California Mask Mandate for Schools to End

All students and staff, regardless of vaccination status, will no longer be required to wear a mask indoors at schools and childcare facilities starting March 12.

Gov. Gavin Newsom and California state health officials issued the order on Monday, nearly a month after they lifted the mandate for vaccinated people gathering in restaurants and other indoor spaces.

"This feels like the right time," said Dr. Mark Ghaly, California secretary of Health and Human Services. "I've been pleased with how the data has come down, and it is the right time to transition from the requirement to a strong recommendation."

Ghaly said on Feb. 14 that he would provide updated guidance for schools as early as Monday,

depending on the public health data. In the past two weeks COVID-19 case rates dropped by two-thirds and hospitalizations, both adult and pediatric, were cut in half.

Ghaly also said he expects rates to decline further during these final two weeks of the school mask mandate. By March 12, California's COVID-19 metrics should resemble those in states like New York and Connecticut that have already started allowing students and school staff to unmask indoors. California parents, however, say they want the mask mandate gone now.

"I think the masks should be optional tomorrow on March 1st," said Megan Bacigalupi, an Oakland parent who leads the group CA Parent Power. "I don't understand the rationale of a further delay of another two weeks."

Ending the mask mandate in schools comes almost exactly two years after the state first shut down schools in many districts in March 2020. Parents and students across California have been demanding the step be taken sooner. A handful of districts across California already lifted their mask mandates.

"It seems like politics and the (California Teachers Association) are holding up my son's chance of getting back to a normal school year," said Scott Davison, a San Diego County parent. "I'm frustrated. I should be happier, but we've been fighting for months."

But a recent poll found that 61% of parents with school-age children support school mask mandates. Lisa Gardiner, a spokesperson for the California Teachers Association,

Kiley Responds to Newsom Extending School Mask Mandate

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) released the following statement in response to Governor Newsom's announcement that the statewide school mask mandate will continue until March 12, 2022:

"There is absolutely no basis for continuing the statewide school mask mandate another day. That's why almost every other state has moved on. Rather than finally acknowledge evidence and common sense, the Governor has chosen to give California kids another two weeks of pointless misery."

"This is the same Governor who kept schools closed longer than any state in the country. It's the same Governor who tried to stop students from enrolling in high-performing charter schools soon after COVID began. Young people in California will pay a lasting price for Gavin Newsom's indecent school policies."

"It's no wonder that dozens of school districts across the state have completely tuned the Governor out. They are doing what is right for their kids."

"The Governor is also refusing to give up his emergency powers and continuing the State of Emergency in violation of the plain text of the Emergency Services Act. The Legislature must act to stop this lawlessness, end the emergency, and let the people of California move on with their lives."

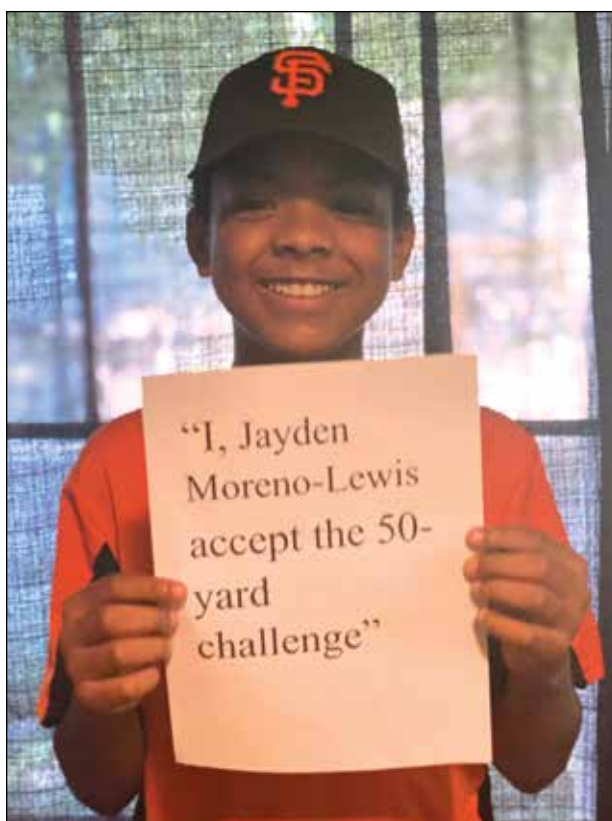
While California students wait until March 12, one day ago Gov. Kathy Hochel of New York announced that students would no longer need to mask starting Wednesday, March 2. ★

