## Creating a Security Plan

YOLO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Yolo Food Bank (the Food Bank) has entered into a \$75,000 contract with the Institute for Social Research (ISR) at California State University, Sacramento that will set the foundation for a countywide food security plan to guide the Food Bank and its partners as they collaborate to increase food and nutrition security and improve health outcomes for vulnerable residents.

"This ambitious effort is absolutely critical to identifying the needs of Yolo County residents and will inform how Yolo Food Bank and our network of partners can effectively collaborate on policies and innovative programs to meet those needs so that our community can thrive," stated Yolo Food Bank Executive Director Michael Bisch.

Momentum for the effort to create a countywide food security plan was sparked by discussion during the inaugural Food for Fairness Summit, which took place in October 2021

and was presented by Yolo Food Bank, UC Davis' Innovation Institute for Food and Health, and UC Davis' AI Institute for Food Systems. The partnership with ISR will enable them to assist in developing and administering a survey to collect population-based data about county residents to better understand Yolo County's food security levels and related health issues.

Equipped with findings from the population-based survey, Yolo Food Bank will more precisely identify how to adapt or implement new services to better serve those who are both attending and not attending their food distributions, with the goal of increasing consistent access to high-quality, culturally appropriate and nutritious food for every Yolo County resident.

The survey will be overseen by Robb Davis, Yolo Food Bank's impact and innovation officer, who has also been leading an analysis of the nutritional content of food distributed by Yolo Food Bank, and collecting demographic, food security, and satisfaction data from those

who are currently accessing food through their programs. These analyses have informed the creation of a nutrition policy for the Food Bank that is aimed to improve health outcomes and reduce barriers to access for vulnerable populations. The survey findings will supplement this ongoing work.

"All of this research is asking the question: how can we provide high-quality food, such as fresh fruits and vegetables, lean meats, quality dairy, low sugar options, etc., to the maximum number of people who need access to food, in a manner that is dignified and culturally-appropriate?" Yolo Food Bank Impact and Innovation Officer Robb Davis explained.

Yolo Food Bank's countywide food security plan seeks to build on multiple regionwide assessments measuring food security and poverty levels. Valley Vision's 2021 Sacramento Region Food System Action plan found that nearly 12.4% of residents in the Sacramento region were estimated to be food insecure in Continued on page 12

## **Experts Look** for Solutions as Fentanyl **Overdose Deaths Surge**

There's no question that the pandemic caused a troubling upward trend in addiction disorders, with many people turning to substances like opioids to help them cope with the loss of a loved one, feelings of isolation or job stress. But amid the darkness came a sliver of light: the dawn of telehealth and tele-mental health services, which provide convenient ways for folks to seek help.

"We've also seen the rollout of naloxone, the opioid reversal agent that can save lives," said Dr. Paul Christo in a recent interview. "It doesn't have to be prescribed by a physician. It can be, but in certain states, pharmacists can dispense it without a prescription. Drugs like methadone, buprenorphine and suboxone, these drugs help prevent relapse, reduce craving and are really important."

Dr. Christo, Associate Professor in the Division of Pain Medicine at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, wants to remind those battling addiction to make use of these valuable telemedicine and tele-mental health services, and adds that it's important for clinicians to advocate to their patients that online treatment options, including telehealth prescriptions for critical medications are available.

The opioid epidemic today progressed in three phases, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The first involves deaths caused by prescription opioids, the second, an increase in heroin use, and the third, a surge in the use of synthetic opioids or fentanyl. Experts say the U.S. is right in the middle of the third phase of the epidemic, due to the increasing availability of fentanyl and increasing rates of overdose deaths involving synthetic opioids.

According to a recent study there were 632,331 drug overdoses between 1999 and 2016. Most of Continued on page 3

**UTK and Kindergarten** registration can be done entirely online. Get started at www.enrollatwusd.org.

UTK Eligibility: 5th birthday falls on or between Sept. 2, 2022 - Feb. 2, 2023

Kindergarten Eligibility: 5th birthday falls on or before September 1, 2022

Preschool registration requires some additional steps. Get started at bit.ly/ FREEpreschool.

Preschool Eligibility: 3rd or 4th birthday falls on or before December 1st, 2022.

