Bike and scooter share returning

West Sacramentans may have seen shared bikes and scooters back on local streets, because, as of August 29, Lime, relaunched JUMP bikes. Through an agreement with the Sacramento Area Council of Governments, Lime will take over as the exclusive regional bikeshare operator for the region. Sacramento and West Sacramento are the fifth relaunch of JUMP bikes in the U.S. following Lime's acquisition of the JUMP brand in May, with several others anticipated in the coming months. Lime will launch 200 bikes immediately across the two cities and ramp up to 600 bikes based on rider demand.

"Welcome back to one of our urban core's most popular transportation innovations," said West Sacramento Mayor Christopher Cabaldon. "More and more of our residents and visitors are getting around now on foot or by pedal, and scooters and bikeshare are key part of that climate-friendly micromobility portfolio. With fewer cars on the road and more folks out walking and biking than ever, there has never been a safer time for scooter and bikeshare on West Sacramento streets.



Lime's service area will include all of West Sacramento and we will be working with them to increase the number of bikes and scooters in the city to ensure micromobility is an option for everyone who wants to use it."

JUMP bikes will initially be available through the Lime app. They will return to the Uber app in the next few weeks as well, at which point they will be available through either app.

Pricing for JUMP starts at \$1 to unlock, and 20 cents per minute to ride. JUMP bikes are also available to those enrolled in the Lime Access program for low-

er-income individuals, priced at just \$5 for an annual membership that allows for up to five free, 30-minute rides per day.

Lime also offers free rides of 30 minutes up to five times a day for public health and safety workers under its LimeAid program. Monthly plans that bring down the per trip cost for frequent riders include \$59.99 for 25 trips and \$49.99 for unlimited unlocks and 200 minutes.

"With JUMP bikes returning to the Sacramento region, residents now have more options to travel sustainably throughout the cities," said Karla Owunwanne, Government Relations

Director at Lime. "We've found that riders prefer options, with bikes and scooters now available in one place for different trip lengths. Users can now turn to Lime for all trips under five miles in the SACOG region. With more modes at their fingertips, Sacramento area riders will help make streets safer and reduce emissions by replacing car trips, doing their part to prevent increased car usage from becoming the new normal."

"The relaunch of bike share in the region is key to helping us reach our climate action and equity goals related to transportation," stated Sacramento Vice Mayor Jeff Harris. "As our community gradually reopens it's imperative that we have clean, accessible, and reliable transportation alternatives that make it easy for people to leave their cars at home. Bike share is a fun, safe, and convenient way to get around our city."

"The City of Sacramento is excited to see the relaunch of JUMP bikes in our region," said City of Sacramento Transportation Planning Manager Jennifer Donlon Wyant. "The

Woodland Christian School approved for school waiver to re-open

On September 3, Woodland Christian School became the first elementary school in Yolo County granted a waiver to re-open in-person instruction by the State of California with local Public Health Officer approval.

On July 17, Governor Newsom issued guidance that any private or public school located in counties on the State of California's County Data Monitoring List (List) would not be able to open for in-person learning or instruction until the county had been removed from the List for 14 consecutive days. However, elementary schools could apply for a waiver to allow for in-person learning in counties on the List if local Public Health Officers granted a waiver. The waiver is only applicable for grades TK-6, even if the school includes additional grades and would need to be approved by the local Public Health Officer.

Yolo County has been on the State's List since July 8 for exceeding case rate and hospital capacity metrics. When the State transitioned to the new 'Blueprint for Safer Economy' on August 31, Yolo County was placed on the most restrictive tier - widespread. As a result, any

The third CreekSpeak of 2020 tackles soils in the Lower Putah Creek Watershed.

CreekSpeak, Putah Creek Council's six-month series of community talks about the nature, culture, and history of our region, continues with its third talk on September 17th, 2020 with a discussion about how the soils in the lower Putah Creek are linked to the larger landscape.

Streams and creeks collect water and sediments from larger watersheds. So, they reflect the climate and geological conditions of the larger basin. Tuleyome Tales: Recovering from Gold Fever—and Fire

Mercury's Checkered Past

Mercury, which occurs naturally in many parts of California's Coast Range, was mined during three eras in our region: the Gold Rush for recovering gold flakes (late 1800's), the two world wars for munitions (early to mid-1900's), and most recently for products such as hearing aids, batteries and fluorescent light bulbs (up to the early 1970's). We are now left with the legacy of about 80 abandoned mercury mines in the upper Cache Creek and Putah Creek watersheds.

