

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Take Action for Mental Health, a new campaign focused on improving the mental health and wellness of all Californians was launched December 15, 2021. Created to build off progress made by previous campaigns and developed with extensive community feedback, the campaign encourages Californians to take steps to check in, learn more, and get support for themselves and people they

Take Action for Mental Health builds on established approaches and provides resources to equip all Californians to support their own mental health and the mental health of people they care about.

Take Action for Mental Health is the result of considerable indepth research, focus groups, and stakeholder input. It incorporates input from diverse populations and

subject matter experts. The campaign available at launch include a Take focuses on three key actions—check in, learn more, and get support; Check in: Helps people recognize the signs and symptoms of mental health challenges and identify when to seek help or start a conversation with someone they care about; Learn more: Supports understanding of the issues or challenges associated with mental health concerns and identifies self-care and support options available; Get support: Connects people with tools and resources to help at any point along the mental health spectrum, from needing a mental health day off to securing professional help and everything in between.

The new campaign website, resources, and updated social media channels are going live today with plans to continue adding additional resources, partnerships, events, and programs throughout 2022 and Action Pledge, and overview of signs and symptoms, mental health selfcare tips, and mental health guides.

Elverta School District Refinances **Bonds, Saves Taxpayers** Nearly \$300K

ELVERTA, CA (MPG) - This November, the Elverta School District refinanced \$631,000 in general obligation bonds which will save District property owners \$289,484 in property taxes. The District took advantage of very low interest rates due to the coronavirus pandemic and overall economic uncertainty to refinance its Election of 2002, Series 2013 General Obligation

In November 2002 more than 58% of District voters approved Measure L, which authorized the sale of up to \$10.5 million of general obligation bonds to renovate schools, upgrade facilities, equipment, and technology, and make safety and health improvements. In December 2013, the District sold its second series of bonds under the measure for \$631,298 to continue projects started in 2003. Interest rates on the 2013 bonds ranged between 5.40% and 6.25%. The average rate on the new bonds is 3.07%, a difference that will save property taxpayers \$289,484 without extending the original term of the borrowing.

Superintendent Mike Wells stated, "With interest rates near historic lows, we felt it was the right thing to do to save our community money. Part of my job and that of the management team is to keep an eye on our debt obligations and seek opportunities to save money, both for the District and our taxpayers."

The refinancing of the bonds was authorized by the Board of Trustees on October 19th. "We know that our community supports our schools, and in turn we wanted to give back to our community by saving taxpayer dollars," said Ray Lippincott, Jr., Board President.

Property owners in the District will see a reduced property tax rate on future tax bills.

Firefighting is Lifesaving

Sac Region's Fire Trove Hearkens Back to 1850s

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Fire Museum has been in West Sacramento for the last three years. Located at 3650 Industrial Blvd., the items in this museum hold firefighting history from the Sacramento Valley-from Fairfield, Dixon, Davis, Yuba City, Citrus Heights, Sacramento, Auburn and other parts of the valley. Pioneer Mutual Hook and Ladder Society was established in 1990 with the intent of building this museum in honor of the Mutual Hook and Ladder Company, which was the first organized Sacramento Fire Company and was formed in 1850.

Their Mission Statements reads, "The Pioneer Mutual

includes trumpets that were used for the Fire Chief to shout orders on the ground at the scene of a fire. There are leather buckets that were used to carry water by hand. There are old metal buckets that eventually replaced the leather ones. There is also the evolution of fire extinguishers.

Some other equipment

Originally for fire extinguishers, there were Carbon Tetrachloride Grenades for putting out small fires. These were a small, colored, glass ball or bulb, about the size of a large orange, that were filled with a non-flammable Carbon Tet. They were generally resting in a wire hoop and attached to the wall, near the door. When a fire broke out, the grenade was thrown at the base of the fire, the glass would break, and the Carbon Tet would evaporate very quickly and extinguish the fire. These were eventually found to have toxic vapors and have been banned since the 1940's.

There are many types of extinguishers, hydrants, nozzles, hoses, lights, hooks, tools, cables, gas masks, horns, hats, badges, and bells. It's really quite amazing... and impressive that they have been able to collect these items. They even have a "Life Net". A Life Net is that big round device that fire fighters would hold so that people could jump out of high-rise fires. It was invented by a civil war veteran, named Thomas F. Bowder. Originally he called it "Bowder Life Saving Machine". The life net became obsolete in the

Within the museum there are areas that are set up to look like the typical firefighter's dorm as well as the command center. Do you remember when there used to be those red and white "Fire boxes" around town that would activate a fire alarm, dispatching the Fire Department? Well, this museum not only includes those fire boxes, but it includes Sacramento's emergency system... in working order.

