County Offers Permit Fee Waiver for Restaurants, Bars, and Bakeries

In an ongoing effort to support local businesses, Yolo County is launching a restaurant fee waiver program to assist West Sacramento businesses impacted by the coronavirus pandemic.

To apply for the fee waiver, businesses must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- The business is a permitted business by the Yolo County Environmental Health Division that has or will pay fees for permit renewal for the period of July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021.
- The business is permitted or will renew their permit as a restaurant, bar, restaurant/bar combination, or bakery.
- The business was previously permitted and is not a newly permitted business (permitted in the prior year of July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020).

The business has experienced a revenue loss associated with COVID-19 which is greater than 25% of gross revenues.

Businesses that have already paid fees between July 1, 2020 to January 31, 2021 are eligible to apply for a refund.

The program is available for applications through June 30, 2021.

Yolo County Adds New Phone Line to Simplify Residents' Access to Local Assistance Programs

The Yolo County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) has launched a new, consolidated phone line designed to simplify access to HHSA's many programs for residents. The toll-free phone line is available in English, Spanish and Russian and can be reached by dialing 1-833-744-HHSA (1-833-744-4472) with automated transfer options available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The new number provides quick and easy access to services for callers who do not know how to reach the programs or services directly. Implementing this central phone number is a step towards building a "no wrong door" approach and ensuring barrier-free access to HHSA's services. Direct phone numbers remain active and callers may continue to use those

GALT Husband and Wife Convicted of Auto Insurance Fraud

Yolo County District Attorney's Office Press Release

Galt husband and wife, Lovepreet and Parwinder Randhawa, were convicted of filing a fraudulent auto insurance claim.

In February 2018, Officers with California Highway Patrol conducted an investigation into a collision which occurred on Interstate 80 in Yolo County. Throughout the course of their investigation, it was determined the at-fault driver provided false information regarding his true identity. CHP determined the true identity of the driver who caused the collision had been Lovepreet Randhawa.

Lovepreet and his wife Parwinder subsequently filed a claim with Mercury Insurance for the damages sustained to their vehicle.

The Yolo County District Attorney's Office Auto Insurance Fraud Division provided assistance on follow-up investigation into the claim filed by the Randhawa's to Mercury Insurance. The DA's Office believed the Randhawa's committed insurance fraud when they reported the identity theft victim had been the person operating their vehicle when in fact Lovepreet had been the driver at the time of the collision.

They've had tough lives, a lot of them. The son of one told me years ago that his mom, while living in the Ukraine,

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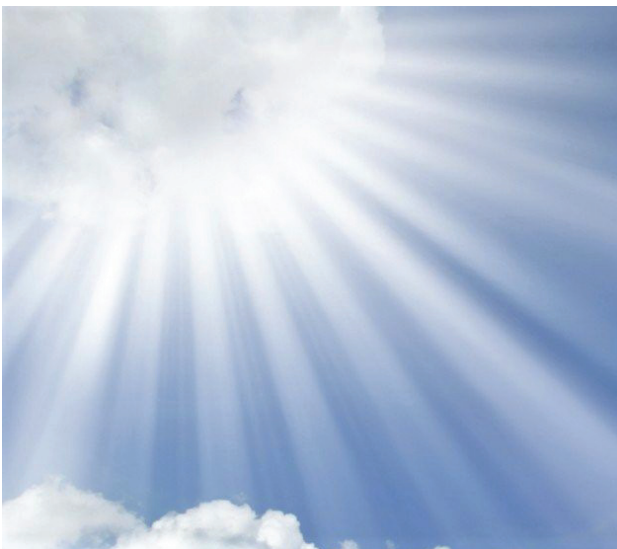

Bob Reynolds

Robert (Bob) Reynolds passed away peacefully at his home in West Sacramento, CA on March 24, 2021. He was born in Glendive, Montana on August 7, 1931 to Frank and Ottellia Reynolds (Klarmann). His father Frank arrived in Glendive, Montana in 1909 with his nine siblings and mother Katherine Reynolds on an immigrant train. Frank decided to go into the grocery business and in 1925 opened the first “Reynolds Market” in Glendive. This grew into five stores throughout eastern Montana that are still thriving today under the leadership of his grandchildren. Frank, through example, taught his six children the importance of a strong work eth-



ic which Bob carried with him his entire life. Bob was a devoted son, father, grandfather, and great grandfather whose honesty, integrity and kindness set an example for the large family that he raised. He had a strong upbringing with his steadfast parents and five siblings. He went to Catholic grade school, high school and college and graduated from Creighton University with a de-

