## Elections are over and we're still one member short

Comprising five members, the West Sacramento City Council includes the Mayor and four council members. To fill a vacant seat, a council member is elected or re-elected into that seat. The term for being a council member is four years. Our council is set up so that two members come up for election at opposite times as the other two. When the four years of that member's term is up, they either leave that position vacant to be filled by someone elected, or they are re-elected and remain in that seat. Every two years, the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes are elected into the seats. This year Quirina Orozco was re-elected and Norma Alcala was elected into the seat that Babs Sandeen retired from. The remaining two seats were held by Martha Guerrero and Chris Ledesma.

Typically, if someone leaves the council before their four year term is up, an application process is held and the council members appoint a person to fill the forfeited seat. This person can then run to be elected into that seat at its next term. If Cabaldon would have won the Mayoral race, it would be business as usual. But this election is different for the West Sacramento city council. Martha Guerrero's council member's seat is empty. The question now is: did she forfeit her seat when she was elected Mayor, therefore opening it up to be filled by appointment through the application process? Or did she just change seats on the council, leaving her seat vacant by default? If vacant by default, should that seat be filled by the candi-

## Martha Guerrero sworn in as Mayor

The December 9th city council meeting was an emotional one. It was held in COVID standards, live-streamed over Zoom. The problem was that there were so many people trying to "tune in" that the system kept crashing. If you were able to connect to it at all, you were often kicked off by the system and had to start over. The city clerk worked tirelessly trying to keep the system up and running for everyone.

The beginning of the meeting was hosted by former mayor Christopher Cabaldon. Despite the technical difficulties,

Cabaldon and the city council, along with some top city officials, managed to bid farewell and good luck to Washington Unified School District Superintendent, Linda Luna, who is retiring after five years in her current position. Also, the council and city officials bid their good wishes to Babs Sandeen who retired from the Mayor pro-tem position after being on the city council since 2014. At the meeting, Babs presented Cabaldon with a proclamation recognizing him for the 24 years of service as West Sacramento's Mayor. She spoke of the ambitious vision the Mayor had for West Sacra-

mento as well as the very long list of innovative ideas and accomplishments toward the development that has brought us to the West Sacramento of today.

After the reading of the proclamation, a series of sincere, heartfelt, comments were made by each of the council members, as well as a few city officials. Their level of appreciation and respect was abundantly clear as they spoke of the true honor they felt from working with Cabaldon and thanked him for providing an inspirational and dynamic environment. Cabaldon then said he wasn't going to make a

long speech because the spotlight of the night should be the swear-in of Martha Guerrero. However, he did take a few minutes to talk about how incredibly proud he is of all of the people that he has worked with and all that they have accomplished over the years. He spoke of the "caliber of amazing people that he has had the honor to work with", and named just a few. He thanked the council for their recognition, but said he "really just wanted to thank West Sacramento for letting him live out his life's purpose."

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# OBITUARY

## Alfredo E. Villegas, Jr.

Born in Hidalgo del Parral, Chihuahua on November 7, 1941, passed peacefully on October 13, 2020, with his family at his side and his loving wife Sheila of 55 years giving him a final kiss as his heart took its final beat. He was a man of strong faith and is now in heaven no doubt keeping busy doing little odds and ends tidying up the place since he could never sit still. He was a wonderful father and our mother will tell you he was the best husband and provider anyone could ever ask for. The day he passed he was raking leaves throughout the neighborhood which he loved to do. He is survived by his wife Sheila



of 55 years, sister Carmen Allen, children Carolyn, Benny and Oscar (wife Katie) and grandchildren Elena, Alex and Vincent.

He loved seeing others enjoy themselves and he selflessly gave to anyone who needed it. Our earliest memories of his kindhearted nature was on Sundays after mass at the Cathedral when we walked along the K Street Mall he regularly

emptied his coin purse giving whatever he had to the homeless. If he liked you he would give you the shirt off of his back or the hat off his head.

He often spoke of his hometown of Hidalgo del Parral because it was a central part of the origins of the Mexican Revolution and the town where Pancho Villa was killed. He said the blood from the revolution ran thick in the town and its people. He feared no one and feared nothing - well, except for our mother.

After immigrating to the United States in the mid 1950s he settled in Bryte where his father had purchased a modest home on Bryte Avenue. He would later graduate from James Marshall High School.

When we were young he had a horrible motorcycle accident and our lives were changed forever. After waking

from a coma followed by years of recovery my mother never once gave up on him, but he never spoke of his accident. He would eventually go back to work at the Southern Pacific Railyards in Sacramento. He loved working for the railroad and never missed an opportunity to pull a double shift in Sacramento then Denver, Little Rock and back to Denver before retiring after 36 years. His career as a member of the International Brotherhood of Boilermakers included some memorable union membership meetings at the Turn Verein Hall. His role in keeping locomotives on the tracks was his pride and joy. He usually had plenty of earplugs, protective eyeglasses available and always practiced safety first. He took his craft very seriously and had a reputation in the shops

as someone who didn't appreciate anyone getting between him and his work.

