Discovery Preschool responds to COVID with success

This year, many of alumni of Discovery Preschool were struggling with virtual learning. Many families explained the jump from preschool to virtual learning left their child uninspired and unhappy. Hearing that their former students were struggling in what should be one of the most exciting years of their academic career, led Discovery Preschool to act. They formed a combination class offering Kindergartners an opportunity to return to in-person school.

They opened this new class in January, and the results as seen on the smiling faces of the children, reinforces that this class was needed. During the first week, one child cried because he was having so much fun that he did not want to go home. A little bit of creativity and flexibility have brought



happiness, joy and a sense of normalcy during these uncertain times.

As we navigate a new way of teaching during the COVID-19 crisis, Discovery Preschool has reimaged their large outdoor space to bring the classroom outdoors. Any-

thing they teach indoors can be taught outdoors, which greatly reduces the spread of COVID. They offer hands-on, play-based approach to learning while helping to grow a child's cognitive understanding of numbers, shapes, colors, and the alphabet.

Discovery Preschool is a school-year program, beginning in late August and finishing in early June. Families sign their children up for one month sessions beginning in August, with priority registration for participants who are currently enrolled

in the program. Fees will vary according to the number of class meetings each session.

The program offers two classes:

Kinder Kids for ages 4-5 attend class on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.

Tiny Tots for ages 2.9-3 attend class on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

AM class 8-10:30 am & PM class 11:30 am-2:00 pm.

All students must be potty trained and registered by their legal guardian. For information about registration, program content and activities, call (916) 371-1344.

Over 628 New Crimes Committed by Individuals Released on \$0 Bail

Over 40% of those released on \$0 Bail have reoffended at least once

As a result of Yolo County Superior Court's continued use of \$0 bail, over 628 new crimes have been committed. In April of 2020, the California Judicial Council imposed the "\$0" Emergency Bail Schedule in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Although rescinded in June of 2020, the Yolo County Superior Court continues to use the Emergency Bail Schedule. Court officials indicated the Emergency Bail Schedule will remain in effect until the pandemic ends.

Since April 13, 2020, 464 individuals have been arrested and released on \$0 bail a total of 583 times, with some benefiting on multiple occasions.

The individuals who have reoffended since their release on \$0 bail in Yolo County have committed over 628 new crimes in Yolo County alone. Those new crimes include 256 felonies and 372 misdemeanors, including crimes such as Attempted Murder (2 new victims), Assault with a Deadly Weapon or Assault by Means of Force Likely to Product Great Bodily Injury (18 new victims), Robbery (10 new victims), Burglary (39 new victims), felony domestic violence (12 new victims), possession of an assault weapon, gang crimes, and dozens of other new felony and

Now Accepting Applications for Measure Z Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee

WUSD encourages West Sacramento residents of all neighborhoods to consider applying for the Measure Z Citizens Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC).

On November 3, 2020, the voters of West Sacramento authorized Measure Z, which passed with 60.93% approval and issued \$150,000,000 in General Obligation (GO) Bonds for school facilities improvements and construction and modernization.

An essential requirement in managing a GO Bond includes the establishment of a

CBOC. The CBOC is composed of citizens within the District boundaries. The priority objectives of any CBOC include reviewing the expenditures and practices of Bond funded projects.

Applications must be received by the District no later than February 26, 2021.

What is the Role of a Citizens Bond Oversight?

- Taxpayers directly participate in the oversight of bond expenditures.
- Alert the public to any waste or improper expenditure of

school construction bond money.

- Actively review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction.
- Ensuring that bond revenues are expended only for the purposes described in the bond language.
- Ensuring that no funds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other school operating expenses.



Requirements:

- Minimum term of two years.
- Serving no more than three consecutive terms.
- Resident within the voting boundaries of Washington Unified School District.
- Employees of WUSD are restricted from Committee Membership per Strict
- Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 [15264 - 15288].
- One member shall be active in a business organization representing the business community located within the school district or community college district.
- One member shall be active in a senior citizens' organization.
- One member shall be active in a bona fide taxpayers' organization.
- One member shall be the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district.
- One member shall be both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district and active in a parent-teacher organization, such as the Parent Teacher Association or school site council.

