- Two West Sacramento twelveyear olds, Julian Gutierrez and Jayden Moreno Lewis, decided last year to "Accept the 50-Yard Challenge". The 50-Yard Challenge is a challenge started by Rodney Smith Jr. Rodney has a lawn service in Alabama called Raising Men Lawn Care Service. This lawn care service is all about giving back to the community...one lawn at a time.

The 50-yard challenge is for boys and girls to mow 50 yards, free of charge, for those that can't afford to, or are unable to take care of their yard. These people include the elderly, veterans, the disabled and single parents. Julian and Jayden accepted the challenge last summer and it took them about 6 months to

Change Service Requested

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Myths and misinformation about our West Sacramento homeless marginalize them, making it more difficult to overcome the many challenges on their path to self-sufficiency and recovery.

Our homeless are West Sacramentans. No single factor, like addiction, results in homelessness, and providing housing alone is not the answer. It's a collaborative community commitment. A response to help the homeless become productive must be a multi-faceted approach to develop a sense of belonging.

The Yolo County Board of Supervisors demonstrated its commitment to fund homeless employment and housing solutions at its January 25 meeting, part of the \$7.5 million dollars earmarked to address housing and homelessness from the American Rescue Plan. In partnership with the City of West Sacramento, they allocated over \$3 million dollars to transitional housing, counseling, and employment assistance.

"The Yolo County Board of Supervisors has made a long-term goal to address and improve on homelessness in the County," said Supervisor Oscar Villegas, District 1, West Sacramento and Clarksburg. "My colleagues and I voted

unanimously to support projects that locations, and at a much lower cost will make a difference in the West Sacramento community."

The funding supports two projects. First, will be the property acquisition of a Project Roomkey motel and operations support for a threeyear period. The proposed motel acquisition will enable the County to consolidate the motel rooms currently being leased from private parties at two different motel

per room to participant.

Second, an additional \$450,000 in funds provided for a three-year extension of the Downtown Streets Team (DST) program in West Sacramento. Downtown Streets Team builds Teams that restore dignity, inspire hope, and provide a pathway to recover from homelessness. DST Team Members receive

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Members of the Sacramento Tall Club (STC) affiliated with Tall Clubs International (TCI) are seeking outstanding eligible high school seniors throughout Sacramento, Yolo, Placer and El Dorado counties to apply for their competitive annual academic scholarship.

While scholarship application materials were provided to county board of election departments in the four counties by STC in January, the club is taking an extra step this year to ensure that it gets the general word out to interested high school seniors throughout the geographical region, said Barbara Kerrin, STC scholarship chair.

"There are dozens of private and public high schools within the Northern California region whose students can and should apply," Kerrin said. "By distributing information broadly to the communication department of county boards of education throughout the region, we avoid any individual high school districts of

accusing us of favoritism."

Every year, Sacramento Tall Club awards academic scholarships to qualified and talented high school seniors who meet the tall club height requirements (at least 5'10" for women and 6'2" for men.) The annual STC scholarship award is dedicated in memoriam of former STC members many of whom were big supporters of young scholars and their many talents and merits. Scholarship amounts can vary year to year.

Part of the scholarship application for each young person is to write an essay titled "What being tall means to me."

"Their essays are quite reflective and thoughtful about the personal challenges we as tall people, often face," Kerrin said.

Completed typed essays and all application materials submitted by area high school students graduating in the 2021-22 school year is March 1, said Barbara Kerrin, STC scholarship chair.

Local STC scholarship winners also compete for annual scholarships awarded by both Tall Clubs International (TCI) and by the non-profit Tall Clubs International Foundation. Annually, the TCI Foundation awards additional multiple

\$1,000 each.

While grade point average and test scores are especially important scholarship evaluation criteria, so too are participation in school activities and community involvement, Kerrin said.

"Just being tall doesn't alone qualify you," she said.

General membership itself in the social Sacramento Tall Club itself is open to men that are over six feet and women that are nearing that mark.

Ekaterina (Katia) Griffin, a graduate of William and Marian Ghidotti Early College High School in Grass Valley was one of three 2020 STC scholarship winners. Griffin attends the University of California San Diego and is studying chemical engineering.

In 2019, Nicole Hensley, a graduating senior from Bella Vista High School in Orangevale received a \$1,000 academic scholarship from the Sacramento Tall Club scholarship award and was a Tall Club International (TCI) scholarship winner.

"We wish all our applicants all the best in the preparing of their applications, and in their overall scholarship search," Kerrin said. The 2020 STC scholarship winner will be notified later in March by the club membership.

Kerrin said all signed STC scholarship applications should be submitted with a good headshot photo, preferably a senior graduation photo. Partial applications are not accepted.

