State Requires Sharing Your Data

In March 2020, as Californians hunkered down for what many expected to be a two-week lockdown, high-ranking health officials were scrambling to find out how many COVID-19 patients were hospitalized, how many were in intensive care and how many beds remained available.

With no system in place for hospitals to report this information to the state and share it, Secretary of Health and Human Services Dr. Mark Ghaly, the state's public health director and other staff had to call 426 hospitals to assess the situation.

Now, officials hope to avoid similar scenarios in the future by changing the way patient data is collected and shared. Legislation passed last year requires all health and human services providers to sign a statewide data-sharing agreement. This includes hospitals, doctor's offices, nursing homes, public health agencies, laboratories, mental and behavioral health providers, substance use treatment facilities, insurance plans, public health departments and emergency services.

The final version of the agreement was published July 1. Most participants will have six months to sign the agreement and a year to begin sharing data.

If implementation goes as planned, a doctor or case worker could request a patient's full medical and social services history in real time. Patients could view their own records easily, and government agencies would also have access to more reliable aggregate data on patient outcomes and demographics — rendering the pandemic scramble obsolete.

The health care industry already amasses incredible amounts of patient data. John Ohanian, chief data officer for the state Health and Human Services Agency, likens it to "freeways of information." The problem is, not everyone has an onramp to the freeway.

Clean Cars 4 All Program Provides Money to Replace Gas Cars or for Riding Transit

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (Sac Metro Air District) is currently accepting applications from income-eligible residents in Sacramento County for grants that will help them replace their 2007 or older car or truck with a hybrid or electric vehicle or opt-in for a transit card from Sacramento Regional Transit (Sac RT).

Depending on income, qualified applicants may receive up to \$9,500 to purchase or lease an eligible car, along with up to \$2,000 towards charging credits or charging equipment; or residents can opt to receive up to \$7,500 in transit cards for use on Sac RT busses and light rail.

"Disadvantaged communities are typically the most impacted by air pollution and often face financial barriers to transition to lifestyles that are environmentally friendly," said Mayor Pro Tem Eric Guerra, current Chair of the Sac Metro Air District. "Providing opportunities for residents in these neighborhoods to exchange older, high-polluting vehicles helps solve the financial strain they are experiencing with high gas prices and helps improve air quality and public health as well."

CC4A is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide initiative that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment — particularly in disadvantaged communities.

It's Rattlesnake Season

RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - Rattle, Rattle! No one wants to hear this while walking trails or in their yard.

"Don't run and, don't go get a closer look!!" Jake Molieri said. Jake is a snake wrangler in name and business. I met him at All Stage Canine with owner Miranda Viani. She was helping Jake with his 'display'.

"All my snakes have 'muzzles' on them. It does not harm them and comes off easily," he told me.

"Why the interest in snakes, specifically rattlesnakes?" I asked.

"My mom moved us to El Dorado Hills. Wildlife was everywhere! I became interested in wildlife. I went on to Cal Poly and got my degree in Wildlife Conservation. I have been rescuing snakes and crawly things from people ever since. I own several rattlesnakes, reptiles and exotic parrots. I take them to schools to help children understand the snake wants away from you more than you do. Rattlesnakes are born alive, not in an egg and with no rattles. It takes one or two sheds to grow a working rattle. The state considers reptiles as, not

kidding, Fish!! I have to have a fishing license to own them."

"If you see a snake and can, safely take a picture, text it to me, (925) 366-0607; I can help you identify it. I then come and take the snake to a safe place and release it. Beware of your garage in the summers. Snakes like cool and dark places. If you see one there, open your garage and leave for about 15 minutes, it will move away from the

light and heat. They help clean up rodents that chew on wires in your house and on the wood too. Lastly, IF you are bit, don't move around. Sit, call 911, don't get out your knife and slit the spot to suck out the venom. That is for the movies. The less you move the less the venom will circulate. Less than 5 people die from snake bites a year. Also, if you should get bit on the fingers, immediately take off all rings. Your

fingers will swell.

"About tourniquets. If you put it on too tight you will lose the circulation to that area under the tie. Just call 911 and quickly get to the ER for relief. Also, you might have been bitten by a gopher snake or king snake, just don't panic, you'll circulate your blood faster," he finished telling me. It was really fascinating. Yes, I held the rattlesnake for a breath only. Rattle, Rattle. ★

Point in Time Count Report Released

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 28, 2022, Sacramento Steps Forward, the lead agency for the Continuum of Care in Sacramento County, released the 2022 Point in Time (PIT) count report.

