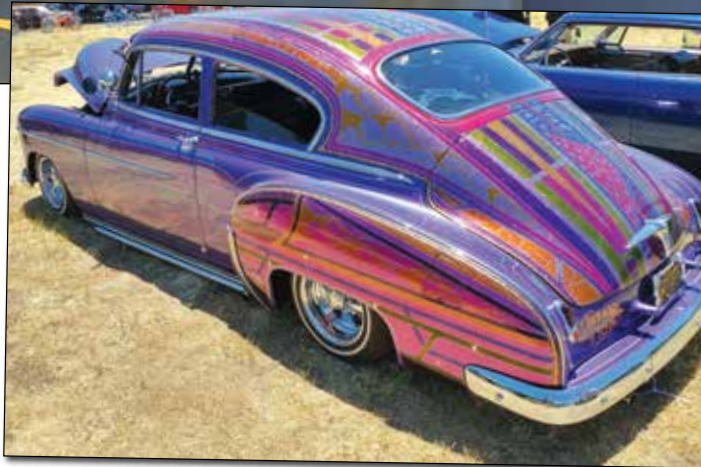
"It's in our clothing, makeup and hair, along with the Food that you see everywhere today."

## Sons of the American Revolution Seeks New Members

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Are you descended from a Revolutionary War patriot?

It's time to look more closely at your family tree, say members of the Sacramento Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) as the 250th anniversary of the American revolution draws near.

The chapter is actively looking for men whose ancestors fought and sacrificed for the nation we have today, said chapter treasurer Donald B. Littlefield. Littlefield currently serves as treasurer and board member of the SAR, Sacramento Chapter. In April, he finished his term as president of the California Society Sons of the American Revolution for 2020-2021. He also served as a chapter officer in 2010, 2011, 2017 and 2018.

and examples of how and where Sacramento chapter members actively participate in our local community.

## You Have 30 Days to Leave Here

**RIO LINDA, CA (MPG)** - Short notice for sure, but when your homeless its heart-breaking. No reasons from the County Rangers, just need to be moved within the 30 days.

This caused a crisis call to Sandy McGouran, who runs the Free Store for the homeless out of the Fellowship Hall of the Calvary Baptist Church, 6680 16th Street, to get on the phone to Sue Frost. Sandy was connected with the Supervisor's Chief of Staff, Matt Hedges. Matt told Sandy it was, "only temporary" this small group of 12 had to leave to bring goats in.

"We need to bring in goats to eat down the grasses and leaves for fire protection, then, they can move back," Matt said.

But, NO ONE had explained that to them. She was also told that they could "camp" in the dry creek bed just past the high school on the left, until they can return. She couldn't wait to go calm their nerves.

Here's a little history of this particular group Sandy has been working with on and off for the last 12 years. She met a homeless man named Matt 12 years ago. She told me the people prefer only first names or 'nicknames'.

Matt has a tragic story of how he became homeless. Matt had gone to the hospital to pick up his wife and newborn baby. On the way home they were hit by another car, mother and baby died. That was the last day of his normal life. He has lived on this piece of land, these 12 years because his family is part owner. They even have a name for this little '12'. "Ground Zero," because they have nowhere to go but "UP."

We talked for over 45 minutes; there was just too much to tell me. I told her next week I would contact her and go with her to the camp for a story and pictures. She was overwhelmed there was any interest. I told her my paper asked me ASAP once they heard about this, to write up something. People do care. I did ask her pretty hard questions that had been on my mind and others I have talked to about the homeless issue. The break-ins for money, the possibility of a big fire due to cooking, the trash piled on the side of the roads, etc. She told me, "with any population you have your good and your bad, the bad is what stands out, unfortunately." We agreed to continue on these topics on our next visit.

# Sons of the American Revolution Seeks New Members

Littlefield said the Sacramento SAR chapter supports the men and women in military service, law enforcement and fire safety on the chapter, state, and national level through their Partners in Patriotism (the American Legion, VFW, AmVets, etc.) to recognize the ongoing sacrifices of our service members throughout the world in activities such as Veterans Day and Memorial Day celebrations, and Wreaths Across America, held at national veteran’s cemeteries.

“Our active members work on various programs, donating time and resources to keep our programs going,” Littlefield said. “We need more new members who understand what we are, what we do, and want to be part of the important legacy we are trying to leave for our posterity,” he said.

Individual Sacramento SAR chapter members visibly inspire patriotism through their color guard which participates in local parades and ceremonies and posts the national colors.

SAR color guard members wear Revolutionary War-era uniforms and participate in civic and patriotic events and observances such as the Fourth of July, Veterans Day, Armed Forces Day, Flag Day, Patriots Day, Bill of Rights Day, Yorktown Day, Constitution Day, and important battles of the Revolutionary War.

