Going Greener

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento Tree Foundation, Sacramento City Council Member Jeff Harris, and Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA), hosted a tree planting event for volunteers to plant 26 trees at Mirasol Village, Sacramento's largest new affordable housing development in the River District. Mirasol Village is the former Dos Rios area that has been re-developed. Some of the 50 volunteers involved in the tree planting project included former Dos Rios residents that will soon be Mirasol Village residents.
Sacramento Tree Foundation says, "This planting is part of SIMPL, an initiative to transform the

northwest section of downtown into a connected, thriving community that supports residents' quality of life, health, and inclusion in the broader region. Projects like this planting support urban greening, health and wellbeing, equitable housing, increased mobility, and decarbonized energy for the people who live and work here."
Studies show that neighborhoods with more trees not only look nicer, but they have better air quality and lead to healthier community members. Better air quality produces fewer people with asthma and other respiratory issues. In addition, it cuts down on obesity and increases mental health. It is the Sacramento Tree foundation, and its NeighborWood program that finds areas that are

"under-canopied" and plants shade trees to improve these areas.
The Sacramento Tree Foundation is "all things trees." They have educational programs such as Acorn Harvesting. In this program, people seek out specific kinds of acorns and bring them back to the foundation where they are planted and grown into a tree. A seed to seedling program.
Sacramento Tree Foundation also has a seed to slab program. In this program, the foundation collects trees or portions of trees that organizations like the city, SMUD or PG&E have cut down and repurpose the wood from the tree, before the tree reaches its expiration date. This wood is cut into usable boards

New Child Safety Seat Program Grant

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol's (CHP) received the *California Restraint Safety Education and Training (CARSEAT) V* grant to support its ongoing effort to improve child passenger safety. The CHP will use the grant funds to conduct public awareness campaigns, training courses, and enhanced-enforcement patrols through September 30, 2022.
The CARSEAT V campaign will focus on reducing the number of children killed and injured in traffic crashes throughout California. To accomplish this goal, the CHP will offer educational seminars, new parent classes, and appointments at local Area offices for child safety seat inspections and assistance with installations. These efforts will highlight the importance of safety seats and seat belts and provide information on the proper installation of child passenger safety seats.
"We are raising public awareness of the dangers of traveling with children in a vehicle who are not securely buckled into the appropriate child passenger safety seat," CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray said. "As a parent or caregiver, it is your responsibility to protect these vulnerable passengers."
California law requires a child to be properly restrained in an appropriate child safety seat in the rear seat of a vehicle until they are at least 8 years old. Children aged 8 and older, who are at least

4 feet 9 inches, may ride in the rear seat of a vehicle in a properly fitted seat belt. Children under the age of 2 must ride in a rear-facing car seat until they reach 40 pounds or 40 inches in height. For the best protection, all children should ride rear facing, if possible, until they reach the upper weight and height limits of their car seat. In addition to educational efforts, the CHP will be conducting enforcement operations concentrating on seat belt and safety seat violations throughout the year with a special emphasis during the "Click It or Ticket" campaign May 23 through June 5, 2022, and during Child Passenger Safety Week September 18 through 24, 2022.
Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. ★

Due to Covid the clinic was put on hold. VIP is back to give your cat/kitten or dog/puppy, shots to keep them healthy and protected. They offer new puppy/kitten packets that follow your pet through its first year.
The difference, at this VIP clinic you don't have to pay for an office visit. These days can be between \$40.00 and \$50.00 dollars just to walk through their doors. You just pay for the shots, worming and preventative medications. The one downside is it is a first come first in line set up. You can have your new pet micro-chipped so if they get lost they can be scanned and hopefully returned to you. Another big

fear among dog owners is the fear of them getting heart worms. Only one bite from a mosquito. At this VIP clinic you can get the blood test to check that they are not present in your animal. After the negative test, your animal is put on a once a month pill. The pill is given by size

of the animal. They don't do spay and neutering right there as it is a drive-thru type clinic. They do offer information to other types of services as spay and neutering clinics.
I went there with my new-est fur baby. The line was around the shed. There were several Frenchies, smaller chi

chi mixes and a gorgeous 6-month-old Husky. All the dogs were well behaved and being carried or on a leash. I did see two cats in carriers waiting in line with their owners. The line moved not slow and not fast, but everyone was friendly and chatting to pass the time. ★

Through the generosity of the *The Rio Linda News*, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Rio Linda.

The rush to release prisoners from our jails and prisons was initially a response to court orders to reduce prison overcrowding, but lately it's become a radical effort to recast criminals as victims and abandoning actual victims and their families. Now we are facing the placement of sexually violent predators (SVPs) that some bureaucrats decided are fit to rejoin society.

Other than the primary risk of creating more victims to sexual violence, there are additional concerns that counties have no input in whether or not an SVP can be placed in their communities. Recently, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors took a definitive position on the state's policy for how SVPs are placed. Knowing that Sacramento County has faced its own battles to keep SVPs out, I intend to join San Diego's example and bring an item before the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors to demand more say in the dangerous practice of placing violent sexual predators in our neighborhoods.

