WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Marriott Springhill Suites' Owners, Management and staff were joined by West Sacramento City leaders for a grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony on Tuesday, October 12th, at the new hotel, located at 3455 Reed Ave. Springhill Suites advertises that they are ready to serve at their new location in the Riverside Commerce Center. The Riverside Commerce Center is the area where Reed Avenue, Stillwater Road and Riverside Parkway make the big loop. The hotel is west of the Reed exit off Highway 80... across the street from Jack in the Box and behind Hampton Inn.

Marriott Springhill Suites is

close enough to attractions such as Downtown Sacramento, Old Sacramento, Golden 1 Center, River Cats Stadium, The Barn, the State Capitol and Sacramento International Airport, that Marriott's management is confident they will have plenty of business. Springhill is a completely smoke free property and guests are not allowed to smoke anywhere on the property. In addition, they are not pet friendly. Service animals are, of course, allowed.

There is plenty to like and enjoy about Springhill Suites. The 97-room facility offers only suites. All guest rooms include a full, hot buffet breakfast each morning, starting at 6 am. The items rotate because they only have a small kitchen for making breakfasts; However, they offer items

such as bacon, eggs, sausage, fruits, yogurt, juices, etc. In addition, there is a small market at the guest services desk, in case you want snacks later in the day.

All suites either have one or two beds, along with a sitting area in which the couch is a trundle bed. There is a separate area for making coffee or tea and a desk with a frosted glass partition that offers some separation between the sleeping area and the sitting area. There is a big, flat screen TV, viewable from both the sleeping and sitting areas. The suites are equipped with a large bathroom, where a sizable vanity area sits between the shower and the restroom.

Amenities that are available for use by the guests include a

Local VFW Announces 2021 Veterans Day Parade

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - VFW Post 8762, West Sacramento's last remaining Veterans of Foreign Wars Post, announced the 2021 Veterans Day Parade to honor our heroes. It's scheduled for Thursday, November 11th. It begins at 10:00 a.m. and runs from the old Westmore Oaks Elementary location (1100 Clarendon St) to Sam Combs Park (205 Stone Blvd).

According to VFW Commander James Brashear, "We try to run this parade annually but last year we couldn't due to COVID-19. It's been a challenging few years for non-profits like the VFW, but especially for veterans. Events in Afghanistan have left many veterans hurting and that makes it important for us to get out there and show our love."

The VFW is organizing the parade with the support of West Sacramento Mayor Martha Guerrero. "Our VFW does more than serve veterans. It hosts an integral role in West Sacramento's rich history. I'm excited to be a part of their effort to bring our community together to honor and celebrate our veterans." Mayor Guerrero adds.

Also confirmed in the parade are Mayor Pro Tem Chris Ledesma, City Council Members Norma Alcalá, Quirina Orozco, Dr. Dawnté Early-West and several City Commissioners. Local groups, including Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, the Southport-Westmore Oaks Marching Band, and the River City High School Cheerleaders and Marching Band, have also confirmed participation. Other local organizations, clubs, private businesses, and community members will also join.

To cover the expenses of the parade and to support veterans and their families, the VFW has launched a GoFundMe campaign. Tiered sponsorships are available for local businesses. Ironman Triathlon Coming

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - You may have seen the orange temporary signs along roads in the southeast part of West Sacramento saying to expect traffic delays. The reason these signs have been there is to give West Sac residents a warning of the upcoming Ironman Triathlon race that will be taking place on Sunday, October 24th, 2021. Impacts to West Sac traffic are being compared to when the Tour of California bike race came through town.

If you've seen the signs on your regular routes, you may want to consider a different route on Sunday. This will ensure better travel time for community members, and better safety

for the athletes. The News Ledger tried to obtain what streets will be closed, but that had not yet been worked out... even though the race route is already decided on.

It is also unclear whether there will be Police directing traffic, or if there will just be closures. It is confirmed that portions of 5th Street, south of Tower Bridge Gateway, Riverfront street, Mill Street. South River Road and Village Parkway will be closed, but unclear about the rest of the route. WSPD and the Ironman team are working together to minimize the impact on the community.

