Microbusiness Grant Program to Make Big Local Impact

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County encourages microbusinesses in the county that have been adversely affected by the pandemic to apply to receive relief grants of \$2,500. The new Microbusiness Grant Program is funded by the State of California's Office of the Small Business Advocate (CalOSBA) and administered by Sacramento County. These new micro-business grants do not need to be repaid, and the application period will be open April 1-29, 2022.

Often operating as solopreneurs, freelancers and small business owners, a microbusiness typically receives less than \$50,000 in revenue annually and has fewer than five full-time employees. Examples of microbusinesses include hair and make-up stylists, interior design professionals, graphic designers, caterers, photographers and event planners. To be eligible, applicants also need to have experienced a 10 percent or greater reduction in revenue in the 2019 to 2020 tax years. A complete list of grant eligibility requirements is available on the Sac4Micro website.

"Sacramento County has more than 52,000 business establishments," said Troy Givans, Director of Sacramento County Office of Economic Development. "Of those businesses, the microbusiness sector makes up approximately 67 percent countywide. The pandemic has been especially hard on our small business community, in particular, our minority-owned businesses. The County is excited to partner with CalOSBA to offer another resource to help the microbusinesses access funding to recover."

Additionally, Sacramento County is partnering with the California Capital Financial Development Corporation, California Hispanic Chambers of Commerce, Sacramento Asian Pacific Chamber of Commerce, Sacramento Black Chamber of Commerce, Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Sacramento Metro Chamber and the Slavic Chamber of Commerce to provide in-language assistance and expand the program's reach into underserved communities.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - History continues to be made at Sacramento State under first-year head coach Mark Campbell as two women's basketball players have earned individual Big Sky

Conference honors.

Senior guard Lianna Tillman and sophomore center Isnelle Natabou were both recognized Monday, March 7 for their achievements during the 2021-22 regular season.

Since arriving as a graduate transfer from the University of the Pacific,

there has been little doubt that Tillman is the most valuable Hornet. Now 28 games later, Tillman has been acknowledged by the rest of the conference as the Big Sky Most Valuable Player.

The 5'9 guard from Lincoln High School in Stockton is the first player

in program history to earn the award. Tillman is a bucket getter. Regardless of if she's scoring herself or finding an open teammate, the numbers don't lie. The graduate transfer led the Big Sky in points (20.3 PPG) and assists (6.2 APG) this season.

Shelter Dog Goes from Rescued to Rescuer

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter intakes thousands of pets in the community each year. Most of these pets are reunited with their owners or are able to find loving forever homes to be adopted into. However, some shelter pets have a difficult time finding a normal adoptive home which is where the shelter's foster and rescue program comes in. The foster and rescue program works with local foster and rescue providers in the community to help shelter pets that need a little extra assistance on the

way to their happy ending. Foster care providers provide temporary care outside of the shelter to animals such as those too young for adoption, needing to recover from an illness or injury, for behavior modification, or just because they need a break from the stresses of shelter life. Rescue group partners are also a huge help as they pull shelter animals who otherwise have a difficult time being adopted due to age, medical condition or the need for behavioral modification that cannot be resolved in a foster home. Shelter dog Dora, who arrived as a stray in 2016, was having a difficult time finding a forever home.



Fortunately, shelter staff was so impressed by her high-toy drive that they contacted the National Disaster Search Dog Foundation (NDSDF). The

NDSDF is an organization based in Santa Paula, California that strengthens disaster response across America by rescuing and recruiting dogs

and partnering them with firefighters and other first responders to find people buried alive in the wreckage of disasters. They have been a long-time rescue partner of the Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter.

"Groups such as NDSDF give dogs that have no chance of placement in a normal pet home an opportunity for a great outcome and a chance to truly thrive in the world," said Shasta Stratton-Quirk, who works on the shelter's foster and rescue team. "Because some dogs are not able to be adopted out through normal routes, it is the job of the foster and rescue team to find an outlet

where they can reach their true potential.

