RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - The sun was shining bright at Rio Linda High School on Friday morning as dignitaries and members of the Knights family broke ground on a new sports complex.

The new complex, which will be esigned and constructed for baseball and softball, has been in the works for several years. Now Rio Linda student-athletes will have a facility that they can be proud of.

"No more home runs with never ending outfields," RLHS Vice Principal Scott Myers said Friday at the groundbreaking ceremony. "No more softball home run derby's because the distance to the fence is too short. No more lost instructional time mowing the lawns. No more discrepancies between the baseball field and softball field."

The new state-of-the-art facility will have lights and a synthetic field. Dignitaries on hand for the ceremony included Twin Rivers Unified School District Superintendent Dr. Steve Martinez, Board President Michelle Rivas, Board Member Stacey E. Bastian and members of the TRUSD Board of Trustees.

"One of the things I love about this campus is what I love about Rio Linda, there's so few places left

anymore where there is real community," Rivas said. "Rio Linda is a community. We know that this neighborhood supports this high school, they support these kids, they support the programs. So, this isn't just for the high school, this is for the community of Rio Linda."

Bastian is a RLHS alumna and vice chair of the Rio Linda Elverta Recreation and Parks District Her father, Bob, served on the TRUSD board for 15 years until his death in January.

"I wanted to thank everyone who made this day possible, who had the vision to see that this historical field needed some much-needed Continued on page 3

County's New Inspector **General Appointed**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously today to approve Francine Tournour as the new Inspector General for Sacramento County. Tournour will begin serving in that role on Sept. 1, 2022.

"Following a nationwide recruitment, we're pleased to announce Francine Tournour was selected as the best and most qualified candidate," said Board Chair and District Five Supervisor Don Nottoli. "We look forward to welcoming Ms. Tournour and her work in providing independent review and accountability in her role as Inspector General."

Two collaborative interview panels were convened for the Inspector General search, whose members included the Chair of the board, the Sheriff, representatives from both the Enforcement Management Association and the Deputy Sheriff's Association, and members from the Community Review Commission.

Tournour began her career in law enforcement as a Deputy Sheriff in Contra Costa County, where she quickly gained an appreciation for the complex field of law enforcement. After working in law enforcement for a brief period, she began working for the City of Sacramento as a Deputy Director for the Office of Public Safety Accountability.

In 2008, she was promoted to the Director role of that office, where she was responsible for conducting all complex and sensitive investigations for the City's 1,300 employees.

Tournour has a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Madonna University and a master's degree in **Emergency Management** from California State University, Long Beach.

The Office of Inspector General was created to facilitate the Board of Supervisors' responsibility to oversee without interfering with the Sheriff's investigative or personnel deployment functions.

The Inspector General ensures the integrity of the citizen complaint process and the thoroughness and fairness of related Sheriff's Office investigations, while fostering positive relations with the community. The

Reducing Homeless Deaths in Sac County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In Sacramento County, 2021 was an unprecedented year for loss of life in this region. The Sacramento County Coroner had more overall deaths reported to their office than any other year in history -8,677 deaths reported. Sacramento County similarly saw an increase in the deaths of its unhoused population.

NOTE: The Coroner's Office does not receive a report of every county resident's death. For example, deaths signed off by a supervising doctor are not reported to the Coroner. Additionally, natural deaths occurring in a hospital or medical facility and/or under a hospice physician's care are not coroner cases which require a coroner death investigation.

The Coroner releases a report every year of the deaths, causes and some demographics for people experiencing homelessness at the time of death. In 2021, 199 deaths were reported to the coroner's office that were investigated and determined to be people who were experiencing homeless. While this is an increase from the years prior, it is not the same incremental increase as the overall increase in the homeless population, based on the most recent point in time count.

The causes of death among the unhoused population vary, but overwhelmingly, the causes are unnatural - death by substance use, vehicular or homicide. Decedents were overwhelmingly male, and there was a disproportionate number of black and Hispanic deaths compared to the overall homeless population demographics.

