It's a Date: Recall Election Set

California voters will decide on Sept. 14 whether to throw Gov. Gavin Newsom out of office, making him the second governor in state history – and just the fourth nationwide – to face a recall.

The announcement today from Lt. Gov. Eleni Kounalakis comes after weeks of procedural wrangling by Democratic lawmakers and state officials to speed up the process for choosing a recall election date. Their apparent calculation is that the Democratic governor has better odds of defeating the GOP-backed recall if

an election is held sooner rather than later.

“I believe we have chosen a fair and reasonable date for this election to take place,” Kounalakis said in a statement. “It has always been my intention to choose an election date that gives election officials and the public ample time to ensure a smooth election with broad participation.”

Newsom’s public approval has been rising as the state rebounds from the coronavirus pandemic, and he’s already amassed a hefty war chest to fight the recall. Holding the election on Sept. 14 protects the governor from being leveraged by special interests and fellow Democrats during

most of the critical bill-signing period that ends Oct. 10.

Delaying a vote until later in the fall would give his opponents more time to mobilize – and raises the possibility that voters could sour on Newsom if conditions in the state worsen due to the pandemic, wildfire season or other unforeseen calamities.

Though the recall effort – led by conservative activists critical of Newsom’s opposition to the death penalty and California’s high taxes, widespread homelessness and immigrant-friendly policies – began before the pandemic hit, it gained support as the virus surged and Newsom

County Updates Climate Action Plan

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Planning and Environmental Review (PER) staff are hard at work on the final draft of the Communitywide Climate Action Plan (CAP), which aims to significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions and prepare the County for climate-related impacts for decades to come.

PER staff expects the final draft CAP will be available for public review sometime in mid summer. You can be among the first to see it by signing up for email or text alerts.

Climate change is expected to affect the region in a variety of ways: hotter temperatures and more extreme heat events; increased wildfire risks; unpredictable rainfall and flooding; reduced snowpack and impacts to the water supply, among others.

The CAP will serve as a policy and technical document that will be used to update other plans and codes – such as the Sacramento County General Plan and County Building Codes – to help the County reach greenhouse gas reduction targets.

“The Climate Action Plan is an extremely important project so we are really taking our time and listening to our residents and the experts to make sure that we get it right,” said Todd Smith, Principal Planner. “Our goal is to have an implementable communitywide plan that reduces Sacramento County’s contributions to climate change while addressing its impacts.”

Following public review, PER staff hopes to get the CAP before the Board of Supervisors for approval in late fall 2021.

Presentations from past public workshops and Board of Supervisors meetings that give examples of some of the concepts under consideration are available on the Planning and Environmental Review website.

Sac County EMS Leader Named Director of the Year

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Brave, dedicated, willing and reliable - these words describe the 80,000 licensed or certified Emergency Medical Services (EMS) providers in California. They demonstrate these qualities every day by coming to the aid of others when they are most in need and working to ensure that the EMS system operates well. However, each year, due to circumstance or extraordinary effort, certain individuals among us shine.

Sacramento County EMS Director, Dr.

Hernando Garzon was named as the 2020 EMS Medical Director of the Year for his heroic acts and extraordinary contributions to EMS by the California Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) earlier this month.

The EMSA seeks to recognize those individuals through the California Emergency Medical Services Awards Program. The awards program honors special accomplishments, meritorious and heroic acts, innovations or fresh ideas to improve EMS in the state, or other unique and/or significant contributions by EMS personnel, physicians, nurses, EMTs, other medical providers, local officials, members of the law enforcement community, citizens, and first responders.

Dr. Garzon was selected for his tireless efforts and selfless leadership during the COVID-19 response. Through a long career in disaster response, Dr. Garzon learned how to organize a systematic approach and efficiently

mitigate a large-scale incident.

During the pandemic, Dr. Garzon assisted the state by building models and predictive theories, enabling local and state-wide leaders to be better prepared to respond to the approaching “storm” of patients. He continued leading one of the largest EMS systems in the state, guiding the development of an “Emerging Infectious Disease” policy that provided direction and clarity to the greater EMS community about a sensible approach to preventing transmission of the COVID-19 virus, mitigating the spread of the disease among the workforce, and safe return to work guidelines.

“I most enjoy working on EMS system-wide and quality improvement issues, because I see that as the key to ensuring the highest quality prehospital care for all people in Sacramento County,” said Dr. Garzon. “I also still enjoy Emergency Department shifts and caring for patients.”

