

Outbreak of Omicron Variant at River City High

YOLO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -On December 16, 2021 the Washington Unified School District (WUSD) and Yolo County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) confirmed an outbreak of the Omicron COVID-19 variant at River City High School in West Sacramento. All parents were informed in a letter last night from WUSD, and Yolo County Health Officer Dr. Aimee Sisson has strongly recommended all students and staff get tested immediately. Healthy Yolo Together, County staff, and a State-supported outbreak response team are providing COVID-19 testing on campus, and all students and staff will be offered home antigen testing kits for use over the winter break. Campuswide testing will prevent spread of the outbreak into the wider community as winter break begins this weekend.

To date, the Omicron outbreak involves five students. Four of the students come from one class; the fifth student is a family member who is not in that class. An outbreak is defined as three or more linked cases in a location within a 14-day period, qualifying this case cluster as an outbreak. Two of the cases are confirmed as Omicron based on genotyping done at the UC Davis Genome Center, and the remainder are presumed to be Omicron based on linkage to the confirmed cases. Two of the students were fully vaccinated but had not received a booster. The students had not traveled and had mild symptoms. An additional family member who is not a student is also part of the outbreak, bringing the total number of cases associated with the outbreak to date to six. This number is expected to increase as more students are tested.

Bridges of The Mind

It's quite common to worry about the "normal" development of your child when we have in our mind a certain time that we believe they should be reaching certain milestones. For example, how old should your child be when they start crawling, talking or walking? The truth is that every child is a little bit different, and we all do things at our own pace. That's just the way it is. So, at what point should you stop wondering and start worrying?

Perhaps worrying is not the best word. I guess it depends on the milestone we are talking about and what exactly your child is doing... or not doing. Some illnesses, injuries and disabilities you can see right away. Some develop as the child does, and some can go undetected (undiagnosed) for a good portion of your life. However, once something is diagnosed, only then can you know what kind of assistance to seek.

West Sacramento is very lucky to have many, many people that truly care about their community and actively strive to provide needed services to West Sacramento and sometimes beyond. Bridges of the Mind Psychological Services Inc. is an organization in West Sacramento that is a great example of this. Located at 1550 Harbor Blvd, Ste. 200 (right across the street from the Fire Department), Bridges of the Mind offers specialized help that you may not be able to get at public school.

Don't let the term Psychological Services put you off. What that means, is that the good people at Bridges of the Mind help with a wide range of services. The specialized Assessment, Training and Tutoring is designed to help people of all ages that need help with reading, help with fluency and comprehension. In addition, they

help with handwriting, as with lower elementary. some learning disabilities it is difficult to do more than one cognitive skill at a time, like listen and take notes. They offer math tutoring as well. Tutoring is available at any level for any age.

Though everyone is welcome, Bridges of the Mind specializes in working with people with learning challenges. These challenges include people on the Autism spectrum, people with Dyslexia or Dyscalculia (like dyslexia, only with numbers). They help people that suffer from ADHD, Anxiety, Depression, Trauma, Intellectual Delays, Other learning disorders, Social Challenges and parenting

The Barton Method is the tutoring method used at Bridges of the Mind. This method is commonly used for individuals with Dyslexia and is a proven intervention for anyone struggling to read. Math tutoring is offered to help address specific areas of need, including common core for

Bridges of the Mind also offers Assessments, Group Therapy, Talk Therapy, Workshops and Speech Therapy. They have many rooms set up to cater to certain age groups because learning is always better when it's fun. These rooms can be for one-on-one work or groups. One example of group sessions is the Anxiety Group.

For this Group, it costs \$100 for the intake and \$65 for each 1 hour session. There are 8 sessions and they are scheduled as follows: 1. What is Anxiety; 2. Identifying and labeling emotions; 3. Negative Thinking / Cognitive Triangle; 4. Mindfulness; 5. Problem Solving; 6. Exposure activity / COVID-19; 7. Empathy / Making Friends; 8. Graduation. To some, these topics may seem like things that everyone knows, but these are some of the milestones that you don't see happening.

So, how do you know if your child is displaying typical traits of development or if they are

showing delayed development? That's where the professionals come in. Bridges of the Mind has a very extensive and in-depth assessment. In fact, the quality of their assessment can in turn be used for future services that may be needed. In addition, Bridges of the Mind will help you with what future steps should be taken. This is often something that is not included when assessed by your school.

Children often confuse the b and the d when they are learning the alphabet. They often mix sounds like aminal instead of animal. So, when do you know that it's something to be concerned about? Well, in the topic of Dyslexia, there are many things to consider before you worry about getting assessed.

