Rebuilding Wind-blown Aviary

Wildlife Care Association Gets a Hand from Wells Construction Corporation

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - There was a mighty wind in February of this year. Trees were split in two, trampolines were flown out of yards and landed on the roadways. Four large electric and light poles were split in half that were in front of the High School. Yet, the blessing, no one seriously hurt.

One of the wind-blown buildings destroyed was the flight aviary used by The Wildlife Association. Again, a blessing, no birds were killed. There were three crows being treated for various issues in the aviary when the storm hit. The next day, two had flown off and one was stunned and sitting next to the twisted wooden and

wire mess. The two never returned and live happily out in the wild, the one behind was treated and when well was released too.

Here's some information about the Wildlife Care project while I watch the quick build. The workers that run the rescue at the Wildlife Care Association, are mostly volunteers. Even the workers in front of me, building, the new Aviary are volunteers from, Wells Construction Company with their day job being workers for the same Wells Construction. Jim Brown was my contact for the new construction. More about him and the volunteers to come in part 2 of this article.

When I checked in this morning, I met a man named Dave Gish. While

we gathered around the donated donuts and coffee, both were still hot, cream filled, jelly filled, french curlers, Okay okay you get it, I love my writing jobs. Anyway, he started telling me all about the how, when, why of the goals of the Wildlife Care Association. He himself has been on board this program since 2015. He volunteered for a year before he was able to go to his first release of a healed bird.

"Amazing to watch", he said. "They sit in the back unsure to move forward. Sometimes you have to tilt the cage forward, sorta making them fall to the front and then they get it and fly off; what a sight!"

Got a Room or House for Short-Term Rental?

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA - Got a room or a home you want to list, or are listing, on Airbnb or a related service? Sacramento County would like to remind homeowners that prior to accepting guests, short-term/vacation rentals require a permit and a business license, and they must register to pay transient occupancy taxes for visitors.

Short-term/vacation rentals are defined by stays of less than 30 days. Sacramento County updated its regulations in 2018 to clarify that houses and apartments cannot be used exclusively for short-term/vacation rentals. Rentals must be an "accessory use" to the property, meaning the owner must live in the house for at least six months of the year.

The Board of Supervisors adopted this requirement to make sure short-term rentals do not disrupt neighborhoods and to limit traditional rental units from being converted to short-term use.

Stays of 30 days or longer do not require a permit.

If you are using your primary residence as a short-term rental, or are thinking of taking the plunge, please follow these steps:

Review the guidelines and application materials for a Short Term Rental Permit; Apply for a General Business License. You will need to set up an account with the Department of Finance to complete the application. Please do not submit until after you have received your Short Term Rental Permit; Register with the Tax Collector's Office for Transient Occupancy Tax returns once you have your business license.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - When the pandemic restrictions began in 2020, Sonia Weaver of Citrus Heights decided to start a podcast that she calls Discover the ‘Burbs. “The original idea was . . . to let people know about the people who were suffering in their own communities, and hopefully encourage them to patronize local shops.” Her more recent podcasts have evolved to chronicle the outdoor activities available in the suburbs of Sacramento. “Everyone wants to get out and be physical and find things to do,” Sonia said, “but they sometimes just don’t know where to go or what to do.” Sonia came up with an initial list of 58 locales, hikes, kayaking sites and activities to be enjoyed within a 50 mile radius of Sacramento. “I just keep adding to the list when I talk to people about the podcast,” Sonia said. “They tell me about places . . . and the list just keeps getting longer.” The April 5 episode features pickleball, and for April 19, Sonia will be kayaking to Lake Natoma Island. Past episodes include hikes to Old Salmon Falls Bridge near El Dorado Hills,