Although any resident within the voting boundaries may apply, the following roles are mandated to be included within Committee membership:

Yolo County Public Health Officer is optimistic about vaccine increases

Yolo County is still in the purple tier and is expected to remain here for a few days. As of last week, Yolo County has administered 26,000 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, according to an update from Yolo County Public Health Officer Aimee Sisson. The most recent clinic was held at River Cats Sutter Health Park, where more than 1,000 doses were administered.

Sisson is cautiously optimistic about an increase in the volume of getting the vaccine. The way that the vaccines are dispersed will soon be changing. The state has contracted through a 3rd party company to handle the sign-ups for the vaccine. With this new system, the county should start having about a three-week advanced notice of when and how many vaccines we will receive. This will aid tremendously in coordinating vaccination events. In addition, Yolo County will be setting up a "My Turn" portal where community members will be

able to register for vaccinations. This portal is expected to help manage registration for the larger vaccination events. The My Turn portal is expected to go up this week. Oscar said "Hopefully going forward it will get a little bit better, a little more smooth, for those of us that want to get vaccinated in the next couple of months."

Yolo County Health and Human Service Agency is looking for volunteers who are interested in helping with future vaccination clinics. Volunteers will assist with set up; takedown, registration, screening, vaccination, traffic control, translation, medical observation, and overall management of the vaccination clinics. Anyone who is at least 16 years old can volunteer and Community Service Certificates will be issued for all volunteers. If you are interested in volunteering, it is recommended that you complete the "Medical Points or Dispensing" (MPOD) course at <http://yolopod-classes.org>. Once completed, you will be given

the option to submit a volunteer application to Yolo County. For questions about volunteering, contact the Yolo County volunteer coordinator at volunteer.coordinator@yolocounty.org. Currently, you can receive notice of when you may be eligible to receive the vaccination by filling out a "vaccine interest form". They are available in English, Spanish and Russian. These can be found on the Yolo County website. However, once the My Turn portal is up and running, the portal will be the simpler and more efficient way to do this. For more information about Yolo County's COVID-19 vaccine and distribution process, visit <https://www.yolocounty.org/coronavirus-vaccine>. Residents can call Yolo 2-1-1 for resource information.

In addition to the vaccine information, the county supervisors discussed that the census data has been received. Oscar thanked everyone in our county who participated in the census. He explained how important it is to have accurate data

to receive our county's portion of federal dollars. It also helps in the process to draw boundary lines according to population. This process is done every ten years and it is done for voting, among other things. The census data showed that in the last ten years Yolo County has increased in population by 20,000 people. West Sacramento has grown by 5,000 people. This is important information when it comes to items such as funding and vaccines!

Oscar also announced that Yolo County has joined a Universal Basic Income pilot project. In this program, we will be partnering with state funds that are available under the CalWorks housing support program to help folks that are living below the poverty level "get a better threshold" over the next year to year and a half. The county is hoping to help people and to learn more about what it is going to take to get people "in a better space". More information about this program will soon be available.



THE GOOD EARTH: Farms and Fields from California to Cape Town Opens at Gallery 625

Drawing on travels abroad and locally, artist Margaret Eldred explores farming in all of its phases with paintings, photographs, drawings, and photographs in THE GOOD EARTH: Farms and Fields from California to Cape Town. The new exhibition is on view at YoloArts Gallery 625 in Woodland.

Eldred is a Davis resident and a retired lecturer from UC Davis, where she earned a PhD in English. She studied art at Sacramento City College in the classes of

Chris Daubert, Frank Zamora, and Gioia Fonda.

