SMUD's Plan for 59th Street Project

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The SMUD Board of Directors approved the SKK Developments and BlackPine Communities team as the developer for its 59th Street Reuse project, which will redevelop its 59th Street site into a multi-use, sustainable, transit-oriented, infill project that will help achieve SMUD's ambitious carbon reduction goals by serving as an all-electric development.

The proposed project consists of 108 single-family homes, 770 multi-family homes, light-rail station relocation, an Olympic-sized swimming pool, community garden and event center, child-care facilities and a central parking garage. The project plan will continue to evolve after further technical studies and discussions with the community, SMUD and the city of Sacramento.

"We're excited to work with SKK/BlackPine," said SMUD Board President Nancy Bui-Thompson. "They really listened to the community's needs and developed a top-notch proposal centered around public input, resulting in a proposal that embodies the spirit of SMUD and the needs of our region."

"SKK/BlackPine delivers a wealth

of community enhancements while furthering our goals of sustainable buildings and clean transportation," said SMUD General Manager and CEO Paul Lau. "It's a win-win for everyone."

SMUD's 59th Street Reuse project was purchased from PG&E when the company took over providing electric service to the community in 1946. Since then, the community and the utility have grown exponentially and SMUD moved its field services to its new East Campus building off Bradshaw Road. Since then, it's engaged in an extensive process to evaluate the property and decide future plans.

One of SMUD's core values is to enhance the vitality of its community and, as part of the value, engaged local residents, community groups and city leaders in discussions about community needs and ideas for the redevelopment of the property.

SMUD began the selection process in September 2019 with a request for qualifications, followed by an invite for formal request for proposals by two highly qualified companies. After thorough review and evaluation, SMUD chose the SKK/

BlackPine proposal.

While SMUD continues to complete remediation, SKK/BlackPine will start detailed project planning, environmental review and work with the city on final approvals. In addition, SKK Developments and BlackPine Communities plan a robust community engagement program, beginning with a virtual forum later this month open to neighbors and other interested community members.

The project will take an estimated 5-7 years, and SMUD will continue to be involved as agreed upon.

As the nation's sixth-largest, community-owned, not-for-profit electric service provider, SMUD has been providing low-cost, reliable electricity for almost 75 years to Sacramento County (and small adjoining portions of Placer and Yolo Counties). SMUD is a recognized industry leader and award winner for its innovative energy efficiency programs, renewable power technologies, and for its sustainable solutions for a healthier environment. Reopen California Now!

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Believing the COVID shutdowns are an opportunity to turn the State's current direction, the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce hosted a Reopen CAL NOW gathering on Monday, February 15, to represent the economic segments still affected.

The event featured local community and business leaders speaking at the commercial block at 7010 Sunrise Blvd., Citrus Heights—right next to the R Vida Cantina Mexican Restaurant. Kevin Miles, co-owner of the dining establishment joined the 30 people attending:

"We've been dealing with this all year, but after you put people in a corner," Miles said, "I could not look at the employees in the face and tell them they are all being laid off... so I took the decision to stay open."

Miles expressed his gratitude to the City of Citrus

Heights for its efforts in being included in the Great Plates Program: "without [that] our business could not have survived."

Event organizer, Arcade realtor Lilian Fulton, told the crowd that the trickle-down effect had been devastating to many: "Parents are not capable of teaching new math to their

children, some have not received unemployment checks since June and July, and all that some have for socializing is Zoom!"

Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce president Amanda Camacho commented, "None of us could have been prepared for how the COVID shutdown has affected businesses from the

local mom-and-pop shops to national franchises... but I am glad we came out today to discuss... the next steps for our community."

Also attending the meeting was elected Sacramento County Fourth District Supervisor Sue Frost. She said that, as before, good data has been very hard to obtain from the State. Most of the information she sought was not available, too hard to understand or did not answer her questions.

