

# West Sacramento family remembers KKK’s dynamite explosion on Baptist church in Birmingham

On Sept. 15, 1963, young Connis Chandler lived in Birmingham, Alabama. Connis had plans to ride with her friend Cynthia Wesley to the Baptist Church on 16th Street. They were going to go a little early so that they could help prepare the church for Sunday services. Cynthia’s dad had car problems so Cynthia got a ride and Connis didn’t make it to church as planned. Suddenly there was

a huge boom that could be heard for miles. The church that Connis was supposed to be at had just exploded. Four members of the Ku Klux Klan (KKK) had planted 19 sticks of dynamite, attached to a timing device, under the steps of the church. The explosion was so strong that it blew the windows out of a different church located several blocks away. Addie Mae Collins, Carole Robertson, Carol McNair and Cynthia Wesley were killed. In addition to

the four young girls that were killed, 14 to 22 people were injured. An investigation took place and in 1965 the FBI had concluded that the racially motivated bombing had been committed by four known Klansmen. Even though the FBI was sure about who com-

mitted this horrible crime, it wasn’t until 1977 when the government decided to prosecute cold cases from the Civil Rights Era, that Robert Chambliss was convicted of the first-degree murder of Carol McNair. Carol was only

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# New CHP officers to be sworn in amid pandemic

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) swore in 77 new officers during at a ceremony at the CHP Academy in West Sacramento on Friday, Oct. 30. Under normal circumstances, the CHP would have invited family, friends, CHP employees, and the media to attend and celebrate the tremendous accomplishment of these new officers. However, due to COVID-19, the cadets received their badges in a physically distant ceremony attended only by the cadets, CHP Executive Management, and essential Academy staff. The new officers begin their careers with more real-life experience than any other class. The CHP closed its live-in Academy in West Sacramento on March 20, 2020, and sent the seven women and 70 men of Cadet Training Class (CTC) III-19 on temporary work assignments in CHP Area offices near their residences. On September 14, 2020, all members of CTC III-19 returned to complete their training at the reopened Academy under enhanced health and safety measures.

Participants of these testing sites must be residents of Yolo County and will need to bring a document displaying their name and address, such as a driver's license, ID card, utility bill, or piece of mail. All ages are accepted. Spanish translation will be available at most, if not all, of the sites. There may be some delays in getting testing results. Registration is recommended in order to speed up the process but is not required and does not guarantee a test. When residents register online, they will not be able to select a time slot and will not receive a confirmation of receipt. Register at: <https://www.avellinocoronatest.com/patient>.

# State's OptumServe Site now in Woodland

In addition to these testing sites, the State of California's OptumServe site will be providing residents with additional COVID-19 testing when their site moves to the portable building next to the Juvenile Detention Facility, located at 2780 E. Gibson Road in Woodland, from November 3 - 28. Testing at the OptumServe site is free and open to all California residents, regardless of documentation status, and is by appointment only Tuesdays - Saturdays from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. All ages are welcome. If residents do not have health insurance, the cost of the test will be covered by the state. If residents have health insurance, their provider will be billed with no out of pocket cost to the resident. At both the State's Optum-Serve and Yolo County's testing sites, residents must wear a face covering and practice social distancing. None of these sites are drive-thru, so residents will need to park their car and walk a short distance to the testing building. 11 years old. It wasn't until nearly 25 years later that Thomas Edwin Jr. and Bobby Cherry were convicted. In 2001 and 2002, these two men were convicted of four counts of murder. The fourth bomber, Herman Frank Cash, died in 1994 and was never charged for his (alleged) crimes. The 16th Street Baptist Church bombing was reported to be the turning point in the Civil Rights Movement and contributed to Congress passing the Civil Rights Act of 1964. This tragedy didn't stop Connis. She didn't hide or slip away. She didn't let this devastating example of racism stop her. She grew to be a beautiful, strong and driven woman. Connis grew up and moved to Georgia where she met the love of her life, Thomas Kimball. Six months later, the two were mar-

ried. Connis became the first Black flight attendant in the South. Tom heard the calling of the Lord and joined the seminary. Together, they had four children. When Connis and Tom's children were still small, they relocated to California where Tom was needed in the Church. They arrived in the Bay Area. Over the years, they lived

family's lifestyle. A senior dog offers a lifetime of unconditional love to share with you and your family.

This program is intended to support essential workers and others who have lost their job or income; or had their educational or training program impacted as a direct result of COVID-19. Applications are due Thursday, November 5 at 11:59 p.m. at [hackerlab.org/pathways](http://hackerlab.org/pathways).

