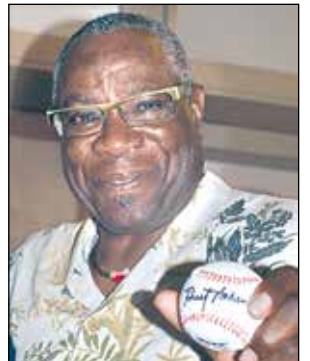

## Dusty Baker Wins First World Series as Manager

**HOUSTON, TX (MPG)** - In the aftermath of the 2022 World Series conclusion, one statement has been said synonymously by people all around the country in various forms: "I'm so happy for Dusty."

Sacramento local Johnnie B. "Dusty" Baker Jr. finally got the proverbial monkey off his back on Saturday night, winning his first World Series title as a manager after 25 seasons. Baker's Houston Astros defeated the Philadelphia Phillies in six games, clinching the series victory with a 4-1 win over the weekend.

At 73 years and 143 days old, Baker is the oldest manager in MLB history to win a World Series, surpassing Jack McKeon who was 72 when he won the title with the Florida Marlins in 2003. Dusty is now a two-time World Series champion, along with the ring that he won in 1981 as an All-Star on the Los Angeles Dodgers.

"I just knew it was going to happen, sooner or later, you stick around long enough, and you got good teams, its going to happen sooner or later," Baker told ESPN minutes after the triumph. "I said if I win one, I want to win two, so I might as well go for two, we'll see!"

Before beginning his MLB career, Baker graduated from Del Campo High School in Fair Oaks in 1967 where he was a four-sport athlete playing baseball, basketball, football and track and field.

Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg recognized Baker's accomplishment with a tweet on Saturday night.

"I hereby declare Dusty Baker Day in Sacramento," Steinberg tweeted. "We'll make it official sometime very soon. Dusty is a great Sacramentan. So happy for him!!" ★

## Bryte Park Improvements Coming Up!

**WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - On Tuesday, October 25, 2022, the Yolo County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved \$2.5 million to support the City of West Sacramento's long-standing effort to rehabilitate Bryte Park. "I know this funding will go a long way towards making improvements as proposed in the Bryte Park Master Plan developed through substantial community input," said Yolo County Supervisor Oscar Villegas.

The Yolo County Board of Supervisors has been reviewing various proposals for use of the American Rescue Plan funds to address the impacts of the pandemic. Supervisor Villegas proposed funding be provided for Bryte Park to enable the implementation of the phases laid out in the Master Plan.



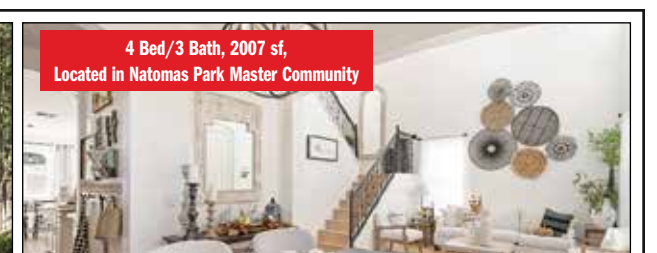

It is hoped the additional funding from the County could speed up the construction of improvements and help the City of West Sacramento leverage the funding to include additional phases of construction. "As a kid I lived down the street from Bryte Park and spent many hours playing at the park. As a father,

I was able to bring my kids here to play along with other residents to enjoy organized sports and family gatherings. It warms my heart knowing these funds will help realize the vision set by the community visioning process and build upon the upgrades made thus far."

Bryte Park is located

in the northern portion of the City and is one of the most heavily used parks. The property is owned by the Washington Unified School District but is maintained and managed by the West Sacramento's Parks and Community Services Department. The City will be responsible for overseeing construction and park improvements. ★

I believe in a holistic approach to emergency management by bringing all stakeholders together to tackle obstacles," said Ms. Weivoda. "I look forward to serving the residents of Yolo County, our cities, the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation, and our local jurisdictions in my new role as Chief of Emergency Services."

Ms. Weivoda worked as a firefighter paramedic and flight paramedic before joining Yolo County in 2013 as Yolo County EMS and Emergency Preparedness Administrator. Ms. Weivoda accepted a Regional Director position with American Medical Response in January 2022.

