**ELVERTA, CA (MPG)** - Elverta has a real life Movie Cowboy!! Jerry Bestpitch has more than 15 movies to his credit. He rode and wrangled for Kurt Russell. Three different times for and with, Bruce Dern who was the first man to kill John Wayne in a movie.

When I went to interview him I gawked at him, he was so um, right out of Central Casting! If you need a Cowboy. He had on spurs, jeans, hat, western shirt and the kerchief around his neck.

"I dress like this everyday, it is my life, I am a cowboy!!" he told me. His face said he had lived outdoors all his life, and it wasn't an easy road.

"Just a four years ago I broke my hip. Six years ago my ankle, but for all the years I have been riding, that really is nothing to sweat about," he

kinda laughed and went on, "I am still able to ride and shoot from a horse, which is what I did in most of my pictures. I am known as the guy you see standing up in the saddle while running my horse and shooting with my Colts or rifle. I feel very blessed and still have years of competition in me yet!" I believe him. I never asked his age, nor did he volunteer it.

"What are some of the other Cowboy things you have done with your life?" I asked.

"I compete in Cowboy Mounted Shootings in Stockton, in LA, San Francisco and all over to Phoenix, AZ." The event, he told me, consists

of Shooting the Shotgun, a 410, a rifle and a 45 lever action gun/guns at 10 targets. These targets are usually balloons on strings laid out in a barrel racing pattern. You each get five tries and the winner is the one who after tallying up those 5 rounds, has the most balloons in the least time. Your focus is on speed and accuracy. You can win

## Caltrans Starts Highway Litter Removal Program

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)**

- Caltrans announced a new Clean California pilot program that offers Adopt-a-Highway volunteers up to \$250 for picking up highway litter. The Adopt-A-Highway program has been one of the longest-standing and successful government-public partnerships in the state. Since its inception in 1989, more than 120,000 Californians have cleaned and enhanced over 15,000 shoulder-miles of roadside. The new pilot program will augment the overall goals of the Clean California program by providing additional resources to maintain and beautify the state's roadways.

"Clean California is all about restoring pride in public spaces and making a difference in our communities, and that goes hand in hand with volunteering,"

said Caltrans Director Toks Omishakin. "Through Caltrans' Adopt-a-Highway program, volunteers can pitch in to clean and beautify our roadsides, and we're proud to offer an incentive for even more people to help Clean California."

Part of Governor Gavin Newsom's California Comeback Plan, Clean California is a sweeping \$1.1 billion, multiyear clean-up effort to remove trash, create thousands of jobs and engage communities to transform roadsides into places of public pride. Since July, Caltrans has collected nearly 2,500 tons of trash and made more than 600 conditional job offers as part of the program.

Adopt-a-Highway volunteers help create cleaner and more beautiful roadsides by removing litter, planting trees and flowers, clearing graffiti, and thinning overgrown vegetation, and

also help prevent litter and other pollutants from entering state waterways through stormwater drains. Whether completed by an individual or group, Caltrans will award stipends up to \$250 total per litter collection event for activities such as:

\$250 for each adopted highway segment; \$62.50 for each ramp, or up to \$250 for all four ramps; Up to \$250 for clean-up activities at other locations, such as along bike paths or at park-and-ride facilities.

Caltrans will require volunteers to submit information - including date, location, amount of trash collected, number of volunteers, hours worked and pictures - following eligible clean-up activities to receive a stipend. Adopt-A-Highway participants are limited to one payment a month.

As part of the pilot program, the stipends will

be available to Adopt-a-Highway volunteers in Butte, Colusa, El Dorado, Glenn, Imperial, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, San Diego, Sierra, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba counties. Caltrans expects to expand the program statewide in the coming months.

There is no cost to participate in the Adopt-a-Highway program. In addition to clearing litter, Adopt-a Highway volunteers have maintained 1,500 acres of vegetation and planted 100 acres of trees and 36 acres of wildflowers since 1989. Caltrans installs signs displaying the name of the person, family, organization or business on the segment of adopted highway.

## Colleges Awarded Federal Child Care Grants

Los Rios Community College District

- Three of the Los Rios colleges - American River College, Cosumnes River College and Sacramento City College - have been awarded federal grants to support child care and family services on campus. The multi-year grants will support a variety of campus programs at the colleges' child development centers.

The grants are part of the Child Care Access Means Parents in School Program (CCAMPIS) program from the federal Department of Education. Here are the details for each college.