Multipurpose (930 Westacre Road, West Sacramento) on January 29th from 9 am to 12 pm. Families who submit registration packets in-person must follow all COVID-19 safety protocols.

The Community Report takes the difficult-to-understand 133-page LCAP and reshapes the information in an infographic, making it more accessible and ensuring the community has the tools its needs to more easily understand the investments WUSD is making in student learning.

**Local Control Accountability Plan** (LCAP) - The LCAP is intended as a comprehensive planning tool to support student outcomes and is an important component of the local control funding formula (LCFF). Under the LCFF, all local educational agencies (LEAs) including school districts, county offices of education (COEs), and charter schools are required to prepare an LCAP, which describes how they intend to meet annual goals for all pupils, with specific activities to address state and local priorities identified pursuant to California

Education Code (EC) sections 52060(d), 52066(d), and 47605. The LCAP is a tool for local educational agencies to set goals, plan actions, and leverage resources to meet those goals to improve student outcomes.

The LCAP Community Report, prepared in November 2021, tells the story of WUSD's 3-year LCAP beginning in 2021 using the most recently available data from 2019, 2020, and 2021. Note that the pandemic began in 2020, disrupting schools across the country, and affecting the availability of some data and the measures themselves.

#### Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (LCP)

Senate Bill 98, approved by Governor Newsom on June 29, 2020, made several key changes to accountability requirements for 2020-21. These include the establishment of a new requirement, The Learning Continuity, and Attendance

## **Fentanyl Overdose Deaths Surge**

Continued from page 1 these deaths (78.2 percent) were drug overdoses with known drug classification. Moreover, 21.8 percent were unclassified drug overdoses. A further investigation revealed that for unclassified drug overdoses, 71.8 percent involved opioids, translating to 99,160 additional opioid-related deaths.

There were over 70,000 drug overdose deaths in 2017, according to an estimate from the CDC. Based

on findings from the new study, over half of those deaths, about 47,000 are suspected of having involved opioids.

Another study on opioid overdoses found that the number of drug overdose deaths decreased by 4 percent from 2017 to 2018. In 2018, more than 67,000 people died from drug overdoses, making it a leading cause of injury-related death in the United States. Almost 70 percent

involved a prescription or illicit opioid of those

deaths. "COVID-19 impacted the drug supply chain by closing borders on some regions, and it led to the higher death rate," Dr. Christo explained. He added that drugs become more challenging to get, and the potency of overdose goes up. It also impacts the price, everything goes up, and in that sense, it becomes more deadly each day, according to Dr. Christo. ★

## A Return to the Stage

## SCSO to Debut in Renovated Concert Space

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Choral Society and Orchestra (SCSO) are celebrating their 26th year performing in the Sacramento Region with a debut concert in the newly renovated SAFE Credit Union Performing Arts Center (1301 L Street, Sacramento, CA 95814) on Saturday, May 14 at 8 PM.

The SCSO will partner with guest chorus Schola Cantorum of Sacred Heart Church in Sacramento to perform the dramatic and romantic Requiem by Giuseppe Verdi, which is billed as a work of virtuosic brilliance. Verdi wrote the work in Latin, and the performers will sing it in Latin with the English translation printed in the programs and projected above the stage. "It's a powerful and operatic work that demands large choral forces," said SCSO President and CEO Jim McCormick. So, SCSO Music Director Donald Kendrick will conduct 175 chorus singers, four accomplished soloists, and 52 orchestra members – for a total force of 232 performers on stage.

The artists are eager to finally perform in the renovated concert venue after the forced hiatus due to COVID-19. During the shutdown, the SCSO members were planning their comeback, raising more than \$120,000 to pay for new choral risers. McCormick said the investment was "a legacy for the future," showcasing the courage and dedication of the SCSO to put in that work without any indication of when they'd be back on the stage. "It says something

about our resilience," said McCormick.

And now, with the upcoming performance on those new risers, McCormick said it feels like SCSO is "rising again." The risers will wrap around the orchestra, which McCormick said will create an incredible "balance of sound." With the sopranos behind the violins, the tenors and altos behind the brass and woodwind instruments, and the basses singing behind the cellos, the complementary tones will blend together seamlessly on the stage. And a new Constellation Sound System will amplify all the performers with a natural, high-quality sound. McCormick said these new features will "raise the quality and level of professionalism."

