great ice breaker, as many of them were farmers." Shawn and his group spent three and a half weeks there and he spent around \$5000 out of his own pocket to fund the trip and supplies. They fed roughly 1500 people a day from their mobile kitchens, mostly women and children.

"It was an amazing experience. They were very grateful that we were there, and I would love to go back" Shawn said.

and commercial energy utility customers received a CAPP bill credit to reduce or eliminate their past due energy bill. While this provided significant relief for customers, not all residential arrearages were covered by the original program. With today's awards, 2022 CAPP will eliminate all remaining eligible past due energy debt accrued by residential customers during the COVID-19 pandemic bill relief period of March 4, 2020 to December 31, 2021.

"California households, through no

fault of their own, continue to suffer from the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and cost of living increases, including energy expenses," said CSD Director David Scribner. "The state was able to mobilize quickly to address historic levels of energy debt through CAPP in 2021, and building on last year's success, we have done it again in 2022 to effectively and efficiently deliver critical financial assistance to Californians in need."

# Public Health Awarded Grant for Child Safety Seats

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Public Health, along with partner agency Mercy San Juan, will educate parents and caregivers on how to properly secure children in a safety seat.

The \$71,500 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) pays for a variety of community outreach events, including education classes and training on the installation and use of child safety seats to parents and caregivers, specifically focused on underserved and refugee communities.

The car seat safety program includes Child safety

seat inspection events and education classes. Child Passenger Safety Technician (CPST) training and recertification courses. Child safety seats at no cost for families in need. Partnering with local organizations on car seat safety community outreach efforts in underserved communities.

The program runs through September 30, 2023.

"The OTS grant funding is critical in helping families, caregivers and education professionals keep children safe," Dr. Olivia Kasirye, Sacramento County Public Health Officer said. "Protecting children is everyone's top priority, and properly secured car seats are

one significant way to prevent harm to children in the event of a crash."

"Like seat belts for teens and adults, correctly installed car seats are the best protection for children while they are traveling," OTS Director Barbara Rooney said. "Car seat programs are an important traffic safety ally."

# Round 2 Small Business and Nonprofit Grant Now Open

- Round 2 of the Sacramento
County Small Business &
Nonprofit Grant Program is
now open. Small businesses
and nonprofit organizations
adversely affected by the pandemic are invited to apply for

relief grants.

The application is available through the sac4smallbiz.org website and will be open from November 1, 2022, at 8 a.m. PST through December 15, 2022, at 5 p.m. PST.

Funded with a portion of the County's American Rescue Plan Act allocation, the County Board of Supervisors has approved this Program to support 750 small businesses and nonprofit organizations with grants of \$10,000 in one-time financial assistance. Grant funds for this Program can be used to reimburse small businesses and nonprofit organizations for costs related to the negative economic

impacts they have experienced due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the related health and safety restrictions.

To be eligible, applicants must operate from a commercial location within the unincorporated County, received \$2.5M or less in annual gross revenue in 2020 and have 25 or less

full-time equivalent employees. Applicants can check whether their address is within the unincorporated County online at assessorparcelviewer.saccounty. gov.

# Rio Linda Man Arraigned on **Multiple Charges after Market Fire**

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - On November 23, Rio Linda resident Sean Larsen was arraigned in Yolo County Superior Court on charges of arson and conspiracy to commit theft and arson.

Larsen was arrested by the Sacramento Police Department on November 19, 2022, on a warrant for suspicion of arson and theft from an incident occurring on

October 27, 2022, wherein a fire was started in the Bel Air Grocery Store in Woodland. The Yolo County District Attorney's Office filed a criminal complaint on November 22, 2022, alleging arson and two counts of conspiracy. Three other suspects remain at large.

Larsen entered a not guilty plea and is scheduled for a Preliminary Hearing on December 9, 2022. Larsen remains in custody on \$50k bail.

### **Expedite your Holiday Travels** with DMV's Online Services and More!

The Thanksgiving season is one of the busiest travel times of the year. The DMV wants to make sure that you are prepared for busy airports so you can catch your flight with ease. Your travels will be easier when you take advantage of DMV online services to get your REAL ID.

### Q: I am planning to fly home to visit my family this holiday season. Do I need a REAL ID to board domestic flights?

A: While you will not need a REAL ID to board domestic flights or to enter federal facilities this holiday season, you will next year. The enforcement date is May 3, 2023. We highly encourage all Californians to give themselves the gift of a REAL ID this holiday season! REAL ID appointments are available, and you can also check DMV Office wait times online if you do not have an appointment. Before you go, complete your REAL ID application online and simply finish the transaction in person at a DMV Office.

View a full list of acceptable documents and start your application online here.