Described by YoloArts creative director, Janice Purnell, as “kind of like a visual travelogue” THE GOOD EARTH: Farms and Fields from California to Cape Town has six thematic sections: Date Orchards, Nut Orchards, Olive Orchards, Row Crops, Rice, and Field Crops, accompanied by paintings and pen and ink drawings for each theme.

“I aim to do two things in my paintings - I strive to celebrate modern agriculture in

all its nuances from planting and irrigating to harvesting and preparing for market and I enjoy playing around with color. You can see how my palette has changed from a focus on primary colors-- red, blue, and yellow -- in my earlier work, to more realistic colors in the middle ones, to greater freedom in my more recent paintings,” Eldred shares in her artist statement.

Eldred’s artwork uses a vibrant color palette to represent farming – from planting, irrigating, harvesting, processing - in many cultures.

Accompanying Eldred’s paintings, photographs, and drawings are recollections of her experiences with the men and women who work in the fields around the globe, producing the world’s food.

“Margaret’s personal accounts and observations on farming add layers of meaning to her art,” said Purnell. “She also helps us understand farming practices in Yolo County by comparing them to those in other lands.”

THE GOOD EARTH: Farms and Fields from California to Cape Town runs

through March 30 at Gallery 625, located at 625 Court Street in Woodland, in Yolo County’s Erwin Meier Administration building. The gallery is open Monday - Friday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Public health guidelines for physical distancing and the use of face coverings are required.

First-of-its-kind health clinic for foster children opens in Sacramento

Clinic is a joint partnership between UC Davis Health and Sacramento County Health Center

UC Davis Health has partnered with the Sacramento County Health Center to open a first-of-its-kind clinic in Sacramento to provide medical care for children in the foster care system.

Located in the Sacramento County Health Center, it's called the CIRCLE clinic, which stands for Comprehensive Integration of Resilience into Child Life Experiences. The clinic opened last November at 4600 Broadway.

The Sacramento County Health Center is a Federally Qualified Health Center that provides primary care and behavioral health services to low income residents of Sacramento County.

The purpose of the CIRCLE clinic is to:

- offer a medical home for the children and adolescents of Sacramento County involved in child welfare
- offer primary pediatric care from UC Davis pediatricians

- coordinate specialty care
- coordinate and provide mental health services in partnership with the UC Davis CAARE Center
- screen and refer for any behavior and developmental concerns in partnership with providers at the UC Davis MIND Institute
- connect the child and family with appropriate resources in the community
- offer appropriate follow-up and communication to close the loop with child welfare providers

tion to close the loop with child welfare providers

"The key part of this model is to provide care coordination, not only with child welfare but also with those involved in the child's life in a child-centered manner. We have integrated general pediatricians, mental care professionals, behavioral therapists and child psychiatrists, along with public health nurses and the county's child welfare," said UC Davis volunteer clinical faculty member and pediatrician Katy Carlsen, who has helped spearhead these efforts and donated funds to make this clinic possible. A UC Davis endowment has also been established to generate funds.

UC Davis pediatrician Albina Gogo has been part of a workgroup for the past three years to create this clinic and works there part time.

"Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), including being in the foster care system, can create trauma and impact the health and wellbeing of children. The CIRCLE clinic provides comprehensive, trauma-informed, culturally-sensitive health care to help instill resilience into these children's lives, resulting in better long-term health outcomes and more stable foster home placements," Gogo said.

So far, the team has seen about a dozen pediatric patients.

"I was super excited when I heard about it," said Monica Foote, a former foster child who is now a foster parent, who came to the clinic for the first time this month. "I experienced a lot of trauma in the system and it did affect my physical health. I'm glad that there is a clinic like this. It's really touched my heart."

timing, lifting the stay home order right before the Superbowl. Good grief. Or, for the stupid and unlucky, maybe just plain grief.

Seriously, I don't get it. Why on earth, when there are vaccines now, has the roll out been so slow? And, once rolled, why aren't more people clamoring for the shots???

