Weighing Job Risks

Look no further than your favorite restaurant, your kid's school or your local hospital to see the effect of California's latest bout of infections.

Cases have skyrocketed since the holidays, reaching nearly 7 million people infected since the pandemic began. That means so many workers are calling in sick that many businesses and offices are left understaffed and fellow workers are stretched thin.

Health officials are walking a fine line between keeping essential services and the economy afloat and controlling the spread of the virus. But a labor shortage has noticeably influenced national and state COVID-19 policies — even temporarily allowing for health care employees to continue working despite a positive test as long as they feel no symptoms and wear an N95 respirator. These guidelines have prompted questions about safety and whether public health is being jeopardized.

Since the start of the pandemic, California's top officials have been adamant that the state's COVID-19 response is based on science. But these

policies also have to be flexible, Gov. Gavin Newsom recently told reporters.

"It's called dealing with reality," the governor said in defense of recent health workplace guidelines during his Jan. 10 budget briefing. "The pragmatism — not what you want, but what you need to do at a time of challenge."

Experts note that the virus and the pandemic environment are fast-changing, and policies in response have to adjust quickly.

But labor needs and politics aside, when it comes to returning safely to work, what are experts and research telling us about omicron? When is it safe for an infected employee to return to work and how dangerous is it to shorten that period? What if you have no symptoms? And what should your employer be doing to keep you and your coworkers safe? Here's what you need to know.

A red flag with omicron is that early research suggests that the incubation period — the time between when one becomes infected and when one starts to show symptoms — is shorter with this variant — about three days, compared to the four to five days of earlier strains.

Usually, the day before symptoms

start and the day symptoms appear are when people are the most infectious, said Sanghyuk Shin, director of UC Irvine's infectious disease science initiative.

That means people can become highly infectious faster with omicron than with the previous variants. For example, if person A is infectious and A infects B, person B can then infect person C quicker with omicron than they may have with delta.

"This creates epidemic dynamics that are really hard to get in front of," said Andrew Noymer, epidemiologist and professor of public health at UC Irvine. "Because it's so rapid."

Here is how fast omicron is moving: It was first identified in late November; in the week ending on Dec. 18, the omicron variant was responsible for about 38% of the cases in the U.S., according to the CDC's variant monitoring system. By the week ending on Jan. 15, omicron made up 99.5% of cases.

In late December, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention shortened the recommended isolation period for a person who tests positive but no

CTC Allocates \$589 Million for Transportation Improvements

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Transportation

Commission (CTC) allocated \$589 million for projects to repair and improve transportation infrastructure throughout the state. Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, accounts for \$302 million — more than half of the funding.

"This investment follows our 'fix-it-first' commitment to repair California's aging infrastructure, while at the same time increasing transit and active transportation options," said Caltrans Director Toks Omishakin. "These projects will make our transportation system safer and more convenient for all users and create thousands of good-paying jobs in the process."

Among those projects approved was one on State Highway 32 in Chico from Muir Avenue to Highway 99 that will rehabilitate pavement, install signals and lighting, upgrade Transportation Management System (TMS) elements, rehabilitate drainage systems, and upgrade facilities to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. The project was allocated \$3.51 million.

Caltrans also presented the CTC with the draft 2022 State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP) at our meeting. Aimed at preserving the condition of the highway system, the draft 2022 SHOPP accounts for \$17.3 billion in funding over a four-year period and includes projects for safety, restoration, road and bridge preservation, and other highway-related facilities.

The CTC will host a public hearing in February to receive comments on the draft SHOPP. All the comments will be considered in the final version that goes before the CTC for adoption at its March meeting. All 2022 SHOPP projects are available on the Caltrans' Ten-Year Project Book website, ProjectBook.dot.ca.gov

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually split between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that are partially funded by SB 1.

Blocking A Million Cyber Threats Daily

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - What if every person in the United States, about 333,000,000 people had tried to hack into Sacramento County government information systems in 2021?

The reality is that the amount would still be shy by roughly 27 million. Last year, there were a whopping 360 million unauthorized attempts to connect to Sacramento County information systems, and each of them was successfully blocked by network filters. At the same time, email filters were successfully blocking 145 million malicious email messages.