The Point in Time count is conducted every two years within Sacramento County and provides the community with a snapshot of how many people may be experiencing homelessness on any given night. The count was last done in 2019 and was delayed from 2021 to 2022 because of the pandemic. This year the count was done on Feb. 23 and 24.

As expected, the overall number of persons experiencing homelessness at the time of the count is much higher than it was in 2019. While it is disheartening to know that more of our residents are unhoused, this report is useful to the overall County strategy and response tactics.

The County now has updated data not only on homelessness overall but on many specific sub-categories such as families, veterans, those living in cars, chronic homelessness and some of the conditions and barriers that are keeping people homeless.

What Sacramento County is Doing:

The County has been steadily increasing funding, resources and programs to serve not only our unhoused residents but mitigating the impacts of unsheltered homelessness communitywide. The needs of the unhoused can be complex and vary drastically from person to person – but one thing remains consistent – complex wraparound services cannot be impactful until people’s basic needs are met. Food, water, shelter and sanitation are just a few of the basic and essential needs people have in order to stabilize

enough to receive more complex services such as mental health treatment and/or drug and alcohol rehabilitation.

The County recognizes the need for diversified responses to this complex problem – knowing that one solution is not right for each person, no timeframe works for every person, and no one service works for everyone. Instead, the County is investing in a myriad of programs, services and new sheltering and housing concepts to not only address current homelessness but prevent or divert homelessness to begin with.

One of the new, innovative projects the County is launching that will aid in helping people exit homelessness, is the recently approved “Safe Stay Community” model. These small, individual sleeping cabin communities will provide the privacy, dignity and respect that unhoused people deserve, while also meeting their basic

needs and giving them a stable environment to learn about and accept services that will help them exit homelessness.

Investments and Programs Targeting Mental Health, Families and Youth–The County has made significant investments through MHSA Funding for Housing and Homeless Supports. Since 2007, \$28M have been allocated to address homelessness in Sacramento County through the MHSA Housing Program and No Place Like Home Program. The County currently has 221 housing units funded through MHSA and an additional 234 coming in the next two years.

In FY 2019-20: **Housed** 563 clients/households; **Prevented** 1,431 clients/households at imminent risk from becoming homeless; **Served** 161 clients/households residing in MHSA-funded apartments; **Provided** rental assistance to 4,682 clients/households; **Provided** 7,815

services utilizing MHSA housing flex funds.

The County currently funds more than \$1 million in prevention and intervention services, primarily targeting youth and families;

The Board allocated \$10 million from ARPA-1 to create the Landlord Engagement and Assistance Program (LEAP) to provide landlord and tenancy supports and short term rental subsidies to help people quickly exit homelessness and sustain housing. LEAP will launch in the fall of 2022, and aims to augment other re-housing programs to help households quickly divert from homelessness;

In partnership with SHRA, the County launched the Sacramento Emergency Rental Assistance (SERA) program, providing one-time financial support totaling almost \$67 million to almost 7,800 families at risk of losing housing as of May 2022;

Over the past several years,

there have been regulatory, policy changes and new investments that have allowed the County to build out services out for foster youth and youth aging out of the system to prevent them falling into homelessness. The County has increased participation in Independent Living Programs, Transitional Housing Programs and Voucher supports for youth as well.

Point in Time Count by the Numbers:


The overall count increased 67% from 5,570 (2019) to 9,278 in 2022. While the overall number of people has increased, the percentage split of sheltered vs unsheltered – 28% vs 72% respectively, hasn’t changed; which is indicative of increased bed capacity over the last three years;

Those reporting chronic homelessness has more than doubled. Chronic homelessness is defined as long periods of homelessness and the presence of a disabling condition such as behavioral health issues or drug addiction– 1) Nearly 50% of those experiencing homelessness are considered ‘chronic’; 2) 58% of unsheltered report disabling conditions vs. 40% in 2019; 3) 74% of the unsheltered population reports being homeless continually for more than a year.

There was a substantial rise in vehicles counted – in 2019, 200 vehicles were counted; in 2022, 1,100 vehicles were counted equating to 1,782 people. The report also notes the new trend of “vehicle encampments”;

In addition to the Point in Time count, the report also provides an annualized count of person that experienced homelessness at some point in the last year – up to 22,000.

