Firefighters Honored for Saving Woman's Life

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Three West Sacramento Firefighters received a Proclamation from Mayor Martha Guerrero last week for what they say was "just doing their job". On Saturday, February 5th, an emergency call came in asking for help because a fence was on fire. When fire engine 42 arrived, the house was engulfed in flames. Standing outside was a frantic man telling the firefighters that his wife, who is disabled, was still in the house and could not get out. Fire Captain Miguel Altamirano, firefighter James Staley and Fire Engineer Terry Dries rushed in

and rescued the woman. She was taken to the hospital but was spared from any injury from the incident.

Mayor Guerrero explained that she is aware that these men were doing their jobs, but she wanted them to be aware of the appreciation that she and the city have of their actions. She thanked them for their courage and acknowledged that they constantly provide West Sacramento, and the region, with heroic actions while keeping the community safe.

The Mayor told the three men (one of whom joined the meeting via zoom) that on behalf of herself and the City Council, as well as the members of the

community, we are all grateful for what they do and for the fact that they put so much of their heart and soul into serving the community. The Proclamation acknowledged the firefighters for their work and heroism on a day-to-day basis. Mayor Guerrero then thanked them for being such an outstanding representation of the West Sacramento Fire Department.

In an effort to save money of the city's resources, the meeting was not held at the fire station, but was instead held at the Sacramento Regional Fire Museum, on Industrial Ave. Thank you to Ric Doris for making the museum available. ★

County Completes Homeless Point in Time Count

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - On February 23, 2022, Yolo County conducted its 2022 sheltered and unsheltered Point in Time Count (PIT), allowing communities to get critical information on its homeless population. It represented the first PIT since 2019 as a winter surge of COVID-19 delayed the 2021 count. Several County, community-based providers, and volunteers spread throughout the County to complete the count. Their effort proved an overall success, with the first time using an online survey tool to facilitate a smooth process.

During the PIT count, each team member was tasked with an in-person survey or a visual count if the resident declined the survey. All surveys were anonymous. The surveys collected demographic information on the homeless population in terms of race, ethnicity, age, how long they have been in Yolo County, how long they have been unhoused, and other key information to help programs understand the needs of the overall unhoused population.

"This year's Point In Time count relied on a large number of community volunteers. They diligently crisscrossed the County to secure a reliable estimate of the numbers of homeless and unhoused," said County Supervisor Gary Sandy and Chair of the countywide Commission to Address Homelessness. "An accurate county count will enable us to better coordinate our resources, maximize State and Federal funding, and strategically address the needs of those who lack housing."

The County's Commission to Address Homelessness is comprised of elected officials from Woodland, West Sacramento, Davis, Winters, and the Chair of Yolo County's Homeless Continuum of Care (HPAC). The Commission supports countywide policy, strategy, and funding recommendations aimed at addressing homelessness and housing issues.

As an example in West Sacramento, several community groups

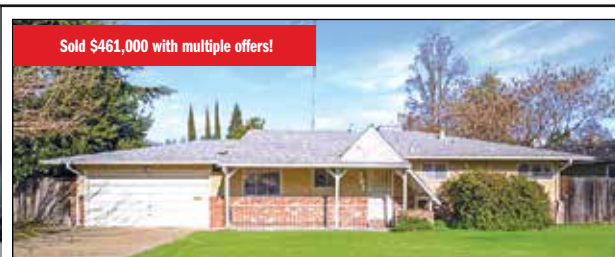

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - The Yolo Land Trust is proud to announce recent organizational growth, strengthening the land trust's capacity to serve the Yolo County community and continue the important work of conserving productive farmland for future generations. In January, the Yolo Land Trust added two new members to their board of directors, elected its 2022 slate of officers, and hired a new staff member.

The Yolo Land Trust Board of Directors voted in the addition of Duncan MacEwan of ERA Economics and Nick Gallagher of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). partnered together to ensure we reached as many unhoused residents in the City as possible – West Sacramento Police Department, Yolo County Children's Alliance, West Sacramento Mercy Coalition, Communicare, and Downtown Streets Team. The team was split into several groups to cover both urban and rural areas of the City. The team effort also provided a comprehensive opportunity to engage clients and offered a connection to support systems in each community, with a caring person and resource information for their needs.

First conducted in 2005,

the PIT count is an unduplicated count of persons experiencing homelessness on a single night within the last 10 days of January (delayed by Omicron in 2022). Communities are required to collect basic demographic and household information. In addition, communities must identify if a person is chronically homeless, indicating long-time or repeated homelessness and the presence of a disability. Communities report the numbers from their counts to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as well as in their annual application for McKinney-Vento funds. The federal

government uses information from the local PIT counts, among other data sources, in its Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR) to Congress.

