**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Washington Unified School District in West Sacramento has received a \$200,000 grant through the California Community Schools Partnership Program to launch two full-service community schools as neighborhood hubs that provide access to a variety of services that support children, strengthen families and improve community health.

The district will partner with United Way California Capital Region, which has nearly 100 years of experience convening community groups and coordinating services among providers.

"Washington Unified School District is laser-focused in its commitment to excellence, equity and empowerment for every student, every day," said Dr. Cheryl P. Hildreth, superintendent for the school district. "Investing in community schools takes our commitment to

the next level, ensuring that students have increased access to services that reinforce academic and social-emotional development."

Through case managers and site-level coordinators, the community schools will provide access to health care, mentoring, expanded learning programs, adult guidance and other services. Each school will include a Wellness Center that provides direct support and trauma-informed care to students and will hire a restorative

## State Requires Sharing Your Health Data

In March 2020, as Californians hunkered down for what many expected to be a two-week lockdown, high-ranking health officials were scrambling to find out how many COVID-19 patients were hospitalized, how many were in intensive care and how many beds remained available.

With no system in place for hospitals to report this information to the state and share it, Secretary of Health and Human Services Dr. Mark Ghaly, the state's public health director and other staff had to call 426 hospitals to assess the situation.

Now, officials hope to avoid similar scenarios in the future by changing the way patient data is collected and shared. Legislation passed last year requires all health and human services providers to sign a statewide data-sharing agreement. This includes hospitals, doctor's offices, nursing homes, public health agencies, laboratories, mental and behavioral health providers, substance use treatment facilities, insurance plans, public health departments and emergency services.

The final version of the agreement was published July 1. Most participants will have six months to sign the agreement and a year to begin sharing data.

If implementation goes as planned, a doctor or case worker could request a patient's full medical and social services history in real time. Patients could view their own records easily, and government agencies would also have access to more reliable aggregate data on patient outcomes and demographics – rendering the pandemic scramble obsolete.

The health care industry already amasses incredible amounts of patient data. John Ohanian, chief data officer for the state Health and Human Services Agency, likens it to "freeways of information." The problem is, not everyone has an onramp to the freeway.

"Our goal was – and the governor's goal was – to make it mandatory that people exchange information and provide rules of the road and guidelines so it can be done well," Ohanian said.

It's a huge endeavor for

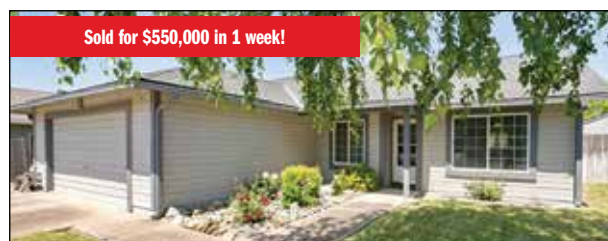

# Ancient Near Eastern History Featured at State Fair

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - A new face at the Sacramento State Fair this year at the Valley Sculpture Artists (VSA) booth is Raad Alnahat, an immigrant from Iraq who will be filling the VSA demonstration spot Chris Thompson held at the fair for many years.

Alnahat has many credentials and will be demonstrating his unique process of combining sculpture and ceramics to construct large figures during the two weeks of

the fair. He will show his particular process for how he constructs larger format forms. His work reflects his culture, featuring works from biblical days. After Israel, Iraq has the most biblical history of any country in the world.

One of Alnahat's pieces is a six-foot tall, 250-pound statue of the last great king of Assyria, King Ashurbanipal of the Neo-Assyrian Empire reigned for 38 years from 669 BC to his death in 631 BC in Nineveh. The four intricate sections of his piece include the head, a

lion and an engraved tablet with writing in four languages.

Alnahat studied in Iraq, receiving his Certificate of Fine Arts in Baghdad in 1985, specializing in sculpture. He has taught painting, ceramics, and calligraphy for over 10 years and participated in many galleries and exhibits in Iraq, including his own personal exhibit 1987. He shared in an email that he had to leave Nineveh, Iraq in 2008 because of the war. He traveled to Turkey and lived there for two years showing his work in numerous galleries as well as teaching calligraphy.