Dora's natural abilities made it clear that the NDSDF made the right choice in bringing her on the team. Six years later, the rescue partner is happy to report Dora is working diligently with the San Diego Fire Department and California Task Force 8 alongside her handler, Joe Zakar, and has truly gone from rescued to rescuer.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - For more than 30 years, thousands of lives have been touched by Sacramento County's Gifts from the Heart program, an annual holiday gift-giving initiative that runs from October until mid-December and serves those within the Child Protective Services and Senior and Adult Services divisions of the Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services.

In 2021, the program provided gifts to more than 2,500 youth, adults and seniors at an estimated cash value of \$152,040.

They got Nerf balls, art supplies, scented candles, Disney princess toys, basketballs, Bluetooth speakers and more! The youngest recipient, Karl, age 1, received finger puppets, wooden puzzles, and a Lego train. The oldest, Quang, age 91, received

businesses, government agencies, service groups and families donate gifts that allow the program to continue.

A team of 57 volunteers managed the pick-up, distribution, and delivery of gifts from community and private sponsors. The volunteers, many of whom return year

after year, spend three weeks in the warehouse organizing toys and gifts. In 2021, volunteers logged in almost 10,000 hours. Donations come in other forms, too. Jackson Properties donated warehouse space; and Sourdough & Co., Roma 2 Pizza, Pizza Guys and Subway provided

lunches to hungry volunteers.

“This was our second year of taking precautions due to COVID-19, but we didn’t let it stop us,” said Tonja Edelman, Volunteer and Student Intern Services Coordinator. “We required volunteers to be fully vaccinated and we wore masks, and we got it done. We are so thankful for our volunteers and for the contributions from local community partners that make the program possible.”

The total cash value of the program – volunteers, donations, gifts - is estimated to be \$476,612.

And the look on gift recipients’ faces? Priceless.

Tillman ranks 17th nationally in points per game and 10th in assists per game. She is also one of only two NCAA Division I women’s basketball players to average at least 18 points and six assists per game along with University of Iowa star Caitlin Clark who ranks first nationally in points and assists per game.
Natabou made quite the impression in her first season playing Division I, unanimously being named the Big Sky Newcomer of the Year. The 6’5 sophomore is the second player in school history to win the award, alongside Kim Sheehy in 2004-05.
She led the conference in rebounding

(11.1 RPG) and field goal percentage (.639) while being sixth in scoring (14.6 PPG). However, that’s not all. Nationally, Natabou ranks 18th in total rebounds per game, 10th in offensive rebounds (4.3 ORPG) and fourth in field goal percentage.
The individual awards for Tillman and Natabou continued with the All-Big Sky Conference selections. Tillman was unanimously selected to the first team and Natabou was chosen to the second team.
The Hornets (14-15, 10-10 Big Sky), led by Tillman and Natabou, began the Big Sky Tournament as the seventh seed on March 7 against Weber State (10-19, 6-14). The winner of the tournament receives an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.★

Shooter Kills Four Inside Church then Shoots Himself

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - At approximately 5:07 p.m. on Monday, February 28, 2022, the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office Communications Center received a call from an employee of a church, located on the 2000 block of Wyda Way, stating a man with a gun was shooting inside the church. The caller had been upstairs inside the church when he heard shots fired. He then exited the sanctuary and called the Sheriff’s Office. The first deputy arrived at the church at 5:09 p.m. with multiple units following. Deputies did not hear the sounds of shooting when they arrived but treated the scene as an Active Shooter Situation and immediately entered the building and began searching rooms.
Deputies located two adults and three juveniles inside building. Deputies triaged each subject, rendering aid before all five were pronounced deceased at the scene. The

victims were a 59-year-old male chaperone to the three female juveniles ages 9, 10 and 13. The shooter, 39-year-old father of the children, then turned the firearm on himself.
Seventy personnel responded from the Sacramento Sheriff’s Office to the call as well as numerous regional law enforcement agencies. The Sheriff’s Office is grateful to the community and our allied partners for their assistance. Investigators were on scene throughout the night collecting physical evidence, canvassing for witnesses and surveillance video.
The identity of the victims and shooter in this case will be released by the Sacramento County Coroner’s Office.

