
All-stars. Steve won two world championships playing for the Dodgers and is up for the next induction into the Hall of Fame.

#### Yolo Basin Foundation News Release

- Summer is here, and the bats are back! The Mexican free-tailed bat colony under the I-80 Yolo Causeway is growing daily as they return from wherever they spent the winter. Although many of the bats over-winter in the bridge, most seem to leave. As the weather warms, crops grow, and insect populations explode, the bats return to the Causeway.

These amazing, winged wonders are the only mammals capable of true flight. In late June, the females give birth to one pup. She nurses that pup for about 5 to 6 weeks, and then it joins her as she flies throughout the Central Valley to consume crop pests and mosquitos. There also are males that live in the Yolo Causeway bridge, but their groupings are smaller, so they are less noticeable.

Throughout the summer, Yolo Basin Foundation offers many Bat Talk and Walks, as well as a number of special events. Registration for all of these activities are now open on our website, www.

Children who are interested in bats are encouraged to join Yolo Basin Foundation for a morning of Bats and Crafts on August 13th and September 17th. Meet live bats from our local area, then have fun creating crafts and playing bat games. This special event is aimed at young children, especially those that are too young to stay up late to watch the bats fly.

Adults can visit the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area Headquarters for Bats and Brews on August 19th to taste a variety of local beers and meet ambassador bats from a rehabilitation program, followed by a visit to the Bypass to see the evening bat flyout.

We are also hosting a Bat House Building Workshop on August 26th! This is a great opportunity for small groups or families. Registration includes supplies and instructions to build a Bat House which can be put up to invite bats to your yard or farm.

Additionally, we are seeking Bat Program Volunteers to help educate the public, guide tours, and host our special events. Our Bat Program Training will take place on June 7th. Visit our website, www. yolobasin.org, for more information about volunteer opportunities!



Studies have shown us it takes \$3 of gain in an investment to emotionally offset \$1 of loss. Our brains record negative things at a much greater rate than they do positive things, and it takes a lot of emotion to recover from that. Your investments may be down a little. If you've got \$1 million in there, it may be worth \$900,000 right now. Next year, it's liable to bounce up to \$1.1 million. In other words, your entire retirement savings is not "eroding away."

Have you ever heard people say they lost all their money in the stock market? Well, that's mathematically impossible, unless you put all your money into one company, and that company completely closed and was worth zero. Remember Enron? What most people really mean when they say that is they lost a bunch of money because they freaked out and went into hyper-drama mode, then pulled all their money out while the market was down.

Jesse, did you know that in the last 20 years, every down year in the stock market was followed by two years of record gains? Facts and mathematics are your two best friends when it comes to telling your inner drama queen, "Shut up, we're going to continue to invest!".

Dairy operators in Tulare and Kings counties say they are thankful to return to the normal rhythms of feeding, milking and calving after historic flooding in March burst levees and forced dairies to rapidly evacuate their cows. Tulare County is California's leading milk and milk products producer. Kings County ranks fourth. Thousands of cattle were evacuated during the storms. While most have returned to dairy ranches, they are being closely watched by veterinarians for stress, which can open doors for disease. No cattle illness spikes have been noted to date.

#### U.S. Supreme Court Rejects Challenges to California Animal Housing Law

The U.S. Supreme Court has upheld California's Proposition 12. Now out-ofstate producers of pork, eggs and veal have decisions to make: Change their operations to comply with the law's animal housing requirements or stop selling their products in California. The Golden State enjoys a 13% share of the U.S. consumer pork market, making it economically infeasible for many pork producers to exit the California market. Because of the interconnected nature of the U.S. pork industry, all or most hog farmers would be forced to comply with the state's requirements.

Things are even more challenging for lettuce growers in the Salinas Valley after this year's storms. Farmers in 2022 had suffered an estimated \$150 million in crop losses as impatiens necrotic spot virus – a destructive plant disease spread by thrips – moved from field to field. Then this year, vast flooding from atmospheric storms damaged multiple crops, with lettuce growers suffering an additional \$54.4 million in losses, according to recent figures released by the Monterey County agricultural commissioner. Still, lettuce growers say they are hoping for a successful crop this year.