"I came to the United States in 2010 with my family and began studying all forms of art to improve myself, but I mostly enjoyed ceramics because it relates closely to my style. I studied at American River College and one of my large sculptures stands in their Art department today. Through my work in ceramics, I was able to combine ceramics with sculpture. My work is mostly influenced from our history in Iraq such as the Babylonian empire, Assyrian empire, etc." Alnahat will be demonstrating his unique style daily at the VSA booth from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. ★

# Social Security Matters

## What Do My Wife, and my Ex-wife, Get If I Die?

**Dear Rusty:** I am a 77 year old married male. I am retired and started drawing Social Security at age 66, and my monthly amount is a little over \$3,000. My present wife is 52 and employed, and we have been married for 22 years. I also have an ex-wife who is 85, not married, and drawing Social Security. My ex-wife and I were married 13 years.

When I am deceased, what happens to my Social Security benefits? When my present wife decides to receive SS benefits, would she draw the higher benefit of our monthly amounts? Would my ex-wife be able to increase her benefit? **Signed: Planning Ahead**

**Dear Planning Ahead:** In the event of your death, here is how Social Security eligibility would work for your current wife and for your ex-wife:

For your current wife, unless she is disabled, she cannot collect a survivor benefit as your widow until she is at least 60 years old. However, if she claims her survivor benefit before reaching her full retirement age (FRA), it will be reduced. Claimed at age 60, her benefit as your widow would be 71.5% of the amount you were receiving at your death.

If she waited beyond age 60 to claim, her survivor benefit would continue to grow until it reached maximum at her FRA of age 67 (100% of the benefit you were receiving when you died). She would also have the option to wait until age 62 and claim her own reduced personally-earned SS benefit first while allowing her survivor benefit to grow to maximum at age 67; or she could take her reduced survivor benefit only first and allow her personally-earned SS benefit to grow to maximum at age 70. She should choose whichever strategy would give her the highest benefit for the rest of her life.

Note, too, that if your current wife were to collect any benefit before reaching her full retirement age (67) and she works, she would be subject to Social Security's earnings test. The earnings test limits how much can be earned before some of her benefits are taken away by Social Security. For reference, the 2022 earnings limit is \$19,560, but it changes annually. If the annual earnings limit in force when your wife claims is exceeded, and she hasn't yet reached age 67, SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the limit. The limit is higher, and the penalty is less in the year FRA is reached, and the earnings test goes away when your current wife is 67.

Regarding your ex-wife, if you die first, and because you were married for more than 10 years, your ex-wife will be entitled to collect a survivor benefit from you, if that amount (what you were receiving at your death) is more than she is currently

receiving based on her own lifetime work record (she would get the higher of the two amounts). Your ex-wife would need to contact Social Security to claim her survivor benefit from you, and your ex-wife collecting a survivor benefit from you will not affect your current wife's benefit in any way - both can get their full survivor benefit from you independent of each other and neither will be reduced because more than one wife is collecting.

For clarity, since you and your ex-wife are both already collecting Social Security, your ex-wife may be entitled to a spousal boost from you while you are both living, if her own personally-earned FRA benefit amount is less than 50% of your SS benefit, and that would have no effect on either your own current benefit or your current wife's survivor entitlement. Your ex-wife would need to contact Social Security directly to apply for her ex-spouse benefit from you while you are both living.

# Southern Cal Ports and Warehouses Face Threats

As California's post-World War II industrial economy slumped during the 1970s, civic and business leaders in the state's two major metropolitan areas made some momentous bets on their economic futures.

While the San Francisco Bay Area opted for the emerging sector of digital technology, Southern California - Los Angeles particularly - believed that its future lay in logistics, tying the region to the fast-growing economies of Asia.

Southern California expanded and modernized its twin ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach to handle what became a flood of container ships from China and other Asian nations. Rail and highway connections were improved and the region's "Inland Empire" became a massive logistics center of warehouses and distribution centers serving the entire nation.

It's estimated that 40% of U.S. imports and 25% of the nation's exports pass through Southern California's ports.

Although logistics industry salaries are not high in comparison to those of the Bay Area's tech industry, its warehouses and other facilities have provided much-needed jobs for the wave of immigrants, mostly from Latin America, that Southern California

experienced in the 1980s and 1990s.

