

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Local father Rick Brazil, along with family and friends, hosted the second "Fighting Fentanyl," fentanyl awareness event on Saturday, June 3rd. From noon until about 3 PM, the event hosted a car show, featuring several cars from the Sacramento Locos Car Club, cars from Specialty Automotive and a bicycle show. Keeping the place lively and upbeat were the music of the two DJ's, Casper and Joker. The DJ booth was set up in front of Muscle Systems gym, the business that hosted the

Low Cost Liquor, the small liquor store that is located in the same business complex at 920 Sacramento Ave., joined in with support and donated cases of water and ice so that people could stay hydrated. The River Cats organization showed their support by setting up a table where everyone could win a prize. The prizes included River Cats hats, baseball cards, bobble heads, soft baseballs for the little ones, portable dog bowls and much more.

WEST SACRAMENTO (MPG) -

The California Department of Parks and Recreation and the California Indian Heritage Center held a public workshop and idea exchange at the future site of the Heritage Center on Marina Way, in West Sacramento. Located along the river, tucked away in the trees was a big tent. In this tent, the design outreach team of Fentress Architects and Amaktoolik Studios had boards with lists of amenities and programs to give the members of the public some ideas of what they would like to see included in the future park.

The California Indian Heritage Center will be a State Park. An extensive tribal outreach began in

February of 2023 and will last throughout 2023. The design team is hoping to hear from all California tribes, both recognized and unrecognized, for their input and collaboration on

In a handout that the team provided, it explained, "The vision of the California Indian Heritage Center (CIHC) is to honor the diversity and history of Californian Indian people's cultural and tribal traditions." They plan to do research and educate on Indian traditions. The CIHC will

Valley Clean Energy Receives Award

DAVIS, CA (MPG) - As part of California Community Choice Association's (CalCCA) annual conference May 17-19 in San Diego, CA, Valley Clean Energy (VCE) was honored as runner-up in the Reliability category of the annual Community Impact Awards in recognition of its AgFIT Pilot Program.

Launched in 2022, VCE's AgFIT, or Agricultural Flexible Irrigation Technology pilot, supports local growers in decreasing energy usage and costs. In partnership with Polaris Energy Services and TeMix, the program provides incentives for irrigation automation and leverages software to help agricultural customers manage energy costs while providing maximum flexibility. The system gives agricultural customers visibility into energy prices a week ahead to help schedule irrigation for when energy costs (and other demands on the grid) are lowest.

"Valley Clean Energy is honored to be recognized for our work in Yolo County. Serving a large agricultural sector, it is important that we develop programs and solutions to fit the needs of our customers," said Tom Stallard, VCE's Board Chair and Woodland City Council Member. "In just a short time, the program has helped growers shift about 40% of their energy use away from summer evening critical peak hours. We plan to expand enrollment in the program and hope to see even more impact and customer

savings."

The CalCCA Annual Conference featured workshops and sessions with keynote speakers from statewide agencies, and highlighted the growing CCA movement within California. During the inaugural awards ceremony, CCA programs were recognized for their outstanding and innovative projects

Elk Grove Man Sentenced to 22-Yearsto-Life in Prison for DUI Murders

YOLO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -On May 30, 2023, Yolo County Superior Court Judge Peter Williams sentenced 29-year-old Elk Grove man, Gabriel Poletti, to 22 years-to-life in prison with the possibility of parole. The sentence was the result of Poletti's conviction for two counts of DUI-related second-degree murder.

During the late hours of February 15, 2021, Poletti was driving southbound on Jefferson Avenue in West Sacramento when he crossed over the center dividing line and struck a vehicle head-on while it was stopped at a red light in the opposite turn lane. Inside that vehicle, husband and wife Rasul and Anila Afzili were killed as a result of the collision. Their three-year-old child suffered a broken arm and leg, while their 5-month-old baby miraculously suffered only cuts and abrasions. A test of Poletti's blood revealed he

had a blood alcohol content of 0.243%, over three times California's legal

Under California law, DUI drivers may be charged with murder if they are found to understand that driving under the influence is a dangerous act that may kill or injure others, yet they choose to do so regardless. Nearly all California courts require an advisement of this fact when an individual is convicted of DUI. Drivers with prior DUI convictions should understand the risks of driving under the influence. Poletti had been previously convicted of DUI on April 8, 2016, in Sacramento County, and had been arrested for another DUI in Sacramento County on February 2, 2021, a mere 13 days prior to the fatal Yolo County

On May 10, 2023, Poletti pled guilty to all counts and enhancements alleged against him, including two counts of second-degree murder, vehicular manslaughter

while intoxicated, and driving under the influence of alcohol causing injury. Poletti entered his plea following a promise from Judge Williams that, if Poletti entered a guilty plea to all charges, he would be sentenced to seven years in state prison plus an additional 15-years-to-life. The District Attorney's Office supported the family of the deceased in objecting to this deal. At today's hearing, several members of the victims' family spoke and provided statements in opposition to the sentence.