"There is a very loose requirement for COVID deaths, and hospitals are receiving money for every COVID death," she said, "this really makes us question the data."

Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) supported the group and gave his view that Governor Newsom's handling of COVID-19 highlighted and "amplified all that was already wrong with California" from political partisanship to the teachers unions and Big Business. ★

Looming Tax Tsunami Requires Immediate Action to Protect Unemployed

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California Senate Republicans are concerned about the looming tax tsunami facing unsuspecting and unemployed Californians stemming from mismanagement and fraud in the state's Unemployment Insurance program. Senate Republicans delivered a letter to Governor Newsom urging him to take immediate action to help those innocent victims.

Californians will begin receiving 1099-G tax forms summarizing their taxable earnings from unemployment benefits. Not only will the tax bill come as a shock to recipients, there is a distinct possibility many victims of fraud will be left on the hook for taxes on money never received. The Employment Development Department (EDD) has struggled to do even the slightest thing right during the pandemic and to think this agency could straighten this out on its own prior to tax day is unfathomable.

By the end of 2020, EDD had paid out \$10.4 billion in benefits to claimants whose identities were unverified and that figure could climb as high as \$30 billion. This resulted in frozen bank accounts, stalled benefit payments and a variety of other problems each of our offices has been tirelessly working to help these individuals with over the last ten months.

The Auditor's report last week underscored Californians' worst nightmare by pointing out the potential problems with regard to tax liability. Without immediate action by the Governor and our federal representatives, innocent people will be left to fight the IRS over tax liabilities for benefits they never received.

Senate Republicans share the auditor's concerns, and want to ensure the Newsom Administration is taking every action possible to enact the auditor's recommendation to promptly assist victims of identity theft and help them avoid tax liabilities for unreceived benefits. April 15 is just a few months away and Republicans are rightfully concerned the agency will be unable to effectively address this new challenge.

... As we enter the tax filing season, many Californians will be surprised to learn that they have tax liabilities for UI benefits that were fraudulently claimed in their name. This is because 1099-G forms will soon be arriving in the mailboxes of taxpayers who were victims of identity fraud. Even more concerning is that there will be victims of identity fraud who will have no idea why they even received one of these forms until after they file taxes. This is because EDD is generally going

to mail the 1099-G to the most recent addresses of record, which are the ones the bad actors used to obtain UI benefits.

The State Auditor shares our concern for the tax liabilities for victims of this identity theft and recommends that EDD should prepare to assist victims of identity theft to ensure that they receive prompt assistance and avoid tax liabilities for benefits they never received. Specifically, the auditor recommends that EDD must prepare to respond to victims of identity theft who receive incorrect tax forms, and should, by mid-February 2021, provide information on its website and set up a separate email box for such individuals to contact EDD and receive prompt resolution. We wholeheartedly agree with this recommendation, but remain skeptical about the agency's ability to do it effectively, if at all. Our offices are currently hearing from the same amount of constituents as we did last spring, who are seeking help from EDD because of problems with identity verification, backlogged claims, and frozen accounts. ...

Last week, Senate Republicans requested legislative leadership for an immediate oversight hearing to discuss ways to implement the State Auditor's recommendations. An oversight hearing was held on Wednesday, February 3 with the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) and the Assembly Insurance Committee. ★

Mystery Brings Unlikely Departments Together

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - This past December, a routine storm drain clearing led to an inter-departmental collaboration to identify the remains of a missing local man.

On Dec. 8, 2020, Sacramento County Department of Water Resources (DWR) employees were clearing a storm drain near Gordon Drive in Sacramento. While unclogging their vacuum machine, the crew manually pulled what was thought to be a stick out of the muck that clogged the machine only to find a shoe attached. It turned out to be a human leg bone and foot. DWR crews stopped work and notified the Sheriff's Department.