### Q: I lost my driver's license and need to replace it before flying home for Thanksgiving. Can I request a replacement online?

A: Yes, if your driver's license (DL) has been lost, stolen, damaged or mutilated, a replacement DL can be requested online by following these steps:

Create an online account (if you haven't previously).

If you've submitted a Change of Address (COA) confirm that the change has been processed and wait 14 days before requesting a replacement DL.

(Confirmation can be done in the COA system.) Be prepared to pay a fee for your replacement driver's license.

You should receive your new DL card in the mail within two to four weeks. If you have not received your DL card after 60 days, call 1-800-777-0133 to check the status.

### Q: My car registration is out of date, and I don't have time to visit the DMV before the holidays. Can I renew my registration online?

A: Yes! Skip the line this holiday season and renew your vehicle registration online. The DMV offers a variety of online services that make completing your DMV business easy and efficient, from renewing vehicle registration to changing your address, or driver's license renewal - and much more! You can find a list of online services at dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv-online/.

In addition to online services, the DMV offers other methods for completing select transactions to help reduce your trips to the DMV and save you time this holiday season, including DMV kiosks and Business Partner Automation (BPA) locations:

DMV kiosks are freestanding self-service touchscreen devices that guide you through various DMV transactions, from registration renewal and payment to submitting proof of insurance. You can find a list of DMV kiosk locations at https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/locations/kiosks/.

Our Business Partner Automation (BPA) program authorizes qualified partners to process vehicle related transactions, including vehicle registration and titling, from their remote locations. # The Yin and Yang of California's Job Picture

When California's monthly report on employment was issued last week telling us what the situation was in October Gov. Gavin Newsom quickly issued a celebratory statement.

"California has now fully recovered all jobs that were lost to the pandemic-induced recession, but we know this isn't the finish line," Newsom said, making a plug for his economic programs to counter rising consumer costs and "to help create thousands of jobs and opportunities for Californians throughout the state."

Newsom claimed that "California has recovered 101.1% of the 2,758,900 jobs lost during the recession the state is now 30,800 jobs above the pre-pandemic level total of February

Data from the state **Employment Development** Department (EDD) tell a slightly different story. In February 2020, according to EDD's bulletin for that month, 18,756,900 Californians were employed. The bulletin for October 2022 pegged employment at 18,502,900, or 254,000 fewer.

Numbers aside, California's employment picture has definitely improved from what it was

the state's jobless rate had soared from less that 4% than 16%. Newsom had ordered widespread shutdowns of business to counter the spread of COVID-19. throwing nearly 3 million Californians out of work.

The financial pain to millions of California families was made immeasurably worse when EDD experienced a bureaucratic meltdown that prevented many jobless workers from collecting unemployment insurance payments, sometimes for months. Moreover, under pressure to clear the backlog, EDD workers then swung too far the other way, authorizing tens of billions of dollars in payments to fraudulent applicants.

Although the October report tells us that almost as many Californians were employed as prior to the COVID-19 recession, the state's overall job picture is more complex than those simple numbers.

For one thing, the reports for February 2020 and October 2022 reveal that the state's labor force the total of Californians either employed or looking for work — has shrunk by nearly a quarter-million persons. The numbers continue a long-term decline in what's called "labor force participation" — the percentage of working-age adults who have jobs or want to work. They also imply that as the state's overall population ages, the pool of potential workers is also shrinking.

Whatever the underlying causes, the labor force decline is one reason why California's employers are having such great difficulty

two-plus years ago, when finding enough workers and why they are raising wages to as much as \$18 an hour of the labor force to more for fast food workers, for example — to attract more applicants.

"For the past full year and for first time in decades, California has more job openings than job seekers," a new report from the Public Policy Institute of California notes. "While this is good news for people looking for work, it also limits businesses' workforce plans and growth - and wage increases have put upward pressure on prices."

In response, the PPIC report says, some employers are implementing more labor-saving technology, such as ordering kiosks in fast food outlets and GPS-guided machinery in agriculture.

The labor shortage may be having other impacts. The sharp drop in community collage enrollment could, for instance, reflect would-be students' opting for higher wages in service industries over education.

We may look back on October 2020 as a high point for employment in California because, economists tell us, a recession may be on the horizon. Some employers, especially those in the high-tech industry, are already laying off thousands of workers in anticipation of a downturn.

California has a history of experiencing a recession of some kind about once a decade and we may be due for another.





A Church Car? You've Got to Be Kidding!