"I am very excited to have Ms. Weivoda lead the County's Office of Emergency Services. Ms. Weivoda is highly skilled in emergency operations, and she has a strong track record of collaborating with our community partners. I am confident that Ms. Weivoda will strengthen the County's partnerships with all cities, the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation, CalOES, and our federal agencies," said Yolo County Administrator Gerardo Pinedo.

Ms. Weivoda started on September 27, as the Chief of Emergency Services, with the annual salary range starting from \$128,611 to \$156,328. ★

# UC Davis Health Nurse Honored for 'Rocking' Nursing World

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The National Black Nurses Association (NBNA) has named Aron King a 2022 Under 40 Awardee. King, an assistant nurse manager at UC Davis Medical Center and a 2021 graduate from the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing at UC Davis, is one of only 16 nurses in the nation to receive the honor.

"These nurses are our present and our future. They are the next generation of nurse leaders," said Martha A. Dawson, NBNA president. "We look forward to honoring these NBNA young notables under the age of 40 who are rocking the nursing world through professional and educational achievement, leadership and civic involvement in their NBNA chapters and in the communities they serve."

After caring for patients as a bedside nurse for 8 years, King entered the master's-degree leadership program at the School of Nursing in 2019. He said through that educational experience he began to see the bigger picture of how he could serve the Black community and inspire future Black nurses. He joined the Capitol City Black Nurses Association, founded by School of Nursing alumni, to advocate for the needs of nurses and optimize health outcomes in communities where health disparities persist.

"Health care is in a battle to undo decades of valid mistrust in communities of color. From unjust medical trials to the treatment of undocumented people and those battling drug addiction," said King, the organization's former secretary who now serves as an executive board member. "Winning the trust of these communities means having a workforce that has representation. We have work to do."

In July, King served as the keynote speaker for the School of Nursing 2022 Commencement. In July, he joined Piri Ackerman-Barger, School of Nursing associate dean for Health Equity, Diversity and Inclusion, to present to an international audience of nursing researchers understanding how microaggressions in health professions schools can poise students for inclusion. She

said King is deeply deserving of this honor.

"Aron is being recognized for his commitment to high quality practice, his accomplishments as a leader and his work as a scholar," Ackerman-Barger explained. "It is an honor to have him join us once again as he pursues his Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) at the School of Nursing."

Next month, King enters the school's PhD program. He expects with the rigorous research program and the demands of his nursing career, the lift to continue the drive to end disparities will be heavier.

"The role of a nurse is not limited to the bedside and we as nurses shouldn't measure our worth by looking at technical skills," he said. "We are advocates and leaders in patient care. We need to be proactive in our approach by investing our energy in preventive interventions."

NBNA honored this year's winners at its 50th Annual Institute and Conference in Chicago. NBNA is comprised of nurses at all levels and serves as the voice for Black nurses and diverse populations to ensure equal access to professional development, promote educational opportunities and improve health. ★

# VFW Post 8762 and Its History

**WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - In 1945 several of our West Sacramento Veterans had a crazy idea, to build a Veteran's Hall in West Sacramento. Our Veterans wanted a place to hold dinners and dances for Veterans.

In 1945, the land and building were purchased for VFW Post 8762. In 1946 the building was moved from Beal Army Air Corps Base to its current location in West Sacramento. December of 1946 marks the completion of the main hall and bar.

During the demolition time, the members had to drive to Beal Army Air Corps base and dismantle the entire building. Once the building was down, they only had their handwritten instructions and sketches of where everything went.

Once the building was down, they borrowed a semi-truck and made several trips to move everything to its new home.

After everything made it safely to West Sacramento, the veterans began the task of assembling it. They poured a foundation set on raising the structure on the weekends and days off. Many of the Veterans' wives spent the weekends with hammers straightening nails. Everything that could be reused was.

After months of work (and lots of beer) the post was rebuilt at its current home at 905 Drever St,

West Sacramento.

During the following decades, the Post was home to so many big events in West Sacramento, so many families have stories of every major life event, which was held at the VFW.

Over the years, expansion was needed. While drinking at the bar one night, it was purposed to add on to the building and build a side hall. The idea was brought to a meeting and there the members decided to move forward with the building of a side hall. The decision was made to build it on top of the existing patio. Walls went up and stucco was put on and it was a building.

The Founding members were always looking for ways to improve the building and make it bigger. They never felt the building was complete.