In 2021, Sacramento County Successfully Blocked Cyber Threats:

360,000,000 Unauthorized Network Attempts
145,000,000 Malicious Email Message Attempts

Network and email filters are just two of the ways Sacramento County's Department of Technology (DTech) is working vigorously to protect the confidentiality, integrity and accessibility of the County's information systems and the data within them.

Some other ways:

Every day, cybercriminals try to trick Sacramento County employees into clicking malicious links. Thanks to DTech's ongoing Security Awareness training required for the entire workforce, employees are becoming more sophisticated about these persistent "phishing" attempts. In the fourth quarter of 2021, employee and contractor

phishing susceptibility was only 6.6 percent, compared to 17.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2020, and compared to the overall government susceptibility rate of 26 percent.

To prevent cybercriminal takeovers of County accounts, DTech has implemented two-factor authentication, which requires users to verify their sign-in to County systems, webmail, and other external-facing web services.

Whenever a vulnerability is discovered in systems or workstations, DTech takes quick and thorough action to implement a software patch. Today, 99 percent of critical and important security patching is being completed within 30 days.

"The fact is, we are so focused on cybersecurity that most of our 14,000+

Sacramento County employees have no idea of the millions of malicious attacks we are blocking and intercepting on our network and email systems every single day. It is now our reality that all U.S. government agencies, big or small, are a target for cybercriminals from all over the globe. We make every effort to be one step ahead of the millions who try to break in," said, CIO and DTech Director Rami Zakaria.

Each workday, County workforce members go about their tasks knowing that although there is an army of cybercriminals constantly seeking to steal County data or disrupt operations, only a very tiny fraction of these attempts will succeed. DTech's mission is to keep shrinking that tiny fraction. ★

RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - Elkhorn Outdoor Sports is a surprising sports shop and U-Haul rental business. Random combination? I thought so too. But it works for them. Elkhorn Outdoor Sports is a fisherman's candy store and has been there since 2016. It is located at 6745 20th street, Rio Linda, Calif. Owned by Tim Boggs, this store is so tucked away that there is a big sign on the corner of the block directing your attention towards them.

Once you turn onto 20th Street, you will find it on your right hand side. It looks like a house, and it's kind of hidden by the brush, but you can look for the U-Haul trucks. When you go inside, it is surprisingly big! There are hooks and lures of all sizes. In addition, they have the equipment for building your own lures, if that's what your fishing trick is.

longer has symptoms from 10 days to five. Those who were exposed but haven't tested positive should also quarantine for five days, the agency said.

The CDC said the change was motivated by growing data showing that much of the transmission was occurring earlier "generally in the one to two days prior to onset of symptoms and the two to three days after."

But this move came with quite a bit of pushback and criticism from some in the public health and medical communities who deemed it too lax, especially because the federal rules don't require a negative test to leave isolation. California updated its guidance to align with the CDC's, but the state does ask that people remain isolated until they receive a negative test.

Some research has shown that people can still be contagious after five days of testing positive. A small study from Harvard, for example, took a look at infected NBA players and found that 25% of players infected with omicron were still infectious on day six after their first positive test and 13% were still contagious on day seven. The study has yet to be peer-reviewed.

"Having people who might still be infectious return to work, could of course lead to more people getting infected and additional workers being forced to isolate," Shin said.

While recommendations about isolation and quarantine can be hard to keep up with, the bottom line is that people should test negative before returning to work and gathering with others, regardless of symptoms, Noymer said.

Asymptomatic transmission does occur and it's a big reason why the pandemic has been so difficult to control.

"We can tell everyone who feels sick to stay home, but not everyone feels sick," said Shin.

Experts say the best public health practice is for anyone who tests positive to isolate, regardless of how they feel.

Studies - albeit, many conducted pre-omicron - have shown that a large percentage of COVID-positive people show no symptoms. Research published in December reviewed 95 studies consisting of about 30 million people

worldwide. Of those who tested positive, 40% had no symptoms at the time of testing. "The high percentage of asymptomatic infections highlights the potential transmission risk of asymptomatic infections in communities," the research authors concluded.

Meanwhile, separate studies show that the viral loads of asymptomatic patients were comparable to those who had symptoms.

Trying to calculate the odds that you'll contract COVID at work is not really possible because there are so many factors to consider, experts say.