However, despite its importance, Southern California's logistics industry faces an uncertain future as the movement of goods becomes increasingly competitive and, as industry leaders complain, new state laws and regulations raise operational costs that could encourage shippers to go elsewhere.

As shipping volume increased in recent years, new Inland Empire warehouses proliferated to handle the traffic, creating a backlash of opposition from local residents and environmental groups.

Attorney General Rob Bonta sued the city of Fontana for approving a warehouse close to a high school and Assemblywoman Eloise Gómez Reyes, a San Bernardino Democrat, introduced legislation requiring new warehouses in Riverside and San Bernardino counties to be located at least 1,000 feet from "sensitive receptors" such as schools.

Business groups have opposed the measure, saying that its setback requirements and a provision of the bill requiring unionized labor on warehouse projects would hamstring development of facilities needed to handle ever-increasing amounts of cargo. The bill has passed the Assembly and is pending in the Senate.

Meanwhile, John McLaurin, president of the Pacific Merchant Shipping Association, told Gov. Gavin Newsom in a letter last month that several new state policies also threaten to curtail the logistics industry's ability to handle increasing amounts of cargo.

He specifically cited new

rules from the California Air Resources Board that prohibit older trucks from handling cargo at the ports and require replacement trucks to be zero-emission vehicles "that are currently unavailable due to the shortage of semi conductors and other equipment."

McLaurin also noted that while a just-passed state budget trailer bill purports to "invest in port-specific high-priority projects that increase goods movement capacity on rail and roadways serving ports and at port terminals," it also bans spending for "fully automated cargo handling equipment."

The prohibition is supposedly aimed at protecting port jobs from being automated but McLaurin told Newsom that unions have already agreed to provisions allowing automation, which is needed to keep Los Angeles and Long Beach ports competitive in the battle for shipping business vis-à-vis other ports.

"California's ports have no more room to grow - except up," McLaurin said. "If we are to meet the needs of California consumers and exporters, support hundreds of thousands of supply chain related jobs and function as a competitive gateway, innovation along the waterfront should be encouraged - not stifled."

These issues are a warning that as logistics have become so important to Southern California's economy, the industry's future should not be taken for granted.

# Davis Murderer Denied Parole

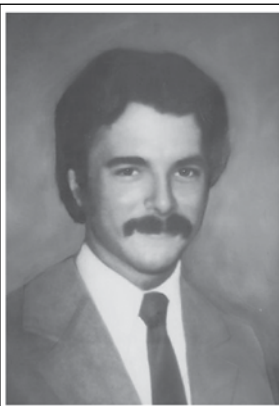
**Yolo County DA News Release**

**WOODLAND, CA (MPG)** - Convicted murderer Daniel Wehner was denied parole for the 13th time on July 12, 2022, by a two-commissioner panel of the Board of Parole Hearings. Wehner is currently housed at California State Prison, Corcoran. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the hearing was conducted remotely by video.

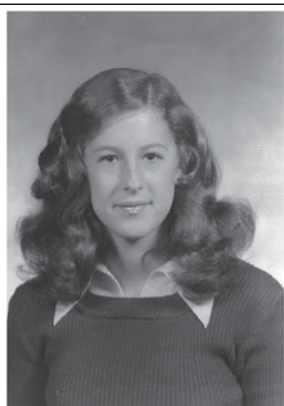
In March 1980, Wehner brutally murdered his former girlfriend Robin Ehlman and her friend John Manville at the Castilian Apartments in Davis. Robin was 19 years old when she was murdered and Manville, a UC Davis veterinarian student,

was 25. Wehner had been stalking Robin and had physically and emotionally abused her during their relationship, causing her to lose consciousness after choking her on at least one occasion.

On June 19, 1981, after Wehner agreed to a plea, a Yolo County judge sentenced Wehner to 27-years-to-life for the murders. A court appointed psychiatrist interviewed Wehner's family prior to the sentencing hearing. Family members described him as "irresponsible," having an "explosive temper," and "violent." "He had a winning personality and charmed older people but had not an ounce of sincerity." Wehner's family

described Robin as "soft and gentle."

Today, Commissioner Teal Kazel and Deputy Commissioner Gary Shinaver both agreed

that Wehner still posed a continued risk to public safety should he be released from prison. Commissioner Kazel stated "You have accepted

responsibility for some of your actions but haven't come to understand the depth and breadth of your actions. You have a superficial understanding and remorse for the victims." She continued, "you have not internalized the concepts you've learned in your programming."