California’s Green Energy Mania Threatens Grid Reliability

California is failing at the government basics. Public safety, homelessness, roads, and water storage are all in shambles. But as long as that shameful list is, it’s about to get longer. With summer around the corner, when demand is at its zenith, our energy supply will not be up to the task.
California’s headlong rush towards zero-carbon power will cost consumers through wildly expensive electricity rates and lower grid reliability. That’s a lose-lose for California families and businesses who want to avoid blackouts and avoid energy poverty.
Golden State politicians and Progressives – groups with an almost total overlap – live in dread fear of possible changes in weather decades in the future. Instead of planning for localized mitigations to deal with changing climate, they’ve decided to remake our entire energy sector, replacing affordable, dependable sources

with their opposites.
A case in point is the closing of the Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant, scheduled to stop operations in 2025. Despite disingenuous claims that PG&E is choosing to close this facility, they are being forced into closure by California regulators who can make relicensing extraordinarily time consuming and expensive.
How important is Diablo Canyon? It currently produces about as much power as all the rooftop solar in the entire state. And unlike solar and wind, this power is available on-demand, 24/7. PG&E, the plant’s owner, alleges it will replace all the lost power with so-called green, renewable resources, but what if it can’t?
The North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC), a non-profit dedicated to promoting grid reliability, thinks it won’t. NERC notes that California already has insufficient reserve power to meet demand during a heat wave. Closing Diablo Canyon will only contribute to declining reserve margins, according to NERC.
All of that is to say that blackouts are coming when it gets hot in California, as it does every summer. Don’t be surprised when your AC won’t click on, or you’re burning candles for light in this supposedly advanced state. The blackouts are entirely predictable and a

direct result of California energy policy making our grid unreliable by replacing on-demand resources with intermittent ones.
And remember, California is pushing people into electric cars through incentives and government decrees. Many people will be charging up those EVs when they get home from work, right after solar energy production peaks. We are creating dreadful imbalances that will lead to energy rationing in one of the wealthiest areas in the world.
Venture capitalist Marc Andreessen recently tweeted about the Ukrainian crisis and its effect on our energy markets and independence, “Build 1,000 new state of the art nuclear power plants in the US and Europe, right now. We won’t, but we should.” He’s right all the way around regarding energy independence and reliance on aggressive rogue states such as Russia for our energy.
But it’s the last line that hits closest to home in California. We need to reverse our green energy mania that prices electricity like a luxury good and guarantees blackouts. Dependable, affordable energy is within our grasp if we commit to predictable, on-demand resources such as nuclear and natural gas. We won’t, but we should.

Feinstein Now Must Decide Whether to Retire

Whither Dianne Feinstein? California’s senior U.S. senator, a California political fixture for more than a half-century, was facing a turning point even before her husband, financier and philanthropist Richard Blum, died on Sunday of cancer.

The Senate’s oldest member at 88 and the state’s longest serving senator has clearly fallen out of favor with voters, even her fellow Democrats.

A new poll by UC-Berkeley’s Institute of Governmental Studies found that after years of steadily eroding popularity, just 30% of the state’s registered voters now approve of her, including just 45% of Democrats. Meanwhile, 49% said they disapproved.

“The five-term senator now receives more negative than positive job ratings from strong liberals, women, voters of color, younger voters, as well as voters in Los Angeles County or the San Francisco Bay Area,” the poll noted.

Feinstein has been a senator for nearly 30 years, following two decades of public service in San Francisco, including a stint as mayor. She was once one of the state’s most popular politicians due to her centrist, pragmatic approach,

and was the go-to person for California’s interest groups with issues in Washington.

However, political polarization has left her drifting in political no-man’s land, reflexively despised by Republicans because she’s a Democrat and increasingly alienated from a leftward-drifting Democratic Party.

As Donald Trump’s presidency widened the ideological divide, Feinstein’s centrism, particularly her willingness to cross the Senate aisle and do business with Republicans, made her a pariah to the Berniecrat wing of her party. Four years ago, as she was seeking another Senate term, the state party endorsed rival Kevin de León.