This mining largely pre-dated two important developments: major water projects damming and diverting runoff from the two watersheds, and



modern environmental laws. Enterprising miners simply dumped their contaminated waste downhill to be swept away in the next storm. That contaminated material still blankets our landscape.

City supports and welcomes shared rideables in Sacramento as they provide convenient and climate-friendly transportation options for our residents."

Given the ongoing threat of COVID-19, Lime continues to closely focus on safety, with new protocols on cleaning and sanitizing vehicles and facilities:

Lime recently completed a white paper in collaboration with an independent medical professional that assessed the available research on COVID transmission and found that shared bikes and scooters were the safest publicly-available transport option to avoid COVID.

Lime has enhanced its cleaning methods and increased the frequency of cleaning and disinfecting bikes and scooters in line with government guidance for shared and public transport.

In Lime's offices and warehouses, it is distributing hand sanitizer, masks, gloves and other personal protective equipment (PPE). All mechanics and operators in the field are required to wear gloves and wash their hands regularly.

Lime is following government advice as well as advice from other global health organizations to collect the most up-to-the-minute information to ensure the actions we're taking are comprehensive and expedient. Based on this information, we will decide to continue, pause, or suspend operations in certain markets.

In addition, Lime will provide in-app reminders of our "THRIVE" health and safety best practices, including:

- **Take precautions** — inspect the bike to make sure the wheels, brakes, throttle, lights, and frame are all in good working condition.
- **Hands** — wash your hands or use hand sanitizer which is at least 60% alcohol-based when you arrive at your final destination. Wear gloves when you can.
- **Ride Solo** for safety and social distancing; maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from others.
- **Identify** bike lanes and be aware of traffic lights and signs.
- **Vigilance** - remain alert of your surroundings and potential road and safety hazards.
- **Enjoy Responsibly** - be respectful of other road users, including pedestrians, other cyclists and scooter riders, and always wear a helmet.

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Knowledge is power: Local socialist group offers free online night school

The Democrat Socialists of America, Sacramento chapter is offering a series of four Thursday night online Zoom classes in September for socialist political education free of charge. As an organization, DSA recognizes and encourages education in building a strong working-class socialist organization.

Registration is required and classes will only run with a minimum of 10 registered participants. By registering, you commit to attending class on-time and doing any preliminary required reading ahead of class. All required readings will be distributed to registrants in advance. Inspired by its members, Connie Reeder, a spokesperson for the education committee of the local DSA chapter, explained the Night School Series responded from a call and a need for more political education. "The classes are meant to help people to learn how to apply socialist principals in a practical way in order to facilitate real change in our community," she said.

"The classes are meant to raise the consciousness of the community,

and the organization, as well as expand outreach and the movement. We wanted to give our members a chance to be students and teachers at the same time. To give people a chance to showcase their talents and knowledge," Reeder said. "We hope that our members walk away with a sense of communion and groundedness in their political work. To have a sense of inclusivity that allows comrades to grow politically, intellectually, and experientially together regardless of background knowledge and/or experience."

The topics are chosen from the ground up with surveys out to members and a committee that votes on the topics. "Usually folks step up to volunteer to teach a specific class. Sometimes we have

people in mind that are knowledgeable about a certain topic we've selected. It's a democratic and intuitive process," Reeder said.

"Night school for the rest of us is a really important part of any community development or organization because I think it's really important to have access to those educational tools," added Jesse Drew, a media professor at UC Davis and organizer with DSA, will be teaching the first September class on low-powered FM radio, which will be held on Zoom on Sept. 10.

Drew's own personal history fuels much of his interest in providing these classes free of charge. He didn't graduate from high school, but got his GED and Bachelor's later in life while working a 40-hour

-a-week job. One thing lead to another and he had an opportunity to go to graduate school and was hired by UC Davis to teach. "I'm kind of an odd ball. I am not your common college professor," he said.

"But to me those skills and bringing those kind of people into educational areas is vital," he said. Before coming to UCD to teach, Drew has taught at city college, state college, private colleges. "Frankly,

the intellectual capacity of all those students is virtually identical... People want to learn and as community organizers we can give people that opportunity, and not talk down to people."

Sept. 10, 7 p.m. We Want the Airwaves: From Pirate Radio to Low-Power FM: The struggle over who controls access to the airwaves has raged for over 100 years in the USA, with multinational corporations and their allies in government mostly victorious. Working People Deserve Fair Tax Treatment, Not Just a Day Off

Labor Day is a day to celebrate the importance of working people in American life, to show how much we value the contributions of the millions of people who give their time and their sweat to support themselves, their families, and their communities. But while having a day off is nice, working people should have more. We shouldn't let Labor Day distract us from the fact that the American economy is rigged, through our tax code, against working people and in favor of rich investors like me.

