Grant Highlights Safety

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grant is helping the California Highway Patrol (CHP) increase pedestrian and bicyclist safety throughout the state. The CHP was awarded \$1.2 million in grant funding through the Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety, Education, Enforcement, and Awareness Program (BESEEN) program.

“The most vulnerable roadway users are pedestrians and bicyclists,” CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray said. “This grant will promote the importance of drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians looking out for one another so that everyone can safely share the road.”

In California, nearly 20 percent of

all traffic-related deaths are pedestrian and bicycle fatalities. In 2020 and 2021 combined, 926 of the 4,651 people killed in crashes throughout CHP jurisdiction were pedestrians and bicyclists.

This grant launches a yearlong effort to educate and enforce traffic safety laws for drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians through September 30, 2023. Enforcement patrols will focus on areas with higher bicyclist and pedestrian traffic and crashes. Officers will also conduct public awareness campaigns in communities throughout the state. In addition, this grant funds bicycle safety training and educational presentations to promote safe and courteous traffic safety behaviors by drivers and bicyclists, as well as

safety publications, bicycle helmets, reflective gear, and other vital safety equipment.

October is National Pedestrian Safety Month with National Walk to School Day on October 12, 2022. CHP officers in plainclothes will work with uniformed officers to monitor crosswalks and areas surrounding schools for motorists who fail to yield the right-of-way or who take unsafe and illegal actions.

Funding for this program was provided by the California Office of Traffic Safety through a grant from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

Election Season is Just Around the Corner

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - We are just weeks out from the Nov. 8 Gubernatorial Election – Sacramento County Voter Information Guides (CVIG) are in the mail and ballots will be mailed to all active, registered voters starting the week of Oct. 10.

Voters who have opted out of receiving a CVIG in the mail will be able to look themselves up and view their guide online through the Voter Lookup Tool on the website beginning Oct. 10. To access the California State Voter Information Guide, visit the Secretary of State’s website.

For those voters or soon-to-be voters that need to register or update their registration file, Monday, Oct. 24 is the last day to make those changes or register online. After the 24th, you can still visit the Election Office in person, or visit one of the Vote Centers that open starting Oct. 29.

Commitment to Transparency

The Sacramento County Department of Voter Registration and Elections is committed to running a fair, honest and transparent election process. Want to come see for yourself? Come tour our office, see our equipment and processes. You’ll learn a lot and walk away feeling better than ever about elections in Sacramento County. Tours are every Wednesday and Thursday at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the Registrar’s office (7000 65th Street).

Once staff begin the ballot tabulation process (running the ballots through the “counting machines”), watch a 24/7 live stream of the tabulation process on our website.

Vote: Pick a Way, ANY Way

Choose how, when and where you want to vote.

By Mail: All registered voters received a ballot in the mail. Place the voted ballot inside the envelope provided, sign the envelope and return – your postage is paid!

Vote Center: With the passage of the California Voter’s Choice Act, traditional polling places were replaced with Vote Centers that are open for up to 11 days, including Election Day. This means voters can choose when, where and how they want to vote – at ANY Vote Center in the County. Avoid the lines, vote early.

At the Vote Center you can drop off your completed ballot OR vote in


Twin Rivers Campaigns for Measures J and K

RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - Twin Rivers School District hosted the first of five Town Hall meetings in attempt to bring light to Measures J and K, which will be on the November 2022 ballot. Both measures regard bringing much needed funding to the district for the purpose of modernizing many of the aging facilities. All children deserve to go to school in a safe environment, and the reality is that many of the schools are just wearing out due to time.

Twin Rivers was founded in 2007 and merged four North Sacramento area school districts. Today, they serve over 25,000 students in the north of Sacramento County as well as a portion of Placer County in their 53 school sites.

According to Twin Rivers Unified School District (TRUSD), it’s been over ten years since the district has had the

opportunity to improve the school facilities. Many nearby districts have passed School Bonds in the past few years, but Twin Rivers has not. TRUSD has some of the oldest schools in the region (one is getting ready to celebrate its 90th anniversary) and the average age of the school buildings in the district is 57 years. Twin Rivers says it is time for the schools to be brought to current health, safety and academic standards,

and Measures J and K are a huge part of that.