"If you want to know whether or not your STC scholarship application has been received, you MUST send in a self-addressed stamped envelope," Kerrin said. "We will not answer any requests via email to whether we have received an application or not."

## Yolo County Superintendent Named to 'Black Change Maker' List

WOODLAND, CA (MPG) - On Tuesday, February 9, Yolo County Superintendent Garth Lewis was named to the Sacramento Bee's list of 'Top 25 Black Change Makers' in the Sacramento region.

In the announcement, the roster includes "individuals in the Sacramento area who have transformed communities through leadership, innovation, altruism, and style."

Lewis has served as county superintendent for the past four years. He was elected to his first term in June 2018 and is the first African American to be elected as county superintendent in Yolo County.

When asked about his selection, Lewis said, "I think about all those who have come before me who have demonstrated the leadership and commitment to ensure that African Americans are recognized as full Americans and can participate in all this country has to offer, from education to voting to the pursuit of happiness. For me to be recognized as a Black change maker, it's an honor and it's humbling. I pray to God that I continue to live up to the title."

With a 26-year career in education, Lewis has served as a paraeducator, teacher, principal, district administrator, and assistant superintendent at the county office of education.

He and his wife, Maria, have two daughters.

The county superintendent is elected by the voters of Yolo County. The county superintendent provides leadership, collaboration, support, and state-designated fiscal and program oversight for the county's five school districts and approximately 30,000 students.

Other local officials named to the list include Porsche Middleton, mayor of Citrus Heights. Garrett Gatewood, mayor of Rancho Cordova; Chinua Rhodes, vice president of the Sacramento City Unified School Board; and Alana Mathews, candidate for Sacramento district attorney.

Continued from page 1 access to case management, system navigation, and employment placement services from trained DST Case Managers and Employment Specialists.

"We're delighted and grateful that the Board of Supervisors approved the ARP funding to partner with the City and its on-going efforts to reduce homelessness and its impacts on our community," said City of West Sacramento Housing Manager Raul Huerta. "The funding will allow the City to continue, and possibly expand, the West Sacramento Downtown Streets Team program and provide additional medium-term housing with supportive services for our homeless population."

"Our Team Members engage in community beautification and clean-up projects that challenge the common negative perceptions of homelessness," said Rachel Davidson, Sacramento Regional Area Director for DST. "Our Team Members have deep roots in the West Sacramento community, and we believe their homelessness is an experience and not an identity."

DST conducts program activities during daytime hours and may include tasks, such as garbage pickup, graffiti removal, and assisting with the cleanup of homeless encampments. DST is designed to operate within downtown districts to decrease the incidence of panhandling

For every 10 yards that Julian and Jayden took care of, they got a different colored shirt. Some of the people that Julian and Jayden helped included a stroke survivor, a pregnant woman whose husband was in the hospital, a local law enforcement officer's house who has a brandnew baby, two WWII veterans and a single mom of twins.

There were people that insisted on paying the boys, so they simply did not count those yards. Each time they had a yard to do, they would have to borrow a truck from one of the boy's grandma in order to take the equipment to where they needed to go. In all the boys actually mowed 55-58 lawns.

Once the boys completed the challenge, they sent in the remaining pictures. On Valentine's Day, Rodney Smith, Jr. drove to West Sacramento to award the boys with their final Raising Men Lawn Care t-shirts and hats, along with a brand-new lawn mower and leaf blower for each of the boys. A certificate for completing the challenge was also given to them by Rodney.

In addition to the prizes from Rodney, Mayor Martha Guerrero was there to award Julian and Jayden with a certificate of recognition from the City of West Sacramento. Abel Hernandez, one of the WWII veterans and the owner of the boys' 50th yard was also there

to see the boys receive their honors and gifts.

Rodney Smith travels around the United States and has actually gone to 8 different countries to award children the new yard equipment that they earned by meeting the 50-Yard Challenge. He delivers them all personally. Raising Men is now a 501c3, and relies completely on the generosity of others to buy the equipment and pay his traveling fees.

According to the Raising Men website, there are 3,294 kids mowing (that have accepted the challenge), 21,000 lawns that have been mowed freely and more than 250,000 supporters worldwide.

## **Meet California's Most** Spectacular Serpents

#### YOLO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -

As Yolo County moves into spring, thousands of migratory waterfowl return to their nesting grounds in the north and reptiles emerge. California is home to several native species of snake. On Thursday, March 3, 2022, Yolo Basin Foundation's Flyway Nights speaker series hosts a presentation on these spectacular serpents by Michael Starkey, Founder & Executive Director of Save the Snakes.

Starkey will discuss the ecological importance of snakes, identification of California venomous vs non-venomous snake species, precautionary measures to avoid snakebites, and first aid and treatment in the event of a snakebite. He will also share facts and dispel myths about snake species in your backyard in this fun, interactive and family-friendly program.