Research has shown that wearing masks indoors can substantially cut transmission, and with omicron, a high-quality mask is more important than ever. N95 masks are the gold standard, especially with a variant as contagious as omicron, Noymer said. Cloth masks are much less effective unless they have multiple layers and a nose wire. And it's essential for masks to fit snugly around the mouth, nose and chin.

"A well-fitting N95 mask should do a pretty good job. But nothing is guaranteed," he said. "Surgical masks do something, but they're not great...and some masks are just pure theater."

N95 masks can filter about 95% of particles in the air, according to the CDC. Experts at UC Davis say it is OK to reuse an N95 mask, but they recommend waiting one to two days between uses so that viral particles can die off.

How crowded a room is also plays a big role. If you're in a busy kitchen or warehouse without many windows, the risk will be greater, Shin said.

A molecular PCR test is the most sensitive and most likely to capture an infection, but rapid antigen tests are effective tools too, experts say.

Antigen tests are often used for routine screening of people who are not sick. If being used as a precaution for an in-person gathering, for example, Shin says a repeat test could help rule out a false negative - a test the day before and a test the day of an event.

However, given the shortage of rapid tests, this could seem like a luxury. People with symptoms looking to confirm whether they're infected or not, ideally would seek a PCR test, Shin said. But with a backlog in

testing, results are sometimes taking more than three days.

Because of the heightened demand for testing, some California counties have come out with new recommendations. Some have urged residents to only get tested if they have symptoms and others have asked people to first seek tests from their health care provider rather than county-run testing sites because they are overwhelmed.

In an ideal world with no supply shortages, workers who come in contact with large numbers of people, such as those who work in customer service or in grocery stores, would be able to access testing easily and test repeatedly and routinely, experts say.

That said, routine testing of essential workers should go hand-in-hand with adequate paid sick leave, Shin said. "I've definitely known people who have said they don't want to get tested because they don't know what to do if they test positive. They can't not go to work, they need to pay rent."

California's COVID sick leave expired in September and legislators and labor unions are negotiating how to reinstate it.

Shin said there is room for more education of workers on how the virus spreads. For example, if someone is in an office space alone, they might think it is safe to take their mask off, but if that same space is occupied by others throughout the day, then people should keep their masks on because COVID-19 is airborne and infectious respiratory particles can remain in the air for up to three hours.

Improving ventilation helps, too.

"Opening windows seems like a no-brainer, but opening windows reduces risk," Shin said.

Workplaces should also consider investing in high grade filtration systems or high efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filters, experts say. According to the Environmental Protection Agency, filters need to be able to remove small air particles in the size range of 0.1 to 1 microns to help remove viruses.

Can't Afford to Pay My Medicare Premium Bill ... What Can I Do?

Toni: My Medicare begins March 1st and I have received my first bill. This bill is for 4 months from March 1st to June 30th. I thought Medicare was monthly. If I pay this amount, then I

cannot pay my rent for March. This bill for Medicare is due February 25th and I was wondering if Medicare allows payments for Medicare Part B premium monthly? I cannot start my Social Security check because I work and make more than Social Security allows without having to pay a penalty because I am not at my full retirement age (FRA).

Jackie:

You are correct that Americans are paying their Medicare premiums monthly by having the premium taken from their Social Security check. Social Security will automatically take the Medicare premiums from a person's Social Security check. Social Security will send a letter informing the Medicare beneficiary that Social Security is deducting the monthly Medicare Part B premiums from your Social Security check.

GOOGLE "Medicare Easy Pay" to pay your Medicare premiums monthly from your checking account or visit www.medicare.gov and you can research topics such as how to download and properly set up Medicare Easy Pay.

Not computer or internet "smart" to research options on "GOOGLE", then get help from a family member or friend that has access to a computer and ask them to assist you in downloading the Medicare Easy Pay form.

It may take about 6-8 weeks to have the "Medicare Easy Pay" form processed. You should make sure that you keep up with your monthly premiums, so your Medicare Parts A and B are not terminated. A simple way to pay a monthly premium or your

complete Medicare premium bill by credit card until the Medicare Easy Pay form is activated is by visiting www.Medicare.com and create a Medicare account.

