

# Exploring the wonders of the Sacramento National Wildlife Refuge

Located in California's Central Valley, the Sacramento National Wildlife Refuge Complex is made up of six individual National Wildlife Refuges (NWR) including Sacramento, Colusa, Delevan, Butte Sink, Sutter and a long stretch of the Sacramento River from Red Bluff south to Princeton, California. The complex adds up to 10,819 acres and was originally established by Franklin D. Roosevelt on February 27, 1937, as a Migratory Waterfowl Refuge. Waterfowl using the Pacific Flyway to migrate currently and historically used the area as a winter refuge.

In the mid-1800s, when early settlers were trying to homestead in the Sacramento area, they were met with some inconveniences. It was

hot and dry in the summer months and during the winter months, the land became a marsh. In order to build their communities and grow food, they developed the Glen-Colusa Irrigation District to divert water from the overflowing

Sacramento River and direct it where it could be used for farming. As a result of this and other irrigation projects in California, the acreage of wetlands available to migrating waterfowl was decreased by 90%. In the Sacramento region

alone, wetland acreage dwindled from 5 million acres to less than 320,000 acres. Although acres of natural wetlands were converted to agriculture, rice farming practices still provided food for the hungry and tired mi-

grating birds. In fact, the throngs of hungry birds could eat up a devastating 40 acres of rice crops in a single night. In response to the conversion of wetlands and the destruction of crops, the Sacramento National Wildlife Refuge (SNWR or Sacramento NWR) Complex was created.

The establishment of the complex helped to:

- manage wetlands specifically for wildlife and other plants and animals
- deter rice crop depredation
- create endangered species habitat
- provide recreational and environmental education/interpretation opportunities
- provide research opportunities

As a result of rice crop devastation, a cooperative rice farming pro-

## Business and Activities Reopening Details

Yolo County and West Sacramento follow state guidelines

A week into the reopening of businesses and activities, Yolo County began to allow businesses to reopen and activities to resume in alignment with the retirement of the State of California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy. The statewide transition to Beyond the Blueprint eliminates the color-coded tier system for counties. Moving to Beyond the Blueprint will allow Yolo County to fully eliminate capacity limits and remove local restrictions on business operations as well as eliminate masking requirements for fully vaccinated residents in most settings. However, masking will still be required for all residents in certain settings as outlined below. The following restrictions apply:

**Capacity limitations:** No restrictions.

**Physical distancing:** No restrictions for attendees, customers and guests. Workers on the job must maintain physical distancing and schools should keep student desks at least 3 feet apart.

**Masking:** Individuals who are fully vaccinated do not need to wear a mask in most settings. Unvaccinated individuals must continue to wear masks in indoor public settings, includ-

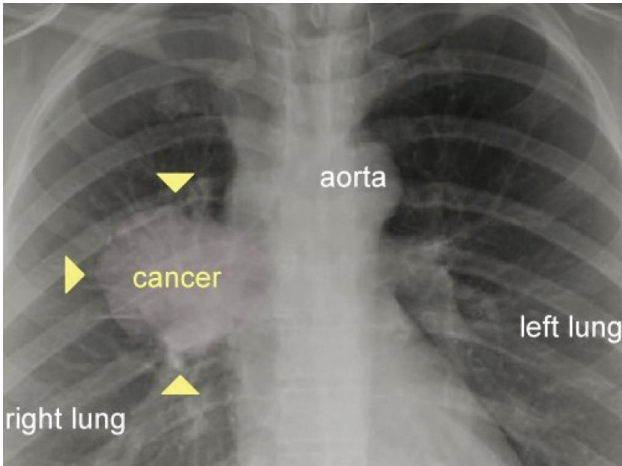

gram was established but later failed. As a result, it was decided that all crops should be removed from the SNWR and replaced with managed wetlands. As the water draws down in the spring, seed-producing plants germinate and provide food for wintering waterfowl and other wildlife.

Today, the Sacramento National Wildlife Refuge is home to over 400 species of plants, 300 species of birds and 500 different species of mammals, reptiles and amphibians. The Sacramento NWR has the greatest concentration of waterfowl per acre in the entire world and comprises over 7,500 acres of managed wetlands sup-

porting peak populations of 850,000 migrating waterfowl. Other species of interest observed in the complex include bald eagles, red-tailed hawks, great blue herons, snowy egrets, just to name a few. It is an amazing experience to see such an array of birds in such a small area.