This is the first Ironman Triathlon to be held in Sacramento. Over 3,500 athletes will be participating in the

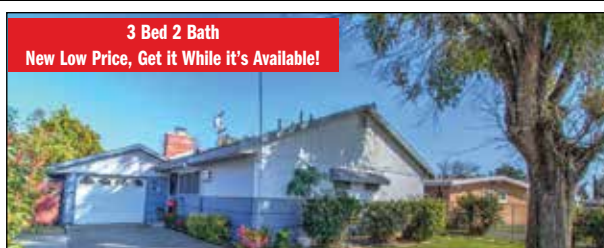
race. Representatives from Ironman said "IRONMAN California will lead athletes along a 2.4-mile swim, 112-mile bike and 26.2-mile run through Sacramento's downstream, flat and fast course, highlighting the famous Tower Bridge, Central Valley's beautiful farm and wine country, Discovery Park and an electric finish around the California State Capitol building and gardens."

The Athletes will swim from the American river, into the Sacramento River. Out of concern for the athletes, we asked if those that planned this race are aware of the danger issues there are in our river. They responded with "We have a robust swim safety plan to ensure the safety of all athletes, we will be having

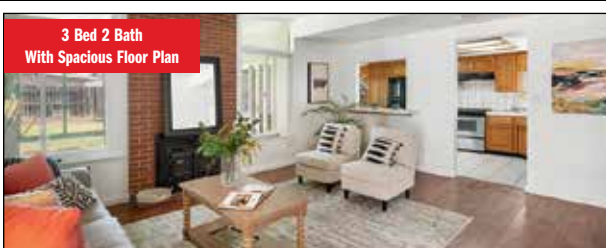
a US Coast Guard permitted secure zone and water safety assets to ensure swimmer safety."

If you are interested in watching the race, the Ironman team says "We encourage folks to spectate along the West Sacramento River Trail and near the swim exit they will be able to see athletes along that stretch from the I street Bridge to the Tower Bridge." One of the transition places will be at Sutter Health Park, so traffic may be pretty crazy in that area. However, it might be a great place to set a lawn chair.

CHP Graduates New Canine Teams

Asm McCarty Bill to Require Analysis of Crime Gun Data Patterns

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) recently announced the graduation and deployment of its 10 newest canine teams. The ceremony at the CHP Academy in West Sacramento is the culmination of 400 to 600 hours of intense training for each officer and their canine partner.

“After weeks of rigorous training, these new teams are ready to assist in the CHP’s mission of protecting and serving the State of California,” said CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray. “Our canines are a tremendous asset to the Department, and the addition of these 10 teams to our existing resources will supplement the already highly effective canine program.”

The CHP uses its canines

to perform a variety of functions, including detecting human scent, contraband, and explosives. A canine team can improve the safety and effectiveness of officers as well as saving time and money. The CHP canines are also used to assist allied agencies in apprehending criminals, detecting explosives or drugs, and in locating “at-risk” missing persons.

This is the only graduation in 2021 for CHP canine teams trained in handler protection and narcotics detection or handler protection and explosive detection. The canine teams completed between 11 and 15 weeks of intensive training at the CHP Academy, depending on their specialty.

All handlers are CHP officers with departmental experience ranging from 4 to 15 years. The graduating canine

teams represent the following CHP Divisions: Valley, Golden Gate, Central, Southern, Border, and Inland. Following this graduation, the CHP now has 48 canine

teams deployed throughout the state.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Governor Newsom signed AB 1191 which will require the Department of Justice (DOJ) to analyze the crime gun data it currently collects, to determine trends and patterns related to how crime guns are sold and trafficked.

A crime gun is any firearm that is illegally possessed, used in a crime or suspected to have been used in a crime.

In California today, the Automated Firearms System approximates that 75% of all crime guns originate from within the state. While the DOJ Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) collects data on firearm acquisition and registration, they don’t conduct a comprehensive analysis of available data on seized crime guns.

“If we are to reduce gun violence, our focus must be on the initial source of crime guns

from irresponsible dealers who profit of the sales of firearms that infiltrate communities across the state, particularly communities of color,” said Assemblymember Kevin McCarty.

