Repeat Drug Trafficker Sentenced to Prison

West Sacramento resident Jayson Garcia was sentenced last week to 12 years, 8 months, local prison stemming from six separate drug trafficking arrests spanning a one-year period, and all committed while on mandatory supervision. Mandatory supervision is a portion of a local prison sentence, determined by the court to be served in the community under the supervision of the probation department.

In May of 2019, Garcia, 43, was originally sentenced to four years in local prison after pleading no contest to possession with intent to sell methamphetamine and admitted an enhancement for having suffered a prior prison term. Garcia was ordered to serve half



his term in custody and the remainder on Mandatory Supervision.

After being released from custody, Garcia was arrested on February 24, 2020, by the West Sacramento Police Department

Community Invited to **Discuss Broadway** Bridge Project in a Virtual Open House

The cities of West Sacramento and Sacramento are hosting a virtual open house on Wednesday, July 28, from 5 to 6:30 p.m. to notify the public about the release of the Draft Environmental Impact Report/Environmental Assessment (EIR/EA) and the public comment period for the Broadway Bridge Project. The project team will present details about the preferred bridge alignment, estimated project schedule and the project environmental impact analysis results.

The Broadway Bridge is a proposed "neighborhood friendly" bridge across the Sacramento River downstream from Pioneer Bridge (US 50/ Business 80) that will connect South River Road on the west side of the river with Broadway on the east side. This crossing will be a movable bridge which will accommodate boat river traffic and provide enhanced travel connections for people who walk, bike, take transit and those who drive.

"This bridge will ultimately provide better connectivity for people traveling across the Sacramento River," said Jason McCoy, Supervising Transportation Planner and Project Manager

THIS 'n' THAT 'Once In a Generation' Flooding

Okay, so it's in Germany but it gives me pause because it also could happen here. The odds are small (less than 2 percent) that West Sac could have a catastrophic flood at any time in any year (Source: California Dept. of Water Resources & Army Corps of Engineers). But living within walking distance of the Sacramento River and a too short levee flooding elsewhere does make me ponder how our levee's 'Reach 8' is doing now.

You don't hear much about flood risk during drought. Right now, 'California burning' vs. drowning is the bigger threat. But it seems to me, and others, it's all related. The U.S. Geological Survey warned

us several years ago that "climate change is here and it's here to stay." (Yes, I know I've reported that before, but I think it bears repeating in the context of this column.)

Consider the Arctic's fast-melting ice and its real threat to coastlines. Is Sacramento back far enough? How about our



8 things health experts want you to know about the Delta variant

Sacramento-area COVID-19 surge is likely, given the highly contagious variant and the low vaccination rate.

For most of June, there were fewer than 10 patients with active COVID-19 at the UC Davis Medical Center

"We're all thinking that another surge is likely," said Christian Sandrock, director of critical care at the medical center. "It is frightening. I don't think we'll go back to the worst we've seen, due to the vaccine, but it's hard to tell."

The state of California re-opened June 15, lifting most masking and distancing requirements. The Delta variant, which originated in India, was spreading rapidly in the U.S. around the same time.

"The substantial increases in COVID-19 cases are consistent with a fourth surge largely, if not entirely, driven by unvaccinated people and not masking," explained Natascha Tuznik, associate clinical professor of infectious diseases at UC Davis Health.

"It's a concern but it's not unexpected, given the increased transmissibility of the Delta variant in combination with opening back up," said Dean Blumberg, chief of pediatric infectious diseases at UC Davis Children's Hospital.

Sacramento County has the third highest COVID case rate in the state, with 11.5 cases per 100,000 people over the last seven days. The county's COVID-19 vaccination rate is around 50%, well below the statewide rate of 63%.

UC Davis Health experts are warning that Delta should be taken very seriously. Here's what they've learned about the variant:

1. Delta is highly contagious

Nearly 80% of current COVID-19 cases in UC Davis Health patients are the Delta strain.

That's in line with what the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Rochelle Walensky, told a Senate committee this week: Delta accounts for 83% of the new cases in the U.S - up from about 50% just a couple of weeks

"The Delta variant is 40-50% more transmissible than the Alpha variant," said Tuznik. The Alpha variant was 50% more transmissible than the original strain of SARS-CoV-2.

2. Symptoms are the same, but cases are skewing younger

"We haven't really seen more severe symptoms with Delta [than the other strains], but we are seeing one trend internationally: 30-50-year-olds are making up more hospital admissions," Sandrock said.

"Symptoms are the same but what we are seeing with Delta is `quicker sicker,' especially in younger people," Tuznik noted. One possible explanation? Research published recently found that the variant grows more rapidly - and to much greater levels in the respiratory tract.