#### Monterey County Winds Soothe Winegrapes, Frustrate Tourists

Coastal winds in Monterey County create some challenging contradictions for a wine region trying to build its brand and attract more tourism. Some winegrape producers say they fear winds that push the fog and help cool vineyard leaves can also discourage winery construction and dissuade tourists who may not want to sip fine wine varietals in gusty settings. Still, the upstate coastal wine region is winning acclaim for its pinot noir and "premium, coastal, cool-weather chardonnay." The wine sector produces \$1.4 billion in economic activity for the county and provides 10,491 jobs

## I'm Approaching 65 – Should I Claim Social Security?

Dear Rusty: I am fast approaching 65 (in August) and plan to continue working full time. I would like to know the implications of that, and about drawing Social Security. Same question for my husband who is past his full retirement age (he will be 67 this year) and he continues to work full time. Signed: Still Working

Dear Still Working: Married couples should always coordinate their retirement strategy, and you're very smart to do so. Born in 1958, your full retirement age (FRA) for Social Security purposes is 66 years and 8 months. Your FRA is the point at which your earnings from work no longer affect your Social Security benefits, but if you claim at age 65 and continue to work full time, you will be limited to how much you can earn before they take away some (or perhaps all) of your benefits. Here's what will happen if you claim Social Security (SS) to start in August when you are 65:

• Your SS retirement benefit will be permanently reduced by 11% (you'll get 89% of your FRA entitlement). Your monthly amount will only change thereafter due to Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA).

• If you start your benefits

in August you will be subject to an earnings limit - either a monthly limit of \$1,770 for the remaining months of the year or the 2023 annual limit of \$21,240. If the monthly limit is exceeded you aren't entitled to benefits for that month, or if the annual limit is exceeded they will take back benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the annual limit. Social Security will use whichever method yields the smallest penalty.

• Beginning in 2024, you will be subject only to Social Security's annual earnings limit, which will be something more than the 2023 annual limit of \$21,240. If you exceed the 2024 (or 2025) annual limit, Social Security will take away \$1 in benefits for every \$2 you are over the limit (half of what you exceed the limit by). The annual limit will be in effect until you reach your full retirement age of 66 years and 8 months in April 2026.

Since your husband has already reached his FRA, working full time will not negatively affect his monthly Social Security benefits if he chooses to claim his SS benefits now. However, if he hasn't yet claimed your husband is already earning Delayed Retirement Credits (DRCs) which will increase his benefit when he later claims. DRCs are earned monthly (.667% per month; 8% per year) and can be earned up to age 70 when maximum SS benefit is attained. For your husband, his age 70 benefit would be 29% more than he was entitled to at his FRA. Whether it is wise to wait longer to claim depends on life expectancy, but break even age is about 83 for those who wait until 70 to claim (vs. claiming at FRA). FYI, average life

expectancy for a man your husband's current age is about 84; for you about 87.

Since you are both still working full time, be aware that - depending on your combined income from all sources - your Social Security benefits will become part of your taxable income. As a married couple both working full time, your combined income will likely be over the \$44,000 threshold after which income tax will be levied on up to 85% of your Social Security benefits received during the tax year (using your normal IRS tax rate). I suggest you consider the income tax implications of claiming Social Security while you are still working full time.

You did not ask about Medicare, but if you (and your husband) now have "creditable" healthcare coverage from your employer ("creditable" is a group plan with at least 20 participants) you can defer enrolling in Medicare Part B until your employer healthcare coverage ends, thus avoiding the Medicare Part B premium while you are working.

## How Will California Deal With Budget **Deficits That Seem Here To Stay?**

A little more than two weeks remain before the June 15 constitutional deadline for enacting a 2023-24 state budget.

It's as certain as anything in politics can be that the Legislature will pass something it calls a budget. If lawmakers missed the deadline, they could lose their paychecks.

whatever they enact will not be the final plan for the 2023-24 fiscal year that begins July 1. Due to declines in revenue, the state faces not only a multi-billion-dollar deficit in the forthcoming tax system, where nearly year but the likelihood of continuing gaps for several years thereafter.

There is, moreover, neither consensus on the scope of the deficit nor agreement on how the governor and legislators respond. Meanwhile, those in the Capitol are besieged by pleas by those with stakes in the budget to protect their projects and programs and demands for even greater allocations.

When Gov. Gavin Newsom introduced his first version of the budget in January, he said the state had a \$22.5 billion deficit, and then increased the shortfall by another \$9 billion in the revised budget

proposal this month.

Immediately, however, the Legislature's budget analyst, Gabe Petek, told his bosses that it's really \$34.5 billion and, more ominously, declared that the state faces continuing deficits averaging \$18 billion for several more years.

It is, in the parlance of fiscal mavens, a "structural deficit," meaning it's baked into the state's finances regardless of underlying economic conditions. All of the competing versions of the state's fiscal situation also assume that California does not experience a recession in the near future.