Historically, the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) is the largest male lineage organization in the United States and consists of 50 state-level societies with more than 500 local chapters, several international societies (including Canada, France, Germany, Mexico, Spain, Switzerland, and the United Kingdom), and over 36,000 active members.

In all, some 220,000 men have joined since the SAR was founded in 1889 on the 100th anniversary of the inauguration of George Washington as our first president.

“We perpetuate the stories of patriotism, courage, sacrifice, tragedy, and triumph of the men who achieved the independence of the

American people in the belief that these stories are universal ones of man’s eternal struggle against tyranny, relevant to all time, will inspire and strengthen each succeeding generation as it too is called upon to defend our freedoms on the battlefield and in our public institutions,” Littlefield said.

Prominent SAR members include 16 U.S. presidents, U.S. senators and representatives, local business and community leaders, as well as foreign dignitaries such as Sir Winston Churchill, and Kings Juan Carlos I and Felipe VI of Spain.

Throughout its history, SAR members have also answered their country’s call in every major American conflict beginning with the battle of Lexington and Concord on April 19, 1775, and continuing to the present day, with military service Operation Desert Storm, Bosnia, and the recent actions in Afghanistan and Iraq. SAR members have also received the highest awards America can bestow, including the Medal of Honor.

### Where to Begin?

A search for a Revolutionary War male family ancestor begins seven to nine generations back.

“Most men seeking membership at this time are looking at ancestors who would probably be their 4th to 6th great-grandparents,” said Littlefield.

“Consider that by doubling the number of ancestors in each succeeding generation (two parents, four grandparents, eight great grandparents, etc.), we might have over 3,000 direct ancestors who were alive during the Revolution,” he said.

“It is likely that if you had any ancestral line living in this country for many years, you could possibly find one or more patriots in your family tree. The search can be rewarding, as you learn how your own family participated in the ongoing history of this country,” he said.

### What does SAR do?

The state-level societies and chapters of the SAR present

thousands of awards each year to law enforcement officers, public safety officers, and other citizens who exemplify the best civic traditions of our nation. This includes young men and women who are leaders in our communities: high-ranking high school students of history, Eagle Scouts, JROTC and ROTC cadets, and midshipmen.

“Our mission is to inspire patriotism, educate our youth about the sacrifices that were and still are required to keep our freedoms, and to support and recognize those who, as members of the armed forces, law enforcement and/or fire safety, continue to defend our freedoms,” said Donald Littlefield.

Members of the Sacramento SAR chapter also help to bring American history alive in the classroom through a living history program where its members in period dress can give first person accounts of very real Revolutionary War era events to fifth grade school assemblies, he said.

### SAR requirements and Resources

The supporting documentation to establish each link in the lineage to a Revolutionary War patriot is needed for membership eligibility, Littlefield said. Hearsay evidence in published family histories and online family trees is not acceptable unless it provides the actual specific sources where the information originated.

With today’s online technology, many original records can be found on sources like FamilySearch.org (free), or subscription sites like Ancestry.com and Fold3.com. The Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) as well as the SAR have online research systems that can help with clues.

Usually vital records such as birth, death, and marriage certificates can be found for most of the events in the 20th century. For example, the national 1850-1920 census records can often show children living in their parent’s household connecting those links. Documented published records

can help with the earliest generations but sometimes it is necessary to look at the original probate, land, church or other records as needed to find the necessary proof. Littlefield said Jim Faulkinbury, the Sacramento chapter’s genealogist can offer membership applicants helpful information in where to begin their research.

### How to Become a Member

Since membership in the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) requires a direct descent from a patriot who helped establish this nation between 1775 and 1783 when the Treaty of Paris gave us our national independence examples of specific eligibility can take many forms, Littlefield said.

According to the SAR website, such examples of service can include:

- Military service in either the Continental Army or in local militia units.
- Civil service in local or state governments.
- Members of the many committees that assisted in the war effort.
- Oaths of Allegiance supporting the war for independence.
- Providing supplies and/or funds.
- In Spanish North America (California, Texas, etc.), the soldiers who manned the Presidios gave financial support to the colonies. For the purpose of membership eligibility, these soldiers are also considered patriot ancestors. Spanish soldiers who served in Florida and Louisiana kept the British out of the Mississippi River allowing vital resources to reach the colonies from the south are also eligible for membership.

### Historical Origins

Nationally, the SAR Archives and Education staff has been digitizing the materials that comprise the SAR Institutional Archives located in the SAR Genealogical Research Library. Some 30,000 files have been recorded and placed in digital storage.

The first file chosen for this series

showcases the exceptional historical depth of the SAR; was the Record of Proceedings of the Convention of Delegates, convened on April 30th, 1889.