HUD requires that local jurisdictions submit a full report by the end of April 2022, and Yolo County will complete its report before the deadline. The report will be posted on the County's website at www.yolocounty.org.

Library to Promote eBooks and eAudiobooks

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - Yolo County Library, Washington Unified School District in West Sacramento and the Winters Joint Unified School District have formed an innovative technology partnership to increase access to more eBooks and eAudiobooks for students. The unique collaboration strives to promote literacy and digital learning by combining school and library digital reading resources in one app.

“Through this partnership, students can read or listen and learn anytime, anywhere because they now have 24/7 access to digital and audio content on smart phones and other computing devices,” said Mark Fink, Yolo County Librarian and Chief Archivist. “We are excited to provide free and safe access to thousands of age-appropriate titles for students to use inside the classroom, at home or on the go.”

Using the Sora app, students in Yolo County can borrow from their school's digital collection of classroom and pleasure reading materials AND from Yolo County Library's children's and young adult digital collections. Students can easily log into the Library's digital collection using the app and their student ID, rather than requiring a separate library card. Sora will automatically filter content to only include age-appropriate titles depending on each student's grade level.

Features available to students on the Sora app include:

Borrowing and opening books with one screen tap; Accessing assigned reading

from the school; Seeing notes and highlighted text and exporting them to PDF, CSV, Google Drive formats; Tracking the number of books read; tracking total reading time

In addition, Yolo County Library provides TumbleBook Library for all Yolo County public schools. In Tumblebook Library, kids can safely browse and read books by their favorite authors. All books are instantly available, with no need to place a hold or check out. Schools can provide Tumblebook Library on their own website.

Patrons of all ages can access Yolo County Library's wide selection of popular digital eBooks and eAudiobooks for free using the Libby app. Yolo County Library's robust collection offers eBooks and eAudiobooks, including bestsellers and new releases. Libby can be used on any major device or computer, including Apple, Android, Chromebook, and "send to Kindle" (U.S. only).

The Sora app is available for Washington Unified School District and Winters Joint Unified School District students to download through the Apple App Store and Google Play Store, and on Chromebooks that support the Google Play Store. It is also available for use in web browsers at <https://soraapp.com> on any computer.

Social Security Matters

I'm Confused About Taking Medicare and Social Security

Dear Rusty: I just turned 64 and now get stuff about Medicare and Medigap and so on. I really don't know how to retire when it's time. What should I do? What am I looking for? Am I eligible for anything as of now? I'm so confused about all this that I don't even know if I can retire when it's time. Maybe I should just continue working so I don't have to try to figure this out. **Signed: Confused**

Dear Confused: Deciding when to retire from work is usually a difficult decision for everyone, so don't feel alone as you struggle with deciding what's best for you personally. I'll try to provide some insight into what you should be looking at now, at age 64:

The reason you're now getting all that unsolicited information about Medicare and "Medigap" is because you're approaching the magic age of 65, when you first become eligible for those senior healthcare services. But if you are still working and now

have "creditable" healthcare coverage from your employer, you don't need to enroll in any Medicare plan until your employer coverage ends (If your employer healthcare coverage is a group plan with at least 20 participants, that coverage is "creditable"). So, if you plan to continue working and have creditable healthcare coverage, you can simply ignore all those healthcare solicitations. You don't need to worry about enrolling in Medicare until your creditable employer coverage ends, at which point you will be able to enroll in a Medicare program without incurring a late enrollment penalty.

You also do not need to apply for Social Security now (or at age 65) - you can wait until you retire from working full time to apply for Social Security. In fact, you probably should wait until you fully retire from working to claim Social Security, because at age 64 (or 65) you will be subject to Social Security's "earnings test" if you claim SS benefits. The earnings test limits how much you can earn before Social Security takes away some of your benefits and, if your earnings are high enough, it could even disqualify you from getting SS benefits while you are still working. Social Security's earnings test applies until you reach your full retirement age, which is 66

years and 6 months. If you claim Social Security before that and exceed the annual earnings limit (\$19,560 for 2022), SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. So, if you're working full time and plan to continue that, waiting to apply for Social Security would be prudent. Delaying Social Security would also mean a higher benefit when you later claim because your benefit will grow for as long as you delay (up to age 70). And although you will become eligible for Medicare when you turn 65, if you're still working and have creditable healthcare coverage from your employer at that time, you can defer enrolling in Medicare until your employer coverage ends.