The NWR headquarters are located at the Sacramento NWR. Here you can learn more about the plants, birds and animals around you. When it is open to the public, they have educational classes for children, youth and adults of all ages. The California Junior Duck Stamp competition is a favorite program allowing youth

a chance to create and compete in state and national duck stamp competitions.

The SNWR is practically in our backyard, I recommend visiting it to anyone who would like to get out and explore nature; you don't even have to get out of your car.

## Tuleyome “Nature & You” lecture: “Invasive Grassland Species”

The hills of California were not always golden! Spanish colonization of California began one of the most widespread plant invasions in the world. It occurred so fast we don't actually know what the native plant community looked like before the Spanish. The majority of our grasslands have been dominated by introduced annual invasive grasses and forbs, such as wild oats and bromes, for hundreds of years, but now a new wave of invaders are entering – yellow starthistle, medusahead, and goatgrass, which are causing new problems. Please join UD Davis Plant Ecologist and Ph.D. candidate, Sarah Gaffney, at 7 p.m. on Thursday, June 24, to learn about these two groups of invasive species and explore the differences and similarities of their ecological role in the grassland and oak savanna plant community, as well as touch on recent research on restoring native grasses to these invaded areas.

# Go For Broke

On Saturday, June 5th, 2021, The California Museum, Florin JACL, Sac JACL and Sac State Japanese American Archives put on an event to introduce the newest “Forever” stamp called “Go For Broke”. The “Go For Broke” stamp is in honor of the 442nd Infantry Regiment. The 442nd was comprised of mostly 2nd generation Japanese Americans (Nisei) who fought in WWII. These men served (while their families were prisoners in internment camps) to prove their loyalty to America. The 442nd is the most decorated unit for its size in U.S. military history.

In 2005, three Nisei (2nd generation) Japanese American women from California: Fusa Takahashi, Aiko O. King, and the late Chiz Ohira began a grassroots campaign to have a USPS stamp in honor of the 442nd Infantry



Regiment. The 3 women, are widows of “Go For Broke” World War II veterans. Their many years of hard work paid off, when the stamp was unveiled at the California Museum, June 5, 2021. The event (small in size) due to Covid restrictions featured stirring speeches by Congresswoman Doris Matsui, Honorable Judge Charles Kobayashi,



Lester Ouchida, Kiyo Sato and Sac City Councilwoman, Katie Valenzuela. Sacramento Taiko Dan opened the program then Tom Nakashima took over the hosting duties. Postmaster Douglas Smith unveiled the stamp to thunderous applause and many heartfelt tears. Accompanied by Esther Hokama’s lovely voice and Ukule-

le, Lois Nishimura and Kiyo Sato danced in celebration at the end of the program.

Also on hand, Honorable Judge Johnny Gogo from Santa Clara County, brought the 48 star flag and had survivors of the Internment camps sign the flag. Most were young children when interned, and were proud and honored to sign the flag. He brought the

48 star flag since that was the number of states during World War II. He is traveling across the country trying to get as many signatures of internment survivors as possible. At the end of the program, Tule Lake survivor, Keiji Takagi remarked how he wished his parents were here to see this and how it takes courage to heal.

## Road Closure on CR 19 Due to Culvert Replacement Project

Due to the Yolo County Public Works Division’s efforts to replace two failing drainage culvert pipes, a section of County Road (CR) 19 will be closed to through-traffic on June 22 and 23 during daytime working hours. ing businesses. All residents must continue to wear masks on public transit and in the workplace, medical facilities, K-12 schools, correctional facilities and shelters, regardless of their vaccination status.

**Employers/workplaces:** Masks and physical distancing continue to be required in the workplace in accordance with the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Prevention Emergency Temporary Standards.

**Travelers:** Follow CDC recommendations.

Proof of full vaccination or of a recent negative COVID-19 test is required for persons attending indoor mega events (consisting of 5,000 or more attendees) and is recommended for those attending outdoor mega events (consisting of 10,000 or more attendees).