"Water Resources works regularly with law enforcement. Our staff teams up with deputies throughout the year as we clean up drainage culverts and water pipes because we run into homeless camps. We ask for the deputies' assistance to make sure nobody is harmed by our machines," said Water Resources Director, Michael Peterson. "So when our crews came across human remains, while shaken up by their discovery, they kept their cool and knew to call the Sheriff's Office for assistance."

When Sheriff's Office detectives responded to the scene, they discovered what appeared to be an additional bone in the storm drain. Detectives contacted the Sacramento Coroner's Office to assist with further evaluation of the remains.

Deputies and a Forensic Pathologist from the Coroner's Office responded to the scene. The leg bone and an additional bone found in the storm drain were determined to be human. Coroner personnel also searched a second area of the storm drain and discovered even more bones. The bones were

retrieved by Coroner personnel and were found to be an almost complete human skeleton.

In addition to the skeletal remains, a debit type card with no name printed on it was also recovered. The debit card company was contacted by the Sheriff's Office and it was learned that the card belonged to a male subject that had been reported missing. The male subject was last seen in November of 2018.

After seeing news reports of remains being found in the area of Stockton Blvd and Gordon Drive, the family of the missing male contacted the Sacramento County Coroner's Office to see if the bones found in the storm drain could belong to their missing relative.

The brother and daughter of the missing person provided DNA samples to the Sacramento County Coroner's Office. The Coroner's Office ran the DNA samples provided by the family and a sample from the remains using their ANDE Rapid DNA instrument. The Coroner's office was able to confirm that the remains belong to the missing male subject, and this case came to a close.

"While my team often works with the Sheriff's Office, we don't usually work with Water Resources, so this was a unique experience for us," said Kim Gin, Sacramento County Coroner. "This was a great example of County employees, that don't usually work together, coming together to identify this local man and bring some closure to his family."

The Sacramento County Coroner's Office has 73 active "John Doe" and "Jane Doe" cases dating back to 1975, and they need your help to identify them. Planning and Designing a Productive Vegetable Garden

Whether planning your first, second or tenth vegetable garden it can be overwhelming. There are so many tasty vegetables and never enough space and time to grow them all.

Start with a plan. Locate your garden in a sunny location with moist, well-drained soil. Save those partially sunny areas for greens like lettuce, chard and kale as well as root crops like radishes and beets. These prefer full sun but will tolerate more shade than tomatoes, peppers, squash, broccoli and other plants we eat the flowers and fruit.

Review your favorite recipes and make a list of family favorites and those vegetables most often used. Then check the list to see which vegetables are suited to your climate and growing conditions and those that make the most economic sense to include in your garden.

Tomatoes and peppers produce lots

of fruit from one plant and are common ingredients in many recipes. Sweet corn is fun to grow but needs lots of space for a relatively small harvest. If space is limited, consider buying your sweet corn at the farmers' market and use that space to grow other edibles.

Every gardener struggles with determining how many of each type of vegetable to grow. This depends upon the productivity of the variety selected, your family's eating habits and of course the impact of weather on the harvest. It is always better to start small, build on your successes and expand the garden in the future. Track your planting and harvesting results to help when planning future gardens.

You will need to plant more if you plan to preserve or donate a portion of your harvest. Purchasing vegetables from your local farmers' market is a way to ensure you have sufficient fresh produce when you are ready to can, freeze and ferment.

Sound overwhelming? Consider enlisting help from Gardener's Supply by using one of their vegetable garden plans (gardeners.com). You'll find customized plans for those who like to cook, want to grow ingredients for a garden-fresh salad, salsa or cocktails, or are following a Mediterranean diet. Many come with seed packets for all the featured plants.

Maximize the available space by growing vertically. Train pole beans, peas, tomatoes, cucumbers and even squash and melons up trellises. Growing vertically not only saves space, but also increases disease resistance by increasing light and airflow through the plants. And picking beans at waist height is much easier than harvesting from low-growing, bushy plants.