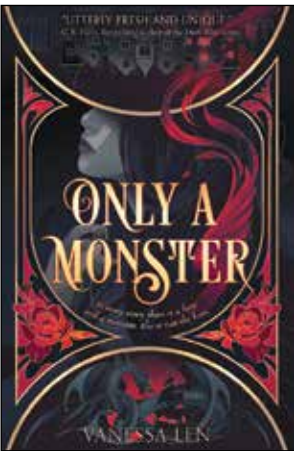
Only A Monster

Easily a top choice for young adult fantasy, this is an author to watch and a series to follow. Even though be warned at the book's closing, readers are left with the haunting question- Are monsters born or made? ★

A BROODING DARKNESS ENGULFS “THE BATMAN” IN GRIM VIOLENCE

“THE BATMAN”

You don’t have to be of a certain age, because of streaming options, to be familiar with the ‘60s camp classic television series “Batman” to appreciate the comical times of the Caped Crusader’s battles with evildoers like the Penguin, the Riddler and the Joker.

Frank Gorshin’s Riddler, clad in a green suit adorned with question marks, offered riddles for his nefarious deeds. Burgess Meredith’s Penguin, who had an affinity for umbrellas, waddled around in a tuxedo imitating the name-sake bird.

Cesar Romero’s clown-faced Joker was a villainous prankster leaving behind jokes as clues to his crimes. For Matt Reeves’

“The Batman” there are no cartoonish characters. Even the Joker is nowhere to be found.

This reboot of the DC universe’s crimefighter takes a different turn with Robert Pattinson’s Bruce Wayne/Batman, as he is not the billionaire playboy of old, but rather a reclusive figure who causes a stir when making a rare public appearance without the costume.

More than ever, Gotham City is a putrid cesspool of violent criminals, corrupt politicians and morally compromised police officials. The crime-riddled streets are populated with the dregs of society who look like they escaped from a “Mad Max” movie.

“The Batman” is a nocturnal journey through the rain-soaked streets of the metropolis, the habitat for Batman who observes in

one of many voiceovers, “They think I am hiding in the shadows. I am the shadows.”

In the midst of a heated campaign for mayor of Gotham City, the incumbent Don Mitchell (Rupert Penry-Jones), the establishment favorite, is challenged by reformer and political neophyte Bella Real (Jayme Lawson) seeking real change.

The amoral mayor is having an affair with Annika (Hana Hrzic), who just happens to be a roommate with Selina Kyle (Zoe Kravitz), and both of them work at the Iceberg Lounge, a nightclub favored by the criminal class and a few city officials like D.A. Gil Colson (Peter Sarsgaard).

Aside from dealing with petty thugs beating up on innocent bystanders, Batman gets called to duty

by way of the Bat-signal when the mayor is brutally murdered in his own home on the eve of the election.

One of Batman’s closest friends is Jeffrey Wright’s Lt. Jim Gordon, who is on the crime scene of the gruesome death. To the chagrin of other police officials, Gordon has asked Batman to join him for some detective work.

The friendship between Batman and the lieutenant is rooted in mutual admiration for honesty and rectitude that is woefully lacking within Gotham City’s power structure and law enforcement.

It quickly becomes apparent that a serial killer is on the loose in “The Batman,” and the first slaying is that of the mayor, a gruesome act that is linked to the elusive Riddler (Paul Dano), who taunts Batman with a greeting card message teasing more deaths and mayhem to come.

This is enough to put the brooding Batman, a tortured soul, into a deeper funk. Even his faithful butler Alfred (Andy Serkis) can’t help, and possibly that’s because Batman remains anguished over the

deaths of his parents.

Little does Batman know at the initial brush of investigating the death of the Riddler’s first victim that more torment and pain are in store as family secrets come to light in mysterious ways, courtesy of the serial killer.

Circumstances bring Selina and Batman together to pursue leads that fit each one’s agenda, and while they may be at odds sometimes, they make a good pair confronting the Penguin (an unrecognizable Colin Farrell), who reports to his boss, the crime lord Carmine Falcone (John Turturro).

Most of the time it rains in Gotham City, thereby heightening the grim mood that pervades throughout the series of murders and other catastrophes that beset the populace. Yet, “The Batman” is masterful in depicting trauma that even the hero can’t fully fix.

Don’t come to “The Batman” expecting humor or wisecracks to lighten its deadly seriousness. Darkness reigns and daylight never shines on Gotham City. This is as

far away as one can get from Adam West’s frivolity, but it seems fitting for the times we are living in today.