When creating a Medicare account, you must have applied for Medicare and have your Medicare number to open your account. On your Medicare account is your Medicare information such as:

- What Medicare Part D prescription drug plan or Medicare Advantage plan you are enrolled in.
- What your Medicare Part A and B enrollment dates are.
- What you can view on your "Medicare.gov" account is paying your Medicare premium, Medicare claims, print your Medicare card and much more.

If one does not stay current with their Medicare premiums, then the Medicare Beneficiary might lose their benefits and may be charged a penalty when they re-enroll. When someone does not have the required 40 working quarters to qualify for Medicare or are married with a spouse that does have the 40 quarters, then they may also have to pay a premium for Part A which is expensive.

Medicare Part D prescription drug premiums are not available via the Medicare site but are managed by the Medicare Part D prescription drug company. One can pay their Medicare prescription drug premium either directly to the prescription drug company by check or credit card. Once one begins receiving their Social Security check, then both Medicare Part B and Part D prescription drug premiums can be taken from their Social Security check.

Shotspotter Activation and Arrest on Lang Avenue


- On January 18, 2022, at 7:45 a.m. there was a 5 round ShotSpotter activation within south Sacramento County. Deputies were dispatched 12 seconds later. The first deputy arrived at the activation location and contacted the suspect less than five minutes later. While deputies were detaining the suspect, the communications center received its first call from a resident stating they heard gunshots.

When deputies arrived at the dispatched address, they observed an adult male subject running from them and attempting to dispose of a firearm. Dominic Alexander King (40) of Sacramento, who is on formal probation

for felon in possession of a firearm, was arrested for multiple felonies and misdemeanors stemming from the ShotSpotter activation. A probation search of King revealed possession of methamphetamine.

King was transported to the Main Jail on eight felony and two misdemeanor counts which include possession of firearm by felon, carrying loaded firearm and discharge of a firearm in a grossly negligent manner. He is being held on \$50,000 bail.

It is unclear who/what the target of the shooting may have been so the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office is asking anyone who may have witnessed or have knowledge of the incident to please contact the Sheriff's Office at (916) 874-5115 or Sacramento Valley Crime Stoppers at (916) 443-HELP. ★



Newsom’s Vacillation on Vaccinations, Phase 2

Is California – and its politicians – ready for VAX War II?

More pointedly, is Gov. Gavin Newsom ready?

Three years ago, the Capitol was wracked by one of the most heated conflicts in its history – legislation to make it more difficult for parents to exempt their children from mandatory vaccinations if they attended public schools. A bill sought to close a loophole that allowed doctors to approve exemptions without specifying reasons, leading to doctor-shopping by anti-vaccination parents.

Hundreds of opponents besieged the Capitol, claiming that the legislation would violate parental rights and require vaccines that could trigger autism or other adverse reactions. The measure’s author, Sacramento Sen. Richard Pan, and other backers were accosted and threatened and on the final night of the legislative session, someone in the Senate gallery threw a cup of what authorities said “appeared to be blood” onto the Senate floor.

Eventually, the bill passed and was signed by Newsom in his first year as governor, but he engaged in some bizarre political theater before finally acceding.

As the bill was moving

through the Legislature, Newsom suddenly demanded a number of changes that weakened its provisions. “I’m a parent,” Newsom said at one point. “I don’t want someone that the governor of California appointed to make a decision for my family.”

After two weeks of private negotiations, he finally accepted a revised version, telling a reporter, “All those amendments, if they’re made, stamp of approval.”

Two-plus months later, however, Newsom did another 180-degree pivot, demanding more changes. Eventually, a final compromise was reached, but Newsom had violated one of the Capitol’s unwritten rules of conduct: once you make a deal, you don’t renege. It drove a wedge between the new governor and lawmakers that affected other issues.

The possibility of renewing superheated vaccination warfare arose this week when Pan, a physician, introduced legislation to close what he regards as a huge loophole in Newsom’s promise to have all school children vaccinated against COVID-19 when vaccines are available for youngsters.

“We have to be willing to take a stand,” Pan said. “We need to be able to respond to this pandemic and future pandemics, but there is this asymmetrical warfare going on right now, and we’re seeing the anti-vaccine movement trafficking in misinformation, threats, and violence.”

Once again, Newsom’s position is uncertain.