3. Delta is hitting the unvaccinated

"The Delta variant in the U.S. is affecting, for the most part, the unvaccinated," said Lorena Garcia, professor of epidemiology in the Department of Public Health Sciences. "That is different than the surges

in winter or early spring when the vaccine was not available to everyone. Now when you combine being unvaccinated with not wearing masks and no social distancing, you see this surge during the summer."

hospitalized COVID patients at UC Davis Medical Center are unvaccinated. "Vaccines continue to work very well – including against Delta," Blumberg said. "At this point in the pandemic, you're either going to get vaccinated or you're going to get COVID."

Nationally and statewide, the data show that areas with lower vaccination rates tend to have higher COVID-19 infection rates.

"My biggest concern is the unvaccinated population and ongoing refusal to vaccinate," said "Vaccination Tuznik. works. Vaccination prevents severe COVID-19 disease, which may be fatal. Essentially all fatalities at this time are being seen in the unvaccinated."

FEEDING PEOPLE, NOT LANDFILLS

An Equitable, Sustainable **Local Food System**

Nearly half of all families in Yolo County don't earn enough to meet basic needs. Not only did the pandemic triple the need for food assistance, but it also illuminated the inadequacies of the local food system. At the same time, about 2.2 billion pounds of perfectly good, nutritious food is dumped in landfills every year in California.

Almost 40% of the food produced in our state is never eaten; instead, it's sent to rot in landfills, emitting methane gas, a potent climate super-pollutant. Investing in surplus food recovery feeds people instead of landfills, and slashes climate emissions.

Yolo Food Bank's already robust surplus food recovery program routinely rescues unsold food from grocers, food distributors, and processors to distribute to struggling families. But more can be done to ensure a fair share of our county's bounty for the low-income rural residents who labor in the fields to ensure that our county's agricultural economy thrives, as well as for those struggling to make ends meet amidst rising housing costs in Yolo County's incorporated cities.

Forward-thinking California legislators passed SB 1383 in 2016, which reduces waste and climate emissions while providing food security for those most in need. Beginning January 1, Yolo County and each of its cities are mandated to collect the maximum surplus, edible food possible from grocers and other large-scale food businesses to redirect to a food recovery organization capable of storing and distributing the food to neighbors in need. Yolo Food Bank is working with local officials to embrace the scale and scope of this opportunity and prevent millions of

pounds of fresh, healthy food annually from being needlessly thrown in the Yolo County Central Landfill. The new law is the best hope in decades of building a sustainable local food system to provide for the residents most in need in Yolo County.



With respect to Future Improvement Areas, the Authority shall levy the special tax at the rate and in accordance with the formula approved by the qualified electors in the Future Improvement Areas in the manner required by the Act (each, a "Future Rate and Method," and together with the Improvement Area No. 1 Rate and Method, the "Rate and Methods"). The special taxes are hereby authorized to be levied commencing in fiscal year 2021-22 and in each fiscal year thereafter for the period provided in the applicable Rate and Method, as contemplated by the Resolution of Formation, the Resolution of Necessity and the unanimous approval form(s) submitted by the owner or owners of land annexing into any Future Improvement Area of the CFD, and all costs of administering the CFD.

Section 2. The Executive Director of the Authority or his or her designee, who may be an outside consultant to the Authority, is hereby authorized and directed each fiscal year to determine the specific special tax rate and amount to be levied for the next ensuing fiscal year for each parcel of real property within Improvement Area No. 1 and each Future Improvement Area, in the manner and as provided in the Resolution of Formation.

Formation.

Section 3. Except as provided in the Rate and Methods, properties or entities of the State, federal or local governments shall be exempt from any levy of the special taxes. In no event shall the special taxes be levied on any parcel within Improvement Area No. 1 or any parcel within any Future Improvement Area in excess of the maximum tax specified in, or contemplated by, the Resolution of Formation.

Section 4. All of the collections of the special taxes shall be used as provided for in the Act and in the Resolution of Formation including, but not limited to, the payment of principal and interest on bonds and other debt (as defined in the Act) issued by the Authority for Improvement Area No. 1 or a Future Improvement Area (the "Bonds"), the replenishment of the reserve fund for the Bonds, the payment of the costs of the Facilities, the payment of the costs of the Authority in administering the CFD, and the costs of collecting and administering the special taxes. **Section 5.** The special taxes shall

be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes are collected and shall have the same lien priority, and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes; provided, however, that this Board may provide for other appropriate methods of collection resolutions of this Board. In addition, the provisions of Section 53356.1 of the Act shall apply to delinquent special tax payments. The Crocker Art Museum is pleased to announce Monet to Matisse: Masterworks of French Impressionism from the Dixon Galleries and Gardens eaturing 50 works by some of the most well-known artists of the late 19th and early 20th centuries, on view from October 3, 2021 through January 9, 2022.