“Our goal was – and the governor’s goal was – to make it mandatory that people exchange information and provide rules of the road and guidelines so it can be done well,” Ohanian said.

It’s a huge endeavor for the state, and not everyone is on board.

In a public comment responding to a draft of the agreement, the California Hospital Association and California Association of Public Hospitals and Health Systems complained that the requirements exceed the statutory authority of the law that established the data-sharing requirement. When contacted for clarification, hospital association spokesperson Jan Emerson-Shea said there was nothing to add beyond what was in the letter.

The California Association of Health Plans also commented that parts of the draft proposal go beyond the scope of the new data-sharing law, including the proposed governing body that would oversee compliance. The association also pointed out potential conflicts with a parallel federal effort to create a national data exchange for health data.

Other groups, including the County Welfare Directors Association of California, County Behavioral Health Directors Association and Planned Parenthood Affiliates of California, raised concerns about data privacy and security. They also want patients to be given the ability to choose whether their data is shared and noted that addiction and mental health records are more strictly protected than other health data. In a letter to the state, Planned Parenthood asked to delay implementation by one year.

According to a state analysis, the proportion of medical and social services organizations that currently use digital records and share that information with other providers varies widely based on sector and location.

While 97% of family physicians used electronic record-keeping methods in 2020, those who didn’t tended to be small independent practices or they were in rural areas. Likewise, 90% of medium and large hospitals also used electronic-only patient records, but only 70% of small hospitals in the state used digital records.

The report found a little more than a third of addiction treatment centers used electronic records to document treatment plans and view laboratory results. Less than half of nursing homes used electronic

records and only 10% reported that their systems connected with local hospitals.

Some of the organizations with the fewest digital record-sharing systems are government agencies like county public health and social services departments. The state Legislature’s approved budget includes \$50 million over two years to help small doctor’s offices, rural hospitals and community organizations invest in the technology needed to comply with the law.

Even before the pandemic, community clinics and social services providers like homeless shelters say disconnected record-keeping systems caused chronic problems.

On a broader scale, the patchwork of digital accessibility has made it difficult to reduce health disparities for conditions like heart disease and diabetes, both before and during the pandemic, said Kiran Savage-Sangwan, executive director of the California Pan-Ethnic Health Network and a member of the data exchange advisory group.

Communities of color make up 63% of the state’s population but represent more than 80% of all enrollees in Medi-Cal, the state’s health system for people who can’t afford health insurance. According to a California Health Care Foundation report on health disparities, Black and Latino residents are far more likely to experience preventable hospitalizations for conditions like asthma, heart failure and diabetes than white residents. The same groups are also the most likely to report delaying health care due to cost or lack of insurance.

In recent years, the state has launched ambitious plans to transform the Medi-Cal system through an initiative called CalAIM, which aims to address the root causes of failing health, like food insecurity and housing instability. It offers coverage for services not typically thought of as medical needs, such as housing. CalAIM, along with the state’s Healthy California for All Commission, which is exploring what a single-payer health care system could look like in California, relies on data.

“I can’t think of a thing on our list of huge transformations that won’t either depend on or benefit from this effort,” Ghaly said. “All of these data systems having some ability to come together around the individual is going to accelerate – whether it’s a social worker or an emergency room nurse – their ability to provide more comprehensive and coordinated services.” ★

Sacramento selects Keegan Murray in 2022 NBA Draft

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Anxious Kings fans waited outside the Golden 1 Center on Thursday afternoon in scolding 100-degree weather to see who the team would select in the 2022 NBA Draft.

NBA Commissioner Adam Silver stepped to the podium around 5:30 p.m. PST and announced, “With the fourth pick in the 2022 NBA Draft, the Sacramento Kings select Keegan Murray from the University of Iowa.”

The reaction among the hundreds of Kings faithful that braved the heat to witness what could be a franchise-altering selection was mixed, to say the least.

As a sophomore with the Hawkeyes, Murray was selected to the All-Big Ten first team after averaging 23.5 points, 8.7 rebounds, 1.5 assists, and 1.3 steals in just under 32 minutes a game in 35 starts. He made a huge leap in scoring from his freshman year, increasing his points per game by 16.3, which is the largest increase in PPG by a Big Ten player in the last 25 seasons.

“Keegan Murray was the best player available and we jumped at the chance to select him,” McNair said in a press conference after the draft. “I think as we went along, and certainly as we got into the final days, it was just apparent to us that if Keegan Murray was there, that was going to be the best course of action for us.”

