California Sheriffs Issue Public Alert Following DOJ **Data Breach**

SUTTER COUNTY, CA (MPG)

- The California State Sheriffs' Association (CSSA) is alarmed to learn of a data breach by the California Department of Justice (DOJ) that has made public the personal information of California's citizen concealed weapon (CCW) permit holders.

CSSA is issuing this alert to make CCW permit holders aware of the situation so they can take appropriate precautions.

"It is infuriating that people who have been complying with the law have been put at risk by this breach," said CSSA President and Butte County Sheriff Kory Honea. "California's sheriffs are very concerned about this data breach and the risk it poses to California's CCW permit holders."

CSSA will continue to engage with DOJ in an effort to ensure that the risk to CCW permit holders is mitigated and a breach of this nature does not happen again.

Every law enforcement agency in California that issues CCW permits is required by law to provide certain information about CCW permit holders to DOJ, which in turn is required to safeguard that information. The data breach was in conjunction with DOJ's launch of its "2022 Firearms Dashboard Portal." The breach included, but was not limited to, the names, ages, and addresses of individuals who hold CCW permits in California. It appears that before the breach was detected by DOJ, the information was copied and at least some portion of it was posted on the

After learning of the breach, CSSA President and Butte County Sheriff Kory Honea contacted DOJ officials. During that conversation DOJ confirmed there was a data breach involving CCW permit holder information. DOJ advised it has deactivated the dashboard and is working to Continued on page 3

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - It's titled "Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience" and for the next six months it is an experience like no other museum in the area.

Located at 31 15th St (on the corner of 15th St and Jefferson Blvd, kitty corner from Whitey's Jolly Cone) in West Sacramento, you can't miss the vibrant blue building with the "Starry Nights" swirls, as you drive down Jefferson Blvd.

"I am extremely honored that we have such an extraordinary Van Gogh exhibit here in West Sacramento that brings together the community in a way that we can and brings in the region so that they can experience Van Gogh's artwork, his legacy and his beauty and how he portrayed that through all of his artwork. And, so that we can learn more about his life," Mayor Martha Guerrero said.

Producers of "Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience" have been working with the mayor's team for weeks to bring the show to life. Spanning over 27,000 square feet, the exhibit consists of a series of museum galleries displaying Van Gogh's work as well as information about the man, in a variety of styles. The creators of "Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience" wants this to be accessible to everyone. They offer discounted group rates, guided tours and a photographer upon request. You can even arrange to have an event catered within the exhibit. The museum encourages corporate events, private events and groups such as schools, universities and

Museum hours are as follows: Mondays, Wednesdays & Thursdays 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., Fridays 10 a.m. to 9 p.m., Saturdays & holidays 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Sundays 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. They are closed on Tuesdays. Parking is \$15 for valet parking, or they offer the alternative to park in public parking by Drake's the Barn (where the first two hours are free) and ride Via for \$3.50.

Tickets can be purchased online at https:// vangoghexpo.com/sacramento/#tickets or they can be purchased at the door (for that day only). Tickets are time slotted because they allow people in every half hour. It takes about an hour and a half to go through it, but you are welcome to stay as long as you like.

Ticket prices start at \$34.90 for adults and \$19.90 for children under 12 years old. If you want to experience the Virtual Reality section of the exhibit, where you are able to simulate walking through his paintings, it costs an additional \$20. The group giving the guided tour on opening day included Guerrero, Orozco and Councilwoman Dawnte West, among others, agreed hands down, that it is well worth the price. Each of them plans on returning with loved ones, so they can share the experience.

The museum also offers gift cards for those who might want to give this experience as a gift to someone. Be sure that you remember your wallet, because after you experience this museum, you will surely want to purchase something from their gift shop on your way out.

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

How Taxes are Decided in California

Let's start with the premise that taxation is largely arbitrary.

Despite efforts to frame tax policy in moral or at least philosophical terms, what or who is taxed and the form and level of that taxation merely reflect current political priorities.

Take, for example, South Lake Tahoe, a small city that sits on California's border with Nevada. If you live in that city, you pay the nation's highest state income taxes. However, if your home is located a few feet to the east, inside Douglas County, Nevada, you pay no state income taxes.