He loved the Colorado Rockies, the Denver Broncos and his Sunday football betting cards from the bookies. He loved the flea markets but mostly talking to the vendors about their countries of origin. He loved his Motown music especially Diana Ross and any kind of Mexican music especially Lucha Villa. He loved country western or war movies especially if it starred Marlon Brando, Clint Eastwood, John Wayne, Telly Savalas, Charles Bronson, Lee Marvin, Gene Hackman, or any movie with Rachel Welch or Cantinflas. He loved his warm tea in the Winter and laughing at anything my uncle Jess would say. He loved showing us his collection of wrist-

watches and playing with tools in the garage. He especially loved listening to his collection of transistor radios and if he ever put his earpiece in it was time for you to stop talking.

He loved taking trips to Central City and Blackhawk Casinos in the Rocky Mountains and was an avid reader of Mexican and US history. He could give you intricate details of most wars. He always had the utmost respect and admiration for any military veterans. He was a man of very few words and never offered unsolicited advice but if you ever asked his opinion or for his advice you usually knew where he stood pretty quickly. In the future if we ever have any more question for him or need his advice we can already hear him saying, "Go ask your mother, she knows." He will be missed.

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## Op Ed:

# Proposition 19 – What You Need to Know

It has been just over two weeks since we certified the General Election in Yolo County, a function of my role as the Registrar of Voters for Yolo County. In my other role as the County Assessor, I find it my responsibility to inform Yolo County residents of one Proposition on the ballot that was passed by California voters that will greatly impact property tax assessments for certain taxpayers - Proposition 19.

Proposition 19, billed as "The Property Tax Transfers, Exemptions, and Revenue for Wildfire Agencies and Counties Amendment," passed with 51.1% of California voter approval in November. As a result, 2021 will see significant changes in property taxes assessed on certain personal residences. Typically, a property's assessed amount is set when the owner acquires the property, and can only increase by up to 2% a year, until the property is sold and reassessed at the market value. What does Prop. 19 mean for property tax transfers and exemptions? Individuals over the age of

55 and some other taxpayers will benefit from greater flexibility to transfer their existing residential property tax base to another home within the state. However, Proposition 19 also changes the exemptions for parents who want to transfer their properties to their children.

The key upcoming changes due to the passing of Proposition 19 are:

1. Eligible homeowners -- persons 55 years or older, those with severe disabilities, or individuals who have lost a home in a natural disaster -- may now transfer their tax basis to a new home anywhere within the State of California, including to a property of greater value. Previously eligible homeowners were limited to transfers within certain counties and to homes of the same or lesser market value.
2. Increases the number of times that eligible homeowners may transfer their base year tax assessments. After April 1, 2021, eligible homeowners will be

able to transfer their tax assessment up to three times (up from one allowable transfer previously).

3. Requires market-value reassessments for transferred properties that are not used as the child's or grandchild's principal residence.

To expand on # 3, Proposition 19 will considerably limit the availability of the parent-child exclusion for purposes of real estate tax assessments and will result in significant property-tax consequences. Prior to the passage of Proposition 19, parents could transfer a primary residence to children without the transfer resulting in a new fair market reassessment, regardless of how the children chose to use the real property. This allowed children to maintain the same property tax basis that their parents had. Additionally, any secondary property, such as a vacation home, rental property, or commercial property, with up to \$1 million of the assessed value could be

transferred while still maintaining the same property tax basis their parents had regardless of its use by the children. The same exemption applied to transfers from grandparents to grandchildren.

Beginning February 16, 2021; however, children or grandchildren who receive real property from their parents or grandparents may have to factor in increased property taxes in the decision to keep or sell the property. For example, if parents purchased a rental property in 1960 for \$70,000, and the market value of the rental property is \$700,000; when it is transferred to a child after February 16, 2021, and the child intends to continue to lease out the property, the parents' tax basis does not pass to the child. The child will now have to pay property taxes based on the assessed fair market value (\$700,000) which may affect the child's decision to keep the property or sell.

If these upcoming changes will affect your family, you might want to consider spending time this holiday season talking with family members about Proposition 19 and its potential impact to your family's financial planning efforts and if appropriate seek advice soon from a reputable tax advisor.

In addition, he wanted to thank West Sacramento for being his family, saying that the city always embraced him and helped him through hard times, and he is extremely proud of this city.

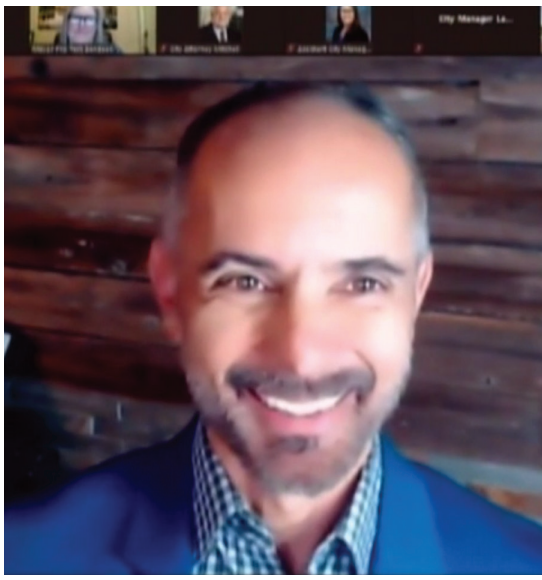

# West Sacramento artist spotlight: Dawn Greene

West Sacramento resident Dawn Greene never saw the world like a sighted person, but it was not until she was struggling in school that her vision was tested. It turned out she was brilliant, but needed vision correction.