This actual system was used until the 1990s. It is amazing, and not at all what I would expect. Though I don't know what I would have expected, I can promise you that it wasn't this! Each section has bells at the top and each section was from a specific area of town. When a handle was pulled in a fire box an alarm would go off in that section of the emergency system, which would send a message on a tickertape. They would take that information and go to a giant "Rolodex" where they would look up the address of the alarm location. The alarm system is the only one that they know of on the West Coast.

The museum costs \$10 for adults with discounts for Seniors and \$5 for kids 12 and under. You can also rent the museum to hold a party or other gathering. It was recently rented for a Memorial with about 300 people that attended. They have memberships of different levels and accept donations to support the cost of maintaining the museum. Elverta Mobile Home Fire under Investigation

ELVERTA, CA (MPG) - At about 11:40 pm, Metro Fire responded to a call to Tims Lane in Elverta. They arrived to find a double wide mobile home, located towards the back of the property, completely engulfed in flames. With no fire hydrants nearby, Metro Fire used multiple water trucks, called Tenders, to bring in water.

Each truck holds about 3000 gallons of water. The Fire Department shuffled the multiple trucks, as they were using one (or more), the others would go to the closest

fire hydrant and fill back up. Even with this method, Metro Fire was able to maintain the fire to only that one structure.

Neighbors feared that someone might be inside the mobile home, but according to Metro Fire Public Information Officer, Parker Wilbourn, firefighters did not find anyone, nor have they found any signs that someone was inside. Additionally, no firefighters were injured during this call.

The cause of the fire is under investigation. An investigation of this type generally takes up to a month. The mobile home was a complete loss.

Senator Nielsen Urges Caution on Projected \$31 Billion State Surplus

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Jim Nielsen, R-Red Bluff, issued the following statement in response to the Legislative Analyst's Office report, The 2022-23 Budget: California's Fiscal Outlook, which projects a \$31 billion surplus.

"A \$31 billion surplus is not an invitation to build future spending obligations.

"Legislative Democrats used up their bag of tricks last year to avoid triggering the Gann Limit, which restricts how fast state spending can grow.

"The Gann Limit, which was passed on the heels of Prop. 13, expressed the wisdom of voters. The surplus either needs to go back to taxpayers or be used for essential functions, like education, infrastructure and paying down debt.

"As the vice chair of the Senate Budget and Fiscal Review Committee, I urge The Legislature and the governor to proceed with caution."

I Have VA Coverage; Should I Get Medicare Part B?

Dear Rusty: I am a 74 year old veteran enrolled with the VA. I have never had Medicare Part B. Should I? My only source of income is Social Security. Signed: Retired Veteran

Dear Retired Veteran: First, thank you for your service to our country. Like you, I use the VA for certain healthcare needs but, unlike you, I am also to have both is a personal but I'll give you some things to consider:

If you are 100% satisfied with your VA coverage, and if that coverage is conveniently available to you, and if the VA provides all the health care you will ever need wherever you happen to be, then enrolling in Medicare Part B may not be needed in your personal situation. For me, the nearest full service VA facility is about 40 miles away, while just about every imaginable private healthcare service is nearby. Thus, for convenience rea-B so I can use any doctor a Late Enrollment Penalty tion.org.

I want within just a few miles of my home. I also travel a fair amount, and I like the convenience and flexibility of using any healthcare provider I happen to be near, without worrying about finding a VA facility or VA-affiliated private provider. So, for me, it all comes down to convenience and flexibility to use any healthcare provider I want. I use my VA coverage when it's convenient for me, but otherwise use non-VA providers. But your needs may be different.

Your choice may especially be different since your only source of income is Social Security. There is a premium associated with Medicare Part B (\$170.10 per month for 2022) which would be taken from your enrolled in Medicare Part Social Security payment, B. The decision on whether thus reducing it. That may create a financial issue for choice only you can make, you, which is obviously an important consideration when deciding if you should also enroll in Part B to supplement your VA coverage. But there's yet another concern if you

enroll in Part B now. relied solely on the VA for your healthcare needs since turning 65, you'll be subject to a Late Enrollment Penalty if you enroll in Part B now, and that penalty may make Part B even more unaffordable for you. Your VA health care coverage isn't considered a "creditable" alternative to

or medical service provider of 10% additional premium will be assessed for each full year you went without Part B coverage. For example, instead of the standard Part B premium of \$170.10, your premium with the late enrollment penalty could be about \$323 per month. And, unfortunately, that penalty lasts for as long as you are enrolled in Part B and will increase along with any increases to the Part B premium as time passes.