Substance abuse continues to be the leader in untimely deaths of the unhoused population at nearly half of all deaths in 2021, as compared to just 3 percent of the overall county population.

Sacramento County continues to invest in existing and new programs to help meet the needs of the homeless population. The

County is investing \$181 million annually on current and new programs, and services and to mitigate the impacts of homelessness. Not only does the County fund 1,300 indoor shelter beds on any given night, but continues to fund new and diversified programs

Increasing the offerings in 2022/23 to those experiencing behavioral health, both mental health and substance abuse, crises:

\$10 million to procure an additional 156 beds for Substance Use Disorder residential treatment:

\$5 million for behavioral health crisis stabilization units required in Medi-Cal;

\$7.5 million in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funds and federal match for additional Full Service Partnerships;

The County has approved two new-concept locations for Safe Stay Communities, adding another 165 indoor beds that provide privacy, dignity and a place for people to receive services to end

their homelessness; The County added 11

new behavioral health staff to the Encampment Service Teams to connect people to mental health and substance abuse services: Allocated \$1 million in the 2022/23 budget to expand the scattered site sheltering program;

Allocated \$10 million in ARPA funding for a Landlord Engagement and Assistance Program (LEAP), which will fund re-housing of 300+ households from shelters and encampments;

Allocated \$28 million in MHSA funding since 2017 through the MHSA Housing Program and No Place Like Home Program;

The County has 221 housing units funded through MHSA and an additional 234 coming in the next two years.

The solutions to end homelessness are complicated and multi-faceted, and there is no "one size fits all," but through the hard work and dedication of the County, our cities and our partners, we are committed to work with compassion and urgency to decrease deaths in our homeless population. ★

Projects are Digging Deep

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Small boys are rejoicing at the sight of 49-ton bulldozers and rockladen trucks roaring into the American River near Fair Oaks. But big fish will be the real beneficiaries.

Started this month, a \$2 million project continues Sacramento Water Forum efforts to restore breeding habitats for vulnerable fish

species. More than 42,000 cubic yards of gravel are being added to Lower Sailor Bar and Nimbus Basin locations. The program is geared to help Chinook salmon and steelhead repopulation.

Human river alterations have threatened these species since the Gold Rush. More recently, dam construction blocked spawning paths and barred natural gravel movement. "The lower part of the American River is gravel-starved," explains Water Forum Habitat Manager

Erica Bishop. "Some salmon and steelhead return to home waters and can't find a place to spawn. "Though the Nimbus Hatchery has a role in juvenile fish production, the Water Forum's focus is to help adult salmonids complete life cycles naturally."

Current projects must be finished before salmon surge home in fall. After the Chinook giants, steelhead will nest in the same areas. "Our work is targeted over time frames least likely to affect migrating fish," says Bishop. "And although the ongoing drought can make their conditions challenging, we focus on long-term river improvement."

Steelhead and salmon once swam from the Pacific Ocean via 200 miles of breeding sites. More than 150 years of human development have reduced options to about 12 miles. "Fish can't build nests among boulders," notes Bishop. "They need moveable gravel." To this end, the program includes mechanical selection of

many tons of small-diameter stones. Nursery channels will also be built to shelter hatchlings before their O

Similar restorations above Sailor Bar accommodated 1000 new Chinook nests in 2019. New gravel beds at Ancil Hoffman Park last year supplied 30 percent of all American River steelhead breeding. "Results are immediate," notes Bishop. "We see salmon beginning to spawn as we finish our projects. We know our restored

Pacific migration.

habitats work."

Sailor Bar and Nimbus projects will wrap by early October. Staging areas are fenced during construction but river access is not restricted. Work will pause to enable weekend and Labor Day recreation.

"I want to thank my dad, for I know this was a day he worked so hard at beginning," Bastian said.







