

Parkway Activists Confront County

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Fed up with illegal parkland camping, the American River Parkway Foundation has addressed a three-page scold to Sacramento City and County. Following the widely-publicized communication, Foundation leaders have achieved meetings with elected policymakers. "We hope to start a conversation that will result in solutions," says Foundation executive Dianna Pognotti.

The non-profit last year got vocal about Parkway deterioration. At a public forum, more than 200 citizens learned the beloved County gem was more imperiled than at any time in its 60-year history. Experts revealed that 15 percent of the Parkway's 4800 acres burned in 2021; that river water was polluted; wildlife habitat was suffering; recreational trail users were intimidated; garbage accumulated faster than clean-ups could counter;

Change Service Requested

Feb. 10, 14 people scattered around California collectively exhaled in relief.

The 14 are members of the state's independent citizens redistricting commission who drew 120 new districts for the Legislature, 52 for Congress and four for the state Board of Equalization that voters will use in this year's election. The commissioners struggled at times to reach consensus, and their mapping was critiqued nearly every step of the way by some experts, advocates, elected officials and the public

officials and the public. But after all the criticism, the maps – came and went. No one sued.

There's still one more state hurdle to clear: critics have until March 27 to challenge the maps via a referendum – asking voters to reject them – before the new districts officially become effective. But there's no sign any such costly effort is underway. (The maps could also be challenged in federal court as violating the U.S. constitution or the Voting Rights Act.)

"The absence of a state lawsuit challenging these maps is a testament to the effectiveness of California's open, publicly accessible redistricting "We worked hard to apply the constitutional redistricting criteria and consider testimony from throughout the state, especially from minority communities," said Yee, a Republican professor and former pastor from Oakland. "While the maps do not please everyone, we believe they are fair and equitable. We would have confidently defended these maps in court, but are thankful we now won't need to."

The commission did face litigation earlier: An emergency petition filed on Nov. 30 on behalf of some *Continued on page 3*

rampant drug abuse has created further hazards.

The Foundation's letter demanded that Sacramento County agencies and Sacramento City pull their weight and "take action" to stop river and parkland abuse.

In an interview with Messenger Publications, District 3 Supervisor Rich Desmond acknowledged the crisis. "I welcome the Foundation's advocacy and criticism," he said. "As a kid, I kayaked from Carmichael to Discovery Park and didn't see a single camper... I never expected what we have now. I'm ashamed our children have to experience nature with this backdrop."

"The Foundation should be relentless in educating policy makers on the harm being done to our beloved Parkway." Asked what the County was doing to counter damage by the (estimated) 1000-strong camper population, Desmond cited a recent \$2 million increase in budget to supply more ranger patrols, fire fuel reduction, a new Environmental Impact Team (to assess restoration needs) and more social workers to connect the homeless to assistance. "What's missing is alternative shelters, transitional housing and treatment options," he admitted. "The County and City are working closely to acquire more shelter locations."

The Foundation letter's must-do list for policymakers includes:

Formulating plans for removal of illegal Parkway campers; Providing *Continued on page 3*

California Releases Extreme Heat Action Plan

California Natural Resources Agency Press Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- With climate change driving greater extremes in weather, the California Natural Resources Agency and Governor's Office of Planning and Research, together with state agency partners, today released a draft Extreme Heat Action Plan to protect communities around the state. This action plan outlines a strategic and comprehensive set of state actions to adapt and build resilience to extreme heat.

California's best climate science projects that every corner of the state will be impacted in years and decades to come by higher average temperatures and more frequent and severe heat waves. Extreme heat threatens public health and safety, economic prosperity, and communities and natural systems, with profoundly disproportionate consequences for the most vulnerable Californians.

The development of the draft action plan was initiated through the state's 2021 update to California's Climate Adaptation Strategy, during which the need for an up-to-date comprehensive, interagency approach to extreme heat was identified early on. To meet this need, the state committed to updating the 2013 report "Preparing California for Extreme Heat Guidance and Recommendations."