Increase space with containers. Consider growing some of your frequently used herbs and vegetables in pots on the patio, balcony, or deck for convenience. You can quickly grab what you need when creating your favorite meal.

Grow multiple plantings in each row. Start the season with cool season veggies like lettuce, peas and radishes. Once the temperatures climb and these plants are harvested and enjoyed, replace them with warm weather vegetables like tomatoes, peppers, beans, cucumbers, squash and melons. Finish off the season by filling any vacant rows with fall crops like greens, beets and radishes.

Take some time to plan a garden that will provide you and your family with fresh produce you can enjoy all season long. Involving everyone in the planning process just might get them to show up and help weed.

Planning to Travel Internationally?

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - If you are planning to travel internationally please be aware beginning Jan. 26 changes will be made to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) (CDC) travel mandates.

Effective January 26, 2021 the CDC will require all international air passengers entering the United States (including U.S. citizens and Legal Permanent Residents) to present a negative COVID-19 test, taken within three calendar days of departure, or proof of recovery from the virus within the last 90 days. Airlines must confirm the negative test result or proof of recent recovery for all passengers prior to boarding. Airlines must deny boarding of passengers who do not provide documentation of a negative test or recovery.

Alaska, American, jetBlue, Southwest, Aeromexico and Volaris offer nonstop flights between SMF and destinations throughout Mexico. Please visit our website or contact the airlines for more information about flights <https://sacramento.aero/smf/flight-and-travel/airlines>.

County Shares Winter Response for Homeless

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County is in the midst of a challenge it has not seen before. Between severe weather events, a continued public health pandemic and housing instability, the challenges of responding to the needs of the homeless population are greater than ever.

The County continues to adapt and respond in real time and develop and operate ongoing programs and services that deliver real and permanent change.

For many years, the Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance (DHA) has run a motel voucher program for persons experiencing homelessness that are particularly vulnerable due to age, illness, injury or other highly vulnerable situations such as families with children. The program provides them with short motel stays in a moment of crisis, coupled with on-going supportive services.

In an effort to increase sheltering capacity over the winter months, the Continuum of Care (CoC) Board approved up to \$600k in additional funding in December to expand the motel voucher program into a weather-related response. Approximately 60 additional motel rooms are now available for a minimum of three nights or longer during extended weather events.

This approach offers several advantages to warming centers: (1) It relies on outreach partners to identify unsheltered people who would not otherwise be reached; (2) It offers several days of stay (compared to an overnight stay at a warming center); (3) It allows people to shelter with pets and partners and in privacy, which is critical during COVID-19; (4) It coordinates transportation for unsheltered people to the motels.

The following criteria will trigger a weather-related response: (1) Nighttime lows of 37 degrees or lower for two or more days within a five-day span; or (2) Rain for two or more consecutive days (forecast 60% or more); or (3) One day or night of rain combined with nighttime lows of 32 degrees or lower.

Because of the existing infrastructure already in place, DHA was able to activate this critical effort in advance of Tuesday's big storm and bring people into shelter in just a few days. The County will continue these efforts for upcoming storms.

DHA is working to expand capacity at its existing homeless shelter for increased weather response.

Sacramento Emergency Operations Plan (EO), operated out of County Office of Emergency Services has Severe Weather Guidance to use in the event of severe weather situations that require emergency response for local governments, non-governmental organizations and other agencies in preparing and coordinating response efforts.

This criteria is a guide to trigger an emergency response on a countywide scale but does not limit cities within the county from opening a warming center under any conditions they see fit and offers material support when they do. The Sacramento County Office of Emergency Services helps support such efforts with food, water, blankets and COVID-19 safety guidance provided by the County Public Health officer.

In anticipation of a weather event, the County organizes a call that includes each city and special districts to ensure seamless collaboration and consistent messaging.

In addition, DHA has an eligibility specialist on location to connect people to mainstream services such as cash, food and medical benefits.