'We are all well aware of the risks to human life of drinking and driving. And Mr. Poletti was acutely aware having been convicted of one DUI in 2016 and having been arrested for another DUI just 13 days before this tragedy," said District Attorney Jeff Reisig. "His decisions and actions took the lives of Rasul and Anila Afzili. Nothing will bring them back but there must be accountability and we must protect the public moving forward."

When you looked at the sea of dark blue gowns and decorated caps, you saw big and proud smiles. You could see the students scanning the crowd to find their





Continued from page 1 partner with tribal communities, regional cultural centers and museums to create a statewide perspective on California's diverse Indian cultural legacy. Once complete, the CIHC will draw visitors from across California, the nation and the world to this center of statewide significance for cultural preservation, learning and exchange, land stewardship based on Native American values and a place to engage all visitors in celebrating the living


cultures of California's tribe communities.

The center will sit on a 51-acre site behind "The Rivers" residential development and will sit on the American and Sacramento Rivers. The public was asked what amenities they would like to see. Some of those requested included: restaurant/dining, an area for traditional tribal rituals to be performed (and discussion about whether or not the public should be allow to attend), gift shops, outdoor picnic areas, places for Indian artifacts

and Indian Art. There was discussion about the style of the building and whether the landscape should stay natural or be developed and designed.

unfair for you to take care of her? You didn't cause it. It's not your fault. Of course, it's not unfair. I'm not mad at you, buddy. I'm just throwing your own logic right back at you.

Maybe these next lines will sound familiar: for richer or for poorer, in sickness and in health. The old "Book of Common Prayer" continues the vows and says, "Unto thee, all my worldly goods I pledge." This is called oneness. It's called unity. And it's what a good marriage should be

Do you get what I'm saying, Sonny? The two of you are in this together. This is not a business partnership or joint venture. It's a man and a woman pledging themselves, and all they have and are, to each other. I understand your feelings, but if you're not careful, that kind of guilt will stand in the way of you two creating a successful marriage—both financially and emotionally.

When you got married, the "me" and "mine" became "we" and "ours." You got all her stuff, the good and bad, and she got all of yours. Now it's time for you to work as a team to make the bad stuff go away and the good things even better. What's fair (and what's right) is to combine all of your income, all of your assets and all of your liabilities.

I know it's uncomfortable, but you've got to choose courage. Ask her to go all in on this with you and attack your debt together. Work toward making your dreams come true together as one.

That's what's fair, and that's what's best when you're married.



Revisiting A Book for the Generations "Are You There God? It's Me, Margaret"

by Judy Blume

If you were a young child in the '70s, '80s, or even the '90s, chances are you have heard of Judy Blume and most likely read a few of her coming-ofage books. Are You There, God? It's me, Margaret has spanned decades and generations, giving a voice to young girls' inner thoughts, fears, and wishes as they enter the scary new stages of life and their changing bodies. Now a major motion film, this book is the perfect summer reading book to bond readers of the past with a new generation.

Margaret Simon will proudly tell you she is almost twelve, but just before her 6th-grade year, her parents suddenly moved from New York City to the suburbs of New Jersey. Before she can unpack one box, the neighbor girl Nancy Wheeler knocks on her door, instantly letting her know that they will be friends. The presumptuous Nancy immediately takes Margaret by the reins, letting her know she must wear loafers and no socks to school (it's the cool thing to do), and even invites her to join a secret club.

With her newfound friends Gretchen, Nancy, and Janie, Margaret can finally talk about boys, kissing, bras, periods, and even their teacher Mr. Benedict. But even they can't help her with everything, especially her secret crush. As Margaret navi-



gates the world of religion, her changing body, and new emotions, she knows there is always one person she can talk to, God. A coming-of-age story that sparks true feelings of angst, fear, questions, honesty, and candor in a way that only Judy Blume can do.

Whether you are 9 or 90, Are You There God? It's me, Margaret speaks

to a young girl's heart; opening the door to honest thoughts, feelings, and emotions of young girls on the cusp of change. Judy Blume skillfully displays four young girls as they are flooded with questions about their changing bodies and new emotions and delivers a book that is an instant safe space. Follow along as Margaret gets her first bra, learns the value of not judging someone by their rumors, and even the fear of buying personal products at a store. Older generations will only be able to laugh and smile at the awkwardness of our youth, while newer generations will find solace in a young girl going through the same emotions. Left in its almost original form, new readers will be able to see how life at twelve in the late 60s was a little different, but the feelings are still the same.