Both Measure J and K are designed to bring in over a million dollars (Measure J - \$120 million, Measure K - \$150 million) to fund facility repairs and critical infrastructure updates. In the meeting TRUSD representative Kristen Coates Ed.D. explained that School Bonds are similar to home loans, as they are paid back over time. Funds to repay the bonds from Measures

J and K will come from a tax on all taxable property – residential, commercial, industrial and agricultural, located within the district.

Measure J will levy a yearly tax of approximately 23 cents per \$100 assessed value and Measure K will levy approximately 37 cents per \$100 of assessed value. The assessed value will be that of the purchase price, not the current market value. Based on the 2022-23 median assessed

Playmakers Goes National

- Local non-profit organization The Playmakers has been teaching character and leadership through sports since the founding in 2009. The Playmakers founder Greg Roeszler, known as Coach Roz, saw the need for at-risk kids, such as foster youth and kids with developmental differences, to have real opportunities to be included and build relationships through team sports.

Playmakers has reached thousands of local kids through their summer football camps and after-school programs, all of which are free to students and their families. And Playmakers is expanding their reach by taking the football camps national: This summer, in addition to the local Sacramento camp, Playmakers hosted camps in Ohio, Iowa, and Florida.

It costs about \$10,000 to host a camp, and they are completely free for the students and their families. The camps are funded through private and corporate donations, various fundraising events, and with support from local civic groups, schools, and churches.

The camps are facilitated by athletes from the local high schools, who oversee the activities and participate along with the kids. Coach Roz said, “It’s been encouraging to see high school kids want and be willing to serve. ... A lot of kids are craving that.”

And next summer, in addition to the existing camps, Playmakers will be expanding to Washington D.C.—hosting a camp at Gallaudet University for the deaf and hearing impaired. And the high school students who help out locally at the Sacramento camp will have the opportunity to travel with Playmakers to Washington D.C.

to help at that camp, allowing them to further practice their leadership skills in a new venue. “There are kids everywhere that need this opportunity,” said Coach Roz. “We can expand anywhere there is an interest.”

For many of the kids who attend these camps, it’s the first time they’ve had a chance to play a sport with other people and be included this way – and Coach Roz said it means so much to both the kids and their families. “It’s a great experience for everyone

involved,” he said.

“It all just revolves around relationships,” explained Coach Roz. “We’re learning so much, spending time with them.” And these lessons are expanding into a new avenue for Playmakers, as they give the high school athletes the opportunity to become leaders of inclusiveness on their own campuses. Just launched this school year is a calendar of events, a playbook for the athletes to follow as they take the initiative and build relationships with the special education

classes at their schools. The Playmakers’ calendar of events includes activities such as painting pumpkins for Halloween and decorating ornaments for Christmas. Coach Roz said these activities keep the kids involved and the relationships connected throughout the school year.

So, in multiple states across the country, as this new school year is getting started, high school athletes are taking those lessons of connection and inclusion to heart, and forging

relationships with special education students to make them an integral part of the social life on campus.

As Playmakers is growing and expanding, these high school students are serving as delegates, bringing that message into the schools, serving as role models to other students on how to lead with character and compassion and make a difference for those who need it most.

Low-Cost Clinic Keeps Pets Healthy and Home

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Pet owners whose animals venture outdoors can be keenly aware of the possible dangers to their animals, such as rabies and other illnesses as well as pets becoming lost. However, indoor animals may occasionally get out and face the same risks. In partnership with VIP Pet Care, the Sacramento County Bradshaw Animal Shelter offers low-cost vaccination and microchip clinics every third Thursday of the month, 3 - 5 p.m. at 3839 Bradshaw Road, Sacramento, CA 95827.

In addition to keeping pets healthy, the clinic focuses on making sure pets can safely find their way home. Most pets who get lost and find their way to the shelter have no identification tags and no microchip, making reunification difficult.

For only \$30, pet owners can buy the extra security that has proven to reunite many owners and their pets. Though visible tags are the first line of identification for animals, they may wear off, fall off or get lost. Unlike traditional ID tags, permanent microchips can contain owner contact information, pet information and Bradshaw Animal Shelter's contact information, and most vets and shelters can easily scan them.

"A microchip greatly increases the chances your pet will be returned to you when lost," said Annette Bedsworth, Director of the Bradshaw Animal Shelter.

"It just takes a moment to scan, and then we can quickly reunite pets with their families. Sadly, most pets who enter our shelter are not microchipped, and we have seen many beloved pets stay for several months before their owners finally tracked down where they were. It's heartbreaking."