The concert will be dedicated to the people of Ukraine and all oppressed people, and it will open with a performance of the Ukrainian National Anthem.

McCormick said that "music is so healing" and Requiem is often referred to as "the Mass for humanity," expressing great sadness but also great hope, so the performance is fitting "at a time of war when people are in need of solace."

The SCSO recorded a performance of Verdi's Requiem 11 years ago at the Mondovi Center in Davis, CA, and those CDs will be available for sale for \$10 each, with proceeds going to Ukrainian relief. Additional donations for Ukraine will also be accepted.

The performance will also honor the memory of Sacramento's celebrated restaurateur Biba Caggiano, who passed away in August 2019. "She put Sacramento on the map when it comes to food," said McCormick. "She was fiercely Italian, and no one was more Italian than Giuseppe Verdi," so the SCSO felt the Requiem

## **Social Security Matters**

## Will My Wife Get a Spouse Benefit When I Claim at 70?

Dear Rusty: My wife started receiving her social security at 65 (her full retirement age) and she will be 69 years old this July. I was able to receive half of her social security under an older law. This April, I will turn 70 and will start to receive my own Social Security. I know I will no longer be receiving a spousal benefit at that time, but what I don't understand is will my wife be able to claim a spousal benefit and collect 50% of my Social Security. She presently is receiving about \$930 but 50% of my social security could be around \$1800. Can you provide any insight on

this? Signed: Turning 70 Dear Turning: You are correct that you are now collecting your spouse benefit under an "old law," which was changed by the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2015 and is no longer available to anyone born after January 1, 1954. You are also correct that since you are now receiving a spousal benefit from your wife on a "restricted application for spouse benefits only," you can claim your personal SS retirement benefit to start at age 70, at which time your spousal benefit

You can apply for your age 70 benefit now, prior to April, but just be sure to specify on your application that you want your SS retirement benefit to begin in April (to avoid a reduction). FYI, you can do this online at www.ssa.gov there is a question on the application which asks if you are now collecting benefits from anyone else, to which you should answer "yes" and provide your wife's Social Security number. To apply online, you'll need to first create your personal "my Social Security" account, which is easy to do at www.ssa.gov/myaccount. Of course, you can

also apply by phone at your

local SS office or by calling

1.800.772.1213 but apply-

ing online is by far the most

efficient method.

After you have submitted your application for your own SS retirement benefit, your wife can apply for a spousal benefit from you, but her spousal benefit amount may not be precisely as you believe. First, your wife's spousal benefit will be based on the benefit amount you were entitled to at your full retirement age (FRA) of 66, not your age 70 benefit amount. Second, your wife was born in 1953 so her full retirement age is 66 (not 65). If your wife claimed her own SS benefit at age 65, she actually claimed a year early, so it was slightly reduced from her full benefit amount. That isn't a bad thing because it allowed you to collect your spouse benefit a year earlier, but it will slightly affect her spousal benefit from you

from your wife will stop. and make it a bit less than 50% of your FRA benefit amount.

When a spouse takes their own benefit early their spousal amount will be less than 50% because of the way spouse benefits are calculated. Your wife's new benefit as your spouse will consist of two parts - her own benefit and a "spousal boost" to bring her payment to her spousal entitlement. Her 'spousal boost" - which is the difference between her FRA benefit and half of your FRA benefit - will be added to her slightly reduced age 65 benefit and the total becomes her spousal payment, but it will be a bit less than 50% of your FRA benefit amount. Nevertheless, you were smart to take advantage of an "old law" which permitted you to get a spouse benefit from your wife while your own benefit grew to maximum.

## \$34.7 Million Awarded for Local **Transportation Projects**

Caltrans News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Caltrans announced it is awarding \$34.7 million in state and federal funds to cities, counties, tribes and transit agencies throughout California - including \$25 million funded by Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 – to plan sustainable transportation projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve the state highway system, enhance access to safe walkways and bike paths, and increase natural disaster preparedness.

'These grants are funding the planning for sustainable and more resilient transportation projects that will prepare the state for rising sea levels, wildfires and other climate related impacts," said Caltrans Interim Director Steven Keck. "By collaborating with local communities, we are working together to achieve both our climate goals and an equitable transportation infrastructure for people who rely on transit and intercity bus service."