gree in pharmacy in 1954. He married Ann Bitter, a charismatic and beautiful woman in 1956. They lived happily together for 59 years raising five children until Ann passed away in 2015. Bob served in the United States Army from 1954-1955. He was fond of his days serving our country and would often tell stories about being assigned to the dispensary in Puerto Rico with his newly acquired pharmacy degree. He enjoyed developing personally crafted treatments for the ills of his fellow soldiers. He would often say, with a smile on his face, how he had to “sweat it out in Puerto Rico” for his country. Bob and Ann moved to Glendive in 1956 immediately after getting married. They lived there for seven years before moving to Napa, where they lived for two years. They then

moved to West Sacramento where they purchased Frontier Drug, which they owned and operated for 16 years. As the owner of Frontier Drug, in what was then the small town of West Sacramento, Bob became close to many of its residents. He was particularly devoted to his customers and often extended credit to many that he knew could never pay him, but understood their wellness depended upon access to the medicine that he could provide. Bob Reynolds was exceedingly generous. Bob and his wife Ann raised five rambunctious children whose constant flow of friends kept them busy and multiplied the size of the large family as all of his children’s friends were considered part of the family. Bob and Ann sent all five of their children to private Catholic grade school, high school and sent their three daugh-

ters to private Catholic college. The enormous tuition strained the Reynolds family finances considerably, but Bob was a strong believer in education and an even stronger believer in providing a solid foundation for his children to succeed. He was also the primary caregiver to his wife in her final years where he worked tirelessly to ensure she lived comfortably before passing in 2015. Bob had many hobbies. He played tennis for more than 40 years including up until his mid-80s. He got all his children to play and helped form a group of players that still play every Sunday. He also loved downhill skiing which he did on numerous occasions with his children. He was a talented woodworker building clocks, tables, planters, inlaid wood designs and much more in his incredibly well-appointed (some

would say overcrowded) workshop. He enjoyed photography, craps, wine, food, gadgets, following the stock market and telling jokes and stories. He always complained that he never had enough time to get everything done. Bob is survived by his sister Marilyn Hoffman, brother Richard Reynolds, daughters Kathy Owens (Cy), Linda Reynolds and Laura Alves (John), sons Kerry Reynolds (Kendra) and Patrick Reynolds (Amy), grandchildren Alana (Carl), Courtney, Rhett (Melissa), Nicole (Tony), Kyle, Katie, Hanna, Mariah, and Cooper, and great-grandchildren Lexi, Rylee, Nollie, Kylie, Nate, Ella, Brynlee, Stetson, and Abram. A celebration of life will be held in the future when gatherings are allowed. Donations in his name can be given to Yolo Hospice.

On February 18, 2021, the Honorable Judge David Rosenberg sentenced Parwinder Randhawa to a misdemeanor violation of filing a fraudulent auto insurance claim and was placed on one-year probation.

On March 4, 2021, the Honorable Judge David Rosenberg ordered Lovepreet Randhawa to

serve a split sentence of two years in local prison. Lovepreet and Parwinder Randhawa were ordered to pay over \$40,000 in restitution.

Insurance Fraud is the second costliest white-collar crime in America behind tax evasion. Insurance industry studies show that about ten percent or more of property/casualty claims are fraudulent. Add it all up and insurance fraud costs Americans billions of dollars each year. District Attorney Jeff Reisig stated that, "Filing false insurance claims and

insurance fraud have an effect on the rising cost of auto insurance for everyone. We are committed to investigating and prosecuting this type of fraud in our community."

The Advisory Redistricting Commission, in accordance with applicable state and federal statutes, will conduct the 2021 redistricting outreach on behalf the Board of Supervisors, and will draft and present supervisorial district maps for the Board's consideration.

The Committee is comprised of seven members, one person from each of the five districts appointed by that corresponding Board Supervisor and two appointed by those initial five members. Applications will be accepted through May 7. To apply for the Redistricting

District boundaries for federal, state and local elected offices are redrawn to reflect new population growths and equalize district populations.

The 2021 Yolo County Fair will not run as planned and will not be open to the public.

When discussing plans for the fair, CEO Vannucci, Fair Board & staff expressed concern for public health, as well as the financial impact of hosting a fair that would adhere to current safety protocols and the lasting impacts of the long-term sustainability of the event.

Although vaccination rates are improving significantly each day, California continues to fight the battle against COVID-19 including the new variants. Where we are today in this struggle makes it difficult to plan a large-scale entertainment event like the free gate Yolo County Fair, especially not knowing where we will be, or what Yolo County and the State of California will look like, in August.

