Clarksburg Lights feature nearly 100,000 lights and over an acre trees wrapped in lights

Clarksburg Lights does not disappoint. These photos are from one house located at 52607 Netherlands Ave. Bring any and all canned and packaged food items for the Yolo Food Bank to place in a bin at the front of their roundabout driveway. All proceeds go to the homeless and people who cannot afford food.

The front portion has over 100,000 lights, with a few themed lands (North Pole, Tree Central, O Holy Night, and the Whimsical Forest. Landscaped with over 100 trees all wrapped in lights, this is something you won't want to miss. The set-up takes close to 100 hours to set up. Lights turn on every night at 4:30 p.m. through New Years Eve. This year, they have added a 40-foot mega tree and lights all the way down the driveway — 650 feet long! Reservations not required.

WUSD Postpones Return of Students in Special Day Classes and Opportunity Academy

In an abundance of caution, Washington Unified School District is postponing the return of students in Special Day Classes (SDC) and the Opportunity Academy.

WUSD has experienced a concerning number of adults needing to quarantine due to exposure, positive results, and symptoms of COVID-19. The district decided that it's in the best interest of the health and safety of our students, families, staff, and the West Sacramento community not to return students for in-person instruction at this time.

WUSD will continue school in our virtual learning model. Any scheduled in-person assessments may continue as well.

This decision is a disappointment and frustration to many students and families, especially to those who planned to return this week to in-person instruction. WUSD has been working so hard to get to this point of returning small groups of students back to school because students learn best when they are in school with their teachers and staff. However, since Yolo County moved to the purple tier, cases of COVID-19 continue to rise. Some families with students in SDC classes have also contacted the schools to continue virtual learning until the winter break because of the current rise of COVID-19 cases in our city and county.

Through this part of the pandemic, the exposure rate and the quarantining processes are not in our control. However, it is possible to decrease the exposure rates by ensuring we do our part of wearing our masks, washing our hands frequently, and most importantly, staying home when experiencing symptoms or having been directly exposed to someone with COVID-19.

New Trail and Dog Park at Grasslands Regional Park Opens December 4

The Yolo County Parks Division is excited to announce the opening of a new 1.25 mile trail and dog park at Grasslands Regional Park, located at 30475 County Road 104 and approximately three miles south of the City of Davis. In 2017, the Yolo County Parks Division was awarded a \$107,000 grant from the California State Parks' Habitat Conservation Fund for construction of a new trail system, parking lot and associated site amenities. The County used other local funds for developing the dog park.

The new trail system is unique because it is a working landscape and will have views including: upland grasses and



patches of California poppy and other native wildflowers; glimpses of raptors like Swainson's hawk, white-tailed kite, northern harrier, and western burrowing owl; and grazing sheep in the trail system and throughout the park that help to manage the grasslands.

Sheep will normally disperse as you approach but visitors should still be able to catch sight of them. Dogs must always be kept on leashes within the trail system.

The new off-leash dog park, adjacent to the trail, is unlike any other in the region. The fenced dog park is approximately 10 acres of natural grasslands among rows of oak trees. As this is a natural environment, and not a manicured lawn like many other dog parks, the ground may be uneven in certain areas with holes due to ground squirrel activity. Visitors are advised to watch their step and keep an eye on their dog at all times.



In addition to the trail and dog park, new improvements at the park include: gravel parking lot and two paved ADA stalls; portable restroom unit; interpretive panel signs; 0.20 mile paved concrete path leading to the trailhead; shade structure with picnic tables; and benches along the trail. The new parking lot provides access to the trail and dog park and is located approximately .25 mile

south of where Tremont Road intersects with the main Grasslands Regional Park entrance on County Road 104. Some navigation programs or apps may not accurately display the park location. "Our team has been working hard on this project over the last several years," said General Services Director Kevin Yarris. "We are happy to be able to provide a new opportunity for

the public to safely recreate and enjoy the outdoors." Additional information about the project can be found on the Yolo County Parks website at: www.yoloparks.org. LOCATION: The project site is located along the west bank of the Sacramento River in the City of West Sacramento, Yolo County, California. The West Sacramento Area Flood Control Agency (WSAFCA) completed construction of 5.5 miles of levee improvements in 2018

as part of the Southport Sacramento River Early Implementation Project (Southport EIP), including constructing a setback levee along the northwestern edge of the project site. The Southport EIP created two new floodplain restoration areas connected to the Sacramento River, immediately upstream and downstream of the project site. Cross levees between the project site and the two floodplain restoration sites were built to preserve access to the Sacramento Yacht Club and the Sherwood Harbor Marina, which are located at the north and south ends of the project site, respectively. The remaining segment of the unmaintained levee along Chicory Loop runs through the project site, with the portion southeast of the levee encompassing the Sacramento Riverbank and associated riverside riparian habitat.

