Teaming up for Training

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - It's not uncommon for anyone traveling through Sacramento International Airport (SMF) to see a military aircraft, from nearby Air Force bases, operating on our runways and in our airspace.

Military cargo planes like the giant Lockheed C-5 Galaxy cargo plane, as well as the smaller and much more nimble Northrop T-38 Talon trainer, frequently use SMF and Mather Airport (MHR) for training.

"We are very proud to partner with our military colleagues and we are happy to provide them this opportunity," said Cindy Nichol, Director of Airports, Sacramento County Airport System.

Other military aircraft, including the Boeing C-17 Globemaster III, the McDonnell Douglas KC-10 Extender, and the Boeing KC-135

Stratotanker can also be seen conducting pattern and approach training exercises at SMF and Mather.

This is done for a variety of reasons, the most important being pilot familiarization for both military and commercial use airports.

Operating from a military airfield and into a commercial airport can provide a different environment for both military pilots and commercial aviation personnel. For the pilots of these aircraft, it's important to interact with civilian air traffic controllers and with civilian airfields in general.

"The reality is they need that training because they don't just use specific military airfields," said Joe Conklin, SMF Senior Airport Manager. "They have to be very familiar with different types of airport environments. It's important for them to understand that process."

Recently personnel from Beale AFB flew a T-38 into SMF to

conduct a familiarization exercise with SMF staff to share valuable information by taking a first-hand look at a T-38. SMF does not have a T-38 to train with, so SMF Airport Fire, Operations and Sherriff's deputies took the opportunity to educate themselves on things like how to release a canopy, make safe the ejection system and a variety of other life safety items.

"Should an incident ever occur at any of our Airports, this face-to-face and hands on training will make the response and recovery on both sides more efficient. It is important to sit down and talk about the needs and requirements on both side in advance; during any emergency is not the time to build those relationships," said Sheri Thompson-Duarte, Deputy Director, Operations & Maintenance.

Further site visits by aircraft from Travis AFB are currently being planned. ★

41 Elected DA's Challenge Early Release of 76,000 State Prison Inmates

- Sacramento District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced today that she and 40 elected District Attorneys across California, have filed a petition with the Secretary of the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) requesting the repeal of temporary emergency regulations awarding additional credits to more than 76,000 state prison inmates.

The regulations were passed under a claim of an emergency and first made public on Friday April 30, 2021, at 3:00 p.m. These regulations would result in the early release of some of California's most violent criminals.

In adopting these regulations, and claiming an emergency, the CDCR Secretary stated these regulations were necessary to comply with "the direction outlined in the Governor's Budget Summary" presented a year ago on May 14, 2020. By invoking an emergency, the traditional regulatory scheme and transparent public comment period was bypassed.

The administrative law petition is often the first step in seeking a formal court order declaring the regulations unlawful. If the emergency regulations are nullified by a court, CDCR would be forced to pass the regulations in the traditional manner, requiring the State's Office of Administrative Law to provide greater transparency and public input.

District Attorney Schubert stated, "Allowing the early release of the most dangerous criminals, shortening sentences as much as 50%, impacts crime victims and creates a serious public safety risk. This petition asks CDCR to repeal these regulations, begin the process anew, and allow for transparency and public input. Victims, their families, and all Californians deserve a fair and honest debate about the wisdom of such drastic regulations." ★

A Busy Playmakers Summer

Local Non-Profit Offers Free Inclusive Sports for At-Risk Kids

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Playmakers Organization is a local non-profit that offers free inclusive sports events for at-risk kids, including foster kids and kids with developmental differences. “Today, inclusiveness is more important than ever,” said Playmakers founder Greg Roeszler (Coach Roz). The Playmakers goal is to provide resources and support to families while giving kids the opportunity to participate in sports. Coach Roz said, “Team experiences help in their overall development, giving kids a sense of team and a sense of accountability.”

All kids deserve the chance to participate, play, and thrive – but not all kids have the same opportunities. At-risk kids are already more likely to be living in a home without a father figure, and Coach Roz explained that the risk increases even more if the child has a disability. Living in a single-parent home comes with challenges that make it more difficult to participate in team sports.