Feinstein easily defeated de León in 2018 but her popularity continued its downward course, not only because she’s out of step with her party but due to her age and media reports that she may be suffering the cognition effects of old age. She must now – and soon – decide whether to seek still another term in 2024.

Feinstein has said she’s running again, but she would say that under any circumstances because that’s what politicians do. Were she to announce retirement, her clout in the Senate, which already has waned somewhat, would vanish and there would be a feeding frenzy among California’s ambitious Democratic politicians.

That said, it was at least a 50-50 bet that Feinstein wouldn’t seek another term in 2024 even before the

devastating poll and her husband’s death. There’s now a strong probability she won’t run, approaching near-certainty.

As that probability sinks in, those ambitious politicians will be maneuvering to become her successor and all eyes will be on Gov. Gavin Newsom.

Newsom won’t have any trouble winning re-election this year, barring some cataclysmic x-factor, but what then?

Had Trump won a second term in 2020, the door would have been open for Newsom to make a run for the White House in 2024. But with Joe Biden’s victory – and more pointedly, Californian Kamala Harris’ elevation from the Senate into the vice presidency – a 2024 presidential run by Newsom seems highly unlikely.

Newsom wears ambition on his sleeve and if he wants to extend his political career, the next logical move would be into the Senate, and there’s no better springboard than a landslide re-election as governor this year.

Newsom is certainly not the only California politician who might want to succeed Feinstein. There are probably several dozen Democratic members of Congress who see a senator staring back when they look in the mirror, plus some other statewide officials and big city mayors.

It all hinges on whether Feinstein is ready for a well-earned political retirement.

DC area bracing for trucker convoy protests as nearly 1,000 vehicles hit Maryland town | 5 March 2022 | Long lines of 18-wheelers and other trucks crowded the roads of Hagerstown, Maryland, early Saturday as the Washington, DC-area prepared for protests over COVID-19 mandates. While other similar US trucker convoys have fizzled, this one started gaining steam Friday evening. Roughly 1,000 vehicles arriving from all directions converged on Hagerstown Speedway, clogging traffic, the Washington Post reported. As of 8 p.m., a two-mile-long line of cars and trucks could be seen stuck in traffic on Route 40 trying to get into the location, WUSA-9 TV reported. Some truckers participating in the “People’s Convoy” said they planned to head to the DC Beltway area Saturday, but others said they were awaiting instructions.

US Surgeon General asks Big Tech platforms to hand over Covid ‘misinformation’ data | 4 March 2022 | Joe Biden’s Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy formally requested Big Tech companies submit data on the prevalence of COVID-19 “misinformation” on social media, instant messengers, search engines, e-commerce platforms, and crowdsourcing platforms. The request for information is part of the Covid National Preparedness Plan that Biden announced during the State of The Union address on Tuesday. The surgeon general’s office wants platforms to submit data on the prevalence of alleged Covid misinformation, beginning with the common examples of such misinformation outlined by the CDC. Dr. Murthy’s request asked about the major sources of Covid misinformation, including those that have been providing “unproven” treatments. The request for information asked platforms to provide data on “exactly how many users saw or may have been exposed to instances of Covid-19 misinformation,” and the demographics that have allegedly been disproportionately exposed and affected by Covid misinformation.

Pfizer Vaccine Only 12% Effective in Kids 5 to 11, Study Says – | 1 March 2022 | The effectiveness of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine against Omicron “declined rapidly for children, particularly those 5-11 years,” according to a study released February 28. The authors of the study still recommended the vaccine for that age group, stating it was protective against severe disease. They also proposed the recommended dose for 5- to 11-year-olds was too small, suggesting a higher dose might solve the problem. According to The New York Times, the study’s lead author, Dr. Eli Rosenberg, briefed Dr. Rochelle Walensky and other officials at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on the New York data in early February. U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) officials learned of the data around the same time. Some scientists at those agencies then pushed for the data to be made public before an FDA meeting, scheduled for Feb. 15, to review Pfizer’s application for Emergency Use Authorization of a three-dose regimen of its vaccine for infants and children 6 months to 5 years old. But the study’s findings were only made public on Monday.