> For your awareness, if Social Security is your only source of income, you may be eligible for your state's Medicare Savings Program which can assist you with paying Medicare premiums and copayments. If your income falls below the required thresholds you may be eligible for the Medicare Savings Program as described at this website: www.benefits.gov/ benefit/4396.

Big Utilities Winning Battle Over Solar Power

The emails arrived just minutes apart on Monday.

The first, from a group called Affordable Clean Energy for All, proclaimed "CPUC Takes Steps to Fix the Unfair Customer Cost Shift Created by 25-Year-Old Rooftop Solar Program."

The second, from a Environment California Research & Policy Center, countered with "California Public Utility Commission fails Californians by gutting bedrock solar program."

Both were reacting to **Public Utilities Commission** draft ruling that would reduce the payments from utilities to owners of rooftop solar power systems when they feed excess juice back into the grid. It would also require those owners to pay a monthly fee for using

the grid. The release capped months of political jousting between the state's major utilities, backed by their employees' unions, and the solar power industry, which has allies among environmental groups, over how solar energy will develop as the state attempts to drastically reduce its carbon footprint. Will it emphasize individual solar improvements.

installations controlled by panel farms controlled by utilities and their suppliers?

The big utilities – Pacific Gas and Electric, Southern California Edison and Sempra Energy - are pushing the policy change. They argue that since rooftop solar arrays are mostly owned by upper-income Californians, the current policy, in effect, gives them a subsidy, of as much as \$3.4 billion a year, from the pockets of less affluent ratepayers. They also contend that since owners of solar panels use the grid, they should pay something to maintain it, hence the \$57 monthly fee.

The companies that rival organization, the install personal solar systems counter that the new policy proposal would make them less affordable to middle- and low-income homeowners. They and their environmental allies also contend that changrelease of a California ing the rules would have the overall effect of reducing solar generation and thus hamstring California's efforts to wean itself from carbon-based energy.

Both sides have waged public relations and media campaigns to sell their messages, but so far, with the release of the draft, the utility-led faction is prevailing, which is not surprising given the CPUC's historic slant. While it regulates utilities, supposedly to protect consumers, the commission also has an implicit duty to make sure that power companies are financially healthy enough to attract investors and borrow money for system

Clearly, the utilities consumers or large solar and their unions - see the growth of personal solar systems as a potential threat to their financial future. Reducing that threat, rather than creating more equity, is their true motive for seeking a change of policy. Likewise, while their solar industry rivals also claim equity as their motive, the proposal would make it more difficult to sell rooftop systems, more than a million of which are already operative. So their underly-

> ing motive is also financial. The full CPUC is expected to vote early next year, but the battle is not over and it now shifts to Gov. Gavin Newsom, who appoints its members. He's already nominated a new chairperson, Alice Reynolds, who is now his energy advisor and will take the new position before a final vote on the policy.

> Politically, therefore, it is very clear that the revised solar policy will only be adopted if Newsom wants it to be adopted. Setting aside the major interest groups in the conflict, it involves two sub-factions that have close ties to the governor unions and environmentalists – although the latter are also divided into pro and con camps.

> The full CPUC is likely to adopt the proposed policy change and if there's political fallout, Newsom will feel it as he seeks reelection next year.

DWR Announces State Water Project Allocation

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

Today, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) announced its initial State Water Project (SWP) allocation for 2022 along with several steps to manage the state's water supply in anticipation of a third dry year with reservoirs at or near historic lows.

Given the unprecedented drought conditions, the SWP's initial allocation for December 1 will focus on the health and safety needs for 2022 of the 29 water agencies that contract to receive SWP supplies. DWR has advised these water agencies to expect an initial allocation that prioritizes health and safety water needs and that the SWP will not be planning water deliveries through its typical allocation process until the state has a clearer picture of the hydrologic and reservoir conditions going into the spring.

DWR is focused on prioritizing water supply in four categories: water for health and safety needs and Delta salinity control; water for endangered species; water to reserve in storage; and water for additional supply allocations if the hydrology allows.

"Despite a wet start to the water year, conditions have dried out since that first storm, and we are still planning for a belowaverage water year. That means we need to prepare now for a dry winter and severe drought conditions to continue through 2022," said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "We will be working with our federal partners

and SWP contractors to take a conservative planning approach to balance limited water supplies with the needs of residents, businesses, and the environment."