The American River College grant award is \$283,000 per year for the next four years. The grant will fund the college's infant toddler program in the following areas:

Improvements to the indoor and outdoor environments; Increased staff to allow for younger children - starting at 6 months of age; Teacher training; Early Childhood Education student training and permit advancement; Family workshops (both enrolled families and campus community)

The Cosumnes River College grant is \$150,000 a year for the next four years and will fund the development of the college's family resource and engagement center, the Nest. This program will support families so that:

Families feel welcomed at our campus, persist, and are strengthened by educational and career achievement; The economic mobility of both parent/family and the child is enhanced; Both student parents and their children's educational outcomes will advance generationally; Families within the college community will be supported, sustained, and strengthened in their collective pursuits and wellbeing

The Sacramento City College grant award is \$224,000 and is renewable each year for five years. The grant will help fund comprehensive services for student families of children under the age of two years;

The funded activities for the children and families will begin in Spring 2022, starting with toddler-aged children; Income-eligible student parents may participate at no cost to the families; The program will feature a parent involvement and education component, with an online parent support and education Canvas site, as well as on-campus activities



# “Lest We Forget”

*“We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live.” – President Abraham Lincoln’s Gettysburg Address, November 1863.*

**CHATTANOOGA, TN (MPG)** - I cannot adequately describe my feelings as I entered the Chattanooga National Cemetery where I had come to pay my respects and dedicate this story to these veterans. It is located not too far from the heart of the city of Chattanooga, Tennessee. Visiting this cemetery, even if you had little or no understanding about the Civil War, you would come away with a new perspective on our nation’s history, and aren’t we supposed to have a grasp of history (both good and bad), before we are doomed to repeat it?

In 1863, General Order No. 296 was issued to create a national cemetery to commemorate the Battles of Chattanooga in November 1863. Major General George H. Thomas, known as “The Rock of Chickamauga,” issued this order, but it was not until 1867 that the cemetery gained a national designation. In all, there are 155 national cemeteries in 42 states and Puerto Rico; to find out where they are in your travels, go to [www.cem.va.gov](http://www.cem.va.gov), for more information.

Why should you visit the Chattanooga National Cemetery? When you arrive at the cemetery and proceed to the administrative building for information, you may talk with Kevin Ritchey of Facilities Maintenance, who has a wealth of knowledge about the park. Kevin is also a U.S. Army combat veteran. The cemetery has many qualified volunteers to answer your questions and offer directions (all the volunteers are veterans), so if you want to visit the grave of Desmond Doss (the subject of the movie *Hacksaw Ridge*), they can get you there. You can visit the grave of an individual who has the unique distinction of being the only person buried here from the American Revolution.

The Chattanooga National Cemetery is 120 acres in size, and there are more than 41,000 veterans and their dependents resting here. Some of the highlights of cemetery include the Memorial Circle of Honor that was established in 1992. You can easily recognize the location by the American flag sitting atop the hill where it is said that

General Ulysses S. Grant had his headquarters while the Battle of Chattanooga was fought nearby. The Circle honors those from our nation’s conflicts, and organizations have erected memorials in recognition of the sacrifices that were made during the Vietnam War, Korean War, World War II and more.

The first thing you see when you arrive is the Andrew’s Raiders Monument. This monument is in honor of those individuals who aided the Union in the Civil War. The individuals honored here are among the first recipients of the Medal of Honor, our nation’s highest military tribute “for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of life above and beyond the call of duty.”

In addition to the individuals buried here from the Civil War, the cemetery also is the final resting place for German soldiers who were prisoners of war from World War I and World War II. Each November, the German government honors these soldiers with a laying of the wreath at the German monument.

The Chattanooga National Cemetery was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1996. As with historic places, one must take time to observe and “feel” the surroundings. For instance, every monument or memorial arch has a story, and usually there is an inscription, or plaque or headstone that tells why that warranted being placed in this cemetery of honor.

The Chattanooga National Cemetery is an inspirational place to visit. I found that there is so much more to discover through the veterans buried here. Charles H. Coolidge, who was one of the last surviving Medal of Honor recipients from World War II, is buried here. In fact, if you want to study up on Medal of Honor recipients, you can visit the Charles H. Coolidge National Medal of Honor Heritage Center right here in Chattanooga.

As I said, a visit to this cemetery is very enlightening and truly educational! The closest national cemetery we have to Sacramento is in Dixon at the Sacramento Valley National Cemetery. It is the seventh national cemetery built in California and the 124th in the national cemetery system. It’s a visit worth the time. Thank you, veterans! ★

# Families Now Receiving October Child Tax Credit Payments

**WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG)** - The Internal Revenue Service and the Treasury Department announced that millions of American families are now receiving their advance Child Tax Credit (CTC) payment for the month of October.

