15 Indicted in Cocaine and Heroin Trafficking **Conspiracies**

U.S. Attorney's Office Eastern District of California

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grand jury returned a 45-count indictment today against 15 defendants for a conspiracy to traffic cocaine, cocaine base, and heroin in the Sacramento area, Acting U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

The indictment charges the following defendants: Tyrone Anderson, 40, of Sacramento; Maurice Bryant, 51, of Antelope; Yovanny Ontiveros, 41, of Sacramento; Alex White, 61, of North Highlands; Jason Tolbert, 44, of Sacramento; Andre Hellams, 38, of North Highlands; Michael Hampton, 57, of Vallejo; Steven Hampton, 61, of Sacramento; Wilmer Harden, 52, of Elk Grove; Charles Sidney Carter, 34, of Sacramento; Bobby Conner, 50, of Sacramento; Jerome Adams, 54, of North Highlands; Dwight Haney, 49, of Sacramento; Arlington Caine, 47, of Rio Linda; and Mark Martin, 62, of Sacramento. The indictment charges Bryant, Harden, Anderson, Carter, Conner, Adams, Haney, Caine, Martin, White, Hellams, Tolbert, Steven Hampton, and Michael Hampton with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute at least 5 kilograms of cocaine and 280 grams of cocaine base. The indictment also charges Anderson and Ontiveros with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin. During and in furtherance of these conspiracies, the indictment charges certain defendants with distributing cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute heroin, possessing firearms as felons, and using communication facilities to facilitate drug trafficking offenses. According to court documents, between March 1, 2018, and May 19, 2021, law enforcement seized over 5 kilograms of cocaine, a kilogram of heroin, a half kilogram of cocaine base, and multiple firearms. "This investigation and indictment results in the dismantling of a network of long-time leaders and organizers in a regional cocaine, heroin, and crack cocaine distribution chain that stretches beyond the Continued on page 3

That still leaves more than 12 million Californians unvaccinated.

a one-stop-shop for vaccine appointments, most Californians turned elsewhere. But the state also maintains a confidential registry of all vaccine recipients. The names of winners will be kept confidential unless they volunteer to have them released, said Newsom.

Republican Gov. Mike DeWine of Ohio was the first to launch a statewide cash-forvax lottery program in mid-May. Nearly 3 million Ohioans entered and a 22-year-old recent college grad was the first winner on Wednesday. According to one analysis, vaccinations jumped by 40% in the week after DeWine's announcement.

Since then other state governors have followed suit. Colorado is offering a total of \$5 million to the newly inoculated. West Virginia has tempted vaccine-hesitant young residents with savings bonds and New York has dangled the possibility of a tuition-free public university education.

But California's cash giveaway is the biggest yet.

For Newsom, the program represents a political win-win. The governor has vowed to ease most of California's COVID restrictions by June 15. The more vaccinated Californians, the more likely it is that the reopening process will go off without another surge in cases and hospitalizations. That, in turn, would be good news for the state, but also a governor who is hoping to survive an all-but-certain recall election later this year.

In a Public Policy Institute of California poll released this week, 57% of likely voters said they oppose removing Newsom, while 40% said they supported the recall. In the survey, 61% approved Newsom's handling of the coronavirus pandemic and 75% gave the state excellent or good marks for vaccine distribution.

Earlier this month, the governor went on a statewide tour announcing various goodies from his latest revenue-rich budget proposal - a convenient mix of policymaking and politics. Handing out even more cash to Californians in the name of public health can't hurt the governor's political image either.

Republican John Cox quickly accused Newsom of trying to "buy votes before the recall."

Based on the nearly 20 million Californians who have received at least one dose now, the odds of winning the \$1.5 million prize are 1 in 2 million -100 times better than the chances of winning the Powerball or Mega Millions jackpots, but for far less money.

Newsom said the administration consulted with researchers at UCLA's COVID-19 Health and Politics project in putting the program together.

According to research conducted by political scientist Lynn Vavreck, lead researcher at the project, about a third of survey respondents said they were "more likely" to get a COVID vaccine if offered a cash prize of \$50 to \$100. That's compared to other tactics, including pro-vaccine public messaging from celebrities.

"Those types of message treatments did not work, but changing people's material condition – giving them a little bit of money or telling them they don't have to wear a mask anymore – made them more likely," Vavreck told CalMatters.

But for a minority of survey respondents - about 15% – the offer of cash backfired. That's consistent with some criticisms made of these lottery programs noting that some vaccine skeptics could falsely interpret a cash reward program as an indication that the vaccine presents a risk that has to be compensated.

Peter Chin-Hong, an infectious disease physician at the University of California San Francisco, said that different people remain unvaccinated for very different reasons - a lack of social pressure, inconvenience, concerns about common side effects and more unfounded and outlandish safety concerns - so a single policy isn't likely to convince them all

A possible cash incentive "will move the needle for the people on the fence," he said. "The people who are watching and waiting, who are not necessarily opposed to the vaccine but waiting to see people they know get it...that group will probably be most moved."