Foster children also face barriers to team sports. Frequent moves to new homes and schools create a lack of stability, making it nearly impossible for them to continue with a team sport. And foster families often can’t afford the high cost of traditional team sports, nor the commitment to multiple practices each week.

To bridge this gap in opportunity, The Playmakers Organization has a busy summer planned, with activities and events that will reach more than 2,000 kids and their families. The summer will begin with football camps in Buffalo,

New York; Omaha, Nebraska; and Orange City, Iowa. Here in the Sacramento Region, the Playmaker River City Fun Day cornhole tournament will

be held July 10 at River City Church, and The Harrison Phillips Man of the Year Golf Tournament will be held in Rancho Murieta on July

11-12. The Mike McGlinchey Playmaker Football Camp will be on July 17 at the Fremont School for the Deaf, and the Izzie Lueken Soccer Camp will

be held August 7 (location to be determined).


New this year, Playmakers is launching an All-Inclusive Sports league with weekly games. With a baseball season, football season, and basketball season, participants will be able to engage with sports year-round. The practice and game will be held on the same day, and kids can attend as often as they are able. Coach Roz explained that kids will be able to come whenever they can and they’ll have a uniform, a coach, a referee, teammates, and “people cheering for them.”

To reach the kids most in need, Playmakers is partnering with Autism Speaks; Big Brothers Big Sisters; and Defending the Cause Regional Alliance, which coordinates with foster agencies and advocates for children in the foster system.

Since Playmakers is designed to support kids and enrich their lives, Coach Roz wanted them to have a voice in the organization’s direction. The Playmakers Children’s Board of Directors gives kids a unique opportunity to learn leadership skills and responsibility. He says the most important thing for all children is to have someone “just communicate with them and develop a relationship with them.”

The league and camps are completely free to kids and their families. As a non-profit, Playmakers depends on generous donations from the community, and there are always various opportunities for volunteers and sponsorships.

RIO LINDA, CA (MPG) - Free Covid Shots were given out last Wednesday and Friday at the Rio Linda Public Library parking lot on 6th street. Thanks to Sally McGrath the Branch Supervisor for the Rio Linda Library who partnered with the Sacramento County Public Health Department. I went to the parking lot on Wednesday morning to look around and get information. While there, I met Hannah Aalborg, with the Sacramento County Health Department. I mentioned I was surprised to see all the military dressed persons setting up the tents.

“Yes, we have partnered with the Army National Guard, to get anybody and everybody their Covid shots who wants one,” she said.

While we were talking, she asked me to “please let the public know, you could also get your second shot in the series of two here. Even with your first shot given somewhere else, as long as it has been the time you were told between your first shot, you were welcome.”

I asked her what was needed, proof wise, to get the shot? Especially, since the shots were now opened to those 12 years of age and older.

“Most likely there is a parent bringing the child for their shot. Also, if they are an adult, we ask for driver’s license to prove you are who you say.”

“If you are asking for your 2nd shot, we ask for driver’s license AND the card you

received with your first shot.”

I asked her to tell me more about the Army National Guard there to help with the shots.

“The persons in the military uniforms are Army Infantry and the persons in ‘scrubs’ are also military, but, are in the Medical Corps of the Army.”

Hannah also said, “We have been partners with the Army Nation Guard since March of 2020. They worked with us when it was all about getting the Covid testing done. Then as the shots became more and more available to the general public, we reached out again for their help. We have a great partnership!!”

I could tell she was very proud of their help. She also mentioned the Sacramento County Health Department has partnered with schools, fire departments, Urgent Care and has a special team that goes out to the homeless community.

One last thing I needed to know was if they have plans to come right back here, to the Rio Linda Library parking lot, when the needed spacing of the shots was due?

“Oh, yes!” Hannah said. “We will be right back here, and I will let you know the dates and time as soon as we know.”