The substance and organization of the Extreme Heat Action Plan was guided by extensive public engagement. In addition to input received through ten regional workshops and numerous consultations with California Native American tribes, the state held an Extreme Heat Workshop Series to gather recommendations on priority state actions and areas of focus for the action plan. The final workshops in this series will be held on January 24, 2022 to solicit feedback on this draft.

The draft action plan identifies existing and recommended state actions to address extreme heat, and identifies eight areas of near-term focus: Implementing a statewide public health monitoring system to identify heat illness events early, monitor trends, and track illnesses and deaths; Cooling schools in heat-vulnerable communities and support for climate-smart planning; Accelerating heat readiness and protection of low-income households and expanding tree canopy in communities

most impacted by extreme heat; Protecting vulnerable populations through increased heat risk-reduction strategies and codes, standards, and regulations; Building a climate-smart workforce through training partnerships and apprenticeships in jobs and careers that address extreme heat; Increasing public awareness to reduce risks posed by extreme heat; Supporting local and regional extreme heat action; Protecting natural systems, including fish and wildlife, from the impacts of extreme heat.

Some Residents Will Move to a Time-of-Use Rate in April

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As part of a multiyear, statewide energy policy to create a cleaner energy future for California, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), East Bay Community Energy (EBCE) and Valley Clean Energy (VCE) will move approximately 142,662 eligible residential electric customers currently on a tiered rate plan called E-1 to a Time-of-Use (TOU) rate plan in April 2022. On the Time-of-Use (Peak Pricing 4-9 p.m. Every Day) rate plan when customers use energy is as important as how much they use.

The transition to this Time-of-Use rate plan will occur by geographical region and affect approximately 2.5 million customers in PG&E's service area in stages. 38,648 customers in San Joaquin, 30,337 in Placer, 20,552 in El Dorado, 19,771 in Yolo, 10,941 in Tuolumne, 10,165 in Calaveras, 6,479 in Amador, 4,380 in Stanislaus, 606 in Sacramento, 568 in Sierra and 215 in Alpine counties will receive a series of notifications by mail that started in December 2021 to allow them ample time to make a choice if they prefer another rate plan.

Customers can choose another rate plan at any time and are encouraged to update their contact information to ensure they receive important program updates. To view a customized rate plan comparison, customers can visit their account online at www.pge.com/TOUchoice. PG&E does not profit from this change.

All California investor-owned electric utilities are required to automatically transition customers to the Time-of-Use rate plan to support a cleaner, healthier, and more reliable energy grid. Some customers will not automatically move to the Timeof-Use rate plan including those enrolled the Medical Baseline program.

"To ensure our customers are fully aware of the transition to the Time-of-Use rate and how the program works, we're communicating this change more than 90 days ahead, and we'll continue to share information before each regional transition takes place," said Marlene Santos, PG&E's Chief Customer Officer. "And customers can choose the rate plan that best fits their needs and lives at any time."

Customers who automatically transition to this Time-of-Use rate plan will receive risk-free Bill Protection for the first 12 months on the delivery portion of the bill. If a customer pays more on the Time-of-Use (Peak Pricing 4-9 p.m. Every Day) rate plan than they would have on their current rate plan, PG&E will automatically credit the customer the difference for the first year.

More About Time-of-Use Rate Plans

Customers on these rate plans can choose to shift and reduce some energy use to lower-cost time periods (19 hours) every day, including weekends and holidays. The hours of 4 to 9 p.m. are higher priced (peak times). All other times are lower priced (off-peak). Environmental advocacy groups such as the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) support the transition to TOU rates as the plans help build healthier communities.

Defendant Charged for Murder of Emma Roark w/Special Circumstances

Sacramento County District Attorney

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert has announced the filing of criminal charges in the tragic death of Emma Roark. Mikilo Rawls has been charged with murder along with several special circumstances, making this a capital case. Rawls is also charged with kidnap, rape, sodomy, and an allegation that the victim was bound or tied in the course of the sexual assault. It is also alleged that Rawls has previously been convicted of a first-degree burglary,

which is a strike offense under California law.

