

Author Salutes Women in Politics

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - It started with lunch. Community relations consultant Chris Hunter was dining with women friends who'd been elected to serve the City and County of Sacramento. Realizing her companions had much to add to California's political history, Hunter began research for a book recently published as "We can Do This!"

Riveter Rosie's wartime mantra is relevant, considers the author. "These women were often up against the odds. They did a great job." Despite stridency associated with many 1970s activists, Hunter's subjects were not consciously feminists or political animals. "They were mainly teachers, nurses and moms," says Arcade resident Hunter. "They

stepped up because they wanted better communities."

The book spotlights the 'first and second wave' of women whose service eased the way for those who followed in more recent years. Former Sacramento Mayor Heather Fargo collaborated in the project and regards the history long overdue. "It's time women who helped shape Sacramento in this era were given the respect they deserve," she says. "They had huge impact."

Several of Hunter's 1970s pioneers served unincorporated Sacramento. The first woman elected to Sacramento's Board of Supervisorsformer nurse Sandy Smoley-got paramedics on firetrucks. Supervisor Illa Collin broke ground for the American River Parkway. Supervisor Muriel Johnson campaigned for the arts and persuaded successor

Susan Peters to prolong a tradition that for 50 years labeled District 3 "the girls' seat."

Sacramento has elected - and reelected - two female mayors. Anne Rudin spoke out for gay rights and the banning of assault weapons. Mayor Heather Fargo championed the environment and women's (and animal) rights.

On the national level, Congressmember Doris Matsui fought for improved health care and ramped up flood prevention. She remains a vocal proponent for girls' STEM education.

Hunter's homage includes women who headed action groups. Lung Association leader Jane Hagedorn took on Big Tobacco against choking odds and achieved a public places smoking ban. Carmichael Continued on page 3

New Wine, **Spirits Bottle** Recycling **Bill Clears**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Senate voted on May 25, 2022, unanimously to approve legislation written by Senate President pro Tempore Toni G. Atkins, D-San Diego, and co-written by Sen. Bill Dodd, D-Napa, to add wine and distilled spirits bottles to California's recycling program.

"I am really pleased that so many of our Senate colleagues recognized the importance of this common sense bill that benefits our environment and consumers," Sen. Dodd said. "With SB 1013 we can increase the recycling rates of millions of bottles that would otherwise wind up in our landfills or be illegally discarded. I look forward to seeing this bill with all its benefits for California pass the Assembly and be signed by Gov. Newsom."

"SB 1013 is historic change that is 40 years in the making," Pro Tem Atkins said. "I want to commend the wine industry, distilled spirits industry, environmental advocates, and other groups who have come together to support this landmark proposal. We will continue working with stakeholders as the bill moves through the Assembly to make sure remaining concerns are addressed, and then, hopefully, 2022 will be the year we can pop a cork and celebrate this overdue improvement to California's recycling law."

The California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act, established in 1986, encourages consumers to recycle beverage containers by requiring them to pay a deposit for eligible bottles. According to a 2019 report, curbside programs received approximately \$172 million from the so-called Bottle Bill in 2017, including \$15 million that is annually provided from the Beverage Container Recycling Fund.

Although the program includes beer, it does not include wine or spirits. It is estimated that California generates more than 500 million wine and spirits bottles each year, with less than 30% being recycled and over 300 million wine and spirits bottles going into landfills. Under Senate Bill 1013, wine and spirits bottles would be added to the program, leading to more recycling, increased business for recycling centers and reduced processing costs. The expansion would also

RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - I talked to many, many grateful people who were waiting in line for their pet's turn at shots, worming and flea control.

I met Mark Perona with his dog, 'Momma'. He was very grateful as he is one of the homeless living in Rio Linda.

"You don't realize how much it means to keep your love bug healthy when you don't even have a place to stay!"

"Even in the heat the wait was worth the benefits for our pets," said Suzie Perona who was with her hubby Mark.

The free event was put on by Bradshaw Animal Shelter. This was the first year they'd been able to come back to Rio Linda since Covid. The

event offers distemper, rabies, worming, leashes and collars, and free dog food (while it lasts). They offer free spay and neuter clinics. Of course, not right then at the spot, but they give out all information to spay clinics. Plus, many people have had their income cut in half and have not gone do to Covid. We don't want litters of puppies and animals with no shots running around." I asked if they planned to come back this year since the turnout showed a huge need in Rio Linda. I was told they would try to come back, it all depended on getting enough volunteers to help them out.

Firefighter Convicted of Sexual Assault

Sacramento County District Attorney

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Christian Madrigal was convicted by a jury of assault with intent to rape and forcible digital penetration.