Durham Tells Court Not to Dismiss Charge Against Lawyer Who Hid Ties to Clinton Campaign | 5 March 2022 | Special Counsel John Durham on March 4 told a federal judge not to dismiss a charge against a lawyer who lied to the FBI about representing Hillary Clinton’s presidential campaign. Michael Sussman was representing the Clinton campaign when in 2016 he passed along information to an FBI counsel. His lawyers say the documents “raised national security concerns” while prosecutors describe them as purportedly detailing a covert channel between a Russian bank and the business of Donald Trump, Clinton’s rival at the time. Sussman was charged with lying to the FBI because he falsely told the counsel he was not providing the allegations to the FBI on behalf of any client despite presenting the information on behalf of the Clinton campaign, prosecutors say. In a filing in February, Sussman’s lawyers moved to dismiss the charge, claiming their client “did not make any false statement to the FBI” but even if he had, “the false statement alleged in the indictment is immaterial as a matter of law.” ★

Social Security Matters

I'm Confused About Taking Medicare and Social Security

Dear Rusty: I just turned 64 and now get stuff about Medicare and Medigap and so on. I really don't know how to retire when it's time. What should I do? What am I looking for? Am I eligible for anything as of now? I'm so confused about all this that I don't even know if I can retire when it's time. Maybe I should just continue working so I don't have to try to figure this out. **Signed: Confused**

Dear Confused: Deciding when to retire from work is usually a difficult decision for everyone, so don't feel alone as you struggle with deciding what's best for you personally. I'll try to provide some insight into what you should be looking at now, at age 64:

The reason you're now getting all that unsolicited information about Medicare and "Medigap" is because you're approaching the magic age of 65, when you first become eligible for those senior healthcare

services. But if you are still working and now have "creditable" healthcare coverage from your employer, you don't need to enroll in any Medicare plan until your employer coverage ends (If your employer healthcare coverage is a group plan with at least 20 participants, that coverage is "creditable"). So, if you plan to continue working and have creditable healthcare coverage, you can simply ignore all those healthcare solicitations. You don't need to worry about enrolling in Medicare until your creditable employer coverage ends, at which point you will be able to enroll in a Medicare program without incurring a late enrollment penalty.

You also do not need to apply for Social Security now (or at age 65) - you can wait until you retire from working full time to apply for Social Security. In fact, you probably should wait until you fully retire from working to claim Social Security, because at age 64 (or 65) you will be subject to Social Security's "earnings test" if you claim SS benefits. The earnings test limits how much you can earn before Social Security takes away some of your benefits and, if your earnings are high enough, it could even disqualify you from getting SS benefits while you are still working. Social Security's earnings test applies until you reach

your full retirement age, which is 66 years and 6 months. If you claim Social Security before that and exceed the annual earnings limit (\$19,560 for 2022), SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. So, if you're working full time and plan to continue that, waiting to apply for Social Security would be prudent. Delaying Social Security would also mean a higher benefit when you later claim because your benefit will grow for as long as you delay (up to age 70). And although you will become eligible for Medicare when you turn 65, if you're still working and have creditable healthcare coverage from your employer at that time, you can defer enrolling in Medicare until your employer coverage ends.