Criminalists from the Sacramento County District Attorney's Crime Lab responded with the Sheriff's Department and assisted in processing the crime scene. Evidence obtained from the victim matched a known profile of Rawls and detectives from the Sheriff's Department obtained an arrest warrant for Rawls, which was executed Friday, February 11. That warrant is a document on file with the court and available for public inspection within the rules of the Sacramento Superior Court. "The circumstances of this murder are horrific, and our sympathies go out to Emma Roark's family," said DA Schubert. "I am incredibly proud of our Crime Lab criminalists who responded to the scene and dedicated every available resource to identify a responsible party." ★

Republican voters alleged that the commission held secret meetings with some interest groups, complained that an analysis of racially polarized voting wasn't made public and challenged the selection of its legal counsel because the firm had previously worked for Democrats.

That emergency petition was denied by the California Supreme Court on Dec. 15. Any of the \$4.3 million set aside for litigation that isn't used goes back into the state's general fund.

The lack of lawsuits is somewhat surprising. After the first time California redistricting was done by an independent commission, in 2011, two lawsuits challenged the final maps, and another questioned the commission's makeup.

And new election districts in other states are being taken to court. On Feb. 7, the U.S. Supreme Court reinstated a congressional map that a lower federal court ruled would disenfranchise Black voters. In December, the U.S. Department of Justice sued Texas, alleging that the maps drawn by a Republican-controlled Legislature and GOP Gov. Greg Abbott disenfranchise Latino voters. In North Carolina, the state Supreme Court threw out new congressional and legislative districts that the justices said were too partisan and ordered the Republican-majority Legislature to draw new ones by Feb. 18.

Even in other states where the maps were also drawn by independent commissions, there are lawsuits. In Michigan, state lawmakers say that the new congressional districts would dilute the voting power of minority communities. In Ohio, Black voters went to federal court seeking to block legislative maps.

Just before approving California's maps and delivering them to the secretary of state on Dec. 27, commissioners noted the exceptional challenges they faced during their 18 months of work, including the pandemic and the delay of Census data that compressed their timeline to have new districts in time for the June primary.

Meeting deadlines and avoiding lawsuits aren't the only measures of success. Other assessments could shape what statewide and local California redistricting looks like after the 2030 Census and beyond.

Ballot measures passed in 2008 and 2010 set the minimum criteria for fair maps: equal population, compliance with the federal Voting Rights Act and compactness of districts, among others.

But beyond that, some look at how well the new districts reflect California's diverse population – with no race or ethnic group making up a majority.

According to the Public Policy Institute of California, the number of majority Latino districts increased "significantly," with six more for U.S. House, three more for state Senate and an additional five for state Assembly - nearly matching the share of the Latino voting-eligible

population at 30%.

There was less change for other ethnic groups. There are two Asian-majority state Assembly districts, up from one, but no state Senate or congressional districts. There are no majority Black districts.

Another measure of fair representation: "influence" districts, where a group makes up at least 30% of voters. While the number of Latino "influence" districts declined, there are two Black influence congressional districts and two legislative districts and six Asian influence congressional districts and 10 legislative ones.

Party control, based on voter registration, flipped in three congressional, four Senate districts and four Assembly districts.

Still, Democrats will likely remain dominant based on the new maps, favored to win 41 congressional seats, 31 state Senate seats and 62 Assembly seats, according to the PPIC analysis. There were also 21 members of Congress, 13 state senators and 20 Assembly members put into the same districts as other incumbents.

Adding to the turnover and possibly changing the partisan balance, so far 21 Assembly members and state senators have resigned or have announced they're not seeking reelection this year. Another seven senators are barred from running again by term limits.

While this California redistricting was heavily scrutinized, the 2010 commission dealt with its own challenges, including tight timelines and budget restraints. But they also had the advantage of being the first independent commissioners.

So, another measure of the current commission's success might be how well it learned lessons from the previous group. Some prior commissioners who followed the 2021 process say the current commission was able to do more public outreach and took advantage of more advanced technology.

But some of the same problems remained: time management, a lack of clear guidance on how to assess competing communities of interest and a struggle to be consistent in making decisions.

The current commissioners, like their predecessors, may also travel throughout California and to other states to share the impact an independent commission can have.