In total, Caltrans will allocate:

\$18.4 million in Sustainable Communities Competitive and Technical Grants to 57 local, regional, tribal and transit agencies for climate change adaptation, transportation and land use planning, and natural disaster preparedness. This includes more than \$4.5 million to fund planning for

14 projects that improve safety and access for people who walk and bike;

\$3.8 million in federally funded Strategic Partnership Grants to 10 projects that will plan for zero-emission medium- and heavyduty vehicles, sustainable goods movement, wildlife connectivity, intercity bus systems and other sustainability initiatives;

\$12.5 million - all from SB 1 - in Sustainable Communities Formula Grants to metropolitan planning organizations to further regional transportation plans and sustainable community strategies. This grant will be awarded later this spring.

Caltrans awards transportation planning grants each year through a competitive process to encourage local and regional projects. Applications are evaluated on how they further state transportation goals by identifying and addressing statewide, interregional, or regional transportation deficiencies on the highway system.

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually split between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that are partially funded

## **Property Tax Levies Increase 6% Statewide**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

Today, the california state board of equalization (boe) released its fiscal year (fy) 2020-21 annual Report, which reported that the total net statewide county-assessed property value was \$7.1 trillion, resulting in \$79.9 billion of local property tax levies.

Those property tax levies contributed \$43 billion to schools and \$36.9 billion to local government. This is an additional \$4.5 billion, or a 6% increase, in property tax levies from FY 2019-20 of

\$75.4 billion. "The increase in property tax levies to almost \$80 billion is a clear reflection of California's vibrant real estate market," said Chair Malia M. Cohen. "As we transition away from the disruptions of the COVID-19 pandemic, I am heartened that these

additional property tax revenues will provide significant funding for our schools and critical local government services."

The BOE is constitutionally and statutorily responsible for the oversight of California's property tax system. The FY 2020-21 Annual Report includes state- and countyassessed property values, aggregate qualifying property tax exemptions, and other statewide property tax data. New in this Annual Report are the highlights of BOE's accomplishments in fulfilling its statewide role in the implementation of Proposition 19, The Home Protection for Seniors, Severely Disabled, Families and Victims of Wildfire or Natural Disasters Act. In November 2020, California voters approved Proposition 19, which made significant changes to certain property tax laws.

Past annual reports and additional information can be found on the BOE website.

The California State Board of Equalization (BOE) is the only elected tax board in the country, and it is comprised of four Equalization District Members and the State Controller. Since 1879, the BOE's constitutional and statutory duties include the oversight of the 58 County Assessors to ensure assessment practices are uniform and consistent statewide. In addition, the BOE directly assesses the property of regulated railroads and certain public utilities, collects the Private Railroad Car Tax, and is responsible for the Alcoholic Beverage Tax and Tax on Insurers. BOE's critical role in property tax administration by promoting fair and equitable assessments protects the tax dollars that schools, local communities, and the State of California depend on every day.

## Sacramento - Area New Home Sales Total 839 In March

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento-area homebuilders sold 839 new homes in the eight-county region in March, the most sales since 888 were reported in July 2020 and the second-highest monthly total since 846 new homes were sold in May 2005, the North State Building Industry Association reported. BIA President and CEO Michael Strech attributed the burst of sales to two factors.

"First and foremost, there remains an almost insatiable desire on the part of area residents for a new home that's designed for today's needs," Strech said. "Most models were designed with the workfrom-home trend in mind, and even as the pandemic has eased, many companies are still allowing employees to work from home full-time or part-time."

He also attributed some of the surge to buyers moving quickly

to lock-in their purchase in light of news that the Federal Reserve would be raising interest rates this year. Rates are likely to rise and will be volatile given uncertainties around inflation, the war in Ukraine and other factors.

Still, Strech noted that while 3% rates are likely a thing of the past, they had hovered in today's 4-5% range for most of the decade leading up to the pandemic, and were over 6% just 15 years ago, meaning today's rates are still considered to be very low.

Strech urged local government officials around the region to expedite the lengthy permitting process to help builders bring new homes to the market more quickly, and to work with builders to reduce fees that average nearly \$100,000 per home.