Pet owners can take advantage of the clinic's affordable microchipping services on the third Thursday of every month, as well as prevent illness. Pets with up-to-date vaccinations and preventive care are protected from illnesses including heartworm, kennel cough, Bordetella, parvo and Lyme disease. If unvaccinated animals contract illnesses, an owner may face costly treatments and surgeries for these preventable diseases. And when pets receive rabies vaccinations, it not only helps to prevent them from contracting the disease from bats, skunks,

and raccoons, but it also protects residents from contracting the virus if bitten by an infected animal.

Licensing can be done at the same time as vaccinations and microchips for as little as \$15. Owners may also conveniently purchase a license online. This inexpensive service proves a pet's ownership and home address, and animals found by County animal officers can be returned immediately to the home, saving the stress of a shelter stay for the animal and the owners.

Vaccinations, microchipping and licensing cost a small fee that proves priceless when owners have safe, healthy pets at home where they belong.

Don't have a pet? The Bradshaw Animal Shelter has many available pets for adoption looking for loving homes. Adoptions include spay/neuter surgery, vaccines and microchipping. Visit the Bradshaw Animal Shelter's website to view a list of adoptable pets. ★

property values, the estimated costs of assessments for the bonds per \$100,000 of assessed value would be approximately \$1.91 per month for Measure J and \$3.08 per month for Measure K. The combined measures would cost approximately \$5 per month per \$100,000.

Basically, the difference between Measure J and K is that Measure J is for middle and high schools and Measure K is for elementary schools. These bonds are strictly for school facilities and will not be used for staff or administration salaries. In fact, there will be an Oversight Committee and third-party auditor that will supervise all bond expenditures.

Measures J and K will fund projects identified in TRUSD's Long Range Facilities Master Plan and reflected to voters in the Bond Project List. These projects are categorized as follows: Priority 1 – Projects that have a high risk for disruption to classrooms and operations if not addressed in the next five years. These include legal and safety needs, critical replacements and growth. This does not mean they are paying legal fees. It means that they will be bringing facilities to meet legal safety standards. Priority 2 – Projects that should be

addressed within the next 15 years to avoid disrepair. This includes curricular, instruction and program needs, and critical life-cycle replacements.

Modernization projects will be completed with funding from Measures J and K would be eligible for state matching funds, if available. Projects that are currently in progress will continue with the original funding source.

Critical repairs that the two measures will fund include school security and safety enhancements, replace lead pipes for safe drinking water, heating and A/C, electrical system repairs, repair cracked pavement, deteriorating playgrounds, remove asbestos, mold and lead paint, leaky roofs, improve security and emergency response systems, construct and equip classrooms with essential technology.

The modernization plans include kitchen modernization with new floors, paint, shelving, cabinets, counters and increased power. Full modernization to some kitchens that are currently in portables. Modernizations will be based on priority.

person. There is even weekend voting.

Eighteen Vote Centers open for 11 days beginning Oct. 29, 2022. An additional 69 Vote Centers open for four days beginning Nov. 5, 2022. Eligible residents can also register to vote, update their registration and cast their ballot at a Vote Center, even on the day of the election.

Drop Boxes: Voted and signed ballots may be placed in any of the 60 secure Drop Box locations throughout Sacramento County beginning Oct. 10, 2022.

When using a drop box, ensure that is an official, secure box provided by your County Election's Office. All official Sacramento County dropboxes are pink

and have the Sacramento County wave logo on them.

Election Results

The first release of results will happen after 8 p.m. on Election night. Ballots may take several weeks to process, due to the increased popularity of returning Vote by Mail ballots, and the trend of waiting to return them until Election Day. Want election results to be final sooner? Vote early!

Defendant Convicted of Charges Stemming from Robbery

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Russell James was convicted by a jury of robbery, two counts of attempted robbery, two counts of assault with a firearm, felon in possession of a firearm and resisting arrest. The jury also found true personal use of a semi-automatic firearm allegations.

On October 3, 2020, James entered a Quick Shop Market, pointed a semi-automatic handgun with a red laser at the store clerk and demanded money. The clerk handed over cash and James fled on foot. On October 11, 2020, the victim was sitting in his parked vehicle outside of a Smart & Final waiting for his wife. James approached the vehicle and pointed the same semi-automatic handgun at the victim while demanding money. When the victim said he had no money or property on him, James struck the victim in the face before fleeing the scene.