With glasses, Dawn was successful in school and became a real estate agent in New York. At 30 years old, Dawn was told she had high pressure in her eyes, but was not concerned about managing it. She moved from New York to West Sacramento to be with her ailing mother. But when she lost her mother and beloved aunt within a year's time, the pressure escalated. Her left retina tore, almost completely detaching, and her right retina tore like a patch-work quilt.

Dawn managed to continue working in real estate and undergoing eye surgeries without telling anyone that she was losing her sight.

"I started compensating for the vision loss," Dawn said. "I would schedule clients earlier in the day or on weekends because I had trouble seeing at night. My lenses got thicker each year. When

it became harder to see houses, I would set up other agents to do walk-throughs and I would handle the phone calls."

But when she made a significant financial error and no longer felt safe driving, she decided it was time for a career change and found Society for the Blind.

"It was a relief when I no longer had to pretend I could see," she said. "I can't tell you how awesome it was for me to meet the people at Society for the Blind. You can feel the love as soon as you walk in there."

Dawn attended Society for the Blind's Senior IMPACT Project and Core program, where she

learned how to cook, stay mobile and use adaptive technology. On one of her days with the Senior IMPACT Project, she tried to walk down the stairs and nearly panicked.

"It looked like a slide with my vision," Dawn said. "One of my instructors immediately noticed and walked me through it. It was awesome and made me cry. I didn't have to say anything; she just knew. Society for the Blind is the most positive place I have ever been."

When the stay-at-home order hit, Dawn was especially grateful for what she had learned. "I'm really thankful for those lessons be-

cause not long after, we were locked down in the pandemic," Dawn said. "Before that class, all I would cook were sandwiches and salads. Without those skills, I think the stay-at-home order would have been a lot harder for me."

Dawn also visited a Low Vision Clinic that includes occupational therapy. There she discovered the tools she

needed to continue her lifelong love of painting. Dawn thought her vision loss would mean never painting again, but our Low Vision Clinic helped her acquire a lighted magnifying tool and lenses.

Just this summer, one of Dawn's paintings won a Juror's Award at a KVIE event – the juror had no idea Dawn was losing her vision.

"I took my time on that painting and wanted to get it right because in my mind I was thinking this might be the last painting I get to paint," Dawn said. "But I'm determined to keep painting. Painting is my true love. My mind still sees color, and I'm thankful for my wonk-ish vision that helps me create my art. I've already got another painting in mind."

a nursing home near my brother.

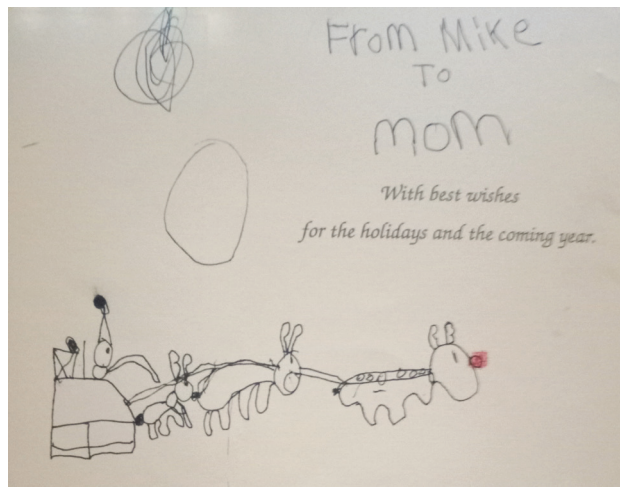

date with the next highest number of votes (this would be Dawnté Early-West), and then run for re-election in 2022?

Our current council is split on this topic. Quirina and Chris argue that because the election was so recent, the position should be filled by the voters' choice. Martha and Norma say that the person who came in third, lost the race and the seat should be opened up to the application process someone that may not have been able to afford the expense of running a campaign can have a chance. Furthermore, Martha says that the council represents the entire city, not just those that vote. However, all of the council members are in there because they were elected, and this election had the biggest turnout of voters in the history of West Sacramento.

It was suggested that a subcommittee be formed to help make this decision. However the subcommittee is Martha Guerrero and Chris Ledesma. So it's just one against one, instead of two against two? The ironic thing is that if a decision cannot be reached between opposing sides, a special election will be held in November of 2021 and the person will be elected anyway. This person will then have to go up for re-election in 2022. The city council is trying to have a decision by the beginning of January, so that if they go with the application process, a selection can be made by February. If that is not the case, then we can look forward to November.