The exhibition boasts significant works of art by the most dynamic artists to work in this period in France, including Claude Monet, Auguste Rodin, Pierre Auguste Renoir, Paul Cézanne, and Henri Matisse. From plein-air landscapes to scenes of modern life in Paris, the exhibition illustrates the radical innovations launched by artists we know today as Impressionists and Post Impressionists.

Georges Hausmann's transformation of the

chaotic web of medieval streets to a more orderly system of wide, tree-lined boulevards coincided with bustling energy in Paris's many cafés and parks. Keenly observing the new world around them, a group of artists dedicated themselves to "painting modern life" on location to capture a quick impression of a particular moment in nature. Ultimately known as the Impressionists, the artists organized eight exhibitions between 1874 and 1886, changing the course of art history and revolutionizing the way art was viewed in Paris and, eventually, around the world.

The term "Impressionism" was coined by the artist and art critic Louis Leroy, when he witnessed the first

Focusing on Claude Monet's painting Impression: Sunrise, he reacted to its seemingly unfinished, hazy evocation of the sun reflected on the sea, finding it the epitome of a type of art he disliked. The artists themselves soon embraced the term, branding themselves "Impressionists."

> Following these artists, the second generation of younger painters pushed the limits even further. Later known as the Post-Impressionists, they embraced new subjects, invented new pictorial structures, and applied color theory in unexpected ways. These remarkable painters, in turn, set the course of Western art in new directions and laid the groundwork for generations to come, including artists working

and ultimately charged with evading a peace officer, possession for sale of methamphetamine and heroin; transportation for sale of methamphetamine and heroin, destruction of evidence, and driving on a suspended license. He was also charged with a violation of Mandatory Super-

Garcia was released on his own recognizance on March 12, 2020, on the drug trafficking case but remained in custody on

the Mandatory Supervision violation. On March 16, 2020, Garcia was released from custody by the court in his Mandatory Supervision case.

On July 30, 2020, Garcia was arrested by the West Sacramento Police Department and charged with possession for sale methamphetamine, driving on a suspended license and traffic violations. After being booked in jail, Garcia was released on \$0 bail as a result of the Court's Emergency Bail Schedule. Three days later, on August 3, 2020, Garcia was arrested again by


the West Sacramento Police Department and ultimately charged with possession for sale of heroin, possession of drug paraphernalia, and possession of methamphetamine. Garcia was released on \$0 bail.

Garcia was back in court on November 4, 2020, and was allowed to remain out of custody on supervised release. On January 6, 2021, Garcia was arrested yet again and charged with transportation for sale of heroin and methamphetamine, and possession for sale of heroin and methamphetamine. He was again released on \$0 bail and arrested two days later, on January 8, 2021, released again on \$0 bail and ultimately charged with possession for sale of methamphetamine. Garcia was arrested on February 12, 2021, by the West Sacramento Police Department who obtained a bail enhancement prohibiting his release on \$0 bail. He was ultimately charged with possession for sale methamphetamine, transportation for sale of methamphetamine, possession for sale of heroin,



Please note that this alphabet is to be applied THROUGHOUT the candidate's entire last name, so if more than one candidate's surname begins with the same letter, the second letter of the surname determines who goes first, according to where the second letter of the name appears in the random alphabet. For example, if two candidates with the surname of Campbell and Carlson are running for the same office, their order on the ballot will depend on the order in which the letters "M" and "R" were drawn in the randomized alphabet drawing. To further ensure fairness in our election process, per Election Code section 13111, the Yolo County Elections Office rotates the ballot order of candidates by State Assembly district for state offices and by supervisorial district for city offices.





4. Breakthrough cases are rare but do occur

Breakthrough cases, when a vaccinated person gets COVID, do occur, but they are rare, and most are mild and don't result in hospitalization or death. "The increased transmissibility of the Delta variant is almost certainly contributing to breakthrough cases," said Tuznik.

"In the U.S., there have been 65,000 breakthrough cases among the 160 million people who've been fully vaccinated. So that's 0.04% of the people vaccinated reporting breakthrough cases," Blumberg noted.

For vaccinated patients who get COVID, symptoms have been largely

similar to a cold, with a significant loss of smell.

"In vaccinated people who do get COVID, it's definitely more of the asymptomatic people with limited symptoms," Sandrock said. "They may have a couple of days of cough, fever or headache but it's not as severe."