The 21-year-old ranked fourth in the country in

scoring average and first in total points (822) and field goals (307). He also displayed his versatility last season as the only collegiate player with at least 50 dunks and 50 3-pointers. Murray is the highest drafted player in Iowa history and the first Hawkeye to be selected in the first round of the NBA Draft since 1998.

At 6-foot-8 and 215 pounds, Murray cemented himself as one of the best power forwards in the nation in the 2021-22 season, winning the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award. Murray was also named a consensus first-team All-American and the Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player.

In the second round of the draft, Sacramento was scheduled to pick at No. 37 and No. 49. However, McNair traded away both picks on Thursday, dealing the latter first. Just before 10 a.m. PST, the Kings exchanged the 49th pick for the rights to Sasha Vezenkov and cash consideration from the Cleveland Cavaliers, according to McNair. The 26-year-old was a first-team

All-EuroLeague selection in 2022 and was selected 57th overall in 2017 by the Brooklyn Nets.

“Sasha, certainly the intrigue with him is his size with his shooting,” McNair said. “Somebody whose hit threes at a high clip but also can playmake and just shows his feel out there on the court. The fact that he’s done it at arguably the second-best league in the world at an age where he’s just entering his prime, we love to see that.”

Sacramento waited until they were on the clock at No. 37 to trade the other second-rounder. The Kings traded the pick to the Dallas Mavericks for two future second-round picks, according to McNair. NBA insider Marc Stein reports that the picks are for 2024 and 2028.

Following the conclusion of the draft, Sacramento reportedly agreed to deals with two undrafted free agents. The Kings agreed to a two-way deal with shooting guard Keon Ellis from Alabama. The Athletic reported. Sacramento agreed to terms with forward Jeriah Horne from Tulsa, as reported by Yahoo Sports. ★

How Taxes are Decided in California

Let’s start with the premise that taxation is largely arbitrary.

Despite efforts to frame tax policy in moral or at least philosophical terms, what or who is taxed and the form and level of that taxation merely reflect current political priorities.

Take, for example, South Lake Tahoe, a small city that sits on California’s border with Nevada. If you live in that city, you pay the nation’s highest state income taxes. However, if your home is located a few feet to the east, inside Douglas County, Nevada, you pay no state income taxes.

That explains why there’s a steady rivulet of high-income Californians resettling in Nevada, or at least changing their official addresses. If a couple of pending California ballot measures are approved in November, state taxes on the wealthy will increase even more and Nevada will become an even more popular tax refuge.

California’s income taxes became the nation’s highest through a series of incremental decisions made by legislators or voters and they now provide more than two-thirds of the state’s general fund revenue. Nevada, on the

other hand, makes do without taxing incomes.

So which state is correct? Neither. They just happened to take different taxation paths for different reasons.

The arbitrary nature of taxation is evident, too, within the California revenue system, particularly in sales taxes.

One oddity is that cold food is not subject to taxation but hot food is and the differential can be very difficult to sort out. Some years ago, a movie theater chain asked the state Board of Equalization to shift popcorn from being a taxable hot food to a tax-free cold food. The rationale was that by the time theater patrons returned to their seats with popcorn in hand, it had turned cold. The board agreed.

If someone buys computer software, such as Turbo Tax, in a store to file federal and state income tax returns, that purchase is subject to a sales tax. But if a large company obtains a custom computer program to prepare its tax returns, the purchase is free of sales taxes. Why? Because those who sell custom software lobbied the Legislature for an exemption in the 1980s.

The Legislature, at the behest of Gov. Gavin Newsom, is on the verge of enacting a new and especially questionable tax anomaly.

One budget trailer bill would impose a hefty new tax on the embryonic industry of extracting lithium from the brine of the Salton Sea in the Southern California desert.

Lithium is the key ingredient of long-life, rechargeable batteries used in everything from cellphones to electric cars and immense electrical energy storage banks and therefore plays a key role in the state’s drive to make itself carbon-free.

Most lithium is imported from other countries, including China. The Salton Sea, however, is a potentially huge source of the mineral that, if developed, would both contribute to energy independence and create many new jobs in an economically depressed corner of the state.

Lithium companies have warned that taxing extraction, \$400 to \$800 per metric ton, would make California lithium more expensive than imports and discourage investment in the industry, but were ignored.

