## Saving Calaveras

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The efforts of 30 people recently saved a single bird's life. Early this summer, Fair Oaks-based animal rescue partners Ben Nuckolls and Laura Morin responded to reports of a grounded bald eagle at New Hogan Lake (Calaveras County). The pair searched the lake shore and at nightfall, found the small male. He was near death: scored all over with raptor-fight wounds and unable to fly. His worst injury was a crater that

extended almost the breadth of his skull. After days on the ground, the raptor was being eaten alive by maggots. He was also starving and dehydrated but according to Ben Nuckolls, our national bird still had fighting spirit left. "When I flung the net over him, he resisted," explained Nuckolls. "Laura and I got him into a kennel

and drove 45 miles to Acorn Hills Animal Center (Sutter Creek). The vet, Alison Pillsbury, came in after hours. We saw the fight still in him and that gave us hope."

Nails More  
Bad Guys**

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert has announced the results from the 5th annual "Operation: Hot Spots," a coordinated countywide sting operation aimed at reducing the demand side of human trafficking by targeting sex buyers and sex exploiters.

Community-based organizations from the Sacramento Together Against Human Trafficking coalition voiced the need to crack down on sex buyers who fund and sustain the sex trafficking trade. In response, DA Anne Marie Schubert led the effort to organize this countywide operation, with a commitment from local law enforcement agencies to conduct operations throughout the year to reduce sex trafficking.

The District Attorney's Office created training videos for law enforcement agencies featuring experts on human trafficking victims (adults and juveniles), suspect tactics/manipulations, conducting trafficking investigations, and insights on evidence collection for prosecutions. Education was also provided on our community resources and the services available to victims of human trafficking. Victim advocates are involved in the sting operations to assist with intervention and service referrals for individuals victimized by human traffickers.

In October 2021, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, Sacramento Police Department, Folsom Police Department, Parole, Probation, District Attorney's Office, California Highway Patrol and FBI worked collaboratively to conducted street and hotel operations targeting sex buyers. The operation included law enforcement postings of fake decoy prostitution ads.

The results were:

261 sex buyer responses to fake decoy ads; 22 citations of sex buyers for soliciting for prostitution – court dates are in January 2022; 1 charged with human trafficking of a minor; 1 charged with pandering; 2 opened investigations into pimping and pandering; 2 arrests for carrying a loaded firearm registered to another.

Those convicted of soliciting another for the purpose of buying sex or agreeing to engage in an act of buying a person to engage in an act of prostitution, face a

## Local Author Releases Book "101 Pat-Downs"

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Sacramentan and CSU Sacramento faculty member Shawna Malvini Redden has released *101 Pat-Downs: An Undercover Look at Airport Security and the TSA*, just ahead of the agency's 20-year anniversary. Part confessional, part investigative research and part light-hearted social commentary, *101 Pat-Downs* takes readers behind the scenes as Malvini Redden explores airport security interactions and offers solutions to what has become the most stressful part of modern-day travel.

Shawna Malvini Redden, an award-winning author and professor who specializes in organizational communication research, teaching and consulting, interviewed more than 200 passengers, Transportation Security Officers (TSOs) and airline crew. She spent years observing security lines as a passenger, watching everything from TSOs cracking jokes to passengers fuming over carry-on confiscations, to the occasional security shutdown

and everything in between.

Seasoned and amateur travelers alike will recognize familiar characters (and possibly themselves) in *101 Pat-Downs*, including the stereotypically gruff TSO, the entitled business traveler and the nervous first-time flier. Malvini Redden examines airport security interactions in a social-science framework, explaining how people navigate communication in complex interpersonal situations – like TSA checkpoints.

"As a road warrior myself, I appreciated 101 Pat-Downs and its keen observations about our current form of security theatre

and how people on either side of that power dynamic react to and evolve because of it," said Elisa Camahort Page, co-author of *Road Map for Revolutionaries: Resistance, Activism and Advocacy for All*.

Now available at online bookstores, *101 Pat-downs* is a perfect traveler's companion for navigating what one TSO described as the nation's "second most hated government agency." The book also offers research-driven suggestions for improving the airport security experience for passengers and TSOs alike.

Shawna Malvini Redden is an associate professor

in the Communication Studies department at California State University, Sacramento. She holds a doctorate in organizational and interpersonal communication from Arizona State University. Her academic research has been widely published and she has received Top Paper awards from the National and International Communication Associations. In addition to academic and professional writing about communication, she maintains a personal blog called The Bluest Muse.