Many Sacramento County communities have had to fight to keep an SVP out of their neighborhoods. In 2019, an SVP convicted of multiple sexual acts with minors was being considered for placement in Del Paso Heights. That same SVP was nearly relocated to Wilton earlier this year. That SVP had no connection to Sacramento County,

but the courts were considering placing him here anyway. When such risky placements are proposed, community members can, and thankfully did, voice their opposition to having an SVP dropped in their neighborhood, but no formal avenue exists for the County to influence such decisions. What San Diego County proposed, and what I will be proposing, is a change in the state law that dictates how SVPs are placed that gives the counties a formal role in the process.

Currently, an SVP is a person that has been convicted of one or more violent sex crimes, has a diagnosed mental disorder, and is likely to engage in violent, criminal behavior. At the discretion of the courts and California Department of State Hospitals, SVPs can qualify for conditional release (CONREP). CONREP allows SVPs to live in a community with supervising and treatment requirements dictated by the court. They have daily contact with a Liberty Healthcare regional coordinator and must wear a GPS bracelet at all times. After a year of CONREP, SVPs can then petition the court for unconditional release. While the protocols of CONREP seem thorough, and I am sure Liberty Healthcare and all involved agencies want to keep communities safe, how can any community or parent feel safe knowing that an SVP is down the street? How do the courts, especially courts in other counties, know which communities are best to locate their SVPs?

The current code says that counties will provide assistance and consultation for the placement of SVPs but it does not create a formal avenue for input on their placement. There is also the perception that

the courts tend to place SVPs in communities with high minority populations or in rural areas. In all things, the County leaders can make better decisions about their communities than someone from a completely different county. Especially when that decision is where to place an SVP with no ties to the area. For that reason, I am joining San Diego in asking our County Chief Executive Officer (CEO), to oppose the placement of any SVPs in Sacramento County until the welfare and institutions code (WIC) is amended to give local jurisdiction a formal role in release and placement of SVPs. That includes the authority to veto their placement in our county entirely.

It is unfair that any of our residents should have to fear the placement of known sexually violent, mentally ill criminals with no mechanism for their local officials to stop it. I will bring this before our board before the end of the year so that Sacramento County, and hopefully other counties to follow, can join the effort to formalize our authority in this process and we can protect our communities.

Rehabilitation and redemption are important values, but support for crime victims and protecting our communities should be our top priority.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Patricia Lane to 60 years to life in state prison. On August 19, 2021, a jury convicted Lane of four counts of child sexual assault and found true a multiple victim enhancement.

Lane sexually assaulted four young boys when they were between the ages of 4 and 11 years old. The victims were adults when they disclosed the sexual abuse. Their testimony was heart wrenching as were the victim impact statements made at sentencing. As the Court stated, “The victims are now vindicated.” ★

Farmers Lose Two Skirmishes in California Water War

The most important battleground in California’s perpetual war over water is the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta.

Dozens of Northern California rivers and streams coalesce in the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers, which join to form the Delta estuary and whose waters then flow into San Francisco Bay.

The state’s massive water infrastructure was constructed on an assumption that water left to flow to the sea was wasted. The web of reservoirs and canals diverts river and Delta water to farms in the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys and domestic users as far south as San Diego.

However, in recent decades environmental groups and their allies, such as Indian tribes and fishermen, have demanded reductions in diversions, arguing that they severely damage habitat for fish, such as spawning salmon, and other wildlife.

The conflict has been played out in multiple arenas – the Legislature, Congress, federal and state regulatory agencies and the courts. It’s been trench warfare with long periods of stalemate, occasional gains by one side or the other and periodic

attempts at armistice.

A few years ago, the state Water Resources Control Board was poised to impose some limits on diversions that the agricultural industry saw as draconian – particularly since the state was also beginning to regulate farmers’ ability to pump groundwater to fill gaps in surface water supplies.

Govs. Jerry Brown and Gavin Newsom wanted to head off a full-fledged legal showdown by urging “voluntary agreements” on river flows acceptable to both farm water agencies and the water board and negotiations have been underway for several years.

One such agreement affecting the Sacramento River and its tributaries appears headed for adoption, but this month, the draft of a second affecting the San Joaquin River hit a huge roadblock. In a letter to the river’s major diverters, the Newsom administration rejected their proposal and said it would urge the water board to resume direct regulation of San Joaquin flows.

Environmental Protection Secretary Jared Blumenfeld and Natural Resources Secretary Wade Crowfoot told the San Joaquin districts that “at this point it is clear that despite considerable efforts, proposed voluntary actions by water agencies on the San Joaquin River tributaries have fallen short of needed flow and habitat improvements, and viable proposals are not being offered at this time.”

The two administration officials added, “We will ask the State Water Board to resume all activities necessary to implement the flow objectives established by the

2018 Bay-Delta Plan for the Lower San Joaquin River and its three major tributaries, the Stanislaus, Tuolumne, and Merced rivers.”

Although Blumenfeld and Crowfoot said the San Joaquin agencies could re-enter the process “if they propose necessary levels of additional water flows and habitat,” their rejection letter sets the stage for political and legal warfare. San Joaquin Valley farmers see the water board’s pending actions as severely damaging their ability to continue operations.