On April 13, 2015, the victim went out to celebrate her birthday with some friends. One of her friends was dating Christian Madrigal, who had just joined the City of Sacramento Fire Department. After their night out, the victim, the victim's friend who was dating Madrigal along with Madrigal went back to stay the night at Madrigal's apartment. While the victim was asleep on the couch, Madrigal forced himself on her and sexually assaulted her for several hours that night. The next morning, the victim reported the sexual assault to law enforcement and underwent a sexual assault examination. In 2018, detectives reinitiated the investigation and interviewed all of the witnesses who were present on the night of the sexual assault and the District Attorney's Crime Lab found that DNA on the victim's underwear was consistent with Madrigal's DNA.

Madrigal faces a maximum sentence of 14 years in prison. Sentencing is set for June 30, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 42 before the Honorable Allen Sumner. ★



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - For many of the over eighty members of the Sacramento Tall Club (STC), the year 2022 is a time to celebrate their 40th anniversary, with a fond look back, and an eye out to attract a new generation of younger members who may be looking for a new social outlet.

The Sacramento Tall Club is a social club for men 6'2" (and taller) and women 5'10" (and taller). STC, founded in 1982, is a member of Tall Clubs International (TCI), an international organization of Tall Clubs.

"We were in our 30s and 40s, just starting out in our professional careers, when STC was founded in the 1980s," said Harry Leman who handles social media and marketing for STC. Leman has been an STC member since 1989.

"As we have become older, we now want to encourage a new generation to meet other special tall friends."

"So, it's time for a reboot. We've launched "STC 2.0", putting the word out through social media that there's a social club for a new generation of the vertically gifted," Leman said.

While time and tech may have changed many aspects of the world around us since the 1980s, the physical challenges which often face tall people have not, he

teacher Effie Yeaw founded Save the American River Association and won protection for heritage oaks. "Yeaw was a gentle lady," notes Hunter. "But she was knowledgeable and articulate. No one could effectively disagree with her.'

Grace (and humor) under fire was a job requirement: male City Councilmembers expected Anne Rudin to make coffee. She wouldn't. Illa Collin was told not to wear pants to State Reclamation Board meetings. She did. Anne Rudin was offered makeup artists before TV appearances. "It's not clear if her male colleagues got the same service," says the author. "At any rate, she declined."

District 3's Sandy Smoley endured a divorce while in office. Daily proceedings were covered exhaustively by the press. She later had a double mastectomy. She told Hunter her breasts were front page news in the Sacramento Bee daily. "I'm just glad I didn't have cervical cancer," quipped the former Supervisor.

Running for City Council at 30, Kim Mueller (Now the first female District Judge to serve Eastern California) was told she looked too young. To be taken seriously, she acquired a frumpy 'candidate outfit' and stomped precincts in matronly pumps.

Trailblazers grinned and bore frivolous interpretations. When women occupied half of the City Council seats in 1990; someone (not a female councilmember)

suggested the term 'manholes' was sexist. A 'sewer furor' flushed Sacramento onto the world stage. Critics attributed the absurdity to "women taking over the council." Maintenance covers was eventually deemed politically correct. "Words do have power," notes author Hunter. "Man-as the generic-was dropped. Into the sewer, one presumes."

For wives and moms in office, election success meant long hours. Sacramento's first black woman city councilmember, Lauren Hammond, tried to tally her working week. "I stopped counting at 60 hours," Hammond said. "It was probably close to 80."

Comments Hunter: "These women worked hard. They raised children; they ran homes, and they ran cities. I felt honored talking to them. They're mostly retired now but they're still passionate about their communities."

Hunter will donate book copies to area high schools. "I want to encourage involvement in local government and to show girls whose shoulders they will stand on," she says. "These female pioneers worked around obstacles with humor and common sense. Their persistence won in the end."

"We Can Do This" proceeds will support the League of Women Voters' Anne Rudin Scholarship. The book is available in public libraries, bookstores and online. For information, visit www.wecandothissacramento.com

Newsom, Legislators Given **Stark Budget Warning**

The Capitol is agog about Gov. Gavin Newsom's declaration nearly \$100 billion budget surplus.

"You've never seen a number like this," Newsom told reporters as he unveiled his revised 2022-23 budget proposal.

Nearly half of the surplus must, by law, go to schools. The governor and legislative leaders are now busily negotiating how to spend the other \$52 billion. They agree on giving a big chunk of it back to Californians but are arguing over how much and who will get the checks

and/or cash cards. However, Legislature's own budget advisor, Gabe Petek, is warning the politicians that they should be very careful because the budget could be in big trouble in the years ahead. If they ignore his advice, there could be a fiscal meltdown of epic proportions.

governor's revenue estimates – on which the huge surplus estimate is based could be too optimistic because he ignores a very real threat of recession. Petek also faults

of the Gann Limit, a constitutional provision that imposes tight controls on revenue windfalls.

"Although predicting the next recession is impossible," Petek says in a report released on Tuesday, "economic indicators currently suggest a heightened risk of recession within two years. Past recessions with the exception of the one induced by the pandemic - have resulted in cumulative revenue that California will have a losses of tens of billions of dollars. In two recent recessions, in fact, total revenue losses were around \$100 billion."