That explains why there's a steady rivulet of high-income Californians resettling in Nevada, or at least changing their official addresses. If a couple of pending California ballot measures are approved in November, state taxes on the wealthy will increase even more and Nevada will become an even more popular tax refuge.

California's income taxes became the nation's highest through a series of incremental decisions made by legislators or voters and they now provide more than two-thirds of the state's general fund

revenue. Nevada, on the other hand, makes do without taxing incomes.

So which state is correct? Neither. They just happened to take different taxation paths for different reasons.

The arbitrary nature of taxation is evident, too, within the California revenue system, particularly in sales taxes.

One oddity is that cold food is not subject to taxation but hot food is and the differential can be very difficult to sort out. Some years ago, a movie theater chain asked the state Board of Equalization to shift popcorn from being a taxable hot food to a tax-free cold food. The rationale was that by the time theater patrons returned to their seats with popcorn in hand, it had turned cold. The board agreed.

If someone buys computer software, such as Turbo Tax, in a store to file federal and state income tax returns, that purchase is subject to a sales tax. But if a large company obtains a custom computer program to prepare its tax returns, the purchase is free of sales taxes. Why? Because those who sell custom software lobbied the Legislature for an exemption in the 1980s.

The Legislature, at the behest of Gov. Gavin Newsom, is on the verge of enacting a new and especially questionable tax anomaly.

One budget trailer bill would impose a hefty new tax on the embryonic industry of extracting lithium from the brine of the Salton Sea in the Southern California desert.

Lithium is the key ingredient of long-life, rechargeable batteries used in everything from cell-phones to electric cars and immense electrical energy storage banks and therefore plays a key role in the state's drive to make itself carbon-free.

Most lithium is imported from other countries, including China. The Salton Sea, however, is a potentially huge source of the mineral that, if developed, would both contribute to energy inden pendence and create many new jobs in an economically depressed corner of the state.

Lithium companies have warned that taxing extraction, \$400 to \$800 per metric ton, would make California lithium more expensive than imports and discourage investment in the industry, but were ignored.

Another trailer bill, however, would give sellers of legal marijuana a hefty cut in taxes, responding to their complaints that taxation makes their product too expensive vis-à-vis pot from illegal growers and sellers.

So California politicians may be strangling an industry vital to their vision of a carbon-free future while encouraging — in essence, subsidizing — an industry that helps people get stoned.

That's about as arbitrary as it can get.

Social Security Matters

I'm Getting Spouse Benefits – What Happens to My Own?

Dear Rusty: I was born in late 1951. When I retired 5 years ago, I was made aware that my own Social Security benefit was less than half of my husband's SS Benefit. So, I chose to take half of his. What happens to my undispensed SS dollars? On the off chance the balance increases beyond the amount I am now collecting, can I eventually switch to my own full SS amount? Signed: Curious Senior

Dear Curious Senior: Much depends on exactly how you claimed your SS benefits five years ago and your age when you claimed. Because you were born in 1951, if you had reached your full retirement age (FRA) of 66 when you claimed SS five years ago and your husband was already collecting his benefits, you had the option to file a "restricted application for spousal benefits only" which would have enabled you to collect only your spouse bene-

fit while letting your own

benefit continue to grow.

But if you were not yet 66 when you claimed, the "restricted application" wasn't available to you, so you are now receiving your own benefit plus an additional amount to bring your payment to your spousal amount.

I expect that the latter is the case (that you didn't file a "restricted application"), which would mean that your current payment amount consists of two parts – your personal benefit (from your own lifetime work record) plus a "spousal boost" to bring your payment to your spousal entitlement. Except for the restricted application, Social Security always pays your own benefit amount first and then supplements your own benefit with an additional amount to give you what you're entitled to as a spouse. Thus, your personal benefits aren't "undispensed" you're already getting them, plus a spousal supplement.