At the hearing, Robin Ehlman's father and younger sister, who was 14 when Wehner murdered Robin and John, made passionate statements. The sister of John Manville also spoke. Chief Deputy District Attorney Jonathan Raven represented the District Attorney's Office at the hearing. Davis Police Chief Darren Pytel wrote a letter in opposition to Wehner's release.


Chief Pytel stated that "The shocking acts of violence committed by Mr. Wehner victimized our entire community. This community is still not over that shock and terror of the murders committed by Mr. Wehner."

Yolo County District Attorney Jeff Reising stated that he is proud of the efforts of his Lifer Parole Division. "We will continue to do everything we can to support the Ehlman and Manville families. We will continue to remember and honor Robin and John. That is the very least we can do for these families and all families who have survived similar tragedies."

Daniel Wehner will be eligible for parole again in three years. ★



# Yolo County Launches Jail-based Competency Treatment Program

## Yolo County News Release

**WOODLAND, CA (MPG)** - The Yolo County Sheriff's Office and the Yolo County Health & Human Services Agency (HHS) have launched a Jail-Based Competency Treatment Program (JBCT) to provide mental health services to incompetent to stand trial (IST) individuals.

The program's primary focus is to restore individuals served in this program to competency, playing an essential effort in reducing recidivism and increasing stabilization in our community. Once competency is restored, they can continue their criminal proceedings while receiving mental health services and re-entry support.

"Our new Jail Based Competency Treatment program will allow inmates who have been determined to be incompetent to stand trial to begin receiving

treatment soon after it is ordered by the court, rather than having to wait many months in our jail for a bed to become available in the State Hospital system. This program will reduce custody time and positively impact both the inmate and my staff," said Yolo County Sheriff Tom Lopez.

The genesis for the Yolo County JBCT occurred when several county departments recognized significant placement delays for IST individuals in the Department of State Hospital (DSH) competency program. The waitlist had doubled, with some individuals waiting six months to one year. As part of the County's work on the Stepping Up Initiative\*, Yolo County criminal justice partners and HHS began meeting to address this growing concern.

Over the last four years, the Public Defender's Office, the Sheriff's Office, the Probation

Department, the District Attorney's Office, the Courts, HHS, and County Counsel have implemented several programs, new practices, toured other communities' JBCT programs and engaged in several meetings with DSH leadership to investigate various solutions. DSH has worked to meet the needs of the increasing waitlists by expanding JBCT programs throughout California, and Yolo County is excited to be part of that expansion.

"All partners agreed that once the appropriate pieces of the jail construction project were completed, this program would be implemented here in Yolo. Like many other things, COVID delayed this implementation longer than any of us had hoped," said Ian Evans, Adult and Aging Branch Director at Yolo County Health & Human Services, who also serves as the County's

Alcohol and Drug Administrator. "We are incredibly excited to have this new program in Yolo, adding another local component to our array of services for those with significant mental health needs that find themselves involved in the criminal justice system."

As key parts of the jail construction concluded in late 2021, partners from the Sheriff's Office, County Counsel, HHS, DSH, and WellPath – who is contracted with HHS to provide behavioral health and medical services in-custody – began meeting regularly to finalize contract details, budgeting, staffing plans, and implementation date.