50-Yard Challenge Gone Worldwide

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Rodney Smith Jr. is a 32-year-old man that lives in Alabama. Rodney doesn't have any children of his own, but he believes that it is important for children to learn that helping people and giving back to your community is an important part of becoming a good person as an adult. Rodney has a lawn service, based in Alabama, called Raising Men Lawn Care Service.

Raising Men Lawn Care Service is a free service for people that do not have the ability or the funds to take care of their yard. Therefore, this free service is for the elderly, the disabled, veterans and single parents. So in 2016, Rodney decided to put the challenge out there into the world and he created the 50-Yard Challenge. He was looking for a way to channel the energy that kids have, in a positive way.

The 50-Yard Challenge is for girls and boys to mow 50 yards, for free, for someone that can use the help. This also includes

raking leaves and shoveling snow. While the kids that accept the challenge follow a positive path, they learn their importance to

society. The challenge has not only taken off across the country, but has gone worldwide.

It begins by a child logging onto weareraisingmen.com and sending a picture of themselves holding a sign that says, "I accept the 50-Yard challenge". They will then receive a white Raising Men t-shirt, along with sunglasses and ear protection in the mail. The child is to take a picture of each yard that they care for, for free. They are to submit those pictures.

For every 10 yards, the kids get another color of t-shirt. When 50 yards have been completed, Rodney travels to where you are to deliver to you your final t-shirt, hat and a brand new lawn mower, weed eater and or leaf blower. Rodney has traveled to every state in our country and has now gone to 8 other countries to deliver the equipment to children that have

State officials also said on Monday that the indoor mask mandate for unvaccinated adults will be lifted starting March 1. Masks will still be required in “high transmission settings” like public transit, emergency shelters, health care settings, correctional facilities, homeless shelters and long-term care facilities. ★

Enacted in March 2020, the CARES Act covered extraordinary and necessary pandemic related expenditures incurred by state and local government agencies. A fundamental CARES Act requirement was that funding utilized by government agencies had to be allocated for pandemic specific activities, and could not be applied toward already budgeted items. The Grand Jury's investigation revealed that the County of Sacramento made no CARES Act funding plan to support countywide COVID-19 relief activities. Instead, the County Chief Executive directed, and the Board of Supervisors approved, allocation of \$104 million of its \$181 million in CARES Act funding directly to the Sheriff's Office. That same amount of Sheriff's Office funding was then transferred back into the County's

In its report, the Grand Jury points out that in sharp contrast to the County, the Sacramento City Council allocated nearly all of its CARES Act funding directly to community agencies and businesses to help alleviate impacts of the pandemic. Formal responses to the report are required from both the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors and Sacramento County Sheriff Scott Jones. That did not sit well with me, so we created Raising Women Lawn Care Service”. Now young ladies receive Raising

Women t-shirts.
Raising Men is a 501(c)3 and relies completely on the generosity of supporters for the equipment, the shirts, hats and travel expenses. You can donate and learn all about the group on wear-raisingmen.com. You can also purchase adult sized shirts and hats in support of your kids and the program. In addition, you can see video testimony from the kids and view news stories that have been done.
This program really is

putting the care back into lawn care, and your kids can meet some interesting people. One mother said, “Sometimes people insisted on paying, so we just didn’t count those lawns”. It is left to the kids and their parents to determine who could use their help. Summer is coming up on us fast. If your kids have energy to burn, and don’t know where to burn it off, consider this challenge. It’s a great way for your kids to learn about their community. ★