Vote No on Prop. 31 and Let Adults Make their Choices

California has a lot of problems and not all of them are directly taxpayer related. But, as noted in last week's column, they all interconnect in one important way: Control. Our state's government and its boosters think they know better than you. They know better how to spend your money. They know better how to use your land. They know what's best for you. And, if you disagree, the nanny state

will just make it illegal. Look no further than Proposition 31 on this November's ballot. It's a referendum on Senate Bill 793, the state's total ban on the sale of flavored tobacco products. SB 793 was passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the governor in 2020. It prohibits "a tobacco retailer, or any of the tobacco retailer's agents or employees, from selling, offering for sale, or possessing with the intent to sell or offer for sale, a flavored tobacco product or a tobacco product flavor enhancer" and each violation of the ban.

Although the law bans the sale of flavored tobacco products to all customers regardless of age, lawmakers named it the "Stop Tobacco Access to Kids Enforcement Act." They claimed it was needed to stop underage tobacco use because only kids, apparently, like flavor. To be sure, no one wants children smoking or vaping, but it's already illegal in California to sell or give tobacco and vapor products to anyone under the age of 21. If prohibition worked, then we wouldn't have a problem.

It's also immensely hypocritical. At the same time California is lowering taxes on marijuana and debating bills in the Legislature to decriminalize psychedelic drugs, it is placing bans on menthol cigarettes, flavored smokeless tobacco, and other flavored nicotine vaping products that don't even contain tobacco. Those non-tobacco vaping products, mind you, were determined by an "expert independent evidence review" published by England's public health agency to be "95% safer" than smoking.

Plus, Californians are smart enough to make this decision for themselves. Our state already has one of the lowest smoking rates in the country. In fact, California has lower cigarette use among adults than any state other than Utah - where the state's predominant religion frowns

imposes a fine of \$250 for on smoking. Only the fear of God can get you to smoke less than we do in California.

> Youth vaping was down 59% before the ban and youth smoking rates are at 1.9% – an all-time low.

Also, while the issue, as I stated, isn't directly taxpayer related (and why HJTA hasn't taken a formal position on the proposition), a legislative analysis of a ban on these products found that it would lead to "significant revenue losses" (revenue is government-speak for tax money) that will exceed \$1 billion in the next four years. I'm sure the Legislature won't take that sitting down and will try to find more "revenue" in higher taxes elsewhere.

It's all about control and it's why voters should just

say no to Proposition 31. Why no? Because this measure is a referendum, which is one of the direct democracy powers that Californians have had since 1911, along with the power of initiative and recall. A referendum empowers voters to approve or reject at the polls any act or section or part of any act of the Legislature.

On Proposition 31, California voters will be deciding whether to approve ("yes") or reject ("no") the law that bans flavored tobacco products.

I'll be voting no – and I don't even smoke.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - With gas prices still hovering above \$5.30 per gallon and many people leaving their 'gas guzzlers' in the driveway, the Sacramento SPCA is reminding the community that it's the perfect time to donate their unwanted vehicle to benefit the animals.

"Unfortunately, we've seen vehicle donations decline by 33% in 2022," said Kenn Altine, Sacramento SPCA CEO. "This has occurred as new vehicle sales also decreased in 2022, due to rising vehicle prices and less inventory."

The average vehicle

Final Recommended Budget **Hearings Begin September 7**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will begin Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 Revised Recommended Budget hearings on Wednesday, Sept. 7, at 9:30 a.m. in the Sacramento County Administration Building located at 700 H Street, Sacramento, 95814. If necessary, hearings will continue on Sept. 8 and 9 at the same time and location.

The hearing schedule, in order:

IHSS Public Authority Budget Deliberation and Approval; Introduction by the County Executive to the FY 2022-23 Revised Recommended Budget; Public Comment; Board Deliberation and Approval to Revisions of the Approved Recommended Budget

The numbers in the recommended budget change between June and September when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. Because of that new information, the Revised Recommended Budget comes back to the Board for review

and adoption in September.

The Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2022-23 Recommended Budget on June 9. The \$7.3 billion spending plan reflected substantial investments in new and enhanced programs based on the Board's priorities and a survey of Sacramento residents. The budget included annual commitments of an additional \$6.5 million to fund new programs and services addressing homelessness in the County; \$10 million to procure an additional 156 beds annually for substance use disorder residential treatment: \$7.5 million in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) and Federal matching funds to fulfill permanent supportive housing commitments; and \$20 million in one-time costs to fund pavement maintenance and road rehabilitation in the unincorporated County, among others.