"Today's chronic shortage of new and existing homes can only be resolved if our industry can increase production over the long haul. It's important that state and local officials work with

homebuilders to find ways to increase production and reduce the fees and other barriers that drive up costs," he said.

The monthly totals were also the highest reported in March since 1,146 homes were sold in March 2004. Sales

are reported from Amador, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo, and Yuba counties.




April showers bloom beautiful books. There are so many beautiful spring releases perfect for that afternoon escape. How will you spend these beautiful sunny afternoons?

The extremely graphic, gruesome, and deeply disturbing images of those five children have now been made public.

The Progressive Anti-Abortion Uprising organization, whose members turned the remains over to authorities, said in a press release, "Their late gestational ages as well as their apparent sustained injuries potentially show violations of the Partial Birth Abortion Act as well as the Born Alive Infants Protection Act

which are federal crimes." Pro-life activists and members of Congress are calling for full investigations. Wade. Since Roe, abortion has taken the lives of at least 63 million children in America and has been the number one cause of death worldwide for many years.

In Colorado, only three days after news broke about the 115 aborted baby corpses in Washington, progressive Democrat Gov. Jared Polis brazenly signed into law North America's most extreme pro-abortion law, all the while celebrating the new law's grant of absolute unrestricted freedom to kill innocent babies.

Among the disturbing provisions of new Colorado law (deceptively called the "Reproductive Health Equity Act"):

Unborn babies are explicitly stripped of any rights under state law.

In the Bible, Israel was forbidden from worshiping the false god Molech (Lev. 18:21), a practice



How different are Colorado and other Democratcontrolled states these days from the cult of Molech? In just 50 years, activists have gone from claiming a "right" of abortion (not found in the U.S. Constitution), to demanding taxpayer funding and enthusiastically supporting the death of babies up to and well after birth.

Is the outright butchery exposed in images of aborted children in Washington any different than the detestable ritual of child sacrifice to Molech? Consider recent reports of women happily taking abortion pills on the Supreme Court steps while taunting pro-life activists - all for the attention of the adoring left-wing media.

The overturn of Roe is far from certain. But even if it is ultimately retracted by the High Court, states under Democrat control (like Colorado) will still be abortion havens. Americans who value the sanctity of life and want unborn babies protected must continue to stand for truth, insist that lawmakers protect life, work for the election of genuinely pro-life candidates, and resist all attempts to legalize the barbaric practice of child sacrifice.



## **Next Hornets Coach Introduced**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Journeyman coach David Patrick was introduced as the new Sacramento State men's basketball coach on Tuesday afternoon, April 15, at the Hornet Athletic Center.

Patrick is the 15th head coach in program history. He most recently served as the associate head coach for the men's basketball team at the University of Oklahoma last season.

"It's a dream come true for me," Patrick said Tuesday at his introductory press conference. "(My family and I) have always wanted to come back to California in the right situation. I was in a good spot at Oklahoma (and) had no reason to leave unless it was for a great opportunity. When you see Sac State after being in NorCal for a long time, I just thought it was somewhere that was untouched, somewhere that could really blossom."

Patrick takes over for interim coach Brandon Laird, who stepped in for Brian Katz after he retired days before last season began following 13 seasons due to a health issue. The Hornets won five of their last seven games to end the season and had 11 total wins, the most wins for any first-year Sac State head coach in the Division I era. Laird spent 11 years with the Hornets program.

According to a report from The State Hornet, the student news organization at Sac State, Laird and Katz were unhappy with the mishandling of the coaching staff's departure by the Sac State Athletics Department.

Sac State Athletic Director Mark Orr has known Patrick for years, dating back to their days together at Saint Mary's College. Patrick served as an associate head coach for the men's basketball team from 2006-2010 while Orr was Director of Athletics and Recreation.

"The previous staff left great character here, that's where it starts at," Patrick said. "The talent is one thing but high character kids is what you want to be around. I can get the players, that's not the hard part. It's the character, it's guys that wanna win and guys that wanna win at a high level. And we'll do that here, I promise you that.

"We're going to recruit from the inside out. We'll recruit here locally and then build out from nationally and internationally."

It didn't take long for Patrick to get started

recruiting from the NCAA transfer portal.