Earlier this month, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention announced that fully vaccinated Americans can largely dispense with mask-wearing and social distancing - providing a powerful incentive for many. Though California has been reluctant to adopt more coercive measures, such as a statewide vaccine passport requirement, the reopening rules allow fully vaccinated people to attend larger events. Also, state and local governments have imposed selective requirements on certain Californians – public university students are likely to be required to have their shots, though prison guards are not.

Multiple EDD Bills Get Senate's Nod of Approval

Senate Republicans announce the passage of Senate Bill 39, Senate Bill 58, and Senate Bill 390 by the Senate. These bills address some of the critical lapses in security at Development Department that have contributed to the rampant fraud in unemployment insurance claims this last year. Senate Republicans have made it a priority to correct some of the glaring issues at the agency that resulted in billions of dollars in fraud and ensure the agency is better prepared for the next economic downturn.

These include: SB 39, authored by Republican earlier this month and is

would require the EDD to cross check prison inmate records with unemployment claims to prevent benefits from going to prisoners. SB 390 would require the EDD to establish and routinely revise a recession plan to increase the department's efficiency during an economic downturn. California's Employment Republican Leader Scott Wilk, Senator Rosilicie Ochoa Bogh, Senator Brian Jones, Senator Melissa Melendez, and Senator Jim Nielsen are co-authors of SB 390. Senate Bill 58, authored by Republican Leader Wilk, would require the EDD to immediately end the practice of including full social security numbers on its most frequently mailed documents. SB 58 passed the Senate

Senator Shannon Grove, in the California State Assembly awaiting consideration. SB 232, authored by Republican Senator Nielsen, would implement all of the State Auditor's recommendations from the previous three audits of EDD. It is scheduled for a floor vote in early June.

"Government completely failed its unemployed citizens this past year and now the governor has failed to prioritize fixing the problems in his budget. It is just heartbreaking to hear from families teetering on the edge simply because their claims are lost in some bureaucratic black hole. These issues need to be addressed and corrected as soon as possible to ensure they do not happen again,"said Senate Republican Leader Scott Wilk (*R*-Santa Clarita). ★

Eastern District of California, through Southern California, and into Mexico," said Acting U.S. Attorney Talbert.

"This criminal organization utilized an interstate drug pipeline that reached far beyond the Sacramento region," said DEA Special Agent in Charge Wade R. Shannon. "These arrests underscore our commitment to rid communities of drug trafficking networks and the poison they peddle."

"The FBI is proud to partner with its local, state, and federal Strike Force partners to disrupt and dismantle violent criminal organizations that threaten the safety of the communities we serve," said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "Together, we are stronger, leveraging seamless communication and our individual strengths to identify and disrupt illegal drug distribution networks."

"The success of this indictment highlights the importance and necessity of law enforcement partnerships across the spec-

Any sentence, however, would be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. The charges are only allegations; the defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

This prosecution is part of the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Strike Force Initiative, which provides for the establishment of permanent multi-agency task force teams that work side-by-side in the same location. The Sacramento Strike Force is a co-located model enables agents from different agencies to collaborate on intelligence-driven, multi-jurisdictional operations to disrupt and dismantle the most significant drug traffickers, money launderers, gangs, and transnational criminal organizations. The specific mission of the Sacramento Strike Force is to identify, investigate, disrupt, and dismantle the most significant drug trafficking organizations (DTOs) and transnational criminal organizations (TCOs) shipping narcotics, firearms, and money through the Eastern District of California, thereby reducing the flow of these criminal resources in California and the rest of the United States. We human beings hate to admit failure. Even though our brains may know when some endeavor has failed, our emotions and our egos may drive us to continue trying to make it work.

Indeed, the syndrome has developed its own linguistic phrases, such as "throwing good money after bad," or "sunk costs," or "cutting our losses."

Private businesses are usually – but not always - willing to shut down or sell off ventures that don't pan out. Ford Motor Co. famously jettisoned the Edsel, a car named after the beloved son of founder Henry Ford, when the car failed to attract enough buyers. But the Boeing Co. stuck with an elongated ver- Brown's pet project – an sion of its 737 jetliner even after two crashed and killed 346 people, and is still trying to make it acceptable.

Government officials are generally less willing to admit failure, perhaps because, unlike business executives, they have no personal financial stakes in outcomes. Their guiding, albeit informal, rule is that launching new programs enhances one's standing while shutting down those that fail just angers their stakeholders.

California's recent history

programs and projects that deserved merciful deaths but have continued to soak up billions of dollars in taxpayer money.

The woebegone bullet train project is the most spectacular. Voters were promised a statewide network of high-speed trains when they passed a \$9.95 billion bond issue in 2008. Thirteen years later, we have only a few concrete structures in the Fresno area – no track, no trains and no certain date when even a relatively short segment will be operative despite the many billions of dollars spent, or wasted, so far.