Dave Eggerton, executive director of the Association of California Water Agencies called the administration letter “very concerning” because of the potential for all-out legal war.

However, as news of the letter spread in the water community, environmental groups celebrated. They had long viewed the “voluntary agreement” process as a tool to subvert stricter regulation necessary to protect habitat.

They scored another win last week when Fresno Superior Court Judge D. Tyler Tharpe refused to validate a very controversial water supply contract that the huge Westlands Water District obtained from the Trump administration. In his ruling, Tharpe cited procedural irregularities, including violation of state open meeting laws.

Thus, as drought grips California, the battles over the state’s very limited supply of water seem destined to intensify.

Synagogue Hate Crime Related Vandalism and Intimidation

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - At approximately 5:50 p.m. on October 20, 2021, the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office Communications Center received a call from a member of a synagogue in Carmichael adjacent to the Colony Neighborhood. The caller stated that someone had taped anti-Semitic leaflets to the menorah in front of the building.

Deputies responded to the location and conducted a neighborhood

canvas for potential witnesses and video footage. CSI collected and processed evidence. Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office Homeland Security and Hate Crime Detectives are investigating and following up on leads. No suspect or further information is available at this time.

Every ten years, following the Census count, the resulting census data is used to geographically define electoral districts, at all levels of government, through a process called redistricting. Redistricting ensures that each of the electoral district boundaries have about the same number of people and comply with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965.

Redistricting is important because it determines which neighborhoods and communities will be grouped together for the purposes of electing a Board member.

Sacramento County residents are encouraged to participate in the redistricting process. Residents can sign up for Redistricting news stories, information and upcoming meetings via email or text. People can also view past and upcoming meetings at the Redistricting Meetings webpage and are encouraged to check-in for additional upcoming workshops and hearings. ★

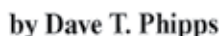

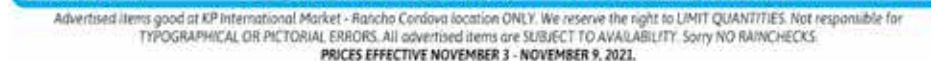

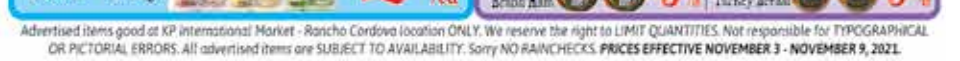

I know that happens with many other careers from police officers to firefighters and others too. But we ask these men and women to go around the world and try to understand how to get the job done in some really incredible circumstances.

I had a little of that experience too. Rick (my husband) and I were married about four months when he was deployed to Vietnam. It was a long time ago, but it still hits home every Veteran’s Day. I can still feel the emotions he and felt as we said goodbye at the airport, not knowing if we would ever see each other again, hoping and praying that we would. It was not a popular war as if any war is, but this one was very difficult for those who returned and the names they were called. After several months, we met for R&R in Hawaii. The joy was there, but dread too, because he had to return to Vietnam after just a few days. But we were grateful.

Thank God my First Lieutenant returned to

me with no injuries on the outside, but what about the inside? We never really talked about all that went on for quite a few years. I felt he would share when he was ready. Perhaps it was better that he was a little older...about 24...and he took on the job of looking after some of the younger guys to keep them out of trouble. I remember the letters he sent, which I still cherish and the cassette tapes we sent back and forth just talking about stuff. I can still remember hearing the pouring monsoons in the background and how he tried to keep busy painting his room.

After Hawaii, it was some months before he came home. It was over the New Year holiday, and I can still feel the terror when I did not know where he was as Saigon was falling. I heard nothing for days and then the call came from him that he was in Seattle. I was at Indiana University working on my Phd, but no gift or degree could have given me such joy as when I heard his voice.

I can’t even imagine what it would be like to have a chaplain and officer come to my door, or know that his wounds were so bad, he would never be whole again. But it’s been 50 years and we are still together. Please think of those brave souls who do this job for us and bring them home safe! Thank you for your service! God Bless Them ALL!!!

Lead Poisoning is Still an Issue in Area Houses

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Did you know that more than half of all homes in Sacramento County were built before 1980? Houses built before 1978 are likely to have lead in the paint. Not to mention that lead can be found in numerous other items around the home including plumbing, dirt, traditional home/folk remedies, imported cosmetics like surma, imported herbs and spices, imported or antique ceramic pottery, some toys and costume jewelry.

Occupational sources that can bring lead exposure at home include being a construction worker, mechanic or electrician, or spending time at a shooting range.

Lead is dangerous to young children, as even low levels can cause behavioral problems and learning disabilities. The good news is that lead poisoning is 100 percent preventable. Learn how to prevent lead poisoning at the Sacramento County Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention website or the California Department of Public Health Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Branch website.

If you think your child has been exposed to lead, ask your child’s doctor for a lead test at their next visit. If you would like to receive a free information packet on how to protect your child from lead, call the Sacramento County Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program at (916) 875-7151. ★