When asked what a typical work day might look like for him, Dr. Garzon said “between clinical work, EMS work, and COVID-19 work with EMSA/CDPH in the last year, I don’t really have a ‘typical’ work day. Of late, they have generally started with multiple conference calls, and a mix of Sacramento and State EMS work, as well as CDPH work for COVID-19. Several times a month I also get to throw in late afternoon Emergency Department shifts to round it out.”

Dr. Garzon’s Notable COVID-19 Projects: **Assisted EMSA** with the State EMS COVID guidelines and response; **Developed a template** for local EMS tiered response during COVID surge; **Developed a Hospital COVID-19 Burden Score** to rank hospital strain with COVID-19; **Lead the effort to write state pandemic crisis care guidelines**, Assisting with **development of the Alternate Care Site**

imposed strict lockdowns to contain it. He was widely blasted as a hypocrite when reports surfaced in November that a maskless Newsom had attended a lobbyist friend's birthday party at the ritzy French Laundry restaurant, even as he told Californians to mask up and avoid socializing.

Only about 55,000 voters had signed recall petitions at the time of dinner. A judge gave proponents more time to collect signatures due to the pandemic. And by the deadline in April, some 1.7 million voters signed the recall petition, more than enough to trigger the recall.

But the state law governing recall elections lays out a lengthy process between gathering signatures and holding a vote. To speed things up, the Democratic-controlled Legislature on Monday passed a bill allowing lawmakers to skip a 30-day financial review of election costs if they've already set money aside in the budget to pay for a recall – and Newsom signed it into law within hours. The new state budget they passed includes \$250 million to pay for putting on the election.

"Politicians play partisan games. It's all about retaining power," GOP businessman John Cox, who lost to Newsom in 2018 and is challenging him again, said during a morning campaign stop in Sacramento.

"I think people will see what's going on. And it'll backfire."

Newsom immediately vowed to defeat the recall

and continued the theme he's been hammering for months – that the recall is a power grab led by "Trump Republicans" who refuse to accept the outcome when they lose elections.

"On September 14, Californians will have the chance to defend our state and reject this Republican power grab once and for all," said a statement from Newsom's campaign manager Juan Rodriguez.

The Republican Party in California has diminished dramatically since 2003, when voters threw Democratic Gov. Gray Davis out of office in a GOP-backed recall and replaced him with Republican Arnold Schwarzenegger. Voters haven't elected

a Republican for statewide office since Schwarzenegger's reelection in 2006. And Republicans hold so few seats in the Legislature – about one-fourth – that they don't have the power to influence policy or budget decisions.

But a recall creates an opportunity for all Republicans, because the rules are different from an ordinary election.

A recall ballot contains two questions. First: Should Gavin Newsom be recalled? And second: If he is recalled, who should replace him? If more than 50% of voters say "yes" to the first question, the person who gets the most votes on the second question wins – even if they

have less than a majority. That's because there's no limit to how many people can run in the recall.

Already, 55 people have filed a statement of intention to run, including former San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer, former Sacramento-area U.S. Rep. Doug Ose and reality TV personality Caitlyn Jenner – all Republicans. Conservative talk show host Larry Elder also is considering a run, Politico reported.

Faulconer has tried to appeal to voters across the political spectrum by highlighting his work with a Democratic city council as San Diego mayor. "This movement is powered by Californians from every community – Democrats, Republicans,

and Independents. I am ready to lead this recall and begin the California Comeback to clean up our streets, cut taxes on the middle class, and reopen our schools," he said in a statement.

Candidates have until July 16 to finalize their decision to run in the recall. In 2003, 135 people ran to replace Davis. But now there's a new requirement that could narrow the field: candidates must submit five years of tax returns.

Voters will be sent a ballot in the mail beginning on Aug. 16. Everyone will be able to mail in their ballot, but options for returning it in person will vary by county. Local election officials had raised alarms about the rapid timeline, saying they couldn't pull it off any sooner than Sept. 14. Even then, some are still concerned they may have a hard time getting the special paper and envelopes required, and securing locations for voters to cast ballots.

"It's a good thing that we at least have a date now so we can at least focus on those items," said Donna Johnston, the registrar of voters in Sutter County and president of the statewide association of election officials.