“With our local case rate very low and the majority of Yolo County residents vaccinated, now is an appropriate time to loosen COVID-19 restrictions, says Dr. Aimee Sisson, Yolo County’s

Public Health Officer. However, Sisson continues to urge the unvaccinated to exercise caution. “While the Blueprint framework is ending today, the pandemic is not. The virus that causes COVID-19 continues to circulate in Yolo County. Those who are not yet vaccinated remain at risk of infection and should continue to protect themselves and others from COVID-19 by wearing masks indoors.”

In settings where masks are required only for unvaccinated individuals, businesses, venue operators or hosts may choose to:

Provide information to all patrons, guests

and attendees regarding vaccination requirements and allow vaccinated individuals to self-attest that they are in compliance prior to entry, implement vaccine verification to determine whether individuals are required to wear a mask, or require all patrons to wear masks.

# Yolo Superior Court Open to In-person Hearings

Consistent with Governor Newsom's re-opening plan Yolo Superior Court fully reopened for in-person hearings on June 15, 2021.

Yolo Superior Court announced its plan to follow the Governor's lead and "open" the courthouse for in-person participants. While the court will continue to allow remote appearances in most case types and for non-evidentiary hearings, it will no longer require remote appearances as it did during the height of the pandemic.

Traffic court will remain an exception and still require remote appearances.

Additionally, jury hardships and orientation will also remain virtual. Court hearings will continue to be streamed so that viewers can watch and listen to public hearings remotely. Exterior service windows will remain open for traffic and collections, and interior service windows will be available for all other case types.

Per local rule eFiling is mandatory for most case types and permissive for others.

The Self-help Center will expand services to include appointments in-person or by Zoom and open office hours for drop-in services Tuesday and Thursday from 8:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. The public should consult the court's website for further information on in-person and Zoom appearances. Presiding Judge Daniel P. Maguire stated "Remote appearance allowed the court to stay open and functioning during the pandemic. The public health crisis is now receding, but we've learned how technology can expand access to jus-

tice, and we will continue to give all court users the option to appear by video for most non-evidentiary hearings." There have been many benefits to the virtual calendars including saving time traveling to and from the courthouse for appearances.

"We're happy to give court users the option to appear remotely and believe that remote appearance offers many benefits in appropriate cases," added the Presiding Judge.

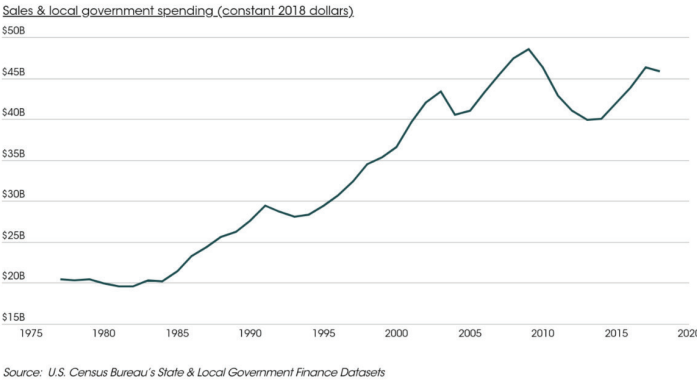
# California Spends \$6.8 Billion on Parks & Rec Each Year, 13th Most per Capita

While the travel and tourism industry took a major hit during the COVID-19 pandemic as more people elected to stay home and avoid travel, outdoor recreation has remained a bright spot.

Recent data from the Outdoor Industry Association showed a 2.4 percentage point jump in total outdoor participation among Americans from 2019 to 2020. Outdoor activities of all types became an enticing alternative for people looking to get away from home while keeping their risk of spreading or contracting the coronavirus relatively low. The OIA data specifically estimated that 2020 saw 8.1 million more hikers, 7.9 million new campers, and 3.4 million additional freshwater fishers taking advantage of the great outdoors during COVID-19. This trend may also reflect larger shifts in people's lifestyle preferences, as COVID-19 has inspired many workers to leave dense urban areas for locations where outdoor space is more plentiful.

