As the need for new farmers, agricultural leaders, and natural resource stewards continues to increase, the Center for Land-Based Learning is announcing its unprecedented organizational growth in response to this need.

The Center, which started offering its FARMS program in 1993, has remained committed to inspiring, educating, and cultivating future generations of farmers, agricultural leaders, and natural resource stewards in California over the long haul.

In 2017, the Center set forth a multi-year strategy plan to, among other goals, "build a new home in a new place."

In May 2020, the Center moved to Woodland, after a successful capital campaign. The Center for Land-Based Learning's Headquarters at Maples Farm is a 30-acre campus that houses their new offices, the Best Classroom where they will hold in-person classes when it is again safe to do so, and pro-

Until Mike was diagnosed, I'd never heard of ADHD. One of the first ADHD books I saw was, "You Mean I'm Not Lazy, Crazy or Stupid?" Nope. Turns out ADHD is a neurological brain glitch that predisposes you

Matsui secures critical West Sacramento flood control construction designation

On May 28, Congresswoman Doris Matsui (CA-06) lauded the announcement of the 'New Start' construction designation for the West Sacramento Project – an essential undertaking that builds a new levee system surrounding the City of West Sacramento.

Matsui played a pivotal role in securing the critically important flood infrastructure designation and additional funding for the expansive, \$1 state-of-theart project. Only a few 'New Start' designations are assigned each year throughout the nation. I cannot emphasize This newly secured construction designation allows the groundbreaking of the West Sacramento Project, which provides full flood protection for West Sacramento's 54,000 residents.

"This is a monumental step towards the full level of flood protection West Sacramento deserves and a strong, modernized first line of defense for the city's families and businesses. Protecting our region from its natural flood risk has been a top priority in Congress, and

enough the importance of delivering proper funding and timely, efficient construction for this city-wide project" Congresswoman Matsui.

West Sacramento has been the last component of the system to receive funding, construction bringing the West Sacramento and the Sacramento River Flood Control System closer to proper completion.

"I am pleased that our federal and state partners share my strong priorities and vision for proper flood infrastructure in the Sacramento region," Matsui continued. "The \$175 million in President Biden's proposed budget is an important step in the right direction for Sacramento region flood protection projects, including the West Sacramento Project and the American River Common Features Natomas Project. I look forward to working with the Army Corps of Engineers and state and local partners to ensure all necessary resources are provided in protecting our region."

West Capitol Ave Project Traffic Alert

tol Avenue will begin with work at the Jefferson Boulevard and US-50 West on/off ramps. During construction work, the Jefferson Boulevard and US-50 west on-ramp will be closed at night from 7:00 pm to 7:00 am from June 6th to approximately June 14th.

Detour routes will be in place directing traffic to Harbor Boulevard for access to the freeway. Additional work at the Jefferson and US-50 on/off ramps is scheduled for later in the summer and at this time is still being coordinated. The final improvements to the project, road rehabilitation and striping improvements are planned for this summer and will occur at night.

Other construction improvements on the west end of the project include the installation of sidewalk

New construction on West Capi- and curb ramps on the south side of West Capitol Avenue between Pine Street and Garnet Street as well as preparation of the road widening for bike lanes. Additional work includes installation of water utilities, preparation of new sidewalks, and grading for stormwater drainage. Beginning next month, a transitional striping and lane shift will be in place to accommodate the placement of the new roadway alignment and the installation of a median island at the Yolo Causeway Bike Trail. Specific dates and timeframes for this work are still in progress.

COVID-19 Vaccine Delivered to Residents in Select Areas June 9-15

To improve vaccination rates, Yolo County is launching a free, call-to-order program to deliver and administer COVID-19 vaccine to local residents at their homes or businesses in West Sacramento June 13-15.