As I was saying goodbyes and great work, I was snapping pictures of the military people after asking permission from their supervisor. I made sure not to include patients. There was a nice healthy line of people wanting their shots, by 10:30 AM. Until the next time, smile a lot. ★

Employers Face Liability by Requiring COVID Shots

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG) - The new guidance from the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) states that employers could be held liable if they mandate employees to take COVID-19 injections as a condition of employment and then they experience adverse reactions.

Under a “Frequently Asked Questions” section of OSHA’s website it states: “If you require your employees to be vaccinated as a condition of employment (i.e., for work-related reasons), then any adverse reaction to the COVID-19 vaccine is work-related. The adverse reaction is recordable if it is a new case under 29 CFR 1904.6 and meets one or more of the general recording criteria in 29 CFR 1904.7.”

Recording requirements of serious work-related injuries and illness may leave employers with worker’s compensation claims and impact their safety record.

To avoid potential liability, employers should not require employees to receive any COVID shot.

Some employers are now offering financial incentives, opportunities to win prizes, or paid time off to receive the COVID shots. Employees who choose not to receive the “voluntary” injection and therefore miss an opportunity to receive a prize could argue they suffered “repercussions” for their

choice. In addition, the “professional advancement” of an unvaccinated employee who is not permitted to work at a particular job site may be affected. However, OSHA’s new guidance does not address these specific situations.

one of the COVID shots are approved or licensed by the FDA. They come under the Emergency Use Authorization, which means they cannot be forced or required.

On March 27, 2020, the Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary declared that circumstances exist justifying the authorization of emergency use (EUA) of drugs and biological products for COVID-19. That means people must be told the risks and benefits, and they have the right to decline a medication that is not fully licensed. The same section of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act that authorizes the FDA to grant EUA also requires the secretary of Health and Human Services to

“ensure that individuals to whom the product is administered are informed ... of the option to accept or refuse administration of the product.”

In addition to this federal law, the FDA includes the Nuremberg Code and the Helsinki Declaration on its website, emphasizing the fact that people cannot be forced to take experimental drugs without their full consent. Learn more at [LC.org/Vaccine](https://www.fda.gov/vaccine).

Liberty Counsel Founder and Chairman Mat Staver said, “Forcing employees to receive one of these experimental COVID injections is a violation of federal law. The COVID injections are not licensed by the FDA and are still in the investigation and experimental phase. No employer or government may force or coerce anyone to take these injections. Federal law requires full informed consent. Employers that require employees to take a COVID shot may be held liable for adverse reactions and death.” ★

Newsom Paints Rosy, but Flawed, Economic Picture

There is a seamless connection between what Gavin Newsom is saying and doing as governor and his campaign to survive a recall, encapsulated in the slogan “California Comeback.”

Newsom’s much-revised state budget, unveiled this month, is centered on a “\$100 Billion California Comeback Plan” that would, he says, put the COVID-19 pandemic and its economic fallout in the rearview mirror.

Last week, when new employment data were released by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics, Newsom immediately hailed them as proof that under his leadership, the state is booming again.

“California is continuing to lead the nation’s economic recovery, adding 101,800 jobs in April — 38% of all the jobs created throughout the entire country,” Newsom crowed. “Over the past three months, California has created 390,300 jobs. But we’re not letting up; the California Comeback Plan is the biggest economic recovery package in the state’s history and will provide historic investments in small businesses and workers to bring California roaring back.”

A closer examination of the latest employment numbers, however, indicates that — as politicians are wont to do — Newsom is cherry-picking the most favorable economic indicator while ignoring others that are less positive.

One of the latter is the state’s unemployment rate of 8.3% in April, unchanged from the March level despite the supposed surge in new jobs. It’s still markedly higher than the national jobless rate of 6.1% and is the nation’s second highest behind Hawaii’s 8.5%.

California’s unemployment rate had been the nation’s third highest in March, but New York improved enough to displace California in April. Four states were tied for having the nation’s lowest jobless rates of 2.8% in April. Arch-rival Texas was slightly higher than the national rate at 6.7%.

The data point cited by Newsom, that California added 101,800 jobs in April, 38% of the nation’s job gains, is also somewhat iffy.