and Middleridge Trail near Fair Oaks. Currently the episodes come out every other week. “I enjoy so much getting out in nature,” Sonia said. “It gives me a reason to go explore new places, and so for me this is a perfect project . . . One of my favorite things is taking along friends that I haven’t normally hiked and gone on adventures with.” She went to the Old Salmon Falls hike with the Bartletts – Jake, Shamay and three of their five children. In addition, Discover the ‘Burbs podcast helps people know what to expect and how to prepare. “I would love if people want to suggest places that they love to visit, that they would like to share,” Sonia said. To make suggestions, just e-mail discovertheburbs@gmail.com Sonia’s husband Richard Weaver, who is an avid runner, said that Sonia always needs something to do. “This is a really great project for her,” Richard said. “I’ve listened to them all . . . but the people that are just talking about their lives, those are the ones I like best.” Sonia’s podcast of January 18, 2021, titled “Creating Your Own Limits” features Richard. Sonia is a longtime resident of the Sacramento area and teaches Spanish

at Bella Vista High School. She is a world traveler as well, having visited Nicaragua a couple of times, where she helped establish a program to teach English to children at an orphanage. “If they begin to learn English,” Sonia said, “they can get a job in the tourism industry, which is much more lucrative than most other things they can do.” She has also traveled to Italy and Spain, and in Central America to Honduras, Belize, and Mexico. She lived a year and a half in Argentina. To listen on an iPhone people can use Apple podcast, Spotify, or other apps, and for Android, Google Play; also people download apps like iHeartradio or Stitcher. It is on the Web at <https://www.buzzsprout.com/1247372>. Originally the purpose of the podcast was to promote getting to know those that live around you, to foster love and understanding. The current subject of hikes and activities near Sacramento fits into that purpose quite well, as families go outside and bring their friends and neighbors. Sonia felt that one reason there is such a lack of love in the world is that people just don’t know each other. “I was hoping that if people could just get to know those that live around them, they would see that we share lots in common,” Sonia said. “We are all passing through the same things, and it would encourage people to reach out to people around them as well.”

Traffic Safety Partners Stress Dangers of Distracted Driving



California Highway Patrol Press Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP), California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) and Impact Teen Drivers (ITD) are working together this April to remind Californians of the dangers of not giving the road their full attention when behind the wheel as part of Distracted Driving Awareness Month. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reports 3,142 people were killed in motor vehicle crashes involving distracted drivers in 2019 nationwide. That same year in California, there were at least 18,698 crashes from distracted driving that resulted in 108 deaths and more than 13,500 injuries. “Driving safely requires your full attention,” CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray said. “Distractions put you and others on the road at risk. Together, with our traffic safety partners, enforcement, and the cooperation of the motor- ing public, we can save lives and eliminate this dangerous behavior on California’s roadways.”

Distractions are not limited to cellular phones. Other electronics, children, pets, and eating or drinking while driving can also divert attention and result in a crash. Breaking distracted driving laws becomes more serious this year. Beginning July 1, a violation for using a handheld cellular phone or texting while driving will result in a fine and also add a point to the driver’s record for each violation occurring within 36 months of a prior conviction for the same offense. “Distracted driving is a serious issue that is 100 percent preventable,” OTS Director Barbara Rooney said. “That text, phone call, or social post is never more important than the task of driving.” As part of Distracted Driving Awareness Month, the first week of April is California Teen Safe Driving Week. Throughout the week, CHP and ITD will place an increased emphasis on informing California’s newest drivers about the dangers and consequences of reckless and distracted driving. “Parents, your kids have been watching you drive since they were in a forward-facing car seat,” Kelly Browning, Ph.D., executive director of ITD, said. “Your driving habits will become their driving habits – be the driver you want your kids to be.” The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

told me since he started, 1750 animals have been rehabbed and released. When you think about that number in terms of them coming in with all kinds of needs it is amazing they lived. He said they come in a lot from being hit by a car, with the Raptors usually from systematic poisoning, which is usually caused when they have eaten an affected prey animal killed by poison. They personally do not have the license to keep the raptors, but can care for them until they can be turned over to a licensed care facility. There is an emergency number that is 916-965-9453. It is an answering machine, monitored, and your call will be returned.