Members of both citizen commissions agree that other institutions should learn from having a bipartisan group work together and reach consensus, especially in these politically polarized times, when 63% of California's likely voters are pessimistic that Americans with different political views can still work out their differences



funding to repair environmental damage; Maintaining healthy water for wildlife and humans; Increasing Parkway safety to benefit nearby neighborhoods; Removing refuse to reduce fire risk and contamination.

Despite assurances of County commitment to the Parkway, Foundation activists won't turn down the heat: "We elect people to shape our community, and we should hold them accountable," Dianna Pognotti said. "The Foundation has waited for them to address this crisis.

They've made announcements but not followed through. OurParkway's being destroyed, and no one seems to be doing anything to save it. We need plans for

services and shelter options. Beyond that, we want the Parkway restored. We've placed (early 2022) deadlines for action. We're fortunate to have this treasure. People shouldn't be afraid to use it."

Agrees Supervisor Desmond: "Parkway encampments need to be removed. But unless we have alternative shelters, they'll just pop up somewhere else. The Foundation's deadlines are challenging, but I'm working with Board colleagues and County staff to identify plans that will continue to provide support the Parkway needs." Calif. school mask rules to remain in effect after mandate expires | 14 Feb 2022 | California Health & Human Services Agency Sec. Dr. Mark Ghaly announced Monday that although the indoor mask mandate will be lifted for vaccinated people on Feb. 15, it will remain in effect for schoolchildren. After Feb. 15, unvaccinated people still will be required to be masked indoors, and everyone - vaccinated or not - will have to wear masks in higher-risk areas like public transit and nursing homes and other congregate living facilities, officials said.

California bill would make vaccine mandatory for employment | 12 Feb 2022 | Democratic California officials have introduced a bill which would force businesses to require their employees to be fully vaccinated against Covid-19 or face fines and other penalties. California State Assemblywoman Buffy Wicks-- a Democrat who worked on former President Barack Obama's 2008 and 2012 presidential campaigns -- introduced the bill on Thursday alongside fellow Democratic assembly members Cecilia Aguiar-Curry, Evan Low, and Akilah Weber. 

Can't Afford to Pay My Medicare Premium Bill ... What Can I Do?



My Medicare begins March 1st and I have received my first bill. This bill is for 4 months from March 1st to June 30th. I thought Medicare was monthly. If I pay this amount, then I

cannot pay my rent for March.

This bill for Medicare is due February 25th and I was wondering if Medicare allows payments for Medicare Part B premium monthly? I cannot start my Social Security check because I work and make more than Social Security allows without having to pay a penalty because I am not at my full retirement age (FRA).

Jackie:

You are correct that Americans are paying their Medicare premiums monthly by having the premium taken from their Social Security check. Social Security will automatically take the Medicare premiums from a person's Social Security check. Social Security will send a letter informing the Medicare beneficiary that Social Security is deducting the monthly Medicare Part B premiums from your Social Security check.

GOOGLE "Medicare Easy Pay" to pay your Medicare premiums monthly from your checking account or visit www.medicare.gov and you can research topics such as how to download and properly set up Medicare Easy Pay.

Not computer or internet "smart" to research options on "GOOGLE", then get help from a family member or friend that has access to a computer and ask them to assist you in downloading the Medicare Easy Pay form.

It may take about 6-8 weeks to have the "Medicare Easy Pay" form processed. You should make sure that you keep up with your monthly premiums, so your Medicare Parts A and B are not terminated. A simple way to pay a monthly premium or your Toni Says® readers.

complete Medicare premium bill by credit card until the Medicare Easy Pay form is activated is by visiting www.Medicare. com and create a Medicare account.

When creating a Medicare account, you must have applied for Medicare and have your Medicare number to open your account. On your Medicare account is your Medicare information such as:

- What Medicare Part D prescription drug plan or Medicare Advantage plan you are enrolled in.
- What your Medicare Part A and B enrollment dates are.
- What you can view on your "Medicare. gov" account is paying your Medicare premium, Medicare claims, print your Medicare card and much more.