"It's going to be like climbing a mountain. And of course once we get to the top and carry off a successful election the view will be nice."

Not surprisingly, Republicans are very fired up about the recall, with a recent poll showing 75% are highly interested in it. But only 36% of Democrats said the same, which means Newsom's challenge in the next two-and-a-half months will be to motivate them to vote.

"The risks of a low turnout, the risks of an uninformed electorate, could be catastrophic for our state," Democratic Assemblymember David Chiu said during a call with reporters the day after the election date was announced, in which Democratic party leaders vowed to unite against the recall.

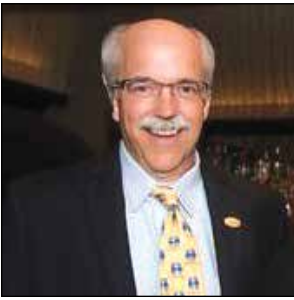

Following several months of community meetings, workshops and public input, the SMUD Board of Directors recently approved a Zero Carbon Plan that commits us to removing carbon emissions from SMUD’s power supply by 2030. It’s the most ambitious clean-energy plan of any large electric utility in the United States.

There are many reasons why we’re taking such an expedited route to decarbonization.

Sacramento’s poor air quality and the growing effects of climate change through drought and wildfires prompted us to act as quickly as we can. In the American Lung Association’s “2020 State of the Air” report, Sacramento was ranked the sixth-most polluted city in the country based on days of unhealthy levels of air pollution in the ozone layer. The public health implications are real - the

Sacramento region’s childhood asthma rates are more than 20 percent higher than the national average. That’s unacceptable.

SMUD’s Zero Carbon Plan will focus both on proven and new clean technologies, new business models and partnerships, the remodeling and retirement of our natural gas plants, and regulatory and financial strategies. While SMUD is one of the greenest utilities in the country, we currently rely on natural gas for about half of our power generation. We plan to close two of our gas plants by 2025 and retool the others to operate on clean fuel.

At the same time, we’re committed to maintaining reliable, around-the-clock service while keeping any rate increases at or below the rate of inflation. As much as they support our clean-energy efforts, our customers tell us that affordable rates and reliable electricity are their top two priorities. We will not sacrifice either of those.

The electrification of buildings and vehicles is a key part of the Zero Carbon Plan. As SMUD’s power mix incorporates more renewable sources such as solar and wind, powering our homes, offices and cars by electricity will reduce greenhouse gas emissions significantly. And we’ll

have the infrastructure in place to support the plan and transition.

One of the biggest strengths of the Zero Carbon Plan is its flexibility. We’re not taking such a large step in any one direction that we can’t pivot if we need to, based on new technologies, customer preferences and market conditions. We know where we’re going, in other words, but our path is flexible. This plan gives us the adaptability to choose the best route.

We realize we can’t accomplish our ambitious undertaking by going it alone. We need the support of a wide range of players, including our residential and business customers, elected officials, local business groups, community leaders, technology companies, car manufacturers, solar companies, and more. We’re committed to full transparency and to making sure that all of our customers, including those living in historically under resourced communities, reap the full benefits of our effort.

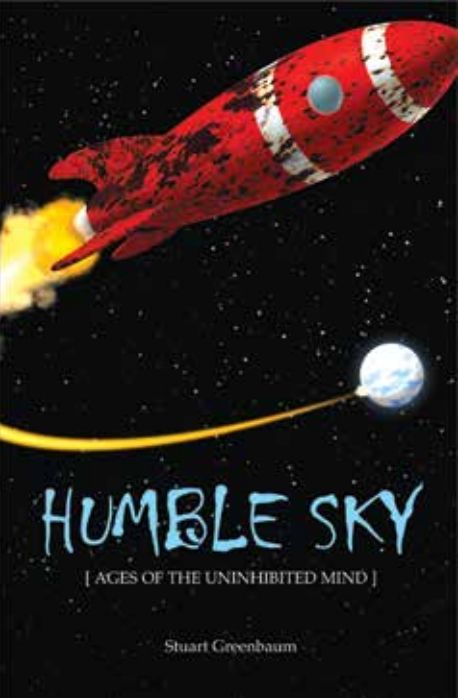

Why Is My Medicare Premium An Extra \$471?

Virtually any utterance from Gavin Newsom’s mouth these days, as well as those from his press office and other outposts of his administration, contains the phrase “roaring back.”