In California, Black men make up less than 4% of the state’s population, yet they represent over 30% of gun homicide victims. Additionally, Black men between the ages of 10 and 24 are also more than 18 times as likely to be murdered with a gun as White men of the same age.

This bill will require the DOJ to provide analyses on how crime guns are being diverted from the legal market and identify irresponsible dealers -- properly addressing a root cause of gun violence.

Kevin McCarty represents California’s 7th Assembly District, which include the cities of Sacramento, West Sacramento and unincorporated Sacramento County. McCarty serves as Chair of the Assembly Budget Subcommittee on Education Finance. ★

state-of-the-art exercise room with free weights. There is a small outdoor pool, with separate towels. The pool also includes an assist chair, that lowers individuals that have a hard time getting into and out of the pool without assistance. On the other side of the building, there is a beautiful outside patio that includes a fire pit. Assistant General Manager, Terry Stewart said, "The patio is really beautiful because since the sun sets on the other side of the building, it never really gets too hot". Terry also mentioned that the outdoor patio was also a great place to enjoy a cocktail from their full bar.

Currently the bar's hours are Monday through Saturday, from 5 pm until 8 pm... unless there are people there. If this is the case, they will stay open later; you don't have to drink outside, however. There is a beautiful lounge area next to the bar, as well as the limited number of seats at the bar itself. Again, because

of the limits of the small kitchen, you cannot order meals, but they do have a "lounge menu" at the bar. This menu is limited to items such as quesadillas, salads and other simple dishes.

The Springhill Suites also includes a Board room and a Ballroom that can accommodate up to 400 people. Both of these are available to rent by the public. The Ballroom has the ability to be separated into two rooms if you have a smaller party. Outside catering is permitted, due to the limits of the kitchen.

Terry said that currently, Springhill suites is fully staffed. However, he welcomes and encourages people to come in and fill out an application at any time. "There is a large turnover in the hospitality business" Terry said. He continued with "especially in housekeeping because, well, it's hard work!" Medical Aid-in-Dying to Be More Accessible

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Mentally capable, terminally ill patients with less than six months to live will now have much easier access to medical aid-in-dying, thanks to a bill just signed by Gov. Gavin Newsom.

Patients still have to get the approval of two doctors, but Senate Bill 380 shortens the waiting period between 2 oral requests for the prescription from 15 days to 48 hours.

Amanda Villegas, an advocate and widow of cancer patient Chris Davis who passed away soon after diagnosis in 2019 without being able to take advantage of the end-of-life care option, said his suffering – and his family's – was prolonged unnecessarily.

"He wanted other patients to not have to endure what he endured," Villegas recounted. "He told me, 'Don't stop. Show the photos, tell my story. Let it be known that this needs to change.'"

Groups opposed to the bill cite religious and moral

concerns. A study from Kaiser found one-third of terminally ill adults who ask for medical aid-in-dying pass away before they complete the eligibility process. Advocates estimate since California's End of Life Option Act took effect five years ago, almost 1,400 people have died before obtaining a prescription.

The bill also requires hospitals and hospices to post their stance on medical aid-in-dying on their websites, so patients do not waste precious time trying

to find out if their provider is willing to help them.

Kim Callinan, president and CEO of the Compassion and Choices Action Network, said she hopes other states will follow the Golden State's lead.

"This is a huge victory for the moment, for Californians and for really dying Americans in every state," Callinan asserted.

The bill takes effect Jan. 1. Nine other states and Washington D.C have passed medical aid-in-dying legislation. ★

Thus far, the recall election turnout in Yolo County is higher than the statewide

average (58.1% - unofficial statewide voter turnout as of October 7, 2021). “Although not all other counties have certified, currently, Yolo County is more than 5% higher than the statewide average in terms of voter participation,” says Jesse Salinas, Yolo County Assessor/Clerk-Recorder/Registrar of Voters.

The preferred method to vote in Yolo County continues to be casting a vote by mail ballot. “95% of voters opted

to vote by mail. This shows an upward trend from the November Presidential Election, where 90% of voters chose to utilize vote by mail,” states Salinas.