I, myself, am one shot shy of Moderna's protocol that promises up to 95 percent protection from not just Covid 19, but at least one mutation, maybe more. I got shot #1 Feb. 4 at Salud Clinic in West Sac. When the county sent out its Covid vaccine questionnaire, I was quick to fill it out. The questionnaire includes the option of adding comments. I added my age (72 March 9) and underlying health conditions: diabetes, high blood pressure, cancer - each of which puts me at more risk of fatal complications. To say

I've been ... worried ... this past year would be an understatement.

Can you believe some healthcare workers have to be **bribed** (paid \$500) to get the shots?? Fully a third, as of earlier this month, didn't want the vaccine. That third, I should add, did not include doctors or RNs who lined up fast.

In fairness, knowing the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines utilize a brand new technology (the first 'large scale' clinical test of 'efficacy' and side effects will be when 80 percent of us have had them); it's natural, I think, to be a wee bit leery.

I was.

But I'm far more leery of having my lungs destroyed by the Covid-19 virus. For almost a year now I've conscientiously worn a mask that has a filter, both of which are washed thoroughly on the rare occasions that I leave the house, as are my hands as soon as I get home.

I pay close attention to tape on floors and stay at LEAST six feet

away from other people. When someone crowds me, I turn so I don't face them. Far too many fail to use the mask correctly: covering both the mouth **and nose**.

Availing myself of any hand sanitizer offered, I wipe off cart handles often while I shop. And, after the groceries are in the backseat and trunk, I wipe off car door handles, my keys, purse handles, wallet and credit card. At home, I wash my hands as soon as I put down the bags, and again when everything's put away.

Never, not ever, not in a million years would I go to a 'get together' of any kind. Least of all, a Superbowl party with people I don't live with. What on earth was Newsom thinking?? Did he forget how the virus surged after Thanksgiving? Is he trying to pacify people who want a recall?

As I write this, just days after my first shot, I'm 55-60 percent safer than before I got it. Some who get

it have reported 'moderate' side effects. I had a sore arm for a couple nights. Aside from that, nothing major. No headache. No fever.

I've read that side effects after the second shot can be worse as your 'anti-virus' antibodies gear up. Flu-like symptoms, is what I've read. I've had the 5-strain flu shot. Maybe that will help.

When the county called and said I could get the vaccine, I was surprised. They pointed to the answers on my vaccine survey. Experts are predicting a new virus surge sometime in March. ICU beds could fill up fast, as might morgues and refrigerated trucks. High risk seniors (I am one) may be in them.

With all that, you, I'm sure, can appreciate my antipathy toward anti-vaxxers, anti-maskers and virus-positives who host parties.

America could have a handle on this by fall, says Dr. Fauci, IF we all, or at least the majority of us, do our part. Those who don't are

selfish. Pure and simple. Masks for instance. Not wearing one, some insist, is their 'right' because they "don't want to."

Really. So why post speed limits? Or arrest drunk drivers? Because drivers with no regard for others might kill you, that's why.

As they say, "My 'right' to swing my arm ends at your nose." p.s. Case closed.

On Feb. 5, the Moderna vaccine became available to residents ages 65+ and up in Yolo County, by appointment only and depending on supply. (The vaccine VP Kamala Harris got was Moderna's.) misdemeanor crimes. Of those released on \$0 bail, 40.5% have reoffended at least one time, the highest percentage thus far during the \$0 bail period.

The Emergency Bail Schedule simply looks at the arresting offense and releases individuals on \$0 bail, even those on probation or parole, without conducting a risk assessment for dangerousness. Additionally, upon release on \$0 bail, offenders are given a court date 4-5 months in the future. This makes it nearly impossible to assess those individuals who are homeless, suffer from a substance use disorder, or from a serious mental illness in order to enroll them into one of the county's diversion programs such as mental health court or addiction intervention court.

The continued use of the Emergency Bail Schedule is determined by the Yolo County Superior Court and is solely within their discretion. Anyone with concerns about the ongoing use of the Emergency Bail Scheduled should contact the Yolo County Superior Court.