This fourth batch of advance monthly payments, totaling about \$15 billion, is reaching about 36 million families today across the country. The majority of payments will be issued by direct deposit.

Under the American Rescue Plan, most eligible families received payments dated July 15, Aug. 13 and Sept. 15. Future payments are scheduled for Nov. 15 and Dec. 15. For these families, each payment is up to \$300 per month for each child under age 6 and up to \$250 per month for each child ages 6 through 17. The vast majority will be issued by direct deposit.

Here are more details on those payments:

- Families will see the direct deposit payments in their accounts starting Oct. 15. Like the prior payments, the vast majority of families will receive them by direct deposit.

- For those receiving payments by paper check, be sure to allow extra time, through the end of October, for delivery by mail. Those wishing to receive future payments by direct deposit can make this change using the Child Tax Credit Update Portal, available only on IRS.gov. To access the portal or to get a new step-by-step guide

for using it, visit IRS.gov/childtaxcredit2021.

- Payments went to eligible families who filed a 2019 or 2020 income tax return. Returns processed by Oct. 4 are reflected in these payments. This includes people who don't typically file a return but during 2020 successfully registered for Economic Impact Payments using the IRS Non-File tool on IRS.gov or in 2021 successfully used the Non-filer Sign-up Tool for advance CTC, also available only on IRS.gov.

- Payments are automatic. Aside from filing a tax return, including a simplified return from the Non-filer Sign-up Tool, families don't have to do anything if they are eligible to receive monthly payments.

- Families who did not get a July, August or September payment and are getting their first monthly payment this month will still receive their total advance payment for the year. This means that the total payment will be spread over three months, rather than six, making each monthly payment larger.

The IRS is currently sending letters to some Americans reminding them it is not too late for families who haven't filed a 2020 income tax return — including those who are not normally required to file because their incomes are too low — to sign up for advance CTC payments. Most low-income families can get these monthly payments. The IRS urges families who normally aren't required to file a tax

return to visit IRS.gov for more information on how to file a return and receive their credit.

Update on Sept. advance Child Tax Credit payments In September, the IRS successfully delivered a third monthly round of approximately 36 million Child Tax Credit payments, totaling more than \$15 billion. Given the new components of this program, the IRS continues to work hard to make improvements and deliver payments timely.

After the September payment was issued, the IRS resolved a technical issue, which the agency estimates caused fewer than 2% of CTC recipients not to receive their September payment on the scheduled payment date. Payments have since gone out to affected individuals.

The impacted group primarily included taxpayers who recently made an update to their bank account or address information using the IRS Child Tax Credit Update Portal. In particular, the issue affected payments to married taxpayers filing jointly where only one spouse made a bank account or address change, which usually results in payments being split into two (between the existing account or address and the new account or address).

In some of these cases, the split payment caused a delay in making payments, and further caused individuals to receive slightly more than the correct payment in September. To address this, the payment that each spouse receives in October,

November and December will be reduced slightly to adjust for the overpayment. For each taxpayer receiving a payment, the typical overpayment was \$31.25 per child between 6 and 17 years old and \$37.50 per child under 6 years old. This will result in about a \$10 to \$13 reduction per child in the three remaining monthly payments.

The IRS will send letters to affected individuals with this information. The IRS continues to closely monitor this program and the agency appreciates the patience of those whose payments were affected.

The IRS encourages partners and community groups to share information and use available online tools and toolkits to help non-filers, low-income families and other underserved groups sign up to receive these benefits.

Links to online tools, a step-by-step guide to using the Non-filer Sign-up Tool, answers to frequently asked questions and other helpful resources are available on the IRS' special advance CTC 2021 page. It's at IRS.gov/childtaxcredit2021. ★

# Reduce your Supply Chain Bottleneck

- Governor Newsom is rolling out an executive order to ease California's supply chain gridlock that's driving up prices, threatening the availability of goods for holiday shoppers and may have even been behind the recent Orange County oil spill.

While those certainly sound impressive, there are a couple other things Democrats can do to ease the backlog in our ports:

1. Repeal AB 5. By threatening trucking

companies with millions of dollars in penalties (applied retroactively) for working with contractors to increase capacity, AB 5 has discouraged the flexibility we need in the supply chain.