Any one or two of these items is likely nothing to worry about, but when the list of how many apply to you or your child increases, then you may want to consider the next step. (ALWAYS, if you are worried about your child,

get it checked out!) Some common often affiliated with Dyslexia are: Skipping crawling stage and going straight to walking; delayed speech (not speaking any words by 1st birthday, not speaking until age $2, 2 \frac{1}{2}, 3$).

Others include Mixing sounds like aminal for animal, hekalopter for helicopter, etc; early stuttering; lots of ear infections; can't master tying shoes; confusion between over/under, left/right, before/after and other directional descriptions; ambidextrous; can't rhyme words like cat by age 4 ½; extended difficulty with alphabet; trouble articulating R's and L's and M's and N's by 2nd or 3rd grade. For example, still saying gween instead of green.

At BridgesoftheMind.com there is a video called Symptoms of Dyslexia in preschool and kindergarten. If you have concerns about your child's development, check it out. Bridges of the Mind also helps with students in secondary education. Bridges of the Mind does not take most insurance, because most insurance doesn't cover learning disabilities. However, they do take Partnership. They also periodically have scholarships available. So don't give up because of the cost.

Bridges of the Mind staff have outstanding and worldly credentials. They have offered to help out our school district since these assistance services are not currently available, but they have not yet heard back from the district. In addition, Bridges of the Mind look forward to supporting our community in ways such as Little League sponsorship and the like.

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

Yolo Cares Receives Grant from Arthur N. Rupe Foundation

- YoloCares has been named as the recipient of a \$50,000 grant from the Arthur N. Rupe Foundation to respond to the needs of patients and their caregivers through the creation of the new Center for Caregiver Support.

A significant expansion of current caregiver resources, The Center for Caregiver Support will provide multi-faceted assistance and education to Yolo County caregivers, many of whom are seniors, facing the challenge of caring for a seriously ill loved one at home. The Center for Caregiver Support will place special emphasis on aiding caregivers who are caring for loved ones with Mild Cognitive Impairments (MCI) such as Dementia and Alzheimer's.

The center includes four programmatic areas to wrap families in multi-layered support which will address the medical, emotional, and practical needs of their families. The program aims to expand access to clinical case management for the caregiver and patient which will include home visits for caregiver respite and



access to YoloCares' adult day facility, Galileo Place. Bereavement, anticipatory grief counseling and caregiver retreats will provide an external avenue to process the emotional burden of caregiving in the face of loss. Educational opportunities will be available for caregivers to master the practical skills of caregiving such as administering medication or caring for a loved one who is bedridden.

Craig Dresang, CEO of YoloCares, recognizes the vital role that caregivers hold when supporting a seriously ill loved one. "Rosalyn Carter once said, 'There are only four kinds of people in the world. Those who have been caregivers. Those who are currently caregivers. Those who will be caregivers, and those who will need a caregiver.' Therefore, it is essential that we all get comfortable with the clumsy caregiver's dance of love and responsibility. Someone's disease might hide the person underneath, but there is still a person in there who needs our love and attention. With the Arthur N. Rupe Foundation's support, we will be able to train and empower others in our community to simultaneously honor the fullness of someone's life while taking their fragile body into their own hands and tending to their every need." says Dresang.

As YoloCares expands supportive care level offerings to provide a unique continuum of care options, The Center for Caregiver Support will provide a critical layer of assistance to the families of those managing a life-limiting illness. The Center for Caregiver Support will be a resource available to the whole community starting in 2022.

surprising because we already knew that Omicron was present in Yolo County, and schools are a part of the Yolo County community. This outbreak illustrates that the Omicron variant is circulating in our community and is not just a risk for those who have traveled. Omicron is here, and Omicron can spread quickly," said County Health Officer Dr. Aimee Sisson.

"We know emotions are heightened with the discovery of this new variant, but our team, together with Yolo County Health, are following all the public health protocols that have allowed our schools to remain open since August," said WUSD Superintendent Cheryl P. Hildreth, Ed.D. "The best thing we can all do is continue to be cautious while using multiple layers of protection, and we strongly recommend that everyone in our schools and community take advantage of the daily testing clinics available

through WUSD to guard against future transmission.