This document records the first Congress of the SAR when delegates from across the country came together to formally unify the different state societies. Delegates from 17 states met in New York City in 1889. Fittingly, it was the 100th anniversary of the inauguration of President George Washington.

Fraunces Tavern has long been associated with the American Revolution and the founding of our nation. In 1783, the tavern hosted the most prominent leader of them all, General George Washington. On the night of December 4th, 1783 at Fraunces Tavern, General Washington bid farewell to the officers of the Continental Army. Washington gave an impassioned speech and then delivered a personal word to each of the men who had helped secure American independence.

Under the Articles of Confederation, which placed the capitol of the nation in New York City, Fraunces Tavern also served as the offices of the Foreign Affairs, War, and Finance Departments. Over 100 years later, as the first delegates of the Sons of the American Revolution gathered there, the tavern once became the backdrop to a scene of national unity and patriotism.

Today, SAR is a thriving historical, educational, and patriotic United States 501(c)3 non-profit organization that seeks to maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom, an appreciation for true patriotism, a respect for our national symbols, the value of American citizenship, and the unifying force of “e pluribus unum” that has created, from the people of many nations, one nation and one people.

# California’s Pro-Housing Forces Score Big Win

California’s housing crisis is a multi-front guerrilla war, pitting those who want to lower legal and political barriers to construction against those who see new developments as threats to the environment and/or the ambience of their neighborhoods.

The conflict is waged in the Legislature, in the state housing bureaucracy, in city councils, in the courts and, increasingly, at the ballot box. Every new offensive assault by pro-housing forces meets stout resistance by defenders of the status quo and over time, it’s been something of a stalemate.

Housing construction remains well below the levels needed to close the gap between supply and demand, resulting in ever-rising rents and home prices, ever-increasing angst for Californians priced out of the market and an adverse effect on the economy as workers migrate to more affordable communities elsewhere.

The Housing Crisis Act of 2019 was a major thrust by the pro-housing faction. Senate Bill 330 was aimed at blocking local government

policies, such as restrictive zoning, caps on building permits or unworkable design standards that limit new housing developments.

Not surprisingly, the legislation was opposed by local government officials as undermining their historic power to shape the tenor of their communities through controls on land use. However, it was passed by strong majorities in both legislative houses and signed by Gov. Gavin Newsom, who had promised to meet the housing crisis head-on.

While the legislation limited the authority of local government officials, it may turn out to be a groundbreaking limit on the power of local voters as well.

The legislation’s passage more or less coincided with the Oceanside City Council’s approval of a 585-home subdivision called North River Farms, which bills itself as a country village integrated with small-scale agriculture. The council rezoned land to make the project feasible.

Despite its bucolic nature, North River Farms was opposed by existing residents of the area and some environmental groups. They launched a recall campaign against one of the council members who voted for the project and eventually placed a measure on the 2020 ballot to overturn the council’s decision, which was passed by a 2-1 margin of the city’s voters.

Thereupon, the project’s developer, sued to overturn the referendum, alleging that it violated the Housing Crisis Act of 2019 and last month, Superior Court Judge Richard Whitney

declared that the new law did apply to the referendum.

In overturning the election results, Whitney said SB 330’s clear aim was to “maximize the development of housing” by overriding any local action or policy that attempts to limit construction.

Whitney’s ruling will no doubt face appeals to higher courts and could collide with a 2017 state Supreme Court decree, in a case involving taxation, that ballot measures are not subject to the same limits applied to local governments.

Writing the 5-2 majority opinion, Supreme Court Justice Mariano-Florentino Cuéllar declared, “Multiple provisions of the state constitution explicitly constrain the power of local governments to raise taxes. But we will not lightly apply such restrictions on local governments to voter initiatives.”

There is also a larger issue posed by the Oceanside case – whether zoning changes are legislative acts subject to referendum or merely administrative actions that are exempt from such challenges. Oregon, for instance, has flatly prohibited the use of referenda to oppose zoning changes.

The Oceanside case is not an isolated example of employing referenda to block projects. If Whitney is upheld, it will be a major victory for pro-housing forces by eliminating one arrow in the quiver of those who resist new development.

# Enrolled in Medicare the Wrong Way!!

I am being charged a much higher premium for Medicare because our 2019 tax return showed higher earnings. Can you please explain what one turning 65 with employer benefits should do because I think I made a big mistake enrolling in Medicare and still working with employer benefits? Thanks, Tammy from Nashville, TN

**Tammy:**

I have good news for you because Medicare does allow those turning 65 with “true” employer benefits to delay Medicare Part B enrollment without a penalty when you want to enroll in Medicare later. Delaying Medicare does require having employer group health coverage thru yours or your spouse’s employer.