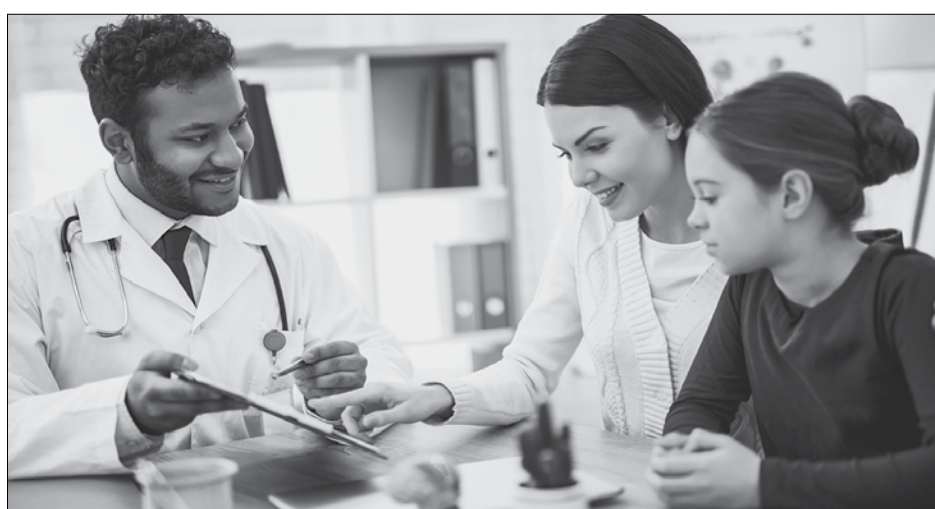
Using data to decide capacity and funding, Yolo and DSH landed on a Yolo County 7-bed JBCT program. It officially launched on Wednesday, June 6, when the first two individuals were admitted into the program,

and as of today, the program is at capacity. HHS has entered into a funding agreement with DSH to bring in the revenue to fully fund the program, providing funding to the Sheriff's Office for a full-time correctional officer solely dedicated to the JBCT program, and has entered into an agreement with WellPath to provide four staff to support the service needs of the program.

While Yolo County partners continue to work to increase avenues to address the community's mental health needs, the launch of the Yolo JBCT program offers an outstanding addition to the service delivery for some of our most vulnerable individuals in Yolo County.

The Stepping Up Initiative aims to reduce the number of individuals with serious mental illness involved in the criminal justice system. ★

the state, and not everyone is on board.

In a public comment responding to a draft of the agreement, the California Hospital Association and California Association of Public Hospitals and Health Systems complained that the requirements exceed the statutory authority of the law that established the data-sharing requirement. When contacted for clarification, hospital association spokesperson Jan Emerson-Shea said there was nothing to add beyond what was in the letter.

The California Association of Health Plans also commented that parts of the draft proposal go beyond the scope of the new data-sharing law, including the proposed governing body that would oversee compliance. The association also pointed out potential conflicts with a parallel federal effort to create a national data exchange for health data.

Other groups, including the County Welfare Directors Association of California, County Behavioral Health Directors Association and Planned Parenthood Affiliates of California, raised concerns about data privacy and security. They also want patients to be given the ability to choose whether their data is shared and noted that addiction and mental health records are more strictly protected than other health data. In a letter to the state, Planned Parenthood asked to delay implementation by one year.

According to a state analysis, the proportion of medical and social services organizations that currently use digital records and share that information with other providers varies widely based on sector and location.

While 97% of family physicians used electronic record-keeping methods in 2020, those who didn't tended to be small independent practices or they were in rural areas. Likewise, 90% of medium and large hospitals also used electronic-only patient records, but only 70% of small hospitals in the state used digital records.

The report found a little more than a third of addiction treatment centers used electronic records to document treatment plans and view laboratory results. Less than half of nursing homes used electronic records and only 10% reported that their systems connected with local hospitals.

Some of the organizations with the fewest digital record-sharing systems are government agencies like county public health and social services departments. The state Legislature's approved budget includes \$50 million over two years to help small doctor's offices, rural hospitals and community organizations invest in the technology needed to comply with the law.

Even before the pandemic, community clinics and social services providers like homeless shelters say disconnected record-keeping systems caused chronic problems.

On a broader scale, the patchwork of digital accessibility has made it difficult to reduce health disparities for conditions like heart disease and diabetes, both before and during the pandemic, said Kiran Savage-Sangwan, executive director of the California Pan-Ethnic Health Network and a member of the data exchange advisory group.

Communities of color make up 63% of the state's population but represent more than 80% of all enrollees in Medi-Cal, the state's health system for people who can't afford health insurance. According to a California Health Care Foundation report on health disparities, Black and Latino residents are far more likely to experience preventable hospitalizations for conditions like asthma, heart failure and diabetes than white residents. The same groups are also the most likely to report delaying health care due to cost or lack of insurance.

In recent years, the state has launched ambitious plans to transform the Medi-Cal system through an initiative called CalAIM, which aims to address the root causes of failing health, like food insecurity and housing instability. It offers coverage for services not typically thought of as medical needs, such as housing. CalAIM, along with the state's Healthy California for All Commission, which is exploring what a single-payer health care system could look like in California, relies on data.