No vaccine is 100% effective. With the COVID-19 vaccines averaging about 90% efficacy, health experts expect about 10% of those vaccinated could be infected. In Sacramento County, that's 74,000 people who could get it – but are still protected from severe disease and hospitalization.

5. Many of our patients wish they'd gotten vaccinated

"A number of younger patients, when they come into us, critically ill, they start saying 'I should have gotten the vaccine,'" Sandrock said. "We are seeing a lot of that. As they start to get really sick, they're like, 'Why did I not get the vaccine? Why did I not listen?' I'd say more than half of them do that."

6. Delta could be catastrophic in some communities

In California's communities with lower vaccination rates, particularly rural areas with limited access to care, Delta could be even more damaging.

"It could be extremely devastating," said Garcia. "We already have an example in what is occurring around the world in low-income countries where the vaccine is not available for the poor. The preventable deaths and severe illness are overwhelming. The impact will be felt for decades to come."

7. Some experts are still masking up after vaccination

"My advice is to continue masking. Even if you're vaccinated, definitely avoid large indoor gatherings - begrudgingly, again - and mask in grocery stores, drug stores and other locations that don't verify vaccination status," said Tuznik. "Socially distanced outdoor activities should be fine, but if you might come into close contact, even briefly, with a stranger, then mask up just in case."

"I'm fully vaccinated and I still wear a mask at the grocery store or even outdoors in a crowded situation like at the farmer's market, because many unvaccinated people are choosing to go unmasked and I'm not

comfortable with that," Blumberg explained.

8. There are more variants to come

"We have the Delta now and then it's being followed by the Lambda in South America," said Sandrock. "If people want to get back to normal, they need to get vaccinated. As long as a good chunk of people are unvaccinated, in the world, we're just going to continue having new strains come along that are going to cause these periods where we'll have to go back and forth to a modified life."

"We are in the middle of our own surge, with patient census is as high as it was a year ago," said David Lubarsky, CEO of UC Davis Health. The risks are real, as we hear every day from people who have gotten infected and really wish they had been vaccinated instead."

transportation for sale of heroin.

On March 12, 2021, Garcia entered no-contest pleas to transportation and destruction of evidence. Garcia also admitted an enhancement that the offenses were committed while out on bail or own recognizance as well as violation of his mandatory supervision.

On July 14, 2021, Garcia was sentenced to a term of 12 years, 8 months in local prison by the Honorable David Reed. Over objection by the prosecutor, the court imposed a term of 3 years, 6 months in custody with remaining time to be spent on Mandatory Supervision. Inmates are legally entitled to earn up to 50% credits so Garcia's actual iail time will be reduced by half. Consistent with recently enacted policy, (link below) all convicted drug traffickers are advised that illicit drugs can be laced with fentanyl, a powerful synthetic opioid that often results in death, and that any future drug trafficking where the substances contain fentanyl which results in someone's death, could give rise to murder charges. https://yoloda. org/yolo-county-da-to-issue-warning-of-homicide-charges-for-narcotics-traffickers-causing-fentanyl-related-deaths

water supply. Is our freshwater safe? Sea lions - salt water creatures that they are - have been seen in the river by Discovery Park. Frolicking about the confluence of the American and Sacramento Rivers. I've seen them with my own eyes. That confluence is all but right across the street (Lighthouse before it turns into 5^{th}).

Not meaning to be alarmist, but climate change- and vaccine-deniers bring it out in me. I'm also not liking the earthquakes much. Some in Sac say the recent shaking from two pretty big ones was 'the hardest they'd ever felt.' People in West Sac felt it, too. I didn't. Probably slept through it thanks to pain medication I take that lets me sleep. That latest quake (as of July 20) just off our NorCal coast makes me wonder whether earth's tectonic plates are a bit too busy. If earth could 'kick up' fossil rocks it hardened 6-8 billion

years ago (see photo and caption), what else might it do?

I once rode a mining elevator to the bottom of Lake Erie to do a story on rock salt mined there. It's used to melt winter ice on Ohio roads. There's lots of it. Leftover from when my home state was under a shallow inland sea. I have saltwater fossils I found in my farm field. And, in Amish country, I took friends and family several times to Nelson's Ledges - a collection of geologic features you can picture as submerged reefs and caves. Early Ohio had palm trees. Maybe one day, California will have blizzards and icy roads.

Here's my point. Some researchers say the time will come that only poor and old people who can't afford to move will populate areas that have become unlivable due to heat. Many experts say we need to get used to 'novel' viruses escaping from now clear-cut former jungles, like what's happening to the rain forest in Brazil. The rain forests, left as God creat-

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


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