Interest in the outdoors is good news for state and local governments that fund parks and recreation. These governments invest in recreational sites not only for the health and leisure of their residents but also as an economic development tool. Studies have estimated that the outdoor recreation economy is responsible for more than 7 million U.S. jobs and close to \$900 billion

State & local funding for parks & recreation has grown significantly over the past several decades



of consumer spending annually—generating roughly \$60 billion in tax revenue for state and local governments.

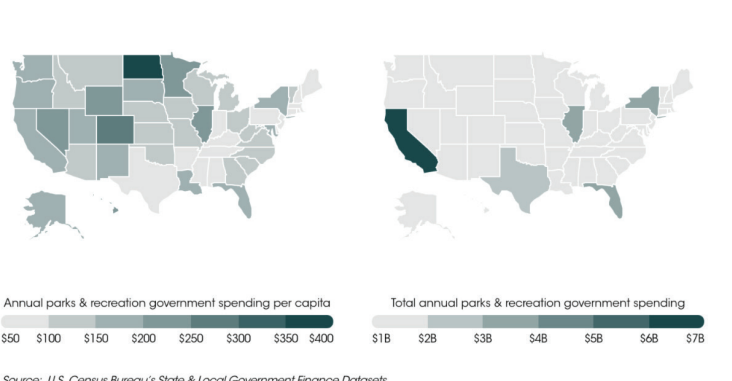
These factors may help parks fare better when it comes to government funding than they did after the Great Recession. Following the last recession, state and local revenues were decimated nationwide, and parks and recreation became a target for budgetary cutbacks in many jurisdictions. During this time, total state and local spending on parks fell from an all-time peak of \$48.5 billion in 2009 to \$39.9 billion in 2013 (in inflation-adjusted 2018 dollars). Spending has resumed an upward trajectory since—but still has not returned to pre-recession heights, after adjusting for inflation.

Currently, overall spending on parks and recreation is led by states with larger populations and greater economic ac-

tivity. California, Florida, New York, Illinois, and Texas are the biggest spenders, and they also represent the five largest economies and five of the top six largest populations. Per capita spending paints a different picture, as several states in the Midwest—including Illinois, North Dakota, and Minnesota—all rank among the top five in the country. Mountain states like Colorado, Nevada, and Wyoming also spend among the most per capita. For many of these leading states, investments in parks and recreation are an important tool for generating economic activity. Developing parks and recreational sites around the state's natural scenery helps bring in visitors—and dollars—to these states.

To find these locations, researchers at CLIQ analyzed data on state and local government finances from the U.S. Census Bureau and data

North Dakota leads in parks & recreation spending per capita, but California spends the most overall



on the outdoor recreation economy from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis. The researchers divided total parks and recreation spending in each state by the state's population to rank the states with the highest spending per capita. The research team also gathered data on outdoor recreation's economic effects, including the share of state GDP and the share of total state employment.

The analysis found that jobs in parks and recreation account for 2.4% of total employment in California. Each year, California invests about \$6.8B into its parks and recreation areas, which amounts to \$173 per resident. **Out of all states, California is spending the 13th most on parks and recreation.** Here is a summary of the data for California:

**Annual parks & recreation government spending per capita: \$173**

**Total annual parks & recreation government spending: \$6,829,549,000**

**Outdoor recreation share of state GDP: 1.8%**

**Outdoor recreation share of total employment: 2.4%**

For reference, here are the statistics for the entire United States:

**Annual parks & recreation government spending per capita: \$139**

**Total annual parks & recreation government spending: \$45,767,313,000**

**Outdoor recreation share of state GDP: 2.1%**

**Outdoor recreation share of total employment: 2.5%**

Director Tanya N. Garfield of the U.S. Small Business Administration's Disaster Field Operations Center-West reminded California small businesses of the July 16, 2021, deadline to apply for an SBA federal disaster loan for economic injury caused by wildfires that occurred Sept. 4 - Nov. 17, 2020.

According to Garfield, small nonfarm businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private nonprofit organizations of any size may apply for Economic Injury Disaster Loans of up

to \$2 million to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. "Economic Injury Disaster Loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that cannot be paid because of the disaster's impact. Economic injury assistance is available regardless of whether the applicant suffered any property damage," Garfield said.