Every Commander made his mark by making changes. Some bigger than others, but all did something.

Over the life of the building, the VFW has given back to the community by giving the hall to other charitable organizations to use for fundraisers. They have held back-to-school drives, hosted Easter egg hunts, and Christmas parties for families that couldn't afford Christmas. In total, the VFW has raised and given away well over \$2,000,000 and continues to raise money for the community as well as veterans in need.

In the last few years, it

has seen several changes, all in line with its original mission. In 2019 the VFW helped get 4 families off the streets and into permanent housing. They also raised and awarded more than \$7,000 in grants to local students. In 2020 when everything shut down, they transformed their business into a kitchen providing more than 6,000 meals to the community.

In 2021, they rebuilt the bar and started changing how the operation was going to be moving forward. They also partnered with local leaders in bringing back the Veterans Day Parade and built a parade larger than the one in Sacramento.

They continue to raise funds for the community, scholarships, and Veterans.

You do not have to be a Veteran to support a Veteran. The VFW Hall is open to our entire community. We have many activities open to the community such as Wednesday Night Bingo, 1st, and 3rd Friday Night Karaoke, and Cornhole, along with Trivia night and 'Paint and Sip' nights.

Our kitchen and bar are open to the public Tuesday through Friday evenings. Check our website calendar for a list of activities.

Please join us on Friday, November 11th at 10:00 a.m. on Park Boulevard for our annual Veterans Day Parade. Help our veterans celebrate part of West Sacramento's proud history. ★

# Man Pleads Guilty to Being a Felon in Possession of a Firearm

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Rudy Tafoya, 54, of West Sacramento, pleaded guilty on October 25, 2022, to being a felon in possession of a firearm, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents, on May 3, 2021, law enforcement officers pulled Tafoya over for traffic violations. Officers found Tafoya had a loaded handgun in his left front pants pocket. Tafoya is prohibited from possessing firearms or ammunition because he has six prior felony convictions, including a 2019 federal conviction for being a felon in possession of a firearm. Tafoya was serving a term of

supervised release on his prior federal case when he violated supervision by again possessing a firearm.

This case is the product of an investigation by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives; the West Sacramento Police Department; and the Yolo County District Attorney's Office. Assistant U.S. Attorney Emily G. Sauvageau is prosecuting the case.

Tafoya is scheduled to be sentenced by U.S. District Judge John A. Mendez on Jan. 31, 2023. Tafoya faces a maximum statutory penalty of 10 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine. The actual sentence, however, will be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and

the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables.

This case is part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a program bringing together all levels of law enforcement and the communities they serve to reduce violent crime and gun violence, and to make our neighborhoods safer for everyone. On May 26, 2021, the U.S. Department of Justice launched a violent crime reduction strategy strengthening PSN based on these core principles: fostering trust and legitimacy in our communities, supporting community-based organizations that help prevent violence from occurring in the first place, setting focused and strategic enforcement priorities, and measuring the results.★

# Is California Strangling its Golden Goose?

Citing a Bloomberg News article, Gov. Gavin Newsom crowed last month about the probability that California would soon pass Germany to become the world's fourth largest economy.

"While critics often say California's best days are behind us, reality proves otherwise — our economic growth and job gains continue to fuel the nation's economy," Newsom said.

Throughout his governorship, Newsom has been obsessed with bragging that California is a global leader in just about every human activity — and subtly suggesting that he's the reason for its success.

It's not surprising, therefore, that he didn't mention another recent Bloomberg article, reporting that California is faltering in a major economic indicator it had long dominated — initial public offerings (IPOs) of stock by expanding corporations.

"Only nine companies headquartered in California went public during the first three quarters of 2022, compared with 81 that launched IPOs during the same period last year," Bloomberg said in an analysis of filings. "Even more dramatically, California's share of US IPO proceeds fell to 2% through Sept. 30, compared

with 39% for 2021."

Jay Ritter, a University of Florida finance professor, told Bloomberg that California's meager IPO activity "is almost entirely" due to declines in valuation among Silicon Valley tech startups.

This is no small thing. The formation of new companies, followed by IPOs, has been a feature of the Silicon Valley-based technology sector for decades, creating untold billions of dollars in new wealth that filters through other sectors and generates immense amounts of income tax revenue for the state.