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The City of Roseville is excited that COVID has calmed down enough that Parks and Recreation is able to bring back the Turkey Trot this year. This will be the 9th annual race and will take place on Thanksgiving morning. Registrations are now being taken to participate in the race. You must pre-register. Absolutely no registrations will be accepted on race day.

The Turkey Trot is a 5K and 10K race in which the proceeds will go to benefit at-risk and low-income youth in Roseville. There is room for 2800 participants in the race. There are currently about 1700 spots still open. The course will begin and end at Vernon Street Town Square in Downtown Roseville.

Registration fees from now until November 21, 2021, at 11:59pm are as follows: 10K - \$45, 5K - \$40, 10K/5K 14 & under - \$35. Registrants are supposed to get shirts, bibs and awards. However, those that registered before November 1, 2021 will receive bibs with the racer's name on it, after that your name will not be on the bib. In addition, those that register later than October 24, are not guaranteed a shirt in your size.

All adult participants will receive a Unisex Port & Company long sleeve performance blend race shirt. Youth will

receive 100% cotton shirts. Extra shirts were ordered but they will be on a first come, first serve basis.

Packet Pickup times will be Tuesday, November 23 11am-3pm and 5-8pm and on Wednesday, November 24 from 9am – 11am. The organizers ask that you please plan on getting your packet, or sending someone to pick it up for you, as they will not mail packets to participants. Packet pickups will be at Roseville Sports Center located at 1545 Pleasant Grove Blvd, Roseville Ca 95747. Late registration will be allowed at packet pickup until all of the spots are filled.

**On the day of the race...** Parking for the event will be free. Plan to arrive no later than 8:15 am. Race announcements and course instructions will begin promptly at 8:30am. The race will start promptly at 8:40am for the 10K and 9:00am for the 5K. The race will feature disposable chip timing with live results and finisher photos. Refreshments will be provided for participants.

maximum penalty of 180 days in county jail, will be subject to search and seizure, and may be ordered to stay away from the involved locations or known "stroll" areas.

"Human traffickers and sex buyers have remained a significant public safety threat throughout the COVID-19 pandemic," said DA Anne Marie Schubert. "We are committed to continuing sting operations through the Sacramento Together coalition to target sex traffickers and buyers as well as maximize our efforts to protect and serve victims of sexual exploitation."

Sacramento Together is a coalition of more than 30 community-based organizations, law enforcement, state and

local public agencies, meeting regularly and working together to combat human trafficking and exploitation in our community.

The coalition works to combat human trafficking and exploitation by working together to treat, educate and remove children and young adults from life threatening situations. Working collaboratively, the coalition coordinates and maximizes community response efforts as well as all of our regional assets to better serve victims of sexual and labor exploitation. # Senator Dahle: California Must Focus on Supply Chain Crisis

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - In response to the Senate Select Committee on Ports and Movement hearing Wednesday, November 3, Senator Brian Dahle (R-Bieber) issued the following statement:

“The current port crisis will take time to resolve, but with the holiday season

fast approaching, we need to focus our efforts on it more intensely. I’m calling for a single, lead point of contact to keep all stakeholders on track and bring all parties to the table for new ideas and solutions. Secondly, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and the local air districts haven’t stopped, delayed, or paused their regulations that are in direct conflict with the reality of resolving our port crisis. These regulations are failing to recognize the gravity of this situation and the reality that the supply chain is fully interrupted. Without the necessary materials, goods, and infrastructure it is impossible for California companies to meet the fast approaching deadlines. Without CARB publicly stating their cooperation, I am certain that we will see

excessive fines and penalties on all companies and ports involved in this current goods movement crises. Lastly, we need to ensure the safety of our truckers, dock workers, ship crews, and everyone else who are working tirelessly to tackle the Mount Everest of containers awaiting them on the more than 70 ships currently parked offshore to unload products for all Americans.”

# Shop Safe and Smart This Holiday Season

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The 2021 holiday shopping season promises to be an unpredictable one. The labor shortage and supply chain issues are already throwing a wrench into holiday shopping. Electronics, toys, and other products will be (or already are) in short supply, and retailers are struggling to staff up as the shopping season nears.

Product shortages and increased online shopping are likely to result in even more online purchase scams this year. These scams accounted for nearly 40% of all scams reported to BBB Scam Tracker in 2020, according to the 2020 BBB Scam Tracker Risk Report. Shortages are likely to make purchase scams even more common as desperate shoppers turn to shady websites in hopes of finding this year’s must-have gift.