The project site is bounded by the Reclamation District (RD) 900 Operations and Maintenance (O&M) waterside toe road on the northwest edge, the Sacramento River on the southeast edge, and the property boundaries of the Sacramento Yacht Club and the Sherwood Harbor Marina southeast of the remnant levee along Chicory Loop.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The proposed project includes implementing ecosystem, water quality and recreational improvements at the Bees Lakes site consistent with the goals and objectives identified in the Final Bees Lakes Habitat Restoration Plan. Project site restoration includes focused removal and control of target invasive species at the project site. The goal of the invasive plant removal is to significantly decrease abundance of target invasive species and increase abundance of native understory species to improve and sustain native plant community health and diversity. The most prevalent target invasive species are: Himalayan blackberry, which occurs in large patches in portions of the riparian forest understory and in some monoculture patches; and edible fig (*Ficus carica*), which is scattered throughout the site, primarily on the riverside portion.

Water quality components include removing and disposing of potentially contaminated soil from the two ponds on the site, potentially treating the pond water, and the removal of trash from the ponds. An abandoned boat and a large amount of refuse

have been observed in the ponds, which are suspected to be degrading pond water quality. At minimum, project implementation would include drawing down pond water levels temporarily to extract large trash and debris.

The water quality components also include installing a submerged or floating aeration diffusion device to increase pond aeration and water circulation within the ponds, decrease algae growth, and increase habitat suitability for fishes and other aquatic life (including mosquito fish). An additional water quality enhancement, which would also provide habitat benefits, includes installing one or more artificial floating wetland islands in one or both of the site ponds.

The proposed project includes several public access and recreational components that are intended to improve access and management at the site and to provide improved recreational opportunities for site users. Potential recreational amenities include marked foot trails, elevated boardwalks, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) access ramps, an equestrian trail, a ten-stall parking area, portable bathrooms, two large viewing platforms, multi-purpose picnic/recreational areas, way-finding signage and information kiosks.

PUBLIC REVIEW: The review period for the Mitigated Negative Declaration begins on December 4, 2020 and ends on January 4, 2021. Volunteers Needed for City Commissions

City Commissions work directly with City staff in developing goals and advising the City Council on many issues. These Mayor-appointed positions are a great way to get involved in the West Sacramento community. Applications are being accepted through December 11, for service on various City Commissions for the 2021-2022 term.

Board/Commission Member Qualifications:

1. Each Member shall be a resident of the City;
2. With the exception of one member appointed to the Parks, Recreation & Intergenerational Services Commission, each Member shall be at least 18 years of age at the time of appointment;
3. No person shall be allowed to serve on more than one Board/

Commission at the same time; and
 4. With the exception of a part-time seasonal employee, a Member shall not be an officer or employee of the City.

Commissions: Arts, Culture & Historic Preservation Commission:

This commission evaluates and identifies needs in the area of cultural enrichment; the designation and inventory of historic resources; and the placement and use of art throughout the City.

Board of Appeals: These members review the workings and finances of the Fire Department hazardous materials program as well as provide interpretation pertaining to uniform codes and City ordinances. Membership preference is granted to those with backgrounds in architecture, civil engineering,

building trades, or fire protection.

Disaster Council: The Disaster Council meets at least once each year to review the emergency preparedness status of the City and reports their findings to the City Council.

Economic Development & Housing Commission:

The commission evaluates and identifies incentives and programs to promote economic development; marketing strategies; business retention and recruitment; community investment and development assistance; housing standards and affordability; homelessness; and the Community Development Block Grant policies and priorities

Environment & Utilities Commission: This commission evaluates and identifies tree preservation; habitat and natural communities conservation; William-

son Act easements; agricultural land conservation; open space; energy; water, wastewater, and stormwater services and usage; refuse, recycling, and solid waste services and usage; and telecommunications services and usage.

Library Advisory Board:

The Board acts in an advisory capacity to the County Board of Supervisors and the County Librarian and includes the review of library operations and services, budget policies, and programs ad priorities for the Yolo County Library. The Board is comprised of a representative from each Yolo County district, as well as one member from the Board of Supervisors.

Parks, Recreation & Intergenerational Services Commission:

This commission evaluates and identifies parks and related facilities and programs;

sports and active living programs; recreation and leisure programs; support for civic and community-based organizations; community services, including health and welfare concerns; adaptation of the full range of city plans, projects, programs and services to the needs of seniors and youth; plans for the provision of services targeted to the elderly, including recreation, leisure, housing, financial security, and mobility; plans for the provision of services targeted to youth; early learning and universal preschool.

Planning Commission:

This commission is a decision making body as designated by state law. Members are heavily involved in planning and zoning law, and land use policy.

Transportation, Mobility & Infrastructure Commission:

This commission evaluates

and identifies transportation planning; bicycle and pedestrian policies and facility planning; goods movement; charging and fueling infrastructure for electric, hydrogen, and other alternative fuel vehicles; public transit; ridesharing, transportation network services, and taxicabs; plans and standards for roads, bridges, and highways; and flood management infrastructure.