If one does not stay current with their Medicare premiums, then the Medicare Beneficiary might lose their benefits and may be charged a penalty when they re-enroll. When someone does not have the required 40 working quarters to qualify for Medicare or are married with a spouse that does have the 40 quarters, then they may also have to pay a premium for Part A which is expensive.

Medicare Part D prescription drug premiums are not available via the Medicare site but are managed by the Medicare Part D prescription drug company. One can pay their Medicare prescription drug premium either directly to the prescription drug company by check or credit card. Once one begins receiving their Social Security check, then both Medicare Part B and Part D prescription drug premiums can be taken from their Social Security check.







Californians Are Having Problems Paying Medical Bills

California Health Care Foundation Special Release

NORTHERN CA (MPG) - The rising cost of health care continues to be one of California's most urgent issues, with one in four Californians saying they have struggled to pay at least one medical bill in the past 12 months, up from 20% last year and 49% saying they have postponed care due to cost, according to a newly released statewide survey conducted by the California Health Care Foundation and NORC at the University of Chicago. Of those who postponed care, the survey finds, 47% report their health condition worsened as a result, up from 41% last year.

More than eight in 10 Californians say it is "extremely" or "very" important for the California governor and legislature to work on "making health care more affordable" in the coming year, a level of support higher than several other noteworthy issues, from improving public education and combating climate change to addressing racial inequality.

The 2022 CHCF California Health Policy Survey was conducted September 27 through November 17, 2021, among a random representative sample of 1,681 adults age 18 or older living in California. The annual poll captures Californians' views on health care affordability, housing and homelessness, experiences with health care, and COVID-19.

Although it was conducted before the Omicron surge, this year's survey finds COVID-19 continues to be a major concern for Californians, with 56% saying their health has been negatively impacted by the stress and anxiety caused by the pandemic. One in ten Californians says the pandemic has worsened their chronic health conditions.

Topping the list of Californians' health care

priorities is making sure state and county public health departments have the resources they need to respond to emergencies (51% said this was "extremely" important; 34% said "very" important). This was followed by ensuring there are enough doctors, nurses, and other health providers across California (48% "extremely;" 39% "very"), providing all Californians with access to health insurance coverage (48% "extremely;" 32% "very"), and making sure people

with mental health problems get the treatment they need (47%) "extremely;" 36% "very").

"The latest numbers show that the high cost of health care and the high cost of housing are both taking a toll on the health of Californians," says Kristof Stremikis, director of Market Analysis and Insight at the California Health Care Foundation. "The rising cost of medical care is causing millions of Californians, especially people with lower incomes and communities of

color to postpone care and experience worse health outcomes as a result. Californians are clear they want this problem to be addressed."

While cost issues are a rising concern for all Californians, they have become particularly serious for lower-income households: 43% of Californians with lower incomes report having problems paying for at least one medical bill, an increase from 32% compared to last year. More than six in 10 Californians overall worry about unexpected

medical bills (63%) and out-ofpocket health care costs (60%), and half of Californians are worried about affording monthly health insurance premiums (51%) and prescription drugs (49%). By comparison, 52% of Californians said they were worried about gas costs and 50% worry about the cost of their rent or mortgage.

Nearly one in five Californians (17%) who report trying to make an appointment for physical health care say it was "very" or "somewhat" difficult to find a provider who took their insurance. Latinx Californians (21%) are twice as likely as White Californians (11%) to report difficulty, and those with lower incomes (30%) are more likely than those with higher incomes (12%) to report that it was difficult to find a physical health care provider who took their insurance.

One in five Californians (19%) say they or someone close to them has experienced a period of homelessness in the past five years. The same proportion (19%) are "very" or "somewhat" worried about experiencing homelessness. Californians also see a connection between affordable housing and health status with 80% of Californians saying lack of affordable housing impacts the physical or mental health of people with low incomes "a lot" or "some."

Nearly six in 10 Californians (59%) believe that the health care system treats people unfairly based on their race or ethnic background: one quarter (26%) "regularly" and a third (33%) "occasionally." Eighty-three percent of Black Californians expressed this belief, a significantly higher percentage than any other race or ethnic group. In addition, Black and Latinx Californians were more likely than White or Asian Californians to report negative experiences by a doctor or other health care provider. *