BBB recommends the following tips

to “Shop Safe, Shop Smart” this holiday season:

Research before you buy.; If the deal looks too good to be true, it probably is.; Beware of fake websites.; Professional photos do not mean it’s a real offer.; Make sure the website is secure.; Be careful purchasing sought-after products.; Beware of making quick purchases while scrolling through social media.; Look for the BBB seal.; Use secure and traceable transactions and payment methods.; Verify shipment tracking information.

# Joint Statement from Agencies Regarding Pfizer Vaccine for Children

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly, and Director of the California Department of Public Health and State Public Health Officer Dr. Tomás J. Aragón, issued a joint statement on the Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup’s recommendation to administer Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines for children ages 5-11.

“Vaccines are how we end this pandemic, and the ability to vaccinate more children who have remained vulnerable to COVID-19 strengthens our fight against this deadly virus. Californians ages 5-11 can now get the same robust protection that has helped save countless lives. The vaccine has been administered safely to millions of people ages 12 and up, and federal and state medical experts agree that the clinical trials have been rigorous in demonstrating that the vaccine is safe and effective for children ages 5-11. Last year’s winter surge was devastating in our state, and it is critically important that all eligible Californians supercharge their protection against COVID-19 ahead of the winter months. By getting more family members including children ages 5-11 vaccinated, we can celebrate the holidays safely and help avoid preventable hospitalizations and deaths.”

California will begin vaccinating children ages 5-11 today with 500 organizations across the state receiving their first shipments through next Monday. The state was allocated 1.2 million pediatric doses from the federal government with adequate supply to vaccinate all newly eligible Californians becoming available in the coming weeks. The state has more than 4,000 locations ready to vaccinate children ages 5-11 as supply increases and is leveraging existing infrastructure and partnerships used to administer vaccines to teens and young adults. This includes working closely with medical providers, local health departments, schools, community partners and others to administer vaccines safely and equitably through mobile clinics and vaccine pop-ups in the hardest-hit communities across the state.

Parents are encouraged to call their child’s health care provider to schedule a COVID-19 vaccine appointment. Parents can also visit [MyTurn.ca.gov](http://MyTurn.ca.gov) or call the hotline at 833-422-4255 beginning tomorrow to find a nearby vaccination site. The COVID-19 vaccine is free for all Californians regardless of insurance and immigration status. All Californians are strongly encouraged to get vaccinated or complete their vaccination series, get a booster when eligible, and get a flu vaccine, which can be administered at the same time.

# A Confusing Array of Sports Betting Measures

# Check Those Smoke Alarm Batteries

Memo to California voters: Prepare to be confused because you could be facing four competing ballot measures next year to legalize sports wagering. Indian tribes that now have a monopoly on casino gambling in California, big on-line sports betting corporations, horse racing tracks, and local poker parlors are jousting for control of what could be countless billions of dollars in bets on sporting events. Following a 2018 U.S. Supreme Court ruling that made sports betting legal, a number of other states have accepted it, and the major professional sports leagues, which condemned sports betting for decades, have struck deals with major on-line betting operations. However, years of efforts in the California Legislature to fashion a system acceptable to all stakeholders fell short. The legislative stalemate meant – as it often does in California – a shift to the alternative arena of ballot measures. Major casino-owning tribes struck first with a measure that would extend their gambling monopoly to sports wagering, qualifying it for the 2022 ballot. In reaction, three other

initiatives are in the works, each of which would benefit its sponsor in some way, but it's not certain that all will make the ballot. Although the election is a year away, the calendar for qualifying measures is fairly advanced and sponsors will have to hustle to make it – which means spending millions of dollars for professional signature-gathering campaigns. The tribal measure already ticketed for the ballot would require sports wagers to be placed either in existing casinos or in locations owned by the tribes. It also would allow sports wagers at major horse racing tracks – an obvious ploy to dampen potential opposition – but would not allow on-line bets on sports events. The measure, if passed, would block DraftKings and FanDuel, the two major on-line wagering outfits that yearn to operate in California. But it also includes a sly legal attack on the local poker parlors, which have long feuded with the casino tribes, and the cardrooms struck back with a measure of their own that would allow them to accept sports wagers. Very quickly, DraftKings and FanDuel pledged millions of dollars for a third measure that would allow them to operate in California and have drawn support from some big city mayors by promising that their proposal would provide money to deal with homelessness. Finally, three casino-owning tribes, two of which have backed the