Not the typical superhero adventure, “The Batman” is foremost a detective story, with Bruce Wayne’s alter-ego working hand-in-hand with Gotham’s finest detective in Jim Gordon. Of course, it helps immensely that Batman has more tools at his disposal.

A real bonus to appreciating “The Batman” are the soundtrack by Michael Giacchino and cinematography by Greig Fraser, both of which capture the tenor and essence of Gotham’s forbidding chaos.

Compared to other Caped Crusader films, “The Batman” is a modern film noir, where the flaws and foibles of the main characters, even those of the hero, are on full display.

Unlike other indestructible superheroes, Batman’s humanity and emotions make for a more compelling hero. Everything adds up to making “The Batman” one of the best DC adaptations, and it is definitely worth seeing on the big screen. ★

Feinstein Now Must Decide Whether to Retire

Whither Dianne Feinstein? California's senior U.S. senator, a California political fixture for more than a half-century, was facing a turning point even before her husband, financier and philanthropist Richard Blum, died on Sunday of cancer.

The Senate's oldest member at 88 and the state's longest serving senator has clearly fallen out of favor with voters, even her fellow Democrats.

A new poll by UC-Berkeley's Institute of Governmental Studies found that after years of steadily eroding popularity, just 30% of the state's registered voters now approve of her, including just 45% of Democrats. Meanwhile, 49% said they disapproved.

"The five-term senator now receives more negative than positive job ratings from strong liberals, women, voters of color, younger voters, as well as voters in Los Angeles County or the San Francisco Bay Area," the poll noted.

Feinstein has been a senator for nearly 30 years, following two decades of public service in San Francisco, including a stint as mayor. She was once one of the state's most popular politicians due to her centrist, pragmatic approach,

and was the go-to person for California's interest groups with issues in Washington.

However, political polarization has left her drifting in political no-man's land, reflexively despised by Republicans because she's a Democrat and increasingly alienated from a leftward-drifting Democratic Party.

As Donald Trump's presidency widened the ideological divide, Feinstein's centrism, particularly her willingness to cross the Senate aisle and do business with Republicans, made her a pariah to the Berniecrat wing of her party. Four years ago, as she was seeking another Senate term, the state party endorsed rival Kevin de León.

Feinstein easily defeated de León in 2018 but her popularity continued its downward course, not only because she's out of step with her party but due to her age and media reports that she may be suffering the cognition effects of old age. She must now – and soon – decide whether to seek still another term in 2024.

Feinstein has said she's running again, but she would say that under any circumstances because that's what politicians do. Were she to announce retirement, her clout in the Senate, which already has waned somewhat, would vanish and there would be a feeding frenzy among California's ambitious Democratic politicians.

That said, it was at least a 50-50 bet that Feinstein wouldn't seek another term in 2024 even before the

devastating poll and her husband's death. There's now a strong probability she won't run, approaching near-certainty.

As that probability sinks in, those ambitious politicians will be maneuvering to become her successor and all eyes will be on Gov. Gavin Newsom.

Newsom won't have any trouble winning re-election this year, barring some cataclysmic x-factor, but what then?

Had Trump won a second term in 2020, the door would have been open for Newsom to make a run for the White House in 2024. But with Joe Biden's victory – and more pointedly, Californian Kamala Harris' elevation from the Senate into the vice presidency – a 2024 presidential run by Newsom seems highly unlikely.

Newsom wears ambition on his sleeve and if he wants to extend his political career, the next logical move would be into the Senate, and there's no better springboard than a landslide re-election as governor this year.

Newsom is certainly not the only California politician who might want to succeed Feinstein. There are probably several dozen Democratic members of Congress who see a senator staring back when they look in the mirror, plus some other statewide officials and big city mayors.

It all hinges on whether Feinstein is ready for a well-earned political retirement.

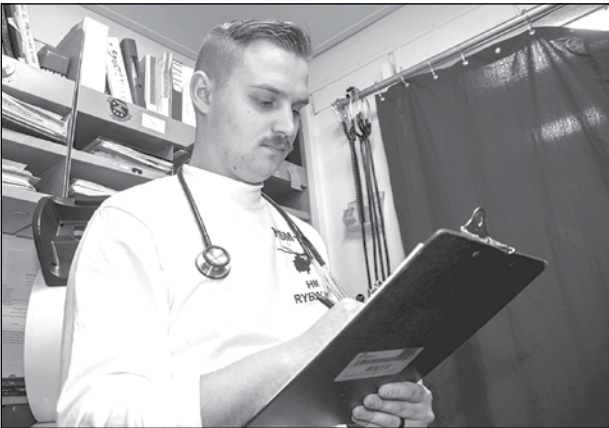