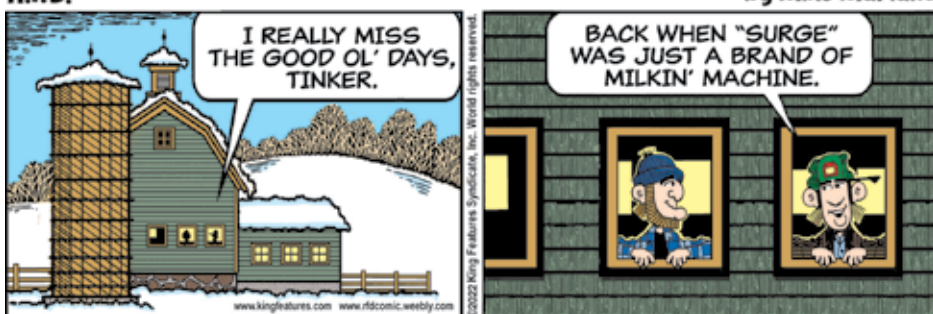

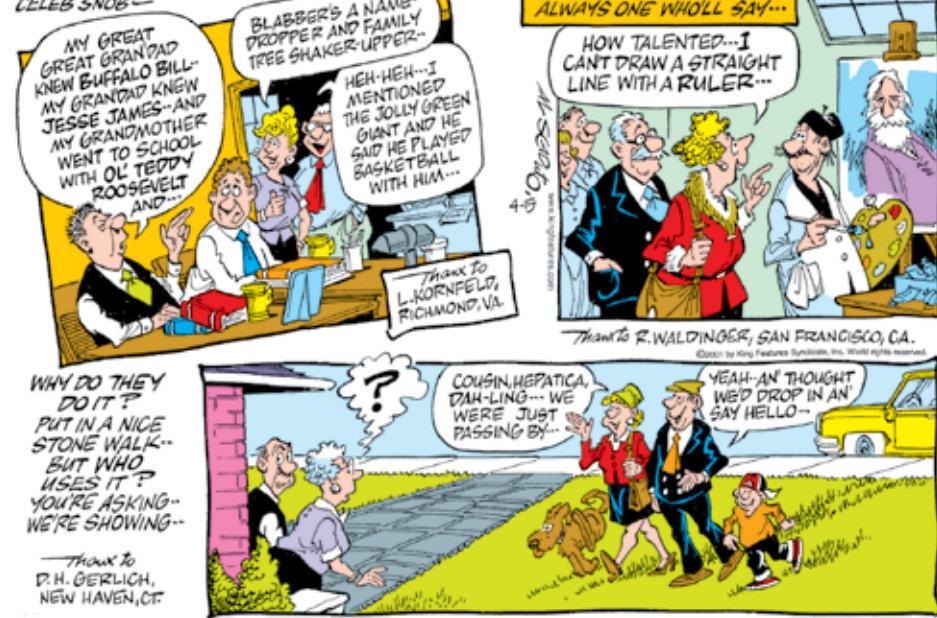

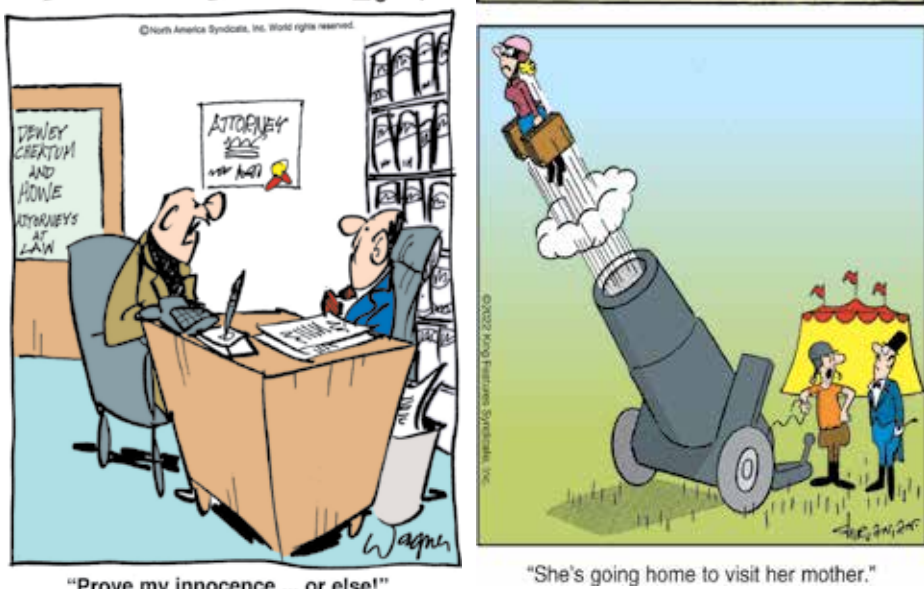