I keep talking about “birds” because it is the Aviary being built. But, Dave wants it know they rehab all types of critters. Raccoons, opossums, turtles, and if they can’t or are not licensed they refer you to a care facility that can help you. For instance they do not have the facilities for deer rescue, but they do have, Kindred Spirits up the hill that does only deer rehab. They also are in contact for over 20 years, with Hope Swinimer of East Coast Canada Rehab, for placements. Most mammals, Dave said, go out to private homes where the care giver has gone through a training and care program before they can actually care for them in their homes. For instance, there is Chris with the endearing name of

“the crazy racoon lady”. At one time she had 38 in different stages of getting well. He named other such people whom he works with with similar endearing names and preference of certain animals.

Two donuts down, I think, and after writing all these notes, I asked Dave if there was anything else before I closed out this week’s story on the beginnings of The Wild Life Association. He said he wanted people to know when animals are well and returned to the wild, they have a policy of where to return the animal. Adult birds are released within 10 miles of where they were found. Raccoons and Skunks must be released within 10 miles from any buildings or properties where people live or work. Lastly, there is ALWAYS A THRILL to be there when you release an animal. He LOVES being here. Also, always looking for volunteers to help with rehab, feedings, cleaning etc.

I thanked him for his time and information. Then looking lovingly back at that half full box of doughnuts, I threw away my napkin and coffee cup. I told him there was too much information for just one article and that the following week’s article will be about the Flight Aviary being built all the ins and outs and how they got the money and supplies... Shook his hand and head out to write this up before I can’t read my scribbles. Until next week, be safe and hug yourself first!! ★

began volunteering at Mather VA Medical Center in California by providing rides to patients in need. It wasn’t long before Frank found himself being asked by Volunteer Services to deliver some items of home furnishings to the new living quarters of enrolled formerly homeless veterans at the request of Mather VA social workers who were implementing the HUD-VASH program The U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development-VA Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) program is a collaborative program between HUD and VA which combines HUD housing vouchers with VA supportive services to help homeless veterans and their families find and sustain permanent housing.

With Diana’s support and encouragement, Frank’s furniture delivery program grew along with other hospital programs, and he found himself coordinating the work of several volunteers from within American Legion Post 861 and VFW Post 10125 as well as family members, friends, and even veterans who received furniture. Eventually, Frank was paying for as many as seven storage units himself, and delivering furniture to Woodland, Davis, Jackson, Elk Grove, Del Paso, and to all cities in the Greater Sacramento Area. These home furnishings have been picked up from donors by members of the volunteer furniture team, and were initially stored in 10’x20’ commercial

storage units and delivered to the new living quarters of enrolled formerly homeless veterans at the request of Mather VA social workers who are implementing the HUD-VASH program. As the program grew, so did the storage requirements that were not donated. Frank has been struggling for several years to get help from Mather VA and local government to provide storage facilities, and to acquire some financial support from local Veterans Service Organizations to help take some of the load off, so he wouldn’t have to continue paying for the needed storage units himself, but without much success.

Over the years, volunteers who have helped Frank with the furniture delivery program include Diana Squire, Dana & Ruth Johnson, Roger Meier, James Sullivan, William Holmes, Ed McDaniels, Brian Womack, John Lowe, Brent Downend, Peter & Lisa Harnett and their son Owen and daughter Lily, Mike Harris, Janet Whetstone, plus several

formerly homeless vets.

CONGRATULATIONS and THANK YOU, Frank, and to all of you who have volunteered your time, hard work, vehicles, and gasoline to deliver home furnishings to many hundreds of grateful formerly homeless veterans!

Kiefer Landfill Accepting Treated Wood Waste

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Treated wood, or pressure-treated wood, has been treated with a chemical preservative to protect it from decay. It is considered hazardous waste by the state of California. Fence posts and decking material are the most common household uses. It is also found in guardrail posts, railroad ties and pilings.

On Jan. 1, the state law that allowed disposal of treated wood waste in California landfills expired. As a result, acceptance of treated wood waste at the Kiefer Landfill – and for landfills across the state - was suspended.

The Sacramento County Department of

Waste Management and Recycling applied for and received a variance from the state to accept the material.

Customers are asked to keep treated wood waste separate from any other items in their load. Regular Kiefer Landfill facility fees will apply.

Commercial haulers are required to obtain a California Department of Toxic Substances variance. For information, visit the Department of Toxic Substance Control website.