"We are already seeing an immediate effect," Brian Uhler of the Legislative Analyst's Office, told Bloomberg. "And it does appear to be significant."

In September, California employers' income tax withholding payments were down 5%, or \$354 million, from a year ago with diminished IPO activity a driver of the decline, Uhler said.

During the first three months of the state budget's fiscal year that began July 1, state revenues were nearly \$5 billion below expectations, virtually all of it in income taxes.

The precipitous decline in IPO activity once again raises the question: Are California's high taxes, high living and business costs and ever-tightening regulation strangling its golden goose?

A new report from Stanford University's Hoover Institution provides evidence that the goose may be flying away.

The report by Joseph Vranich, whose company advises firms on relocation,

and Lee E. Ohanian, a Hoover Institution senior fellow, says "the number of companies relocating their headquarters out of California in 2021 occurred at twice the rate of 2020. Our findings show that 352 companies moved their headquarters to other states just in the period from January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2021 ..."

Some of those relocations have been spectacular, such as McKesson, the nation's ninth largest corporation, and Tesla, the leading maker of electric cars, from California to Texas.

The report covers only shifts of corporate headquarters, but there are other corporate moves, such as the Walt Disney's relocation of 2,000 jobs from Los Angeles to Orlando, that are also negative indications. And corporate decisions not to locate in California or expand operations in the state are never publicly reported.

California may replace Germany on the global list of economies but that statistical exercise is far less important than the possibility that California's economy has peaked.

Newsom is too smart not to know what the Bloomberg IPO article and the Hoover report imply. It may explain why he opposes Proposition 30, which would hike California's marginal income tax rate to more than 15% and give investors another reason to shun the state.

## TV LEGAL THEMES FOR 'FAMILY LAW' AND 'SO HELP ME TODD'

**A Film and TV Review by Tim Riley**

### "FAMILY LAW" ON THE CW

There's something oddly humorous about a dysfunctional family engaged in the practice of family law. That's exactly what happens when attorney Abigail Bianchi (Jewel Staite) ends up unwillingly having to work at her father's firm on a probationary basis.

The new "Family Law" series on the CW network opens with Abigail dozing in her car outside a bar after a night of heavy drinking. It's morning and she wakes up with only minutes to make it to court before her case gets dismissed.

Stumbling into the courtroom where a group of students are filming on their phones, Abigail can barely steady herself before vomiting right into the lap of her startled client. Of course, the student videos go viral and Abigail proves to be toxic.

Apparently not a novice boozier, Abigail is suspended from practicing law and can only redeem her career through a mentorship with a seasoned lawyer. The only person willing to take the assignment is her estranged father Harry Svensson (Victor Garber).

An old-school lawyer, Svensson runs a top family law firm, which also employs Abigail's half-siblings Daniel (Zach Smadu) and Lucy (Genelle Williams), the firm's psychologist. That Abigail had never met her half-siblings before adds to tension at the office.

Harry walked out on Abigail's mom Joanne (Lauren Holly) when their daughter was only seven, and fathered two more children that Joanne refers to as the "rainbow-colored siblings."

As the oldest of the three Svensson offspring, Abigail is rather condescending to Daniel and Lucy, belittling their accomplishments and status as a coping mechanism for her low standing in the office.

Eager to jump into a case, Abigail is almost certain to run afoul of her father's condition that she stick to menial office tasks and not make waves or interject herself into litigation.

Before the first episode lays bare all the family dysfunctions, Abigail plunges into the case of a teenager desperate to find her biological father who was a sperm donor found on Craigslist.

The unaware father turns out to be a

successful developer who ends up being sued for 13 years of child support, and during the trial Abigail veers off into a tangential diatribe against her own "lousy parent, an emotionally stunted and unavailable human being."

Abigail has other issues to deal with, namely that her husband Frank (Luke Camilleri) tossed her out of the house, and her teenage daughter Sofia (Eden Summer Gilmore) remains aloof while younger son Nico (Brenden Sunderland) is more forgiving.

Since "Family Law" is a pickup of a Canadian series that's been announced for a third season, we'll see if it has staying power with an American audience.

### "SO HELP ME TODD" ON CBS

The CBS network has an affinity for procedurals, and "So Help Me Todd" might fit into that category if it could figure out whether it is a detective drama or a comedy about a dysfunctional family relationship.