The California Center for Jobs & the Economy, a business-supported research organization, points out that the jobs number is a “seasonally adjusted” estimate, rather than a hard count, noting that the federal agency “so far has revised their adjustment formula three times in an effort to overlay seasonal factors to data that is overwhelmingly driven instead by the pandemic.”

“The underlying unjust numbers instead show California gaining a stronger 151,500 nonfarm jobs, and the U.S. doing far better with a gain of

1,089,000,” the center’s analysis continued. “Using the adjusted data, California had 38% of the national jobs gain. Using the more relevant unadjusted, California had 14%. As of the April numbers, California has regained 48% of the non-farm jobs lost to the state shutdowns. The U.S. in total has regained 63%.”

Newsom’s Employment Development Department (EDD) simultaneously released its version of the federal jobs report, which demonstrated just how much ground California must regain to return to pre-pandemic levels.

EDD said that just 38,600 more Californians were employed in April than in March while 1.6 million remained unemployed — and that doesn’t count those who have dropped out of the state’s workforce.

The employment situation is especially daunting in Southern California. The Los Angeles region had the highest unemployment rate of any major U.S. metropolitan area in April at 11.7%, dragging down the state as a whole.

So, it would seem, California is recovering, bit by bit, the more than three million jobs lost when Newsom, under emergency decrees, closed large segments of the state’s economy a year ago to battle the pandemic. However, we still have a very long way to go before he can legitimately claim a California Comeback.

Toni:

My 86-year-old mother with Alzheimer’s needs 24-hour care and lives in a personal care home. She is enrolled in a Medicare Advantage HMO and taking her to the doctor is quite an ordeal.

Friends have suggested that I disenroll my mother from this HMO and return her to Medicare, then use “Telehealth” which is popular since COVID-19 has made medical changes, or I can ask about using a “House Call Doctor” for her.

Financially, it is costing over \$4,000 for her personal care home and she does not qualify for a Medicare Supplement due to her Alzheimer’s because I have tried. How do I find a doctor that does use telehealth or makes house calls like Dr. Welby did in the old days?

Is this something that Medicare or Medicare Advantage plan will pay for it? *Thanks, Trish from Atlanta, GA*

Trish:

I have good news for you because the Dr. Welby days are back for those on “Original Medicare” or Medicare Advantage plans. In today’s pandemic times with social distancing telehealth also known as telemedicine has become popular. These current doctor at-home office visits via the computer are keeping the sick from having emergency room hospital visits when one cannot get to the doctor’s office for a face-to-face meeting.

My advice to you Trish and the Toni Says® readers is to ask your family member’s primary care doctor or specific healthcare provider about which telehealth, house call or visiting physician organization that their office is contracted with, whether your family member has “Original Medicare with or without a Medicare Supplement, a retiree group medical plan or a Medicare Advantage plan.

Not only are doctors making telehealth or house call visits, but dentists, eye doctors and even mobile x-ray/ultra-sound

machines with technicians are visiting homes, assisted living facilities, nursing homes, etc.

A telehealth or house call visit can help keep those who are having a minor ailment turn into a major operation, keeping a frail Senior healthy and out of the hospital.

Doctor or medical provider visits by telehealth or house call services whether at home or at a long-term care facility such as assisted living or nursing home are being accepted and paid for by Original Medicare, Original Medicare with a Medicare supplement and Medicare Advantage plans (*depending on your house call provider or telemedicine service being in the Medicare Advantage plan’s network*).

House call doctors are generally board certified and the providers consist of doctors, physician assistants and nurse practitioners. The patient does not have to be home bound to qualify. The house call doctor can schedule regular appointments, especially if there is a chronic illness or you can schedule appointments as needed.

Trish, you are wise to look at all your mother’s options regarding disenrolling from her Medicare Advantage plan with her serious health situations. Many do not realize that you must qualify medically to apply for a Medicare Supplement which helps pay for what Medicare will not pay for. If she does not qualify, then she will pay the Medicare out of pocket amounts.