ROBERT FRANK BASTIAN • 3/4/1933 – 1/12/2022

Bob was a loving and dedicated husband, father, papa and community leader. He was born in Sacramento on March 4, 1933 and was raised in the North Sacramento area by his parents John and Dorothy Bastian who preceded him in death. He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Susan, children Stacey, Bobby, Mark, Michael, Michelle, many beloved grandchildren and great grandchildren and loving cousins. Bob attended McClellan, Rio Linda and Hagginwood schools before graduating from Grant High School as a proud “Pacer for Life.” He was student body president, a football player and an All Metro lineman while attending Grant HS. Bob continued his education at Grant Tech and American River College where he was a student body president and earned his Associate of Arts Degree before transferring to Sacramento State. He played on the football team and worked his way through college by working in maintenance for the Grant HS district. He obtained a BA in Education and a MA in Special Education from Sacramento State. He taught at Del Paso Junior HS and Lincoln High School where he was also a football and baseball coach. He then went to the Rio Linda Union School District where he taught for over 30 years. He was a much beloved Special Education teacher, counselor, summer school administrator and president of the teachers association. Bob not only dedicated his life to his family but to his students and community. He served as Chairperson of the first elected Rio Linda/Elverta Recreation and Park District Board, was a founding member, past president and vice president of the Rio Linda/Elverta Historical Society, developed

and coordinated Kid’s Day at the annual RLEHS Farm and Tractor Days by arranging involvement and transportation so school children could attend. He was a faithful Rio Linda/Elverta Lions Club member for 49 years and demonstrated the true meaning of Lionism which is to serve the community. During his years he served as President, Vice President, Vision Chairperson which provided eye exams and glasses to needy children, the scholarship committee and coordinated the Ruby’s Christmas Basket program with local schools. Bob believed in being an active part of his community. He was a member of the Rio Linda Chamber of Commerce, a Mason, a Shriner especially dedicated to the Shriners hospital for children, a member of the Grant Alumni Association, Grange and Dry Creek Parkway committee, a Special Olympics and Pop Warner football coach, 4-H Club leader and CRASH committee member which developed the overpass at Elkhorn Blvd. and highways 70/99. Bob was a Sacramento County Parks and Recreation Commissioner representing District 1 for over 20 years. In his spare time, Bob enjoyed watching Stacey and Bobby at the Sacramento County and California State Fairs and transporting their many animals and exhibits, family camping trips, attending high school football games,

especially Bobby’s, tending to his ranch, watching western shows/movies and riding horses. He participated in a re-enactment ride of the Pony Express in 1986 on his horse, Misty and was a member of the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Posse with his palomino, Prince. After retiring from the RLUSD in 1996 he pursued his deep commitment to schools by being elected to the RLUSD Board of Trustees on which he served for 12 years. He was then elected to the Twin Rivers Unified School District Board of Trustees representing Area 4 in 2007. He was instrumental in the development of Career Technical classes at the high schools and bringing back the agriculture program at RLHS. He served on the TRUSD Board until his passing and even participated in a TR board meeting the night before he passed away.

Bob always took the time to listen and problem solve in a compassionate and honest manner. Whatever the need, he was always there to help. He fought and beat cancer four times but through it all, kept striving to better his community. Bob exemplified all that a true leader should be. Heaven must have needed a hero and great leader. “Your presence we miss, your memories we treasure, loving you always, forgetting you never.” The family invites to a celebration of Bob’s life on March 5, 2022, 1 PM at the Dry Creek Ranch House, 6852 Dry Creek Road in Rio Linda.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that the Sacramento County District Attorney’s Office, joined the Contra Costa County District Attorney’s Office and 15 other California District Attorneys and City Attorneys, in a settlement with Copart for injunctive relief, civil penalties, and enforcement costs totaling \$800,000.
After an investigation into the waste management practices of Copart, the prosecuting offices filed a civil complaint alleging Copart disposed of hazardous waste items into the trash. The items disposed of consisted of used office supplies, and items removed from vehicles being prepared for sale such as personal items, small electronics,

personal care, automotive, and other consumer products. These practices ultimately lead to hazardous waste being improperly transported to and disposed of in municipal landfills instead of authorized hazardous waste disposal facilities.
When contacted by prosecutors, Copart was cooperative with the investigation. Copart facilities have prepared and implemented new policies and procedures and enhanced their existing training programs designed to properly manage and dispose of all items that are regulated as hazardous waste.
The judgment agreed to by the parties provides for \$650,000 in civil penalties, \$150,000 in costs of enforcement and a permanent injunction prohibiting Copart from violating hazardous waste laws and requiring Copart to implement compliance assurance measures. ★

How California Mistreated its Working Families

Democratic politicians frequently and vehemently express their admiration for and support of what they call “working families,” while contending that rival Republicans lack such empathy.

