Practice Perfects the Farm!

FFA Mock Show Prepares Students to Exhibit Animals

RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - It doesn't matter if it's your sport or your hobby, you must practice to be at your best. That is what brought me to the Mock Show/Plant Sale put on by the FFA this past weekend. Future Farmers of America students were having a 'Mock Show' to practice their 'Show Ring Etiquette' for this summer's Country and County fairs.

You can join the FFA even if you live in an apartment or housing development. You don't need to have land for your animals. Behind the Rio Linda High School is a whole site of pens to hold many types of farm animals. The way it works is

you will pick your animal off a list at the Ag office in school. There are cows, chickens, goats, pigs and even turkeys.

Once you're assigned an animal all of the care is done by you. You must buy the feed, the bedding, the grain or hay for your animal. You must clean the pen daily or twice daily for some of the animals, and make sure there is fresh water. You're responsible for getting your animal in tip top show condition by learning about your animal's needs. You also are responsible for all the training to show your animal in a show ring. You have to bathe your animal enough that it gets used to a bath. Before each show the animal is bathed and fluffed and should

be in show weight. To me this is as close to owning your own property.

Once you have made your choice and done all the above it will be show time! That brings us all back to today's practice show. The students get to wear their official FFA uniform for the day. There were two rings to show in.

First in the show ring were pigs. There is no leash and halter for a pig. You steer it with a stick. I am sure it has an official name; I just did not catch it. I tell you those pigs looked shiny. They strutted too. The ring judge's name was Catharine Renner. A previous 4-H'r then FFA and now at U.C Davis getting her degree in

Sacramento Spare the Air Season Underway

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (Sac Metro Air District) and the air districts of the Sacramento region launched the 28th annual Spare the Air season on Sunday, May 1.

The region's Spare the Air program runs each year from May 1 through Oct. 31, and a Spare the Air alert is issued when the Air Quality Index (AQI) for groundlevel ozone pollution is forecast to meet or exceed 126, rendering air quality unhealthy for sensitive groups. Air pollution affects everyone. Even healthy people can experience health impacts from polluted air, including respiratory irritation or breathing difficulties during exercise or outdoor activities. In addition to its harmful health effects, air pollution impacts businesses, the economy, and the environment.

Small changes can make a big difference in our community. During the past two years, the Sacramento region saw a vast improvement in air quality. Residents of Sacramento, Placer, Yolo, Solano, and El Dorado counties are encouraged to consider teleworking, taking transit, driving a low or zero emission vehicle, or using other active transportation options such as walking, biking, or riding a scooter when possible. By making individual efforts to reduce air pollution, we can come together as a community to make a much larger impact on air quality in our region and combat climate change.

Please follow these tips to continue to improve the region's air quality: Download the free Sacramento Region Air Quality app to view daily air quality forecasts and real-time air pollution readings for Sacramento, Placer, Yolo-Solano and El Dorado counties. Drive less to help reduce vehicle emissions, especially on a Spare the Air Day

Telework at least once per week, if possible. Use active transportation, such as riding a bike, walking, or taking a scooter for your errands, or as a way to commute to work. Take public transit or carpool to reduce the number of single-passenger vehicles on the road. Use a zero-emission hybrid or electric vehicle.

Extreme Heat Action Plan Announced

Office of Gov. Gavin Newsom

The announcement comes on the heels of a heat wave earlier this month in Long Beach that reached a high of 101°F, nine degrees hotter than the record high in April 2014.

"Extreme heat driven by climate change endangers the lives and livelihoods of Californians in every corner of our state, and threatens our vital natural systems," said Governor Newsom. "The Extreme Heat Action Plan is a critical part of California's commitment to strengthening community resilience and will guide partnerships and investments in equitable solutions to protect all Californians."

Projections from the state's best climate science forecast that all of California will be impacted in the years and decades to come by higher average temperatures and more frequent and life-threatening heat waves, impacting public health and safety, economic prosperity, and communities and natural systems – with profoundly disproportionate consequences for the most vulnerable Californians. Extreme heat ranks amongst the deadliest of all climate change hazards, with structural inequities playing a significant role in the capacity of individuals, workers,

and communities to protect and adapt to its effects.

In partnership with the Legislature, Governor Newsom advanced an \$800 million package in last year's budget to protect California's communities from heat. The package includes \$300 million to support implementation of the Extreme Heat Action Plan and numerous other investments that protect communities, the economy, and natural systems from extreme heat. The Governor is proposing to allocate this additional funding in the 2022-23 budget to support the implementation of the Extreme Heat Action Plan.

Governor Newsom has put forward a historic \$37.6 billion climate package – more than what most other

countries are spending – to protect all Californians from the costs and impacts of climate change, while accelerating efforts to reduce the dependence on big polluters and fossil fuels.

With the launch of the Extreme Heat Action Plan, the Newsom Administration is announcing an all-of-government approach to address extreme heat across four action areas:

Building Public Awareness and Notification

The Administration will prioritize the needs of highrisk California communities most impacted by extreme heat by increasing access to timely and appropriate information and resources that can help them stay safer. The most impacted groups include people experiencing housing insecurity, outdoor workers, older adults, young children, and people with existing health conditions. Additionally, the public awareness effort includes actions to equip communities, governments, and tribes with easily accessible data.