Snakes of the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area are non-venomous, although rattlesnakes are reported in the Yolo Bypass after major floods. Snakes have roamed the earth since the time of the dinosaurs. They lack movable eyelids and external ears, which is how one can tell a legless lizard from a true snake. In the Wildlife Area the most common snake is the Gopher Snake, Pituophis catenifer, so named because its prey includes mice and the occasional gopher. Gopher Snakes often attempt to mimic

rattlesnakes by pulling their head back into a triangular shape, hissing loudly, and rattling their rattleless tail in hopes of scaring off potential predators. Another frequently seen species is the Garter Snake Thamnophis sirtalis. This hunter has yellow stripes on a dark background and tends to sun on the gravel roads. Its close relative, also found in the aquatic areas of the Wildlife Area, is the Giant Garter Snake, Thamnophis gigas. This snake has become exceedingly rare with the loss of its wetland habitat in the Central Valley. Unfortunately, it is now a both State and Federally listed Threatened Species.

Another less common snake in the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area is the Common Kingsnake, Lampropeltis getula. This boldly banded serpent is

highly resistant to venom and will actually kill and consume rattlers. Finally, the sprinter in the group is the fast-moving Yellow-bellied Racer, Coluber constrictor. This slim, high-strung serpent actively hunts down prey, often chasing lizards in open ground.

Michael Starkey is a conservation biologist, ecological consultant and public speaker working to educate and involve the public in wildlife conservation issues. Michael has a diverse background in the field of wildlife conservation and he has worked as an ecological consultant for environmental consulting firms and government agencies such as the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and the California Department of Fish & Wildlife.

Flyway Nights is a monthly speaker series highlighting environmental issues, natural history of Northern California. and current research topics in conservation. Yolo Basin Foundation hosts Flyway Nights the first Thursday of the month from November to April through virtual presentations. The presentation will be via Zoom. Registration is required to receive the Zoom link to the presentation.



## The Rates Keep Rising



#### Commentary by Bruce Lee

Heads up! Those rates (garbage rates in this case) are rising - now in Folsom, but coming soon to a community near you!

And, what a rise! In mid December Folsom approved a 74% increase over four years. The typical residential bill is currently \$34.50 per month and will rise to \$60 by 2025. The rates will rise "gradually" to \$46.25 in 2022; \$56 in 2023; \$58 in

2024; and then finally to \$60. It will be like cooking a frog to death, starting it in room-temperature water while slowly raising the heat to a boil.

The rationale for the increase is a state mandate pushed down upon local government – in this case Senate Bill 1383 of 2016, which is attempting to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Folsom could face fines up to \$10,000 per day for noncompliance. According to the city, they issued public notices and held required hearings, but there was no majority objection to the fees.

SB 1383 is a statewide effort to reduce "shortlived" climate pollutants and applies to all residents and businesses. Using 2014 levels as the standard, the intent is to reduce disposal of organic waste by 50% by January 1, 2020

(they missed that goal), and by 75% by the end of 2024! Plus, the state wants to "rescue" at least 20% of currently disposed, edible food for human consumption.

(I'm not sure what they plan to do with all of that "rescued" food. Remember the Seinfeld television show debate when George took a pastry out of the garbage - but it was "just below" the lid line! It might be worthwhile to catch that rerun.) And, "short-lived" means pollutants that have a relatively short life in the atmosphere. (Hmmm ... so why worry about them? Well, I'm not a "scientist" and nobody argues with a scientist now-a-days!)

Now, there is a logic. When food scraps and compostable materials (such a paper products) are put into a landfill without access to oxygen, they break down and produce methane (CH4), which is a greenhouse gas in the atmosphere. (This is akin to cow flatulence.) And, we do have a lot of organic waste - 71% of all San Mateo County's landfill waste is organic. And, evidently food waste tallies up to about 17% of all landfill disposal in California.

Maybe we just need a mandate to buy less food or that we are required to consume all that we cook?

Now, while some of this may seem a bit humorous, there are four serious lessons for us:

1) Who thought in 2016 when the well-intended SB 1383 passed that garbage rates would skyrocket! Policy decisions are often made based on general big-picture ideas that

sound good, but are

made out of context. The impact trickles down.

- 2) Rates are just as important as taxes - so keep an eye on them!
- Folsom purportedly had little public comment or objection, so shame on us for being indifferent.
- Once you pay higher rates or higher taxes, there is often little guarantee on how the money will be used. These types of things can also be good rationales for higher wages and the like.

And, starting last January 1st, per SB 1383, Californians are required to recycle their food scraps and other leftovers. Your organic waste can be combined with your green waste; or maybe there will be a new "brown waste' can. Confused yet?