Show creator and executive producer Scott Prendergast informed critics during the summer press tour that the show is based on his own true story about his mother's husband disappearing and how he helped find him.

That personal inspiration is the foundation for the first episode in which Marcia Gay Harden's Margaret Wright, a lawyer in a Portland firm, enlists the help of her wayward son Todd (Skylar Astin) to track down her missing spouse (Mark Moses).

Todd is first seen in a supermarket stalking a single mom suspected of insurance fraud on a phony disability claim.

He's relegated to this grind after losing his private investigator license for illegal surveillance work.

Even worse, he's living in his sister's (Madeline Wise) garage, and his mother Margaret thinks it's time that her errant son needs to get his professional life back on track.

There may be doubts about Todd doing investigative work for a law firm, but he soon proves his worth in unorthodox ways beyond locating a vanishing spouse.

At the firm, Todd is reconnected with old flame Susan (Inga Schlingmann), now engaged with a huge rock on her finger. He's also sparring with overbearing researcher Lyle (Tristen J. Winger) who is more uptight than Tony Randall ever was as Felix Unger in "The Odd Couple."

According to Scott Prendergast, his main inspiration was the quirky private detective agency in "Moonlighting," and he counts his new series as a throwback to classic procedurals like "Hart to Hart" and "Remington Steele."

Like others in the genre, "So Help Me Todd" has a new case every week, with plenty of red herrings and twists, and the end of each episode brings a big resolution, and Todd will be goofy at times and skate close to the edge.

Above all else, "So Help Me Todd" is a show with a light touch wrapped into a series of mysteries that work best because Marcia Gay Harden and Skylar Astin are a great team thoroughly invested in the humor and frustration of the generational divide. ★

# Hornets Prevail at No. 5 Weber State, 33-30, to Remain Unbeaten

Sac State earns its 2nd victory all-time at Weber State while recording 9th win of the year

**Sac State Athletics News Release**

**OGDEN, UT (MPG)** - Sacramento State, ranked No. 2 in the nation, improved to 9-0 on the season with a 33-30 victory over fifth-ranked Weber State on a windy and rainy day at Stewart Stadium on Saturday.

The Hornets never trailed in the contest and were able to make the big play when needed on offense, defense and special teams in the victory.

Sacramento State's nine-game winning streak becomes the longest in school history surpassing eight-game streaks in 1966, this year, and last season. The Hornets are now 6-0 in conference games and have defeated teams ranked in the top 15 in three consecutive contests. Weber State dropped to 7-2 overall, 4-2 in league games and suffered its first home loss of the year.

Sacramento State scored the game's first points with a 15-play, 75-yard drive which ended with a 3-yard touchdown run from Asher O'Hara. The Hornets ran the ball for all but two of the plays during the series and took nearly six minutes off the clock. O'Hara cleared the goal line on a third down carry for his 15th rushing touchdown of the year.

Weber State was able to match the score with a 16-play, 75-yard drive of its own. Like the Hornets, the Wildcats relied on the ground game during the drive with 13 rush attempts. The scoring play came through the air as Bronson Barron faked the handoff

and found a wide open Jacob Sharp in the back corner of the end zone.

Neither team scored until midway through the second quarter when O'Hara connected in stride with Marshal Martin for a 48-yard touchdown pass. The play was the longest pass of the season for Sacramento State. The Hornets closed the first half scoring on the next series. After the defense forced a punt, the snap sailed over the head of the Wildcat punter and was downed in the end zone to give Sacramento State a 16-7 advantage at the break.

Weber State had a fantastic start to the second half, forcing the Hornets to punt on the first series and then driving 68 yards to make the score, 16-14, with 8:44 left in the third quarter.

Sacramento State needed just two minutes and 30

seconds to respond. The Hornets turned to Jake Dunniway at quarterback and the senior came through with two big passes to cap the drive. The first was a 27-yard crossing route to Pierre Williams to take the ball to the 9-yard line. On the next play, Dunniway threw off his back foot to connect with Martin. The score was Martin's second of the game and marked the fourth time in his career he has had multiple touchdowns.

The Hornets continued to put the pressure on when Patrick Dean came down with an acrobatic interception on a long pass attempt down the middle of the field. The team turned the turnover into a touchdown with an 11-play, 75-yard drive which ate up the last portion of the third quarter and carried into the first play

of the fourth quarter. The big play in the series was a 4th-and-1 pass from O'Hara to Coleman Kuntz which turned into a 28-yard gain. O'Hara punctuated the drive with a 1-yard leap over the pile for his second TD of the contest.