original tribal measure, are floating a fourth measure that would allow on-line betting controlled by the tribes. It's a hedge against the DraftKings-FanDuel measure because it assumes that given a choice between wagering on-line or driving to a casino to place a bet, betters would prefer the former. Millions of dollars are already being spent by the sponsors of the four measures and they've commenced hostilities with dueling public relations campaigns in advance of what promises to be a tsunami of television and on-line advertising to persuade voters to choose one over the others. It would surprise no one if hundreds of millions of dollars are spent on the campaigns next year, because the millions would be pocket lint compared to the billions of wagering dollars that would flow through the hands of whichever interests can claim legal authority. That said, it's also possible that the campaigns will be short-circuited by a political deal. Those who sponsor ballot measures can remove them from the ballot if their demands are met by legislation. Given the years of legislative stalemate on the issue, it's difficult to see the competing interests agreeing to divvy up the pie, but it's not an impossible resolution. **SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - It's always surprising how many people aren't aware of the recommended practice to change the batteries in your smoke alarm/smoke detector each time that Daylight Savings Time begins and ends. Well, it's that time of year again. That's right, change the batteries twice a year and test them once a month! Does that seem excessive to you? Well, think about this, nobody ever plans on their house catching on fire. According to the National Fire Protection Association, in the year 2020, an estimated 379,500 residential structure fires caused 2,630 deaths and 11,900 civilian injuries. On top of that, 3 out of 5 home fire deaths took place in homes with no smoke alarm or a failed smoke alarm. Out of those that died when there was a working smoke alarm, 22% of them had been alerted by the alarm, but did not respond and 11% did not hear the alarm. By far, the most common reason for a failed smoke alarm is failed power to the device. Smoke alarms can be hard wired only, hard wired with a battery backup or battery only. In addition, there are alarms that respond to heat, respond to smoke, or respond to both. Regardless of the type that you have, it won't respond at all if it has no power supply. Your life, and the lives of your loved ones is why it is so important to change the batteries twice a year and check them monthly. The easiest way to remember, is to change them when you change your clocks. The only exception to this time frame is when your smoke alarm is powered by lithium batteries. Lithium batteries are known as 10-year batteries, but fire personnel suggest checking them every 6-7 years. Since having a working smoke detector more than doubles one's chance of surviving a fire, there are a couple of other important facts you should be aware of. Smoke detectors may not work properly if they are not clean. Clean your smoke detectors? That just means to make sure that they don't have paint in them, or sheetrock and that they are not caked with dust. In a kitchen, make sure that grease has not built up. The best way to keep them free of dust and debris is to periodically spray them with compressed air, like you would use on your computer. Another thing to be aware of is that smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors have an expiration date! Yes, an expiration date! Typically, they are designed to have a 5-7-year life. To find out when the expiration date is on your alarm, when you take it down to

change the batteries, there should be a sticker with the date on it. Be sure to note if that date is the expiration or installation date. If there is not date, look up that model and figure out the expiration date, then mark the device. Home fires usually start by cooking, faulty wiring/appliances, smoking, chimney fires or something being too close to a heat source. With the holidays coming, and many people will be decorating with lights, if you plug something in and your lights flicker or dim, unplug what you plugged in and get your electrical checked by a professional. In only 3 ½ minutes, the heat from a house fire can reach over 1100 degrees Fahrenheit. In rooms that are not even on fire, the temperature can reach over 300 degrees. That is hot enough to kill the people in those rooms. In addition to the extreme heat, fire produces gases and fumes that make you sleepy, weak, and confused. You can't smell these fumes, so if you are asleep the smell won't wake you up, but a smoke alarm will. The smoke from a house fire can be so thick that your house can be completely dark within 4 minutes even with all of the lights on. One smoke detector in a household is not enough. It is recommended that you have one in each room, but especially right outside of each sleeping area. In addition, there should be smoke detectors on each level, and near the garage and anywhere there is a fireplace, wood stove, etc. It is highly recommended that you encourage your children to test the smoke detectors with you each month. It is very important that your child is familiar with the sound the alarm makes. In addition, make sure that your children are aware what a firefighter will look like in a fire. Explain the breathing sounds they will be making, and the equipment they will be carrying. Children often hide when hearing the smoke alarm. It is important that they know to respond to the firefighter calls. Never put your child to sleep in their day clothes. Children's pajamas are coated with fire retardant and can make a big difference in the outcome. Sacramento Metro Fire Captain and Public Information Officer, Parker Wilbourn wants to remind the community check/change the batteries twice a year because *SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES*! # Saving Calaveras