Another trailer bill, however, would give sellers of legal marijuana a hefty cut in taxes, responding to their complaints that taxation makes their product too expensive vis-à-vis pot from illegal growers and sellers.

So California politicians may be strangling an industry vital to their vision of a carbon-free future while encouraging – in essence, subsidizing – an industry that helps people get stoned.

That’s about as arbitrary as it can get.

Defendant Sentenced for Human Trafficking, Prior Strike for Animal Abuse

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 20, 2022, the Honorable Carlton Davis sentenced Lamar Robinson to 16 years in prison and ordered him to register as a sex offender for life.

On May 17, 2022, Robinson pled to human trafficking of a minor and admitted to a prior strike conviction for animal abuse with the use of a deadly weapon.

In 2021, Robinson met the 13-year-old victim. The victim's family repeatedly told Robinson her age. Despite this, Robinson

groomed the victim with promises that he loved her and that they would have a life together. He induced her to run away from home and to begin engaging in prostitution. Robinson gave the victim detailed directions about how to make money through selling sex and demanded that she give him her money.

On November 14, 2021, Sacramento police officers stopped Robinson while he was driving with the victim in the car. Robinson was on parole at the time and when officers searched his cell phone, they found evidence of his exploitation of

the victim. Officers arrested Robinson and took the victim to a safe place.

In the prior 2017 strike case, Robinson used a leash to repeatedly body slam a small dog against the ground. Robinson was also holding a second dog by its neck, and that dog appeared unconscious. The dogs suffered several injuries, and a radiograph of both dogs revealed multiple rib fractures in different stages of healing.

Defendant Sentenced to Prison for Felony Animal Abuse

The Honorable Lawrence Brown sentenced Lamar Robinson to 4 years and

8 months in prison after Robinson pled to 8 counts of felony abuse.

On December 12, 2017, an apartment tenant was awakened to the screams of an animal. When the tenant went to her window, she witnessed Robinson repeatedly body slam a small dog against the ground, using a leash to increase the impact to the pavement. Robinson was also holding a second dog by its neck, and that dog appeared unconscious. The witness called 911 and Sheriff's Deputy Brian Fowell responded. Robinson

was arrested after the deputy encountered him 'walking' two dogs with obvious injuries, including a broken leg.

Radiographs of both dogs revealed multiple rib fractures in different stages of healing. Surveillance footage captured part of Robinson's horrific crime.

The case was prosecuted by the recently formed Sacramento County District Attorney's Animal Cruelty Prosecution Unit, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and Sacramento County Animal Care and Regulation. ★

Defendant Convicted of Attempted Murder in Drive-By Shooting

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Ladarius Murphy was convicted by a jury of attempted murder and discharging a firearm from a vehicle. The jury also found true allegations that Murphy intentionally discharged a firearm causing great bodily injury.

On May 12, 2016, the victim was walking to school when a gang member drove by and threw up gang signs. That gang member's girlfriend went to the same school and texted him saying there were "sucks" at the school. Later that day, the gang member, his girlfriend and Ladarius Murphy drove near the school and saw the victim.

Murphy leaned out of the front-passenger window and fired 6-8 shots at the victim from a 9mm handgun. The victim was struck in the arm and torso but survived. The gang member's car was quickly identified by the Sacramento Police Department and his girlfriend later identified Murphy as the shooter. Murphy was arrested on an unrelated case and his prints and DNA matched evidence from the car involved in the shooting. The gun used in the shooting was never recovered.

Murphy faces a maximum sentence of 34 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for August 26, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 32 before the Honorable James Arguelles. ★

Sacramento County to Launch

First ‘Safe Stay’ Site

Ham Radio Operators

Help Save Lives

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors approved Sacramento County’s first proposed “Safe Stay Community” for persons experiencing homelessness. The new concept community will open at 8144 Florin Road, on the corner of Power Inn and Florin at the former site of a now razed grocery store. The site will house up to 100 Pallet sleeping cabins – both single and double occupancy, bathrooms, and communal gathering spaces. At any point in time, it can shelter up to 125 people.

The Board originally heard this item at its April 26 meeting but voted to delay the item six weeks to allow for more community outreach and engagement.

Safe stay communities are temporary shelter settings for unhoused community members. These communities are built as a safer and more sanitary environment and offer critical services oriented towards exiting to permanent housing. Each site will include 24/7 security, case management services, on-site power, sanitation and food services. The County will develop good neighbor policies for the operator and occupants.