Members of the public may attend the hearings and be heard on any item in the budget, either publicly, over the phone or through written comments. The budget hearings will also be telecast live on Metro Cable 14 and on sccob.saccounty.gov/ Pages/BOSPublicMeetings.aspx.

California's Ban on Gas-Powered Cars Won't be Easy

California made it official last week - the state will ban sales of gasoline-powered new cars after 2035.

order leading to the Air Resources Board's adoption of the ban, issued his characteristic boast about California being out front.

"The climate crisis is solvable if we focus on the big, bold steps necessary to stem the tide of carbon pollution," Newsom said. "California now has a groundbreaking, world-leading plan to achieve 100% zero-emis-It's ambitious, it's innovative, it's the action we must take if we're serious about leaving this planet better off for future generations."

Declaring that the sale of gas-powered cars will end 13 years hence is the easy part. Actually transforming a huge component of Californians' daily lives, and a big chunk of the state's economy, will be immensely difficult.

regulations want zero emission vehicles (ZEVs) sold in California to be capable of traveling up to 150 miles without recharging. That might be sufficient for

compact region. But what ZEVS now account for about longer trips?

Speaking of which, what would happen to the hundreds of thousands of Californians who are now employed in providing those services?

Finally, recharging mil-Gov. Gavin Newsom, sands of recharging stations lions of ZEVs would impose a major new demand on California's electric grid - not to mention the impact of phasing out home appliances that now use gas in favor of electric devices.

California is already struggling to meet the current power demand as it also phases out gas-fired generators in favor of wind and solar facilities. Will we have enough juice for recharging ZEVs, particularly during the night, when the sun doesn't shine and the wind may not be blowing?

Both the reliability of housing complexes are a wind- and sun-powered grid and the availability and price of battery-powered cars also will depend on having enough lithium to build enough batteries to make everything work as envisioned. Given the nation's dependence on lithium from other countries and the fragility of global supply chains, that's not a small risk.

At first glance, rugby appears to be an orchestrated bash of bodies. But take a closer look and you will see that there is a front line, or line of scrimmage.

You'll watch players with the ball try to advance with no blockers in front of them, but lots of support behind them. There are lots of strategies and even set plays, but the essence of the game is that one player moves the ball as far as he can until he is stopped; at that point, his teammates support him while another takes up the ball and pushes forward.

It is a game that requires complete trust in the players behind you. Players love the game because of the camaraderie. Someone always has your back.

In the junior leagues, the phrase you'll hear most often shouted by coaches is: "Go with him!" Players must learn to follow and support a teammate at all times and all costs. When a player is down, their teammates form a ruck, or a kind of huddle, over them to protect them and the mission of moving forward. Protecting a mate in this way often means an opposing player is going to run into you at full bore

to try and disrupt the ruck. It's a price you pay for your teammates.

It's no wonder that rugby players form a strong bond among themselves. They are almost always in a supporting role. So it's no surprise that, 15 years after playing together in college, a team remains close as siblings. And so it was for Stan's

Stan was a tall, fit, handsome young man who succeeded in business right after college. He has a young family, and he has cancer. But he also has his brothers from the team. When he was hospitalized during the pandemic, none of his team brothers was allowed to visit the hospital. So every day, they donned their old jerseys and stood

atop the parking garage, where Stan could see them through his window.

Even with a breathing tube in his mouth, Stan's wife says, he smiled. The next week, tears formed in his eyes. Stan was getting weaker. The lads from his team showed up every day, arms clasped in solidarity. They were standing that way on a rainy day when Stan passed.

"It meant everything to me," his wife says. "To see the support day after day. My kids see those young men as heroes. His rugby brothers take turns calling them to see how they are doing."