On Monday, April 14 he signed 6-foot-9 Australian forward Hunter Marks, a three-year starter who is transferring from Hartford. Several college basketball reporters were surprised Marks signed with the Hornets rather than a high-major school, indicating that the new Sac State coach got a steal of a prospect. Four days later Patrick reunited with Callum McRae, a 7-foot-1 Kiwi center who is transferring from UC Riverside.

Patrick brings many years of college coaching experience at several different stops with him to Sacramento. Since 2006 when Patrick retired from his playing career overseas, he has been an assistant coach at six collegiate programs.

In 2018, he got his first head coaching job at UC Riverside, where he spent two seasons. Patrick made an impact in his short stint with the Highlanders, as he currently holds the best two-year start in school history with a 27-38 (.415) record. In his second season at UCR, he led the team to a 17-15 record, which is the most wins in the program's Division I era.

"This isn't a steppingstone job for me," Patrick said. "I've got two girls that are (in) tenth grade and sixth grade, we're not trying to jump spots. If you look at my resume, I've kind of moved a little bit the last year or two but that's not what we're about. We're about staying somewhere and staying here to make it last."

With his experience, Patrick has brought in some great players over the years. He has recruited 19 players who have gone on to play professionally with 11 of them playing in the NBA. Seven of those players were selected in the NBA Draft and four were first round picks.

In 2016 while Patrick was at LSU, his godson Ben Simmons was selected with the first overall pick in the draft by the Philadelphia 76ers. Simmons has gone on to become the 2018 Rookie of the Year, a three-time All-Star and has been selected to the All-Defensive First Team twice during four seasons in the league.

"I am so excited for coach Patrick to take on the role as head coach at Sacramento State," Simmons said in a Sac State news release. "He is one of the most underrated coaches and recruiters in the country. When I went through the recruiting process, there was never a doubt that I wanted to be coached by him. He is more than a coach,

he is family. He cares deeply about his players, not only as it relates to basketball, but also life."

Other current NBA players that Patrick has coached include Desmond Bane of the Memphis Grizzlies, Moses Moody of the Golden State Warriors and Patty Mills of the Brooklyn Nets. The 46-year-old Patrick has coached on five NCAA Tournament teams, four NIT teams and was an assistant coach on the Australian men's national basketball team that won bronze at the 2020 Summer Olympics.

"I think if you win in the classroom, you win on the floor," Patrick said. "This degree will help you longer in life because the ball is going to stop bouncing at some point. And this is a lifelong deal with me. I want to be at their weddings, when they have children, this is about a life term relationship, not just the four years that I'm going to be with these student-athletes."

Patrick said that he is going to rely on his older players and prioritize playing defense and rebounding.

"Everybody wants to shoot and play offense," Patrick said. "But they'll tell you the first day of practice every morning we're starting with bricks and getting after it. I promise you we'll be one of the best defensive and rebounding teams not only in the Big Sky (Conference) but in the country, I guarantee that."

The new Sac State men's basketball coach addressed the size of the Nest at his introductory press conference. The 1,012 seat multi-purpose gymnasium that the Hornets play in is one the oldest and smallest venues in all of NCAA Division I college basketball.

"The gym doesn't matter, it's the people," Patrick said. "If you're going somewhere for just the gym, you ain't going for the right reasons. (If we) get a real trust and relationship with these student-athletes, it doesn't matter where they play at."

Patrick will now attempt to do something that no Sac State basketball team, men's or women's, has ever done: Win a Big Sky Conference Championship and advance to the NCAA Tournament.

"People say, 'Why Sac State? Why would you take (the) Sac State (head coaching position)? You're at a Power Five job.' But I see this place being somewhere you can compete for Big Sky Championships yearly," Patrick said. "I promise you we'll win a lot of games here over at Sac State." ★





2021. Research has established that poverty and food insecurity are deeply intertwined and can result in poor health outcomes and chronic diseases such as obesity, diabetes, and coronary heart disease. Additionally, in Yolo County, 20.9% of residents are living in poverty, according to a 2021 study from the Public Policy Institute of California, which was the highest poverty ranking among California counties.

Yolo Food Bank's work to create a countywide food security plan is a timely effort that has garnered support from the healthcare community and local organizations and coalitions focused on improving public health outcomes throughout the region, including the Yolo County Food Security Coalition. The coalition is made up of academics, medical professionals, and others who voluntarily convene to explore collaborations to increase food and nutrition security.