Meanwhile, watch out for your rates! Folsom is a harbinger for all other local governments, and the City of Sacramento City is currently working on their wastewater fees in earnest.

## Women's Hoops is Back at Sac State!

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento State women's basketball team is making history in the 2021-22 season under first-year head coach Mark Campbell.

The Hornets (13-12, 9-7 Big Sky Conference) have already improved 10-games from last season, the best season-to-season turnaround in program history, with four regular season games and the Big Sky Tournament to be played.

Campbell brought his "blueprint of chasing excellence" with him from The University of Oregon.

"Every day you gotta be locked in, as a team, as a staff," Campbell said. "It's a simple formula but it's hard to follow. It's hard to bring it every single day, day after day, for seven months. For college basketball, it's a grind from August all the way to March.

"This group is learning that. They've done an incredible job of giving us everything they have. You've seen the byproduct of all the hard work with what we've been able to do over the last month and a half. So, I would say that's probably the biggest thing that I gotta bring from my time at Oregon, and at Oregon State, we built a Final Four program there too."

While he was an assistant at Oregon, Campbell coached the No. 1, 2 and 8 overall picks in the 2020 WNBA Draft, Sabrina Ionescu, Satou Sabally and Ruthy Hebard.

Campbell ranks second in win improvement among NCAA Division I coaches who are in their first season at a new school. He is second in the nation behind LSU's three-time national championship coach Kim Mulkey, who has currently led the Tigers to 14 more wins than a season ago.

Sac State only won three games last season (3-22) under Bunky Harkleroad, the final straw after six consecutive losing seasons.

Guard Summer Menke is in her fourth year at Sac State and is one of three players on the team who played under Harkleroad for the last three seasons.

"(Campbell) raised the bar completely," Menke said. "Our toughness, what he expects from us, everything. Our offense is so much better. He brought a completely brand-new program here. We're still working out the kinks, it's the first year. I'm excited to see what it's going to look like in a couple years."

After spending seven seasons at Oregon and six as the associate head coach, Campbell moved to California's Capitol with loads of experience and some familiar faces. Joining Campbell in Sacramento as assistant coaches were Xavier "Xavi" Lopez and Minyon Moore, both having spent time at Oregon as an assistant and player, respectively. Lopez's wife and Oregon alumna, Megan Murphy Lopez, also joined the Sac State program as director of operations, the position she previously held at Oregon.

Campbell and his staff took over a Sac State program that has not had a winning season since 2015, when the team went 18-16 and lost in the third round of the Women's NIT Tournament.

The Hornets began this season 4-9 overall and 0-4 in the Big Sky before rattling off wins in 9 out of 10 games. The biggest win of the nine came Jan. 27 at first-place Idaho State winning by 16 and in Pocatello, Idaho for only the second time in school history.

"It takes time, we're still growing," Campbell said. "You can't just throw a group of people together and expect them to instantly become cohesive. The outside world thinks it's that simple but it's not.

"You have to develop a chemistry. A defensive cohesiveness, offensive cohesiveness. That takes time. We won 9 out of 10 but it's still year one where we're just creating an identity on both ends of the court. We're fighting and competing and we're learning a lot."

Leading the charge for the Hornets has been graduate transfer Lianna Tillman, who spent her first four collegiate seasons at the University of the Pacific.

"I think (Campbell's) competitive spirit matched mine especially and that's why I came here," Tillman said. "I feel like he turned this team around. Just being more competitive and striving for a championship rather than just getting through the season is the biggest thing."

The 5'9 guard currently leads the Big Sky and ranks 14th in the

nation in scoring with 20.5 points per game. Tillman is also one of only two players in women's college basketball that is averaging 18 points and 6 assists per game, alongside University of Iowa phenom Caitlin Clark.

Sac State returned home to the

Nest for a two-game homestand last week taking on penultimate Weber State and Idaho State. The Hornets lost both games falling to the Wildcats 62-52 on Thursday, snapping their four-game winning streak, and against the Bengals 67-56 on Saturday.

This weekend against Idaho State, freshman Isnelle Natabou had 11 points and 8 rebounds, snapping her streak of 10 consecutive games with a double-double. The 6'5 center has 15 double-doubles on the season.

Despite the two-game setback, Sac State still has a lot to play for. The Hornets have four regular season games remaining on their schedule before the Big Sky Tournament begins in Boise, Idaho on March 7. The winner of the tournament receives an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament, something Sac State has yet to achieve.

"The ultimate goal from the beginning is that we're playing our best basketball in Boise at the conference tournament," Campbell said. "I have no doubt if we can stay healthy our last four games, when we go into Boise, we're going to be a very dangerous team."