Our tax code treats income differently depending on how you make it. There is one set of tax rates for money

you get from a job (ordinary income) and another set of rates for money you make on long-term investments like stocks (long term capital gains), an option only available to people who already have enough money to invest. You might think that money earned from work would be treated preferentially (after all, hard work is a cornerstone of the American dream), but you'd be wrong. The rates that rich people pay on money earned passively from their investments is significantly lower than what most working people pay.

Say you and your spouse together earn \$100,000 a year from working 40 hours a week, 52 weeks a year. At the end of the year, you will end up pay-

ing about \$7700 in federal income taxes. While you were doing that, say my wife and I sat on a beach all year, sipping margaritas and soaking up the sun, and at the end of the year I decided to sell a few stocks and make \$100,000 in capital gains. I would pay \$0 in taxes on that \$100,000. Does it seem fair that I should end up \$7700 richer than you when I sat around all year while you worked hard for your money?

Let's say I decided to sell a lot more stock and take in \$10 million in capital gains. That's more money than most people will ever earn in their entire lifetime, but I only pay a top tax rate of 20% on it. To put that into perspective, if you're a single person working

for a living you'll start paying a higher rate than that after earning just \$40,126 in taxable income.

This isn't just a small loophole - this is a massive sinkhole of tax evasion. Really rich people tend to earn most of their money from capital gains. They don't work for a living, they let their money work for them. I haven't worked in years - I now just live off of my investments, and I'm making more than I ever did when I was actually working, and paying a lower tax rate on it.

If you work for a living, you should understand this one thing about the tax code: a dollar rich people made off of their money is worth more than a dollar made off of your sweat. Think

about that for a minute. If you are working, you keep less of every dollar you make compared to someone who is not working, who is living off their investments.

Our tax code is deliberately designed to reward capital income over labor income, and it gives people who are already rich a permanent advantage over everyone else. Our elected officials may talk endlessly about the value of a hard day's work and the nobility of labor, but that's all many of them are willing to do. Talk is cheap. If politicians really want to honor working people, they should stop talking about hardworking Americans and start giving their income equal treatment.

school in Yolo County that wants to re-open for in-person learning must go through a lengthy waiver process that includes, but is not limited to:

- Completing an application and providing supporting documentation.
- Consulting with labor, parent, and community organizations and providing evidence of these consultations to the local health officer, including a signed attestation form.
- Creating an elementary school reopening plan that must address several topics related to health and safety, such as: clean-

ing and disinfection; entrance, egress and movement within the school; face coverings and other essential protective gear; health screenings; healthy hygiene practices; identification and contact tracing; physical distancing; staff training and family education; student and staff testing; triggers for switching to distance learning; and communication plans.

- Publishing the reopening plan on the school's website.
- Making revisions to the reopening plan as requested by the local Public Health Officer.
- Working with local public health staff, including having an onsite visit.
- Allowing ongoing compliance checks by public health staff.

Woodland Christian School has made multiple changes to meet the necessary criteria, including hiring extra staff, creating protocols for responding to COVID-positive staff or students, implementing the necessary health measures and safety protocols, and developing outdoor instruction space.

nor the participants will know who is assigned to which group. After an initial screening, participants will receive two injections of either the investigational vaccine or a saline placebo approximately four weeks apart. One person will receive a placebo injection for every two people who receive AZD1222, which will result in approximately 20,000 people receiving the investigational vaccine and 10,000 people receiving a placebo.

"The trial primarily is designed to determine if AZD1222 (the vaccine) can prevent symptomatic COVID-19 after two doses. The trial also will evaluate if the vaccine candidate can prevent SARS-CoV-2 infection regardless of symptoms and if it can prevent severe COVID-19. It also will assess if the experimental vaccine can re-

duce the incidence of emergency department visits due to COVID-19.

"Participants will be closely monitored, particularly after injections, for safety and reactivity, which refers to symptoms — usually mild and self-limiting — that can occur after vaccination. Investigators will evaluate participants after each vaccination and will ask participants to record any symptoms after returning home as well. An independent Data and Safety Monitoring Board (DSMB) will provide oversight to ensure the safe and ethical conduct of the study.