What should everyone in Yolo County do right now? "As we enter the holiday season, I encourage everyone to take additional precautions against Omicron. Get vaccinated, and if you're already vaccinated, get boosted. The vaccine may not keep you from getting a mild infection, but it will keep you out of the hospital," said Dr. Sisson. "Wear a mask that fits your face well and filters well. Get tested before and after gatherings and travel, and stay home if you are sick, even if you think you only have a cold. That "cold" could be a mild Omicron

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

Sac Region's Fire Trove Hearkens Back to 1850s

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Fire Museum has been in West Sacramento for the last three years. Located at 3650 Industrial Blvd., the items in this museum hold firefighting history from the Sacramento Valley-from Fairfield, Dixon, Davis, Yuba City, Citrus Heights, Sacramento, Auburn and other parts of the valley. Pioneer Mutual Hook and Ladder Society was established in 1990 with the intent of building this museum in honor of the Mutual Hook and Ladder Company, which was the first organized Sacramento Fire Company and was formed in 1850.

Their Mission Statements reads, "The Pioneer Mutual

There is also the evolution

a non-flammable Carbon Tet. They were generally resting in a wire hoop and attached to the wall, near the door. When a fire broke out, the grenade was thrown at the base of the fire, the glass would break, and the Carbon Tet would evaporate very quickly and extinguish the fire. These were eventually found to have toxic vapors and have been

banned since the 1940's.

There are many types of extinguishers, hydrants, nozzles, hoses, lights, hooks, tools, cables, gas masks, horns, hats, badges, and bells. It's really quite amazing... and impressive that they have been able to collect these items. They even have a "Life Net". A Life Net is that big round device that fire fighters would hold so that people could jump out of high-rise fires. It was invented by a civil war veteran, named Thomas F. Bowder. Originally he called it "Bowder Life Saving Machine". The life net became obsolete in the

Within the museum there are areas that are set up to look like the typical firefighter's dorm as well as the command center. Do you remember when there used to be those red and white "Fire boxes" around town that would activate a fire alarm, dispatching the Fire Department? Well, this museum not only includes those fire boxes, but it includes Sacramento's emergency system... in working order.

This actual system was used until the 1990s. It is amazing, and not at all what I would expect. Though I don't know what I would have expected, I can promise you that it wasn't this! Each section has bells at the top and each section was from a specific area of town. When a handle was pulled in a fire box an alarm would go off in that section of the emergency system, which would send a message on a tickertape. They would take that information and go to a giant "Rolodex" where they would look up the address of the alarm location. The alarm system is the only one that they know of on the West Coast.

The museum costs \$10 for adults with discounts for Seniors and \$5 for kids 12 and under. You can also rent the museum to hold a party or other gathering. It was recently rented for a Memorial with about 300 people that attended. They have memberships of different levels and accept donations to support the cost of maintaining the museum. The proposed work consists of the following: furnishing and placing new water mains, water services and laterals, water meters, digital registers, Smartpoint M2 Radio Transceivers (MXUs), water meter boxes and lids, blow off assemblies, air release valves, water valves, fire hydrant assemblies, electrical grounding rod assemblies and all related components necessary to complete the work as specified in the plans. Bid Security: Each proposal must be accompanied by a Bid Security in the form of a cashier's check, certified check, or Bid bond executed on the prescribed form, in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the total Bid price payable to the City of West Sacramento.

Big Utilities Winning **Battle Over Solar Power**

The emails arrived just minutes apart on Monday.

The first, from a group called Affordable Clean Energy for All, proclaimed "CPUC Takes Steps to Fix the Unfair Customer Cost Shift Created by 25-Year-Old Rooftop Solar Program."

The second, from a rival organization, the Environment California Research & Policy Center, countered with "California Public Utility Commission fails Californians by gutting bedrock solar program."

Both were reacting to release of a California Public Utilities Commission draft ruling that would reduce the payments from utilities to owners of rooftop solar power systems when they feed excess juice back into the grid. It would also require those owners to pay a monthly fee for using

the grid. The release capped months of political jousting between the state's major utilities, backed by their employees' unions, and the solar power industry, which has allies among environmental groups, over how solar energy will develop as the state attempts to emphasize individual solar improvements.

installations controlled by panel farms controlled by utilities and their suppliers?

The big utilities – Pacific Gas and Electric, Southern California Edison and Sempra Energy – are pushing the policy change. They argue that since rooftop solar arrays are mostly owned by upper-income Californians, the current policy, in effect, gives them a subsidy, of as much as \$3.4 billion a year, from the pockets of less affluent ratepayers. They also contend that since owners of solar panels use the grid, they should pay something to maintain it, hence the \$57 monthly fee.

The companies that install personal solar systems counter that the new policy proposal would make them less affordable to middle- and low-income homeowners. They and their environmental allies also contend that changing the rules would have the overall effect of reducing solar generation and thus hamstring California's efforts to wean itself from carbon-based energy.