On October 15, 2022, another victim was sitting in a parked car waiting for her friend. James approached the car, flung the door open and began assaulting the victim while demanding she give him money or

property. James again pointed a semi-automatic handgun with a laser at the victim’s head and eventually hit her in the face with the butt of the weapon before fleeing. In each incident, James wore a hat and a neck gator to conceal his identity. The Sacramento Police Department received an anonymous tip that the robbery suspect was possibly parolee, Russell James. The Sacramento Area Apprehension Team conducted surveillance on James. When officers attempted to stop the vehicle James was riding in, James exited the vehicle and ran into a Walmart where he was soon apprehended. It was determined James hid a Taurus .380 caliber semi-automatic handgun inside a store shelf. Further inspection of the firearm revealed it was the same weapon used in all three incidents and was unregistered.

Allegations that James has two prior strike convictions for robbery in 1999 and 2014 will be determined at the sentencing hearing.

James faces a maximum sentence of 136 years and 4 months to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 18, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 21 before the Honorable Shelleyanne Chang. ★

Sacramento Man Sentenced to 57 Months for Cocaine Trafficking

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Jason Tolbert, 45, of Sacramento, was sentenced yesterday by United States District Judge Troy L. Nunley to 57 months in prison for possession with intent to distribute cocaine, United States Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents, Tolbert was one of 15 federal defendants arrested in 2021 for trafficking narcotics as part of a DEA-led multi-agency operation targeting cocaine and heroin traffickers in North Sacramento. Tolbert was intercepted during wiretaps in 2018 trafficking powder cocaine. Upon his arrest, he was in possession of over a kilogram of cocaine and a loaded firearm. Tolbert is the first defendant to be sentenced.

This case was the product of an

investigation by the Drug Enforcement Administration, Sacramento Police Department, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, United States Marshals Service, Homeland Security Investigations, and California Highway Patrol. Assistant United States Attorneys Cameron L. Desmond and Aaron Pennekamp prosecuted the case.

This effort is part of an Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) operation. OCDETF identifies, disrupts, and dismantles the highest-level criminal organizations that threaten the United States using a prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency approach. Fatal Hit and Run

SOUTH SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On September 20 at 12:15 a.m., California Highway Patrol (CHP) Dispatch advised CHP South Sacramento units of a solo vehicle rollover collision with a possible ejection on I-5 Northbound, south of Hood-Franklin Road.

CHP South Sacramento units responded and arrived on scene. Cosumnes Fire Department arrived before CHP and pronounced one party deceased.

A gray Toyota Camry was traveling northbound on I-5, approaching Hood-Franklin Road in the # 2 lane at approximately 70 miles per hour (speed obtained by two surviving passengers). The cause is still under investigation, but we believe the right-side tires of the Toyota crossed the solid white line between the # 2 lane and the shoulder, coming into contact with the rumble strip. The driver of the Toyota over corrected to the left, and the vehicle lost traction on the

wet roadway. After swerving some more, the vehicle went off the east shoulder, into the dirt/ grass shoulder area, and began overturning several times. Based on the damage to the vehicle, it appears to have cartwheeled at least once as well.

Three of the four occupants were ejected, including the driver. The left rear passenger remained in the vehicle, crawled out, and called 911. This is the only call on the CHP log, and we have no independent witnesses. The right rear passenger was ejected and declared deceased at the scene by elements of Cosumnes Fire Department. The driver was declared deceased at a local hospital.

The driver was identified as the driver by independent statements from the two living occupants. They corroborated each other’s version of seating positions.

Upon inspection of the occupant restraint system, it is obvious that no seatbelts were worn. We do not believe alcohol or drugs to be a factor in this collision. ★

Defendant Sentenced for Murder, Felon in Possession of a Firearm

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Kevin McCormick sentenced Keyshawn Wright to 70 years to life in prison.

On June 3, 2022, a jury convicted Wright of the second-degree murder of Alex Smith, and the allegation that Wright personally used a firearm causing death was found true. Wright was also convicted of being a felon in possession of a firearm. The Court found true allegations that Wright has three prior strike convictions for robbery.