Just to complete the picture, if you did file a "restricted application" at age 66, then your own benefit continued to grow until you were 70 (at which point it reached maximum). The growth amount would have been 8% per year additional benefit, so at age 70 your own benefit would have been 32% more than your FRA amount. If you know what your own FRA benefit amount was, then increase that by 32% to see if your

own amount is now higher

and, if so, contact Social Security to apply for your own higher benefit.

If you don't know what your personal FRA amount was and/or are uncertain if you filed a restricted application, you'll need to contact Social Security directly to see if you're entitled to any additional amount based on your own lifetime work record. You can contact Social Security at either the national center (1.800.772.1213) or at your local office (find the number at www.ssa.gov/locator). If you are currently getting spouse benefits only under a restricted application and your personal benefit is now higher, since you'll soon be 71 you should request six months of retroactive benefits when you switch from the restricted application to your own benefit.

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Yolo County Assessment Roll Tops \$33 Billion

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - Yolo County experienced another year of growth as reflected in the assessment roll data released by the county's Assessor/Clerk-Recorder/Registrar of Voters Jesse Salinas.

According to Salinas the annual assessment roll hit \$33.81 billion, a 7.23% increase over the prior year. The assessment roll reflects the total net assessed value of all real and business property in Yolo County as of January 1, 2022. "Local entities and services depend on property tax revenue to operate, including public schools, community colleges, cities and the county. We as a community rely on

these invaluable resources and the timely and accurate completion of the assessment roll," said Salinas.

The Yolo County assessment roll was delivered on June 28, 2022, ahead of the statutory deadline of July 1, 2022. "I am proud of the extraordinary work done by staff during these difficult times to close the roll successfully," said Salinas.

This is the tenth consecutive year of growth. The year's growth in property assessment is most notably due to the surge in demand for single-family housing as well as a strong market growth in the commercial/industrial properties throughout the county. The city of Winters experienced a 12.05% increase, the largest Yolo County increase for the sixth consecutive

year. West Sacramento and Woodland experienced the second and third largest increases within the county at 9.18% and 8.34%, respectively. The city of Davis increased by 5.59% and unincorporated areas of Yolo County grew by 5.07%. These percentage increases reflect a comparison of this year's assessment values to the prior year. "Taxpayers should know that we're closely monitoring the rapidly changing real estate market," said Salinas, while reminding the public that the taxable value represents the value as-of January 1, 2022. We encourage taxpayers to review their assessed value closely and contact the Assessor's Office with questions or concerns at (530) 666-8135 or by email at assessor@yolocounty. org. The Assessor's informal review filing period for residential properties is July 2nd – November 1st. Assessment. The 2022-2023 assessed values are available online for review beginning in late August. Tax bills are typically mailed in mid-September. Please note appeal applications are accepted July 2nd through November 30th. Friends of the Mission Awarded \$12.5M to Relocate Walter's House Residential Treatment Program

YOLO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Friends of the Mission received notification of \$12.5 million in state funding for the relocation and expansion of Walter's House residential substance use treatment program.

The new location will be at the East Beamer Way campus, 1901 E. Beamer Street in Woodland. The funding will be delivered through the Department of Health Care Services' (DHCS) Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP). Friends of the Mission is a Non-Profit Organization based in Woodland that provides affordable housing for individuals, families and youth who are in need. The unhoused population in

Yolo County is a focus and types of affordable housing include emergency, transitional, supportive and permanent housing projects and programs.

Walter's House is cur-

rently located in central Woodland. The move to the East Beamer Way campus is the third phase in the project and will provide for an increase in the number of beds, from 44 to 60. Phase one of the East Beamer Way campus, a 100-bed emergency shelter, opened in January of 2021 and phase two, 61 permanent supportive housing units will open later this summer. Once phase three is completed in 2023 the East Beamer Way campus will provide temporary and permanent housing for 170 people, and substance use treatment for 60 people.

"This development project for Walter's House at East Beamer Way will serve more people in Yolo County with much needed treatment care in a residential setting and support the expansion of services with our county, city and nonprofit partners," said Janet Ruggiero, Friends of the Mission board member.

Friends of the Mission is a Non-Profit Organization based in Woodland that provides affordable housing for individuals, families and youth who are in need. People who are homeless in Yolo County is a focus, and the types of affordable housing include emergency, transitional, supportive and permanent housing projects and programs.

