

Is the speed limit too high on the roads of West Sac?

City Council heard city report that recommends no changes

On July 14, the West Sacramento City Council will vote on the city’s proposal to keep speed limits the same on some of the busiest roads in town. At the last meeting, the council heard the report and read comments sent in from residents who share concerns that the 40 mph speed limit on Davis Road, in particular, is too high -- that 25 to 30 mph would be more reasonable considering the pedestrians,

older residents and pets who live in the area.

City of West Sacramento Junior Engineer Joanna Ortiz who presented the report over Zoom at the last meeting, held on June 16, said ensured the council that “everything is looked at -- especially residential areas.”

“There’s a lot of factors to consider when dealing with speed limits,” she said.

For the same meeting, the agenda included information on the city’s

Mobility Action Plan, which among many of its environmental and equity goals includes a section on Road Safety. The MAP cites the 2018 West Sacramento Systemic Safety Analysis Report which noted that pedestrian-vehicular collisions were the most significant safety concern throughout the city, followed by bicycle-vehicular collisions. The majority of collisions occurred at intersections, however, the severity of the collisions was heightened

for those that occurred on general roadway segments due to higher travel speeds. According to that report, “the higher number of collisions are in the north part of the city within transit dependant communities which cause inequitable access to opportunities and higher stress to communities that are dependant on transit or non-motorized mode of transportation.”

The MAP, in general, focuses on how different modes of transportation relate to each other. “At its core, the MAP is about ensuring our community members have a diverse set of choices of how they get around and helping prioritize local investments that offer safe, affordable, convenient and sustainable transportation options. Creating an environment where more people feel comfortable choosing to walk, bike, or take a shared or zero-emission ride can also help to re-

Call-To-Order COVID-19 Vaccine Program Expanded to all of Yolo County

As part of an effort to increase access to COVID-19 vaccine, Yolo County is expanding the free call-to-order program to deliver and administer COVID-19 vaccine to residents in all of Yolo County until July 2.

Residents 12 and older who would like to get vaccinated at their home or business can call (530) 666-8665 at any time to schedule an appointment to be vaccinated. If an operator does not answer the phone, residents can leave a message and receive a call back to schedule their appointment. County staff will deliver and administer vaccines seven days a week between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m.

“Because we don’t want access to vaccines to stand in the way of Yolo County residents getting vaccinated, we are offering this unique opportunity for residents to get vaccinated at a time and place that work for them,” said Dr. Aimee Sisson, Yolo County’s Public Health Officer. “Getting vaccinated against COVID-19 doesn’t get any easier than this. I encourage anyone 12 and older to call us and we will bring a vaccine to them, any-

duce traffic, and related emissions, while improving air quality and community health outcomes.”

Among residents who provided written statements against keeping the speed limits the same are Dani and Larry Langford in a joint statement wrote, “In less than half a mile on Davis Road between Village Parkway and the Clarksburg Trail, there are roughly 25 homes that have approximately 15-25 young children living or visiting regularly as well as numerous animals/pets. Also, that stretch of road is used frequently by horseback riders and bicyclists. It truly boggles our minds that other nonresidential roads have a speed

limit of 30 mph yet we have to fight and beg to get our populated area’s speed limit reduced to keep us and our families safe.”

In regard to the concern of the 40 mph speed limit proposal, Council Member Norma Alcalá asked how it had been determined and if the city got public input from residents in the area.

Ortiz said she coordinated these “high priority” segments with the police department. “They’re where they’ve had a lot of concerns,” she said.

For the next batch of segments, including Davis Road, that will be coming to council in regard to their proposed speed limits, Ortiz said

she’s been in touch with the police department “so that we are prioritizing the areas that need to be prioritized.”

Another resident who provided a written statement against keeping the speed limits the same is Sheila Johnston, a Commissioner of the Transportation, Mobility and Infrastructure Commission and a seven-year resident of the City of West Sacramento to who urged the council to send the consent agenda item to the TMI commission for input. According to Johnston’s statement, the city has not done an inventory of Safe Pedestrian Infrastructure measures.

In multiple neighborhoods, she argues that the city has allowed pedestrian safety measures, such as crosswalk reflection paint, reflective markers, signs, bike lanes, etc., to be virtually invisible. “I reported multiple crosswalk crossing signs that were placed behind light posts, that took over a year to be fixed. I even reported that the words STOP at a neighborhood intersection had been faded for three years. It took me over a year to have the letters repainted,” she wrote.