My mom took out a Parent PLUS loan in 2009 to help pay for my college education. I also took out \$70,000 in student loans myself. My mom never made a payment on the loan she took out for me, and now the amount due on the Parent PLUS loan has ballooned to \$100,000. She recently told me in her mind it was my loan in her name, and I should be the one to make the payments after I became financially stable. Thankfully I just got a new job making \$140,000 a year. With this I can finally make a dent in my own loans, but she asks me every week if I'm going to pay the Parent PLUS loan. My

mom is a nurse practitioner, so she makes good money, but she recently financed two new luxury cars within 24 hours of each other—one for work and one for church. She also has loans out from borrowing on her 401(k) and credit card debt. Should I take over the Parent PLUS loan under my name? - Tommy

Dear Tommy, Wait, are you serious? Your mom has a church car? I've never heard of such a thing. But hey, I'm going to talk to my wife about this. I knew I needed another car, I just didn't know I needed a church car. Oh, my goodness!

Dave Ramsey Says

Ok, here's the deal. If you had an agreement with your mom, or promised at any time to pay back the Parent PLUS Loan when you were able, you should cover it. But that's not what you told me. It sounds like your mom has a good heart and was just trying to help, but she did it in a dumb way. From what you told me, she's done a lot of dumb things with money.

Under no circumstances do you take the loan back under your name. In fact, I'm not certain you can even do that with a Parent PLUS Loan. You need to get your debt cleaned up first before trying to help her. If you choose to be a bigger help after that, you need to start things by having a serious conversation with your mom. She needs to hear that she's being absolutely silly with her money. Let her know you're willing to help because the loan was for your benefit. But make sure she understands you won't pay it all, and you won't do it while she's making two luxury car payments—including one on a church car. That's ridiculous.

Offer to be her biggest cheerleader, and help her find a good financial coach—someone with the heart of a teacher. You might want to let her know you'll match whatever

# Giving Machine: the Spirit of Christmas

**ROSEVILLE, CA (MPG)** - The Giving Machines, which are vending machines that disperse donations instead of snacks, have come to Westfield Galleria Mall in Roseville, the only place in California to have them.

Santa Claus was one of the first to donate, aided by Denise Hoffman, supervisor of the Tuesday volunteers.

"The Giving Machine is the same spirit of Christmas that Santa has," Santa said. "We give and not receive. That's what Christmas is all about. Always give and think of the love we share. Merry Christmas!"

Hoffman didn't say what Santa's choice was, but she said that her family's favorite donation is chickens.

"We've already bought some chickens, but I think (my husband) wants to buy a family toilet," she said. "You can get a family toilet for \$60."

Minimum purchase begins at \$10 and goes to a maximum of \$1,500. Volunteers are there every day to help patrons operate the vending machines.

Sponsored by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the Giving Machines originated in 2017 and this year are in place during the holidays in 22 locations in the United States, and 6 international locations. At the Galleria, the machines offer donations to four local and three international nonprofit organizations. They will be in place from November 22 through January 2.

How does it work? Choose a machine – each machine offers a selection of items on behalf of global and local organizations that help those suffering from hardship and privation. Make your selection - you may add several items you'd like to donate using the touch screen "shopping cart," up to a total of \$1,500. Swipe your card - Giving Machines accept credit card and

mobile payments (Apple Pay, Google Pay, etc.). Collect your receipt – a card will drop down showing what you have donated.

"One of the things I've learned is," said Hoffman, "we're buying chickens for a family in an underdeveloped country - that will provide both food for them and income from selling eggs to others in the village. The charities must use that money donated for buying chickens, they can't use it for anything else. The organizers have oversights in place to assure that what is donated is what is given."

Anyone can donate, and often entire families come and let the children help choose what the family donates. Nancy Pinney of Granite Bay came with her grandchildren Luke, Jake, Chase,

"They were very excited about it," Pinney said. "They each picked something that they wanted to purchase . . . I think that the Giving Machine is just an inspired program. So many people are looking for ways to help other people. They don't know how to. They don't know where to turn, they don't know who to ask. And this Giving Machine is so easy to use and it's so available, it's right there in the middle of the Mall, and it gives you such a selection of things to choose from. I think it's just an amazing, amazing program."

While international donations may provide more exotic purchases, like chickens or outhouses, than donations for local charities, contributions to local concerns are needed to provide help to the people who live right around you. The local groups that are represented in this year's Sacramento area machines are Placer Food Bank, HART, Al-Misbaah, and Catholic Charities: Diocese of Sacramento.

Placer Food Bank covers Placer, El Dorado and Nevada Counties, an area of about 4,700 square miles. During the last fiscal year, the food bank distributed about 8.2 million pounds of food in the three counties.

"When we started learning about the concept of the Giving Machines, we thought it was really, really quite brilliant," said Lisa Heinrich, director of development and communications for Placer Food Bank, "and quite an interesting way to allow the community to come together in a gathering place and make a donation . . . What better way to continue our mission, to help feed people."


In the meantime, it's good to remember the real meaning of the Giving Machine.