This is the third of six rounds of \$2.2 billion in BHCIP funding from the

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state of California for fiscal vear 2021-22. The funding is for the construction, acquisition, and expansion of behavioral health facilities and community-based care options, as well as investments in mobile crisis infrastructure. Funds are to be used for facility capacity expansion. BHCIP is part of a broader commitment by the California Health & Human Services Agency (CalHHS) to improve the state's behavioral health and long-term care continuum infrastructure.

"This is an incredible project with multiple partners that will help our community address one of its biggest needs and biggest priorities, which is the increased access to residential substance use treatment for Yolo County residents," said Ian Evans, Adult and Aging Branch Director at Yolo County Health & Human Services, and also serves as the county's Alcohol and Drug Administrator. "Fourth & Hope, who operates Walter's House, has always been a great partner with Health and Human Services and we are all so excited for what this funding will mean in terms of increasing access to care for our community."

The City of Woodland has played a key role in providing the land on which to build the new treatment center and is a dedicated project supporter. City leadership recognizes that people struggling with homelessness often face many overlapping issues, such as disability, substance use, lack of employment,

and more. In response, Woodland has prioritized diverse responses to this persistent crisis, including personal follow-up with unhoused individuals, affordable housing production, and the game-changing collocated services at the East Beamer Way campus.

"Transformative proj-

ects like East Beamer Way happen through partnerships, and we are fortunate to work with a committed group of private, nonprofit, and government funders," said Ken Hiatt, Woodland City Manager. "The City of Woodland is committed to evidence-based solutions, and we know that on-site services paired with diverse housing options lead to better outcomes for the most vulnerable unhoused individuals." ★

I want those reading the Medicare column to know how important it is to be sure you are enrolled in Medicare Part B when you are leaving your job, especially those enrolling in COBRA.

When turning 65 enroll in Part B at least 90 days prior to your 65th birthday if you or your spouse are not working full-time. says.com.

"Is still working" with true employer benefits (not an individual plan) is what Medicare searches for to keep from giving you the Part B penalty.

Those past 65 and 90 days, when you enroll in Part B at leave your job and enroll in COBRA, the Toni Says® Medicare team always advises everyone that we consult with to have Medicare Part B in place as soon ago was laid off as you can or at least the month your COBRA is starting.

Medicare gives an 8-month window to enroll in Part B when leaving your employment with "true" employer benefits.

If you wait longer than 8-months as you have Alex, then you are subject to the Part B 10% penalty for each year or 12-month period, you could have had Part B which goes all the way back to the day you enrolled in Medicare Part A. - 3. Visit the DMV office to complete your REAL ID application

- A: One original or certified proof of identity and two different printed proofs of California residency are required.

Two different printed proofs of California residency

- Q: Do I have to wait for my current license or ID to expire before I get a REAL ID?
- A: No, you can apply for the REAL ID before your current driver license or ID expires! Be aware that your new REAL ID will hold the same expiration date as your current driver license or ID. Keep in mind that as the enforcement date gets closer, wait times are estimated to get longer. Don't delay and apply today to beat the rush!

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
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Finding Humanity with Project Free Write

YOLO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -The Yolo County Public Defender's Office introduces you to Project Free Write, an eight-week storytelling workshop created for system-impacted persons with a mission to bear witness to their voices. their experiences, and their common humanity.

The pilot Project Free Write workshop launched this spring with clients from the Day Reporting Center, a county program that provides comprehensive evidence-based services to men and women on probation, parole, or releasing from the local jail.

Project Free Write was founded on the fact that every person has a story and every story is worth listening to, investing in, and sharing. The power of written expression plays a critical role for system-impacted persons and the community where they live, facilitating a process of healing.

Throughout the workshop, participants experience different forms and genres of storytelling, such as prose, poetry, photography, and artwork. Two Public Defender Client Advocates, Eliana Swerdlow and Benjamin Hernandez, serve as instructors and guide participants in a discussion about various stories and forms of expression.