Pandemic has Damaged California’s School Children

A comprehensive history of the COVID-19 pandemic’s effect on California would surely conclude that the state’s school children have been treated shamefully.

The incessant political squabbling over closing and reopening schools, and the sporadic efforts at in-home learning, have once again demonstrated that the supposed adults who manage and operate public education in California are more focused on their own interests than on the wellbeing of students.

Indeed, one could easily describe what has happened and not happened in the schools as child neglect on a massive scale.

California schools were not a roaring success even before pandemic struck more than a year ago. By almost any measure, we lagged behind other states, particularly in meeting the needs of the more than three million students classified as poor or English-learners.

The many billions of dollars that the Legislature appropriated to improve their outcomes under former Gov. Jerry Brown’s Local Control Funding Formula were often misdirected with little accountability.

When the coronavirus

reared its ugly head, schools were quickly shuttered and educators scrambled to replace classroom instruction with at-home instruction via the Internet. But once again, many of the children already at risk of failure were left behind, lacking the resources and/or familial support to participate.

The damage has been huge, widening the already yawning gap between the at-risk students and their more privileged peers. A new report on impacts in Los Angeles Unified School District, the nation’s second largest school system, reveals the extent of the damage.

LA Unified’s classrooms have been closed for more than a year and will only begin to reopen later this month, largely due to conflicts between the district’s managers and its unions – a syndrome that’s delayed reopening in many large urban districts.

“The COVID-19 pandemic has interrupted the livelihoods, health, education, childcare, and financial stability of millions,” says the report issued by Great Public Schools, a local advocacy group. “Students in Los Angeles Unified School District...are experiencing the painful loss of connection with their peers, teachers and school staff, and serious loss of learning that will have life-long consequences if not addressed.”

“We may not know the full impact of this last year on our students for another year or more, but the preliminary data we have paints an alarming picture,” the report adds.

Among the specific findings, based on LA Unified’s own data:

40% of LAUSD middle and high schoolers were disengaged or absent from classes in spring 2020; Disengagement was likely even higher for elementary students; More than 13,000 middle and high school students were consistently disengaged in fall 2020. An additional 56,000 did not actively participate on a daily basis; Two-thirds of LA Unified students are falling behind in literacy and math. Fewer young students of color are on target in reading skills compared to a year earlier; Across all academic progress indicators, students of color, low-income students, English learners, foster children, students with disabilities and homeless students have been set back further than their more advantaged peers; Many high school students are at risk of not graduating. Currently, 20% of the class of 2021, 43% of the class of 2022, 37% of the class of 2023, and 30% of the class of 2024 will not graduate.

These numbers are – or should be – shocking and embarrassing to every adult involved in the operation of California schools, from Gov. Gavin Newsom downward. Not only are the futures of the affected children dimmer but their educational lapses will affect the entire state for decades to come.

Social Security Matters

Can I Still Suspend My Social Security Benefits?

Dear Rusty: Is it still possible to suspend Social Security benefits for a time? And, if so, how often? **Signed: Curious Senior**

Dear Curious Senior: If you have already reached your full retirement age and are receiving Social Security benefits which you claimed earlier, you can voluntarily suspend your benefits to earn Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) and get a higher benefit amount when your payments are resumed. While your benefit payments are suspended, you will earn an additional .67% for each full month of suspension (8% per full year of suspension). If you wish to do so, you can suspend until you

are 70 years old, after which you will no longer receive Delayed Retirement Credits, and your benefit will have reached maximum.

At age 70, Social Security will automatically restart your benefit at the higher amount, as appropriate for the number of DRCs you earned while suspended. If you prefer or need the money sooner, you can request that your benefit be restarted earlier than age 70.