Substantial Amendment to the 2020-2021 CDBG Annual Action Plan

The City of West Sacramento hereby notifies concerned members of the public, pursuant to 24 CFR 91.105, 24 CFR 91.505, of its intent to amend, approve and adopt a substantial amendment to the 2020-2021 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Annual Action Plan by the following actions:

The substantial amendment to the 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan will be available for a thirty-day public review and comment period from October 22, 2021 through November 23, 2021 online at: <https://www.cityofwestsacramento.org/residents/housing/community-development-block-grant>

The U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) determines each year the CDBG amount the city receives in the form of an entitlement amount (based on the City's overall population, its proportion of low- and moderate- income residents, and other demographic factors). The actions proposed by this Substantial Amendment involve reducing the original allocation of one activity within the Annual Action Plan and shifting the funding to another activity previously funded by CDBG. As a result, there is no net fiscal impact.

Construction work for the Washington Neighborhood Sidewalk, Lighting and Landscaping Improvement Project has been delayed and these actions are necessary for the City to utilize its allocation of CDBG funds to support the priority goals of the 2016-2020 CDBG Consolidated Plan. HUD requires that the Annual Action plan evaluate all resources available to increase economic opportunities and serve the needs of low-income residents. In December 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the city acquired a 40-unit motel at 817 West Capitol Avenue for a Homekey Program to provide interim housing for the homeless. Homekey Program participants receive case management, food distribution and other wrap around services to enable them to transition into a permanent housing alternative. The 817 West Capitol Avenue site needs electrical upgrades to enable the Homekey Program to run efficiently and continue to provide the support services to program participants. Reducing the incidence and impacts of homelessness was a priority goal in the 2016-2021 CDBG Consolidated Plan.

The goal of the Regulate Aggressive Driving and Reduce Speed (RADARS) VI grant is to decrease traffic crashes attributed to speed and the number of people killed and injured in these crashes. In federal fiscal year 2018-2019, speed was a factor in approximately 45 percent of all fatal and injury-causing crashes in California. That year, 36,036 speed-related crashes killed 335 people and injured 53,060 others.

"Reckless driving behaviors are a significant threat to all who use California's roadways," said CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray. "The RADARS grant will provide for a focused education and enforcement campaign targeting speeding motorists and aggressive driving behaviors, including street racing and sideshow activities, to help prevent crashes resulting in death or injury."

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020, CHP has noted a significant increase in incidents of unsafe

driving behaviors: motorists exceeding 100 miles per hour on state highways, illicit street racing and sideshow activities, and speed-related crashes.

Between April 1, 2020, and September 30, 2021, the CHP issued more than 44,500 citations to motorists traveling in excess of 100 MPH. To address the issue, the CHP used federal grant funding to conduct enhanced speed enforcement operations on state routes with a history of speed-related incidents, collaborated with local law enforcement agencies to create street racing and sideshow task forces, and conducted social media campaigns to educate the public about the dangers of speeding, aggressive driving, and street racing. The RADARS grant will allow the CHP to conduct a comparable campaign from October 1, 2021, through September 30, 2022.

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security.

Social Security Matters

The Basics of Applying for Social Security

Wednesday; born after the 20th of the month your payment will be received on the 4th Wednesday.

You can apply for benefits over the phone by calling Social Security at 1(800) 772-1213 (or by calling your local office) and requesting an appointment to apply. However, by far the most efficient way to apply is online at www.ssa.gov/applyforbenefits. Here's a link to a short video about applying online: https://www.ssa.gov/hlp/video/iclaim_r01.htm. To do the online application you will first need to create your personal "my Social Security" online account which is easy to do at www.ssa.gov/myaccount. When you have that online account set up, you will see your estimated benefit amounts at several ages. You'll see that if you claim at age 62 your benefit will be 30% less than it would be at your full retirement age (FRA) of 67 (a permanent reduction), and you'll also see that your benefit at age 70 would be about 75% more than your benefit at age 62.

Dear Rusty: I am planning to apply for Social Security in May of 2022 and would like to understand how to file. I will be taking it when I am 62.
Signed: Ready to Retire

Dear Ready to Retire: Congratulations on your upcoming retirement! You should apply for your Social Security benefits about 3 months before you wish benefits to begin (you will tell them the month you want benefits to start when you apply). Since you plan to apply at age 62, be aware that you must be 62 for an entire month to be eligible for benefits – you cannot get benefits for the month you turn 62 (unless you were born on the 1st or 2nd of the month). Rather you become eligible the following month.