In addition to limiting the initial allocation to health and safety needs, DWR is making plans to adjust SWP operations this winter and spring. DWR is capturing and storing water when possible, in Lake Oroville and south of the Delta in San Luis Reservoir to increase available supplies for 2022 and will continue to do so throughout the winter. Health and safety demands for the Bay Area and Central and Southern California will be met with water available from the Delta as well as water stored in San Luis Reservoir. Water in Lake Oroville will be reserved to maintain Delta water quality, protect endangered species, and meet senior water right needs. Beyond minimal exports to meet South Bay health and safety needs, water stored in Lake Oroville will be used for south of Delta deliveries only if hydrology conditions improve. DWR plans to conserve as much storage as possible in Oroville in anticipation of a third dry year, and potentially a dry 2023.

Also, today, DWR along with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, submitted a new Temporary Urgency Change Petition (TUCP) to the State Water Resources Control Board. If approved, the petition would allow for the State Water Project and the Central Valley Project to operate under modifications to the water quality and water right permit requirements in the Delta from February through April 2022, should conditions warrant. These modifications may be needed to conserve water in Lake Oroville to ensure minimum health and safety water supplies are available later in the year if dry conditions persist. If significant precipitation materializes in the next few months, standards may be met through natural means and modifications to SWP and CVP operations may not be necessary.

DWR is also delaying the removal of the Emergency Drought Salinity Barrier in the Delta. The rock barrier across West False River was scheduled to be removed by November 30, however drought conditions have persisted and leaving the barrier in place will enable a more efficient drought response in spring 2022 if needed. DWR plans to create a notch in the barrier in January 2022 to allow for fish passage and boat traffic until April 2022.

"It is going to take a multi-pronged approach to successfully respond to these unprecedented drought conditions," said Nemeth.

Each year, DWR provides the initial State Water Project allocation by December 1 based on available water storage and projected water supply demands. Allocations are updated monthly as snowpack and runoff information is assessed, with a final allocation typically determined in May or June.

The lowest initial allocations were 5 percent in 2010 and 2014. Last year, the initial SWP allocation was 10 percent, however due to increasing dry conditions, the final allocation was lowered to 5 percent.







Key Factors To Consider About The Housing Market

Commentary by Tim Pagliara

Author who detailed plight of Fannie Mae, Freddie Mac says government must fill gap for minorities, middle class to access mortgages.

The question: With the mortgage forbearance program winding down and housing inventory hitting a 40-year low, where is the housing market headed amid dynamics of the COVID-19 pandemic?

Shades of 2008? When the U.S. housing market collapsed in the Great Recession in 2008, Congress created the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) to regulate the mortgage industry. The FHFA placed Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac into a conservatorship, which led to Fannie and Freddie sending large payments to the U.S. Treasury.

Expert's take: "This isn't a crisis of oversupply like in 2008," says Tim Pagliara www.capwealthgroup.com, Forbes Books author of Another Big Lie: How The Government Stole Billions From The American Dream Of Home Ownership. And Got Caught! "It is a crisis due to single-family housing units while we have static demand for 1 million-plus new homes every year.

"Because of delays in the recapitalization of Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac of their release from conservatorship, the availability of credit has been constricted. As a result, minority home ownership among Blacks and Hispanics has not kept pace. Black home ownership is at a 50-year low."

Pagliara points out the foreclosure crisis following the '08 housing crash was largely due to the fact that millions of

homeowners were underwater - i.e., their remaining mortgage balance was greater than their shortage. We are short 6.8 million home's value. Real estate and mortgage experts today say homeowners now are generally likely to have more home equity than those in '08.

> But will a large sector of would-be buyers be left out without the government giving Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac more help?

> "Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac need capital so they can serve their mission of providing longterm fixed-interest housing for the underserved and the middle class," Pagliara says. "They are the bedrock of the American middle class, the strongest engines of economic equality this country

has ever invented."

Pagliara's takeaways about the housing market:

Budget constraints are going to force the Biden administration to be creative. "By finishing the recapitalization of Fannie and Freddie and the release of their conservatorship," Pagilara says, "the government can generate over \$50 billion in proceeds, which can be placed in a housing trust to assist communities and first-time homebuyers."

As the Federal Reserve System tapers later this year, Pagilara says economic activity will need to accelerate, especially the housing market. "A strong housing market has a multiplier effect on many things throughout the economy," Pagliara says. "Everything from paint to appliance sales benefit."

Big real estate investors and asset management firms are factors driving up home prices and making home ownership less accessible to average Americans. One result, Pagliara says, is too many renters who should be owning. "If you can rent a home in a neighborhood where people own, you should be able to purchase that home," he says.