Residents age 12 and older, who live in Esparto, Dunnigan, Guinda, Woodland or West Sacramento and who would like to get vaccinated at their home or business can call (530) 666-8665 to schedule an appointment between 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. during the days that the program is in their area. These areas were selected because they lag behind the countywide average of residents who have been vaccinated. During times of high call volume, residents can leave a message and receive a call back to schedule their appointment. County staff will then come to their home or business to administer the vaccine. Yolo County will be vaccinating

residents in the following areas from June 9-15:

- June 9: Esparto, Dunnigan,
- June 10-12: Woodland
- June 13-15: West Sacra-

"I am very excited to offer this opportunity for Yolo County residents to get vaccinated wherever is most convenient to them," said Dr. Aimee Sisson, Yolo County's Public Health Officer. "Residents may face barriers to getting vaccinated at existing clinic locations, and this program eliminates many of those barriers. For example, if you are a single mom with kids at home all day, we will bring the vaccine to you at home. If you can't take time off of work to get vaccinated, we will bring the vaccine to you at work. Getting vaccinated against COVID-19


My brother is a Viet Nam veteran who received a Bronze Star for pulling 4 of his wounded brothers to safety. He also received eight pieces of shrapnel in his body. He was nearly killed. I want to be perfectly frank about this. There was no ticker-tape parade for him and his brothers and sister upon arriving "home." He was ridiculed and spit on by those who were once his peers. My own family, even my own grandfather who came to America from Sicily where he had fought the Turks from age 17 until age 21 and who was a very proud American. All three of his sons were highly decorated war heroes in World War II, were treated as a possible enemy like so many Japanese Americans whose only crime was their nationality. My father was also in WWII. He was a crew chief who worked directly under General MacArthur and had worked on aircraft his entire career. He went to be with the Lord in 2009. He was a great man yet humble. I very rarely heard him speak of his time in the service working for Mac. I have learned many things over the last decade through my brother. I am amazed and humbled by him and have gained a much deeper understanding of his and the rest of my family's sacrifices and service. I was brought up traveling this great country. I like to say that I was brought up in the military-industrial complex. There is so much more to it. It was an awesome childhood. This story needs to be told or at least touched upon.

I would personally like to extend my gratitude and respect to all who have served and are serving our country. Your sacrifice is understood and appreciated and I honor you all. God bless you.



West Sac native choreographed spring 2021 dance concert at Muhlenberg College

2021-22 Recommended Budget and 2020-21 Annual Report Now Available

Yolo County released its 2021-22 Recommended Budget and 2020-21 Annual Report. The Board of Supervisors will consider the recommended budget on June 15. Total expenditures for the County are recommended in the amount of \$526,245,540 general-purpose revenues of \$86,309,117, which represents an increase of \$1,796,774 or 2.1% from the 2020-21 fiscal year-end estimated general purpose revenues. Capital expenditures are recommended \$46,617,196. These increases are expected to be offset by slight increases in most revenues. The Recommended Budget proposes eliminating or defunding 20 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions while adding 25 FTE positions, for a net increase of 5 FTE positions. 10 FTE positions that will be added back have been vacant since 2020 and the start of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Of significant note, the County will have an infusion of approximately \$42.8 million over the next few years due to the American Rescue Plan (ARP), which is a federal stimulus plan approved by the Congress of the United States and President Biden that provides \$350

billion of stimulus funding to State and Local Governments out of the \$1.9 trillion-dollar bill. These funds are available for use and can be expended between March 2021 and December 2024. The County approved principles for the use of ARP funds in March available significant federal resources, the County should avoid depending on it to balance the operating budget.

