Citizens Bond Oversight Committee Update Regarding Measure V 2014 Bond Initiative

The Citizens Bond Oversight Committee for Measure V met on Nov. 18 to review the annual audit of Measure V and receive updates of the expenditures to date of the final projects to Measure V.

Measure V was approved by the West Sacramento voting citizens in November 2014 to bring old facilities up to compliance and safety codes. Projects such as fire alarms, HVAC systems, new roofs, and compliant accessibility to the campuses were some of the upgrades made to all our school campuses through Measure V. In addition, modernization of two full campuses were made possible. The Bryte College & Career Train-

ing Center is where our Washington Middle College Charter High School and our Career Technical Education pathways for Culinary Arts, Agriculture, and Farm to Fork programs currently reside.

The Fallbrook Campus is still under construction for the current Westmore Oaks School to be moved for the opening of the 2021-2022 school year.

Recently, questions have been asked about overspending in the Fallbrook Campus construction budget. As of last month, the budget is not overspent. There still remains money as the construction projects continue.

State campus, a mountain lion was confirmed. The river, you know. Wildlife follows it.

Nonetheless, there are pluses to having an indoor/outdoor cat. Reduced need for a litter box, for one. Cats love to dig. They will happily fertilize your neighbor’s flower bed. And yours.

Also, they are great climbers and love to sharpen their claws on trees. A plus. It spares your couch.

And then, there’s this: Tired of bird seed scattered from a neighbor’s feeder? Suspect it may attract rats and mice? Cats will reduce the rodent population. Also little frogs and lizards. And, their favorite, birds.

I live on Lighthouse. From my balcony one morning, I saw a kitty from across the street start to cross from our side. I shrieked just before it got thunked by a speeding Honda. From two blocks away, I heard the thunk. The driver heard it, too, and stopped, but kitty ... startled but apparently not badly hurt ... streaked back home. It survived. I guess it’s why they say cats have nine lives.

Not all cats are as lucky.

At age 2, I learned that death was sad. We lived on a busy road in Olmsted Falls, a bedroom community near Cleveland. My mom’s cat was an indoor-outdoor cat. Mom and I, one day, were headed back to the garage to get the car. My eyes fixed on our front lawn, I stopped. “Mommy,” I said. “Nicky.”

Nicholas Needlefoot King of the Cats (named for my favorite children’s book) was halfway to the house from Bagley. One black foreleg outstretched toward the porch. His body still, not moving.

My mom ran to him. Gath-
ered him up. Cradling him to her chest; she was crying. I’d never seen my mommy cry before. Seeing my wide, frightened eyes; Mom shook off her grief. She told me, “Wait right here,” and took Nicky in the house. She came back out; we got in the car, and left. After a few minutes of silent driving, she said she’d placed Nicky in a shoebox. Nicky was dead, she said. A car had killed him. Crying again, she said, “When daddy gets home,” she said, “he’ll bury him.” I cried, too. Dead meant sad.

Cats are very determined animals. They like it outside. It’s their nature, having descended from jungle animals. I like the idea of catios.

Community Members Sought for Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council

The Yolo County Board of Supervisors is seeking community members to serve on the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, a multi-agency body

which is advisory to the Probation Department on a continuum of county-based responses to juvenile crime. The Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council

is chaired by the Chief Probation Officer and includes representatives from the Yolo County District Attorney’s Office, Public Defender’s Office, Sheriff’s Department, Board of Supervisors and Health & Human Services Agency, as well as representatives from a community-based drug and alcohol program, nonprofit community-based organizations providing services to minors, a city policy department and the Yolo County Office of Education.

The Board of Supervisors has recently added one community member position from each of the supervisorial districts to the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council. Qualifications to serve in these positions include: experience providing community-based youth services; youth justice advocates with expertise and knowledge of the juvenile justice system; or those that have been directly involved in the juvenile justice system.

“The Probation Department will benefit greatly from more public engagement on the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council as we have much to do in response to juvenile justice reform,” said Yolo County Chief Probation Officer Dan Fruchtenicht. “Increased community input on these matters will ensure that we continue to evolve our practices in a way that both benefits public safety in our communities and ensures our

youth thrive and avoid entering the adult criminal justice system.”

Community members interested in applying to serve on the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council can find an application at: www.yolocounty.org/general-government/board-of-supervisors/advisory-bodies. The Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council is expected to meet monthly in late 2020 and early 2021, and then quarterly going forward.

During leaf drop season (November 1st to January 31st) extra leaves may be placed next to your full organics cart in 30-gallon cans or in compostable bags (paper or ASTM D6400 rated) weighing no more than 50 pounds each.

Whatever you do, please do not place piles of leaves in front of your house on the street. They will not be picked up and could potentially clog storm drains and cause flooding issues in your neighborhood.

All customers will be required to wear a face covering before utilizing Landfill services and must physically distance from others. These measures are being implemented with the public's health in mind as well as for the health and safety of County workers. The Esparto Convenience Center is still closed to the public until further notice.