Were a recession to strike, the deficits could grow by tens of billions of dollars because It's equally certain that California's revenue system is dangerously dependent on taxing the incomes of the state's wealthiest residents, as Newsom's budget acknowledges.

"California's progressive half of all personal income tax in the state is paid by the top 1% of earners, has contributed to extreme budget volatility over the years," the May revision says. "Maintaining budget stability requires long-term planning in the face of these revenue fluctuations."

In light of that statement and Petek's rather gloomy long-term projections, will Newsom and the Legislature respond responsibly? Or will they take the easy way out, paper over the current deficit with creative bookkeeping and backdoor borrowing, and ignore the structural crisis?

essentially a short-term response, dipping the usual bag of fiscal tricks to produce a budget that would be balanced on paper - assuming his deficit estimate of \$31.5 billion is accurate.

Both Senate and the Assembly leaderships have adopted budget frameworks that purport to protect vital services but differ in approach. The Assembly's version would reshuffle appropriations while the Senate's would cover the gap by raising corporate income taxes, arguing that a tax hike would merely recapture money large corporations gained from the Trump-era federal tax overhaul.

Although Newsom immediately rejected a corporate tax increase, if the deficit is as wide and chronic as Petek projects, budget stakeholders will intensify their demands for tax increases of some kind. In recent elections, California voters have rejected proposed increases in property taxes and personal income taxes on the wealthy. Newsom opposed the income tax increase, is now opposing the Senate's proposed corporate tax, and also has rejected periodic bills to impose a wealth tax.

"A wealth tax is not part of the conversation," Newsom said of this year's version. "Wealth taxes are going nowhere in California."

This year's budget dance will kick off a political tussle over spending and taxes that will likely continue for the remainder of Newsom's governorship.



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Directors of Volunteers in Agencies (DOVIA) celebrated volunteerism on Thursday, May 18th with a reception honoring the nominees and winners of the Youth Volunteer of the Year, the Individual Volunteer of the Year and Volunteer Manager of the Year awards. The reception was held at Eskaton Village Carmichael, 3939 Walnut Avenue, Carmichael.

Six youth volunteers were nominated for Youth Volunteer of the Year, twenty individual volunteers were nominated for Individual Volunteer of the Year and three volunteer coordinators were nominated for Volunteer Manager of the Year.

#### The winners are: Youth Volunteer of the Year

Rose Luo - Rose is a longtime teen participant at the Sacramento Public Library's Arcade branch. She re-joined the volunteer team after the library reopened to the public during COVID-19 and immediately took on a more prominent volunteering role. A talented artist and dedicated helper, she soon shouldered two monumental tasks: illustrating their seed library dividers to better advertise the colinformation disbursement. Fast Forward 2022 -When COVID hit, and volunteers were given an opportunity for "leave of absence," everyone except Thuy decided to take leave. Outpatient Surgery was suddenly not an option. Instead of taking the easy route, Thuy walked in and said, "Where do you need me?" She became an ambassador.

Here is a list of the types of services she performs: wheelchair round up and cleaning, Personal Protective Equipment distribution, Admissions Kits preparation and distribution, Greeter/Ambassador coverage and training, member escorts and general information. All these services helped to coordinate visitation, navigation, and safety.

#### Volunteer Manager of the Year

Lynn Pesely - Lynn Pesely is the Coordinator for the Sacramento Medical Reserve Corps. During the COVID-19 pandemic she supported Sacramento County's testing and vaccination clinics and other efforts supplying hundreds of volunteers. 424 volunteers served a total of 28,000 hours, an economic value of \$1.4 million, for COVID-19 response at vaccination and testing clinics, COVID-19 Hotline, case investigation, after-hours calls, courier,

Lynn often had too many volunteers trying to secure the same shifts - a good problem to have! Sacramento Medical Reserve Corps volunteers often served multiple days a week, including overnight and weekends. Sometimes 20 volunteers were deployed a day at 5 different locations. During the COVID-19 response, 20 volunteers served 500+ hours, earning a Gold Presidential Service Award and 6 of those served 1000+ hours. 15 volunteers served 250+ hours earning a silver presidential service award, and 51 volunteers served 100+ hours earning a bronze Presidential Service Award. The volunteers who came onboard during COVID-19 are now dedicated to the Sacramento Medical Reserve Corps program, continue to volunteer for a variety of events, have started friendships with other members, and some even support the Sacramento Medical Reserve Corps Foundation with donations on the Big Day of Giving. In addition to the COVID-19 response, Lynn's volunteers have also supported the Sacramento County Office of Emergency Services' response to wildfires and the recent winter storms and flooding.


#### Individual Volunteer of the Year