Despite that political posture, the Democratic governor of California, with the implicit support of a Democrat-dominated Legislature, has imposed unnecessary misery on those they purport to value, as a new report from the Legislature’s budget analyst confirms.

When COVID-19 struck California two years ago, Gov. Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency and ordered closure of large segments of the state’s economy to battle its spread. Almost immediately, more than two million workers were laid off as their employers complied with the orders and most applied for unemployment insurance benefits to keep themselves and their families housed and fed.

Whether the closures and resulting layoffs were justified, in terms of their pandemic-fighting effects, will be endlessly debated. Regardless, they happened and having lost their jobs by executive decree, the suddenly idled workers’ claims for benefits deserved rapid and accurate processing by

Newsom’s Employment Development Department.

Instead, EDD’s pandemic operations rapidly devolved into a bureaucratic Chernobyl with immense and prolonged backlogs of claims, unresponsive handling of claimants’ inquiries, rampant fraud and, as the new report details, botched anti-fraud practices that blocked payments to those with legitimate claims.

The state’s oversight agencies, particularly the state auditor’s office, have steadfastly catalogued EDD’s shortcomings and the latest report, focusing on about \$20 billion in fraudulent payments and EDD’s measures to battle it, comes from the Legislative Analyst’s Office.

What emerges is a tale of an agency repeatedly failing to act when necessary and then overreacting as it tries to correct its previous errors.

Embarrassed by the revelations of fraud, mostly involving special federal jobless benefits, EDD’s managers went overboard in adopting anti-fraud policies, thus denying benefits to many legitimate and qualified claimants, the LAO report declares.

At one point, it says, “EDD and (and an outside contractor) identified 1.1 million claims as potentially fraudulent. EDD stopped payments for these claims. Workers were not notified ahead of time. To reopen their accounts, workers had to verify their identity using ID.me or their accounts would be closed permanently. Ultimately, more than half of the claims (600,000) flagged as fraudulent were confirmed as legitimate.”

Thus, the “working families” that Democrats profess to treasure have been doubly

and triply mistreated.

Newsom’s proposed 2022-23 budget contains funds for six contracts by outside vendors to prevent future fraud, in addition to 13 other fraud-related contracts and the LAO report questions “whether additional anti-fraud efforts are warranted at this time.”

“Moving forward at this time with new, additional layers of fraud protection also would move the department further out of balance by again prioritizing fraud elimination at the expense of prompt and straightforward payments,” the report states.

One of the most irritating things about the EDD’s incredibly bad performance over the last two years is that its political overseers had plenty of warning. During the previous recession that began in 2007, the department experienced great difficulty in handling a surge of unemployment insurance claims because of antiquated tools and procedures.

However, once that recession ended, the agency reverted to its customary ministerial role and no one — in particular Newsom’s predecessor, Jerry Brown — took the proactive step of improving EDD’s capabilities before the next recession hit.

Thus, when it did hit in 2020 by Newsom’s decree, the department was overwhelmed and the shortcomings revealed in the previous recession were magnified. It’s another reminder of government’s endemic inability to look ahead and plan ahead.

Social Security Matters

About Survivor Benefits for Minor Children

Dear Rusty: My nephew died suddenly at 50 years of age and left 2 children, ages 17 and 14. He was divorced, but they were married for more than 10 years, and his ex-wife works as a nurse. My nephew worked for more than 10 years during his lifetime. I want to know if the children are eligible for survivor benefits and the amount of benefits they will receive, and if their mother's income will affect their eligibility.

Also, will my nephew's ex-wife be eligible for survivor's benefit as she is taking care of a child younger than 16 years old? She did not remarry. Will her income affect her survivor's benefit? **Signed: Helpful Relative**

Dear Helpful Relative: Our condolences on your nephew's sudden and untimely passing. From what you've shared in your email, your nephew's minor children are eligible for Social Security benefits based on his earnings record (assuming he worked in a job where he paid SS FICA taxes on

his earnings). However, because they are divorced, his ex-wife is not eligible for early "child-in-care" spousal benefits. Child-in-care spousal benefits are not available to divorced spouses under age 62.