United Way Announces Funding from \$10M Mackenzie Scott Donation

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - United Way California Capital Region has approved a first wave of funding totaling \$500,000 from the \$10 million gift received in December from philanthropist MacKenzie Scott. The first wave of funding will help individuals and families in the region gain social and financial capital, support United Way’s digital equity work across the capital region, empower Sacramento residents to have a voice in a local redevelopment project and provide COVID-19 relief funding in Yolo County.

“We knew this gift from MacKenzie Scott would be a game-changer for our community, and I’m thrilled that we are able to begin distributing this much needed funding,” said Stephanie Bray, president and CEO, United Way California Capital Region. “This first wave of funding will go a long way toward reaching the goals of our Square One Project that is working to provide family support and stability so kids can stay on track in school and graduate from high school prepared for success.”

\$200,000 of the funding will go toward United Way’s Capital Region Independence Initiative that is providing direct investment in local individuals and families to amplify their financial and social capital. The initiative aims to address inequities in the region, increasing average monthly income, decreasing subsidies, improving children’s grades, increasing savings and improving families’ overall economic impact on the community through increased spending.

United Way is investing \$150,000 of the funding in its digital equity work, with a match of \$150,000 from SMUD over the next three years to fund local digital literacy and training programs, distribute laptops and hotspots to those in need, and address underlying factors that contribute to the digital divide. Working with

community-based organizations, United Way will remove technological barriers to education and employment and build the digital capability of those in the community who are most acutely affected by the digital divide, prioritizing low-income households with children and senior citizens.

United Way will invest \$50,000 in its work to give residents of Mirasol Village in Sacramento greater engagement and influence in its redevelopment and resettlement. United Way is working with residents to develop a comprehensive, results-driven plan based on a needs assessment and other data. The work will help residents self-advocate about how Mirasol Village is redeveloped, how the surrounding community is built and how they can reach their own life goals.

The first wave also is providing \$100,000 in funding toward United Way’s Yolo County COVID-19 relief program, providing households in need in Yolo County with a one-time \$500 payment. Local nonprofits will identify and qualify low-income families who are experiencing an increased financial hardship from unpaid leave due to isolation, care of a vulnerable or infected relative, loss of wages due to involuntary cancellation of work or unpaid leave due to school or day-care closures.

Scott chose the local United Way chapter to receive the \$10 million gift in December because of the group’s work to fill basic needs while also addressing long-term systemic inequities that have deepened during the pandemic.

For nearly 100 years, United Way California Capital Region has brought local people together to make community change happen. Today, the nonprofit is bringing people together across Amador, El Dorado, Sacramento, Placer and Yolo counties for its Square One Project, a 20-year promise to significantly increase the number of students in our region who graduate from high school ready for success in college and beyond. United Way believes ending poverty starts in school and is working to ensure kids meet important milestones and their families receive support and resources. More Counties Adopt Healthy Communities Resolution

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On the heels of another round of changes to Governor Newsom’s statewide COVID-19 response plan, four additional counties passed variations of the Healthy Communities Resolution.

“Nearly one year into California’s COVID-19 state of emergency, we are still struggling with arbitrary shutdowns and constantly shifting goalposts. We support the growing number of California counties that are banding together to reject the status quo and advocate for a better path forward,” said Assemblyman James Gallagher (R-Yuba City).

The Resolution, which is the product of a conference of North State

representatives, rejects Governor Newsom’s one-size-fits-all approach to reopening communities. Instead, the Resolution calls for a data-driven approach tailored to each county’s specific circumstances.

“2021 cannot be a repeat of 2020. The way to begin repairing the grievous errors of the last year is to restore our institutions of self-government,” said Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin).