Sheer fight saw eagle “Calaveras” through four months of healing, courtesy of Tri County Wildlife Care in Jackson. The raptor’s head wound was so deep that a quarter-size chunk of skull was exposed. Though fish-skin graft was considered, the eagle was deemed too stressed for surgery. Tri County founder Susan Manning and fellow volunteers eventually healed the wound with Silver Sulfadiazine cream. As skin regenerated over exposed skull, Manning wondered if his beautiful white pompadour could return. “I feared he might always be a truly ‘bald’ eagle,” she considered. “But at last, tiny quills pimpled the new skin. White feathers began to fill in. They have such an amazing capacity to heal.”

Eagle Calaveras was soon winging powerfully around a 100-foot flight chamber loaned by bird rehabilitator Pat Benik. Angler Wally Gallagher caught fish and delivered them live to nourish

the survivor. With returning health came feist; born free, the captive was going nuts in captivity. He crashed at chamber walls. He damaged wings and face in efforts to escape. “We didn’t want to release him while his head was still healing,” explained Manning. “But we feared he’d do terrible damage to himself. We had to let him go.” On a recent Saturday, Calaveras was driven back to his beloved home shores.

And not a moment too soon: parole glittered in the warrior’s yellow eyes. As Morin and Park Ranger Sam Schutz unclasped his cage, a powerful talon rammed the door wide open and out shot a bat from hell. Calaveras rocketed along a gully and clamped yellow feet on a high pine branch, 250 yards from his release site.

This photographer found him minutes into blessed freedom; poised with furrowed head down in hunting mode. As an Air Force poet once described, the warrior had “slipped the surly bonds of earth and danced the skies

on laughter-silvered wings.”

Who can project this eagle’s fate? Suffice to say the effort of 30 human angels had saved a noble icon from death. “His recovery was touch-and-go,” said rescuer Laura Morin. “His big wound took ages to heal, and dozens of people worked hard to help him. Ben and I are involved in many animal rescues; we don’t always see happy endings.”

At the lakeside release site, Susan Manning regarded his transporter. “An empty cage is a good thing,” she considered. “Without Ben and Laura, this guy would not have survived another day. He left us, flying free – the majestic eagle he was meant to be.”

## ASK THE DMV



### DO YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT REAL ID?



The DMV has answers! Changes to the deadline, limited-time fee waivers, and a simplified application process have all been recently announced. Read below for details on how to get your REAL ID.

**Q:** I Paid The Fee To Renew My Driver's License Online Last Year, But Offices Were Closed Due To COVID-19, So I Couldn't Get a REAL ID. Will I Have To Pay A Fee Again To Upgrade To The REAL ID This Year?

**A:** No! For a limited time, customers who have recently renewed a driver's license or identification card that is not federally compliant will be able to upgrade to a REAL ID for free! If you paid a fee to renew a driver's license or ID card between since March 2020, you will qualify but you must act now – the free REAL ID upgrade is only available until the end of the year.

The DMV is offering this free upgrade as a part of their continual efforts to accommodate customers who faced barriers due to COVID-19. It's important that everyone who is eligible and wants one can get a REAL ID. In May 2023, anyone flying domestically, visiting a military base or other federal facility will need a form of federal ID, like a REAL ID, to do so.

The process to get a REAL ID is also easier than ever – it is now possible to begin the REAL ID application and upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process. Making your visit at the window 10 minutes or less.

**Q:** Which documents will I need to get a REAL ID?

**A:** The DMV has made it easier than ever to get a REAL ID. Recently the DMV also announced that you no longer need to supply your social security card – just your social security number. To apply, you will need to provide ONE identity document that includes your date of birth and your full name – like an original or certified birth certificate, or a valid US passport. You'll also need to provide TWO documents that show your name and address to prove you're a California resident. You can use cell phone and utilities bills, your mortgage, bank statements, or even your vehicle registration.

You can start your application online today and find a complete step-by-step checklist of all approved documents at [REALID.dmv.ca.gov](https://REALID.dmv.ca.gov). If you upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process, your time at the window will be 10 minutes or less.