> "Under our estimates of revenue and spending in the out-years, the state would have a very narrow operating deficit in 2023-24, a small operating surplus in 2024-25, and a larger operating deficit in 2025-26." Petek says.

> Although Newsom's budget makes passing reference to the possibility of recession, it assumes that the state's recovery from the pandemic-caused downturn will continue to be strong, and thus will generate a strong flow of revenues.

Petek reserves his sharpest criticism, however, for the budget's lack of a plan to cope with the effects of the Gann Limit. Once the calculated limit is reached, any revenue beyond that point must be either returned to Petek believes that the taxpayers or spent on a few exempt categories.

"These requirements would far exceed the state's narrow operating surpluses and would compound operating deficits," Petek notes, adding that withthe governor's budget for out corrective action "the ignoring long-term effects state likely would have

significant budget shortfalls in the out-years."

As drafted, Newsom's budget avoids triggering the Gann Limit in 2022-23 by clever accounting, but Petek warns that it's likely to hit home within the next few years, forcing Newsom – assuming he's re-elected this year - and the Legislature to reduce spending on other programs to meet Gann Limit requirements.

Although Newsom and legislative leaders have indicated they may ask voters to repeal or modify the Gann Limit's stringent requirements, "In the meantime, we strongly caution the Legislature against passing a budget with a structural deficit stemming from unaddressed State Spending Limit (Gann Limit) requirements," Petek says.

He suggests that one way to make the budget more resilient to both recession and Gann Limit requirements is to devote more of the surplus to reserves, which would mean spending less of it on things that the governor and legislators want, such as a massive election year giveback of cash to voters.

"Economic indicators point to a recession on the horizon within the next two years, not three-to-four years from now," Petek warns. "The state has a \$52 billion surplus this year - now is the time to prepare for these looming budget problems."

office, helped us understand what is happening with the homelessness issue. We have hired, Navigators, who go out and tell them what is open to them. He said, "the Navigators have had people drive by, screaming, 'leave them alone' and throwing stuff at them. He also brought up a case where they were giving the homeless, three squares a day! In the meantime, the American River had such a high E-coli outbreak last summer, we had to warn the public not to swim in it. Also, today alone, Detective Lori removed 2.4 tons of garbage behind the Walmart/Home Depot in Antelope. That is one day in one place, and never have they got caught up. Our hands are tied unless they are on private land, you can't force the homeless into treatment centers."

I really could feel the frustration by all there. The residents were fed up, with the very topics covered. The officers, really put across their frustration with the revolving door of criminals. We are out there every day, seeing what you are frustrated about and many, many times our hands are just tied!! One thing I heard too, more notice, of these kinds of meetings, is needed!! Frustration is everywhere on all sides, be kind out there, we are all trying.

Sheriff's Office Holds Town Meeting SCPH Investigating Travel-Related **Monkeypox Case**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Division of Public Health is investigating a case of monkeypox virus related to travel in Europe. Confirmation testing from CDC and CDPH is pending. Based on symptoms and preliminary testing, monkeypox confirmation is likely.

The patient is isolating at home and is not in contact with any other people. Risk to the general public is very minimal. The individual under investigation recently traveled to areas in Europe where cases of monkeypox have been confirmed.

Transmission of monkeypox virus occurs when a person comes into contact with the virus from an animal, human, or materials contaminated with the virus. The virus enters the body through broken skin (even if not visible), respiratory tract, or the mucous membranes (eyes, nose or mouth). Respiratory droplets generally cannot travel more than a few feet, so prolonged face-to-face contact is required. Monkeypox is an extremely rare diagnosis in the United States.

"This case appears to be related to recent travel to Europe," said Dr. Olivia Kasirye, Sacramento County Public Health Officer. "Public Health is working with CDPH to conduct contact tracing, and risk to the general public is extremely low."

Monkeypox does not occur naturally in the United States and cases in the US are very rare. US cases are related to international travel or importing animals from areas where the disease is more common.

Symptoms of Monkeypox include fever, headache, muscle aches, backache, swollen lymph nodes, chills and exhaustion. Within 1-3 days (sometimes longer) after the appearance of fever, the patient develops a rash, often beginning on the face and then spreading to other parts of the body. The incubation period (time from infection to symptoms) for monkeypox is usually 7-14 days but can range from 5-21 days. The illness typically lasts for 2-4 weeks.

Continued from page 1 cut greenhouse gas emissions by almost 200,000 tons of carbon dioxide while reducing litter of wine and spirits containers, a visible and dangerous component of urban litter pollution.

SB1013 is supported by a number of groups including Californians Against Waste, Heal the Bay, California

Association of Local Conservation Corps, Monterey Regional Waste Management District, National Stewardship Action Council, Northern California Recycling Association, California Teamsters Public Affairs Council, The 5 Gyres Institute, the Plastic Pollution Coalition and Zero Waste USA. It has no formal opposition.

It passed the Senate with unanimous, bipartisan support. It heads next to the Assembly.