Food security, as defined by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, is achieved when all people, at all times, have physical and economic access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food to meet their dietary needs and food preferences for an active and healthy life. Nutrition security builds on food security by focusing on how the quality of our diets can help reduce diet-related diseases, according to the United States Department of Agriculture. Edye Kuyper and Lucia Kaiser are members of the Yolo County Food Security Coalition who voiced their support for addressing food and nutrition security through the creation of a countywide food security plan.

"Food and nutrition security are foundational to good health, yet we've never had reliable data on the scope of food insecurity in Yolo County. The results of the population-based food security survey will help us better target our Food is Medicine programs and assess their impact on improving patient access to healthy food," said CommuniCare Health Centers Food and Wellness Manager Edye Kuyper. "We're grateful for Yolo Food Bank's leadership on this important initiative and happy to contribute to this effort."

'We must have an accurate and timely picture of who is food insecure and why. Without this data and a strategic food security plan, health and economic disparities will grow even worse over time," Lucia Kaiser, Ph.D., a retired community nutrition specialist and registered dietitian affiliated with the UC Davis Department of Nutrition and UC Agriculture and Natural Resources, shared. "We have a unique opportunity to achieve food security and improve the health of all people in this county. A strategic food security plan developed in Yolo County could be an excellent model for many other counties in our nation."

"We're aware of complex layers around food security, such as lack of access to adequate medical care, immigration status, language barriers, high cost of housing and transportation. Of these macro-level factors, we're addressing one: food security," Davis added. "This is a systemic issue that we're trying to both grasp and address."


A multiple-step approach will inform the countywide food security plan: 1. Use a population-based (structured) survey to estimate the overall prevalence of food insecurity, and assess food access and food and health issues in Yolo County; 2. Use the same survey to focus on a sample of food system workers, unhoused individuals, and senior residents across the County to derive estimates of food insecurity within these groups; 3. Conduct individual and group-based

semi-structured interviews to explore critical factors related to food access in greater detail.

"First, we need to execute a broad analysis of food security in Yolo County, then talk to specific groups within that community, and then go and sit with people and learn from them more deeply," Davis said. "These are all pathways to deepening our understanding. When we understand the barriers and assets that residents have, we can work together to create solutions."

## **Transportation Tax Initiative**

If you saw my last column ... "More Tax Please", you are aware of the recent court opinions which are now allowing politicians to take dusty, previously failed tax proposals and repackage them as new "citizen initiatives". And, by doing so, local government is bypassing the constitutional requirement for a two-thirds voter approval, and letting a "citizen initiative" for a new tax pass by only a simple majority vote requirement. SO MUCH EASIER TO PASS NEW TAXES!!

And also with this new method, local governments do not even have to bother with those pesky things like public hearings, keeping the public informed, and having reasonable public debate!! That darn public, don't they know the political elites know what is best for them? (sarcasm)

Their consultant said the tax increase would not pass if there was any organized opposition to it. The coalition consisted of business, agriculture, social groups and others - including the NAACP and the National Action Network; and the reasons to oppose the tax hike have not changed too

much in the past two years. First, it is still a bad time to propose a new tax. Although the pandemic appears to be subsiding, the county's economy is still weak. One third of SMUD customers are either behind or have stopped paying their bills altogether. And small family businesses are still closing their doors. Inflation is raging. The cost of food and fuel is way up! This proposal has been kicking around for years, but county leaders seemingly cannot read the room that homeowners, renters and businesses are struggling.

improvements because of age and deterioration, local governments, and especially Sacramento, have a history of neglecting infrastructure and instead fund fancy new projects or programs until roads, sidewalks, and other infrastructure start to fall into disrepair. It is only then they run to taxpayers for more money. We believe that historic neglect and lack of prioritization shouldn't be rewarded.

Third, this is a highly regressive tax falling disproportionately on the shoulders of the working poor and the middle class, hence the historic opposition by the NAACP and

As a concluding comment, the proponents of this half-percent tax increase are well aware of the broad spectrum of community concern and opposition of over the past years ago. Yet, as President of the Sacramento Taxpayers Association, nobody has reached out to us to even discuss digging up this sad proposal from the grave.