“This is an important first step in implementing Safe Stay Communities throughout the County,” said District 2 Supervisor, Patrick Kennedy. “This project will ensure people experiencing homelessness in the area will be put in a stable environment and are

connected to services to help get their lives in order. We are fully committed to making this and other Safe Stay Communities a success for our neighborhoods, business districts and our homeless neighbors.”

Guests for every Safe Stay Community will be brought in from the immediate neighborhood, not only providing direct relief to the community, but providing local and dignified shelter in an area the guest is familiar with.

The County is concurrently standing up Encampment Services Teams who will connect people living unsheltered into the communities and are already providing deeper connections to County behavioral health services, connection to benefits like CalFresh, CalWorks, Medi-Cal, etc., linkages to longer-term shelters, and flexible funding to help support individuals’ transition into permanent housing. Ultimately, all sites should be considered as a stepping stone to stabilize and support individuals on a pathway to permanent housing.

“It is vital that we get this right, both in terms of ensuring the surrounding community feels listened to, and to best serve our unsheltered constituents,” said First District Supervisor Phil Serna who represents the north side of Florin Road in the area where the Safe Stay campus is proposed. “It is absolutely incumbent that the ‘Safe Stay’ campus be a great neighbor to nearby residents, businesses, educational campuses, and places of worship. It’s why that as

the third vote to approve the county’s first ‘Safe Stay’ site, I was insistent critical ‘good neighbor’ policy elements be adopted.” said Supervisor Serna.

While homelessness can be successfully addressed by providing stable, affordable housing, combined with appropriate support services, this approach can take many years. Safe Stay Communities provide immediate safe and hygienic locations for persons experiencing homelessness to live and access services. The communities also provide a consistent location for service providers and outreach workers to engage on a more regular basis with occupants.

Additionally, some of the broader community benefits anticipated by having this safe space community include a reduction in trash and debris, the mitigation of environmental and health hazards, and the ability to restore land previously occupied by unsanctioned encampments to its intended use.

Work will begin on the site in the near future, including the assembly of the cabins, followed by additional infrastructure, such as electricity and sewer, through the summer/fall – we anticipate moving guests sometime in November if there are no delays. SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - When the Loma Prieta Earthquake struck the greater San Francisco Bay Area in 1989, it knocked down power lines and knocked television and radio stations off the air. Phone lines were disrupted, and cell phone service died. However, they stepped in and helped save the day.

The same scenario played out 16-years later when Hurricane Katrina struck New Orleans and the surrounding area. Once again, television sets and radios died. The power went off. Standard telephone service and cellular service stopped working. But, once again, they stepped in and provided emergency communication.

Who are they? These men and women are all members of the same group who belong to the American Radio Relay League (ARRL). These people are all radio amateurs, who are also better known as Ham Radio operators. Despite the recent rise of the internet, the hobby of ham radio, which is more than 100-years old, is alive and well.

The ARRL International Field Day took place in multiple cities and countries this past weekend, including Sacramento. This year’s event was hosted by the California Department of Technology headquarters located in Rancho Cordova. State authorities know all too well from multiple

experiences that when emergencies strike, it’s the independent ham operators who can be relied upon when emergency communications are needed.

Alice Austin likes to help people. That’s why she became a member of the local Friends and Amateur Radio Communications Enthusiasts (FARCE) group and helped to organize this year’s field day.

“It’s important to me to lend a hand in any kind of emergency,” Austin told Messenger Publishing. “The purpose of our field day events is to make sure our operations are intact and our radios work. We try to contact other ham radio operators located all over the world.”

Hobbyists include military veterans like Dennis Merritt, who served tours in both the U.S. Navy and Army. He is better known in the ham community by his FCC assigned license name of W6UHQ. He started his field day experience by contacting other ham radio operators in places like Bozeman, MT, Boise, ID and

Portland, OR.

“People like us can contact hospitals, emergency providers and other businesses when all other forms of communications fail,” Merritt said. “We are there to help when people need us, but it’s also fun to keep in contact with our counterparts in other parts of the world.”

Merritt says wildfires that have recently plagued California is another example of where ham radio operators can play a crucial role in getting people out of danger. A Los Angeles Times article found that emergency warnings never reached many people in Paradise, CA during the 2018 Camp Fire because cell towers and power lines had been knocked out. The fire killed more than 80 people.

“The idea behind ARRL Field Day is practice,” Austin said. “It encourages us to be prepared, to stay prepared and to encourage other people to join us.”