When he announced the school vaccination mandate in October, Newsom

boasted that California was the first state to impose such a requirement

“The state already requires that students are vaccinated against viruses that cause measles, mumps, and rubella (so) there’s no reason why we wouldn’t do the same for COVID-19,” Newsom said. “Today’s measure, just like our first-in-the-nation school masking and staff vaccination requirements, is about protecting our children and school staff, and keeping them in the classroom.”

That would seem to be a strong endorsement of mandatory vaccinations. However, Newsom subsequently watered it down, at least verbally, by repeatedly reminding parents that they could opt out under state law’s “personal belief” exemption. Pan’s new bill would eliminate that exemption, leaving only precise medical conditions as a way to avoid vaccination.

Newsom’s new fence-straddling is not going unnoticed.

“He’s trying to be comforting and non-confrontational, but it sends a message that if you don’t want to get the vaccine, don’t get it,” Catherine Flores Martin, executive director of the California Immunization Coalition, told CaliforniaHealthline.

“Gov. Newsom struggles with this – he’s trying to have it both ways.”

Yes, he is.

Social Security Matters

Will I Have Any Social Security Benefits?

Dear Rusty: I’m 60 years of age and wonder if I will have any Social Security retirement benefits. After all, I did purchase them.

Signed: Uncertain

Dear Uncertain: Your eligibility for Social Security benefits depends upon your lifetime earnings history from work, from which Social Security FICA taxes were withheld. If you have worked, contributed to SS while working, and have earned at least 40 “quarters” of credit, you will be entitled to Social Security benefits. You can earn up to four credits each year by earning a specific amount of money, which means you must have worked for about 10 years contributing to Social Security in order to be eligible for Social Security benefits. For 2022, you will get 4 credits if you earn at least \$6040 (the amount needed per credit varies by year). The amount of benefit you will get depends upon your average monthly earnings (adjusted for inflation) over the highest-earning 35 years of your lifetime. The higher your annual

earnings (from which FICA tax was withheld), the more your SS benefit will be. But you must have worked, earned and contributed to SS for at least 35 years to get your maximum benefit. SS always uses 35 years of earnings to compute your benefit and if you have fewer, they will put \$0 earnings in some years to make it 35. They will use the monthly average of those 35 years to determine your primary benefit (known as your “Primary Insurance Amount” or “PIA” which is what you get at your full retirement age (FRA)).

You cannot collect your personal SS retirement benefit until you are at least 62 years old, but if you claim at that age your benefit will be permanently reduced by 30%. You can only get your full SS benefit by waiting until your full retirement age (age 67 for you) to claim your Social Security. Claiming any earlier means a smaller benefit, but you can also delay longer and earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) up to age 70, when your maximum benefit would be 24% more than it would be at your FRA. You have an 8 year window to claim your Social Security, and when you claim within that window determines how much of your primary SS benefit you will get.

If you claim before your FRA and you continue to work, Social Security places a limit on how much you can earn before they take away some of your benefits. For example,

someone who claims at age 63 in 2022 would have an annual earnings limit of \$19,560, and if that were exceeded SS would take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the limit (a monthly limit may be imposed if you claim mid-year). The earnings limit applies until FRA is reached, after which there is no longer a limit to how much can be earned.

The easiest way to determine your eligibility for Social Security benefits and how much that benefit would be at different ages is to obtain a Statement of Estimated Benefits from the Social Security Administration. You can request that by calling SS at 1.800.772.1213, but you can also get it yourself by creating your personal “my Social Security” online account at www.ssa.gov/myaccount. Once you have created your personal online account you can see your lifetime record of earnings and download your Statement of Estimated Benefits to understand whether you are entitled to Social Security benefits and, if so, how much your benefit will be if claimed at various ages.

Utilities Join to Support Regional Electric Vehicle Charging Network

SACRAMENTO CA (MPG) - During a virtual event with Secretary of Energy Jennifer M. Granholm, Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo, the California Electric Transportation Coalition and California utilities announced a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to support a California Regional Charging Network. The MOU encourages cooperation and leadership amongst the California utilities to build out a regional network of chargers in support of California’s ambitious goals to electrify the transportation sectors in California.

The MOU was signed by the Los Angeles Department of Water & Power (LADWP), Northern California Power Agency (NCPA), Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD), San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) and Southern California Edison (SCE), with additional utilities planning to join soon.