"I can't think of a thing on our list of huge transformations that won't either depend on or benefit from this effort," Ghaly said. "All of these data systems having some ability to come together around the individual is going to accelerate – whether it's a social worker or an emergency room nurse – their ability to provide more comprehensive and coordinated services." ★

## SS Disability's Medicare Enrollment Rules



Toni King

Dear Toni:

My husband has met his 24th month of being on Social Security Disability which qualifies him for Medicare. His disability is because of a severe case of

Parkinson's. On August 1st his Medicare Parts A and B will begin, but he is only 64. He will turn 65 next March and I am not sure what he should do.

With Paul's serious Parkinson's issues affecting his health, I am concerned with which Medicare option is for him to enroll in. Should he enroll in a Medicare Advantage plan or a Medicare Supplement?

I am concerned about whether he will enter the Medicare Prescription drug donut hole because his Parkinson's medications are expensive. Please advise what we need to do to find what Paul's best Medicare option should be?

Thanks, Cynthia from Dallas, TX

Cynthia:

Learning how to enroll in the right Medicare and Part D prescription drug plan when someone has a serious health condition can be extremely complicated. Your current specialists and prescriptions are what the Toni Says® Medicare team focuses on for a Medicare consultation.

# Sac State Baseball Players Now in the Pros

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Summer is here and, as the temperatures begin to heat up, so have the performances of Sacramento State baseball alumni at all levels across the country (all stats as of June 15).

**Rhys Hoskins**

*(Philadelphia Phillies - MLB)*

Fresh off a 4-for-5 performance against Miami that saw him slug a double, a pair of home runs — the first a three-run shot that tied the game, and the second a solo shot that gave Philadelphia the lead — and drive in six (<https://www.mlb.com/phillies/video/rhys-hoskins-two-home-run-game>), Hoskins is enjoying a stellar month of June, batting .354 with nine extra base hits and 12 RBI for the Phillies, with hits in 11 of his last 15 games and raising his average 26 points in the process. The six-year Major League veteran is batting .480 and slugging 1.080 over his last seven games and hitting .351 over his last 15 contests. Hoskins' 13 home runs this year are third on the team behind only Kyle Schwarber and Bryce Harper, while his 36 RBI are second behind only Harper.

**Sam Long**

*(San Francisco Giants - MLB)*

Following a brief stay at AAA Sacramento, Long has rejoined the San Francisco roster after being recalled on June 7 and has shined in his last three appearances — all in relief — for the big club, allowing just four hits over his last eight scoreless innings, walking a pair and striking out three to lower his ERA to 1.96 in 12 Major League appearances. He surrendered a single hit at Miami in two innings of work in his first game back on June 2, walked only one without allowing a hit in three scoreless innings against Colorado on June 7, and

scattered three hits over three innings in a start against the rival Dodgers on June 11. When you include his five appearances for the River Cats before returning to the Bay Area, Long has posted a 2.35 ERA over his last 15.1 innings of work, having not allowed a run since May 10 at El Paso.

**Nathan Lukes**

*(Buffalo Bisons - Toronto Blue Jays AAA)*

Now in his third full season at the Triple-A level with the Blue Jays organization, Lukes has blistered the ball through the first 54 games of the season, batting .301 with an .819 OPS for Buffalo in the International League, adding 16 doubles, five home runs, and 26 RBI to his stat line while also swiping 12 bases. Lukes is hitting .324 in the month of June — mere points behind the .325 he hit in April for the Bisons — thanks to hits in nine of his 12 games this month, which included four home runs and 11 RBI in that stretch.

**Justin Dillon**

*(Syracuse Mets - New York Mets AAA)*

Before making a trip to the seven-day disabled list on May 31, Dillon has been solid out of the bullpen for Syracuse, posting a 3.45 ERA over 15.2 innings of work in 11 appearances for the Mets' Triple-A squad, striking out 18 and holding opponents to a .254 average. In his last appearance against Rochester, he struck out a season-high four over 1.2 innings of work and posted a 1.86 ERA in six appearances in the month of May, allowing just two earned on eight hits over 9.2 innings of work while striking out 10.