Your benefit payment date will be either the 2nd, 3rd, or 4th Wednesday of the month, depending on the day of the month you were born. Born between the 1st and 10th of the month your payment will be received on the 2nd Wednesday; born between the 11th and 20th of the month, payment will be made on the 3rd

yet known, but it will be something a bit more than the 2021 limit of \$18,960. If you exceed the annual limit, Social Security will take back benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit (half of what you exceed the limit by). The earnings limit goes up by over 2.5 times in the year you reach your full retirement age and goes away entirely once FRA is attained.

Finally, your Social Security benefits may be subject to income tax if your combined income from all sources is high enough. The thresholds depend on your IRS filing status – if you file as "married/jointly" and your combined income (yours and your husband's) is more than \$32,000, then 50% of your SS benefits for the tax year becomes part of your taxable income. If your combined income as a married couple is more than \$44,000 then up to 85% of your SS benefits will be taxable. The thresholds are less if you file your taxes as a single – in that case income over \$25,000 means 50% of your SS benefits are taxable, and income over \$34,000 means up to 85% of your benefits will be taxed at whatever your normal IRS tax rate is.

Beat a Cyberbully: Here's How Parents Can Help

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - While remote learning during the COVID-19 pandemic lowered reported instances of bullying, parents fear that, for some students, going back to school will mean going back to being bullied.

"Bullying is something we worry about, especially with the beginning of each new school year," said Zury Bourque of her family of four in Cypress, Texas.

Now 15 years after the inception of National Bullying Prevention Month in October, technology's ever-greater presence in children's lives has given bullying a new outlet. With just a click, cyberbullies can taunt, harass and threaten relentlessly, even reaching into the home via

cellphone or computer. As a result, victims report feeling hopeless, isolated and even suicidal.

What can parents do to protect their kids? Taking an interest in their children's online world can make a difference, says the National Parent Teacher Association.

This interest does not necessarily require parents to become tech experts. Instead, the federal stop-bullying.gov site advises parents to watch for subtle clues that something is wrong, such as their child becoming withdrawn, hiding their screen when others are nearby or reacting emotionally to what is happening on their device.

For Zury Bourque and her husband Chris, that has meant being keenly aware of what "normal" looks like for their two boys, ages 12 and 10.

"Knowing my children's

moods is very important because I can then detect shifts or changes in their personalities that might signal something is going on," Chris said.

Talking with kids openly – and often – helps too. "The more you talk to your children about bullying, the more comfortable they will be telling you if they see or experience it," UNICEF says in its online tips for parents.

As their two daughters enter their teens, Houston parents Thiago and Auboni Cordolino have found that talking less and listening more works best. "We try to focus on being approachable and listening actively without reaction," Thiago said.

Beyond talking, listening and observing their kids, parents should not be afraid to make and enforce rules for online activities, experts say. ★

Collection Guidelines.

Free Bagged Leaf Collection

Make sure you are following these guidelines:

- Bagged leaves only.
- Individual bags may not weigh more than 50 pounds.
- Paper or ATSM D6400 rated compostable bags only.
- Place leaf bags next to your organics cart on collection day.
- Do not leave unbagged leaf piles in the street.

Leaf Bag Set-out Collection Schedule

- ▶ Weekly pickup during leaf drop season (Nov. 1 - Jan. 31)

A Cleaner Solution

Use your organics cart to dispose of organic waste and help keep West Sacramento storm drains free of leaves.

Weekly Organics Cart Guidelines:

- Ensure cart lids can close.
- Only place green waste, food scraps, and food-soiled paper in cart. Do not place food waste or food soiled paper in leaf bags.
- Excess branches and pruning no larger than three (3) feet long and two (2) inches in diameter, weighing no more than fifty (50) pounds may be tied in bundles and placed next to the organics cart.



No plastic, glass, metal, treated wood, rocks or dirt, hazardous or pet waste.
No plastic or foil coated paper.