Your nephew's minor children are eligible for benefits and their mother's income won't affect their survivor benefit from their father. Both minor children currently qualify for a survivor benefit from their father, and the benefit for each could be as much as 75% of the benefit their father had earned up to the month he died. They will remain eligible for this benefit until they reach 18 years of age (or 19 if still in high school). It's possible that Social Security's "Family Maximum" may slightly reduce each child's survivor benefit to a bit less than 75%, but any such reduction for the 14 year old will disappear when the 17 year old turns 18 and becomes ineligible for child survivor benefits).

The children's mother should contact Social Security as soon as possible (at her local SS office or at the national service center number – 1.800.772.1213) to apply for survivor benefits for her children. She may need to provide their father's death certificate (although SS may have already received that from the funeral director) as well as the children's birth certificates.

If your nephew's

ex-wife doesn't remarry before age 60, at that time she will become eligible to collect a survivor benefit from her deceased ex-husband. But claimed at age 60 that survivor benefit will be reduced by 28.5% from what it would be if she waits until her full retirement age (FRA) to claim it (a survivor benefit reaches maximum at the survivor's FRA but is reduced if claimed earlier). If she claims her survivor benefit prior to reaching her FRA and she is working, Social Security will impose an earnings limit which, if exceeded, could result in the loss of some of her survivor benefits. Earnings limits for future years aren't yet known, but the 2022 earnings limit is \$19,560. The earnings limit will no longer affect her Social Security benefits after she reaches her full retirement age.

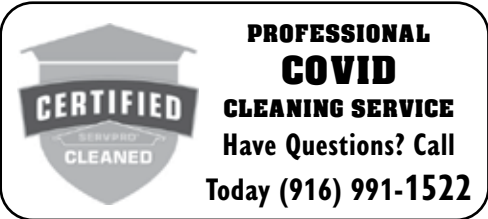

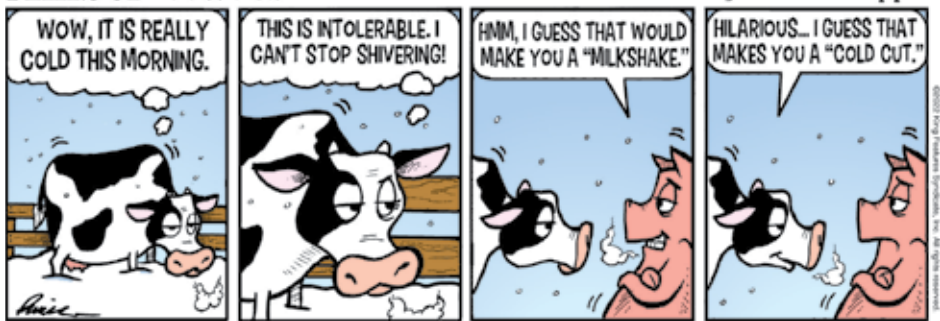

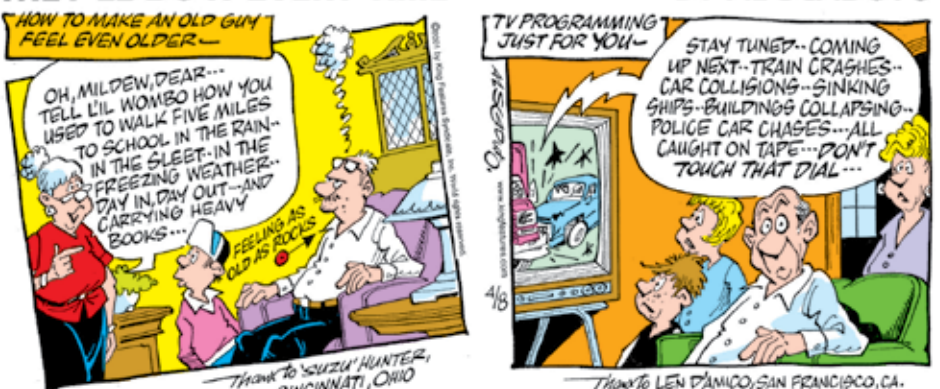