The Wildcats showed their ability to get back into the game on special teams when Abraham Williams took the kickoff out of the end zone and ran 100 yards untouched for a score. The kickoff return for a TD was the first allowed by Sacramento State this season. Weber State attempted to make it a one-score game but failed to convert the two-point conversion.

As the rain picked up in the fourth quarter, neither offense was able to generate much production until Weber State scored a field goal with 4:07 remaining

to make the score, 30-23. During the drive, the Wildcats took advantage of a pair of pass interference penalties. The team had a 1st-and-goal from the 10 but followed with three rush attempts which took the ball to the 5 before settling for a field goal.

The Wildcats then attempted an onside kick which rolled out of bounds untouched by either team giving the Hornets pristine field position. The team fed Cameron Skattebo for the first three plays of the drive before turning to O'Hara on the next two plays. The quarterback was stopped on 3rd-and-10 setting up a 43-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski to make it a two possession game.

Weber State scored the final points with a touchdown on a drive late in the fourth quarter. The team

attempted a second onside kick which was recovered by Martin to seal the game.

Sacramento State outgained the Wildcats, 431-319. The Hornets compiled 204 yards on the ground and threw for 227. O'Hara led the team in both areas with 81 rushing yards and 162 passing yards. Williams and Martin each had four receptions for 74 and 70 yards, respectively.

Prince Washington led the defense with nine tackles while Eian Moore, Cameron Broussard and Armon Bailey tallying eight.

Sacramento State will play its final road game of the regular season on Friday, Nov. 11, at Portland State at 6 p.m. The team's final regular season home game will be Saturday, Nov. 19, against UC Davis in the Causeway Classic at 2 p.m. ★

## Republic FC Midfielder Rodrigo Lopez Named to USL Championship All-League First Team

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - On November 1, the USL Championship announced the 2022 All-League teams, honoring the best players across the league for the season. Republic FC midfielder Rodrigo Lopez was named to the All-League First Team alongside ten other top performers from seven other clubs.

"RoRo played the best soccer of his career last season as club captain," said Republic FC President and General Manager Todd Dunivant. "He was an integral part of our collective success in league, cup and post-season play helping us reach new heights this season."

Lopez appeared in 25 of 34 regular season matches for Sacramento, while starting each contest in the club's run to the U.S. Open Cup Final. He finished 2022 with 1,894 minutes in league play, and captained Sacramento in each of his 21 starts on the season. In regular season play, he finished tied for the team lead in goals with seven – and added another in the playoffs.

He led in team assists with eight during the regular season – his second-highest total for a season in his professional career. He finished the regular season with 59 chances created, good for 10th in the league and 3rd in the Western Conference.

He delivered for his club in critical moments all season long. On opening night against El Paso Locomotive FC, he scored the club's first goal of the year from the penalty spot, then a critical equalizer just before half-time. On June 25, just four days after netting

the opening score against LA Galaxy in the U.S. Open Cup, he came off the bench and assisted the first of two goals from Maalique Foster in a come-from behind win over Monterey Bay F.C. He helped the club to results in two home rivalry matches against Oakland Roots, assisting a last-second equalizer on July 9 to secure a 3-3 draw and the winner in the club's match with the Bay Area side on August 27. In the regular season finale against San Diego Loyal SC, he netted the winning score just two minutes in, threading a shot from the left just inside the post.

Lopez's play was also recognized league-wide throughout the campaign. He was named the league's Player of the Month for August after netting one goal and tallying a league-leading four assists in four contests and earning Player of the Week Honors in Week 22. He was named to the USL Championship Team of the Week six times, earning a spot on the league's Best XI four times and tallying two selections to Team of the Week Bench.

This is Lopez's second career All-League First Team selection, and his third All-League selection in USL Championship. He previously earned First Team distinction following the club's inaugural 2014 season. In 2015, he was honored on the USL All-League Second team. He is one of three Republic FC players all-time to earn the honor; defender Nemanja Vukovic was named to the All-League First Team alongside Lopez in 2014 and midfielder Danny Barrera was named to the league's top squad in 2016.