"Participants will be followed for two years after their second vaccination. They will be asked to provide blood and nasopharyngeal samples at their initial visit and will be asked to provide blood samples periodically for the duration of the trial. Scientists will examine the blood samples in the laboratory to measure and characterize

immune responses. The severity of the disease observed will be measured and used to assess the activity of the investigational vaccine.

"Participants suspected to have COVID-19 will be asked to undergo a nasal and nasopharyngeal swab for testing. Participants who test positive for SARS-CoV-2 infection will be followed closely and referred for medical care if symptoms worsen.

"Adults who are interested in joining this study can visit Coronaviruspreventionnetwork.org (link is external) or ClinicalTrials.gov and search identifier NCT04516746."

That's from a vaccine study sponsored by the United Kingdom. It's opening in 80 sites across America.

There are scads of vaccine studies. If interested, go to ClinicalTrials.gov and take your pick.

As yet, no vaccine is proven safe and effective in preventing the Covid

Today's Mercury Problem

Mercury is an odd element: it is liquid at room temperature, yet 13 times denser than water. In nature, mercury is a concern because one form, methylmercury, is extremely toxic to humans and wildlife—one droplet is enough to pollute several Olympic-size swimming pools worth of water. Today, mercury is a common cause of contaminated waters statewide, including in our local watersheds.

Exposure to methylmercury comes largely from eating fish that have accumulated it through their diets to levels about one million times more concentrated than their water. The state's Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment has issued several warnings for people to limit their consumption of local fish (oehha.ca.gov/node/412).

But wait...there's more! The LNU Lightning Complex Fires

are burning around many mine sites. Fire impacts on mercury can vary depending on factors such as the fire's temperature and the forms of mercury, but much more than usual can be released into the air (vaporized and adsorbed to smoke and ash) and downstream (adsorbed to eroded ash and soil). A silver lining of fires is that they clear the vegetation, making it easier to identify, access, and clean up mine sites.

Tuleyome to the Rescue

Tuleyome, a nonprofit organization based in Woodland, is a regional leader in cleaning up abandoned mercury mine sites. Tuleyome led projects in 2012-2019 funded by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife's Ecosystem Restoration Program to clean up the Corona and Twin Peaks mercury mines in northwest Napa County. The site is in the Lake Berryessa watershed, and contributed to high mercury concentrations in fish and fish-eating birds in the streams and lake.

The core project team assembled under Tuleyome's leadership included many re-

gional experts: soil scientist Vic Claassen from UC Davis, mining geologist Greg Reller of Burleson Consulting in Folsom, general contractor Justin Smith from Middletown, attorney Michael Lozeau of Lozeau & Drury in Alameda, environmental engineer Peter Green from UC Davis, and chemist Tim Tsukamoto of TKT Consulting in Reno, NV.

As a "Good Samaritan," Tuleyome worked with regulators to address the many environmental laws governing abandoned mine sites. The project team spent many hours studying the site's cultural history, plants and animals. Those efforts allowed the team to most effectively make the site safer, revegetate barren hillsides, and treat acidic drainage water. Researchers continue to study the bacteria found in the mine drainage water for their ability to thrive in such harsh conditions.

Tuleyome also recently completed a project funded by Napa County's Lake Berryessa Watershed Improvement Program to improve nearly three miles of Oat Hill Mine Road, which

passes by several mercury mines (including Corona and Twin Peaks). The road, first constructed in 1867 for stagecoaches, ran into disrepair when the alternative toll road became a free public highway in 1924 and large-scale mining operations along the roadway ceased. Most culverts were undersized and improperly installed, frequently failing during heavy rains. After culverts plugged, runoff flowed down the dirt road, scouring channels and washing away berms. Tuleyome's project team designed and constructed durable road improvements to reduce erosion (of mercury-rich sediment) and localized flooding, leading to better water quality downstream and access to the mine sites and road network. This project also supported the planned Napa Co. Open Space Trail System and public primitive campground, potentially connecting to the popular Oat Hill Mine Trail.

What's Next?

Regional water managers recently completed a project

(westsideirwmbrownfields.org) to identify and prioritize all of our region's mercury mine sites, and then to conduct detailed site assessments and produce clean-up plans for a select few. Several stakeholders are now considering how to address those sites. Tuleyome is also proposing to improve roads in a designated off-highway vehicle use area near Knoxville (in the Lake Berryessa watershed and beside a UC Davis reserve). As for the recent road improvement project, these planned efforts will reduce mercury-laden soil erosion from contaminating local waterways and the lake.