When, for example, the Legislature passed a state budget to meet the June 15 constitutional deadline, Newsom issued a statement declaring that “California’s economy is coming roaring back.”

Not surprisingly, it’s also the key slogan in his resistance to a campaign to recall him, something voters will decide later this year.

“Gov. Gavin Newsom has California roaring back,” the announcer in one of his campaign spots declares. “Newsom is delivering money to your pocket. Plus an extra \$500 bucks for families with kids – \$4 billion straight to small businesses through the nation’s largest grant program – cleaning up our streets and getting 65,000 homeless Californians into housing – and free pre-K for every California child, regardless of income.”

To some, it might appear somewhat unseemly that Newsom so obviously merges his official actions – and taxpayers’ money – with

his political campaign, but the once-discernible line between politics and policy vanished long ago.

That said, do the facts support Newsom’s repetitive “roaring back” claim?

To be sure, some Californians have prospered in the 15 months since Newsom declared a public health emergency due to COVID-19 and imposed restrictions on personal and economic activities.

Those who could continue to work at home maintained their incomes and those on the top rungs of the economic ladder were enriched as the values of their investments such as stocks expanded, thanks largely to the Federal Reserve’s cheap money policies.

Newsom has a multi-billion-dollar revenue surplus mostly due to taxes on the affluent, money he’s now spending on the wide array of new benefits he’s touting in his campaign ads.

However, broader economic data offer scant support for the “roaring back” mantra the governor is chanting these days. It’s more like creeping back – slowly.

The state’s monthly report on employment, issued on June 18, frames the glacial pace of improvement. The state lost nearly 3 million jobs after Newsom ordered widespread business closures in March 2020, and since then we’ve recovered roughly half of them. Our 7.9% unemployment rate is still twice what it was before the shutdown and is the third highest of any state, slightly under Hawaii and New Mexico.

In addition to the official unemployment rate, the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics makes other calculations, including an important one on underemployment, called U-6, which includes not only workers without jobs but those who are only marginally attached to the labor force and those working part-time.

California’s U-6 rate through the first quarter, 18.4%, was four percentage points above the national figure and the third highest of any state, behind Hawaii and Nevada. Even more disturbingly, the U-6 rate in Los Angeles County, 24.1%, is higher than that of any state.

The federal Bureau of Economic Analysis reported this month that during the first quarter of this year, California’s economic output increased by 6.3%, slightly lower than the national rate and in the lowest third of the states.

The federal bureau also reported that California’s personal income grew by 42.8% during the first quarter, which sounds impressive until one looks at the nation as a whole and learns that California’s growth was the second lowest of any state. The bureau notes that nationwide, “transfer payments” – mostly federal aid programs rather than earned income – accounted for virtually all of personal income growth.

California’s economy is recovering, to be sure. But “roaring back?” Hardly.

My husband, John and I need your guidance because I believe I have made a mistake enrolling in Medicare. Last year, John was laid off due to COVID-19 and has lost his employer health insurance and so I have enrolled in Medicare since I am turning 65 in August. John is a Veteran and is receiving his healthcare from the VA, so he did not have to enroll in Medicare and his healthcare is not costing us anything.

Why is my Medicare costing me an extra \$471 for Medicare Part A and \$148.50 for Medicare Part B? I thought Medicare Part A was free. Is there some form that I did not fill out because I have not worked very much since we married 40+ years ago and was a stay-at-home Mom and now I am the caretaker for our elderly parents? Please explain what I should do to correct my Medicare mistake.

Thank you, Susan from Cleveland, Ohio

Susan:

Most Americans do not realize that they must work a certain amount of time and pay taxes to have Medicare Part A at no cost. This is what your problem is and the Toni Says® Medicare office can help you solve your problem.

For you to qualify for Medicare you must have worked and paid Social Security and Medicare taxes from your payroll check. The Medicare Beneficiary must have worked at least 10 years or 40 quarters (paying taxes) to qualify for Medicare Part A at no additional cost. When you sign up for Medicare Part A, you may want to enroll in Part B, that also has a monthly premium, if you are not working full-time with yours or your spouse’s employer benefits.

The premium for Medicare Part A is

\$471 each month if you do not qualify for premium free Medicare Part A. If you paid Medicare taxes for 30-39 quarters not 40 quarters, then the standard Part A premium is \$259 each month.