Both sides have waged public relations and media campaigns to sell their messages, but so far, with the release of the draft, the utility-led faction is prevailing, which is not surprising given the CPUC's historic slant. While it regulates utilities, supposedly to protect consumers, the commission also has an implicit duty to make sure that power companies are financially healthy enough drastically reduce its car- to attract investors and bon footprint. Will it borrow money for system

Clearly, the utilities consumers or large solar and their unions - see the growth of personal solar systems as a potential threat to their financial future. Reducing that threat, rather than creating more equity, is their true motive for seeking a change of policy. Likewise, while their solar industry rivals also claim equity as their motive, the proposal would make it more difficult to sell rooftop systems, more than a million of which are already operative. So their underlying motive is also financial.

The full CPUC is expected to vote early next year, but the battle is not over and it now shifts to Gov. Gavin Newsom, who appoints its members. He's already nominated a new chairperson, Alice Reynolds, who is now his energy advisor and will take the new position before a final vote on the

Politically, therefore, it is very clear that the revised solar policy will only be adopted if Newsom wants it to be adopted. Setting aside the major interest groups in the conflict, it involves two sub-factions that have close ties to the governor unions and environmentalists - although the latter are also divided into pro

The full CPUC is likely to adopt the proposed policy change and if there's political fallout, Newsom will feel it as he seeks reelection next year.

SPIRIT OF THE HOLIDAYS IS FULL OF CHRISTMAS CHEER ON CABLE

This may not come as a surprise to anyone that the Hallmark Channel has been the champion of Christmas movies during the holidays. To keep their exalted status, Hallmark unleashed a torrent of themed films back in October.

You can usually spot the Christmasspecific movies by their titles, such as the English drama "The Holly and the Ivy" (1952), "Bush Christmas" (1947) from Australia, the Robert Mitchum-Janet Leigh romance "Holiday Affair"

Add to those titles, the short film 'Compliments of the Season" (1930), the episodic "Christmas Eve" (1947), and a modern retelling of the Nativity story in the short "Star in the Night" (1945).

There's possibly the best version of the Dickens tale about the redemption of a mean-spirited miser in "A Christmas Carol" (1938), and a modern take on the story written by "The Twilight Zone" creator Rod Serling, "Carol for Another Christmas" (1964), a TV movie starring Sterling Hayden.

Netflix has a slate of Christmas movies that it admits is not quite as robust as Hallmark Channel's selection, at least not vet, but claims you can still get your fill of snowfalls, hot cocoa and Santa magic on demand.

With the streaming service of Netflix, it's even easier to find a Christmas movie to get in the holiday spirit. Brooke Shields and Cary Elwes meet-cute over

the purchase of a gorgeous Scottish castle in "A Castle for Christmas."

The British comedy "Father Christmas is Back" has a great cast of Kelsey Grammer, John Cleese and Elizabeth Hurley. Four sisters reunite for a Christmas holiday in a Yorkshire castle and are joined by their estranged father, Grammer's John Christmas.

To compete with the Hallmark Channel's collection of romantic Christmas movies, Netflix is bringing back "A Knight Before Christmas" which tells the story of a medieval knight transported to modern-day Ohio.

A fish-out-of-water story, Josh Whitehouse's Cole time travels to 2019 and encounters disillusioned teacher Brooke (Vanessa Hudgens) preparing for a loveless holiday season. PG-rated romantic antics ensue, but this cheesy flick may still be worth a watch.

Another sappy romantic holiday movie, "The Holiday Calendar" follows an aspiring photographer stuck in her small-town dead-end job. An antique Advent calendar passed down from her grandmother arrives just in time to point her toward love and a more fulfilling career.

Aside from "The Miracle on 34th Street" which will run on HBO Family, where do we find "It's A Wonderful Life" and "A Christmas Story?" For the former, look to Amazon's Prime Video as well as Tubi and NBC.com and the latter gets a marathon treatment on TBS.

May everyone enjoy the Christmas spirit with family, friends and the occasional fruitcake (okay, maybe not that) and a Happy New Year.



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

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

UC Davis Vandalism and Riotous Activity

On November 18th, there was an anti-police riot on the University of California, Davis, campus. A group called UC Davis Cops off Campus led the riot, which involved vandalism, threats, intimidation, and the use of a smoke grenade and/or a flare.

The Yolo County Republican Party condemns the riot, as we condemn all political violence. Unfortunately, UC Davis Chancellor Gary S. May has not condemned the riot. He sent out an email on November 19th, the day after the riot, mentioning COVID-19, Fall commencement, and an interview he conducted with San Francisco London Breed, but not the riot. Because, on an Instagram post on his Instagram account, he disabled comments after some students asked him what actions the University will take against the

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