The victim was dating a woman that was

in a previous relationship with Keyshawn Wright. On November 25, 2018, Wright’s associate saw the victim and the woman arrive at her apartment. Soon after, Wright kicked in the apartment door and began to shoot at the victim. The victim suffered a fatal gunshot to his chest. The victim was able to return one round of fire, striking Wright in the forearm. Wright’s blood was found leading away from the apartment to the parking lot area. Wright arrived at the hospital minutes later and lied to authorities saying he was shot in another location by an unknown person. The gun used in the murder was never recovered. ★

California Refusing to Release School Test Results

California’s Department of Education has finally acknowledged the obvious: It is arbitrarily delaying the release of results from this year’s round of academic testing.

In years past, scores from the spring Smarter Balanced tests of academic achievement have been released in late summer or early fall, but this year, the department denied a request for statewide results even though it authorized individual districts to make their data available.

Why?

Mary Nicely, chief deputy state superintendent for instruction, told EdSource, a website devoted to California education issues, which had requested the data, that the numbers would be released as part of a “dashboard” that includes other “metrics” on how schools are performing.

“We are on track to release the data as we did last year. If we can come out sooner, we will,” she said. “We are not withholding anything; people are working hard to finalize the data.”

That doesn’t wash.

There’s absolutely no reason that data already given to school districts should not be made public now and included in the

“dashboard” later.

It’s likely that the test results will show a sharp decline in the abilities of California’s school children in basic skills, such as reading and math, due to the state’s shutdowns of schools during the COVID-19 pandemic.

State officials probably want to sugarcoat the bad news by delaying it until after the Nov. 3 election and combining it with other material that would dilute its importance. Tony Thurmond, the state schools superintendent, will be on the ballot along with Gov. Gavin Newsom and other Democratic officeholders and while all are favored to win re-election, bad news on schools would be embarrassing.

We know that the post-pandemic test results are likely to be disappointing. That’s been the pattern in other states. Los Angeles Unified has already released its quite negative test results, reversing about five years of gradual progress in the state’s largest school system.

In LA Unified, about 72% of students did not meet state standards in math, five percentage points higher than pre-pandemic testing. In English, 58% were subpar, two points higher.

“The pandemic deeply impacted the performance of our students,” said LA Unified Supt. Alberto Carvalho. “Particularly kids who were at risk, in a fragile condition, prior to the pandemic, as we expected, were the ones who have lost the most ground.”

If LA Unified had

enough guts to tell its voters and parents the harsh truth, there’s no valid rationale for Thurmond not to do so for the entire state.

After its request for statewide results was denied, EdSource pressed the issue with a letter from its attorney requesting reconsideration.

“EdSource considers delay tantamount to denial as it effectively robs the public of its vital role in overseeing the CDE (Department of Education) and individual districts and in holding both accountable to its students and the public. This is especially important during what continues to be one of the most challenging and impactful times to our educational system due to the COVID pandemic,” EdSource attorney Duffy Carolan wrote.

EdSource’s letter told the Department of Education that it “cannot identify any ‘public’ interest in non-disclosure that could justify its denial position, let alone an interest that ‘clearly outweighs’ the substantial public interest in access to this information.”

This is not only a politically tinged education issue but a major test for the state’s Public Records Act, which allows public agencies to withhold information only under extreme circumstances. If records can be withheld for obvious political purposes in this case, the Public Records Act might as well be junked entirely.

Defendant Sentenced for 25 Counts of Child Sexual Assault

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Steve White sentenced Ronald Berry to 529 years and 8 months to life in prison.

On July 21, 2022, a jury convicted Berry of 25 counts of child sexual assault charges including sexual touching of a child under 14 years old with force; sexual intercourse or sodomy with a child 10 years old or younger; and oral copulation or sexual penetration of a child 10 years old or younger. The jury also found true great bodily injury and multiple victim allegations. The Court found

true an allegation that Berry has a prior 2004 strike conviction for assault with a firearm.

On May 28, 2020, the 11-year-old female victim disclosed that Berry sexually abused her from the age of 8 to 11 years old and that he was sending her sexually inappropriate text messages. The sexual abuse included touching her over her clothes and progressed to multiple forced sexual assaults. The victim was afraid Berry would hurt her if she didn’t comply. A Sheriff’s detective identified a second victim who stated Berry began sexually assaulting her when she was 13 years old. ★

Second-Striker Convicted of Attempted Robbery, Burglary

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Anthony Mosqueda was convicted by a jury of attempted robbery, two counts of burglary and being a felon in possession of a firearm. It was also found true that Mosqueda has two prior strike convictions for residential burglary and assault with a firearm.