2. Allow state funding for port automation. The labor shortage is slowing operations throughout the supply chain, making it hard to move goods 24/7 like we need. Democrats didn't help the situation when they banned state funding for automated cargo handling equipment. Sadly, there are 50,000 reasons the governor might not go for this one.

Bottom line: We're never going to get out of the supply chain crisis if Democrats stick with half measures that prioritize their special interest friends over real solutions. And that's bad news for everyone. ★

# Gavin’s Gas Lawn Equipment Ban Hits the Little Guys

Gov. Gavin Newsom’s signature on Assembly Bill 1346 makes one wonder whether California politicians ever fully understand – or even want to understand – the ramifications of their decisions.

The measure aims to eliminate the sales of gasoline-powered lawn equipment, such as mowers, string trimmers, leaf blowers and other devices, within a few years.

The purpose, it’s said, is to eliminate the exhaust emissions from small engines that create smog and contribute to global warming.

The bill’s author, Assemblyman Marc Berman, a Menlo Park Democrat, contends that “operating the best-selling, gas-powered commercial leaf blower for one hour emits air pollutants comparable to driving a 2017 Toyota Camry from Los Angeles to Denver. Smog-forming emissions from small engines will surpass those from passenger vehicles this year.”

One could add that the gas-powered lawn machines also emit jarring levels of noise.

Under AB 1346, the California Air Resources Board will decide how and when sales of gas-powered

devices will be prohibited and it could be as early as 2024. A shift to battery-powered machines presumably would occur as older devices need replacement.

Tools powered by rechargeable batteries are convenient, quiet and relatively inexpensive to operate and make perfect sense for the homeowner. Personally, I’ve used them almost exclusively for the past quarter century and wouldn’t have it any other way.

That said, what’s practical for personal use is not necessarily so for lawn care professionals, most of them single persons or small crews, and often immigrants. It’s estimated that California has at least 50,000 such microbusinesses.

Mowing a lawn once a week is one thing, but pros do it a dozen or more times a day to keep their families housed and fed. They would have to not only buy the equipment but dozens of batteries and chargers and have the facilities, including sufficient electric power supplies, to recharge those batteries.

Backers of the legislation, a coalition of public health and environmental groups, would let the Air Resources Board figure out the details. There’s the possibility of a \$30 million fund to help buy new equipment.

The arithmetic, however, indicates that the proposed conversion would cost much more than that, either borne by the lawn services or taxpayers.

Andrew Bray, vice president of the National Association of Landscape Professionals, told the Los Angeles Times that “a

three-person landscaping crew will need to carry 30 to 40 fully charged batteries to power its equipment during a full day’s work,” adding, “These companies are going to have to completely retrofit their entire workshops to be able to handle this massive change in voltage so they’re going to be charged every day.”

The larger landscape companies that Bray represents could make the switch and adjust their fees accordingly. But how about the little guys?

A basic array of high-quality, battery-powered lawn tools – a mower, a trimmer and a blower – would cost at least \$1,000. Enough spare batteries and chargers would at least double the initial cost. So at a minimum, with 50,000 lawn services, the total cost would be \$100 million. The real world cost would likely be a quarter-billion dollars or more.

Even were the state willing to cover replacements, how about the infrastructure that small landscapers, operating out of their homes, would need to recharge their batteries? Would we be putting them through a daunting application process? Would the many undocumented landscapers submit the paperwork?

Newsom and the legislators who voted for this bill may think they are doing the right thing, but did they ever consider that they are messing with people’s livelihoods and lives? Nothing in the bill indicates they did.

# AMCHA Denounces Newsom’s Signing of Ethnic Studies Bill

## AMCHA News Release

**SANTA CRUZ, CA (MPG)** - AMCHA Initiative Director, Tammi Rossman-Benjamin, issued the following statement in response to Governor Gavin Newsom’s signing of AB 101, a bill to make ethnic studies courses a high school graduation requirement:

“Having closely monitored and studied the ethnic studies scene unfold on college campuses for years, particularly in California, to say we are deeply concerned is an understatement. While certainly not all in the ethnic studies field fall into this category, there is a vocal and active faction of extremists who have long been seeking to inject their antisemitic and anti-Zionist agenda into our nation’s classrooms, and today that faction succeeded. This is a dark day for Jewish students in California and the dozens of other states that historically follow California’s lead.