Social Security must interview you to terminate Medicare Parts A and/or B by calling your local Social Security office and discuss with the representative that you would like to terminate your Medicare because you are covered by employer’s group health coverage. If you do **NOT** have “true” employer group health coverage, missing your enrollment period is going to mean that you will be paying penalties. Medicare recognizes true employer and union health plans as qualified group coverage with the Medicare recipient and/or their spouse **working full-time** to be able to delay Medicare Parts A and B.

• **A Working Spouse: Does It Matter?** If the working spouse is providing health insurance benefits from their employer group health coverage, then you want to delay enrolling in Medicare Part B. You might continue to work either part-time or as a self-employed individual, taking advantage of the coverage provided by your working spouse.

• **Self-Employed: Does It Matter?** Yes, it does because if you are turning 65, not covered under an employer’s group health plan whether yours or your spouse’s employer’s benefits and waited to enroll in Medicare Part B, then you can receive a 10% penalty for each year that you were not enrolled, due to not enrolling in Part B at the right time. If you waited 2 years to apply for Original Medicare Parts A and B, then the penalty would be a 20% penalty (2 years, 65 and 66) every month for as long as that you are on Medicare or the rest of your life.

Different options to enroll in Medicare are below:

1) **Turning 65 and Receiving Your Social Security Check** is the easiest way to receive your Medicare card. Medicare will send your “Welcome to Medicare” kit 90 days before you turn 65 with your Medicare card in the kit.

2) **Turning 65 and NOT Receiving a Social Security Check** because you are still working or may not be working but waiting past 65 to receive 100% of your Social Security benefits. Visit Social Security online at [www.ssa.gov/benefits/medicare](http://www.ssa.gov/benefits/medicare) to enroll in Medicare 90 days before you turn 65.

3) **Turning 65 and “still working”**- Talk to your Employer’s HR. Ask if you need to enroll in Part B. If you do not need Part B because you are “still working” or your spouse is “still working” and you are on their group plan. When you or your spouse are no longer covered under an employer group health coverage, at that time have your HR department fill out and sign Social Security form CMS-L564 “Request for Employment Information” and CMS-40B “Application for Medicare Part B. Call your local Social Security office and fax the forms to justify your delay in enrollment and avoid needless penalties.

## Can I Get a Higher Benefit Now Because I'm Older?

**Dear Rusty:** I started getting Social Security at age 62 and I am now 77. Can I get a higher benefit now that I'm older? **Signed: Needy Senior:**

**Dear Needy Senior:** Probably not. When you first start collecting your Social Security retirement benefits (e.g., at age 62 or any other age) your SS benefit amount is permanently established and will change thereafter only if:

- A Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) is granted (which is usually done annually, starting with your payment in January of each year). There have only been 3 years in the last four decades that a COLA increase didn't automatically occur. This year's COLA increase was 1.3%.

- You later became eligible for a higher spousal benefit because your husband started collecting benefits after you first claimed, and your benefit amount at your full retirement age (FRA) was less than 50% of your



husband's FRA benefit amount.

- You later became eligible for a higher survivor benefit because your husband passed away and his Social Security benefit was more than you were receiving (you would need to apply separately for your survivor benefit).

- You had later earnings which were higher than any of the 35 years over your lifetime used to originally compute your benefit when you first applied. Past years earnings are adjusted for inflation, so original earnings amounts in prior years are increased to today's dollar value to see if your recent earnings are higher.

If you are working, Social Security monitors your earnings (and your contributions through payroll taxes) every year to see if you are due a benefit increase and, if appropriate, it is automatically given. COLA increases are also automatically given effective with each December's benefit (paid in January) if such an increase is appropriate due to inflation as measured by the national Consumer Price Index. So, the only

other possible way your current benefit could be increased now is if 1) you didn't claim a spousal benefit when you were eligible and you are still eligible because your husband is still living, or, 2) your husband is now deceased, and you didn't apply for a higher survivor benefit you were entitled to when he died. If either of those are true, then you should contact Social Security to request your higher benefit.

You do not, however, get a benefit increase simply because you are now older than you were when you first claimed Social Security. COLA will slightly increase your benefit automatically most years, but unless one or more of the other conditions above apply, your benefits won't change further as you age.

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - At approximately 9:19 p.m. on Monday June 21, 2021, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received a call from a resident on the 4400 block of Oakhollow Drive in North Sacramento stating she had been shot.

Deputies arrived and found an adult male victim obviously deceased with multiple wounds to his body. Also located in the residence was an adult female victim with what appeared to be a gunshot wound. Fire arrived moments later and transported the female to the hospital where she is

being treated for her injuries.

CSI collected evidence, witnesses were interviewed and Homicide detectives were on-scene for several hours. No suspect information nor any further information is available at this time.

The identity of the victim in this case will be released by the Sacramento County Coroner's Office after identification and notification of next of kin.