The program began after Hacker Lab CEO Gina Lujan donated leftover masks made by community members at Hacker Lab to an organization supporting farmworkers. That spawned conversations with community partners to create a program that supports career development, STEM exploration and the design challenge of prototyping masks for Sacramento communities.

“Our goal is to help people hurt by COVID-19,” said COO Eric Ullrich. “We have a great new program to introduce you to the Hacker Lab possibilities with a focus relevant to these times. Considering the conditions many workers are facing, the stipend should help people move forward.”

Students at Sacramento City College’s STEM Equity Success Initiative are about halfway through the PPE design curriculum led by Hacker Lab’s CTO Nile Mittow speaking about topics relating to the PPE needs unearthed during the pandemic as well as future guest speakers from those with PPE needs.

The program includes:

- \$1,000 stipend and two months of Hacker Lab access;
- 20 hours of training in PPE product innovation
- 10 hours per month (20 hours total) in online workshops and webinars
- 6 hours in-person training on Hacker Lab equipment
- A mix of online and in-person trainings on the following:
- PPE product innovation
- Prototyping and manufacturing equipment, e.g. 3D Printing and Laser Cutting
- Onboarding, mentorship, and check-ins with Hacker Lab staff to ensure participant Success; career readiness and business skills and a supportive network and community.

“Hacker Lab is running two no-cost programs this fall to help people create a new career, start a business, or enter college, and to make our space available to those who need it most,” said Michael Mott, coordinating the Pathways scholarship, the other offering participants can apply for.

While the two-month CARES program is focused on PPE education with a \$1,000 stipend over two months; participants can also apply for the 8-month Pathways scholarship for self-starter entrepreneurs.

“Participants build new careers, businesses or their next education level,” Mott continued. “This year Hacker Lab is offering tracks for individuals interested in entrepreneurship or exploring IoT and tech.

These programs wouldn’t be possible without CARES Act and the City of Sacramento as well as sponsorships by SMUD and Sutter Health. Kaiser Permanente is supporting Pathways scholarships as well. Thank you for helping communities in need during COVID-19 and making a stronger workforce!

Hacker Lab is also grateful to United Latinos, Latin Economic Council and the Sacramento Hispanic Chamber for their partnership and support, CEO Gina Lujan said.

teach me how to Zoom at their next Zoom date.

Whatever instructions they impart, I hope they impart them slowly. Maybe I'll write them down. If I remember where I put my pen.

Several articles related to Covid 'brain fog' were published in October. The New York Times reported: "Memory problems, dizziness or confusion were reported by a third or more respondents" in a post-infection survey. The Times went on, "... troubling cognitive symptoms ... can include memory loss, confusion, difficulty focusing, dizziness and grasping for everyday words." Symptoms, said one brain expert, that impair a Covid survivor's ability to work and function normally.

The expert in neuro-infectious disease said people can

be so disabled by Covid fog they can't work at all. What causes it? Covid inflammation of blood vessels leading to the brain, decreasing oxygen? Small strokes? Don't know. To date, MRI scans detect no brain damage.

Late last month, WebMD reported on a virus syndrome tagged as "long Covid". As the "long" suggests, sufferers display a range of symptoms for multiple weeks, not days. For 22 percent of those 70 or older, brain fog is one of those symptoms. Younger people are not exempt: For those ages 18-34, one in 10 appears to develop long Covid. The syndrome can include relapses and, in the younger victims, women are more at risk than men.

Medscape, a publication of the National Institutes of Health, on Oct. 20, published a Kaiser Health News article titled: "Older COVID Patients Battle 'Brain Fog,' Weakness, and Emotional Turmoil."

The gist is, severe Covid cases that put people in the hospital, on ventilators, are most at risk for Covid brain fog. Another trigger: isolation. Recent research has concluded prolonged isolation can change the structure of your brain!

So. Nuts. Do I stay locked up in my apartment except for shopping because I don't want to catch the virus? Is it already too late? I've lost interest in TV, haven't cracked the stack of books I got at Goodwill to get me through the lockdown. Do spend hours on the computer posting weather and other news I think will help people. But contact with human beings? No. Not much.

I worry about catching the virus. I also worry about being an a-symptomatic spreader. Recently, after not seeing me since Mother's Day, my son and his girlfriend made plans with me to go to Raku for sushi. It had just reopened for indoor dining.

I wanted to see them, but had just read how going out to eat is now linked to community spread of the virus. Plus, I wasn't feeling great. I canceled. So much for breaking out of isolation.