These low-interest federal disaster loans are available in the counties below:



California counties: Del Norte, Fresno, Glenn, Humboldt, Imperial, Inyo, Kern,

Kings, Lake, Lassen, Los Angeles, Madera, Marin, Mariposa, Mendocino, Merced, Modoc, Mono, Monterey, Napa, Orange, Plumas, Riverside, San Benito, San Bernardino, San Diego, Shasta, Siskiyou, Solano, Sonoma, Tehama, Trinity, Tulare, Tuolumne, Ventura and Yolo.

The interest is 3 percent for businesses and 2.75 percent for private nonprofit organizations with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition.

ditional disaster assistance information and download applications at <https://disasterloanassistance.sba.gov/>. climbed the tree next to my folks’ garage, sat on the roof and lit it. Blegh. No filter. Icky stuff on your tongue. Undaunted, we scrounged a butt-with-filter from beneath a hedge. Ugh, ugh, triple ugh. MENTHOL! AW-FUL!!!

Well, the short version after that is a brief fling with cigarettes in junior high, trying to look like movie stars of the day. None in high school. Took it up again when I was waitressing. Smoking was ‘what you did’ when you were on your break.

By my TV News years, I was buying Winston’s by the carton. And smoking two-and-a-half packs a day.

I get it that it’s hard to quit that kind of habit.

When a non-smoking boyfriend wanted me to quit, I switched to Winston Lights. He said he’d take me to Acapulco if I quit completely. Hmm.

I tossed the carton, but took one pack.

In Acapulco, I learned two things. Dispirited horses on the beach made me so sad and I would never, ever ride one. And, I was done with smoking.

Here’s how I did it.

Each time I wanted a cigarette, I told myself I could have one ... in three minutes. Oh, boy, did I watch the clock! By the time I was back in Denver, that pack was pretty ragged. The seal and cellophane were gone. The foil was ripped. But, I hadn’t had one. I’d upped my ‘wait’ time to an hour. By the third week, all 20 cigarettes still in the pack, I threw it away.

Habituated behaviors. That’s what’s tough. But you can change those, too.

I used to keep a cute green glass ashtray next to my desk in Denver. Back from a story – at first I had trouble getting started. My habit was to light a cigarette and THEN start writing.

The boyfriend (also a reporter/anchor) sat at

the desk next to me. A few weeks after we returned from Acapulco, he gave me skis for my birthday – and informed me he ‘needed’ to go to Detroit to see if he was ‘over’ his ex-girlfriend.

The news director told me yes, I could move my desk.

So. EX-boyfriend. But I credit him for 1) getting me to quit smoking and 2) having procedures done that, I’m convinced, resulted in my one and only baby.

Mom told me she’d had a dream and woke up crying, “I dreamed you started smoking again.” I said, “Don’t worry mom, I never will.”

It took eight years, if you can believe it, to find cigarettes disgusting. Now, nearly 40 years since I quit, the desire’s gone. Completely.

So if you believe the myth that getting vaccinated could mean no babies and you want to someday be a parent – and yet, you smoke – stop now. If I can do it, you can.

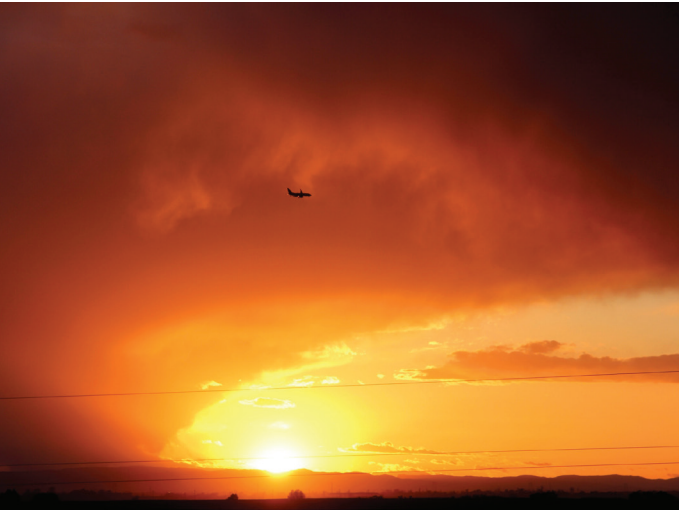