In addition, the important safety practices that have been put in place to protect Californians, including indoor seating capacities, live events seating capacities, proof of testing or vaccines, and other restrictions may lead to attendance that is considerably lower than previous years. The financial im-

plications of hosting a typical Yolo County Fair with the same overhead costs as previous years, but far less revenue, could be devastating to our association. In a typical year, the Yolo County Fair's budget is designed to break even or have a nominal profit. Holding a full fair this year would likely lead to significant financial loss.

While we wish we had the ability to see the future we do not. Taking all the above into consideration CEO Vannucci, the Board of Directors and fair staff feel that the best decision is to greatly limit the traditional aspects of the Yolo County Fair. While this is a difficult decision, we feel it is the best way to protect the long-term sustainability of the Yolo County Fair, as well as the safety of those involved.

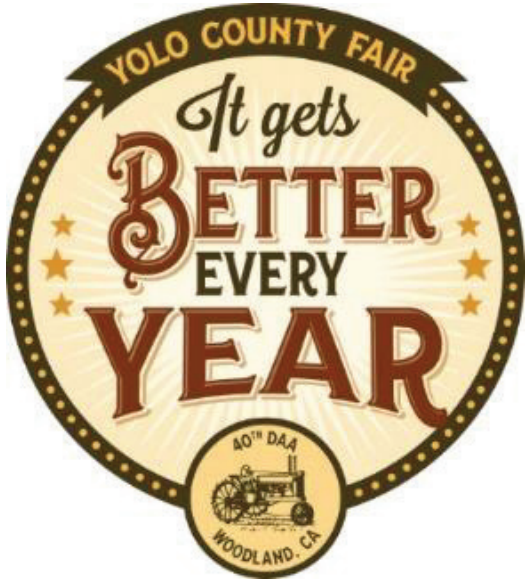
The 2021 Yolo County Fair will be limited to FFA Market Animal exhibitors and their family members for a week-long event that will culminate with a Live Auction on Saturday August 21st.

We fully plan on bringing back the full Yolo County Fair in 2022, with its carnival rides, the 2-night demolition derby, the ro-

deo, entertainment, food vendors including local beer booths, livestock shows and all the homegrown exhibits you have come to expect.

watched thugs beat to death her husband right in front of her. She is sweet, she’s funny, almost always smiling – except the day she told me, in tears, her sister’s family – still in the Ukraine – just sold their last cow. And now, had no food. No money.

The big Russian Baptist Church, corner of Sac Ave. and Kegle, sponsors people like Masha and others who seek the safety of America. My friend, Matrina, has taken me to church with her there. Her son directs the choirs. If you’ve never been, you ought to go. It’s like hearing the Mormon Tabernacle Choir.

Since I moved into this complex (2008), a great many of these refugees have lost their husbands. Matrina, for example, who gardened next to me, lost Nikolai. She became so frail it made me sad to hug her. A few weeks ago, Masha told me Matrina moved out and is living with her son now.

That’s the downside to senior housing. All too often, your favorites die. And even though I know these lovely souls are

now with God, I mourn and miss them.

Initially, with the language barrier, we barely more than nodded at each other in the garden. But then one evening, I joined Nina, my downstairs neighbor, on the garden benches. Somehow, we managed to tell each other about grandchildren (hers) and one son (mine). Now, I know a smattering of Russian, she knows a little English, and we love each other.

One afternoon, returning from the garden, I gave two of my roses to her friendly husband, Genady, who we called Genna.

He looked puzzled. I grinned and said, “For Nina.” “Oh!,” he said, and dropped a little curtsy. So cute, the both of them.

Nina lost Genna to throat cancer a few years ago. We cried together. A church van picked up their Russian friends, and me. Together, we went to the funeral.

It’s sad, how much mistrust and misunderstanding there is in the world. A friend in Rotary is married to a lovely, kind, friendly woman from Iran. Asked, “What is the biggest misconception people here have about Iran?”

hee said, “They mistake the government for the people.”

So, my worldview is: Expect the best of people and credit them with the values you relate to. They love their children. Things make them laugh. They’ll help you if you need them.

Genady was the first to teach me a little Russian. A decade or more ago he saw me walking my newly acquired dog. Pointing, he exclaimed, “Saba-ka!” “Dog?” I said. “Sabatchka (little dog),” he answered, smiling.

At my complex, no one tells me “I don’t speak English” anymore. If we get stuck, we pantomime. Suspicion gone, we’re all just people, more alike than different. My friend, Lydia, from Belarus, stuck an Easter/Happy Spring card in my door. From my balcony, giving up on the Lighthouse traffic noise when I saw her walking; I pantomimed a small square, pointed to my heart and told her thank you.

So, I’ll brace myself for sad news, if any, in the garden. If, when I ask, about the missing, the others point toward the sky, I’ll know they mean: “Gone home,” and wish that I could hug them. Camaraderie