Dr. Fauci (we all know him. He's the virus expert who constantly contradicts Donald Trump) says we're not likely to see anything close to 'normal' until 2022. Other experts warn there are a great many as yet unknown viruses lurking in rain forest animals and one group wants to test ALL of them!

Perhaps we're pioneers in an unpleasantly changed new world.

I don't like it. I liked the old one.

They say those with Alzheimer's remember the past clearly, that it's the short term memory they lose. Standing at the kitchen sink to give the dog fresh water, I thought absently about my mother's last few months.

With dad declining rapidly from Alzheimer's and mom his sole caregiver, I called her daily. "Mom, are you having any fun?" I once asked. "Not much," she said, her voice profoundly sad and weary.

Lost in thought, unrinsed coffee mug in hand, dusk gathering, a familiar silhouette caught my eye. Hummie. Hovering at her feeder. Introspection replaced by joy.

So, I think what we have to do, as mom would say, is "think pleasant thoughts." Refuse to allow this 'new normal' to get us down. Dwell on what we have; not what we've lost. Embrace our joys. And decide fuzzy focus is a blessing.

around the Bay, including Mountain Grove, Pebble Beach and Fremont, just to name a few.

As their children grew, they were that house where the kids hung out at. It was here where they started a youth program as their first form of outreach ministry.

Tom was asked to serve on the county grand jury and was the first Black man to hold that position. Connis ran for city council and almost won. Tom was told that "was too much power for one family to have."

Tom was usually the first and sometimes the only Black pastor in the multi-cultural or all white churches. He eventually became a district superintendent, supervising some 50 churches in a five-county area.

Tom left the church service for a while to go to work for JC Penny's where he went through management training and became the first Black person with hiring power for the company. After a while though, Tom felt the calling again and left JC Penny's to return to the church. He was again Pastor as the churches need him. Again, he was often the only Black pastor.

Tom said, "It was because of this that they learned to deal with people of all stripes."

At one point, Tom was approached by a parishioner and asked if he would be open to gay people coming to his church. He replied that "If your desire was to deepen their relationship with Christ, then you're welcome. There are no other preconditions." Tom said that because they were

welcome, others came. In addition, he said, "It freed other parishioners who had children that were gay and their families, who were now comfortable". Tom went on to say that he had people ask him why he didn't seek out being a pastor of an all-Black church and responded, "Because my calling is to pastor the people of God and the people of God, there are no restrictions".

When asked what they thought of all of the current craziness with the protests and Black Lives Matter protests, Tom and Connis's daughter, Benita, joined in and said that they agree with the protests but not the violence and destruction. Benita went on to say that the point of the protests is to bring to light that racial injustices are still happening. She explained that her 18-year-old niece is a mixed child and they have never and will never make her say

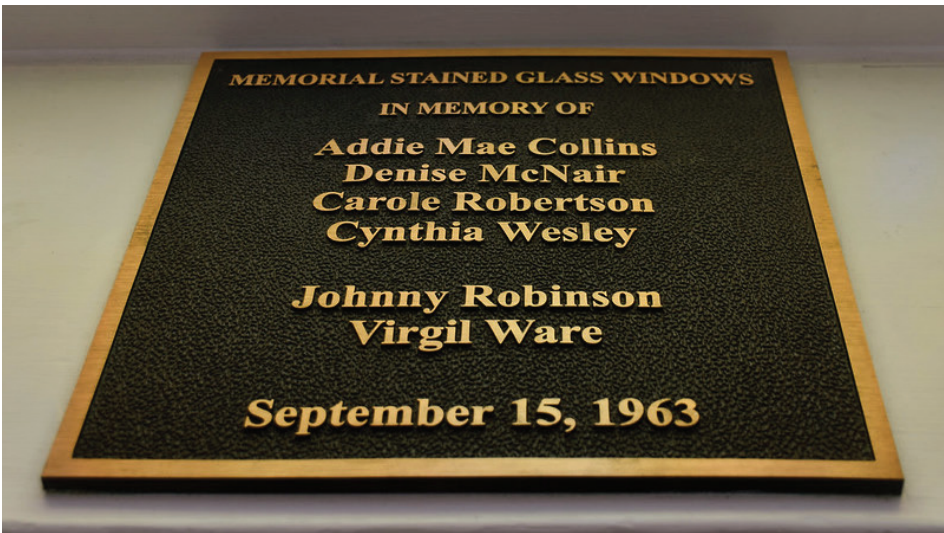

Connis and their daughter Benita own and operate a store in Sacramento called At Last Bra and Lin-