On February 24, 2019, Mosqueda and three other perpetrators broke into a house when the victim was home. When they were unable to gain access to the victim’s locked room, they fled. Two days later,

Mosqueda entered a second house while the victim was at work and stole property. Surveillance video from that incident showed Mosqueda was armed with a firearm, which he pointed at the victim’s dog. The firearm was never recovered, but photos on Mosqueda’s cell phone showed he illegally possessed multiple firearms. Mosqueda was on parole when he committed the offenses in this case.

Mosqueda faces a maximum sentence of 61 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for October 28, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 13 before the Honorable Matthew Gary. ★





Let them know what has happened, how it happened, and while you feel awful about how things worked out, you had no intention of misleading them or causing problems. On top of all that, promise to do everything possible to make the transition as easy as you can.

In uncomfortable scenarios, it's always a good idea to try to put yourself in the other person's shoes. Let's pretend you own a business, and you just hired a young lady. A few weeks later, someone comes in, completely out of the blue, and offers her more than double what she's making with you. I can tell you what would happen at my company. I'd tell her to take it. I'm serious. I mean, as an employer I'm certainly not going to double her income that quickly. And while I'd be surprised, and a little disappointed, I'd be happy she has the chance to take such a big step up.

If an organization cares

about its people, and one of those team members has the opportunity to significantly increase their income – and they're not breaking a contract or promise in the process – this type of scenario is perfectly reasonable, even if it's a little inconvenient for the current employer in the short term. I know it'll be uncomfortable for you, Jenny, but they can't realistically expect you to pass up a chance to do what you love at double-plus what you're making now. Congratulations!

All Aboard: Caltrans Has New Passenger Trains

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Rail passengers in Northern California and the Central Valley will start enjoying a more comfortable and modern ride after Caltrans accepted into its fleet the first of seven Siemens Mobility single-level intercity trainsets at the San Joaquin Regional Rail Commission facility in Stockton.

“With train ridership recovering from the pandemic drop, these new trainsets will provide Californians with enhanced comfort and convenience as they move around the state,” said Caltrans Director Tony Tavares.

The new trainsets will operate on the San Joaquin rail corridor between Sacramento/Oakland and Bakersfield, connecting riders to jobs, education and leisure along the way. Passengers can expect spacious and modern interiors with amenities that include enhanced onboard Wi-Fi with power and USB ports at all seats as well as enlarged windows. The passenger cars also feature wider aisles and more comfortable seats, additional leg room, larger tray tables and expanded luggage storage options, with oversized baggage and bike racks. The trains are ADA accessible, including weatherproof gangways between

cars, wider aisles, retractable steps, and state-of-the-art touchless and much larger restrooms. Each coach car seats up to 70 passengers.

“These trainsets were designed with Californians in mind, both in terms of job creation here in Sacramento and next-generation passenger rail throughout the state,” said Michael Cahill, president of Siemens Mobility Rolling Stock in North America. “Together with Caltrans, we’ve created a trainset that is both safe and modern to keep passengers connected and on the move.”

With Caltrans officially taking ownership, the department anticipates the trainsets soon will enter service. These additional trains will help restore service to pre-pandemic levels, resulting in schedule improvements throughout the state’s rail service.

The Venture Trainsets for Caltrans were ordered from Sumitomo Corporation of Americas and are being designed and manufactured by Siemens. They are Buy America-compliant and built at the Siemens Mobility rail manufacturing facility in Sacramento. Powered by the California sun with two megawatts of solar energy and 2,400 employees, the facility has been in operation for more than 30 years. ★

Wildfire Victims Get ‘Healing’ Tax Exemption from Settlement Payments

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Wildfire victims receiving payment from PG&E’s “Fire Victim Trust” will not have to pay state income taxes on those

payments with the signing of Assembly Bill 1249 (Gallagher). Senator Jim Nielsen, R-Red Bluff, is AB 1249’s principal co-author.

“The signing of the measure into law was critical for the healing of the victims of the devastating Butte and Camp Fires,” said Nielsen. “I am deeply grateful for the unanimous bipartisan and heartfelt support AB 1249 has received.”

AB 1249 will provide financial relief to wildfire victims of the 2015 Butte Fire and the 2018

Camp Fire by exempting them from paying state income taxes on settlement payments made out of PG&E’s “Fire Victim Trust” fund.

Elected to the State Senate in January 2013, Senator Nielsen represents the Fourth Senate District, which includes the counties of Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Tehama and Yuba.