Strengthening Community Services and Response

The burden of extreme heat falls disproportionately on rural and disadvantaged communities and California Native American tribes. The community services and response effort include a suite of actions that reduce heat exposure,

build communities' capacity to respond to heat events, support local climate adaptation planning and implementation, and advance heat illness prevention standards for indoor and outdoor workers.

Increasing Resilience of the Built Environment

As temperatures increase and heat waves become more frequent and severe, the cascading impacts of extreme heat on infrastructure and the environment exacerbate risks to people, the economy, and the natural environment. The built environment track includes actions to protect critical energy, transportation, and other infrastructure, support

heat-resilient communities through relevant regulations and codes, and scale weatherization and cooling technologies.

Utilizing Nature-Based Solutions

Nature-based solutions deliver multiple benefits, including addressing extreme heat by cooling communities, providing strategic shade, and regulating temperature of buildings and surfaces during extreme heat events. This track includes actions to promote nature-based solutions to reduce extreme heat risks, support nature's ability to withstand and adapt to increasing temperatures and reduce heat risk to water supply and systems.

The content and organization of the plan was guided by extensive public input, including listening sessions and regional workshops, as well as consultations with California Native American tribes. Stakeholder input highlighted the need for the Extreme Heat Action Plan to drive coordination and collaboration across federal, regional, and local efforts, support localized action through funding and technical assistance, and maximize multi-benefit strategies that advance the state's climate and public health goals.

Implementation progress of the Extreme Heat Action Plan will be tracked through the California Climate Adaptation Strategy's annual reporting process to advance California's all-of-government approach to climate adaptation. ★

more accessible through this shorter number, calls, texts, and chats to the Lifeline's network of crisis call centers are expected to increase. It is vital that the federal government work with states to ensure callers in distress will have: Someone to call, Someone to come help, and Somewhere safe to go. We must act NOW to secure funding to equip call centers and community crisis response services throughout the country with the staff and resources to respond to everyone in crisis.


safety over politics to ensure that our system serves everyone equally."






Celebrate Mother's Day

Naval Medical Forces Pacific 2021 Nominee

MILLINGTON, TN (MPG) - Petty Officer 1st Class Carly Vohs, a native of Sacramento, California, was selected as a Naval Medical Forces Pacific (NMFP) 2021 nominee.

NMFP announced the 2022 NMFP Senior Sailor of the Year during a ceremony at Naval Base San Diego, April 13. Vohs was one of 13 finalists nominated for the award. The finalists represented NMFP commands located from Maryland to Okinawa, Japan. Five hundred and forty-eighth first class petty officer billets across the 13 different NMFP commands competed for the coveted honor. Hospital Corpsman 1st Class David Lay, with Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Pearl Harbor, was chosen as this year's winner.

Vohs joined the Navy nine years ago.

"My decision to join the Navy came after my freshman year at Azusa Pacific University," said Vohs. "While I would have loved to continue my education, it just wasn't feasible for me financially at that time. Aside from that, I wanted to get away and make something of myself. I had only planned to stay in for one contract, but here I am nine years later."

Today, Vohs, serves as a hospital corpsman with Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command (NMRTC) San Diego.

"My favorite part about being a hospital corpsman is caring for patients and serving alongside my Marines as their 'doc'," said Vohs. "For as long as I can remember,

I wanted to have a career in the medical field."

Growing up in Sacramento, Vohs attended Valley Christian Academy in Roseville, California and graduated in 2011. Today, Vohs relies upon skills and values similar to those found in Sacramento to succeed in the military.

"In high school, I played every single sport that my school offered," said Vohs. "From basketball, softball, to volleyball, I was in sports year-round. I enjoyed every minute, but there were certainly some hard times that challenged me both physically and mentally."

"Learning how to effectively play as a team and identify my own areas for improvement and strive to work hard in order to overcome physically and mentally challenging situations, played a huge role in preparing me for life in the Navy," added Vohs. "I often revert back to them to this day."

Serving in the Navy means Vohs is part of a team that is taking on new importance in America's focus on rebuilding military readiness, strengthening alliances and reforming business practices in support of the National Defense Strategy.







SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A multi-phased renovation project is now underway in the lobby of the California State Railroad Museum.

2 Men Indicted for Cocaine Trafficking

Department of Justice News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grand jury returned a two-count indictment on March 31 against Jose Manuel Chavez Zepeda, 54, of Carmichael, and Denis Zacarias Ponce Castillo, 37, of Sacramento, charging them with conspiracy to distribute cocaine and distribution of cocaine, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents, from at least April 22, 2016, until March 2022, Chavez distributed cocaine in kilogram quantities that he obtained from a source of supply in Mexico connected to the Cartel Jalisco Nuevo Generación (CJNG). Ponce

worked for Chavez as one of his larger sub-dealers and later as his "stash pad" manager. In June 2021, Chavez and Ponce sold a half kilogram of cocaine to a confidential source in Sacramento.

This case is the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Drug Enforcement Administration, Homeland Security Investigations and the Sacramento Area Intelligence/Narcotics Task Force (SAINT). Assistant U.S. Attorney David Spencer is prosecuting the case.

If convicted, Chavez and Ponce face a maximum statutory penalty of 40 years in prison and a \$5 million fine. Any sentence, however, would be determined at the discretion of the court after

consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. The charges are only allegations; the defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

This effort is part of an Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) operation. OCDETF identifies, disrupts and dismantles the highest-level criminal organizations that threaten the United States using a prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency approach.