The discussions from the workshop yielded insightful and profound lessons to both the participants and instructors. Client Advocate Eliana Swerdlow reflects, "I remember one participant saying that every person he passes on his way to our class is a story — not just that they have a story. We are stories hoping to be heard."

Instructors often facilitate by asking participants thought-provoking questions, such as: What makes you feel free? What do you think about when you close your eyes at night? Where is home, and what does home mean to you?

These discussions occur every other week. They focus on an example piece's form, theme, and memorability, leading participants to develop, understand the meaning, and learn from cause and

Participants spend the entirety of the alternating week's course freewriting their own stories in any form they choose. Participants often incorporate what they have learned from the previous week's discussion into their pieces, and instructors and classmates support one another through the storytelling process.

As the eight-week workshop nears its end, participants are invited to publish their stories through the Public

Defender's Office and share them with the community. To tell a story is to take a risk. Just as storytelling can inspire empathy, it can also invite judgement. Participants took this risk by engaging in the pilot workshop.

"We hope that in the distribution of these stories and other works, community members pay attention to our participants' various identities and concerns," said Public Defender Tracie Olson. "Past and future storytellers are mothers, fathers, daughters, brothers, dreamers, and more. They are people."

Public Defender Client Advocates Eliana Swerdlow recently published recently published her story, and a participant will soon publish his story.

The Public Defender and the Day Reporting Center plan to host another eightweek Project Free Write workshop in autumn as it was well-received by participants. Of the workshop, one Project Free Write participant writes, "I highly recommend to anyone wanting to improve their writing skills and creative abilities. Project Free Write motivated my inner writer."

Countywide Access to Antigen Tests in Yolo County to Replace PCR Testing by Healthy Yolo Together

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - With the June 30 ending of COVID-19 PCR testing by Healthy Yolo Together (HYT) and Healthy Davis Together (HDT), Yolo County is reminding residents of the many other COVID-19 testing resources available, for free or low cost, to the community.

Retail pharmacies have home antigen test kits available for purchase, and insurance companies, including Medicare and Medi-Cal, are required to reimburse each member for up to eight tests each month. Many pharmacies bill insurances directly so customers pay nothing out of pocket. All U.S. households can order three rounds of free COVID antigen test kits through the U.S. Postal Service at www. COVID.gov/tests for home delivery.

Yolo County has developed two additional options for antigen tests. First, residents can go to their local library to pick up a free test kit. Second, Yolo County will launch a pilot program later this month with five antigen test kit vending machines at locations in West Sacramento, Woodland, Esparto, Winters, and Davis. Tests in the vending machines are free; residents are asked to take only what they need to ensure tests are available for everyone.

The State-sponsored OptumServe testto-treat site continues to operate Thursday through Sunday at 2780 East Gibson Road in Woodland. In addition to offering testing, the site has telehealth consultation and antiviral treatments available on site for persons who test positive and are at high risk of severe COVID-19 disease, including persons 50 and older and/or who have underlying conditions.

"We have developed a variety of tools to help stop the spread of COVID, including widely available antigen tests that provide nearly instantaneous results. We no longer need to rely on PCR tests," said Yolo County Health Officer Dr. Aimee Sisson. "In addition to testing, wearing masks indoors is strongly recommended during this time of high COVID-19 transmission."

When performed correctly, home antigen tests are reasonable substitutes for PCR tests. Like any test, including PCR tests, antigen tests are not perfect. Antigen tests are not always able to identify infected persons early in their illness when virus levels are low. This means that if someone has COVID-19 symptoms and tests negative for COVID-19 with an antigen test, they should stay home and test again one to two days later.

While HYT and HDT saliva testing ended on June 30, Healthy Davis Together will continue to monitor wastewater in Davis, Winters, Woodland, and Esparto for the virus that causes COVID-19 through the end of 2022 and expand wastewater monitoring to more communities in the Central Valley. Wastewater monitoring for COVID-19 has become an important public health tool to track virus trends in a community. Since wastewater doesn't rely on infected individuals to seek PCR testing, it provides an accurate and real-time indicator of community infections. This allows health officials to rapidly respond and encourage actions to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.