“The fact that no less than seven ‘guardrails’ were deemed necessary for preventing AB 101 from facilitating the widespread promotion of antisemitism is itself a stunning indictment of the bill and the dangers it poses for Jewish students and the Jewish community. And by law those so-called guardrails are purely optics. They carry zero weight when it comes to preventing school districts from bringing the rejected and blatantly antisemitic original ESMC curriculum or its far worse Liberated cousin into the classroom.

“Making matters significantly worse, California’s teachers’ unions and public universities’ ethnic studies departments proudly support those overtly antisemitic curricula. Both the original ESMC draft and Liberated’s curriculum are endorsed by California’s two largest teachers’ unions and ethnic studies departments and faculty on Cal State and University of California campuses.

“This bill could and should have been stopped at the legislative level and must not be forced on the Jewish community to fight in each of California’s 1,300 school

districts. We surely hope that those who guaranteed the guardrails would prevent antisemitic curricula from seeping into our state’s high schools stand ready to fulfill their commitment, since this enormous responsibility ought to fall squarely on their shoulders, not on parents and students.”

AMCHA has led several efforts to warn Newsom about the dire harms of the bill and urge him to veto it. In the past couple of weeks, hundreds of Holocaust survivors and their descendants, dozens of religious, civil rights and education organizations, thousands of Californians, and hundreds of California high school students and parents have urged Newsom to veto the bill. And the LA Times editorialized against AB 101, urging a veto, and citing the same concerns raised by the petitioners.

Rossman-Benjamin was the first to expose the way in which the discipline of Critical Ethnic Studies is deeply antisemitic and anti-Zionist. AMCHA has led several coalition efforts to educate officials about the dangers of a curriculum based on Critical Ethnic Studies. AMCHA’s Director, Tammi Rossman-Benjamin, has testified before the California Senate Education Committee and the Assembly Education Committee against AB 101, and provided evidence that if AB 101 becomes law, most school districts will adopt some version of the rejected antisemitic first draft.

# Home and Community-based Care Supports Us All

Every day, millions of workers enter people’s homes to provide care to those with disabilities and the elderly. These “direct-care” workers assist individuals with bathing and dressing, cooking and eating, taking medication, and getting exercise. For the people they help, they are lifelines to health, independent living, and economic stability.

Yet our system for providing this care is in desperate need of repair. Medicaid serves approximately 4.8 million Americans with home- and community-based services, but there are still nearly 850,000 people on waiting lists. They often wait years for crucial support.

At the same time, direct-care workers have been underpaid for decades, causing instability in their own lives. This situation was untenable even before pandemic-induced social distancing kept these workers from fulfilling their jobs.

President Biden proposed a fix for the industry in his infrastructure plan, which would have added \$400 billion in federal spending for Medicaid’s home and community-based services program. This would have provided a sorely needed boost to the caregiving economy.

Yet the president and a group of bipartisan senators dropped this aid from the “compromise” they reached and passed on infrastructure. That’s deeply disappointing. Lawmakers must do everything they can to work this aid back in as a separate bill. Funding home- and community-based care for the most vulnerable Americans

shouldn’t be a partisan issue.

The demand for home- and community-based care will only grow in the years ahead, given that one in four Americans today are living with a disability, and the average age of the U.S. population continues to rise. According to Harvard University’s Joint Center for Housing Studies, the U.S. population aged 74 and over is expected to increase by 48% in the next decade. And older Americans are increasingly cost-burdened. Among homeowners over age 79,

just 3% owed mortgage debt in 1989, compared to 27% by 2019.

It all adds up to a situation where more people need services but have fewer options.

The voting public recognizes this. An April poll from Morning Consult and Politico found that 76 percent of Americans support new funding to improve caregiving for people with disabilities and the elderly. And yet, some of our political leaders don’t seem to see the need.

Perhaps they don’t understand that care workers enable people to continue living in their own homes – or how important this is. Aid recipients prefer to be cared for in their own homes and communities, and the law obliges public agencies to do so whenever possible.

Care workers themselves also need help. Though entrusted with their clients’ wellbeing, direct-care workers make \$11 an hour on average. Approximately 15% live in poverty. It’s no wonder that there is 50%

turnover every year among direct-care workers.

The low wages also exacerbate gender and racial inequality, as women of color dominate the ranks of direct-care workers. And when we fail to support direct care, the burden of looking after family members typically falls to women, taking them out of the workforce.

Home- and community-based care makes it possible for millions of families to thrive. But without new expenditures, both

the workers who provide these services, and the individuals and families who rely on them, will not. Our lawmakers need to make this investment now, assuring a sustainable system of services and support for our most vulnerable citizens, their families, and the professionals who care for them.