Those who did not work or pay into Social Security System for 10 years and are married such as is your situation Susan, should apply for Medicare under their spouse’s Social Security number to qualify (if spouse worked 10+ years or 40+ quarters). If one never married or possibly lived with someone as a domestic partner and they did not work enough quarters, then they will have to pay for Medicare Part A.

My advice to you Susan would be to call your local Social Security office since it is the government office which oversees America enrolling in Medicare. Explain your situation that you have always been a stay-at-home spouse, your husband has worked enough quarters to qualify and that you need to appeal your Medicare Part A premium of \$471. Tell the Social Security representative that you are seeking premium-free Medicare Part A due to your husband having enough quarters to qualify.

Social Security will look over both yours and your husband’s Social Security accounts to verify that he has enough quarters. Be prepared to provide a certified marriage license showing you are married and will have to mail the original certified marriage license (not a copy) to that specific Social Security office.

For Medicare enrollment questions either call your local Social Security office specific 800 number or call the Toni Says Medicare hotline at 832/519-8664 for help.

I must confess that I'm not always obvious to everything that is before me. I admit I miss a lot of things set before me. I don't do this intentionally. The other day when I got up, I think my eyes were open, but I'm not sure. I stumbled out into the kitchen to get my morning coffee. On the way there, I heard a loud scream like a Comanche on the warpath and found myself dancing, and I don't dance. After a few seconds, I felt a pain coming from several of my toes up to the top of my head. I had no idea what happened. Social Security Matters

I was told by SS that I don't Qualify to Receive his Survivor Benefits

Dear Rusty: My husband and I were only married 5 years before he passed away from cancer. I am 61 and was told by SS that I don't qualify to receive his survivor benefits because we weren't married long enough, and because I made more money than him when he was alive. I still work fulltime and plan to continue until my full retirement age. Am I able to collect any of his benefits? Why can his daughter collect his benefits, but I cannot? **Signed: Frustrated Widow**

Dear Frustrated: You were given partially incorrect information by Social Security because you were married long enough to collect a survivor benefit, but there are also other rules which might affect your eligibility:

- You cannot have remarried before age 60 and be currently married.
- You cannot collect full survivor benefits if you exceed Social Security's annual "earnings limit." That you made more money than your husband (and are presumably entitled to a higher personal SS benefit) isn't material, but your earnings from work could be. If you didn't remarry before age 60 and remain married, and if you don't earn too much money, you are eligible to collect a survivor benefit as your husband's widow. You can



even claim your survivor benefit (only) while allowing your personal SS benefit to grow (if desired, up to age 70 when it reaches maximum). So, you may be eligible to collect a survivor benefit from your husband now, but if you're working full time, you may make too much money to be able to collect it at this time. Social Security has an "earnings test" which applies to those collecting early benefits and which limits how much you can earn before they take benefits away. For 2021, the annual earnings limit is \$18,960 and if you earn more than that they will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. That could mean you'll owe them more than you're entitled to in benefits, which would mean no benefits would be paid. Here's an example: Say you make \$60,000 per year working full time. If you collect the survivor benefit and because you haven't yet reached your full retirement age (FRA), you'll be subject to the earnings limit of \$18,960. At this earnings level you would exceed the limit by about \$41,000. Half of that amount would be about \$20,500, and SS would require you to repay them that amount from your SS benefits. Depending upon your survivor benefit amount, that could disqualify you from receiving monthly benefits. As you can see from this example, if you work full time but do not significantly exceed the annual earnings limit, you may be able to collect at least

some of your survivor benefits, but I cannot answer that without knowing your annual earnings and approximately what your survivor benefit would be. For clarity, the earnings test no longer applies once you reach your full retirement age. Regarding your husband's daughter collecting a survivor benefit from him: a surviving minor child of the deceased can collect a survivor benefit until they are 18 (or 19 if still in high school). An adult disabled child who was disabled before age 22, is also eligible to collect a survivor benefit from a deceased parent. So, let's recap: you were married to your husband long enough to be eligible for a survivor benefit, but you may have significant earnings which disqualify you from receiving those benefits right now. There is no longer an "earnings test" once you reach your FRA (66 years and 10 months), so at your FRA you could collect your full survivor benefit. And you could collect your survivor benefit only first and allow your own personal SS benefit to grow until you are 70 when it would be more than your survivor benefit. At that time, you would switch to your own benefit which would be about 25% more than your FRA benefit amount.