The major motion film, Are You There God? It's me, Margaret, keeps the essence of the era it was written in but breathes a new depth and life into the characters. The perfect summer book club pairing, buddy read, or just for Nostalgia.



Farm Bureau President Urges Congress to Address Fire Risks

California Farm Bureau President Jamie Johansson is calling for increasing the pace and scale of forest management, including employing livestock grazing and prescribed burns to reduce dangerous fuels and protect communities and the environment. On May 23, Johansson testified in Washington, D.C., before a federal lands subcommittee of the House Committee on Natural Resources. He told the panel, "Given the extensive number of wildfire related impacts in California, California Farm Bureau has a vested interest in quality and quantity of forest management activities."

Winter Storms May Have Increased

Risks of Tree Pathogens

Atmospheric rivers that swept across the state this year have created conditions for plant pathogens that haven't been seen for decades in California. Florent Trouillas, a plant pathologist at the University of California, Davis, said he is getting more calls from growers and farm advisors concerned about potential crop damage. Recent tests in an orchard showed the presence of Phytophthora syringae, a pathogen that can affect almond crops but is rarely seen in California. Researchers are working to diagnose fruit and nut crop ailments that could be enhanced by wet weather.

Farm Bureau: Small Farmer Need Help After Storms

The California Farm Bureau is calling on the state to improve mechanisms for disbursing disaster relief payments for damages suffered in devastating 2023 storms. Testifying before a joint informational hearing of the California Assembly Agriculture Committee and the Assembly Emergency Management Committee, Farm Bureau Administrator Jim Houston said the storm impacts have been especially hard on small farmers, including many that may lack insurance. "There is no good mechanism for people to recover their losses," Houston said at the May 23 hearing.

Researchers: Lab-Grown Meat May Be Worse For Environment Than Retail Beef

Researchers at the University of California, Davis, have found that lab-grown or "cultivated" meat's environmental impact is likely to be significantly higher than retail beef. Researchers conducted a life-cycle assessment of energy needed and greenhouse gases emitted in all stages of production compared with beef. Based on current and near-term production methods, they concluded that lab-grown meat will be worse for the environment and more expensive than conventional beef production

Five years ago, while running for governor, Gavin Newsom pledged to transform California's medical care to a single-payer system similar to those in Canada and western Europe.

gle-payer legislation, which had passed the state Senate, saying there was "no reason to wait around."

"I'm tired of politicians saying they support single-payer but that it's too soon, too expensive or someone else's problem," Newsom said.

His position helped solidify support for Newsom among the proposal's progressive advocates as he dueled with a fellow Democrat, Antonio Villaraigosa.

Assembly, and after winning the election, Newsom began edging away from the single-payer concept, citing difficult barriers. One is persuading the federal government to give California the \$200-plus billion it spends on Californians' health care about half the state's total medical expenditures.

Newsom segued into pursuing universal health care, meaning all of the nearly 40 million Californians would have some sort of coverage, and came close last year.

At the time, "About 3 million Californians reported

2022," a report from the Public Policy Institute of California notes, citing census data. "Nearly seven in 10 (68%) are Latino, about 38% are noncitizens and 80% have low or moderate incomes (below 400% of the federal poverty line)."

Some of the gap was closed in the 2022-23 budget, drawing on what seemed to be a nearly \$100 billion budget surplus, by extending Medi-Cal coverage to undocumented immigrants otherwise ineligible for federally subsidized

Newsom backed sin- January 1, 2024, Medi-Cal will be available to all income-eligible Californians," the final 2022-23 budget declared.

> The expansion of Medi-Cal – California's version of the federal Medicaid program was made easier during the COVID-19 pandemic when federal authorities relaxed eligibility requirements. This year, enrollment topped 15 state's population.

Under his "California The bill stalled in the Blueprint," universal health care is still Newsom's professed goal. However, at the moment, coverage appears to be shrinking, and with the state facing chronic budget deficits, reaching it before Newsom's governorship ends would be difficult, if not impossible.

> The federal government's "continuous enrollment" pandemic policy is expiring and hundreds of thousands of Californians who benefited from it will once again have to prove their eligibility.

Newsom's revised 2023-24 projects that Medi-Cal enroll-

being uninsured in spring than a million people, still more than a third of the state's population but moving away from the universal coverage Newsom has sought as a single-payer substitute.

Single-payer advocates are. unsurprisingly, annoyed by Newsom's failure to deliver on his 2018 promise. They gave him some heat when he appeared at last month's state Democratic Party convention.