This is important, Johnston explained, because the city does factor in a whole transportation model that promotes pedestrian safety and transportation of vehicles. “If the city did factor this in, the recommendation of 35 mph on Southport Parkway between Marshall and Jefferson would be deemed too fast.

“When pedestrians cross any of the crosswalks going across Southport Boulevard, you have a 50/50 chance of being hit by a speed-

ing car that pays zero regard for pedestrian safety.

“There is zero enforcement of speed limits in this area, we maybe see one police car once a week, on a good day. Like I said above, pedestrian safety measures are not a priority.

Another example can be found at the crosswalk leading from Higgins Road to River City High School. The yellow lines of the crosswalk are faded, yet the speed limits stay the same.”

Among other concerns, Johnston stated that the recommendation to keep the same speed limits does not cite an environmental impact report. “We live in a rural area where there is abundant wildlife. We have wildlife crossing signs located on Southport Parkway with almost daily sightings of wildlife. To mention

that speeding cars and the correlating speed limits have zero impact on the environment reflects a huge oversight in the report,” she argued.

Ask the DMV – What you need to know about new REAL ID rules

Intro: Do you have questions about REAL ID? The DMV has answers! Changes to the deadline, limited-time fee waivers, and a simplified application process have all been recently announced. Read below for details on how to get your REAL ID.

Q1: I paid the fee to renew my driver's license online last year, but offices were closed due to COVID-19, so I couldn't get a REAL ID. Will I have to pay a fee again to upgrade to the REAL ID this year?

A: No! For a limited time, customers who have recently renewed a driver's license or identification card that is not federally compliant will be able to upgrade to a REAL ID for free! If you paid a fee to renew a driver's license or ID card between since March 2020, you will qualify but you must act now – the free REAL ID upgrade is only available until the end of the year.

The DMV is offering this free upgrade as a part of their continual efforts to accommodate customers who faced barriers due to COVID-19. It's important that everyone who is eligible and wants one can get a REAL ID. In May 2023, anyone flying domestically, visiting a military base or other federal facility will need a form of federal ID, like a REAL ID, to do so.

The process to get a REAL ID is also easier than ever – it is now possible to begin the REAL ID application and upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process. Making your visit at the window 10 minutes or less.

Q2: Which documents will I need to get a REAL ID?

A: The DMV has made it easier than ever to get a REAL ID. Recently the DMV also announced that you no longer need to supply your social security card – just your social security number. To apply, you will need to provide ONE identity document that includes your date of birth and your full name – like an original or certified birth certificate, or a valid US passport. You'll also need to provide TWO documents that show your name and address to prove you're a California resident. You can use cell phone and utilities bills, your mortgage, bank statements, or even your vehicle registration.

You can start your application online today and find a complete step-by-step checklist of all approved documents at REALID.dmv.ca.gov. If you upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process, your time at the window will be 10 minutes or less.

Community Input Needed to Refine Projects for American Rescue Plan funds

Yolo County staff is putting together a comprehensive blueprint for our American Rescue Plan funds with the goal of funding transformational projects that improve the lives of our communities and residents.

Staff will be seeking community input during three in-person and one virtual meeting to prioritize projects, refine ideas, and ensure that the projects that get funded are not duplicative (cities, school districts, state funding). Projects should invigorate our communities and be aligned with the strategic goals of the County.

The American Rescue Plan is a federal stimulus plan approved by Congress and President Biden that provides \$350 billion of stimulus funding to State and Local governments. Yolo County will receive approximately \$42.8 million.

Projects that support the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency, replace lost public sector revenue, provide premium pay for essential workers and invest in water, sewer and broadband infrastructure are eligible for American Rescue Plan funding.

"American Rescue Plan funding is an opportunity for Yolo County to address some of the impacts caused by the pandemic, while also potentially investing in necessary infrastructure improvements," said Yolo County Board of Supervisors Chairman Jim Provenza. "The Board of Supervisors would like to hear from community members prior to making a decision on how to allocate these funds."

Community members can submit their own proposals online to be included in the workshops. Proposals must be submitted by Friday, July 2nd for staff to review and ensure eligibility requirements are met.

I am sure everyone knows it will be replaced sadly, but that is progress. Onward and upward. My cousin had a brother who dove off of this bridge as a teen in the 40s. He lost his life. Hit something under the water. It broke his neck and he died. That is another memory I have of this bridge. So, perhaps a new bridge is the answer. I have seen enough walls built in my life. I am rather fond of bridges. Something that brings us together to share life and experiences. But then again, I am an artist, photographer of sorts, and at times a dreamer. I believe we need more of them.