While the Healthy Communities Resolution is the collaborative work of 15 Northern California counties, any county may pass it. The latest counties to pass a version of the Resolution are Shasta, Del Norte, Yuba, and Sutter. Placer, Orange, Siskiyou, San Luis Obispo, Lassen, and El Dorado Counties adopted the Resolution late last year. ★

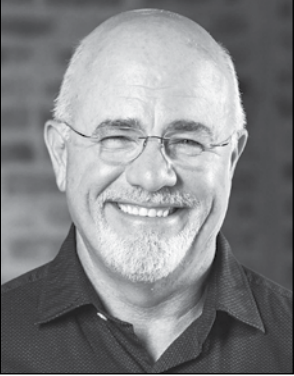

A friend told me about your Baby Steps program. I have one question, though. I noticed that according to your plan, saving for retirement should come before saving up a college fund for your kids. Why is this?

Ask Toni
Enrolling in Medicare Made Simple



Toni King

Hello Toni:
My husband, David, has been laid off because of what is happening to the economy due to COVID-19. He is 68 and has never enrolled in Medicare, but I am turning 65 this June. We both are covered under his employer's health plan and it is ending April 30th.
We have been told that he will get a penalty because he is over 65 and never enrolled in Part B. I really hope NOT! I assume that I am fine since I turn 65 in June. Please explain what our Medicare enrollment options are since we are different ages and have different enrollment situations.
~ Thanks, Peggy from Tampa Bay, FL
Great Question, Peggy:
There are 2 different rules regarding enrolling in Medicare Parts A and B in your household and I will keep how to enroll in Medicare for both you and David SIMPLE!
#1: David needs to apply for a SEP (Special Enrollment Period) by downloading the form CMS-L564 or OMB #0938 (Request for Employment Information) from socialsecurity.gov or email info@tonisays.com and we can email you a form.
Have David's HR department sign off on the Request for Employment Information CMS-L564 form and take the form to your local Social Security agency to apply for Medicare Parts A and B. Advise the Social Security representative that he is losing his company benefits and need his Medicare Parts A and B to begin May 1st.
This is an ALERT to the public because COVID-19 and social distancing issues have caused local Social Security offices to be closed with employees working from home. The public should call their local Social Security office direct for help filing forms to apply for Medicare Part B via fax. Most Social Security direct 800# can be located by Googling online that specific office 800# and the wait while holding is less than calling the main Social Security 800.

#2: Peggy your way to enroll in Medicare is simple and quite different from David's because you are turning 65 in June. Go online to www.socialsecurity.gov/benefits/medicare at least 90 days prior to turning 65 and apply online for a June 1st effective date.
Below is a checklist for those enrolling in Medicare the simple way:
1) Learn that Original Medicare: Part A covers your in-patient hospital stay, skilled nursing/rehab stay, blood transfusions, home health and hospice. Original Medicare: Part B covers your primary care or specialist whether in the office or performing surgery, outpatient surgery, durable medical equipment, x-rays, CAT scans, MRIs, chemotherapy, etc.
2) Discuss with your healthcare facilities and medical professionals which Medicare plans they accept such as Original/Traditional Medicare with a Medicare Supplement or a Medicare Part C (Medicare Advantage plan such as HMO, PPO or PFFS).
3) Go to the specific Medicare Advantage plan's hospital/provider online directory to be sure your physicians and hospitals are in that specific plan's network.
4) Seek Medicare Prescription Drug planning every year to see if your standalone Prescription Drug or Medicare Advantage Plan with prescription's formulary covers all your brand name or generic prescription drugs.
5) Seek "Extra Help" with prescription drugs if you meet low-income qualifications.
6) Consider a Long-Term Care (LTC) option such as standalone LTC policies, hybrid annuities or life insurance with LTC riders, VA aid and attendant benefits or applying for financial help from your specific states Medicaid for LTC.

SMUD Accelerates its Fleet Electrification with Five All-Electric Work Trucks

California Seeking Volunteers to Help Keep Waterways Clean

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - SMUD has partnered with Zeus Electric Chassis, Inc. and the California Mobility Center (CMC) to procure five custom, all-electric work trucks as it works to transition to an all-electric fleet. The trucks are the only all-electric work truck chassis manufactured in North America in the medium duty class and will be customized for a variety of uses throughout SMUD's service territory.