Covering all Californians would be expensive. Medi-Cal coverage costs federal and state governments about \$10,000 per enrollee. No one knows precisely how many "Beginning no later than Californians still lack coverage today but 2 million is as good a number as any, and including that many more in Medi-Cal could potentially cost another \$20 billion a year.

Meanwhile, single-payer advocates haven't given up. Last week, the California Senate passed Senate Bill 770, aimed at implementing a plan for single-payer coverage developed by the Healthy California for All million, or nearly 40% of the Commission, which Newsom created in 2019.

> The bill would direct state agencies to begin talks with federal officials about participating in a California single-payer system.

"It's time we made real progress toward eliminating the inequities and injustices of our fractured healthcare system," a co-author of the bill, state Sen. Scott Wiener, a San Francisco Democrat,

ASK THE DMV

Making Travel Plans This Year?

Take care of your travel checklist ahead of time!

Making travel plans this year? Find out how the DMV can assist you in having a smooth trip From renewing your license online to getting ahead of the May 2025 REAL ID enforcement date, the DMV is here to help.

Q1: If I already have my passport, why do I need a REAL ID?

A1: While you can board a domestic flight with a passport, there are several reasons to upgrade your license to a REAL ID. A REAL ID not only allows you to easily board domestic flights but also enter secure facilities such as military bases, federal courthouses, and other federal facilities. It serves as an everyday form of identification and lets you fly domestically without having to risk traveling with your passport. A REAL ID does not replace a passport.

Q2: Can I fly with a temporary ID?

A2: Although the DMV will issue you a temporary ID if you are waiting to receive a replacement, the TSA does not consider a temporary ID an acceptable form of identification for flying. If you need to replace your ID, don't forget to use the DMV's convenient online services, and request to replace your driver's license from the comfort of your home. Create or log into your MyDMV account and have your payment information ready. After completing a request, you'll receive your replacement ID within three to four weeks. If you have not received your replacement within 60 days check the status here. replacement within 60 days check the status here.


Q3: What essentials should I have on my travel checklist?

- A3: Make your trip a breeze by ensuring you take care of your travel checklist. The DMV offers the following tips to help make your trip as easy as possible:
- 1. Make sure your license is not expired. If you notice your ID will expire before your flight, or before your return flight, make sure you allow ample time to renew it. You can do this online with the help of the DMV's online services. If you need to renew your license, make it a REAL ID and get ahead of the May 2025 enforcement date. Start your application today!
- 2. Have a road trip planned? Check your vehicle registration and renew your vehicle registration online if you need to. Make sure you have a renewal notice confirming your current address, your license plate number, the last five digits of your VIN, and your payment information ready to enter online.
- 3. Don't lose your vehicle registration renewal notice in the mail! Now that most DMV tasks can be done online, make the change to paperless notifications and eliminate the hassle of receiving DMV notices by mail for good! Log into your MyDMV account and select the option to go paperless. All the necessary information can now be sent to you by email Visit: https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/paperless.paticos/
- 4. Make sure the address on your ID is current. You can request a change of address and check the status using the DMV's convenient online services. You must wait 14 days after a change of address before requesting a new driver's license.





Volunteers Celebrate World Environment Day by Cleaning Lake Berryessa's Shoreline

Participants worked hard to clean trash, plastics and recyclables from the shores of Lake Berryessa. Teams of volunteers from Anheuser-Busch joined with individuals and families of volunteers to remove debris from the areas surrounding Markley Cove to the Monticello dam. The haul this year involved more than 100 pounds of cigarette butts, bottle caps, food wrappers, glass and plastic bottles and other plastic items that eventually

degrade into microplastics, including fishing line and other discards.

Plastic debris can entangle and kill fish, birds and wildlife when it is in its original form. When it breaks down with time and environmental exposure, the resulting microplastic tiny particles travel through waterways and end up in the ecosystems that serve as homes to aquatic and marine life. Microplastics are easily ingested by living things, often causing great harm. Microplastics also tend to collect other pollutants on their surfaces; further endangering the animals that eat them and everything that eats those animals as the substances accumulate in their bodies and slowly make their way up the food chain, including into the bodies of the humans who consume them. Removing plastic from our waterways is a major component of good

opportunity to plant yarrow and creeping wild rye plugs along Lake Solano and take guided kayak tours with docents from the Solano Resource Conservation District and Putah Creek Council. Genentech Green Team Lead, Emma Mendiola, helped volunteers create their own wildflower pollinator seed packets and all registered volunteers received a commemorative T-shirt. The day ended with a picnic lunch from the Upper Crust Bakery in Winters, and a meet and greet with locally famous, Bilgee, the Protector of Clean Waterways, who posed for photos.