The Recommended Budget aligns with the Board of Supervisors Adopted Fund Balance and Reserve Policy, funds a General Fund contingency, prioritizes focus areas within the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan, and supports long term financial planning; however, the 2021-22 fiscal year includes many known budget risks including use of a higher than normal assumption of General Fund carryforward balance. The County will be utilizing grant funds, State and Federal revenues, and numerous fees that are paid in exchange for providing requested services to the public to help off-

Total unfunded liabilities continue to be of significant concern. The pension liability of \$350,245,214 has more than doubled within the last four years despite pension reform lowering the formula for new employees. This cost increase is due to changes in CalP-2021 with the direction ERS' assumed investment to treat the funds as one earnings, changes in actime. Accordingly, even counting methodology as ARP funding makes and revised assumptions of higher age retirement. This amount will continue to increase as CalPERS phases in a change from a 30-year amortization to a 20-year amortization for payment of the unfunded liability. The retiree health liability continues to see reductions due to the ongoing efforts of the Board-approved pre-funding plan with the most recent 2020 actuarial study showing an unfunded liability of \$65,180,000. is down from \$153,091,000 in 2014. The road maintenance liability of \$477,000,000 has yet to be fully addressed, though SB 1 has substantively strengthened road maintenance investment in the county.

"These are unprecedented times for Yolo County. The pandemic has generated significant economic disruption and fiscal uncertainty over the past year. At the same time, the one-time federal American Rescue Plan funds offer Yolo County a oncein-a-lifetime opportunity to make community investments to transform the county," said Interim County Administrator Daniel Kim. "To make the most of this opportunity, we plan to take a "measure twice, cut once" approach to budget development so we can more thoughtfully

consider how to make the best use of these one-time funds. This recommended budget is the product of many dedicated county staff who have produced this document largely in a remote environment, while remaining true to the "Yolo Way" of collaboration, cooperation and coordination of effort. I am grateful for the Board's long-term vision and continuous efforts to

strengthen the County's fiscal resilience."

Once adopted, the recommended budget will serve as the interim spending plan until the adopted budget hearings can be completed in September following adoption of the state budget. The 2021-22 recommended budget is available online at: www. yolocounty.org/budget-finance.

to inattention, impulsivity, and, in my case, excessive talking. None of which endear you to teachers. Trying to impart knowledge to largely round pegs, their mission is complicated by the square ones.

Even my brother, a board certified neurologist educated at the Mayo Clinic, never suspected, nor suggested to my folks, my problems might be ADHD. Poor dad. Patience never was his long suit.

Mom remembered the day she punished me when I was 3. She said I looked at her with woeful eyes and said, "I didn't mean to be bad." Believe it or not, I remember that. Both of us cried. Poor mom.

My folks did a lot right, I have to say. It took a while, but I finished college. And lucked into a career that

proved great for me (TV News/journalism).

Dad's business degree was from Ohio State. He did alright, too. At 50, he started a business, ultimately had a string of four, plus made money in the stock market. He and mom had football season tickets at Ohio State – on the 50 yard line.

When Mike completed college with a Bachelor of Science degree, I wish my parents could have been there.

Well, all that came to mind on Memorial Day as my ADHD self failed to come up with a column topic. Looking for ideas, my email subscription to neurosciencenews.com provided one. "Breakthrough" news

one-fifth of babies who inherit a genetic variant located on chromosome 16 will develop autism spectrum disorder (ASD) by age 3. The variant is called "16p11.2 deletion." (Variant is just another word for 'difference'.)

A health science center in Texas is studying baby mice that have the variant. They've learned that such mice can't let their mothers know they need help because they can't call her. The research goal is defining how this difference impacts social behaviors in autistic mice when they reach puberty. Study has begun on human infants via recordings of the newborn cries of

preemies. Preterm infants have a high risk of developmental issues, including autism, say the scientists. In two or three years, they hope technology such as AI (Artificial Intelligence) will come up with

rithms' for early treatment. Applied early, they believe, such treatment will improve later outcomes for autistic

In a paper first published in the journal "Molecular Psychiatry," lead researcher, Dr. Noboru Hiroi writes: "Identified in this way, infants at risk of (autism), can be given desensitization therapy so that they don't overreact to certain cues they don't like." Hiroi believes the behavioral therapies can help babies learn how to cope in social situations.

Fascinating. What will molecular research discover next? To me, this feels like hope, real hope, for babies born with disordered brains - that they can, one day, achieve their full poten-