"This is a phenomenal addition to our fleet," said SMUD General Manager and CEO Paul Lau. "Not only does it showcase the future of electric vehicles and the ability to transition a large fleet to all-electric, but it also reduces our operating costs and greenhouses gases – helping us meet our goal of zero carbon by 2030."

SMUD has invested in fleet electrification for more than 10 years and has a total of 950 assets in its fleet consisting of sedans, service trucks, bucket trucks, trailers, cable pullers and other

construction equipment. Electrification efforts have depended upon commercially available technology and focused on electric and hybrid light duty vehicles and hybrid bucket trucks. Just last year, SMUD added 16 new Chevy Bolts to its fleet, bringing the count to 122 all-electric or hybrid vehicles across the fleet.

SMUD has a goal to transition 25 percent of its total fleet to electric or hybrid options by 2022 and recently added electric service trucks to its fleet.

Zeus is a start-up company out of Lindstrom, MN and is currently the only complete custom upfit electric truck chassis manufacturer in North America for medium duty work trucks.

SMUD's fleet engineers helped design the vehicle specifications and Zeus will fabricate the trucks in collaboration with the CMC. With a nine-month lead time, SMUD hopes to have the vehicles in operation by the end of the year.

SMUD has long been a supporter of electric vehicles, having worked with major automakers and a

wide variety of technology companies for the past 30 years to help test and optimize EVs and vehicle charging equipment, and demonstrate real-world effectiveness.

SMUD's efforts and partnerships have already brought electric vehicles to underserved communities; electric school buses to local districts; clean public transportation; mobile battery charging stations and more.

Additionally, SMUD's special EV rate discount allows EV owners to save money when they charge their vehicles between midnight and 6 a.m. This allows owners to maximize their savings while mitigating the impact to SMUD's electric grid for all customers.

SMUD was introduced to Zeus through its work with the California Mobility Center that was founded to serve as an innovation hub of policy, funding and commercialization of clean transportation technologies including autonomous transportation; electric vehicles; battery storage; shared mobility solutions; public transit and more. The goal is to provide equal opportunities in Sacramento for increased mobility and access to employment, healthcare and education.

As the nation's sixth-largest, community-owned, not-for-profit electric service provider, SMUD has been providing low-cost, reliable electricity for almost 75 years to Sacramento County (and small adjoining portions of Placer and Yolo Counties). ★

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California's Boating Clean and Green Program is looking for individuals to become Dockwalkers to help keep the ocean, lakes and reservoirs clean. Even during the COVID-19 pandemic, recreational boaters continue to recreate in California's waterways. The need to share clean boating practices with the recreational community, while abiding to COVID-19 guidelines, remains important.

For the past two decades, Dockwalkers have taught more than 100,000 boaters about keeping waterways clean from oil, fuel, sewage and marine debris. The training qualifies as community service. Interested persons must register ahead of time online. Anyone who is interested in this effective educational program can view videos online to learn more about the program and view success stories.

Marinas and yacht clubs are also encouraged to participate in the Dockwalker Program. Participating facilities receive educational materials and tools to operate a clean boating facility and minimize water quality impacts. This program provides marinas with points towards a Clean Marina designation provided by Clean Marina Program. Participation in the Dockwalker Program counts towards the nomination of the Club of the Year, under the community service category. In addition, yacht clubs and marinas are essential in spreading awareness directly to boaters.

Partnerships with The Bay Foundation, U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, U.S. Power Squadrons, Save Our Shores, Lake Berryessa Partnership and many more organizations are integral to this program's success.

The Dockwalker Program is part of California's Boating Green and Clean Program. The program is an education and outreach program conducted through California State Parks Division of Boating and Waterways and the California Coastal Commission.