It would take a book – a thick book – to fully describe all of the state government's highly touted, very expensive digital information projects that have failed to deliver the promised benefits. While it lacks the scale of the bullet train and the failed information technology projects, Calbright may fall into the same category.

It's former Gov. Jerry online community college that would offer high-quality, low-cost instruction to help working Californians upgrade their job skills.

Tens of millions of dollars have been sunk into Calbright over the past few years but it's actually provided instruction only to a few dozen students — at an enormous per-student cost, of course.

Last month, State Auditor Elaine Howle catalogued Calbright's failures, declaring that "A primary reason...is that newspapers.

is replete with examples of its former executive team failed to develop and execute effective strategies for launching the college."

> If Calbright doesn't shape up by next year, Howle told the Legislature, it should be axed. Five days before Howle issued her report, the state Assembly voted unanimously for legislation that "makes the California Online Community College Act inoperative at the end of the 2022-23 academic year."

To be fair, the legislation, Assembly Bill 1432, does not merely reflect an unwillingness to continue a project that has fallen short of its lofty goals. The bill is sponsored by the union that represents faculty at the state's 115 local community colleges and it opposed Calbright from the onset, fearing that it would undermine the existing system.

However, Calbright's obvious shortcomings made it vulnerable to a political death sentence. The fight over its fate now shifts to the state Senate, or perhaps will be decided when legislative leaders and Gov. Gavin Newsom negotiate a final 2021-22 budget deal behind closed doors this month.

If Calbright is jettisoned, perhaps it would mark a new willingness to stop throwing good money after bad. Now how about that bullet train to nowhere?

All Adults Should Get Tested for Hepatitis C

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - An estimated 2.4 million people are living with hepatitis C in the United States. However, many don't know they are infected because chronic hepatitis C does not have symptoms for 20 years or more. By that time, serious damage can occur to your liver and can lead to death. The good news is that life-saving treatments can cure hepatitis C in 8 to 12 weeks to prevent further liver damage, cirrhosis and liver cancer. Getting tested for hepatitis C is the first step.

'We want to educate the community that lives can be saved just by getting tested for hepatitis C. This virus is the leading cause of liver cancer and liver transplants," said Sacramento County Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye.

The liver is a vital organ that processes nutrients, filters the blood and fights infections. Hepatitis causes inflammation of the liver that can affect its function. Although hepatitis is caused by a virus and exposure to the blood of an infected person most often, toxins, some medications, certain medical conditions and heavy alcohol use can also cause hepatitis. The most common types of viral hepatitis in the U.S. are hepatitis A, hepatitis B and hepatitis C. Although all types of viral hepatitis can cause similar symptoms, they are spread in different ways, have different treatments, and some types of hepatitis are more serious than others.

Hepatitis C is caused by the hepatitis C virus. When someone is first infected with the hepatitis C virus, they can have a very mild illness with few symptoms or could require hospitalization. Less than half of people who get hepatitis C are able to get rid of the virus without treatment. Those who get infected will likely develop a chronic lifelong infection, which left untreated can cause serious health problems including liver disease, liver failure, liver cancer and death.

CDC recommends you get tested for hepatitis C if you: Are 18 years old and older; Are pregnant (get tested during each pregnancy); Currently inject drugs (get tested regularly); Have ever injected drugs, even if it was just once or many years ago; Have HIV; Have abnormal liver tests or liver disease; Are on hemodialysis; Received donated blood or organs before July 1992; Received clotting factor concentrates before 1987; Have been exposed to blood from a person who has hepatitis C; Were born to a mother with hepatitis C.

The hepatitis C test is a blood test that looks for HCV antibodies to find out if someone has ever been infected with the hepatitis C virus. Test results can take anywhere from a few days to a few weeks to come back. Rapid anti-HCV tests are available in some health clinics and the results of these tests are available in 20 to 30 minutes. If you are positive for the HCV antibodies, a follow-up test called NAT/PCR test will be done.

Inspector General Releases 2020 Annual Report

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -Sacramento County's Inspector General, Mark Evenson, has released the Office of the Inspector General's (OIG) 2020 annual report. The report is available for public view on the OIG's website.

Based on investigation reviews, feedback from the community, analysis of agency policies and procedures, and knowledge of national best practices, the OIG made a total of 20 recommendations within the following focus area categories:

Citizen Complaint Process; Transparency; Use of Force; COVID-19 Jail Protocols; Training

Also available in the report are some of the 2021 OIG focus areas, which include a review of inmate grievance procedures, a review of mental health screening and care of inmates, use of force trends, pursuit policy, litigation review, and implementation of the recently established Community Review Commission.

The Office of Inspector General is an independent monitor who provides oversight of investigations of citizen complaints against the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office to ensure they are objective, fair and complete. The OIG informs and advises the Board of Supervisors, the Sheriff and the County Executive relative to findings and recommendations.

In addition to the citizen complaint process, the OIG is responsible for examining policies and procedures within the Sheriff's Office and providing recommendations to ensure those policies and procedures are compliant with national best practices.