The MOU encourages cooperation and leadership in support of electric cars and trucks traveling along key corridors in California and beyond to reduce pollution, protect public health, advance equity, and support access to electric cars and trucks for all Californians.

“We’re proud to support a partnership that aims to maximize EV infrastructure throughout the state,” said Paul Lau, CEO, and general manager of SMUD. “We recognize that achieving the state’s emission reduction goals will take a collective effort and we’re happy to be aligned with utilities and municipalities that support that effort. Creating clean travel corridors throughout the state benefits everyone, especially our disadvantaged residents who disproportionately live near these corridors. We hope that this MOU will support the purchase and use of EVs while bolstering the confidence of drivers who move about our state.”

“Providing the infrastructure needed to support widespread electric vehicle adoption is critical to breaking down one of the biggest barriers to EV adoption,” said Pedro J. Pizarro, president and CEO of Edison International, parent company of Southern California Edison. “Edison is committed to doing our part to ensure electrification of the transportation sector is truly equitable.”

The California utilities will be working together to identify key locations for

charging infrastructure in support of regional travel across the state, identify those locations that minimize grid impacts and customer costs, and define charging infrastructure characteristics that lead to more user-friendly car and truck charging.

“No single utility on its own can create a regional charging network to eliminate range anxiety,” said SDG&E CEO Caroline Winn. “But by working together within a framework of shared values, we can make a bigger collective impact to benefit all Californians and advance our state’s global leadership in clean transportation.”

This MOU and collaboration grew from the ongoing commitment in California to zero-emission mobility and goods movement, recently highlighted by Governor Newsom in Executive Order N-79-20. Under the order, 100 percent of sales of new cars and drayage trucks are to be zero-emission by 2035 and all on-road cars and trucks are to be zero-emissions by 2045. Although California has built out its charging infrastructure at a commendable rate, much more is needed to meet the state’s zero-emission car and truck goals, and ensure that all Californians have access to safe, clean, and affordable electricity fuel.

“At LADWP, we recognize the tremendous benefits to transitioning California’s vehicle fleet to electricity fuel, and we are committed to doing our part to ensure this transition is truly equitable. The opportunities to benefit from this transition apply to all Californians whether or not they own or operate an electric vehicle, these kinds of collaborations help improve and ensure those benefits,” said Reiko Kerr, LADWP senior assistant general manager, Power System Engineering and Technical Services.

The MOU specifically calls out the need to support and engage with local and diverse communities along the regional corridors. The MOU emphasizes equity and community inclusion, as part of the participating utilities core values.

“The California utilities have led the nation on clean, renewable, electricity and support for electrification. I look forward to this collaborative effort and to seeing it expand with partnerships and collaboration across the United States that benefit all EV drivers by ensuring they can travel freely within and outside the state,” said Eileen Tutt, executive director, California Electric Transportation Coalition. ★

The Spring 2022 FBI Citizens Academy class will be the first to be hosted in multiple locations including Bakersfield, Chico, Fresno, Ripon, and Roseville, enabling more people the opportunity to participate.

“With more than 87,000 square miles to cover, our territory is vast. Prior classes were hosted in a single location in Fresno or Roseville, limiting our ability to connect with many of the communities we serve,” said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. “This new concept enables us to open the FBI Citizens Academy experience to more civic, business, and community leaders from our region. This new, hybrid experience will directly connect with many communities while offering both a regional and location-specific perspective regarding the FBI’s role in federal law enforcement.”

Classes offer in-depth exploration of the FBI’s investigative priorities including terrorism, counterintelligence, civil rights, cybercrime, public corruption, and violent crime. The scheduled sessions hosted one evening a week for eight weeks are complemented by an optional day of in-person demonstrations by specialty teams and a firing range experience offering gun safety and an appreciation for the weapons every agent must have demonstrated proficiency with.

FBI Citizens Academy graduates have a better understanding about how the FBI Sacramento Field Office fulfills its mission within the region and how it partners with law enforcement and the community to prevent violence and investigate crime. All graduates are encouraged to join the local FBI Citizens Academy Alumni Association Chapter to continue their education and participate in crime prevention and youth education efforts that benefit their communities.