Life is just shorter for some people than others. But we can all make it richer, more meaningful, by "going with them" through difficult times. ★

FBI Sex Trafficking 'Operation **Cross Country' Locates Victims**

FBI National Press Office News Release

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - The FBI, working with its state and local partners during two weeks in August, identified and located 84 minor victims of child sex trafficking and child sexual exploitation offenses and located 37

actively missing children during a nationwide enforcement campaign, dubbed "Operation Cross Country." The FBI-led nationwide initiative focused on identifying and locating victims of sex trafficking and investigating and arresting individuals and criminal enterprises involved in both child sex trafficking and human trafficking.

In addition to the identification and location of adolescent victims, the FBI and its partners located 141 adult victims of human trafficking. Agents and investigators also identified or arrested 85 suspects with child sexual exploitation and human trafficking offenses. Those suspects identified will be subject to additional investigation for potential charges. The average age of victims located during this year's Operation Cross Country was 15.5, while the youngest victim discovered was

"The Justice Department is committed to doing everything in our power to combat the insidious crimes of human trafficking that devastate survivors and their families,' said Attorney General Merrick B. Garland. "I am grateful to the dedicated professionals of the FBI and our law enforcement partners across the country for their tireless work to rescue trafficking survivors, including exploited children, to investigate and prosecute the perpetrators of trafficking crimes, and to provide the services and support that survivors need and deserve."

"Human trafficking is among the most heinous crimes the FBI encounters," said FBI Director Christopher Wray. "Unfortunately, such crimes


- against both adults and children - are far more common than most people realize. As we did in this operation, the FBI and our partners will continue to find and arrest traffickers, identify and help victims, and raise awareness of the exploitation of our most vulnerable populations." As part of Operation Cross

Country XII, FBI special agents, intelligence analysts, victim specialists, and child adolescent forensic Interviewers working in conjunction with over 200 state, local, and federal partners and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) con-

ducted 391 operations over the two-week period.

"The success of Operation Cross County reinforces what NCMEC sees every day. Children are being bought and sold for sex in communities across the country by traffickers, gangs, and even family members," said Michelle DeLaune, President and CEO National Center for Missing & Exploited Children "We're proud to support the FBI's efforts to prioritize the safety of children. This national operation highlights the need for all child serving professionals to continue to focus on the wellbeing of children and youth to prevent them from being targeted in the first place."

Victim specialists provide a "bridge" for victims who are wary of the system, help the victim establish positive relationships with law enforcement, and ensure the human trafficking victim population receives any appropriate resources available to them. Victim specialists also provide services based on the individual needs of human trafficking victims, to include crisis intervention, emergency food and clothing, transportation to receive emergency services, and locating shelter or housing. The task forces in the recent operation included federal, state, local and tribal partners, with efforts in every state and even a few U.S

Take care of your DMV transactions, such as the online driver's knowledge test, from the comfort of your home with the DMV's online services! Online services allow you to take advantage of fast and convenient service, with the comfort of knowing that your transaction is safe and secure. The online driver's knowledge test is available in over 35 languages for eligible customers who complete the online driver's license application. Along with the knowledge test, there is also an interactive eLearning course option for those who need to renew their license and have trouble with exams or prefer an alternative learning method. The eLearning course is approximately 45 minutes and is currently only available in English.

Don't wait, start your driver's license application now at dmv.ca.gov/online!

Q: Can I take the online drivers test on my mobile device?

A: No, the test cannot be taken on a tablet or a mobile device. You will need to take the online test on an internet-enabled computer or a laptop with a webcam. You can begin the online exam between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, excluding state holidays. For identity verification and as a fraud prevention measure, online test participants are required to verify their identity and agree to be monitored throughout the exam.

Q: How many times can I attempt to the online driver's test?

- A: The test can be attempted online twice. If you fail to pass the test after two tries, you will be prompted to go to a DMV office to take the test a third
- Q: What happens after I take my online knowledge test or eLearning course?
- A: Customers with a testing requirement for their license must still go to an office after completing one of the online options to provide the required identity and residency documents, take a photo, provide a thumbprint, complete a vision screening, and be issued a licensing document.