You can voluntarily suspend and restart benefits more than once if that is necessary, but the process requires some lead time to stop/restart benefits and there are other important factors to consider. If you suspend your personal SS retirement benefit now to gain a higher payment amount later, while you are suspended no other benefits based on your record (such as a spousal or other dependent benefits) will be paid. And, if you currently have your Medicare premium deducted from your Social Security benefit, suspending your SS benefits will require you

to make alternate arrangements for direct payment of your Medicare premium(s). You would need to pay your Medicare premium via mail or by direct withdrawal from your bank account, or by charging a credit/debit card. If you decide to suspend your Social Security payments, you will need to contact Social Security directly at 1.800.772.1213 (or call your local SS office) to do so. When requesting your benefit suspension, you can also make arrangements through Social Security to pay your Medicare premium separately.

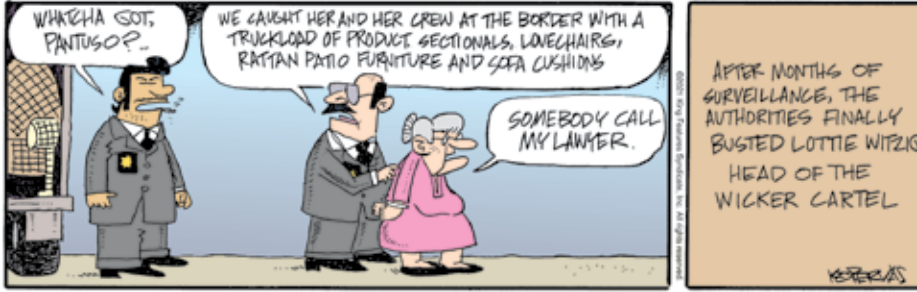

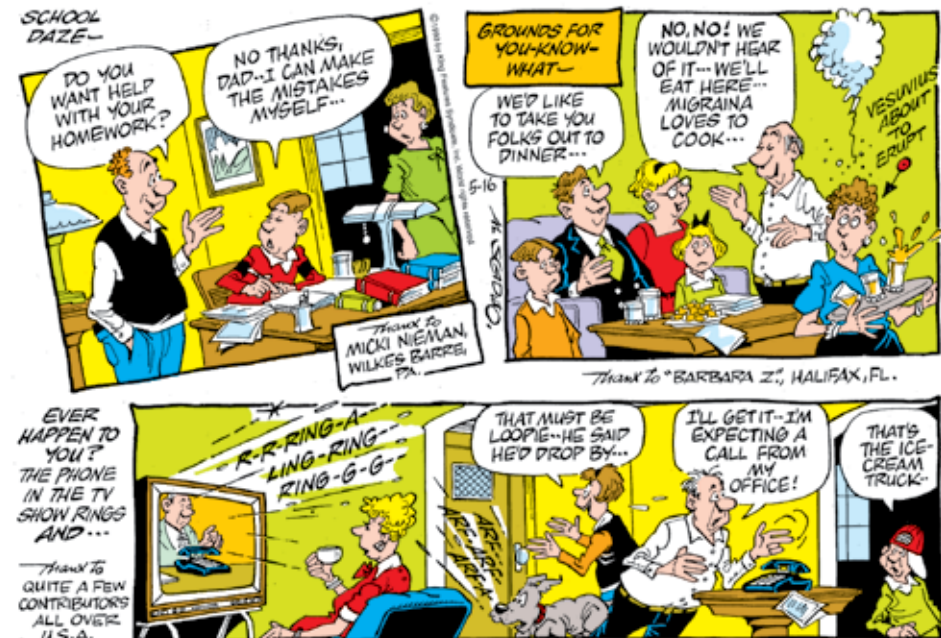

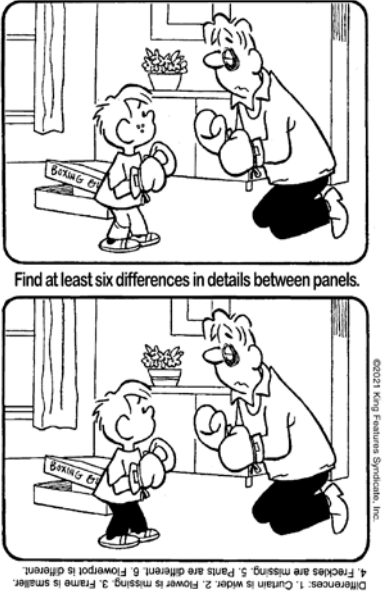
